MISCELLANEOUS REGULATIONS**I. THE ASSEMBLY'S STATED CLERK.**

Besides discharging the duties named in Form of Government, the Assembly Stated Clerk is required:

1. To discharge the duties of Engrossing Clerk, appointing such Temporary Clerks at each meeting of the Assembly as may be needed for his assistance. Minutes 1872, p. 31; 1873, p. 34.
2. To furnish proper statistical blanks to the Stated Clerks of the lower Church Courts. Minutes 1873, p. 34; 1897, pp. 24, 26.
3. To report inefficient Stated Clerks to their Presbyteries and Synods. Minutes 1889, p. 52; 1891, p. 15; 1898, p. 51.
4. As far as he can do so consistently with other duties, to visit Church Courts and congregations and give encouragement and direction toward the general welfare of the Church, being permitted to use also the title "General Traveling Secretary." See Minutes of 1901, p. 115.
5. The Stated Clerk's salary is \$750.00 per annum. See Minutes, year 1916. Page 73.
6. He shall also employ such press reporters during the sessions of the Assembly as may be necessary to give the Assembly news publicity. See Minutes 1916, p. 35.
7. The Stated Clerk of the General Assembly was instructed not to publish in the Minutes of the General Assembly any communications or reports unfavorably considered by the Assembly. (See page 27, Minutes 1917 Assembly.)
8. We recommend that the printing of the Minutes of the General Assembly, (until further ordered) be done by our own printing plant, the New Cumberland Press, and that it be paid a price of not exceeding ten percent above cost. (See page 130 Minutes 1917 Assembly.)

II. THE ASSEMBLY TREASURER.

The Stated Clerk shall also act as the Assembly's Treasurer, for the collection and handling of Contingent Tax. See Minutes of 1900, p. 47.

III. THE ASSEMBLY'S CONTINGENT TAX.

The Assembly's Contingent Tax shall be five cents per resident member, due July 1, each year. Minutes 1914, p. 146; 1908, p. 99. Statement sent by Stated Clerk July 1, based on resident members, to each Presbyterial Treasurer. Minutes 1898, p. 63; 1903, p. 7.

The Assembly's Stated Clerk is not authorized to remit the tax of a Presbytery. Any Presbytery regarding itself as, from any cause, entitled to relief from this tax or any portion thereof, may, by the counsel of and direction of its Synod, petition the Assembly to that effect. Minutes 1898, p. 73.

IV. THE ASSEMBLY'S MINUTES.

The Assembly Minutes will be sent, free of charge, to ordained ministers, clerks of sessions, the various Boards and schools of the Church, such Synodical and Presbyterial Stated Clerks and Treasurers as are not ministers or session clerks, to those appointed by the Assembly to serve on committees in the interim of Assembly meetings, to the Stated Clerk's Exchanges, to all members of each Assembly, and a copy is to be sent to any probationer requesting it and sending ten cents to cover postage. Others desiring the Minutes can secure them by addressing Rev. D. W. Fooks, Paducah, Ky., and enclosing 50 cents. Minutes 1897, p. 46; 1903, p. 66; 1904, p. 66.

V. PRESBYTERIAL AND SYNODICAL MEETINGS.

The Assembly directs that every Presbytery shall hold a "Spring meeting," and as early as possible, that the Stated Clerks of Presbyteries shall have their reports in the hands of the Assembly's Stated Clerk not later than May 1; also that summer meetings of Church Courts shall be held late in the season, in order that there may have been sufficient time to become familiar with the deliverances of the Assembly. See pp. 39, 67; Minutes 1898, p. 52.

VI. STATED CLERKS OF PRESBYTERIES.

1. The Assembly recommends that, as a matter of convenience and efficiency, Presbytery shall select the same person to serve as its Stated Clerk and Treasurer where this is practicable. Minutes 1897, p. 63.

2. This Assembly makes it a standing order that the Stated Clerks of the Presbyteries are to have their statistical, financial and other reports in the hands of the General Assembly's Stated Clerk by May 1st. of each year, that there may be no delay in publishing the Minutes of the General Assembly.

3. The Stated Clerk of the General Assembly has been directed not to delay the publishing of the Minutes on account of any delay in Presbyterial reports; and, in default of report from the Stated Clerk in any Presbytery, he shall publish the report as given the year before. Minutes 1909, p. 91.

VII. EXAMINATION OF ASSEMBLY MINUTES.

The Assembly directs that each Church Court, from session to Synod, at its first meeting after the appearance of the Assembly Minutes, shall conduct in open meeting a careful examination of the Minutes, as a means of discovering whether there be errors and omissions in the same and who is responsible therefor, so that the Clerks of Church Courts may be held to rigid account for the discharge of their official duties. See Minutes for 1901, p. 77.

VIII. REPORT OF BOARD AND PERMANENT COMMITTEES.

1. All the Assembly's Boards, Permanent Committees and Stated Clerks of Presbyteries are ordered to close their books promptly on or before April 1st., and to have their annual report in the hands of the Stated Clerk not later than April 1st., in order that he may print the same and send them to commissioners in advance of the Assembly's meeting. (See Minutes for 1901, p. 117; 1903, p. 66; 1917, p. 29.)

2. When the books and papers of any Board of this General Assembly, receiving and paying out money for any purpose, are submitted to a special auditing committee prior to the meeting of the Assembly, such books, papers, receipts, stubs, etc., together with report of said special committee shall be submitted to the Assembly's regular auditing committee. See Assembly Minutes for year 1916, page 121.

IX. ASSEMBLY'S STANDING RULE.

In 1901 and 1915, the General Assembly adopted the following:
Resolved, That:

1. Popular meetings shall be held on successive evening as follows, beginning at 8:00 o'clock:

Thursday—Home Missions.

Friday—Tithing.

Saturday—Sunday School and Young People's Work.

Sunday—Education.

Monday—Foreign Missions.

Tuesday—Ministerial Relief.

Wednesday—Publication.

These popular meetings shall be under the direction of the Boards and Committees, respectively having these interests specially in charge.

2. Friday forenoon—Assembly business:

Appointment of Committees.

Stated Clerk's Report.

Communications and Overtures.

Reports of Boards and Permanent Committees, etc.

The Boards and Committees are each to occupy not exceeding thirty minutes, and in the following order:

Educational.

Missions and Church Election.

Publication.

Ministerial Relief.

Assembly Trustees.

As a rule, papers that are in print and in the hands of the members shall be accepted as having been read, those presenting them having opportunity for making remarks within the limits named.

3. Friday afternoon. For so much of this period as may be necessary, the order of the forenoon is to be continued.

4. Assembly business in the forenoons of Saturday, Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday and Friday.

5. There shall be no business session of the Assembly on the afternoons of Saturday, Monday, Tuesday, the time being devoted to Committee work.

6. Reports of all Standing and Special Committees shall be considered in the order in which they are filed with the Stated Clerk.

7. All resolutions touching the general enterprise of the Church must be referred to appropriate Standing Committees for consideration before they can be taken up by the body.

8. No item of business in conflict with this Standing Rule shall be considered except by suspension of the Rule by a two-thirds vote.

9. In all cases not provided for in its own Rules of Order, the Assembly is to be governed by Robert's Rules of Order.

10. That we believe it would be wise for arrangements to be made for preaching services at 11:00 a. m., on Saturday and Monday and on Saturday and Monday afternoons for the benefit of the visitors or the Commissioners who are not engaged in the Committee Rooms, these arrangements to be made by the pastor-host.

MEMBERS OF CHURCH BOARDS

(Original resolution of 1910 as amended in 1912.)

TO THE MODERATOR AND MEMBERS OF THE 82ND GENERAL ASSEMBLY:
WHEREAS, There is no uniform number which constitutes the Boards of our church,

RESOLVED: 1. That in no case should there be more than nine members; and where there are nine members in the Board, three NEW members should be elected each year.

2. That where the Board is constituted of a less number than nine, that one-third of the members should be elected each year.

3. That no individual shall be a member of more than one Board.

4. That each Board so adjust itself as to comply with these rules after 1910 General Assembly.

5. That each Board may nominate to the General Assembly persons to fill the places of the one-third going out each year.—F. A. Brown.

OF THE EIGHTY-SEVENTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE

SESSION IN THE CUMBERLAND PRESBYTE-
RIAN CHURCH, LINCOLN, ILLINOIS,

MAY 17th TO 22nd, 1917.

FIRST DAY, THURSDAY—FORENOON SESSION,

MAY 17, 1917, 11:00 O'clock

The General Assembly of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church convened in its Eighty-seventh Annual Session in the Cumberland Presbyterian Church, Lincoln, Illinois, Thursday, May 17, 1917, at 11:00 o'clock a. m.

OPENING SESSION

The General Assembly was called to order by the Moderator, Rev. J. L. Price, of West Prairie Presbytery, Synod of Missouri, and was led in prayer by Rev. H. M. Guynn, of Obion Presbytery, Synod of West Tennessee.

A scripture lesson, Hebrews 1st. Chapter, was read by Rev. T. Ashburn, of Knoxville Presbytery, Synod of Tennessee, and the Assembly was led in prayer by Rev. S. L. Noel, of Marshall Presbytery, Synod of Texas.

The opening sermon was preached by the Moderator from the text, 11 Tim. 3:16, the theme "The Inspiration of the Holy Bible."

The Assembly was led in the Constituting Prayer by Dr. W. K. Piner, of Florida Presbytery, Synod of Alabama.

PROGRAM ADOPTED

A program, prepared by the Committee on Program, was read and adopted, subject to necessary changes.

RECESS

Recess was taken to the hour of 2:00 o'clock this afternoon, benediction by Dr. J. P. Campbell, of Ft. Smith Presbytery, Synod of Arkansas.

FIRST DAY, THURSDAY, AFTERNOON SESSION,

MAY 17, 1917, 2:00 O'clock

Recess out, the Assembly was called to order by the Moderator and was led in prayer by Rev. C. C. Miller, of Princeton Presbytery, Synod of Kentucky.

REPORT OF BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY

Bowling Green, Ky., April 30, 1917.

To the General Assembly of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church in Session at Lincoln, Ill.:

At the meeting of the Assembly Board of Trustees, the same officers were retained to serve for the year ending fourth Monday in June, 1917, (viz.) J. D. Smith, President; E. W. Beck, Vice President; M. R. Graham, Sec.; W. J. Denhardt, Treas.

But little business of importance has come before your Board. Nothing could be learned, during the year, relating to "The Carson Will Case."

Your Secretary would report, however, that he has been in active communication with the Administrator of the estate of the late Synthia A. Smith, of Decatur, Ill., with regard to the property bequeathed by the said Synthia A. Smith, to the proper officials to hold in charge for the use of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church in general. The property is estimated by the Administrator to be, in value, about twenty thousand dollars. I have, as yet, nothing definite to report concerning this matter. We recommend to the Assembly the appointment of Ruling Elder J. A. Stone of Bowling Green Congregation in lieu of Joe D. Smith, resigned.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON SUNDAY SCHOOL TEXT BOOK

To the Eighty-seventh General Assembly of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church, in Session at Lincoln, Ill., May, 1917:

Dear Fathers and Brethren:—

At the Eighty-fifth Assembly meeting in Memphis, Tenn., Rev. O. A. Barbee, Rev. C. M. Zwingle and Rev. T. Ashburn were appointed a committee to prepare a Denominational Teacher's Text Book for use in Cumberland Presbyterian Sunday Schools and Young People's Societies.

The committee realized the great undertaking, and shrank from the responsibility of writing such a book. Efforts were made with other denominations to secure the right to revise one already in print in harmony with the doctrines of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church. The committee finally secured permission from the owner of the copyright of the book published for the Christian denomination. While it would have been necessary to do considerable changing, the committee felt that it would be cheaper, and a great deal less work than writing a book entirely.

However, at the Eighty-sixth Assembly in Birmingham, the chairman of the committee found that so many of the commissioners were opposed to the plan that he did not read the report. A number of the commissioners insisted that we must have a denominational text book all our own, and not a revised work of some other denomination. Encouraged by so many, I finally concluded to make an effort to see if I could produce what the church desired.

I returned from the Assembly and immediately commenced work. I have spent almost every moment of my spare time from that meeting up to this hour, and have the manuscript ready to copy for the printer.

I have given the work the title of "The Student's Lamp," and have arranged the fifty lessons so that the work is not only adaptable to those desiring to be teachers in the Sunday School, but have planned it so that the lessons may be used for Teacher Training classes in the Sunday school, any class in the school desiring to take the course as a supplement to the regular lessons, young people's society topics, mid-week prayer meeting lessons, family study at home, individual pupils.

At the Eighty-sixth Assembly in Birmingham a committee on Doctrinal Literature Examination was appointed to examine all manuscript intended to be published as Cumberland Presbyterian doctrine. This committee has examined the manuscript of the Students' Lamp, and their separate reports are as follows:

Rev. A. C. Biddle's statement: "There are no strictures on doctrine so far as I am able to judge. It is a great undertaking. Your idea is comprehensive. Need is great. Your work will be a great blessing to our people."

From Rev. P. F. Johnson: "I did not make any notes on the manuscript as you suggested, as none were of a doctrinal nature. I am delighted with your work, and I shall take pleasure in recommending it."

From Rev. J. T. Barbee: "I find no objections in doctrine or otherwise. I am pleased with the arrangements of subjects. It surely is a great work, and I believe will accomplish great good when in the hands of the people. It will be a monument to your memory."

The lessons have been appearing weekly in the Cumberland Pearl, and I have received a number of commendations.

The Contents are as follows:

Preface, Endorsements, How to Use.

Five lessons on the Bible and its Books: 1. The Book; 2. Different Versions; 3. Authorship and Difficulties; 4. Old Testament Books; 5. New Testament Books. One lesson on Bible History by Dispensations.

Six lessons on Old Testament History by Periods: 1. The First Race; 2. The Abraham Race; 3. The Wilderness Wanderings; 4. The Conquest of Canaan; 5. The Israelite Kings; 6. The Foreign Rulers.

Six lessons on New Testament History by Periods: 1. The Preparation For Christ; 2. The Early Life of Christ; 3. The Ministry of Christ; 4. The Jewish-Christian Church; 5. The Jewish-Gentile Church; 6. The World Wide Church.

Five lessons on Bible Geography: 1. The Ancient World; 2. The Wilderness Wanderings; 3. Palestine; 4. The Land Of Christ; 5. The New Testament World.

Six lessons on Bible Institutions: 1. Places For Public Worship; 2. The Sacrifices; 3. The Sabbaths; 4. Jewish Anniversaries; 5. The Ordinances; 6. Character of Services.

Seven lessons on the Sunday School: 1. History of the Sunday School; 2. Definition and Purpose of the Sunday School; 3. The Sunday School, Home and Church; 4. The Sunday School Organized; 5. The Divisions of the Sunday School; 6. The Sunday School in Session; 7. The Sunday School At Work.

Seven lessons on the Teacher: 1. Qualification; 2. Use of the Bible; 3. Preparation; 4. Methods; 5. Questioning; 6. Illustrating; 7. Management.

Seven lessons on the Pupil: 1. The Pupil's Three-fold Nature; 2. Recreational Needs; 3. The Beginners and Primaries; 4. The Juniors; 5. The Intermediates; 6. The Young People and Adults; 7. Organized Class.

If the Assembly considers the work of sufficient value to be owned by the church, the manuscript may be purchased from the author, and copyrighted and owned by the church; or the church may publish the work as its own and pay the author a royalty.

If the Assembly does not wish to own the work, and deems it worthy of endorsement, the author will arrange to have it published for the use of the church.

REPORT OF THE BOARD OF MISSIONS

The Board of Missions offers the following report to the General Assembly in Session in Lincoln, Ill., May 17, 1917:

Dear Fathers and Brethren: The reel of time has struck and three hundred and sixty-five days have been wound into the hank of another year, and we must make a report of our stewardship. We have not been idle, for we have either gone in person or asked some one who was a member of the Presbytery or of the Synod to represent the Board at the meeting of their Presbytery or Synod. But we did not stop at Presbyteries and Synods, but wrote to all the pastors and session clerks, some of them as often as four time to be sure and take an offering for the Board of Missions. We have received an offering from one or more congregations in every Synod. There are ten Presbyteries from which we have not received an offering from a congregation in them, namely: Bartholomew, Burrow-Little Rock Presbyteries; Arkansas Synod, Ewing-McLin and Sangamon Presbyteries, Illinois Synod; Greer Presbytery, Indianola Synod, Yazoo Presbytery; Mississippi Synod, Cookville and Knoxville Presbyteries, Tennessee Synod; Dallas-Bonham Presbytery, Texas Synod. We can only reach the congregations through the ministers and the sessions, but some ministers and sessions are as inactive as the grave, when an appeal is made to them for money to help extend the bounds of our church. Our people are not penurious, but their leaders have never taught them they can worship God with their money as truly as they can by prayer and song, for much of what is called worship never gets farther than the sound of their voice. The offerings of this year are next to the greatest of any year since 1906, and yet

the amount of money received is so small that every lover of his church feels the blush on his cheek when he hears the amount.

We most humbly entreat you to demand of Synodical and Presbyterian Missionary Boards to report to your Board of Missions every cent of money they raise in their bounds for mission and church erection in order that proper credit may be given. If this was done we would report to the Assembly a sum of money that would cause us to thank God and say, we did well this year, but we will do better next year. If our people would take the church papers and read them they would see things differently, and would act differently. They would see such a picture of the possibility of our church, that hundreds of our members who are now inactive would become enthusiasts for the church, and that enthusiasm would so fire them that others would catch the spirit, and would so direct their energies, that we would become the most active church in christendom. If we could but realize the possibilities before us we would so humble ourselves before God, and be and do what he wants us to be, that within the next quarter of a century we would have a half million members. As a church we do not seem to realize that Ohio, Pennsylvania, Illinois, Missouri, Arkansas, Mississippi and all of the south-west, and west and northwest, with their millions of people and fertile valleys, rich soil and gas and ores, are an inviting field to us. The people who live in these states are beseeching to us to come among them and preach the gospel to them as Cumberland Presbyterians believe and preach. Shall these hundreds of thousands of people call to us in vain? If so then God will take this field from us and give it to a people who will give them the gospel.

We need to build more churches. Building churches is a part of our work. We are making commendable progress, but we need to do more. The people whom we hope to reach are willing to worship in a plain house until they are able to build better. There are many places where a few hundred dollars invested in erecting a building or buying a house that would accommodate us and would save to us thousands of people, and in a few brief years we would have a membership, and beautiful houses of worship that would not only be a credit to us, but to any denomination. O that God would open the eyes of every Cumberland Presbyterian, that each one might see the possibilities of our church.

Not one of our Boards has had and still has as much to contend with as your Board of Missions. Every Synod and many of the Presbyteries have a missionary organization, which is to look after the mission work in their bounds. These organizations are usually called Board of Missions, and collections are taken for them. Now this creates confusion, and when the time comes to take the offering for the Assembly's Board of Missions, the people do not understand that the offering they made, which may have been just a month before, was for the work in their own bounds, and having given once for missions, they think that is enough; and the result is your Board does not get anything from them. From the most of these synodical and presbyterial Boards of Missions no report is made to the Assembly Board, of the amount of money they have raised. This ought not to be. Since 1906 too many people look with suspicion on men who are on any one of the Assembly Boards. An honest man has no objection to being watched, but he should be treated as honest until he shows he is not; and when the time comes to make the offering for Assembly's Boards the people should have an opportunity to contribute.

What the Board is Doing INDIANOLA SYNOD

Wagoner, Okla.—Rev. J. S. Hall, who was the missionary at this place, resigned December 31, 1916. Since then the Presbyterian Missionary Committee, in the bounds of which Wagoner is, have been looking after that work.

McAlister.—The Church in this place has asked your Board to help them pay the salary of a minister they think they can get. The Church is being supplied just as often as they can get some one to preach to them. This is an important place to our Church in the Indianola Synod and should have preaching all the time.

Pryor, Okla.—For some reason it is hard to find a minister who suits this Church and the Church suit the minister. Your Board is not supplementing the salary of the minister who is supplying them.

Cherokee Presbytery.—Rev. D. F. Blasingame is the missionary for this presbytery. According to his reports and the statement of the Presbyterian Committee on

Missions he is doing a good work. The Board is supplementing his salary of \$25 a month.

TEXAS SYNOD

Quanah, Tex.—This Church hopes to be free from debt in July, when it will be dedicated. They have asked the Board of Missions for fifty dollars that they may be able to pay their indebtedness.

ARKANSAS SYNOD

De Queen, Ark.—The Board is supplementing the salary of the pastor of this Church, Rev. G. E. Greer, \$10 a month. He reports the Church is taking on new life, and the prospects for a self-sustaining Church are encouraging.

PACIFIC SYNOD

Your Board is assisting three places in this Synod. California is an inviting field for our Church. This State is the gateway to the orient. There is not a State in the United States that has as many nationalities in it as California has, and for this reason we should enter every door that is open to us in this the golden State. If we will do this, in a short time we will be stronger on the Pacific Coast than we have ever been. We will not only reach Americans, but Chinese and Japanese as well. Some of these converts will return to their own country to preach the gospel to their own people. With the few members we have in California we are doing a great work among the Chinese. If somebody would give the Board a few thousand dollars to be used in mission work in this State, it would not be long until the Pacific Synod would be leading the Church in mission work.

Fresno.—This Church is out of debt and hopes to be self-sustaining in the next twelve months. By a gift of two of the members the debt was paid and enough left to start a building fund for a manse. When the manse is built and paid for, which they hope to do within a year, they think they will be able to support their pastor. Rev. W. M. Freeze is the pastor. The Board is supplementing his salary, twenty-five dollars a month.

Merced.—This Church is growing under the leadership of Rev. E. W. Johnson. If the Church was out of debt, it would grow faster. Will not some one whose heart the Lord has touched pay this debt and unbind the Church and let it go free? If this burden was removed, the members could give their strength and time in bringing the lost to Christ. The Board is supplementing the salary of the pastor, twenty-five dollars a month.

Los Angeles.—Rev. C. H. Walton is your missionary at this place. He reports the Church is growing steadily. With a self-sustaining Church and a well-housed congregation in Los Angeles we will be a power for good in one of the greatest cities on the Pacific Coast. The growth of this city is wonderful. With the First Church self-sustaining, it would not be long until we could organize another Church in another part of the city. Your Board supplements the salary of C. H. Walton, fifteen dollars a month.

OUR FOREIGN WORK—CHINA

While your Board has no missionary in China, yet a member of the Board is not only supporting a Bible-Reading Woman in China, but has endowed her and her successor as long as the China Mission remains a Cumberland Presbyterian Mission.

We hope it will not be long before the Lord will lay it on the hearts of some of our young men to go to this, one of the most promising fields in the world. The day is not far in the future when China will be one of the leading nations of the world; so that it can be said, as goes China so goes the world. In China Brother Gam is educating two bright young men who are preparing for the ministry. He asked the Board of Missions to help keep them in school. The cost is about a hundred dollars, in gold, a year. We had no money for that purpose, but by private solicitation we raised the money. With these two young men thoroughly equipped for the ministry, with the other converts who are already at work, we will have a working force for which we should be thankful.

A MISSIONARY DAY FOR OUR SABBATH SCHOOLS AND YOUNG PEOPLE'S SOCIETY

We urge that each Sabbath school and Young People's Society should at least once a year make an offering for missions. Why cannot our Sabbath schools and Young

People undertake the support of a native missionary in China? The Church will never grow as it should until she utilizes all her resources. We will never do what we ought to do until every congregation makes offerings regularly for missions.

TERMS OF OFFICE WHICH EXPIRE AT THIS MEETING

The time for which Vint N. Bray, G. W. Freeman, and Rev. D. W. Cheek were elected expires at this meeting of the General Assmblly. Brother Bray has been called to the better world. We recommend that you appoint Ruling Elder J. E. Eberts to take the place of Brother Bray and that you appoint G. W. Freeman to succeed himself and that you appoint Rev. R. L. Layman to succeed Rev. D. W. Cheek who has moved to the State of Mississippi.

BEQUESTS TO THE BOARD

Whether man was born to die may be questioned, but that men do die is a fact that is not questioned; therefore all Cumberland Presbyterians who have means in making their wills should remember the cause of missions; and if they think best, should make the Cumberland Presbyterian Board of Missions and Church Erection one of their heirs.

**ANNUAL REPORT OF THE CUMBERLAND PRESBYTERIAN BOARD OF
EDUCATION**

To the Moderator and Brethren of the Eighty-seventh General Assembly of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church, in session at Lincoln, Ill., May 17-22, 1917:

Dear Fathers and Brethren: Your Board of Education are gratified to report to you a very satisfactory year's work. We believe that the work of the past year has been more profitable than that of any year since the unhappy division in our denomination. There were times during the year when we could not see just how we were to be able to complete the year's work; but, in answer to our repeated calls for funds with which to carry on the work of our Board, our congregations and many individuals responded and placed in the treasury of our Board money enough to make us able to complete our year's work. During the year we have given assistance to forty-one students.

We have earnestly tried to obey every suggestion of the General Assembly whose servants we are. We have tried to safe-guard the funds entrusted to us and to disburse same in the most practical and profitable way possible. We are trying to keep in close touch with every beneficiary of the Board; and if one shows himself unworthy, it is our purpose to withhold assistance from such a one. We demand of all beneficiaries that they submit written, monthly reports to the Treasurer of our Board stating the number of days in school, the number of hours per week at recitation, whether or not they have obeyed the rules of the school and Board, the amount of money spent for board, tuition clothing, books, laundry, and tobacco, the amount of money on hand, any other expense, their average grade, etc. We feel that we have a right to know these things of the ones whom we are aiding.

The Board has been in session at the regular stated times during the year. These Board meetings have been well attended, spiritual and harmonious. Truly your Board of Education is not a Board of factions. God, grant that it may never be! On the first Thursday in July, 1916, all the officers of last year were re-elected and are as follows: J. H. Coplen, President; S. H. Braly, Vice President; W. B. Cunningham, Corresponding Secretary and Treasurer; C. A. Davis, Recording Secretary.

The term of office of C. C. Costen, S. H. Braly, and J. H. Coplen expires with this meeting of the General Assembly. It becomes the duty of this Assembly to elect their successors. We have no recommendations to make concerning these appointments. The action of the General Assembly will be our pleasure. We would call your attention to this fact, however, that it is economy to appoint men to this Board who do not reside to far from McKenzie, the regular meeting place of the Board. The Board pays the expense of members to the Board meetings, and the nearer the members of the Board reside to the place of meeting, the smaller the expense.

Our endowment accounts have all been collected except the J. H. Zarecor note of \$50 due January 8, 1916. All endowment funds collected have been loaned, well secured, and are yielding interest at the rate of six per cent.

Praying that this may be our greatest General Assembly and awaiting your further directions, we are,

THIRTY-SIXTH ANNUAL REPORT OF THE BOARD OF MINISTERIAL RELIEF OF THE CUMBERLAND PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH

To the Eighty-Seventh General Assembly of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church, in session at Lincoln, Ill., May 17-22, 1917.

Dear Fathers and Brethren: Your Board of Ministerial Relief herewith submits its thirty-sixth annual report to your reverend body:

It is indeed a great pleasure to report that in the face of the serious financial conditions through which we are passing, caused by the excessive cost of the staples of life, that this has been one of the most prosperous years in the recent history of the Board of Ministerial Relief.

Through the fine spirit of faithfulness of the noble-hearted men, women, and children of our Church, there has been a splendid increase in the offerings, which will enable your Board again this year to materially increase the apportionment to each beneficiary of the Board.

ON OUR ROLLS

There has been on our roll during the past year fifteen ministers and fifteen widows of ministers, which it has been a great pleasure of your Board to gladden and comfort, through the funds which you have entrusted to us for that purpose.

There have been eight children and one minister in the home at Bowling Green, Ky., during the year, who thereby have been beneficiaries of the Board. At the present time we have ten ministers and thirteen widows as beneficiaries, also five children and one minister in the home. There are now a number of applications for beneficiaries of the Board, which will enter on our May payment of the new year.

ENTERED INTO REST

During the year three ministers and one widow have passed into their eternal home, which has brought sorrow to the Board.

Rev. M. G. Milligan, of Talladega Presbytery, Alabama Synod, died July 16, 1916.

Rev. M. M. Smith, Logan Presbytery, Kentucky Synod, died August 29, 1916.

Rev. N. W. Berry, McGee Presbytery, Missouri Synod, died January 3, 1917.

Mrs. Alberta Wilmon, Bartholomew Presbytery, Arkansas Synod, died February 1917.

The sorrow which comes to the Board and Church through the deaths of these beloved fathers and mothers in Zion is truly that of the loss of our loved ones; but, truly, "They rest from their labors, and their works do follow them."

EMERGENCY DISTRESS CALL

Since taking charge of the work June 20, 1916, we have answered nine distress calls, aggregating \$145.

Nothing is more necessary than this phase of the work, which enables help to come to any of our ministers when overtaken by misfortune or sickness, although not a regular beneficiary of the Board.

OFFERINGS FOR THE YEAR

We are glad to report that, through the co-operation of the pastors and members of the Church, there has been quite an increase in the offerings for this year, as the statistical exhibit will show.

THE WORK OF THE CORRESPONDING SECRETARY AND TREASURER

The Corresponding Secretary and Treasurer, Rev. John A. McLane, has spared neither postage nor time in placing the needs of the work before the Church and in the execution of the duties of the office work.

Every offering has been receipted within a few days of its arrival at the office.

AUDIT

The books and accounts of the Corresponding Secretary and Treasurer were audited by the Board at its February meeting and were found in excellent condition.

VACANCIES BY EXPIRATION OF TERM OF MEMBERS

The term of membership of Rev. Wm. H. Hutchinson, of Tennyson, Ind., Rev. J. M. Cook, of Greenville, Ky., and Rev. J. T. Coleman, of Nashville, Tenn., expire with this meeting of the General Assembly.

The Board, at its February meeting, recommended to your reverend body that Rev. J. M. Cook and Rev. J. T. Coleman be elected to succeed themselves and that Rev. C. A. Galloway be elected to succeed Rev. Wm. H. Hutchinson.

THE HOME

The report of Dr. T. W. Stone, President and Attending Physician and Treasurer of the Board of Managers of the Home, is herewith submitted and made a part of this annual report.

(Note—Report of the Trustees of the Cumberland Presbyterians Orphans' Home, also the report of Dr. Stone, the physician of the Home, to this Assembly will be found in the report of the Financial Statement of Cumberland Presbyterian Orphans' Home, on Pages 49 and 52.)

CUMBERLAND PRESBYTERIAN ORPHANS' HOME

Bowling Green, Ky., April 12, 1917.

Dear Brethren: I hereby submit my annual report of the Home located at Bowling Green, Ky:

We have at present five children who are regular inmates, having Lockett and Ernestine Evans from Arrington Street congregation in Nashville, Tenn., since our last report. The children of Mrs. Halbert did not take advantage of our offer this year. We have also taken care of the three Thompson children of Nashville, Tenn., for a few weeks.

Rev. W. C. Lloyd has been cared for during the whole year. His health has improved some, but he is not able to do any work yet.

The three Crews children have been with us for three years, and it is a great pleasure to see how much they have developed.

The children are in good health, attending school regularly and Sunday school each Sabbath.

Our buildings are in good condition, but need some remodeling to make them comfortable in winter.

As physician of the Home, I have made twenty-three visits to the institution and have made three hundred and ten dressings at my office during the year.

The running expenses have been greater during the year, caused largely by the high cost of living prevailing in the country. The Church at large has furnished us more provisions this year than any before.

POLICIES OF THE BOARD

All meetings of the Board are held with open doors, and any member of the Church or other person is privileged to attend each session of the Board Meeting.

In executing and administering the duties and offices of the Board, it is the sense of the Board to use the greatest precaution that the expenses may be kept to the smallest amount possible.

That any minister or minister's widow may, in case of total disability, receive help from the Board until able to care for themselves or until their Presbyteries can make them regular beneficiaries of the Board.

That the Home at Bowling Green, Ky., is the home of every aged or infirm minister, minister's widow, or orphan child in the Church. It is the hearty wish of the Church and of the Board that this Home be filled to its utmost capacity. It would cost but little more for four or five times the number of persons to have the opportunities of the Home than it is costing to maintain the Home at the present time. We urge that every orphan child, where either or both father and mother were Cumberland Presbyterian, and not otherwise provided for, be made beneficiaries of the Board and sent to the Home at Bowling Green, Ky.

RULES

The General Assembly has set apart the months of December and January as special periods for offerings to be made by Churches, Sunday schools, Young People's Societies, and individuals for the support of our aged and infirm ministers, ministers' widows, and the orphan children of the Church.

The Presbytery has the sole power of making a minister, minister's widow, or orphan children beneficiaries of the Board.

The application must be filled out and signed by the Moderator and stated clerk of the Presbytery and forwarded to the Corresponding Secretary and Treasurer of the Board.

Simply reporting names of persons who are in need is not making them beneficiaries of the Board. They should be made beneficiaries in regular order to receive help from the Board.

Presbyteries which have beneficiaries of the Board who have become able to resume active work, thus providing for themselves, should notify the Corresponding Secretary and Treasurer to drop their name from the roll of beneficiaries.

The Home will not receive any person who has any form of contagious disease or who is insane.

A widow, should she marry, ceases to be a beneficiary of the Board.

The Corresponding Secretary and Treasurer shall make full a report of all finance handled for the year and submit his books, vouchers, and papers for the inspection and audit of the Board at the February meeting.

NOTE OF EXPLANATION

The Board of Ministerial Relief, for the first half year following the periods for offerings to this Board, have a surplus of funds which are never needed until the last half of the year. This year, owing to the change in the management of the Publishing House by the Board of Publication and Sunday school and Young People's Work, the Board found themselves without funds and credit. The Board of Ministerial Relief made a loan of \$1,000 on January 24, 1917, to the Board of Publication for six months on triple security to re-establish the credit of the Board and put it on a working basis until it could collect notes and accounts due it.

Realizing that much criticism has arisen against the Board and many rebukes offered for this action, yet the Board feels that it has done its duty to another member of the same body of our beloved Church.

STATISTICAL TABLE

The former Corresponding Secretary and Treasurer having failed to get the report of offerings from April 1, 1916, to June 20, 1916, in our hands in time to credit each Presbytery and Synod with the same, we hereby submit his report as given. Also disbursements covering the same period of time, making our report proper from June 20, 1916, to April 1, 1917.

REPORT OF MUSIC EDITOR

To the General Assembly of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church, to meet in Lincoln, Ill., May 17, 1917.

Moderator, Fathers, and Brethren: In submitting my annual report as your Music Editor, I desire to emphasize the following particulars.

1. As to "The Songs of Zion," our new Church Hymnal, I am pleased to report that it is steadily growing in favor with our Churches wherever it is introduced, the greatest difficulty being that it is not introduced as rapidly as we feel that it ought to be. This Hymnal should be in every Cumberland Presbyterian Church throughout our broad land. Other denominations have their churches stocked with their own Hymnals, and thus prove their loyalty to their own Church, just as we do by using our own Sabbath school literature in our churches. (If any do not, they should be ashamed. There is no literature quite so good for Cumberland Presbyterians as the literature that bears the stamp of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church.)

2. I call your attention to the large array of testimonials from many of the brethren in the ministry and laity, both in and outside of our Church, as found in the New Circular, giving a description of the book with specimen pages of the music, which will be circulated at this meeting of your body. I respectfully ask that you provide yourselves with one or as many as you may want to take home with you for your churches to examine. You will find this book has been highly recommended by ministers and the press of other denominations.

3. The publishers, believing that this Hymnal deserved a wider circulation than any one Church could give, have issued a "Regular Edition" which corresponds in style of binding, prices, etc., with our "Cumberland Presbyterian" edition, the only difference being in the title page.

4. It affords us a sense of real pleasure to note the fact that the people, even the young people, are expressing a desire to return to the use of the grand old hymns and tunes that fired the hearts of our fathers and mothers in the years gone by. How pleasing to see the old saints as they take their harps down from the "willows" again and tune them once more to the grand old songs of Zion which they sang in the days of their childhood. These songs are soul-satisfying. They carry comfort to the weary and worn. They tell of sweet rest in heaven. And

"Breaking through the clouds that gather
O'er the Christian's natal skies,
Distant beams like floods of glory,
Fill the soul with glad surprise;
And we almost hear the echo
Of the pure and holy throng,
In the bright, the bright forever,
In the summer land of song."

This hymn is No. 341 in the New Hymnal and is only one of the many others of which it is a fair sample. It was written by that immortal hymn-writer, Fanny J. Crosby.

5. But we would not have the Church to forget the debt of gratitude we owe the publishers for making it possible for us to obtain a new Hymnal that we can call our own. For before, we were compelled to accept second-handed books that were worn out before they reached us. Thanks to our noble publishers; and not only our own, but in either round or shaped notes, and either with or without the Bible readings for the responsive service.

6. I desire to acknowledge with deep appreciation the fact that our Board of Publication, some months ago, ordered that an advertisement of the Hymnal be run free in the Cumberland Presbyterian until this meeting of the Assembly. The Board has thus given its endorsement in a substantial way to the Hymnal.

7. If our pastors would only take up the matter and suggest to their Churches that they should give preference to the Church's own adopted Hymnal over all other song books, it need not be a great while until the sale of the Hymnal would discharge our financial obligation to the publishers, besides furnishing our churches with a Hymnal that is second to no other now published. I ask that you emphasize and urge that this be done.

8. We would not discourage the use of new songs in the Sabbath school and Young People's Societies, but we do plead for the use of the standard hymns and

tunes in the regular worship of the Church. No church can afford to be without the hymnal in its regular services, and we desire that you emphasize this thought in your recommendations.

9. We continue to receive testimonials from ministers and others in all parts of our Church expressing their high appreciation of the merits of the Hymnal, and we believe that with your continued approval of it and a ready co-operation on the part of the ministers and churches the Hymnal will soon be in use in all our congregations.

10. As to books for use in the Sabbath school, Young People's Societies, and revivals, I mention "Times of Refreshing," "Hymns of Calvary," "Cumberland Hymns, Centenary Edition," "The Harp of Glory, with and without a Supplement," "Sound the Battle Cry," etc. These can be used as auxiliary helps in connection with the Hymnal. We purpose publishing a new book of this class by next spring, to be known as "Cross and Crown, or Songs of Warfare and Victory." This book will be strictly up-to-date and cannot fail to please the Church.

Trusting that our work as your Music Editor may have been such as to merit a continuation of your sanction and approval, I am yours for the best service I am capable of rendering to the Lord and our beloved Church.

REPORT OF THE PERMANENT COMMITTEE ON HISTORICAL SOCIETY

Dayton, Tenn., April 30, 1917.

To the Moderator and brethren of the Eighty-Seventh General Assembly of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church:

As Secretary of the Historical Society of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church, I would report as follows:

There has not been a meeting of this committee since the last meeting of the Assembly for the following reasons: (1) there has been no money in the hands of the Secretary to pay the expense of a call meeting, and we have felt that it would be an injustice to the members of the committee to have them pay the expense out of their own money when there was no apparent need for a meeting. (2) There has nothing been brought to the attention of the committee, or at last to the Secretary requiring the call of the committee.

We would report that it seems to be the mind of the committee and of the Church, as far as we have been able to read this mind, to have this committee to proceed with the collection of data and when the proper time shall arrive to have this history written there will be plenty of time to write it. But in our opinion this time has not yet arrived for many reasons, chief among them being the deplorable conditions existing in all the world, brought about by the "world war." That has been the cause of strenuous times in the financial world, and we think that should all other things be settled, it would be unwise to proceed to the issuance of the history at this time. Again we might remark that the unsettled condition of the Church would prohibit the work being successfully done at this time.

We would ask that the Assembly give these reasons assigned the attention they deserve; and if it is the mind of the Assembly to proceed at once with the work, to so order the committee, and it will comply to the very best of its ability.

REPORT OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE CUMBERLAND PRESBYTERIAN THEOLOGICAL SEMINARY TO THE EIGHTY-SEVENTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE CUMBERLAND PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH

Brethren: Three meetings, two regular and one special, of your Board have been held during the year. At the first meeting, which was held in McKenzie, Tenn., June 1, 1916, Rev. B. J. Reagin was re-elected President of the Board and Rev. J. L. Hudgins was re-elected as Secretary and Treasurer of the same. The Secretary and Treasurer was authorized to use the sum of \$100 in prosecuting the work of raising an endowment fund during the year, if needed.

The school year, so far as the Seminary is concerned, was reduced to eight scholastic months, but this was not to interfere with the annual salaries paid to teachers in the Seminary.

A Loan Committee was created, consisting of D. M. McAnulty, of Bolivar, Tenn., W. T. Marshall, Lebanon, Tenn., and the Secretary and Treasurer.

A committee consisting of Rev. H. S. McCord, D. M. McAnulty, and W. T. Marshall was appointed to prepare an appeal to the Church in behalf of the Endowment Fund of the Theological Seminary. This appeal was sent out in due time.

Upon motion of Rev. H. S. McCord a degree to be known as Bachelor of Theology and indicated by B.Th. shall be conferred upon all students completing the course of study known as No. 2.

The Board recorded its unanimous approval of the enactment of the General Assembly at Birmingham, Ala., as expressed in the following: "Whereas some teachers of theology are surrendering the doctrine of the Divinity of Christ, we intrust the teachers in our Seminary to lay special emphasis on the divinity of Christ, the inspiration of the Bible, and the endless punishment of the unrepentant wicked."

At the special meeting of the Board held in Nashville, Tenn., on August 22, 1916, nothing was done except to make some changes in the matter of the securities offered by Rev. A. N. Eshman for loan made to him, the changes being regarded by the Board as no disadvantage to the Board but an accommodation to Brother Eshman who paid the expenses of the meeting.

The second regular meeting of the Board was held at McKenzie, Tenn., on Thursday, April 12, 1917.

REPORT OF THE BOARD OF PUBLICATION, SUNDAY SCHOOL AND YOUNG PEOPLE'S WORK OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE CUMBERLAND PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH, IN SESSION AT LINCOLN, ILLINOIS, MAY 17-22, 1917.

The General Assembly, meeting in Birmingham, Alabama, May, 1916, united the Board of Publication and that of Sunday School and Young People's Work, under name of the Board of Publication, Sunday School and Young People's Work. The scope of the work committed to it embraced all that had before been the province of each.

The Board met June twenty-ninth and organized by electing Henry J. Graf, Evansville, Indiana, President; and Rev. T. Ashburn, Knoxville, Tennessee, Secretary and Treasurer.

Rev. J. L. Hudgins was employed as editor of The Cumberland Presbyterian; Rev. T. H. Padgett and Miss Allie May Taylor were secured for the chief part of the work on our Sunday School Literature.

THE VISITOR was entrusted to Mr. T. A. Havron, who changed its name to THE CUMBERLAND PEARL. Mr. Havron is now editing and publishing this paper for the Board at no cost to the Board, nor remuneration for that privilege. This arrangement is to continue until January 1, 1918.

We made a careful survey of the needs and conditions of all departments of work entrusted to our care, and endeavored seriously and earnestly to devise means and plans to promote its usefulness and to prosper the trust committed to us. We

were anxious to extend and to improve the efficiency of the Sunday Schools and Young People's Societies; and to place our church on a plane with sister denominations in this important branch of its work. We also desired to improve and extend the usefulness of the CUMBERLAND PRESBYTERIAN, and to inaugurate a system that would offer our people a chance to get good denominational books conveniently.

Rev. T. Ashburn, who was for a number of years a member of the Board of Sunday School and Young People's Work, and who was actively in touch with this department of work, was employed to give all of his time to its development and extension. He began his work in the field September 8, 1916, at salary of one hundred twenty-five dollars per month. He visited individual Sunday Schools, held institutes and meetings for groups, and attended Presbyterian and Synodical meetings. The results have been so satisfactory that the Board is convinced that it made no mistake in taking this advanced step. Later it was found necessary that a part of his time be spent at the Publishing House to formulate plans, and secure helps and equipment to supply the needs of our Sunday Schools.

The Board of Publication had a contract with the Rev. A. N. Eshman, which made him practically the lessee of the Printing Plant and the Publishing interest of the church, and which did not expire until October 1, 1916. While this contract was in force, the work was continued as previously, along publishing and printing lines, and the Sunday School and Young People's Work was continued as it had been, and the incomes and expenses were kept separate.

When the former contract with Rev. A. N. Eshman expired the Board employed him as Business Manager of the Publishing interests of the church, at a salary of one hundred dollars per month. Rev. Eshman was obliged, however, to look after private enterprises as well, and the urgent needs of his affairs and the pressing demands for his time and attention to prosper them kept him from giving the business of the Board such consideration and service as it required. He retained the position as Manager until January 6, 1917, when he resigned.

Rev. J. L. Hudgins was then made business manager, and the duties of this position were added to those already placed upon him as editor of The Cumberland Presbyterian. Although extra work and responsibilities were added, no increase was made in his salary.

The Board took hold of the Printing Plant with the thought that it is to be used for the development and fostering of the literature of the church, and not primarily as an institution for profit. We improved The Cumberland Presbyterian and increased its circulation. Since the first of the year, better paper has been used, the mechanical work is better, and the general make-up of the paper has been improved.

The Board has sought to improve the Sunday School Literature, but on account of conditions beyond its control, nothing could be done until the issues for the Second Quarter for 1917. Further reference is made to the literature in another paragraph of this report. The Board has been very much gratified at the way the church at large has supported its efforts. Many expressions of appreciations have come from the people where our literature is used.

Much improvement was made in the Sunday School supply department. We can now supply our people with nearly all the reading matter and the various helps for church work needed by any one. This department is rapidly growing, and our people are showing their appreciation more and more by their patronage.

The matter of economy has entered into the management of the printing plant. The salary of an extra man for business manager was saved. The proof reading is being done by other office employees, and in this way another saving of sixty dollars per month was made. Other items in the running expenses of the Printing Plant have also been reduced.

Summary for the year ending April 1, 1917:

- The running expenses of the Printing Plant greatly reduced;
- The CUMBERLAND PRESBYTERIAN improved;
- The Sunday School Supply Department greatly enlarged;
- Sunday School Literature improved;
- A field man appointed for Sunday School and Young People's Work;
- A better credit established for the Publishing Plant.

The Board always welcomes criticisms and suggestions fairly and intelligently made, and they receive such consideration and reply as the Board can give them. The Board is always ready to admit that mistakes may be made by it; but after it

has listened to and considered such suggestions, it cannot undertake to satisfy each person or follow the lines of suggestions when deemed unwise or impracticable. Such suggestions sometimes involve the employment, at a salary, of the person urging the changes; and of course it frequently occurs that the suggester feels piqued when his ideas are not at once followed.

We feel that the General Assembly should discourage such persons and their friends from intemperate and vicious attacks upon the Board. The members of the Board serve without compensation. They are busy men, and have neither the time nor inclination to enter into a long drawn-out discussion of the wisdom of their course in any particular matter. Nor do they deem it advisable that the official organ of the church, THE CUMBERLAND PRESBYTERIAN, be diverted from constructive work in order that these vicious criticisms be answered.

Articles have appeared in the Cumberland Presbyterian Banner reflecting on the honesty and integrity of the members of the Board. We refer specifically to articles and comments in the Banner of March 16 and 30; April 6, 13, 20 and 27; and May 4.

The imputations of these articles and comments lack all essence of common courtesy and respect, and evince an unfairness on the part of the writers that would only arise from a sinister motive. The viciousness of the attack does not comport with honest criticism. On the contrary they conform more nearly to a newly acquired venom distilled from disappointed hopes. The articles are libelous in their nature, and indirectly reflect on the good name of the General Assembly and the Cumberland Presbyterian Church.

We are the servants of your reverend body, and we respectfully ask that you fully investigate the intent and purpose of the writers and publisher of these articles, and find whether or not they are unselfish, true, and in the spirit of brotherly love, and we further ask you to fully investigate our conduct of the business of your Board of Publication and Sunday School and Young People's Work, and if we are found guilty of the neglect indicated and the misdemeanors insinuated and charged by the articles and the comments of the editor of the Banner, then in all fairness to the work and the welfare of the church, you should select other brethren to conduct the Board's affairs. But, if you find that we have, as we claim, given of our time and means to the business of your Board; and that we have faithfully and honestly striven to conduct its affairs as is becoming Christian brethren, and in accordance with the practices and principles underlying all honorable business, then we ask your endorsements of our efforts.

We have been urged to make more changes and improvements in the Sunday School Literature, and the claim is made that no attention was given to the suggestions. We maintain that the matter was carefully considered and an effort was made to put some of the plans offered in operation. After careful investigation it was found, however, that the cost, which included that of an extra editor, was so much greater than obtained under the former plan, that the Board was obliged to defer making radical changes, and endeavored to improve the old line of supplies until its financial stringency is somewhat relieved.

The Board did not get direct control of the publishing and printing business until October, 1916; and it did not get complete control of its finances until January, 1917. In the uncertain conditions in which it was obliged to work for more than half of the year, it could not undertake plans of any kind that would involve it more than existing conditions already involved it.

Besides, arrangements with persons for work on the contents and production of the Quarterlies and other papers are more or less far reaching and obligatory. It is not advisable, and often not possible, to overturn existing plans, methods, or measures without the proper allowance of time. Any party doing business honorably, and in a proper business-like way is not always free to revoke agreements, or to cancel arrangements at will. Some arrangements in business are flexible, others are more or less rigid, and any change contemplated requires the element of time.

We were urged also to undertake the publication of new books, and get out new editions of old ones. Neither of the requests could, under existing conditions, be carried out so far. The Board cannot well afford to undertake anything more that would make additional business obligations until it is possible to do so without involving it in further debt.

We have sought, during the past year, to break away from former practices and conditions, that were imposed by circumstances surrounding the task of your Board.

We have tried to place all lines of the business in the province of the Board on a better footing and a higher plane, and we believe that, though there were many hindrances, we have succeeded in a large measure.

We state again, that we desire your reverend body to investigate the efforts, plans and methods of your Board, and deal with it as the result of such investigation warrants.

**REPORT OF STATED CLERK AND GENERAL TRAVELING SECRETARY OF
THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE CUMBERLAND
PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH**

To the Eighty-seventh meeting of the General Assembly of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church, in session at Lincoln, Ill., May 17-22, 1917:

Beloved Brethren: As your Stated Clerk and General Traveling Secretary we submit for your consideration our annual report. We have given to the work this year the very best service possible and surrendered our time unreservedly to what we humbly believed to be the very best interest of the church at large.

Statistics

We have put forth, it seems to us every available effort reasonable to get full and complete statistics from each of your seventy-two Presbyteries. Our efforts have been rewarded by reports to date (May 8th) from fifty-seven of the seventy-two Presbyteries. Some of these show a splendid growth when compared with last year's report; viz—Austin, Bartholomew, Chickasaw, Clarksville, Corsicana-Waco, Greer, Illinois, Knoxville, Lebanon, Mayfield, McGee, Morrilton, Obion, Ozark, Sweetwater, Talladega, Texas-Greenville, Weatherford, Springfield, White River and many others. Those Presbyteries showing an apparent loss were: California, Cumberland, East Tennessee, Ewing-McLin, Ft. Smith, Lincoln-Decatur, McMinnville, Porter, Princeton, Richland, Sangamon and Springfield. In almost every instant of apparent loss in a Presbytery, the Stated Clerk of that Presbytery writes that he can not get reports from session clerks. One Stated Clerk wrote that a letter from a session clerk (a lady) in his Presbytery advised him "that the session would not

let her make out her report until they found how much dues they could collect." This perhaps tells the story of many churches which show a loss, or failure to report altogether.

Again we plead with the Assembly to suggest some plan whereby inefficient or careless clerks can be removed and others put in the place.

Presbyteries Visited

As General Traveling Secretary we have visited as many Presbyteries as it seemed our time and the fund would allow. We have attended the following meetings, giving help and encouragement to the best of our ability:

Mississippi, Yazoo, New Hope, Mayfield, Lebanon, Indiana, Owensboro, Richmond, Elk, Logan Presbyteries, and Arkansas Synod, and West Tenn. Synod. Much of encouragement was found in these several fields.

The Assembly Fund

We have endeavored to handle the Assembly fund as judiciously as we possibly could. The increased cost of printing and paper has added about 25 per cent to the expense account this year as compared with our last report. Some Presbyteries are still in arrearage for Presbyterial dues, these we are endeavoring to collect as rapidly as possible.

When we closed our books this year, May 5th, we had about the same amount of Bills Receivable as we had last year May 5th, at which time we closed our books. It will be seen that at that time we had a deposit in the bank with no Liabilities \$842.66. On the same date this year we close our books with \$1,218.93 on deposit in bank with no liabilities.

After closing the books, two presbyteries, Hopewell and Lexington, each remitted for Presbyterial dues, which is not shown in above assets. Our expenses the coming year will be much heavier than previous years, on account of the advanced cost of materials in general, and especially printing and printing materials.

Seminary Visitation

By reference to recommendation No. 5, page 109, Minutes General Assembly year 1916, a commission was appointed to visit the Seminary "and the Assembly pay the expenses of such visitors." We received the expense account of one member of this committee, and while it was not very clear as to whether this account was to be paid by the Assembly's Treasurer, yet we found the Assembly had provided no other way to meet the expense. So we paid it and are ready to pay the expense of the other members of the committee. We feel however, that we should suggest, that while this fund belongs to the Assembly to make such disposition of as they desire, yet if we continue to attach to it the expense of undertakings other than that of the Assembly office, we shall soon find the fund gone and the office hopelessly in debt.

Printing Future Minutes

If the General Assembly would direct where and by whom, the future minutes of its meetings should be printed, it would relieve the Stated Clerk of a heavy responsibility.

Boards Changed

It appears to your Stated Clerk that since the raising of a commission on Legal Fund by the 1916 General Assembly (see page 130 minutes General Assembly year 1916) that there is no longer a necessity for the continuation of the Legal Advisory Board and Legal Board, which will be found to be listed under head of Boards and Agencies of the General Assembly, and marked 8 and 9. Will the Assembly express itself as to whether it wishes to continue these Boards? There was also a committee appointed two years ago on "The Bible in Public Schools." This committee has become inactive, and we ask the privilege of dropping it from the list of Boards and Agencies of the General Assembly.

Financial Exhibit

We append hereto and make a part of this report our financial exhibit, which we ask shall be placed in the hands of a competent auditing committee appointed by this body. We have given itemized statements of money's received, and from whom, of money's paid out and for what and to whom.

At a second meeting of the committee which met in the study of the Arrington St., C. P. Church, Nashville, Tenn., the claims filed with the committee against the church for legal services and expenditures were taken up and found to approximate 20 cents per resident member and adopted the plan of prorating this to the different Presbyteries and ask them to prorate it among their congregations according to their membership, to be paid in four payments of five per

cent per resident member each year for four year which would liquidate the debt or legal obligations of the church.

The following letter was then adopted and the Secretary ordered to have 500 copies printed and one mailed to each Presbyterial Clerk, and one addressed to each Presbytery laying the plan before the church and ask the conformation of each Presbytery to this plan of work.

The letter as follows:

Nashville, Tenn., 1916.

ToPresbytery
Synod
S. C. and Trs.

Brethren: The Committee appointed by the General Assembly of 1916, to raise funds with which to pay off all past claims for legal services rendered the Cumberland Presbyterian Church in the litigation growing out of the Union Question, find that it will take a sum equal to 20 per cent resident member of the entire denomination to meet these claims.

By looking at the figures giving the total of the resident members of the congregations in your Presbytery and multiplying that number by 20 per cent you will get the apportionment for your Presbytery.

According to the instructions given the committee, the Presbyteries will have until the Assembly 1921 in which to meet their obligations in this matter. But if it can be arranged for you to meet it at an earlier date it will be much more preferable to the committee and to the men who have spared the use of their money in these litigations.

Of course it is left optional with the Presbytery how your apportionment is to be raised, but we suggest that you apportion it to your congregations on a basis of 20 per cent per member.

Congregations should settle with the Presbyterial Treasurer and the Presbyterial Treasurer with the Treasurer of this Committee, Rev. J. T. Coleman, 324 Wilburn Street, Nashville, Tenn.

In order that we may meet these obligations as rapidly as possible we shall expect your Presbytery to pay at least one fourth of their part per year.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON REVIVAL WORK

Your Committee on Revival Work submits the following report:

Our part of God's great Church was born in a revival, the influence of which has never ceased. The Cumberland Presbyterian Church is a Revival Church, and has been the instrument in God's hands of bringing more souls into His kingdom

than any other Church on earth with similar environments. From our view-point we have made one mistake in trying to steer clear of narrow sectarianism, we have never worked like other denominations to get our converts to join our, the most Biblical denomination in existence; consequently we have not made the numerical growth that otherwise we would have made. We very much need to be revived and greatly energized both among our preachers and elders, and in fact throughout our entire membership on this ingathering question.

We are very much in need of a revival that will bring speedily into God's kingdom through the mighty power of the Holy Ghost, multitudes of lost souls.

THINGS IN THE WAY OF SUCH A WORK OF GRACE

1st. Unbelief in the Bible teaching that true revivals are from above; that God is the author, and that there is no greater awakening, no Holy Ghost revival until the very souls of the church members are poured out to God in wrestling prayer for the kind of revival that the Master wants, and that the Spirit of God must work gloriously in the hearts of the people, both saint and sinner. We are believing too much in man, in preachers, singers, in form, in show off generally. The time has come, when if we have the much needed blessing. We must in spirit clothe ourselves in sack cloth and ashes and cry, and cry, mightily unto God for showers of blessings.

2nd. Our pulpits are not on fire with the Holy Ghost, as much as they should be. If we preachers had the baptismal fire as did McGready and the fathers of our Church, you would soon see the divine flame all over our bounds.

3rd. We cannot have a soul-saving work of grace in any congregation where only about ten out of every one hundred members attend prayer meeting. It is for the want of religion, pure religion that makes such slim attendance, hence there has got to be some repentance and reformation on this line before the goal of revival prosperity is reached.

4th. So many parents haven't enough of the Spirit of God to go to Sunday School, taking their children with them, and keeping them there, until the preaching service is over; especially in towns is this evil very prominent; and where it prevails, those children are hard to reach with the gospel; they are the kind that run wild after picture shows, and that consider the preaching and preaching service a drag all the way through. With such parents and such boys and girls, and young people in a congregation in large numbers, there has got to be a shaking among such dry bones before they will put on life enough to be a help and not a hindrance in a revival effort.

5th. Everybody ought to know who is a reader of the Word that God has promised in Mal., that He would open the windows of heaven and pour out such a great blessing on the people that there would not be room enough to receive it; if they would cease to rob Him and bring all the tithes into His storehouse. So we plainly see that if all Cumberland Presbyterians were honest with God, heaven's windows would be open for us to get blessings that we are not getting now.

6th. Another hindrance is the desecration of the Lord's Day. Sunday travel for business and pleasure, and now automobile transit, mostly for pleasure, together with the railroad travel, is decreasing our Church attendance very much, therefore demoralizing Church members and their children spiritually, keeping the whole family out of church and Sunday school, and especially taking the young people away, all of which and much more that might be mentioned, rises up and stands up directly against revival work.

7th. The Bible is not read, yea, searched diligently by our members; therefore they haven't faith enough to take hold of God and hold onto Him until the revival comes. "Faith cometh by hearing, and hearing by the Word of God.

8th. Love of money and worldliness generally among the professed Christians are extremely hard to get out of the way in a revival effort.

9th. We are making the impression through our Church papers that we don't love each other, that the Church is divided and about to die and will die real soon if the dear good brethren who say such things don't get exactly what they are writing for. We do love each other, and the Church is not divided, and it is very much alive; because God is its author and its very life. "The gates of hell shall not prevail against it." Our writers who are discussing the various questions don't mean to hurt the Church with their extreme expressions and often harsh language. They don't mean at all that our great God-established Church is nearly dead. No, far from it;

they don't mean to impress any one that we are destitute of love for each other—far from it. Still it is true that readers of such things in the papers are talking of leaving the leaning, tottering house, and many others are kept from casting their lot with us; and we can see at once how revival work is hindered by such false impressions getting out. We need to have the loving Christ more and still more lovingly in our hearts when we write, when we talk, and even when we think.

We recommend that this Assembly say with emphasis that each Presbytery should without any failure see that each Church, large or small, rich or poor, has a revival effort, even if some consecrated laymen have to be sent to hold some of the meetings and that each Church has a preaching service at least once per month, even if some layman has to do the preaching. Your committee feels that it has not enough public lay workers now in our churches. We also recommend that all Churches that have revivals, through the preacher or some one else, report the same to the Church papers so this committee can make a full report of all revival work a year hence.

The book the last Assembly directed to be prepared on Church and revival work has been delayed on account of ill health and a failure to collect some money due. We hope soon to submit manuscript to both committees.

REPORT OF THE BOARD OF TITHING TO THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY IN SESSION AT LINCOLN, ILL., MAY 16-21, 1917

To the Moderator and members of the Eighty-Seventh Consecutive Session of the General Assembly of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church, convening in the city of Lincoln, Ill., May 16, 1917:

God, in his infinite wisdom, has seen fit to call home from labor to rest our grand and noble leader, Hon. Vint N. Bray, of Springfield, Mo., whose main object in life was to lead Cumberland Presbyterians to accept God's plan of financing the Church. His dying message to his wife was "Never give up tithing," and we see from her letter to our Church paper that as soon as she recovered her health, she would give her whole time to the work of God. As we note her returning health and strength, we also note her zeal and enthusiasm for the cause of tithing; and may we, as the Tithing Board, hold up her hands and do our part in accomplishing this great

object, which means so much to our Church.

The loss of our leader has, to a great extent, prevented the progress of the work this year. However, we feel that this Assembly marks the beginning of a new epoch in the history of tithing. More ministers are preaching on the subject, and several congregations and individuals have contributed to the fund.

We desire to extend to the Assembly our appreciation for being granted the privilege of a place on the calendar of contributions with the other boards, the month of March having been designated as the time when the regular collection shall be used for this purpose. We also desire to thank every minister who has preached on the subject and taken an offering, and especially those who have contributed of their means. This is the one thing needed—money to put a man in the field, and we hope to devise some plan at Lincoln whereby this may be accomplished.

REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON DIGEST

To the Eighty-Seventh General Assembly of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church, in session at Lincoln, Ill:

Brethren: Your committee named at the last General Assembly to prepare a revised digest of the laws of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church and of the rulings of each of its General Assemblies down to date, the work to be based upon and to be in continuation of the "Stephens Digest," would respectfully report that in its opinion this work should be done by one man commissioned by this General Assembly. His report to be made to the next General Assembly; and if, adopted, to be kept on file in the office of the Stated Clerk until such time as the General Assembly can arrange to have copies printed.

The work is very important and should be done at once. Your committee was unable to have a meeting on account of the fact that all of its members did not reside in the same place and for the further reason that one of its members was necessarily absent in the army most of the year. Either one of the members might have acted alone, but a meeting was almost impossible.

It is heretofore recommended that a brother be commissioned by this General Assembly to prepare digest to date and that the Stated Clerk be furnished the one so commissioned with at least two copies of Stephens Digest and a copy of the minutes of each General Assembly since the publication of said Stephens Digest.

REPORT OF REV. J. L. HUDGINS

To the Eighty-seventh Session of the General Assembly of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church Convened at Lincoln, Illinois, May 17 to 22, 1917.

Nashville, Tenn., June 10, 1917.

Dear Fathers and Brethren:

As your servant I desire to communicate to you, relative to my duties in the several relations in which I am humbly trying to serve you, as follows:

1. AS TRUSTEE OF PUBLISHING HOUSE FUND

In the month of August, 1916, I transferred all of the unpaid subscriptions, on the Publishing House Fund, to Rev. A. N. Eshman and took a receipt in full for all payments on the machinery for which notes had been given, and I now hold both the machinery and said receipt from Rev. A. N. Eshman, subject to your orders. I agreed that Rev. A. N. Eshman should be allowed time, up to May 1918, in which to finally clear the machinery of original purchase notes, as the final payments on the Publishing House subscriptions would not, according to the terms of the subscriptions, be made until about that time. Neither the Board of Publication, Sunday School and Young People's Work, nor the General Assembly, or Church at large, owes Rev. A. N. Eshman one dollar for machinery, or for anything else so far as your Trustee is advised, he agreeing to take what he could collect from the subscription as payment in

full of all payments on the machinery. I ask that you will ratify what I did in this matter and record the fact that your machinery is, so far as Rev. A. N. Eshman's interests are concerned, free of debt.

2. AS EDITOR OF THE CUMBERLAND PRESBYTERIAN

For almost seven years I have served you to the best of my ability in this capacity. I have tried to make your weekly paper a clean, respectable journal devoted to the interests of the church in all the departments of its work. I have tried to, in every way, treat all alike, and, in this, I have no doubt, offended some who have thought that I should have yielded to their wishes. I have all the time refused to admit to the columns of the paper adverse criticisms of the work of the various Boards and agencies of your body, believing that where criticisms were needed it was your province and, not the province of individuals through the printed page, to administer the criticisms. Some good brethren have felt offended at my course in this. I have from time to time, possibly unwisely, but I assure you always conscientiously, insisted upon the importance of pastors, sessions and individuals complying with the recommendations and mandates of your body upon the question of offerings for the various enterprises of the church. In doing this I have offended some. So far as you can do so I ask your endorsement in the course pursued or instructions as to a different course.

3. AS MANAGER OF YOUR PUBLISHING INTERESTS

Since January 8, 1917, I have served you in this capacity. The duty was laid upon me by your Board and was not sought by me. I found the New Cumberland Press rather heavily in debt and without local credit. Could it have collected what was due it this would not have been so, but circumstances made immediate collections impossible. I found that the Sunday School Literature for the first quarter of the year had been very disappointing and that many of your schools were turning their patronage away from your own plant. But I am glad to advise you that the credit of your New Cumberland Press is now on a par with all similar institutions in the city of Nashville. Could we collect all that is now due us we could meet all obligations and have a comfortable balance to our credit. The institution is, I believe, on a safe financial and business basis.

Without going into an argument here, but trusting that I may have the privilege of doing so before your body in support of what I now present I wish to offer the following suggestions:

1. That you endorse the efforts being put forth by your Board of Publication, Sunday School and Young People's Work, to raise by voluntary subscription, an Operating Fund of \$2000.00 for the New Cumberland Press, your publishing plant.

2. That you authorize your Board of Publication, Sunday School and Young People's Work, to, as soon as practicable, re-locate the New Cumberland Press by locating it either in Nashville or in some other town or city that might care to offer inducements for its location.

3. That you, if found possible to do so, devise some means of securing to your publishing interests the united support and co-operation of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church that these interests may not be disturbed by the opposition and competition of independent publishers and hindered by a division of the patronage of the church.

Finally, brethren, I have served you to the best of my ability in these several relations and am perfectly willing that you, or a committee appointed by you, shall make the fullest possible investigation as to my stewardship as your servant. I am willing to continue to serve you as long as my services are needed, but I do not wish to have you feel that you are under any obligations to me as an individual. If you can find some one who can give you better service than I am able to give you, or as good service for less remuneration, then I want you to regard me simply as a son of the church, in your hands to be dealt with by you as you may see proper. Should it be your judgment that I should be retired from any or all public positions in the work of the church, I will most gladly bow to your mandates and go back into a pastorate, the line of work from which you called me seven years ago. I beg that this, after it has been read to the open Assembly, shall go into the hands of the proper committee for its consideration.

REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE TO VISIT THEOLOGICAL SEMINARY

The three members of the committee made their visits to the Seminary separately and unannounced. This gave opportunity for observation and study at various intervals. From our study we beg to submit the following report:

The Enrollment

During the year 1916-17, twenty were enrolled, thirteen boys and seven girls. Of this number ten were taking Theological work exclusively, while ten were taking elective work in the Seminary.

Course of Study

Two courses of study are offered to the pupils, the Classical and the English. The Classical contains three years of Greek and Hebrew, two years of Systematic Theology and Teacher Training, and one year of Biblical Analysis, Church His-

tory, Sacred Geography, Missions, and Pastoral Theology. The English course required no Greek and Hebrew. There were fifteen pupils in the English and five in the Classical.

The Teaching Force

The work is carried on by Rev. P. F. Johnson, Dean, and Rev. S. H. Braly.

The school covers a period of eight months, four days each week. Brother Johnson has on an average five periods of forty-five minutes each day. Brother Braly has on an average four periods of forty-five minutes each day.

We commend the work of these faithful teachers:

1st. In giving all the Boards of the church an opportunity to acquaint the students with the needs of the church.

2nd. In their efforts to secure strong, modern and inspirational text books.

3rd. In their emphasis on the social message of the Bible; and

4th. In their labor to teach the pupils the fundamentals.

Your Committee would recommend the following:

First—That the campaign for \$100,000.00 endowment be pushed as rapidly as possible.

Second—That all the money and teaching force of the church be concentrated for the present at Bethel College.

Third—The \$200.00 be given by the Seminary fund for the support of a course of Public Speaking and Reading. That the course be given free to Theological students. That a least one year's course of Public Speaking be required before graduation.

MEMORIALS, PROTESTS AND PLEADINGS FROM NEW LEBANON PRESBY-
 TERY, MISSOURI SYNOD AND INDIVIDUALS IN MISSOURI SYNOD,
 ALSO FROM MCGEE PRESBYTERY IN MISSOURI SYNOD, RE-
 GARDING TROUBLE BETWEEN NEW LEBANON PRESBY-
 TERY AND ONE OF ITS CONGREGATIONS

(NOTE—Some of the requests made in the pleadings were lost before the As-
 sembly, but it was impossible to leave these out of the record without doing in-
 justice to those that passed.—S. C.)

A PROTEST

To the Eighty-seventh General Assembly of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church,
 in session at Lincoln, Ill., we the undersigned members of the Missouri
 Synod, of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church do solemnly protest against
 a certain memorial coming up from a disloyal Presbytery, namely, New
 Lebanon Presbytery:

This memorial sets out that there is trouble between the membership of the
 Sedalia Congregation and a former pastor, and that upon an appeal from one or
 more members that the Synod demanded action on the part of the Presbytery and
 that the action of the Synod was irregular.

This memorial prays that the General Assembly set aside the action of the
 Synod. A brief, of the church may be necessary. While the General Assembly was
 in session at Evansville, Ind., Rev. J. M. Russell, as the Synodic field man con-
 ducted a meeting in Sedalia, and organized a church. The Synod having no other
 man that could be had for the place held the state man for two years, at the
 end of this time the Synod met with said congregation and proposed to pay off a
 debt of \$2200.00, that remained on the house providing that the church would pay
 the salary of their pastor. To this the session agreed and accordingly recalled Rev.
 Russell at a salary of \$800.00 per year. On the 8th of the following September
 the session met and in a settlement with their pastor found that they still owed
 him \$450.00, and with the money in their pockets refused to pay the salary. The
 trouble is not between the members and the preacher, but between the session and
 the preacher. After the session had employed another preacher the injured pastor
 tried to come before the session to adjust this trouble, but was refused a hearing.
 He then brought suit against the church, in the name of the session and obtained
 a judgment for balance due him.

Said Russell tried to get a call meeting of said Presbytery to adjust the mat-
 ter and was denied this request. In October, 1915, the Synodic Board made a re-
 port on page 10 and 11 of the minutes of the Synod, in which they mentioned this
 contract between the Synod and congregation and the failure of the congregation
 to pay the preacher's salary, and also mentioned that the spiritual condition of
 the congregation was not good and ordered the Presbytery to adjust this difficulty.
 In the meantime twenty-three members of the church petition the New Lebanon
 Presbytery to appoint a commission to look into this matter. The Presbytery re-
 fused to grant both, the order of Synod and the prayer of the church. The Memori-
 al claims that the Synod overstepped their bounds. We deny their claim and
 refer your reverent body to article 37 of the Constitution of our church, where it
 says "The Synod is to take such orders with respect to the Presbyteries, Church Ses-
 sions and Churches under its care, etc."

We find upon investigation that in the session of the Synod in October, 1916,
 on page 19 and 20 the Synod refers to the refusal to obey its orders and rein-
 structed the Presbytery on penalty of being dissolved if they refused to obey.

Their Memorial shows that they have refused to obey the voice of the Synod,
 hence according to the order of the Synod have dissolved their Presbytery, there-
 by forfeiting their right to a seat in this Assembly. We contend that the church
 being a mission church, that both congregation and pastor is under the supervision
 of the Synodic Board and that this Board has a right to demand the Presbytery
 to take such action as may be necessary to adjust all troubles in said church. We
 contend that the church is still a mission church, and as evidence the present pas-
 tor has been sending out letters and pledges over the Synod to collect money for

the preacher. For the future good and safety of our church we pray that this memorial be not granted.

MEMORIAL FROM MCGEE PRESBYTERY

To the Eighty-Seventh General Assembly of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church, at Lincoln, Ill:

Fathers and Brethren: We, the McGee Presbytery of the Cumberland Church, are informed that the New Lebanon Presbytery is sending to your reverend body a memorial asking you to set aside the order of the Missouri Synod of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church, said order demanding that the New Lebanon Presbytery have a call meeting of the Presbytery, to meet at Sedalia, Mo., to settle the trouble in the Church at Sedalia, a trouble growing out of a refusal of the session to pay a pastor's salary. Their memorial claiming that the action of the Synod was irregular. We, the McGee Presbytery, would memorialize your reverend body against the memorial from New Lebanon Presbytery and give as our reason the following information: Rev. J. M. Russell, the Synodic Field man, in June, 1911, reorganized the Cumberland Presbyterian Church in Sedalia, Mo., and the Synodic Board retained said Russell as pastor of said Church for two years. In October, 1913, the Synod met with said Sedalia Church and proposed to the session of the Church that the Synod would assume the debt on the church if the session would be responsible for the preacher's salary from that time on. To this the session agreed and retained said Russell at a stated salary for a period of twelve months. At the end of this contract, with the money in the bank, they refused to pay a large part of the salary. In October, 1915, the Synodic Board reported on page ten and eleven of the minutes of the Synod and requested the said Presbytery to appoint a commission to settle this difficulty if possible and report to the Synodic Board. In October, 1916, the Synod met, and a committee on the minutes of the Presbytery found that New Lebanon Presbytery had refused to obey the mandate of the higher court. The committee reported, and the Synod concurred in the report and adopted the recommendation (see minutes of Synod 1916, page 19 and 20) reordering the Presbytery to adjust this trouble with a penalty of dissolution in the event of a failure or refusal to do the bidding of the Synod..

We deny their claim of irregularity on the part of the Synod and sight your reverend body to the constitution of our Church, article 37, which says that the Synod may review the records of the Presbytery and redress whatever they may have done contrary to order, and further the Synod may take such order with respect to Presbyteries, Church sessions, and Churches under its care, etc.

The Synod acted solely upon her judgment as to what was right in the premises and in keeping with the authority given in article 37. We therefore pray that the Assembly sustain the action of the Synod, believing that it will endanger the future of our beloved Church to allow a Presbytery to defy the order of the Synod.

This is to certify that the above is a correct copy of a paper adopted by the McGee Presbytery of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church at a called session in Moberly, Mo., May 7, 1917, at 3 p.m.

MEMORIALS FROM NEW LEBANON PRESBYTERY

To the Eighty-seventh General Assembly of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church, in session at Lincoln, Ill., May, 1917:

Whereas, Missouri Synod at its 1916 Session made an order directing New Lebanon Presbytery to appoint a Commission to visit and settle differences between a congregation in said Presbytery and a former pastor thereof and also differences among the membership of a congregation and, whereas, nothing has ever regularly come up to Presbytery, either by complaint or appeal from pastor or congregation, and, therefore, nothing has regularly come before Synod, and, whereas, the order was made to be obeyed by Presbytery on pain of dissolution simply upon a showing to the Synod made by one of the interested parties, and, whereas, it is the desire of New Lebanon Presbytery to proceed only in a regular and legal manner. It therefore requests the General Assembly to make a deliverance upon the question as to whether or not Missouri Synod had the legal right to make such an order when nothing, either in the form of complaint or appeal, had reg-

ularly come before it, and requests that this General Assembly reiterate the action of the Eighty-sixth General Assembly, held at Birmingham, Alabama, when the principle contended for in this matter by New Lebanon Presbytery, was laid down by that body in answer to the first six questions propounded by McGready Presbytery. (See page 41 of the 1916 record for the questions and pages 112-113 for answers.)

It is further requested that the deliverance of the General Assembly on this subject be transmitted by the Stated Clerk to both Missouri Synod and New Lebanon Presbytery for their guidance and direction. The foregoing was adopted by New Lebanon Presbytery April 6, 1917.

FROM MCGREADY PRESBYTERY, ASKING THE ASSEMBLY TO PASS UPON CERTAIN OFFICIAL QUESTIONS

To the Eighty-seventh meeting of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church, to meet in Lincoln, Ill., May 17-22, 1917:

The McGready Presbytery in Session March 23, 1917, most respectfully memorialize your reverend body to answer officially questions as follows:

1st. When a Licentiate, who is an Elder has been elected by his Session has been refused a seat in Presbytery, because of his licensure, requests that his name be dropped as a licentiate, that he might be eligible to his seat in Presbytery. The Presbytery drops his name from the roll, and does not report him as a licentiate to Synod nor Assembly. More than one year rolls by, he presents himself to another Presbytery to be taken under her care. Would the Presbytery have the right to receive him as a licentiate and enroll his name as such, he having no letter nor authority from Synod? See Rules of Discipline, page 135, Sec. 98.

2nd. When an appeal from the action of a Presbytery to the Synod as to the constitutionality of its action. Would the Presbytery have the right to further prosecute the case, until Synod should have decided the case? Rules of Discipline, page 132, Sec. 80.

3rd. Should the Presbytery continue the case after an appeal, before it is decided, and another appeal is taken to the Synod, and the appeal was received by the Clerk and Moderator in open Session. The Clerk being also the Clerk of the Synod to which the appeal was taken. Would the Stated Clerk of the Presbytery and Synod have the right to report to the Synod that the appeal was debarred by limitation as the written appeal was not presented until ten days had expired, after the appellant recognized in the reception of the appeal, for the express purpose to have more time to prepare the appeal, and acted on that acknowledgement.

4th. If the acts of the Presbytery were unconstitutional, and the rulings of the Presbytery were so oppressive as to almost kill one of the best congregations in the Presbytery. What course should the Presbytery pursue to restore confidence in the congregation to the Presbytery?

5th. See page 89 Cumberland Presbyterian Church Digest, after repeating Sec. 47, First clause continues as follows: "Yet a ruling elder or deacon, though chargeable with neither heresy nor immorality, become unacceptable, in his official character, to a majority of the church which he serves. In such case it shall be the duty of the church session, upon application either from the officer or from the church, to dissolve the relation. Now the question is, after the petition has been signed asking the Session to retire the elder named as a ruling elder in that congregation. Is it optional with the Session to grant the request of the congregation or not?"

1. There is quite a number of young men preparing for the ministry who can and will attend the Theological Department at Cumberland College, and for financial reasons can not attend a school outside of the state.

2. The condition of our church in this field demands the presence of every young preacher to occupy our mission fields and fill the pulpits of the weak churches, which they can do while in college.

3. At the present time the young men, who are now in and who have been in the school in the past, are filling about thirty pulpits, which doubtless would be vacant, if it had not been for the benefits derived from the several departments of Cumberland College.

4. We can get money for Cumberland College while the work is confined to Texas, that no other state would get.

REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON EDUCATION

Your Committee on Education have had before us the report of the Board of Education for the year ending April 1, 1917, and also a resolution adopted April 15, 1917.

These we have given careful investigation and consideration.

We are glad to note the fact, that the report of the Board is encouraging; that a sum of \$2822.81, was on deposit April 1, 1916; that the offerings for the year were \$3231.00; interest on loans and refund \$135.00, making a total of \$6189.31; that forty-three students were assisted in school to the amount of \$2956.64.

First—In regard to the resolution adopted by the Board, April 5, 1917, as found on page 102; it is the opinion of this committee, that the help the students receive from the Board should be made in the way of a loan, without interest, to be paid back as early as possible. But in the event of death or long protracted sickness the student being unable to repay it, that after a time, deemed sufficient by the Board, the debt be canceled.

It is further the opinion of your committee that all educational offerings sent to the Cumberland Presbyterian Board of Education by churches served by beneficiaries of the Board be credited to the account of beneficiaries taking same.

The idea of the committee is, not to be oppressive on the beneficiary, but to make him more independent, than he otherwise would be.

Second—We recommend, that the Board endeavor to formulate a plan, whereby the amount necessary to meet the yearly expense, be set forth and this amount pro-rated among the Synods; the amount of the Synods pro-rated among the Presbyteries and the amount from each Presbytery be pro-rated among the churches of that Presbytery.

Third—We recommend that Rev. J. A. Deaver, of Jackson, Tennessee, take the place of Mr. C. C. Costen; that Rev. J. W. Dishman, of McKenzie, Tennessee, take the place of Rev. S. H. Braly; that Mr. G. B. Holladay, of Camden, Tennessee, take the place of Mr. J. H. Copeland.

REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON THEOLOGICAL SEMINARY

To the 87th General Assembly of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church.

Dear Fathers and Brethren:

Your Committee on Theological Seminary make the following report:

It is with profound gratitude that we note the splendid spirit of progression which is being made manifest in every branch of the work connected with your

Board on Theological Seminary and the Theological department of the schools at Bethel College, located at McKenzie, Tenn., and Cumberland College, located at Leonard, Texas, and feel that while the work has not been up to that standard of proficiency which reaches the ideals of our hearts, yet under the conditions which these departments have been forced to work, that we commend the course and work accomplished.

We insist that the most thorough knowledge of Greek and Hebrew possible be given our Theological students that they may be able to interpret the original text.

We feel that no students should enter the Theological Department until they have at least finished a good four year preparatory course, and that the degree of Bachelor of Theology should not be conferred until said student has at least received a bachelor's degree in a literary course.

We have had before us as your committee the report of the Board of Theological Seminary, and the report of the Committee on Visitation of Theological Seminary, together with petitions from the Trustees of Cumberland College, Leonard, Texas, and from the Trustees of Bethel College, West Tennessee Synod, Mckenzie, and memorial from Marshall Presbytery, Texas Synod, and have given careful consideration to each item contained in these papers and in view of the highest interest of the work of the entire denomination we would recommend:

First: That the campaign for raising the \$100,000.00 Endowment Fund Theological Seminary be continued under the direction of Rev. J. L. Hudgins, editor of The Cumberland Presbyterian.

Second: That the work be continued for the ensuing Assembly year as has been for the past year in furnishing one Theological teacher to the Cumberland College, Leonard, Texas.

Third: That as the funds of the Board will not permit the giving of \$200.00 for the course in Reading and Public Speaking that the Theological students be urged to raise the necessary fund for the maintenance of this department.

Fourth: That the Permanent Committee on location of Theological Seminary be directed at once to receive bids on location of Theological Seminary and report to the next meeting of the General Assembly.

Fifth: We recommend that the Library of the late Dr. J. L. Goodknight, which according to his bequest has become the property of Theological Seminary and now stored in the Cumberland Presbyterian Church at Lincoln, Illinois, be placed in Bethel College for the use of the Theological students there until the permanent location of Theological Seminary.

Sixth: We recommend that Rev. J. L. Hudgins, Rev. G. W. Burroughs, and W. T. Marshall be elected to succeed themselves.

We recommend that Rev. F. A. Grundy, of Central City, Ky., be elected by your body to fill the vacancy of Rev. R. H. Morefield.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON MINISTERIAL RELIEF

Your Committee on Ministerial Relief would ask your kindly consideration of the following:

We have had referred to us the Annual Report of the Board of Ministerial Relief which we have carefully examined and discussed its every part.

We note that the Board has adopted an emergency or distress call, plan by which in case of accident or sickness a preacher becomes destitute he is assisted, although he is not a regular beneficiary. We regard this as a policy to be highly commended.

We see also from the Board's report that on Jan. 24, 1917, the Board loaned to the Board of Publication One Thousands Dollars for six months at the rate of six per cent interest. The note seems to be well secured as it is backed up by a triple security.

We further notice that the report also states that this action has been the cause of adverse criticism. This your committee notes with deep sorrow. We have care-

fully inquired into this matter, and can find no just cause for such criticism. The Board UNQUESTIONABLY acted in good faith. It has violated no obligation nor committed any breach of trust.

We therefore, recommend that the Board be exonerated from all blame and their action sanctioned by the General Assembly. Your committee recognizes the fact, that the Boards of our church are the creatures of your own choice. You have looked over the field and made your selection, without considering the sacrifices often to be made in order to be obedient. Just from loyalty to you, and love of the church, busy men, without compensation have left their own business, no doubt many times at great sacrifice, and have complied with your request, and are amenable to you, and you only, for their stewardship. Often they have been hindered by unjust criticism and public announcement, of at least doubtful information, criticism and public announcement, of at least doubtful information, criticism without knowing the facts in the case. Your committee therefore recommends that this General Assembly pledge itself to the Boards of our church to stand by them and protect them against all unjust criticism. Your servants, the Board of Ministerial Relief are responsible for their doings. They are not above criticism, and when they do wrong they are to be condemned. When they make mistakes they are to be corrected. But, untimely and indiscriminate condemnation of your servants, which does not seek to aid them in the hard work you have given them to do, we feel must receive as it deserves your very certain and earnest disapproval. Those who thoughtlessly condemn your Board, condemn you, and those who condemn you condemn the Cumberland Presbyterian Church. We believe your servants should have their work reviewed and closely examined, but we feel they are not responsible in their doings to irresponsible persons. Their work should be censored, but there is a right way and a wrong way of doing it. Having reviewed all the facts within our reach, we believe this reverend body should now go on record as saying this: "We not only find nothing in the doings of the Board of Ministerial Relief to condemn, but much of loyalty and wisdom and earnest devotion to commend." We learn from the Boards report that the term of office of Rev. Wm. H. Hutchinson, of Tennyson, Ind., Rev. J. M. Cook, of Greenville, Ky., and Rev. J. T. Coleman of Nashville, Tenn., expire at this meeting of this Assembly.

We recommend that they be re-elected and that the Board's personnel remain as it is except that Rev. E. M. Johnson, of Mattoon, Illinois, on account of feebleness and inability to serve be relieved of that duty and that Rev. C. A. Galloway, of Bowling Green, Ky., be elected in his stead.

Your committee note with pleasure the splendid report of Dr. T. W. Stone on the good work being done in our Old Minister's, Widow's and Orphan's Home, in Bowling Green, Ky. We feel however, that more of our old ministers and their orphan children should be cared for in that splendid home. We therefore recommend that our preachers everywhere should take more time in explaining to our old worn out ministers, widows, and orphans, that this is no poor house or place of correction, but a real home. From the report of the Board we learn there have been thirty beneficiaries on their roll during the past year, four of these have gone to their reward. There will no doubt be a larger demand this year than any previous year for assistance on account of the high cost of living.

It is therefore the imperative duty of every pastor and every vacant congregation to see to it that an offering is taken and sent to the Board during this year.

There has been referred to us a paper from Rev. J. H. Milholland touching a difference of opinion between him and the Board of Ministerial Relief, on some action of the Board.

As the committee is not in possession of any facts as to the grounds of complaint, we recommend that the paper be returned to Rev. J. H. Milholland without further action.

We bring to your notice the great work that Rev. W. M. Neelley is trying so earnestly and faithfully to do in the Minister's Benefit Association. It is a most commendable work and it does seem that the ministers should take hold of it and at once make it a great success.

REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON AUDITING AND FINANCE

To the Eighty-seventh General Assembly of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church in session, in Lincoln, Illinois, May 17-22, 1917.

Dear Fathers and Brethren:

We, your Auditing and Finance Committee, beg to report as follows: The books, receipts, and cancelled checks of your efficient Stated Clerk have been carefully checked and found correct except, we find he holds the following receipts for which he has taken no credit:

Freight \$.68, Storage \$.32, Drayage \$.35, Telegram to Mrs. Vint N. Bray \$.61, Freight on books to Birmingham Assembly, \$1.17, Service for mailing Minutes \$2.00, Stamps for mailing Minutes \$17.05, a total of \$22.18.

We direct that he be allowed said \$22.18 and that the same be credited on his next report.

We have also carefully examined and checked the receipts and disbursements of Rev. W. B. Cunningham, Secretary and Treasurer of the Board of Education and find his books well kept and same correct.

We have examined the account and vouchers of Rev. J. W. Duvall, Treasurer of the Board of Missions and Church Erection and find the same correct. Your Committee recommended some change in mode of book-keeping and issuing checks to Brother Duvall, which he cheerfully adopted and which we believe will simplify and aid him in his work.

We find on examination that the account of Rev. J. H. Milholland, former Treasurer and Rev. John A. McLane, present Treasurer of the Board of Ministerial Relief, to be in good form and correct.

The books of the Board of Publication, Sunday School and Young People's Work, owing to bulkiness have not been submitted to your committee, but we have been informed by the President of said Board that another committee at this session of the General Assembly would authorize a regular auditing for said Board and we concur in said plan.

We recommend that the plan for raising the necessary funds to pay the claims filed for legal services for the church and stated by the Committee on Legal Finance in their report to your Reverend Body published in the preliminary Minutes, be adopted.

We have before us the report of Rev. A. N. Eshman on the "Weekly Savings Plan" showing amount contributed, names of donors, and how pro-rated and congratulate him on this great work for the church, although it is now in its incipency.

We recommend that he be permitted to continue the same for the coming year and that our people respond liberally to same.

We recommend that the printing of the Minutes of the General Assembly until further ordered, be done by our own printing plant, the New Cumberland Press, and that it be paid a price of not exceeding ten per cent above cost.

Your committee cognizant that a great many business people now receive interest from banks on daily balances are constrained to recommend that the Treasurers of the various Boards and others handling funds of this Assembly endeavor to make such arrangement with the bank and save this important item to our beloved church and that they take proper steps to carry this recommendation into effect and that the interest collected from each fund be credited to its respective fund.

We desire to commend the willingness of each of the members of the various Boards appearing before us in assisting the committee in every possible way.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON PUBLICATION, SUNDAY SCHOOL AND YOUNG PEOPLE'S WORK

Your Committee on Publication, Sunday School and Young People's Work submit the following report:

The difficulties under which the Board have labored the past year have been trying, yet we are pleased to note that the work is still progressing in the hands of the worthy men who are conducting the work. The members of the Board have given of their time and best thought to the enterprise placed in their hands. The entire church is indebted to them for the faithful service which they have rendered.

Adverse Criticism

While friendly criticism and criticism that is intended for the good of the enterprises of the church and made with the view of encouraging the various Boards may be permitted. On the other hand that which is destructive in its nature and is calculated to hinder the work and create discord in the membership of the church is to be deplored. Your committee is of the opinion that far more of the latter kind of criticism has been made upon the Boards of the church than should be allowed to go unrebuked and it is now time for the General Assembly to denounce such criticism. It is the prayer of your committee that such a statement as this will never again be necessary in a report to any future General Assembly.

Annual Report of the Board

We call your attention to the following items which we find in the Annual Report of the Board which was referred to us:

1. On June 29, 1916, the Board employed the Rev. J. L. Hudgins as Editor of The Cumberland Presbyterian, and on January 6, 1917, he was made Manager, although extra work and responsibilities were added, no increase was made in his salary.

We further note from the report of the Rev. J. L. Hudgins, which was also referred to us that as trustee of the Publishing House Fund he transferred in August, 1916, all the unpaid subscriptions on this Fund to Rev. A. N. Eshman and took a receipt in full for all payments due him on the machinery for which notes had been given and now holds same subject to the orders of the General Assembly.

We commend the Editor of The Cumberland Presbyterian for his faithful work and especially for his course in rejecting all articles offered for publication which in his judgment were destructive to the enterprises of the Church.

As Manager he has succeeded and is removing the financial embarrassment of the Publishing House.

We believe that should the Board decide to continue the Rev. J. L. Hudgins as Editor and Manager it would be entirely satisfactory to the Church.

We recommend:

(a) That J. L. Hudgins be continued as Trustee of the Publishing House Fund until that business is entirely closed.

(b) That his Communication which was read and referred to this committee, be printed in the Minutes of the General Assembly under the head of Communications.

2. The contract with Rev. A. N. Eshman as lessee of the Publishing House expired Oct. 1, 1916, from that time until Jan. 6, 1917, he was the manager for the Board at which time his connection with the Publishing House was severed by his resignation. Rev. A. N. Eshman has at all times shown his love for the Cumberland Presbyterian Church by his acts and liberal support of the same.

3. The Rev. T. Ashburn became Sunday School and Young People's Field Man on Sept. 8, 1916, to which work he has given all his time up to the present. The work of Rev. Ashburn since he entered the field is ample evidence to this General Assembly of the wisdom of the Board in employing him and shows the need for such a man in the field.

Inquiries come relative to graded lessons for use in the Sunday Schools. We answer the same by saying the Board is endeavoring to supply the demand either by publications of our own Church or by securing the same from other publishing houses.

4. We commend the Board on its success in securing the able corps of writers who are giving us our present good Sunday School Literature.

We are advised by the President of the Board that the kind of literature required by the memorial from Marshall Presbytery has been provided and can be secured from the Publishing House.

5. As to the financial status of the Publishing House and the disposition of all funds received by the Board, which will give you a clearer insight to financial condition than any brief statement we can make in this report.

6. The Board is now preparing a catalogue for distribution which will give information concerning all books and supplies that can be secured from the Publishing House.

We recommend:

1. That the entire membership of the Church patronize our own Publishing House.

2. That you urge the membership of the Church and Sunday Schools to subscribe for The Cumberland Presbyterian and use our Sunday School Literature.

3. That our people buy and read the books kept on sale by the Publishing House.

4. That you urge our people to send church news and articles for publication to The Cumberland Presbyterian.

5. That the Board be instructed to have books and inventory sheets examined by a competent auditor and that his report be presented in connection with the Annual Report of the Board.

6. That our Young People's Societies take up Mission Study Courses in connection with the usual work, and that our Board prepare topic cards embodying such courses.

7. That our Presbyteries devote at least one half day of one session each year to Conventional work stressing Sunday School and Young People's Work in which our young people may take part.

8. That Hon. J. H. Zarecor and Hon. Frank Slemons whose terms on the Board expire with this meeting of the General Assembly be appointed to succeed themselves as members of the Board and that W. G. Stewart, Nashville, Tenn., be appointed to succeed J. M. Gallaher whose term expires at this time.

9. All members of the Board retiring from membership on the Board shall attend the first meeting of the Board after their successor has been appointed.

OTHER COMMUNICATIONS

1. **Report of Music Editor:** Rev. W. T. Dale, D. D., the Musical Editor of the Church should be commended for his faithful and splendid service in this special work.

2. **Commission on Examination of Manuscript as to Conformity to Doctrine:** The report of the Commission shows that two Manuscripts have been examined, Viz: "The Student's Lamb," by Rev. O. A. Barbee, and "Willie Goodwin," by Rev. Wm. Thomas Dale, D. D., and that they conform to the doctrines of the Church. It is the opinion of your committee that the report of this Committee does not obligate the Board to publish the manuscripts.

3. **Report of Committee on Sunday School Text Book:** This report is signed by one member of the committee, Rev. O. A. Barbee. The report described the "Student's Lamp," a work designed for use in Sunday Schools and by the young people of the Church.

We recommend:

(a) That the Board be left entirely free to act on its own judgment as to the publication of the work.

(b) That Rev. S. H. Braly, D. D., McKenzie, Tenn., be made a member of this committee in the place of Rev. C. M. Zwingle.

4. **Report of the Permanent Committee on Historical Society:** This committee is hindered in its work for the lack of funds with which to prosecute its work.

We recommend that the committee continue to collect such facts as they may be able.

5. Report of the Committee on Digest: We recommend that Rev. A. C. Bidle, Clarksville, Tenn., be appointed to prepare the Digest in accordance with the printed report of the committee.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON MISSIONS AND CHURCH ERECTION

Brethren of the General Assembly of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church.

Your Committee on Missions and Church Erection would most respectfully submit the following:

We feel no constraint whatever to call your attention to the great fundamental and far reaching importance of the particular matter you have assigned us to consider.

We have considered, first, the report of your Board of Missions and Church Erection submitted to your body. We note in this report that the offerings on the part of both individuals and congregations have not been as general and liberal as we feel they should have been, yet we hope for the better. Why this dereliction in past and previous years, it is not in order that we should undertake to say, but better that we set ourselves to the task of formulating some plan and of requiring a greater degree of diligence on the part of all that would insure results more satisfying in the future.

Let us address ourselves to present duties and opportunities, and not waste our time and thought in lamenting the neglected things of the past. Never at any time in the past were the needs so great and general, the field so large and inviting as at present.

Your Board in its report makes special mention of the need of greater effort in the building of church houses, however humble and unpretentious these houses may be.

Your committee heartily agrees with your Board in the need of giving special emphasis to the importance of this particular work. We would suggest and recommend that some discrimination be drawn between work of this nature that is initiative and that which is supplementary.

That is, whether it is the erection of a house at some strategic point where practically all the funds need to be supplied by the Board, or is giving assistance to some weak or depleted congregation.

Your committee is of the opinion that the aiding of weak congregations should be left more directly to the care of the Presbytery and Synod in which they are located, and that the General Board should have the care of all initiatory work whether inside or outside of the Presbytery.

Also that the General Board should be free to give aid to any strategic point within any Presbytery that may be of such importance and proportion that the Presbytery may not be able to care for it.

The Board in its report complains that the Synodic and Presbyterial Boards and those engaged in mission work in the several Synods and Presbyteries, do not report as fully and promptly as they should and as they are directed by the Assembly. This may arise from causes that are natural—a want of a system of organization that clearly defines the respective duties and offices of each respective and the relation of one to the other that discriminates between these respective duties and offices. The report also complains of confusion because of the work of these sub-

sidary Boards. Such confusion is natural and inevitable in the system that fails to define respective duties and to discriminate the respective fields. In the latter part of this report your committee submits a general system that it feels will not only remedy the occasion for both of these complaints on the part of your Board, but will aid greatly in the promotion of both the Mission and Church Erection work of the Church.

In regard to other parts and features of your Board's report:

1. We believe there is occasion for caution on the part of the Board in aiding weak congregations and employing Missionary Evangelists in the bounds of active Presbyteries. In fact, we would recommend that the aiding of weak congregations or employing Mission Evangelists in any active Presbytery be either left to the Presbytery or be not done only on the recommendation of the Presbytery. This, in its practical effect, obviates any abuse of the confidence of the Board complained in the Memorial from Dallas-Bonham Presbytery.

2. In reference to the entire California field, your committee would most heartily commend its great and wonderful opportunities to the exclusive care of your Board. Also we would add to its special care the more western states and borders. Because of its weakened condition and as a strategic point, we would recommend Florida Presbytery to the care of the Board and would particularly mention Tampa, Florida, as a vitally strategic point at which our Church should be planted.

3. Our Chinese Mission at Canton, China, is too well understood to need any particular recommendation. Only as a work under the Woman's Board that we most heartily commend to the whole Church for support.

4. We commend for your endorsement the suggestion by the Board that a special Sunday be named for every Sunday School to make an offering for the Board and that the President and Secretary name this Sunday and prepare a special program as they may deem expedient.

5. Also that bequests for the cause of this Board be encouraged as suggested in its report.

6. That Ruling Elder J. E. Eberts be elected to fill the vacancy occasioned by the death of Vint N. Bray, G. W. Freeman be elected to succeed himself and that Rev. R. L. Layman succeed Rev. D. W. Cheek.

7. In reference to the report of the Committee on Revival Work while we heartily commend all that this report bears to your body in reference to this particular work, yet it is the sense of your committee that all evangelistic and revival work pertains more peculiarly to the duties of the Presbyteries than to your body or any agency created by it. We recommend that you enjoin upon all Presbyteries to give special care and consideration to revival and evangelistic work in their respective bounds.

8. In reference to the report of the Committee on "Promotion of International Friendship through the Churches," we recommend that its request for another year's consideration be granted. This recommendation answers the paper addressed to your body from the Federal Council of Churches.

9. Your committee has had under consideration the matter of mission work in the foreign fields. We feel that when the present social and political upheaval of the eastern hemisphere, that is carrying death and destruction in its wake as was never before experience and as we pray God will never again be, has spent its force, new fields will be opened for the gospel message never before so greatly needed, so inviting and so fraught with great possibilities. Therefore, we would recommend that you instruct your Board of Missions and Church Erection to at once appeal for offerings that a fund may be created with which to enter these particular fields as soon as the way is opened, the fund to be known as the Special Foreign Mission Fund.

Your committee has had before it a plan of Church Erection adopted by Tennessee Synod. This plan is particularly designed to help the weaker Churches within the bounds of the Synod. We not only most heartily commend the plan in its entirety, but request that you recommend its adoption on the part of all our Synods, in which event, the entire plan be incorporated in this report.

Endowment Loan Fund

(Adopted at Regular Meeting Held by the Board, Nashville, Tenn., Feb. 8, 1916.)

Whereas, there is a crying demand for help from weak congregations in the bounds of the Synod, to the end that Church property may be saved from sacrifice; and,

Whereas, an Endowment Loan Fund is an urgent necessity in the work of the Board of Missions of this Synod; therefore, be it

Resolved, 1. That the Treasurer of the Board be directed to solicit contri-

butions to an Endowment Loan Fund for use in the bounds of the Synod.

Resolved, 2. That no part of the principal of this fund shall ever be used except by the Board, or its successors, with approved security; these loans to be used for the purpose of paying for places of worship within the bounds of this Synod, and for no other purpose; these loans to bear legal rate of interest.

Resolved, 3. That the Treasurer and Missionary be directed to appeal to our people in the Synod to subscribe to this fund in \$10.00 shares, or half shares of \$5.00, or quarter shares of \$2.50.

Resolved, 4. That a separate record be kept of all who contribute to this fund in the minutes of the Board.

Resolved, 5. That it be distinctly understood that this fund is separate from the funds raised for the support of the missionary and the work of the Board, and no part of the principal of this Loan Fund shall ever be used for the payment of the missionary, or for any other purpose than that for which it is created.

HOW IT WORKS

All funds under this plan compound the interest. Band deposits at 4 per cent double every 17 1-2 years. A \$2.50 endowment will grow to \$5.00 in 17 1-2 years, to \$10.00 in 35 years, to \$20.00 in 52 1-2 years, to \$40.00 in 70 years, to \$80.00 in 87 1-2 years and to \$160.00 in 105 years. The 6 per cent loans in Church buildings will compound every 12 years. At the end of 96 years a \$2.50 endowment will grow to \$320.00. Of course a full share \$10.00 endowment will increase to a multiple of four. Another fact is that no congregation that secures a loan from this fund can sever its connection with the Cumberland Presbyterian Church and go into another Church with the property without refunding the loan and accrued interest to the Board.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON JUDICIARY

To the General Assembly of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church, Lincoln, Illinois:

Your committee has had before it, for its consideration, memorials from the Presbyteries of McGee and New Lebanon, also a memorial signed by four members of Missouri Synod protesting against a memorial from New Lebanon. All three of these Memorials refer to a trouble between New Lebanon Presbytery and Missouri Synod. There seems to have been trouble between Rev. J. M. Russell and the session of the congregation at Sedalia, Mo., New Lebanon Presbytery.

This matter was brought before the Missouri Synod by some interested party or parties. The Synod requested the Presbytery to appoint a commission to settle the trouble if possible.

In October 1916, the Synod met and a Committee on the Minutes of the Presbytery found that the Presbytery had refused to obey the mandate of the Synod. The committee reported and the Synod concurred in the report and adopted the recommendation, re-ordering the Presbytery to adjust the trouble with a penalty of dissolution in the event of a failure or refusal to do the bidding of the Synod.

The Constitution of our Church gives four ways in which a matter may be brought before a Synod, namely:

General review and control, reference, appeal or complaint. Rules of Discipline, Article 67.

A complaint was made before the 1915 Synod but we find no notice of complaint, in writing to the Presbytery before its adjournment or within ten days thereafter to the Moderator or Clerk of said Presbytery. Therefore the mandate of the Synod was null and void. The mandate of the 1916 Synod was made under the law of Review and control. This law gives the Synod the right to review the records of the Presbytery and to redress whatever it may have done contrary to order, but your committee is of the opinion that the words "review and address" do not give Synod power to make a mandate to the Presbytery under penalty of dissolution in the event of a failure or refusal to do the bidding of the Synod in particular as it was the first time to come regularly before the Synod. Therefore we recommend that this General Assembly declare the action of Missouri Synod out of order in making said mandate to the Presbytery.

The Memorial from New Lebanon Presbytery on this same subject further request that the deliverance of the General Assembly on this subject be transmitted by the Assembly's Stated Clerk to both Missouri Synod and New Lebanon Presbytery for their guidance. We recommend that it be granted.

We have considered the Memorial from Indiana Presbytery asking if a Synod has the right to transfer a minister from one Presbytery to another without giving notice to the Presbytery of which the minister transferred is a member. Your committee is of the opinion that it cannot except in constituting new Presbyteries.

Your committee has carefully considered the Memorial from McGready Presbytery in which this General Assembly is asked to answer officially a number of questions submitted therein and we recommend that such question be answered as follows:

1st. When a Licentiate is dropped from the Roll of the Presbytery he is no longer a licentiate therefore no Presbytery has a right to receive him as such.

2nd. When there has been an appeal from the action of a Presbytery to the Synod, the Presbytery has no right to further prosecute the case until Synod has acted and decided upon the appeal. (Digest P. 370, A. 2—Rules of Discipline Article 80.)

3rd. Every appellant must give notice of his intention to appeal and the reasons thereof in writing, to the court before its adjournment, or within ten days thereafter to the Moderator or Clerk. After ten days is passed the appeal is debarred by limitation. (Rules of Discipline Article 82.)

4th. If the action of a former Presbytery was unconstitutional the Presbytery at a later meeting, may reconsider its former action.

5th. If a majority of the membership of any congregation petition its Church Session to remove one of its elders who has become unacceptable to a majority of the membership the Session is duty bound to retire said elder.

We have considered the Memorial from New Lebanon Presbytery asking this Assembly to hand down a deliverance upon certain questions.

1st. To define specifically the powers of the Board of Elders in administering the affairs of the congregation.

The duties of the Church Session which are many are laid down in Article 27 of the Constitution. The Assembly is not asked to define any one of these in particular therefore can make no deliverance.

2nd. That the Assembly declare as to whether a congregational meeting is ever mandatory under our form of government, and if so under what circumstances and for what purpose. The jurisdiction of a congregation is lodged in the Church Session, composed of the minister in charge and ruling elders. Therefore the Congregational meeting is never mandatory. (Constitution Article 4.)

The committee has had before it Memorials from the Presbyteries of Lebanon, Madison, California, McMinnville and Princeton asking this Assembly to change the basis of representation to the General Assembly and to make certain changes in the Confession of Faith.

The committee has had before it Memorials of the Presbyteries of Hopewell and New Lebanon asking that no change be made in the basis of representation to that of the number of communicants. Your committee recommends that no changes be made.

We have duly considered the Memorial of Ft. Smith Presbytery, Arkansas Synod regarding certain changes in our method of work. We recommend that the Memorial be not granted.

Your committee has had before it the following: "We the undersigned members of the McGee Presbytery, most humbly request your Reverend body to interpret clearly and fully, Section 33, Constitution of the Church.

It is of the opinion of your committee that Article 33 of the Constitution does not give the Moderator of a Presbytery the power to call a special meeting of Presbytery without the concurrence or at the request of two ministers and two ruling elders of different Churches.

Fourth: Memorial from Synod of Tennessee asking that we make the Tennessee River the dividing line between the West Tennessee and Tennessee Synods.

We recommend the memorial be dropped since it is irregular and does not come in proper form.

Fifth: California Presbytery memorializes this Assembly to remit the Assembly contingent tax of Chinese members in China.

We recommend that they be released from these taxes.

Durrett, Knoxville, Tenn., take the place of the name of Hon. Vint N. Bray, (deceased) in Class 2, and that R. B. Shaver, Greenville, Ky., succeed himself, and that the name of Rev. M. L. Clemens, Greenville, Tenn., take the place of the name of Rev. C. W. C. Norwood and that the name of H. M. Baker, Dyersburg, Tenn., take the place of Rev. C. A. Galloway in Class 3.

Third: Your committee would further recommend that your Tithing Board be authorized and instructed to employ a competent, active field man as soon as the funds for his support can be collected.
