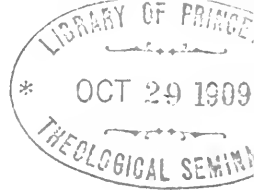

MINUTES

OF THE SEVENTY-NINTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE
CUMBERLAND PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH, HELD AT
BENTONVILLE, ARKANSAS, MAY 20-26, 1909.

First Day, Thursday, Forenoon Session.

May 20, 1909, 11:00 a. m.

The Seventy-ninth General Assembly of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church convened pursuant to adjournment, in the Cumberland Presbyterian Church, Bentonville, Arkansas, on the Third Thursday in May (20th) at 11:30 o'clock a. m., A. D. 1909.

OPENING EXERCISES.

The Assembly joined with the choir in singing Hymn 212, "Holy, Holy, Lord God Almighty," after which Rev. J. L. Hudgins, of Obion Presbytery, Synod of West Tennessee, read as a scripture lesson the Twenty-third Psalm, and led the Assembly in prayer.

Judge F. H. Prendergast, the retiring Moderator, delivered the opening address of the Assembly, on the subject: "The Power of Knowledge." Theme: "Christian Education."

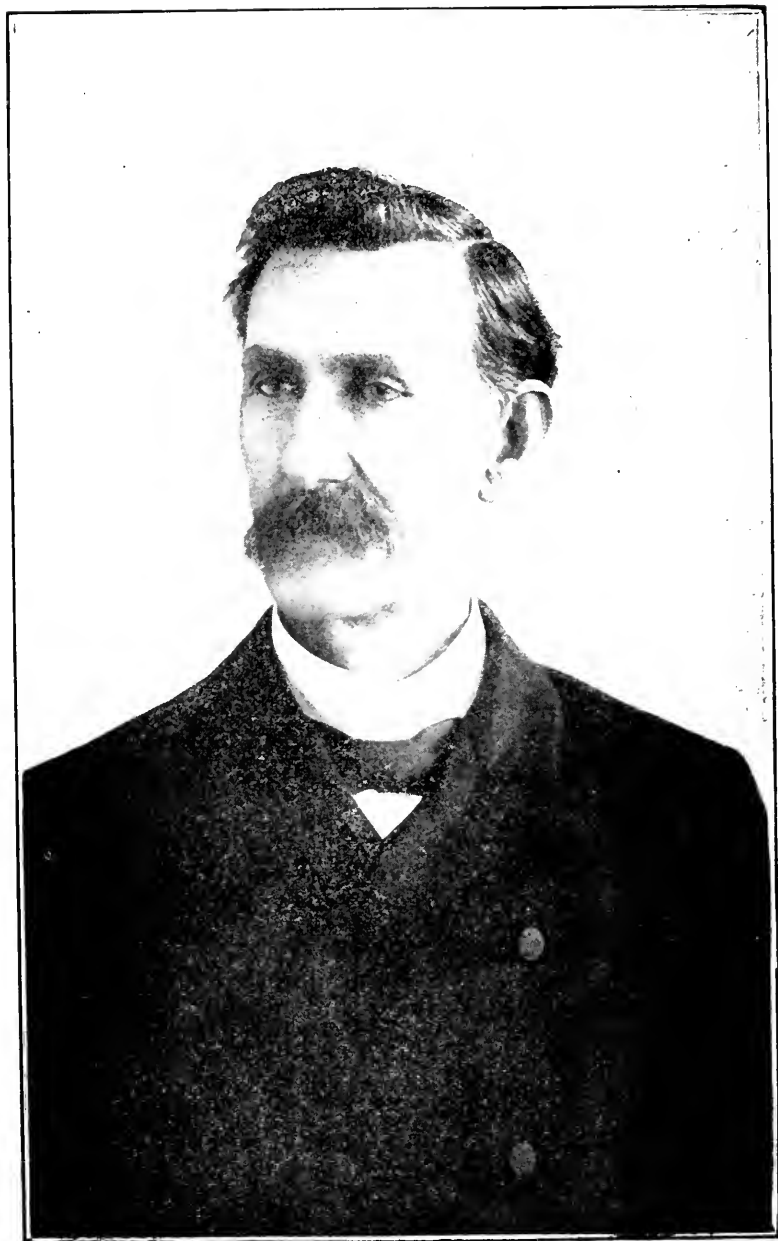
FIRST. The same committee appointed last year, by this commission, "to look after the interests of the Synod of Iowa," (page 66, your Minutes, 1908), was continued and Rev. E. M. Johnson was added to that committee. The failing health resulting finally in the death of our dear, devoted, efficient, spiritual minded, clear visioned brother, who was the consistent and logical defender of our doctrines and discreet and wise in the practical application of the principles of our Church polity, the Rev. R. D. Miller, is a sad loss to the Commission and to that Committee of the Synod of Iowa.

SECOND. The Report of that Committee is made a part of our report to the General Assembly, and is as follows:

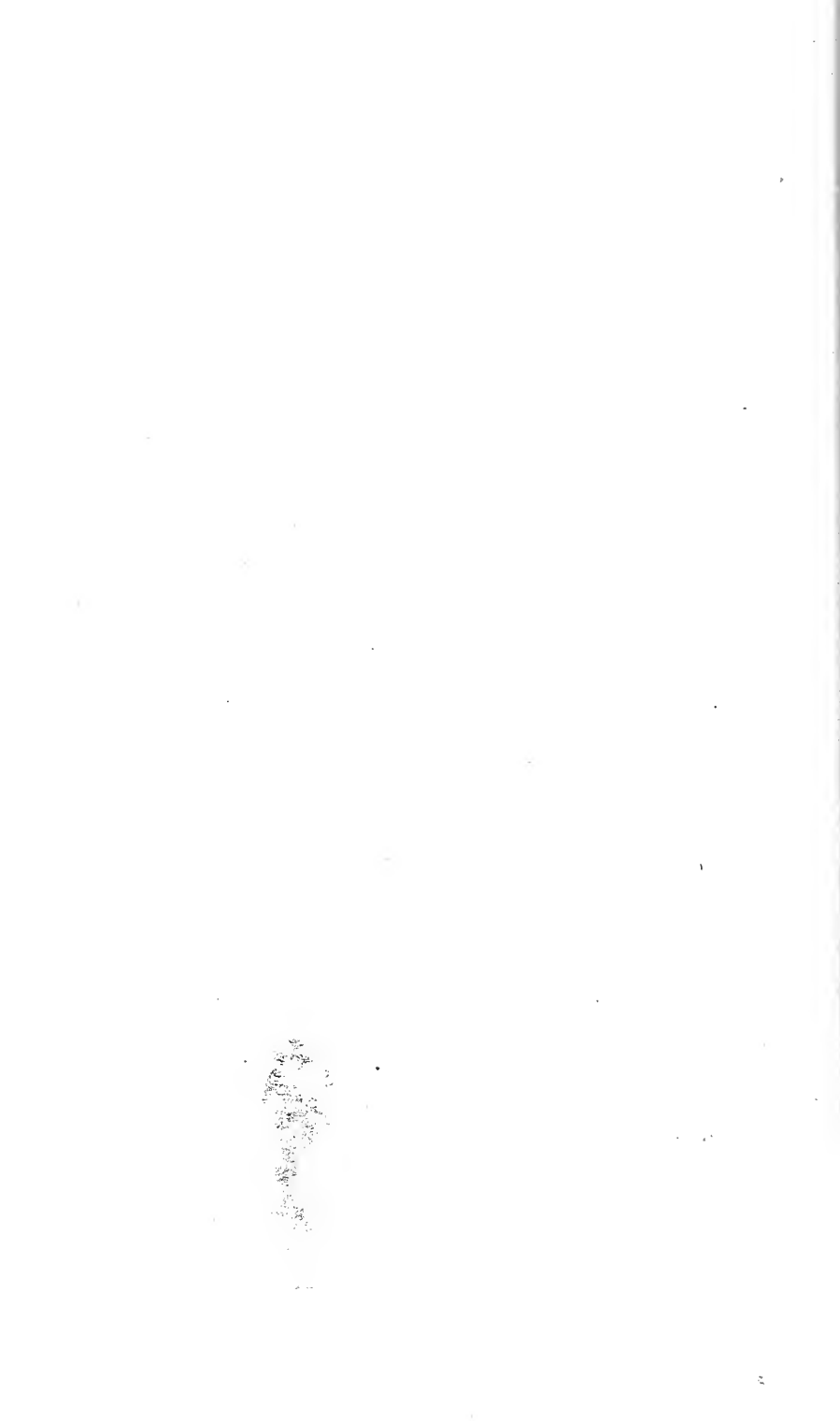
The Committee submits the following Report to the Commission:

(1) On September 15, 1908, the West Iowa Presbytery of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church met at Leon, Iowa, and a quorum being present, viz. Revs. W. H. Berry, J. S. Wayman, and R. S. Maupin, the Presbytery elected Rev. W. H. Berry Moderator, and Rev. J. S. Wayman, S. C. and Treasurer.

(2) On September 22, 1908, the Colesburg Presbytery of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church met at Gilbert Station, Iowa; and

REPORT OF BOARD OF EDUCATION.

Fathers and Brethren:—

With gratitude to God for his guidance and thanks to the Church for her co-operation, the Board of Education submits for your consideration this, their Twenty-Eighth Annual Report. The work has been pleasant and we humbly trust that it has been helpful to the Church we represent.

The Board holds four regular meetings each year, as follows: On Thursday before the third Sabbath in July, October, January and April.

SCHOOL OPENED.

The Board of Education complied with the instructions of the General Assembly of one year ago and opened a school in connection with Bethel College, McKenzie, Tennessee, for the training of probationers for the ministry in our Church. At the regular meeting of the Board in July, 1908, arrangements were made with the Board of Trustees of Bethel College to open said school in connection with

said Institution. At the same meeting of the Board the Rev. P. F. Johnson, then pastor of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church at Dyer, Tenn., was elected Dean of the Theological School, and entered the work at once. By this arrangement students preparing for the ministry are to have the benefits of a literary course in the College in connection with the theological course. The schools opened Sept. 1, 1908, with an enrollment that was very encouraging, however only two were enrolled who were students for the ministry. Others entered in a few days. The enrollment for the year reached twenty-two, one of the number is a Baptist, hence the number of Cumberland Presbyterians in the class is twenty-one. They are from the following synods: Alabama 6; Mississippi 2; Missouri 1; Tennessee 1; Texas 4; and West Tennessee 7.

LEGAL QUESTIONS.

The property that was in the hands of the members of the Board of Education who went in to the Presbyterian Church, U. S. A., is still in their hands. We appointed a committee with power to take such steps as are necessary to recover said property, and we expect to be able to report to you one year from this that much of the property has been recovered.

PRESBYTERIAL REPRESENTATIVES.

At the meeting of the General Assembly last year the presbyteries were instructed to appoint a suitable person in each of their bounds to represent the interest of the Board of Education. This action of the Assembly was not presented to the presbyteries until after many of them had met, hence they failed to comply with your request.

PROBATIONERS INCREASING.

We are profoundly grateful to God for the answer he has given to the prayers of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church. He is still calling men to the gospel ministry in our Beloved Church. Only a few more years, if we do our duty, and the Cumberland Presbyterian Church will be well supplied with well equipped, consecrated ministers. With a suitable representative in the bounds of each presbytery, to report the facts, the Board could make quarterly reports to the "Banner" and in that way keep the entire Church informed as to the number who are entering the ministry. While the Lord is calling many, many more are needed. The Church should keep praying and asking for still others.

FINANCIAL REPORT.

Again we are able to report an increase in the offerings of this year over the preceding year. The Board is endeavoring to use

every dollar given for Education to the very best advantage. The Corresponding Secretary has done the work this year without any expense to the Board. Much of the stationery and postage has been furnished by members of the Board, thereby saving the amount to the Board.

We are pleased to note that the young men who are preparing for the ministry are not making demands for money; but on the other hand very reluctantly receive aid.

The Board presents the following suggestions and recommendations for your consideration:

1. That the Board of Education is entirely under the control of the General Assembly and her policy should be outlined by the Assembly.

2. That the presbyteries be urged to give every encouragement possible to the probationers for the ministry under their care to make the most thorough preparations possible for their life work and that all of them are in condition to go away to school be placed in Bethel College next September.

3. We would recommend that you set apart a definite period in which offerings are to be made for the Board of Education and that you direct the same to be sent to the Treasurer of the Board.

4. That you divide the membership of the Board of Education into three classes and that the term of office of class number one expire at the present meeting of the General Assembly and that the term of class number two expire at the meeting of the Assembly one year hence and that of number three at the meeting of the Assembly two years hence, and that the term of office of those elected to fill the vacancies in each class as above described shall be three years, or until their successors have been appointed. We suggest the following as a suitable classification:

Class 1—P. F. Johnson, J. D. Lewis, C. L. Wade.

Class 2—W. E. Dunaway, Allen Foust, J. N. Parker.

Class 3—J. L. Hudgins, Frank Slemmons, J. W. Smith.

Also that the Committee on Education recommend the names of those to be elected to places on the Board.

This amount was contributed by only a very small proportion of our membership and is divided as follows:

Individuals 1108, Congregations 146, Presbyteries 4.

As near as we can estimate it from reports received with the various contributions, the total amounts of \$2,861.47 was contributed by less than 2500 individual members or about two per cent of our membership.

We are greatly hampered in pressing pending litigation on account of lack of funds. Where synods, presbyteries or states make it a practice to take special collections in their bounds to the exclusion of the General Assembly's Committee, such synods, presbyteries or states should be required to assume all expense of litigation in their bounds.

Your Committee has discharged the duties assigned them to the best of their ability.

The Chairman of the Board of Legal Finance respectfully requests that he be relieved from further service on this Committee.

REPORT OF BOARD OF MINISTERIAL RELIEF.

To the General Assembly of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church,
Bentonville, Ark., Seventy-ninth Meeting, May 20, 1909.

Dear Fathers and Brethren:

As the servants of our entire Church, the members of your Board of Ministerial Relief are glad of the opportunity at the close of another ecclesiastical year of bearing testimony to the STERLING CHARACTER and DEVOTION to the CHURCH, of those who have earned the right and title "to be ministered unto" in the temporal things, by having abundantly ministered to others in spiritual things.

These Have Entered Into Rest.

The Rev. Dr. S. R. Chadick of Gilmer, Texas; the Rev. J. S. Laird of Laird, Mississippi; the Rev. S. H. Holmes of Savannah, Tennessee; the Rev. I. L. Thompson of Smithville, Tennessee, and the faithful wife of the Rev. W. H. H. King of Mineola, Texas, are numbered with those who have died in the assurance of faith, and of the final triumphant victory for the Cumberland Presbyterian Church.

Expiration of Term of Office.

The time, for which Rev. E. M. Johnson, Rev. G. W. May, and Rev. J. L. Goodknight were elected members of this Board, expires with this meeting of our General Assembly, and the Board of Ministerial Relief recommends that your Reverend Body re-elect each one of them to succeed himself for the term of three years.

The Thornton Home Case.

As reported last year to the General Assembly, this Board instituted proceedings in the Civil Court in Indiana to obtain possession

and control of the insurance funds and other property belonging under our care and which was (and is) being diverted from the use and the service for the Cumberland Presbyterian Church.

This case is still awaiting a hearing; but, the Insurance Company being in another state, that case has been transferred from the Indiana courts to the Federal court at Indianapolis, Indiana.

And, in addition to the \$50.00 used out of the funds of the Board as reported last year for expense of filing the case, your Legal Board sent to our Board \$75.00, making a total of one hundred twenty-five dollars on the expense of this case.

The property involved consists of the \$6,300 insurance on the Thornton Home, reported last year, and also the \$34,965.67 Endowment Fund and other gifts and legacies with accrued interest etc., indicated in our report to the General Assembly in May 1907—two years ago.

REPORT OF BOARD OF MISSIONS.

To the General Assembly of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church:
Bentonville, Ark.

Your Board of Missions desires to present to you, preliminary to its former report, some suggestions as to what should be done by this Assembly with reference to the Board's future.

This Board for the last twelve months has had many obstacles in its path which have prevented it from doing any considerable work of value to the Church. First of all the Church has been distracted from the pursuit of the Mission work by the controversies that have existed in so many locations with reference to the claims of the Presbyterian Church U. S. A. for the property of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church; this of itself has lessened the spirit of the enterprise in a very large number of congregations. The further fact that so many congregations have been divided in their membership with reference to the Union has put the burden of paying the local expenses correspondingly heavier on the faithful few, who have stood by the Cumberland Church and its doctrines. This condition naturally and inevitably has materially reduced the contributions to many of the general enterprises, and especially to the Board of Missions, and this condition has also tended to stimulate the comparative local work of the Presbyteries and the Synods and much of the work that has usually been done and ordinarily should be done by the Board of Missions has been accomplished by the Synodical and Presbyterial Boards for the last year. Under the circumstances this Board feels that the activity of the Synodic and Presbyterial Boards should receive our approval, and is not a matter of regret in any sense.

Another matter which deserves mention here is that in the last meeting of the Assembly there was a considerable number of commissioners who desired to have one federal head for all the Boards who should be the Treasurer, collect and apportion and pay out the funds to the Boards. This plan, while supported by many sincere friends of the Church, was not adopted by the Assembly, but a plan called "a budget plan," but following in general the old method of each Board attending to its own collections and distributions of the funds was adopted instead. Those contending for one Federal head have not yielded their belief that their plan was the best and have not fully supported the Assembly's plan.

The Cumberland Presbyterian Banner, which is the only paper our Church has, has all along been in favor of the plan which was rejected by the General Assembly and has not yielded its assent to the plan adopted by the General Assembly. The Board of Missions

while recognizing the importance of some features of the plan calling for one Federal head, has felt that it was its duty as a Board to maintain the plan adopted by the General Assembly and has declined the efforts to inaugurate the other plan during the year.

In making these preliminary observations your Board does not desire to reopen the much discussed matter of Finance, and the best method of handling it, but, we do desire to bring to your attention, that it seems to us to be necessary for the work of the Board to be minimized in its importance in certain localities.

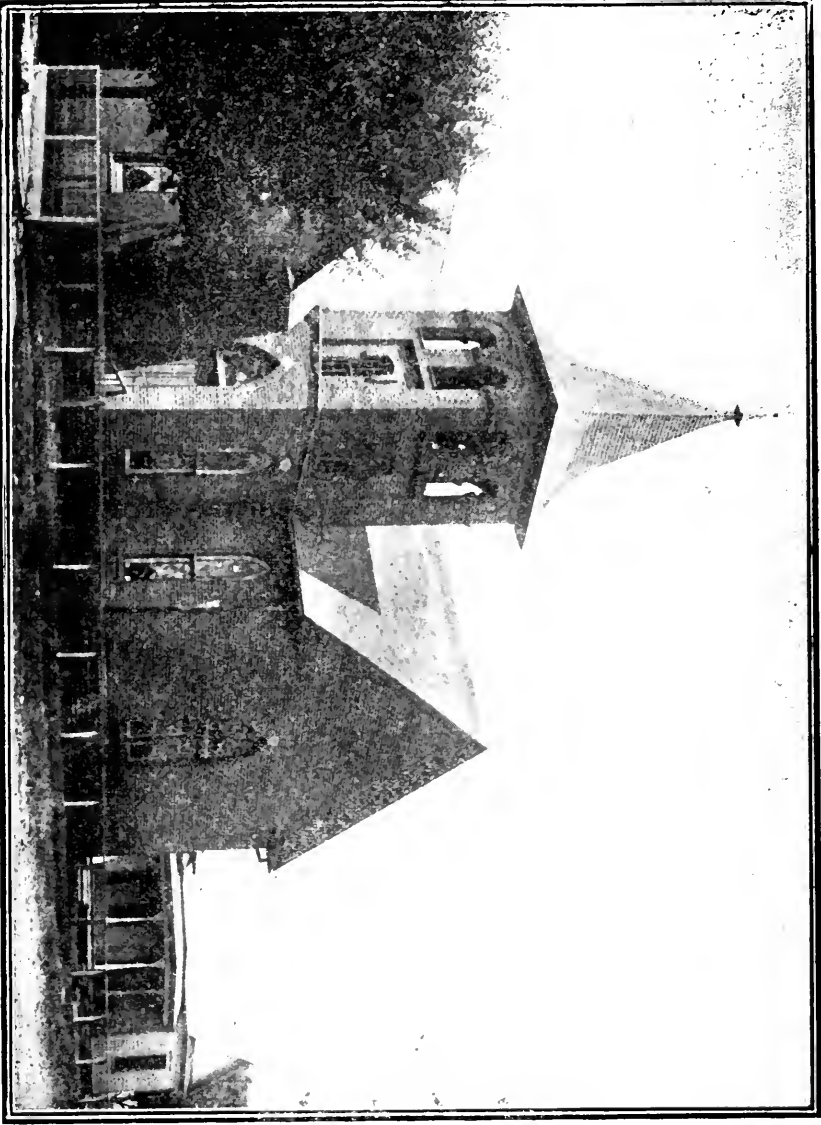
Many of our people are placed under the immense burden of erecting new churches in addition to the usual congregational expenses, to expect them therefore to take active part in the support of the benevolences of the Church for the time, is bordering on the impossible.

We feel that a greater activity on the part of your Board is imperative, and we feel that for the ensuing year the prime necessity of detaching our Secretary entirely from the pastorate so that he can give his entire time to the active prosecution of the voluminous duties of a Field Secretary.

Your Board desires to explain that the disturbed condition of the Church, and the fact that our Secretary was not in the field for all of his time rendered it well nigh impossible for us to carry out that order of the General Assembly relating to the articulating of our work systematically in the Presbyteries and Synods, but our purpose is to enter energetically upon thus organizing our work, unless you shall order to the contrary.

The work to be successful should begin with the people through the Presbyterial Boards, and all these boards should be represented in the Synodical Boards, and the Synodical Boards to the General Board, whose Field Secretary should visit as many Presbyteries and Synods as he can, in fact, Synods should so fix their time of meeting as not to conflict, and the Presbyteries in like manner in each Synod.

With reference to the Cumberland Presbyterian Banner, we would not disparage, nor seek to minimize the important and efficient work it has done in the past and is yet doing, and it has received, and should receive, the commendation of all true friends of the Cumberland Church, yet we are faced with the condition which calls either for the establishment of one official organ of the Church, or the establishment and support of two papers in different parts of our territory, the Banner being in no sense official, or under any character of control by the Church, and is free to support or decline to support the acts of the Assembly, and it should not be criticized for following

its own judgment. It is the opinion of this Board that we should have an official organ published monthly, and known as our Missionary Monthly, in which all the reports from the field are published, thus placing our needs and work before the people, in order that the various and conflicting views of our membership may be brought before the Church on equal terms.

This Board in its routine work during the year has received many and various calls for help, which were meritorious within themselves, but there being a large portion of our Church which has been confronted in the Mission fields by the destructive effects of the Union movement that we have been unable to respond to many that were very deserving. The Mission at the City of Memphis has received continuous assistance from this Board, the General Assembly having commended this work to the Board, we have not felt that we were called on to determine the propriety of changing our assistance from this point. Under the plan suggested by us for the future, Memphis being in one of the strong Synods, would be expected to receive its aid locally from the Presbytery or Synod and not from the Church at large.

We have followed the directions of the Assembly and have placed a man in Oklahoma Synod at an expense of \$66.66 per month beginning November 20, 1908.

We also did what we could for our Colorado work with our limited means; after it is too late to arrange work the collections have come more freely. We think it advisable to so change our time of collections for Home Missions to May and June so the work can be planned for the year.

Since writing the above the Court in Texas has decided the property question in favor of the Unionists and the Tennessee Court has decided against the Unionists, and in view of the probable effect the Tennessee opinion may have on our right to the publishing house, the matter of having an official publication for the Church and the Boards may be presented to the Assembly from a different standpoint.

The Assembly will be able to handle the whole problem.

We append the financial statement.

We desire to commend Rev. J. R. Goodpasture for his faithfulness to every duty falling upon him and the painstaking care he has given our literature and the able manner in which he has conducted the business affairs of his department.

The Board of Publication after much study and correspondence, now places before the Church our new publication for our Sabbath Schools and Young People's Societies.

The new publication is known as the "Cumberland Visitor," and takes the place of "Cumberland Boys and Girls," and we believe it is a publication that merits the cordial and liberal support of our people throughout the bounds of our Church. In order to make it a financial success, we must have at least fifteen hundred new subscribers. Individual subscriptions are 50 cents per annum, and in clubs of five or more, 48 cents per annum.

We urge that our General Assembly use every means possible to increase the number of organized Sabbath Schools and the use of our own literature in all our Schools. Some of the largest Sunday Schools in our Church purchase their literature from syndicate publishing houses. This should be condemned by our General Assembly, for we are now engaged in a struggle against enemies strong and resourceful, and we feel that our denominational enterprises should be supported in preference to placing the money of our Sunday Schools in the pockets of publishing interests operated for private gain.

We recommend that no change be made in the personnel of the Board of Publication until all legal matters have been finally determined.

REPORT OF BOARD OF SUNDAY SCHOOLS AND YOUNG PEOPLE'S WORK.

To the General Assembly of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church in Session at Bentonville, Ark., May 1909.

The Board of Sunday Schools and Young People's Work submit the following as their report for the year ending December 31, 1908:

The work committed to our care has been one of pleasant responsibility. We have found the young people very responsive and ready to co-operate. And we hereby record our appreciation for the hearty support we have received in our work, not only from the young people, but from the Church at large.

By the sympathetic help of the people and the Good Shepherd above, we have been enabled as we believe to accomplish much good during the year.

Many Sunday Schools and Young People's Societies have been organized, and old ones taken on new life and are doing better work. Many institutes and conventions of various kinds have been held in different parts of the Church, giving forth enthusiasm and better methods for the individuals and congregations.

Our Sunday School literature has been improved and has met the demands of the Church. The Board of Publication deserves the praise of the entire Church for her good management of this department of our work.

Rev. J. R. Goodpasture who has had the Editorial management of our Sunday School literature has done heroic work, and the Church can never fully repay the debt of gratitude due him for his making it possible to have a first class literature of our own during these trying times. And our Board notes with pleasure, the continued improvement in this department of our Young People's Work.

The denominational reading course has been pressed during the year, and through it our young people have been urged to study our own church history, theology, and government as well as to familiarize themselves with the work of our denomination and to keep in touch with the best religious literature of the times.

"Children's Day" was observed by a much larger number of Sunday Schools than formerly and the offerings on that day were much larger than in the past and the Board is taking steps to have the day more generally observed during this coming year.

The Board has representatives in nearly all of the Synods and Presbyteries who co-operate with our Board in their given fields.

So in many ways, the Board has sought to foster the Young People's Work for the denomination by organizing more of them for study and work.

Much correspondence has been done in the way of answering questions about Sunday Schools and Young People's Work, coming almost daily from various parts of the Church, and in this way much good has been done.

The general field of the development of our work is so very large and its possibilities so very great, that as soon as the situation will admit there ought to be some one who could give all of his time to this work, which in the judgment of the Board is the most fruitful of any of the Church's enterprises. Awaiting the realization of that ideal the members of this Board who are very busy men will continue to do all in their power to cultivate this delightful field so white unto harvest.

Large part of the Board's work has been the Missionary work in the State of Oklahoma, the field assigned to us by the last meeting of the General Assembly. The Board has sought to study this field by much correspondence and by sending a representative to look over the field and to study the work at first hand. Which investigation revealed to us a very needy and promising field both among the Whites and the Indians. We have kept one missionary in the field at work all the time during the year and he has done faithful and efficient work.

Our Missionary Rev. J. S. Lish has had many years experience in this field, and has been a blessing to our cause in these trying times; we are hopeful that in the very near future we can see our way to have two instead of one as we now have in this fruitful field.

The Third Sunday in November was observed as a Missionary Sunday by our Sunday Schools and young people's societies, which day was a success not only in the increase of interest but a handsome income was also realized from the offerings of the day.

The opportunities of this Board are limited only by the time and money at their disposal. Much more every way could be and needs to be done, if we had a larger income and more time at our disposal. We believe that it will be but a short time when these will be forthcoming.

Our denomination with many others has been using the Christian Endeavor organization as our denominational society. Which is entirely satisfactory to the majority of our people, but we have some who feel that our young people should be taken out of this organization, because that in conventions they would be associated with members of the Presbyterians U. S. A. And besides some of our people believe that our young people would be more loyal to their own church, if they were kept out of these State and International Conventions, where they are thrown with persons of other denominations.

We have gone over this situation very carefully and prayerfully with the facts before us from all parts of the Church, and the convictions of the members of this Board are clear and strong that for our Church, especially at the present, we should make no change in

the form of our young people's organization. No form can be made more denominational than the Christian Endeavor, and as to our young people being hurt by being thrown with members of other churches in conventions we think they will be benefited for such associations broaden and develop and thus fit them better for service.

Besides, in our judgment, there are several reasons why it is not wise to make any changes at the present; especially by pulling away from the Christian Endeavor form of organization, and try one that is peculiarly and alone denominational. Such a time may arise later on, when many other things have been settled and adjusted, but for the present we believe such a course would be very unwise.

The Christian Endeavor leaders were the first to recognize our Church as still in existence after the effort to destroy, and we think that it is still worth much to be thus recognized. Besides to take that step now would bring about another division in our church work, which we can't afford; furthermore, we do not believe it possible for us to produce the necessary literature for an independent society, and with our young people divided as such a course would necessarily bring about, we could not have conventions and unions and institutes, for our young people as they would have a right to demand, for when they would be divided the denominational society would be so small that the constituency would not be large enough for literature or for conventions or for inspiration, we believe far better to leave the action of the Assembly stand as it is on this question, and the congregations which may not see their way to have Christian Endeavor Societies then that they be encouraged to organize in any form which seems to suit their local demands.

We would recommend that the Board of Sunday Schools and Young People's Work be authorized by this Assembly to continue the work in the same lines as has been done during the last year, but in every way possible to enlarge and make more effective the work already begun.

The policy of the Board has been and will so continue, is to keep clear of any debts or financial entanglements; enlarging the work as the offerings may from time to time justify.

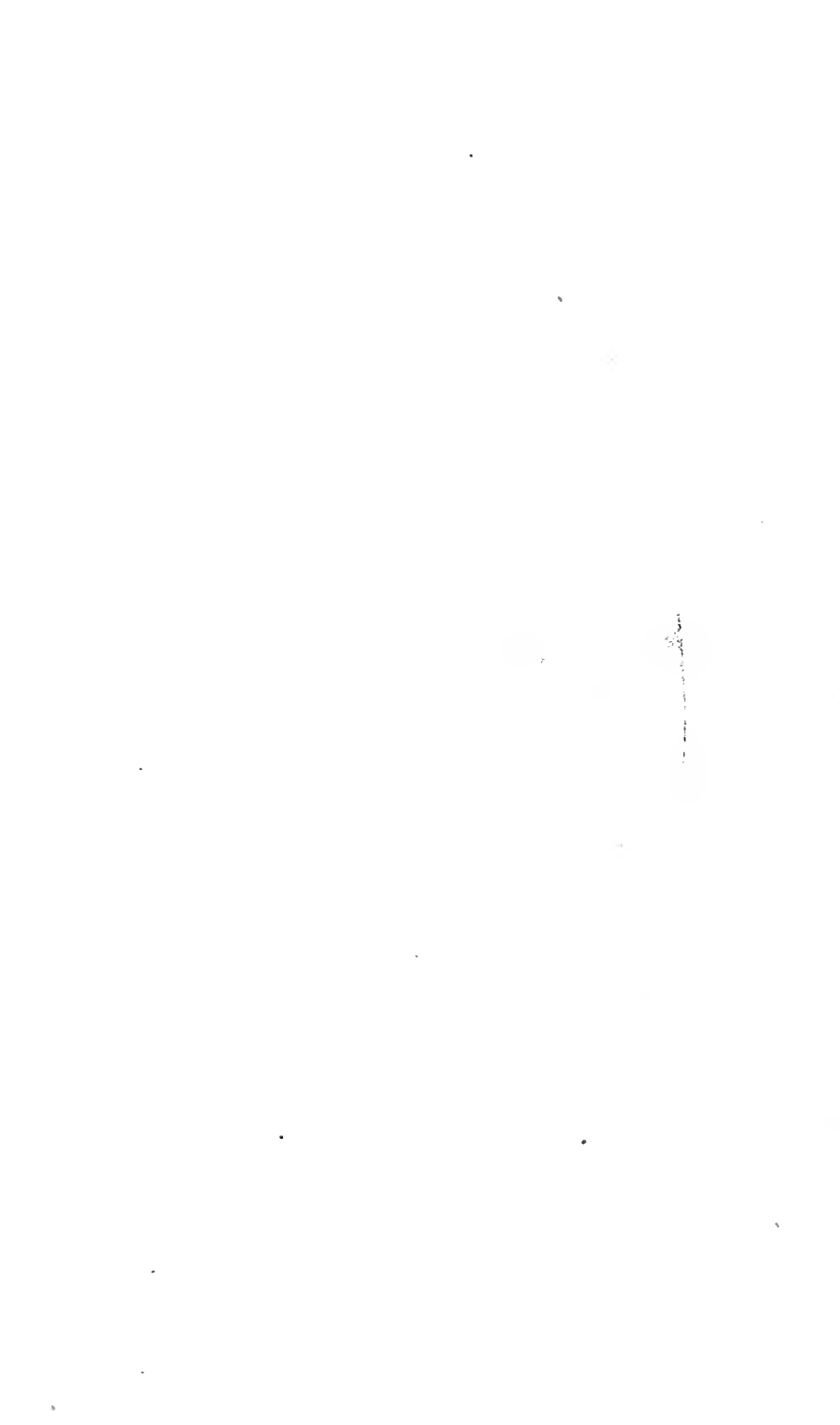
As your Stated Clerk, I desire to make the following report:

The Presbytery of West Plains has been consolidated with Springfield and made a part thereof.

The receipts for the year amounted to \$3,129.45, and the expenditures amounted to \$2,636.92. Books, accounts and receipts are submitted.

You are asked to have same audited. Checks and receipts will show expenditures, and receipt stubs will show receipts in connection with the receipts for the year.

I was under the necessity of borrowing from the German American National Bank, of Lincoln, Illinois, the sum of \$600.00, which amount has been paid and interest thereon.

Cash balance shown in the hands of the Stated Clerk is \$492.53.

There are a number of Presbyteries that have not paid. I deem it proper to call your attention to the fact that so far Birmingham Presbytery, Louisiana Presbytery, Robert Donnell Presbytery, Wabash Presbytery and Wichita Presbytery, for reasons satisfactory to them, have been unable to pay any contingent taxes for 1906, 1907 and 1908.

REPORT OF ASSEMBLY'S TRUSTEES.

Bowling Green, Ky., April 15, 1909.

To the General Assembly of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church at Bentonville, Ark.

Brethren:—

The newly elected members of the Board of Trustees of the General Assembly of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church met in Bowling Green Kentucky, on July 22, 1908, and after qualifying, by taking the oath of office, which was administered by the County Court Clerk of Warren County, Kentucky, the Board was called to order by Dr. T. W. Stone, and was then organized by electing the following named members to serve as its officers for the ensuing year: Dr. T. W. Stone, President; E. W. Beck, Vice-President; Henry H. Denhardt, Secretary; Dr. W. E. Lundy, Treasurer; Dr. J. F. Hendricks, M. R. Graham, and C. W. Stone, members of the Executive Committee. The Board authorized the Secretary and Treasurer to loan the balance of the money in the treasury at six per cent interest, said loans to be secured by first mortgage lien on Real Estate. Acting upon this a loan of \$1200 was made to C. W. Potter on July 9, 1908, due one year after date. The Board was notified by the Authorities that the Commonwealth of Kentucky would institute

proceedings to collect an inheritance tax from the estate of Z. P. Smith. After an investigation of the law it was decided that the Board could be compelled to pay this tax and the treasurer was ordered to pay \$170 the amount thereof. Dr. W. E. Lundy, having resigned as Treasurer, C. W. Stone was elected, on February 4, 1909, to fill out the unexpired term.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON EDUCATION.

Your Committee on Education would beg to report the following:

We have had before us the report of your Board of Education, and find that the Board has done its work in a commendable manner, for which the Church should be grateful.

We need not speak to this Assembly about the importance of Education for we know that knowledge is power, and that we must educate or we must perish.

We note with pleasure that Bethel College, McKenzie, Tenn., which was in the hands of the Presbyterian Church U. S. A. was given back to our Board of Trustees by the Chancery Court in this month and that the Board has already taken possession of the same. Since this is the only school that is under our control, we would not only recommend, but urge our people to support our school at Bethel College by sending their boys and girls to this institution.

We would recommend that you heartily endorse the action of the Board of Education in employing Rev. P. F. Johnson as Dean of the Theological School and that you give him your most hearty support in the work.

We are grateful for the large number of young men who are answering the Divine call to the Gospel Ministry and placing themselves under the care of our Presbyteries. We would urge our Presbyteries to guard well our cause, and see that none but those who are up to the standard laid down in our Confession of Faith, and conse-

crated to the cause of Christ and loyal to the Church be ordained to the work of the ministry in our Church.

We reaffirm the recommendations made in report of Board of Education on page 75 of 1908 Assembly Minutes, which recommends that you direct each Presbytery to appoint a suitable person within its bounds to represent the interest of the Board, and that the Clerk of Presbytery report the name of such person as soon as appointed, to the Corresponding Secretary of the Board, Rev. P. F. Johnson, McKenzie, Tenn.

We recommend that the classification of the members of the Board of Education made by the Board in its report be ratified.

Since it is desired to have members of the Board who live near or at least convenient to Bethel College, and since the term of C. L. Wade and Rev. J. D. Lewis expires at this time, we would recommend that Rev. C. A. Davis of Memphis Presbytery succeed C. L. Wade and that W. B. Young of the Clarkesville Presbytery succeed Rev. J. D. Lewis and that Rev. P. F. Johnson succeed himself.

We recommend that the Board of Education take such steps as seems necessary and best toward the education of Alexander Ponghee, the Chinaman of California, and if thought best put him in school at Bethel College.

We recommend that March and April, the time already fixed by our Assembly, be the period for making offerings for Education and urge our people to give liberally to this worthy cause.

However the memorial of Logan Presbytery backed up individuals of that Presbytery and one or more members of the Board of Trustees speaking as individuals asking that said fund be divided by loan or gift between Bowling Green and Auburn Congregations to erect

Houses of Worship, being in the locality where the donor lived and died.

Therefore we recommend that said fund be so used, \$2,000.00 to Bowling Green and \$1,500.00 to Auburn Congregation by loan or gift as may appear proper on a conference between the Assembly's Board of Trustees and the Legal Board of the Assembly, if on said conference there appear no legal difficulties in the way of such disposition.

REPORT NO. 4.

We, your Committee on Finance, would respectfully show, that while no memorials or resolutions have been referred to us, concerning a general or permanent plan for raising and providing funds for the various enterprises and Boards of the Assembly, yet being informed that this matter is in a general way, and by implication committed to us in the creation of such a committee, and on financial reports, we would respectfully submit the following report and recommendations:

First—The fact appears from information derived from members of the Boards and from sources outside of the Boards that the results during the past year of the present plan or plans in force have not **proven** satisfactory in providing a sufficiency of funds for the needs of the various fields covered by said Boards.

Second—It appearing that this failure is traceable largely, to a lack of some general head in the making and taking of collections for the purposes named.

Third—It appearing that there has not been provided a sufficient fund for the legal defense under the present condition connected with the effort to deprive congregations and Boards of property held in the name of Cumberland Presbyterian Congregations and Boards, which failure has been due, largely, to the fact that this collection has not been placed by the Assembly on equal footing with its other Boards and every minister in the Church urged and required to press its claims on the congregations.

Therefore, we recommend:

First—That the Legal Board of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church, as heretofore organized and constituted, together with the Board of Legal Finance thereof, be continued so long as the demand and need therefor appears to indicate, being put upon an equal basis

with the other Assembly Boards and that all and every minister of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church be urged and required by the Assembly to present from the pulpit the claims of this Board, and make collections therefor at the time and during the time allotted thereto as hereinafter shown, it being understood, that congregations or communities, where litigation is pending may arrange with the Legal Board for the special handling of local contributions in such manner, and to such extent as may be agreed on in said Board.

It being further understood that as far as your Assembly has a right to suggest in relation thereto that any and all suits pending or to be brought in future, be brought to the notice of and oversight of the Legal Board, in order to become a participant in the distribution of the Legal funds raised and provided as above set out.

Second—We further recommend a return to the former plan of handling the Assembly Boards and collections therefore, that a specific portion of the year be designated and set apart during which time the ministers and church sessions shall present to the members the claims of each particular Board and make collections therefor.

To this end we suggest that the allotments of time be made to each of the Assembly's Boards as follows:

Legal Board.....	January and February
Education	March and April
Publication	May and June
Missions and Church Extension..	July, Aug. and Sept.
Y. P. and S. S. W.....	October
Ministerial Relief	November and December

Sufficient pliability to be allowed as to above terms to allow ministers of large pastorates and under any peculiar conditions to cover all the collections.

As a convenience in raising the collections for the various Boards, we suggest, that in cases where desired by pastor and session the whole matter be embraced in an annual subscription list designating in said subscription an apportionment of the fund.

Subscription cards to be prepared for this purpose by conference of the Boards acting by representatives.

Third—We recommend that the Assembly Boards as now constituted or revised and altered by the action of this Assembly in disposing of the various Committee reports on these subjects, as thus constituted, be placed in charge, each of its own field, and in addition to the general and specific requirement of the Assembly in other respects, be required to aid the pastors and church sessions in raising collections for the purposes of said Boards. To this end, that said Boards, by their Presidents or Secretaries furnish such literature

etc. as appears needful, and make such visitations to church courts as appear advisable.

Fourth—We recommend as coming directly under the scope of this report that the offered resignation of R. L. Baskette, of the Chairmanship of the Board of Legal Finance be declined; that it be recommended to the Board that he be continued in that position.

REPORT OF HISTORICAL SOCIETY.

To the General Assembly of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church, to convene at Bentonville, Arkansas, May 20, 1909:

The Executive Committee of your Historical Society would submit the following report:

1. In pursuance of your instructions we have demanded of those who formerly composed this Committee, but who now hold allegiance to the Presbyterian Church U. S. A., possession of all the property of every character held by them in the name of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church May 1, 1906, which demand has not up to this time been complied with.

2. We have in part discharged the second duty specifically enjoined upon us, to ascertain who of the members of the society in May 1906 remained true to the Cumberland Presbyterian Church, and to elect successors to such as have gone to the Presbyterian Church U. S. A.

We have interpreted this to have reference especially to the Chairmen of the Synodical and Presbyterial Historical Societies. By the constitution of your Historical Society these committees are to be appointed by the Synods and Presbyteries, and the chairmen thereof are ex-officio corresponding members of the Historical Society, and of this Executive Committee. As to how many of these Synodical and Presbyterial Historical Societies have been appointed since 1906 we are not able to report at this time, but with a view of getting especially the Synodical Committees into working shape as speedily

as possible, and acting under authority vested in us by the last Assembly, we have appointed the following to act as Chairmen, where the Synods for which they are appointed have now no organized Historical Society, until said Synods do appoint such Committees, to-wit:

- For Synod of Alabama—Dr. H. P. Bone, Gurley, Ala.
- For Synod of Arkansas—Rev. N. S. Moore, Lonoke, Ark.
- For Synod of Illinois—Rev. J. H. Milholland, Charleston, Ill.
- For Synod of Indiana—Rev. J. B. Hadlock, Petersburg, Ind.
- For Indianola Synod—Rev. A. A. Collins, Blair, Okla.
- For Synod of Kentucky—Dr. T. W. Stone, Bowling Green, Ky.
- For Synod of Mississippi—Dr. J. B. Bailey, Connehatta, Miss.
- For Synod of Missouri—Rev. A. M. Buchanan, Moberly, Mo.
- For Synod of the Pacific—Rev. N. F. Gill, Los Angeles, Calif.
- For Synod of Tennessee—Rev. T. Ashburn, Knoxville, Tenn.
- For Synod of Texas—Rev. G. B. Russell, Fort Worth, Tex.
- For Synod of West Tennessee—Elder I. N. Parker, Dyersburg, Tenn.

3. That our Church has been passing through a period of extraordinary historical interest not only to ourselves but to the religious world must be apparent to all, and that a full and just history of the manifold events of this period be embodied into permanent history is matter of the highest importance to us as a denomination. The opportunity for procuring complete data for such a history will become more and more limited with every passing year. We think therefore that as speedily as practicable to do so, a volume of Cumberland Presbyterian Church history to begin where the Rev. B. W. McDonald's history leaves off, and to come down to the present time giving a full, accurate and just account of all the important matters in which the Church has been involved, should be prepared and published.

To this end we recommend that the Executive Committee of your Historical Society be authorized and directed to prepare or cause to be prepared the MS. for such a volume of history to be published by your Board of Publication or a Committee appointed by this General Assembly.

4. In view of the importance of active, extensive, and immediate work on the part of your Historical Society, and the imperative need of funds to meet necessary current expenses, we recommend that your Stated Clerk be directed to notify all the Presbyteries, that under a former enactment of the Assembly, they are expected to pay into the treasury of the Society one dollar a year and to urge upon them to make prompt remittances of the same.

5. We further recommend that in order to speedily and successfully obtain data from all parts of the Church with a view to the

early issuance of another volume of our Church history, this Executive Committee be authorized and empowered to appoint suitable persons in sections where our Church is not yet in an organized working condition to act as corresponding members of this Committee.

6. We recommend that each Synod and Presbytery that has not now an Historical Society be urged to appoint one at once, or as soon as may be.

7. The term of office of Bro. J. H. Zarecor will expire with the adjournment of this Assembly, and it devolves upon you to appoint his successor.

8. We recommend that the Assembly take suitable action with a view to a proper celebration of the Centennial of our Church at the next Assembly, especially with reference to the appointment of speakers for the occasion.

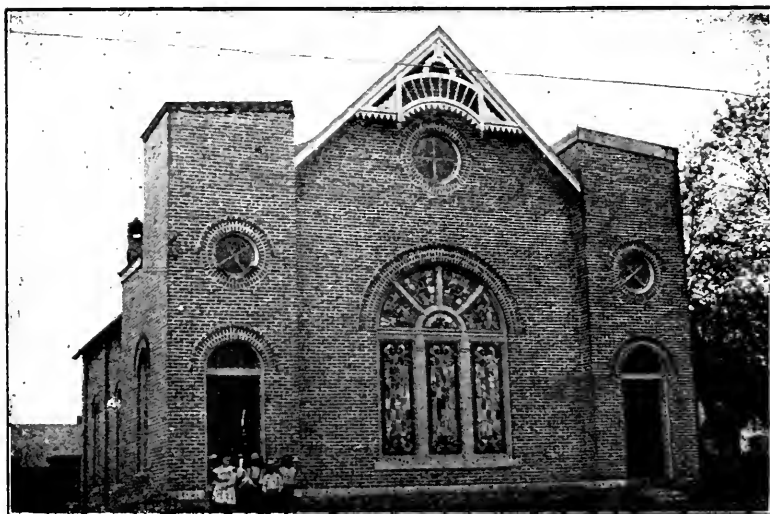

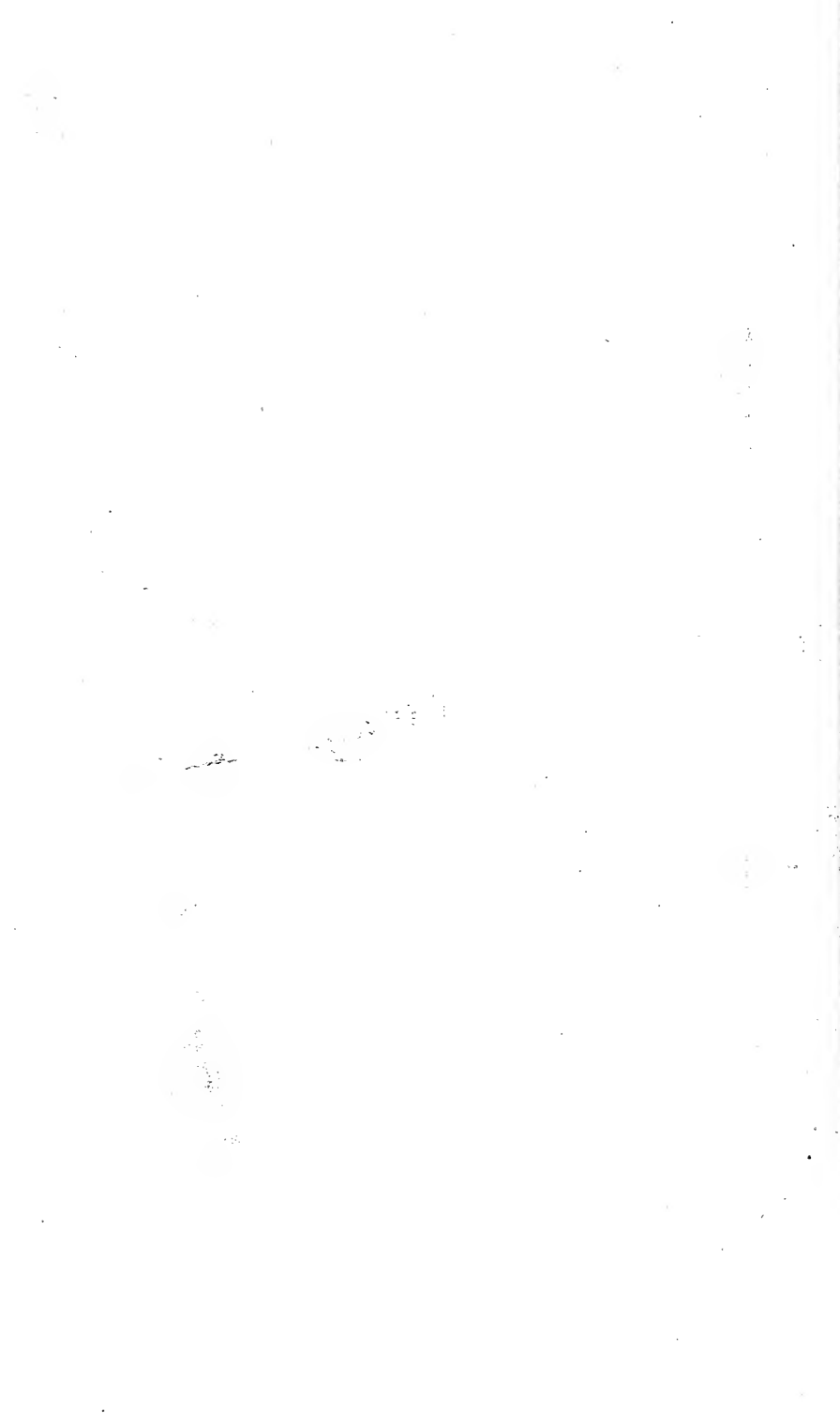

Your Committee on Overtures, regarding several matters referred to it, makes the report following:

1. Regarding the request made of this Assembly by Memorial from McGrady Presbytery asking that all presbyteries be authorized and empowered to elect and send a double representation, to the Assembly, to meet in the year 1910, one to be the real representatives of said Presbyteries, and the other merely as advisory and honorary, your Committee, because there is no constitutional authority for such actions, and no right or power either in the Assembly or the Presbyteries to pay the traveling or other expenses of additional delegates, recommend that said memorial and request be denied, but, without any purpose of your Committee to discourage or restrict the attendance of our people, on their own account, to celebrate the one hundredth anniversary of the birth of our denomination, which on all accounts is greatly to be desired.

2. As to the resolution offered this Assembly, by the Rev. L. F. Clemens, asking that the Committee on Evangelistic work created by the Decatur, Ill., Assembly, in May 1906, be dissolved and its members be discharged; because it had never had any work assigned to it to perform. The subject having been considered by your Committee, and it being uninformed of any good reason for the continued existence of said committee, it respectfully recommends that said request be granted, and said Committee discharged.

3. It appearing from the letter written by the Stated Clerk of Brownwood Presbytery to the Rev. J. L. Goodknight, recites that a resolution was adopted by said Presbytery making some memorial to this Assembly regarding the settlement of litigation concerning

church property, but did not set out or inclose such memorial or the date when adopted, your Committee recommends to this Assembly that if deemed worthy of further attention, that same be referred to your Legal Committee for such action as to it may deem proper

Cook's or the American Sunday School Union, or any other literature except our own, from the fact that ours is far superior to all for Cumberland Presbyterians. No school worthy of the name of Cumberland Presbyterian should injure the work of our Board, and injure their own school by turning down the better for the worse.

We further recommend that you express your appreciation of the work being done by the Rev. W. T. Dale in the way of getting our books in the hands of our people. He cannot be commended too highly for his efforts in getting out new editions of the Old Log House, Why Am I a Cumberland Presbyterian, Collinsworth's Lec-

tures and McDonalds Church History. Also that Dr. Dale's Song Books be heartily recommended to our People for their real value and adaptability to our wants.

The Cumberland Presbyterian Banner has figured largely, very much so in saving our beloved Church from destruction by the would be destructionists. We owe a debt of gratitude to its editor which we can never repay. This paper should be in every Cumberland Presbyterian household in the broad land. We are aware of the fact, that some of our people think that the "Time has come when the sarcastic, rough, rasping language in regard to the Unionists, should be made smoother, or altogether left out of its pages," but your Committee believe that, as its Editor has been such a great blessing to us in our great time of need, and as he has such a great big head full of brains on his little body, and also such a great warm brave heart beating in his bosom, we should say, "Havron live close to God and exercise your own consecrated judgment in the future as well as in the past. In the name of our loving Christ we say God bless you, and may you and the Banner be a glorious benediction to us all along the victorious way."

The McGhee Observer edited by the Rev. A. M. Buchanan has been a great blessing to our people in Missouri and also in other States.

We should give the necessary patronage to keep this outspoken helpful little sheet circulating everywhere.

Our Confession of Faith should be distributed more than ever before, and your Committee rejoices that the Westminster Confession is being read and compared with our own, which helps the people to appreciate our biblical statement of doctrines as the best on earth.

We should redouble our energies in showing to the world through our publications that we believe, and one good way to get people to read our doctrinal books is for our preachers to preach our doctrines **from the pulpit**, and at the fireside more than they have done or are doing. We have been hurting our Church by being entirely too modest, afraid to open our mouths on Water Baptism for fear some immersionist might not like it, afraid to say much on the "Preservation of Believers for fear that some Methodist brother might not feel good over his eternal safety. Afraid to say anything against fatality for fear Presbyterians might feel aggrieved. Afraid to educate our young people in our glorious doctrines, even afraid to urge our converts in our meetings to join our Church, and the results are that other denominations do the indoctrinating and swell their ranks with our people. Our doctrines brought intelligently before

the people, through press and pulpit will give our Church a glorious uplift.

We are glad that the time is not far distant when our Publishing work will be much enlarged, and will not be circumscribed and handicapped for the want of a proper place to do its work and make its interests blossom as the rose.

In the matter of Young People's Society we recommend that we concur in the report of our Board of Sunday Schools and Young People's Work that we do not withdraw from the International Society of Christian Endeavor, and that Congregations which may not see their way clear to have Christian Endeavor Societies be encouraged to organize Young People's Societies in the form which best suits the demands, so long as loyal to our denomination.

And we recommend that this General Assembly instruct our Board of Publication to prepare and supply such literature and supplies as

the necessities of our Young People demand and in their judgment will be self sustaining.

We especially commend the Cumberland Visitor to all our Young People, both in Sunday School and Young People's Societies. We are pleased to note our Board of Sunday School and Young People's Work is pressing a denominational reading course and hereby emphasize its importance. We recommend that there be no change in the personnel of our Board.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON TEMPERANCE.

Bentonville, Ark., May 22, 1909.

We, your Committee on Temperance, duly appointed by this General Assembly of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church, beg to submit the following report:

First—The inestimable gift from God to man, The Holy Bible, teaches us to be temperate in all things, but especially with relation to ardent Spirits, we are instructed to abstain.

We are warned by Solomon, the wise King, as to the certain state of the drunkard, who shall come to poverty; we also learn how the Priests and the Prophets erred through strong drink.

No country, no people, no home, no church, no man, is proof against its demoralizing influence, where it is allowed free scope.

Second—The Cumberland Presbyterian Church has always been an open advocate of temperance, and only as the Church maintains the principles of our Fathers can we hope to flourish as a Soul Saving Agency and win the commendation of our Leader, Jesus Christ. Let the Leaders of our People teach the great value of the noble virtue Temperance.

Third—We as a Committee (while agreeing with past committees in their approbation of the onward march of the Law of Prohibition) would take a step further by recommending the support of Prohibition, we do not seek to bring our Church into the political arena, but the enemies of Alcohol view its devastating influences, and the world acknowledges its effect in making homeless children, wives, widows, and orphans, destroying the bloom of maidenhood, and robbing our country of its citizenship, in pulling down the characters of youth and manhood.

Therefore, realizing that ardent Spirits is a recognized evil, our Holy Book forbids any compromise with the traffic or evil in any form, so that it behooves us as Children of God, as Members of a Spiritual Body, the Cumberland Presbyterian Church to seek its removal, if by common consent this blight cannot be removed from a nation, let us in God's Name for the sake of our cause, our Master, our little Children, seek by our prayers, our interests in a practical way, support the law or laws that will compel its removal.

It was Shakespeare who said, "Why will men put in their mouths that which robs them of their heart and BRAIN?"

We, your Committee on Temperance, therefore, believing the liquor traffic to be the greatest club in the hands of the Devil towards destroying the bodies and souls of men, the greatest enemy of the Churches.

THEREFORE, Be it resolved by this General Assembly, that our Church now records its enmity to the traffic as a whole and the open saloons in particular, and that we declare it to be the duty of all our people to show our enmity on every occasion, when an opportunity affords.

RESOLVED, That no person or set of men who favors the licensings of the sale of liquor traffic has any right to expect or receive the votes of Christians, and any candidate for office who declines to speak openly against the traffic, deserves not, and should not receive our support.

We have not the control of men's mouths, nor can we hope to gain that control, but, by our prayerful united effort it is possible and probable that we can control this traffic before it reaches the mouths of our future and many of our present generation.

4. Reports are published exactly as furnished by the various Stated Clerks. I had no authority to change them.

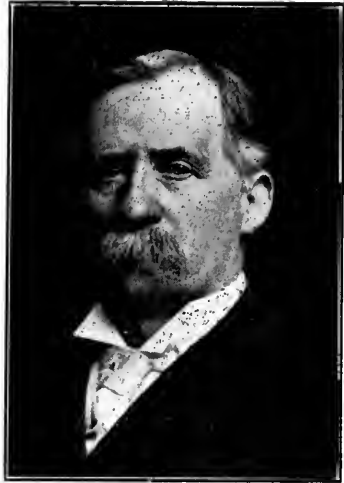
5. McGhee-Kirksville-Saltriver is now one Presbytery; this heading should have been where "McGee" is. They are printed in the statistical report as copy furnished.

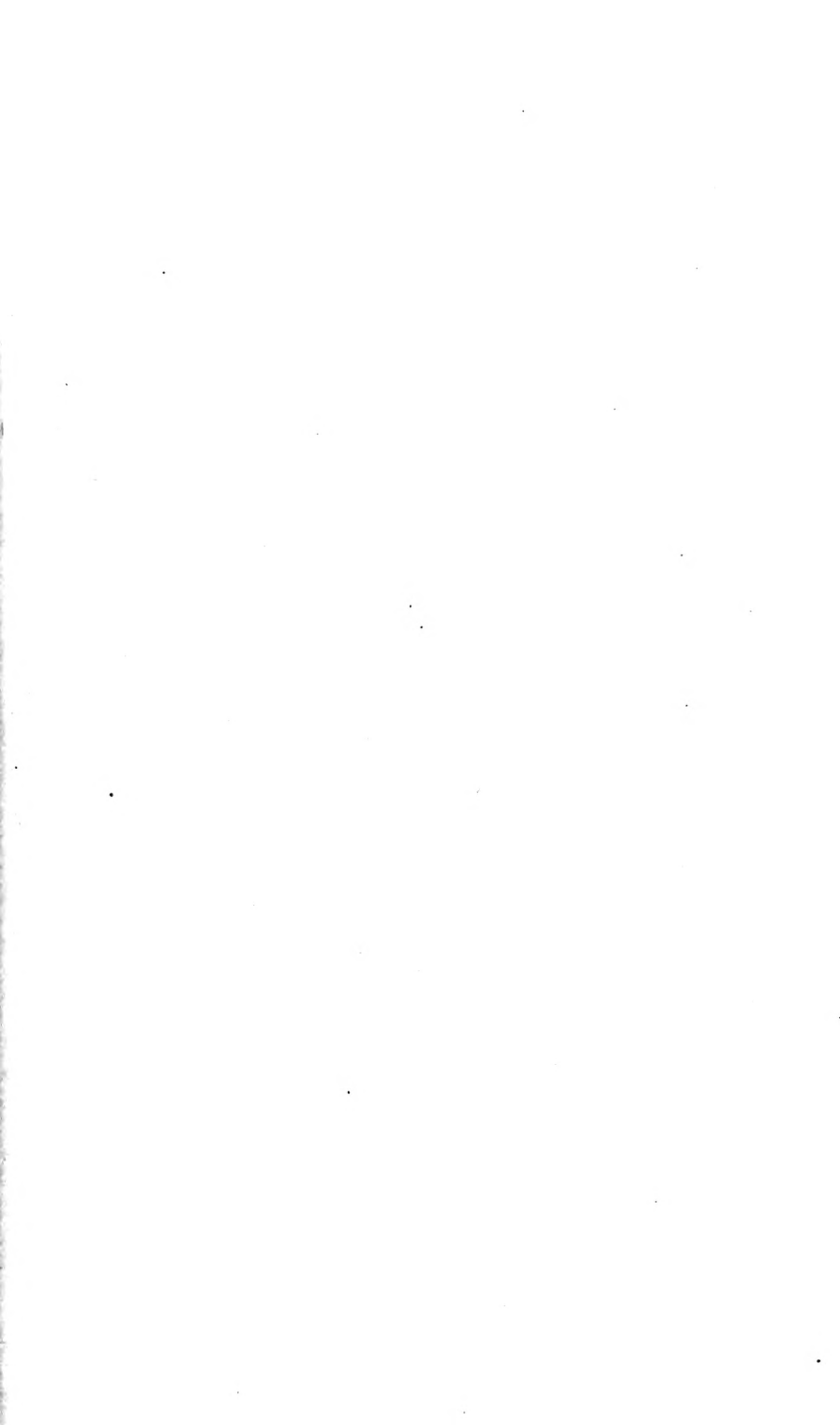

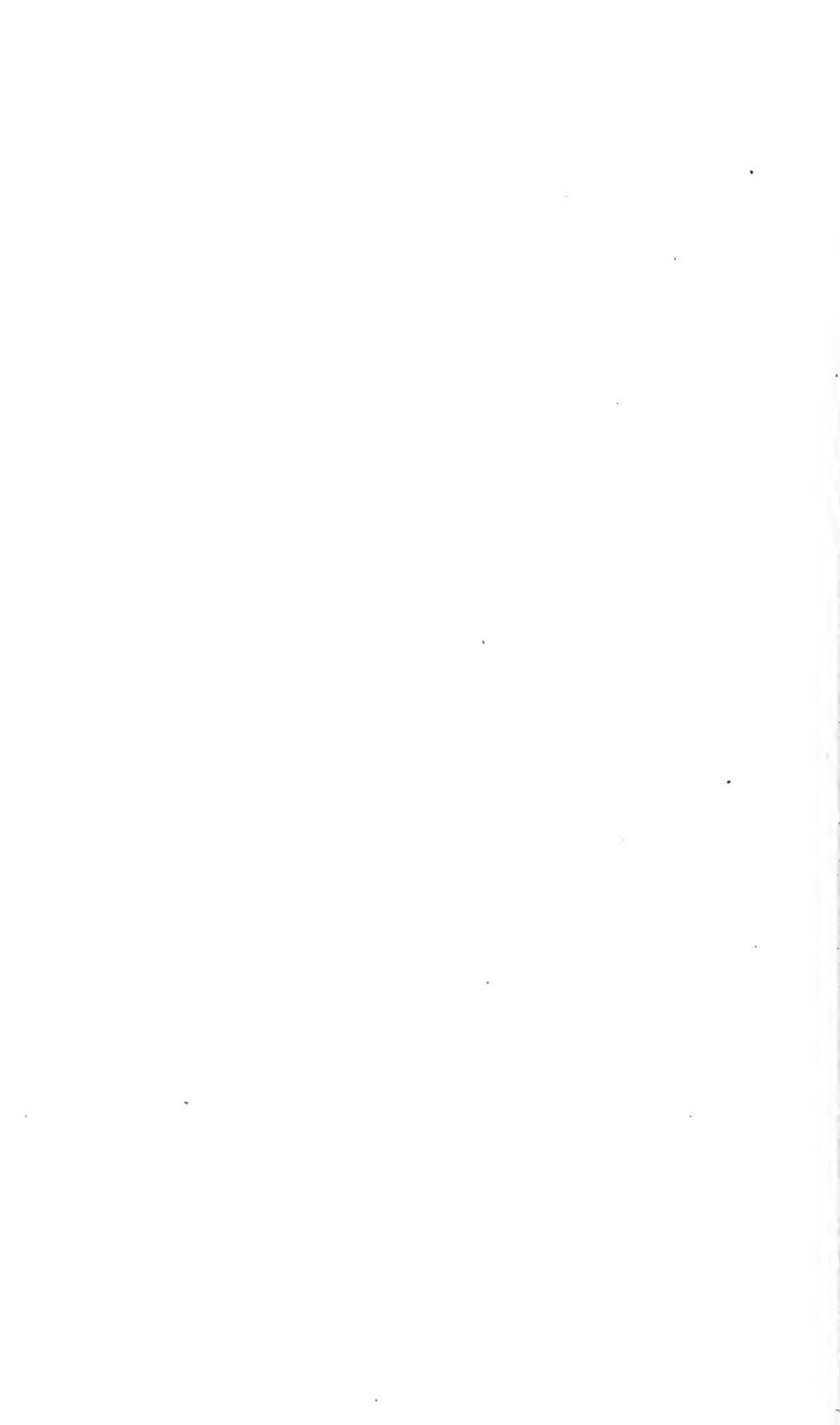

VIII. MISCELLANEOUS REGULATIONS.

1. The Assembly Stated Clerk.

Besides discharging the duties named in Form of Government, the Assembly's Stated Clerk is required:

1. To discharge the duties of Engrossing Clerk, appointing such Temporary Clerks at each meeting of the Assembly as may be needed for his assistance. Minutes 1872, p. 31; 1873, p. 34.

2. To furnish proper statistical blanks to the Stated Clerks of the lower Church Courts. Minutes 1873, p. 34; 1897, pp. 24, 26.

3. To report inefficient Stated Clerks to their Presbyteries and Synods. Minutes, 1889, p. 52; 1891, p. 15; 1898, p. 51.

4. The Stated Clerk's salary is \$500.00 per annum.

5. As far as he can do so consistently with other duties, he is to visit Church Courts and congregations and give encouragement and direction toward the general welfare of the Church, and shall be permitted to use also the title "General Traveling Secretary." See Minutes of 1901, p. 115.

II. The Assembly Treasurer.

The Stated Clerk shall also act as the Assembly's Treasurer, for the collection and handling of Contingent Tax. See Minutes of 1900, p. 47.

III. The Assembly Contingent Tax.

1. That the Assembly's Contingent Tax be four cents per resident member. Minutes 1908, p. 99. Tax due July 1, each year. Statement sent by Stated Clerk July 1, based on resident members, to each Presbyterial Treasurer. Minutes 1898, p. 63; 1903, p. 71.

The Assembly's Stated Clerk is not authorized to remit the Tax of a Presbytery. Any Presbytery regarding itself as, from any cause, entitled to relief from this tax or any portion thereof, may, by the Council and direction of its Synod, petition the Assembly to that effect. Minutes 1898, p. 73.

IV. The Assembly Minutes.

The Assembly Minutes will be sent, free of charge, to ordained

ministers, clerk of sessions, the various Boards and schools of the Church, such Synodical and Presbyterian Stated Clerks and Treasurer as are not ministers or session clerks, to those appointed by the Assembly to serve on Committees in the interim of Assembly meetings, to the Stated Clerk's "Exchanges," to all members of each Assembly, and a copy is to be sent to any probationer requesting it and sending ten cents to cover postage. Others desiring the Minutes can secure them by addressing Rev. J. L. Goodknight, Lincoln, Illinois, and enclosing fifty cents—none sold on credit. Minutes 1897, p. 46; 1903, p. 66; 1904, p. 66.

V. Presbyterian and Synodical Meetings.

The Assembly directs that every Presbytery shall hold a "Spring meeting," and as early as possible, and that Stated Clerks of Presbyteries shall have their reports in the hands of the Assembly's Stated Clerk not later than May 1; also that summer meetings of Church Courts shall be held late in the season, in order that there may have been sufficient time to become familiar with the deliverances of the Assembly. See pp. 39a, 67; Minutes, 1898, p. 52.

VI. Stated Clerks of Presbyteries.

1. The Assembly recommends that, as a matter of convenience and efficiency, Presbytery shall select the same person to serve as its Stated Clerk and Treasurer where this is practicable. Minutes 1897, p. 63.

2. This Assembly makes it a standing order that the Stated Clerks of the Presbyteries are to have their Statistical and Financial and other reports in the hands of the General Assembly's Stated Clerk by May 1st of each year, that there be no delay in publishing the Minutes of the General Assembly.

3. That the Stated Clerk of the General Assembly be directed not to delay the publishing of the Minutes on account of any delay in Presbyterian reports; that in fault of the Stated Clerk of any Presbytery, he shall publish the report as given the year before. Minutes 1909, p. 91.

VII. Examination of Assembly Minutes.

The Assembly directs that each Church Court, from session to Synod at its first meeting after the appearance of the Assembly Minutes, shall conduct in open meeting a careful examination of the

Minutes, as a means of discovering whether there be errors and omissions in the same and who is responsible therefore, so that the clerks of Church Courts may be held to rigid account for the discharge of their official duties. See Minutes for 1901, p. 77.

VIII Report of Board and Permanent Committees.

All the Assembly's Boards and Permanent Committees are ordered to close their books promptly on December 31 (except the Board of Ministerial Relief, which shall close books on January 31), and to have their annual reports in the hands of the Stated Clerk not later than April 1, in order that he may print the same and send them to Commissioners in advance of the Assembly's meeting. See Minutes for 1901, p. 117; 1903, p. 65.

IX. Assembly's Standing Rule.

In 1901, The General Assembly adopted the following: Resolved, That—

1. Popular meetings shall be held on successive evenings as follows, beginning at 8 o'clock:

Thursday, Home Missions.

Friday, Education.

Saturday, Sunday School and Young People's Work.

Monday, Foreign Missions.

Tuesday, Ministerial Relief.

Wednesday, Publication.

These popular meetings shall be under the direction of the Boards and Committees, respectively having these interests specially in charge.

2. Friday forenoon, Assembly business:

Appointment of Committees

Stated Clerk's Report.

Communications and Overtures.

Reports of Boards and Permanent Committees, etc.

The Boards and Committees are each to occupy not exceeding thirty minutes, and in the following order:

Educational.

Missions and Church Erection.

Publication.

Ministerial Relief.

Assembly Trustees.

As a rule, papers that are in print and in the hands of the members shall be accepted as having been read, those presenting them having opportunity for making remarks within the limits named.

The foregoing rules and order are suspended by Assembly 1908, p. 87. Like Committee for 1909

3. Friday afternoon. For so much of this period as may be necessary, the order of the forenoon is to be continued.

4. Assembly business in the forenoons of Saturday, Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday and Friday.

5. There shall be no business session of the Assembly on the afternoon of Saturday, Monday, Tuesday, the time being devoted to Committee work.

6. Reports of all Standing and Special Committees shall be considered in the order in which they are filed with the Stated Clerk.

7. All resolutions touching the general enterprise of the Church must be referred to appropriate Standing Committees for consideration before they can be taken up by the body.

8. No item of business in conflict with this Standing Rule shall be considered except by suspension of the Rule, by a two-thirds vote.

9. In all cases not provided for in its own Rules of Order, the Assembly is to be governed by Robert's Rules of Order.

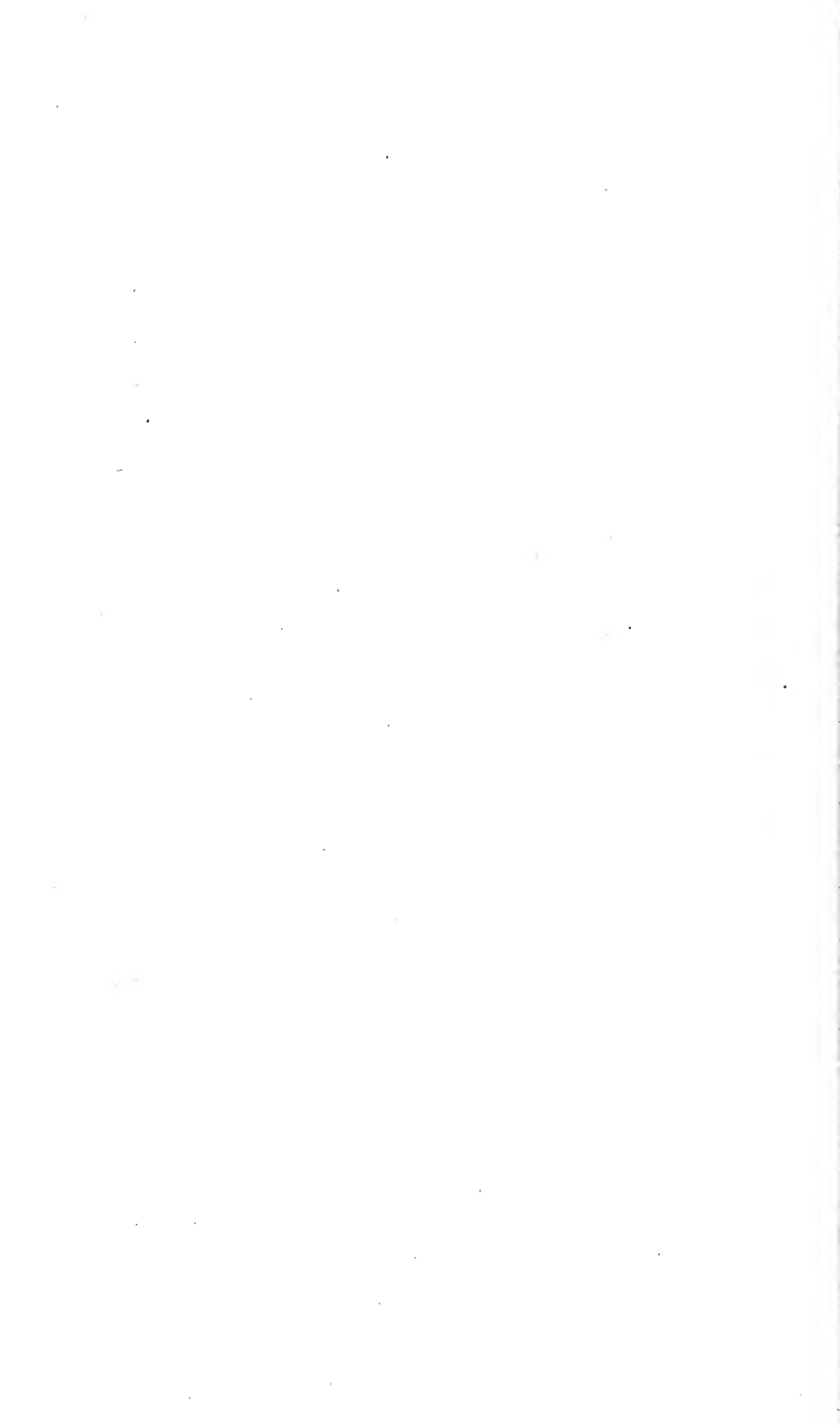
