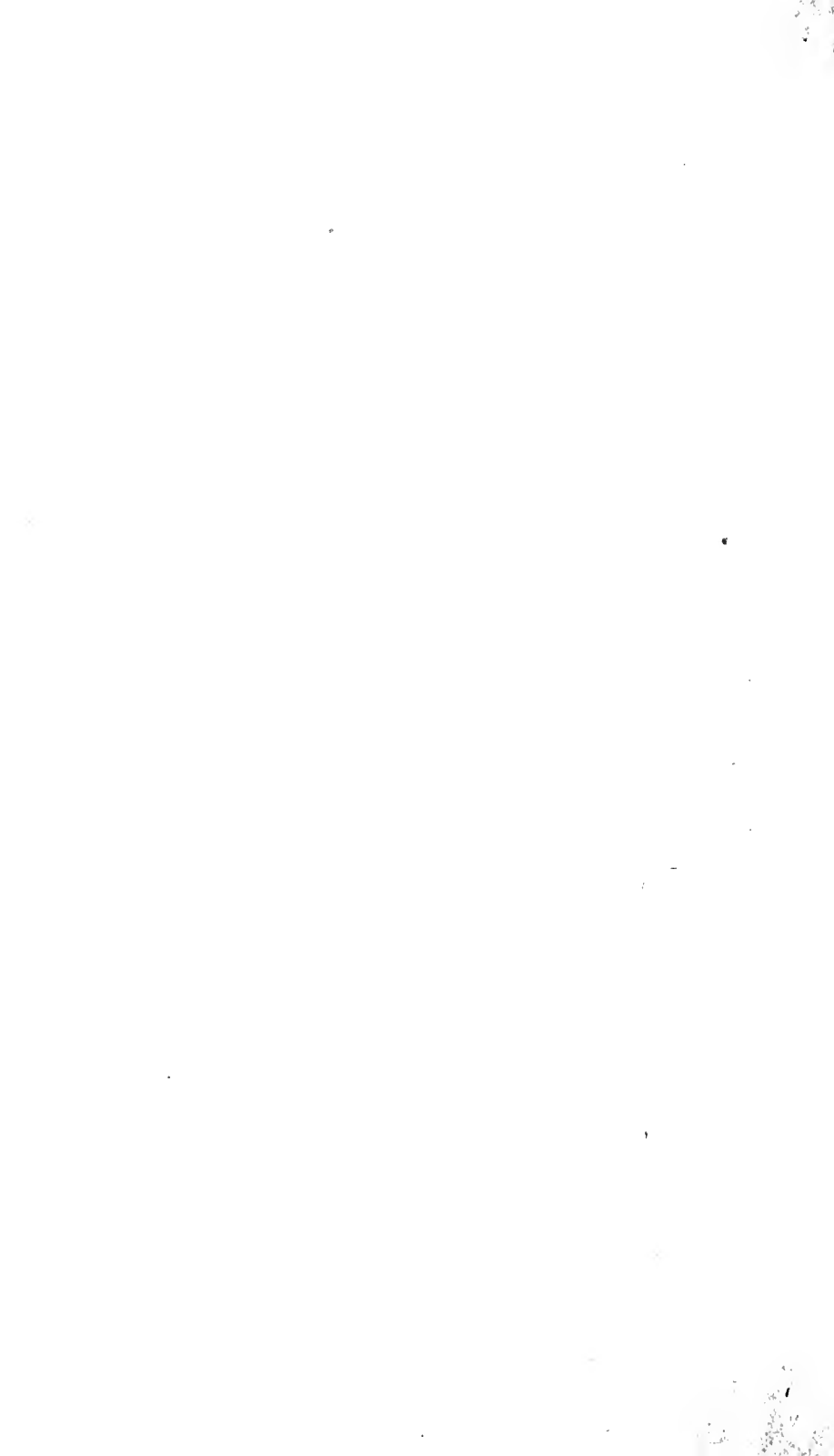


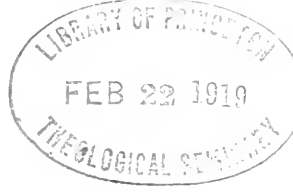

MISCELLANEOUS REGULATIONS.**I. THE ASSEMBLY'S STATED CLERK.**

Besides discharging the duties named in Form of Government, the Assembly Stated Clerk is required:

1. To discharge the duties of Engrossing Clerk, appointing such Temporary Clerks at each meeting of the Assembly as may be needed for his assistance. Minutes 1872, p. 31; 1873, p. 34.

2. To furnish proper statistical blanks to the Stated Clerks of the lower Church Courts. Minutes 1873, p. 34; 1897, pp. 24, 26.

3. To report inefficient Stated Clerks to their Presbyteries and Synods. Minutes 1889, p. 52; 1891, p. 15; 1898, p. 51.

4. As far as he can do so, consistently with other duties, to visit Church Courts and congregations and give encouragement and direction toward the general welfare of the Church, being permitted to use also the title "General Traveling Secretary." See Minutes of 1901, p. 115.

5. The Stated Clerk's salary is \$750 per annum. See Minutes, year 1916, page 73.

6. He shall also employ such press reporters during the sessions of the Assembly as may be necessary to give the Assembly news publicity. See Minutes 1916, p. 35.

7. The Stated Clerk of the General Assembly was instructed not to publish in the Minutes of the General Assembly any communications or

reports unfavorably considered by the Assembly. (See page 27, Minutes of 1917 Assembly.)

8. We recommend that the printing of the Minutes of the General Assembly (until further ordered) be done by our own printing plant, the New Cumberland Press, and that it be paid a price of not exceeding ten per cent above cost. (See page 130, Minutes of 1917 Assembly.)

II. THE ASSEMBLY TREASURER.

The Stated Clerk shall also act as the Assembly's Treasurer for the collection and handling of Contingent Tax. See Minutes of 1900, p. 47.

III. THE ASSEMBLY'S CONTINGENT TAX.

The Assembly's Contingent Tax shall be five cents per resident member, due July 1, each year. Minutes, 1914, p. 146; 1908, p. 99. Statement sent by Stated Clerk July 1, based on resident members, to each Presbyterial Treasurer. Minutes, 1898, p. 63; 1903, p. 7.

The Assembly's Stated Clerk is not authorized to remit the tax of a Presbytery. Any Presbytery regarding itself as, from any cause, entitled to relief from this tax or any portion thereof, may, by the counsel of and direction of its Synod, petition the Assembly to that effect. Minutes, 1898, p. 73.

IV. THE ASSEMBLY'S MINUTES.

The Assembly Minutes will be sent, free of charge, to ordained ministers, clerks of sessions, the various Boards, and schools of the Church, such Synodical and Presbyterial Stated Clerks and Treasurers as are not ministers or session clerks, to those appointed by the Assembly to serve on committees in the interim of Assembly meetings, to the Stated Clerk's Exchanges, to all members of each Assembly, and a copy is to be sent to any probationer requesting it and sending ten cents to cover postage. Others desiring the Minutes can secure them by addressing Rev. D. W. Fooks, Paducah, Ky., and enclosing 50 cents. Minutes, 1897, p. 46; 1903, p. 66; 1904, p. 66.

V. PRESBYTERIAL AND SYNODICAL MEETINGS.

The Assembly directs that every Presbytery shall hold a "spring meeting," and as early as possible; that the Stated Clerks of Presbyteries shall have their reports in the hands of the Assembly's Stated Clerk not later than May 1; also that summer meetings of Church Courts shall be held late in the season, in order that there may have been sufficient time to become familiar with the deliverances of the Assembly. See pp. 39, 67; Minutes, 1898, p. 52.

VI. STATED CLERKS OF PRESBYTERIES.

1. The Assembly recommends that, as a matter of convenience and efficiency, Presbytery shall select the same person to serve as its Stated Clerk and Treasurer where this is practicable. Minutes, 1897, p. 63.

2. This Assembly makes it a standing order that the Stated Clerks of the Presbyteries are to have their statistical, financial, and other reports in the hands of the General Assembly's Stated Clerk by May 1 of each year, that there may be no delay in publishing the Minutes of the General Assembly.

3. The Stated Clerk of the General Assembly has been directed not to delay the publishing of the Minutes on account of any delay in Presbyterial reports; and, in default of report from the Stated Clerk in any Presbytery, he shall publish the report as given the year before. Minutes of 1909, p. 91.

4. That this General Assembly require all stated clerks of Presbyteries, Synods, and sessions to faithfully perform all duties entrusted to them. All such clerks who will not discharge their respective duties shall

be ordered to resign by the court having jurisdiction over them. (See minutes for year 1918, pages 24, 113.)

VII. EXAMINATION OF ASSEMBLY MINUTES.

The Assembly directs that each Church Court, from session to Synod, at its first meeting after the appearance of the Assembly Minutes, shall conduct in open meeting a careful examination on the Minutes, as a means of discovering whether there be errors and omissions in the same and who is responsible therefor, so that the Clerks of Church Courts may be held to rigid account for the discharge of their official duties. See Minutes for 1901, p. 77.

VIII. REPORT OF BOARD AND PERMANENT COMMITTEES.

1. All the Assembly's Boards, Permanent Committees, and Stated Clerks of Presbyteries are ordered to close their books promptly on or before April 1, and to have their annual report in the hands of the Stated Clerk not later than April 1, in order that he may print the same and send them to commissioners in advance of the Assembly's meeting. (See Minutes for 1901, p. 117; 1903, p. 66; 1917, p. 29.)

2. When the books and papers of any Board of this General Assembly, receiving and paying out money for any purpose, are submitted to a special auditing committee prior to the meeting of the Assembly, such books, papers, receipts, stubs, etc, together with report of said special committee shall be submitted to the Assembly's regular auditing committee. See Assembly Minutes for year 1916, page 121.

IX. ASSEMBLY'S STANDING RULE.

In 1901 and 1915 the General Assembly adopted the following:
Resolved, That:

1. Popular meetings shall be held on successive evenings as follows beginning at eight o'clock:

Thursday—Home Missions.

Friday—Tithing.

Saturday—Sunday School and Young People's Work.

Sunday—Education.

Monday—Foreign Missions.

Tuesday—Ministerial Relief.

Wednesday—Publication.

These popular meetings shall be under the direction of the Boards and Committees, respectively having these interests specially in charge.

2. Friday forenoon—Assembly business:

Appointment of committees.

Stated Clerk's Report.

Communications and Overtures.

Reports of Boards and Permanent Committees, etc.

The Boards and Committees are each to occupy not exceeding thirty minutes and in the following order:

Education.

Missions and Church Erection.

Publication.

Ministerial Relief.

Assembly Trustees.

As a rule, papers that are in print and in the hands of the members shall be accepted as having been read, those presenting them having opportunity for making remarks within the limits named.

3. Friday afternoon. For so much of this period as may be necessary, the order of the forenoon is to be continued.

4. Assembly business in the forenoons of Saturday, Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday.

5. There shall be no business session of the Assembly on the after-

noons of Saturday, Monday, Tuesday, the time being devoted to committee work.

6. Reports of all standing and special committees shall be considered in the order in which they are filed with the Stated Clerk.

7. All resolutions touching the general enterprise of the Church must be referred to appropriate standing committees for consideration before they can be taken up by the body.

8. No item of business in conflict with this Standing Rule shall be considered except by suspension of the Rule by a two-third's vote.

9. In all cases not provided for in its own Rules or Order, the Assembly is to be governed by Robert's Rules of Order.

10. That we believe it would be wise for arrangements to be made for preaching services at eleven a. m. on Saturday and Monday and on Saturday and Monday afternoons for the benefit of the visitors or the Commissioners who are not engaged in the committee rooms, these arrangements to be made by the pastor-host.

MEMBERS OF CHURCH BOARDS.

(Original resolution of 1910 as amended in 1912.)

To the Moderator and Members of the 82nd General Assembly:

Whereas, there is no uniform number which constitutes the Boards of our Church; therefore be it

Resolved: 1. That in no case should there be more than nine members; and where there are nine members in the Board, three new members should be elected each year.

2. That where the Board is constituted of a less number than nine, that one-third of the members should be elected each year.

3. That no individual shall be a member of more than one Board.

4. That each Board so adjust itself as to comply with these rules after 1910 General Assembly.

5. That each Board may nominate to the General Assembly persons to fill the places of the one-third going out each year.—*F. A. Brown.*

MINUTES OF THE EIGHTY-EIGHTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
THE CUMBERLAND PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH IN AN-
NUAL SESSION IN THE FIRST PRESBYTERIAN
CHURCH, U. S., DALLAS, TEX.,
MAY 16-22, 1918.

FIRST DAY, THURSDAY—FORENOON SESSION.

MAY 16, 1918, 11 O'CLOCK.

The General Assembly of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church convened in its Eighty-eighth Annual Session in the First Presbyterian Church U. S., Dallas, Tex., Thursday, May 16, 1918, at 11 o'clock a. m.

OPENING SERMON.

The General Assembly was called to order by the Moderator, Ruling Elder F. A. Seagle, of Chattanooga Presbytery; and after a short address delivered by the Moderator the opening sermon was preached by the Rev. J. L. Hudgins, of Lebanon Presbytery, from the text 2 Chronicles 7:14: "If my people, which are called by my name shall humble themselves, and pray, and seek my face, and turn from their wicked ways; then will I hear from heaven, and will forgive their sin, and will heal their land." The Assembly was led in the constituting prayer by Rev. A. C. Biddle, of Clarksville Presbytery.

PROGRAM ADOPTED.

A program prepared by the Committee on Program was adopted, subject to any necessary change.

COMMITTEE ON CREDENTIALS APPOINTED.

The Moderator appointed a Committee on Credentials consisting of the following: Rev. J. B. Oakley, of Lexington Presbytery, Ruling Elder J. W. Burney, of Obion Presbytery, and Rev. J. L. Joyner, of Greer Presbytery.

RECESS.

Recess was declared to the hour of two o'clock this afternoon. Prayer and benediction by Rev. S. C. Lockett, of Corsicana-Waco Presbytery.

FIRST DAY, THURSDAY—AFTERNOON SESSION.

MAY 18, 1918, 2 O'CLOCK.

The General Assembly was called to order by the Moderator and was led in prayer by Rev. J. L. Elliott, of Sweetwater Presbytery.

COMMUNICATION READ.

A communication from the Synod of Illinois was read informing the Assembly of the consolidation of Sangamon and the Lincoln-Decatur Presbyteries by action of the Synod of Illinois.

1. That prayers be made for the President and his cabinet, for the Houses of Congress, for all heads of departments, and for all our leaders at home and abroad.

2. That prayers be made for the soldiers and sailors in the camps, in the trenches, on land or sea, or in the air, that they may be true to their country and to their God.

3. That prayers be made for those mothers and wives who have already made the great sacrifice; that God may give them the further grace of heart full of a helpful, Christian courage.

4. That prayers be offered for those wives and mothers who shall still be called upon to yield up their loved ones to the death; for the men and boys who must carry through life either maimed body or blinded vision caused by the wounds received on the battle field; and for the thousands of orphans made bitterly so by the cruel war.

5 And that prayers be made for the Church, that, when our boys have left a world-peace "over there" and come back to us over here, they shall know as never before the peace which passeth understanding."

GREETINGS FROM SAN FRANCISCO MISSION.

An impressive feature of the service was the dedication of the infant of Rev. and Mrs. J. T. Halliburton, of McGee Presbytery, by Rev. W. M. Thomson, of McGee Presbytery.

The power of the Holy Spirit was strongly manifest throughout the service, which closed with prayer and benediction by the Moderator.

At the close of the eleven o'clock hour an offering of \$70 was given to the local congregation to help defray the expense of this Assembly.

The consecration address was made by Mrs. Ollie Glass Baucom, of Hubbard, Tex., who used as a theme, "Who Is My Neighbor?"

Two young ladies, Miss Ruth Pickens, of Texas, and Miss Mattie Sanders, of Mississippi, came forward and placed themselves under the care of the Woman's Board of Missions. The consecrating prayer was led by Mrs. Mary M. Graf, of Evansville, Ind. A free-will missionary offering was taken, amounting to \$763. The meeting closed with prayer by Rev. J. W. Duvall.

EVENING SERVICE.

A joint platform meeting was held by the Assembly and Woman's Board of Missions, which was presided over by Rev. J. E. Cortner, of the Assembly's Board of Missions.

Mrs. George Wallace Wade, of the Obion Presbyterial Missionary Society, bore greetings to the General Assembly from the Woman's Board of Missions.

Miss Julia McCaslin, of the Pacific Synod, brought a message from our Mission in San Francisco.

Rev. J. W. Duvall, Secretary and Treasurer of the Assembly's Board of Missions, made an address, using as a theme, "Broadening the Vision of Our Horizon." An offering toward the building of a better house for our Chinese Mission in San Francisco, Cal., was taken, which amounted to \$1,400 in cash and subscriptions.

FIFTH DAY, MONDAY—FORENOON SESSION.

MAY 20, 1918, 8:30 O'CLOCK.

The Assembly was called to order by the Moderator, and the morning devotional service was conducted by Rev. J. P. Campbell, of Fort Smith Presbytery.

ROLL CALL.

The roll was called and absentees were noted.

MINUTES APPROVED.

The minutes of Saturday's sessions were read and approved.

COMMUNICATION.

A communication of fraternal greetings from Rev. J. G. Willis, of McGregory, Tex., was read and referred to the Committee on Fraternal Greetings.

Resolved, that this General Assembly make a deliverance requiring all stated clerks of Presbyteries and Synods within the bounds of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church to faithfully perform all duties of such. Any stated clerk who will not discharge all the duties incumbent upon him pertaining to said office that it shall be the duty of the Presbytery or Synod to demand his resignation and elect his or her successor.

The following resolution was read by Rev. J. H. Zwingle and referred to the Committee on Resolutions:

Resolved, that this General Assembly appoint a commission to begin work looking toward the location and building a permanent Assembly ground.

COMMITTEE ENLARGED.

Elder P. W. Sims, of Tulare Presbytery, and Rev. C. A. Galloway, of Logan Presbytery, were added to the Committee on Resolutions.

SPECIAL ORDER.

The hour of eleven o'clock this morning was set apart as a special hour for an address by Rev. H. W. Sears, of the Lincoln-Decatur Presbytery.

MEMBERS EXCUSED.

Rev. T. J. Rascoc and Elder F. M. Montgomery, representatives of the Springville Presbytery, were excused from the further sittings of this Assembly.

RECESS.

Recess was declared until eleven o'clock this morning.

SPECIAL ADDRESS.

At eleven o'clock the Assembly was called to order by the Moderator and was led in prayer by Rev. R. L. Keathly, of Madison Presbytery. An address was delivered by Rev. H. W. Sears, of Lincoln-Decatur Presbytery, on the subject: "The Brotherhood of Man, the World's Democracy."

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON DECEASED MINISTERS.

The Committee on Deceased Ministers made a report which was concurred in and its recommendation adopted. (See page 100.)

OFFERING FOR QUARTETTE.

An offering amounting to \$62 was made toward defraying the expenses of the Hilderbrand-Burnett quartette, who have rendered music during the Assembly sessions.

RECESS.

Recess was taken to the hour of 3:30 o'clock this afternoon. Prayer by Rev. J. L. Hudgins.

FIFTH DAY, MONDAY—AFTERNOON SESSION.

MAY 20, 1918, 3:30 O'CLOCK.

The Assembly was called to order by the Moderator and was led in prayer by Rev. J. L. Joyner, of Greer Presbytery.

COMMUNICATION.

A communication from Rev. J. H. Hughey, of Decatur, Ill., advising that the legacy of \$20,000 accruing from the will of the late Mrs. Cynthia Smith, of Decatur, Ill., would be ready to be paid to the authorized agency of the General Assembly on June 3, 1918. Same was read to the General Assembly, and the Assembly joined in singing, "Praise God from whom all Blessings flow."

RESOLUTION.

The following resolution was offered by Dr. G. B. Russell, which was adopted and a copy ordered sent by the Stated Clerk of the General Assembly to Mr. W. G. McAdoo, Director-General of Railroads in the United States:

Whereas, it is proposed to raise the rate of passenger traffic twenty-five to fifty per cent, and

Whereas, said raise is in consequence of the higher cost of living, increased wages, etc., and

Whereas, the average minister's salary has not been increased, but in many cases decreased, and

Whereas, the minister's life is spent in the interest of humanity, and

Whereas, he has had to pay the increase in war tax, and

Whereas, said rise will very materially handicap ministers in their philanthropic and humanitarian work, therefore

We, the members and friends of the General Assembly of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church, do earnestly pray the President of the United States and his Secretary of War, Mr. McAdoo, not to raise the rates of transportation on ministers and religious workers.

We pray other religious assemblies to join us in this petition.

The popular hour of the evening was a platform meeting conducted under the auspices of the Board of Ministerial Relief. The meeting was presided over by Rev. Charles R. Matlock, of Chattanooga Presbytery. A Number of interesting addresses were delivered. At the close of the platform meeting a memorial service was held in respect to the ministers of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church deceased since our last meeting. The roll was called, and appropriate remarks were made by members of the Assembly.

On motion and second it was agreed that debates should be limited to ten minutes and no person be allowed more than two addresses upon

the same subject, both of which should not cover a period of more than ten minutes.

The Moderator announced that the Rev. J. A. McLane, of Ewing-McLin Presbytery, would conduct devotional exercise to-morrow morning at 8:30 o'clock instead of Rev. S. D. Belt, who is absent.

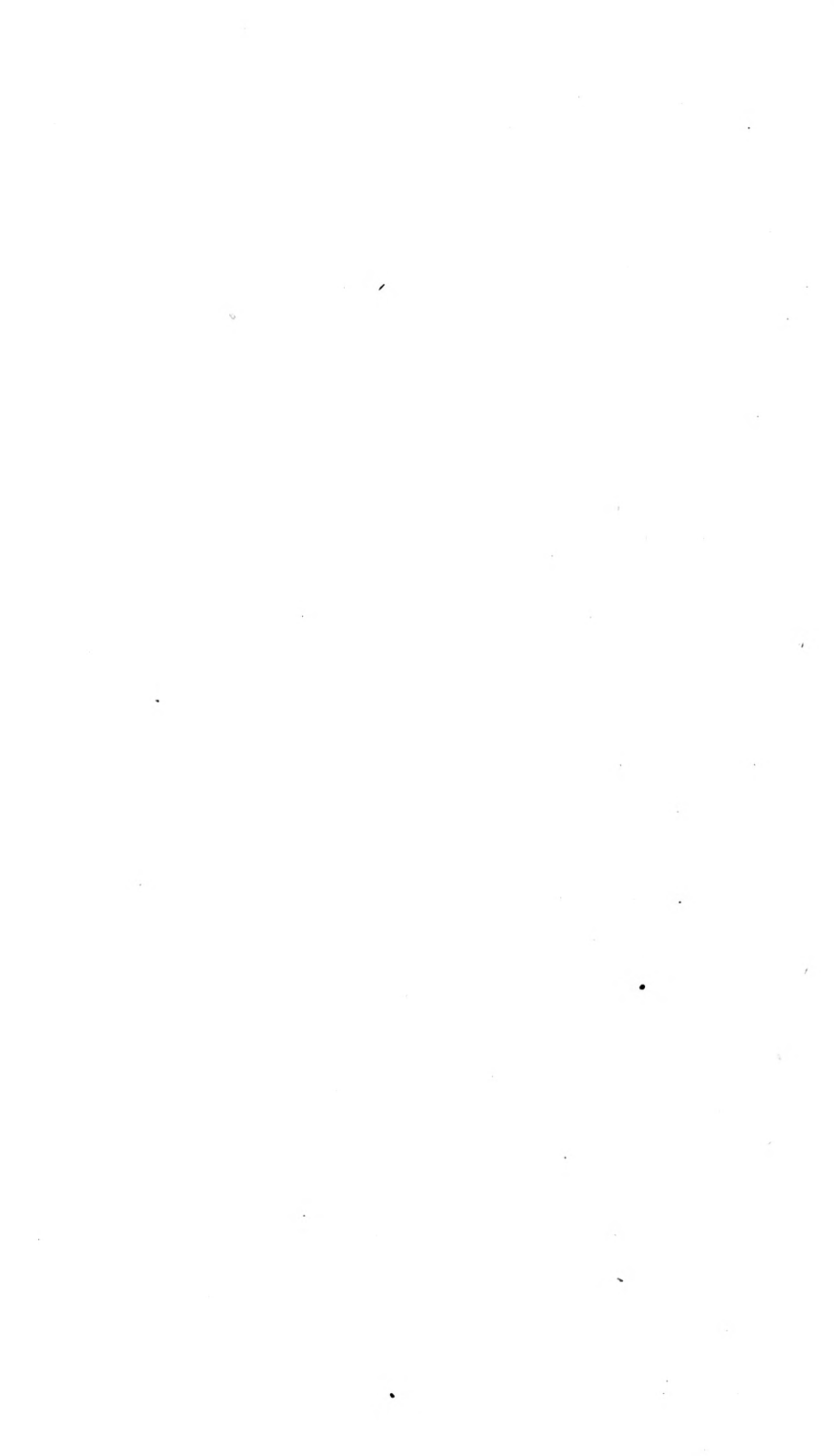

REPORT OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY.

To the Eighty-Eighth General Assembly of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church in session at Dallas, Tex.:

At the regular meeting of the Assembly Board of Trustees—fourth Monday in June, 1917—the following officers were elected for the coming year: E. W. Beck, President; Willis Goodrum, Vice President; M. R. Graham, Secretary; and W. J. Denhardt, Treasurer. Upon instructions from your Board the Secretary endeavored to ascertain something regarding the reported will and bequest of the late Dr. J. H. Sinclair, of Colorado Springs, but all of his letters were returned uncalled for, and nothing could be learned regarding the will. Regarding the bequest of the late Cynthia A. Smith, of Decatur, Ill., Hon. B. F. Cloud informs me that he, as executor of the will—is ready to settle with the Cumberland Presbyterian Church as soon as the papers are made out, informing him as to who the proper person or persons to receive the bequest. Our legal advisor, Judge Drake, of Bowling Green, Ky., is at present engaged in preparing an affidavit showing the Board of Trustees are the proper persons to receive the bequest. I regret very much that I am not able to report to you the work as being complete.

Since my last report to you, the venerable Dr. J. H. Hendrick, of Bowling Green congregation, and L. J. Miller, of Mt. Olivet congregation (both being members of the Executive Committee of the Board of Trustees) have passed home to the reward of the faithful. We recommend that M. G. Proctor and F. W. Quisenberry of Bristow, Mt. Olivet congregation, be appointed to fill the vacancy caused by the death of these two worthy members of the Board.

REPORT OF STATED CLERK AND GENERAL TRAVELING SECRETARY OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE CUMBERLAND PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH.

To the Eighty-eighth meeting of the General Assembly of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church, in session at Dallas, Tex., May 16-22, 1918:

Fathers and Brethren: Another year has passed us by—another milestone has been added to the ever-increasing number that marks the pathway of our march.—another link in the chain has been wrought for "weal or woe" to our beloved Zion. As your Stated Clerk and General Traveling Secretary, we have freely given to the duties of the office such time as we felt necessary.

PRESBYTERIES CONSOLIDATED.

We are officially informed by the former Stated Clerk of Sangamon Presbytery, Synod of Illinois, that Illinois Synod, at its last meeting, did consolidate Sangamon Presbytery with Lincoln-Decatur Presbytery and added its members and ministers to said Lincoln-Decatur Presbytery.

STATISTICS.

Again we have earnestly endeavored to secure a full, complete, and dependable report from every Stated Clerk of each Presbytery in the Church. In some cases we have made signal failures. Others have responded promptly and have shown by their statistical exhibit a growth that is gratifying to us, and we believe most pleasing to your reverend body. But this splendid growth, shown by reports from some Presbyteries, is more than offset by reports from many others where it is claimed that some session clerks are "slackers" and will not respond, although in some cases repeated efforts have been made. The banner Presbytery so far reported is Porter Presbytery, Synod of Arkansas, which shows a net gain of 236 resident members. The Presbytery showing the greatest loss—evidently due to the failure of session clerks to report—is Knoxville, which shows a decrease of 180 resident members. Sangamon has been united with Lincoln-Decatur by an action of the Synod of Illinois and yet shows a loss of 56 resident members. Presbyteries so far reported (May 1, 1918) showing a gain of 100 or more resident members are as follows: Austin, 105; Chattanooga, 173; Ewing-McLin, 118; McGready, 147; Ozark, 150; Porter, 236. Those showing a loss of 100 or more are as follows: Knoxville, 180; Leitchfield, 101; Marshall, 158; McMinville, 144; Richland, 176; Talladega, 165. Total statistics to date show a reported gain of 1,140 resident members, offset by a reported loss, due largely to negligent clerks, of 1,294. Net loss shown, 154.

DUTIES AS GENERAL TRAVELING SECRETARY.

Because of increased traveling expenses and from the fact that all railroads are discouraging all but indispensable travel, we have visited but few Presbyteries since our last meeting, endeavoring to reduce our traveling expense to the minimum. Presbyteries visited are as follows: Little Rock-Burrow, Morrilton, Mayfield (two sessions), and Memphis.

THE ASSEMBLY FUND.

We have endeavored to handle as judiciously as possibly the Assembly fund and have reduced the incidentals, traveling expenses, etc., to the smallest possible margin in order to conserve the resources of the office. We have done much of the copying which has heretofore been done by an expert. When we close our books this year (May 5), we have to the credit of the Assembly account about the same amount of bills receivable as on last year (May 5) when we closed our books. At that time we had on deposit, as shown by our report, \$1,218.93. This year on the same date we have on hand, as shown by our financial exhibit, which is made a part of this report, the amount of \$1,348.80, and this in the face of the increased cost of postage, stationery, office requirements and, in fact, almost everything needed by us to successfully carry on the work. In order to facilitate the work of the office and to handle the additional demands we have been forced to employ a stenographer a part of the time to assist us in the work for which we have paid from our own funds the sum of \$65, which has not been charged to the Assembly account.

NEEDS OF THE OFFICE.

We need for use very seriously in the office a typewriting machine, a few additional letter files, with a few other inexpensive articles which would remain the property of the Assembly and would be used solely and alone in the work of the Assembly office.

NEGLIGENT PRESBYTERIAL AND SESSION CLERKS.

It is painful to your Stated Clerk to continually call attention to the fact that the Church and the world are denied the benefit of our statistical showing only because many session clerks are so careless that they will not make reports to their Presbyterial clerks, and a few Presbyterial clerks are but little better. We respectfully ask that your reverend body call the attention, once more, of all Synods, Presbyteries, and congregations to Rule VII in the minutes of the General Assembly, stated as follows:

VII. EXAMINATION OF ASSEMBLY MINUTES.

The Assembly directs that each Church Court, from session to Synod, at its first meeting after the appearance of the Assembly Minutes, shall conduct in open meeting a careful examination of the Minutes, as a means of discovering whether there be errors and omissions in the same and who is responsible therefor, so that the Clerks of Church Courts may be held to rigid account for the discharge of their official duties. See Minutes for 1901, p. 77.

FINANCIAL EXHIBIT.

ANNUAL REPORT OF THE CUMBERLAND PRESBYTERIAN BOARD OF EDUCATION.

To the Moderator and Brethren of the Eighty-Eighth General Assembly of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church, in session at Dallas, Tex., May 16-21, 1918:

Dear Fathers and Brethren: Your Board of Education have closed the work of another year and desire to express our appreciation for all co-operation we have received in our efforts to make it possible for our ministerial and missionary boys and girls to attend school. With your support, we have given assistance to thirty-eight beneficiaries during the year, many of whom would not have been in school without the helping hand of the Board of Education. We feel that our efforts have, by no means, been insignificant, and rejoice in the accomplishments of the year.

There has never been a time in the history of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church when we needed more to encourage our coming ministers to be thoroughly educated than at the present. The world demands efficiency in every sphere of activity and makes no exception for the minister or Church worker.

We feel that our young people should be impressed with the importance of losing no time in acquiring such a degree of scholarship and efficiency as will enable them to compare favorably with the best of other denominations. The Cumberland Presbyterian Church, through her Board of Education, can sweep away all financial barriers that stand in the way of our young people and make it possible for them to remain in school until they are well prepared for responsible service in the ministry of our denomination.

The Loan Policy, inaugurated one year ago, has, so far as we know, given universal satisfaction. No complaint or criticism of it has come to us from any source whatever, and we believe it to be worthy an honest try-out.

Offerings to our Board during the year total somewhat less than for last year, but we think that this fact does not indicate a changed attitude of the Church at large to our Board. Not so many depended upon us this year, as one year ago, and our ambition has been simply to ask for what we needed; and if we had needed more, you certainly would have heard from us and as surely would have responded to our call and supplied all our needs. We have had an abundance to meet all our obligations and have enough in our treasury to carry all our beneficiaries to the end of this school year.

We cannot tell now what the needs of next year will be, but with the liberal support of our denomination, whose servants we are, we are sure that all our wants will be taken care of.

The term of office of C. A. Davis, A. J. Harpole, and M. M. Russell expires with this meeting of the Assembly, and it is yours to elect their successors, if you see fit to make any change in the personell of the Board. As to this, we make no suggestions further than to suggest that it is most desirable that men who do not reside too far away from the regular meeting place, McKenzie, Tenn., be chosen to membership on this Board. The difference is simply in the expense of Board meetings.

Praying that God will direct this sitting of the General Assembly in all its deliberations and that peace and love shall reign in every commissioner's heart, we are,

REPORT OF THE BOARD OF MISSIONS AND CHURCH ERECTION.

The Board offers the following report to the General Assembly in session at Dallas, Tex., May 16, 1918:

Dear Fathers and Brethren: The clock of time has struck, and another year has passed; and we, your servants, must give an account of the business intrusted to us. We have made many efforts to get all of the Synods, Presbyteries, and congregations to co-operate with us by sending an offering to the Board so that we might help the worthy, needy places in the bounds of the Church. There are seven Presbyteries from which we have not received an offering from a congregation in their bounds, and most of these are strong Presbyteries. The weak Presbyteries contribute more in proportion to their congregation than many of the stronger Presbyteries. A large per cent of the congregations have not sent anything to the Board. It is not because the pastors and Church sessions did not know of the time to make the offering, for this has been before them continually in the Church papers and through the United States mail.

Indifference seems to have settled on many pastors and session clerks who simply ignore the obligations resting on them. There have been more individual offerings than usual, which show the fault is not with the people but with the officers. We are living in an evil time, when most of the ministers and officers do not look upon their ordination vows as sacred.

If it is possible for the Assembly to do so, it should adopt some means by which all ministers and elders will be induced to keep their ordination vows sacred and obey the mandates of the General Assembly. The following congregations have sent to the Board an offering of a dollar or more a member: Shinar, in Iowa Presbytery; San Francisco, California Presbytery; Mt. Zion, Lexington Presbytery; Mt. Tabor, Madison Presbytery; Holden, Lexington Presbytery; Selma, Tulare Presbytery. These congregations should be commended for what they have done.

We find it necessary to insist that Synods and Presbyteries and congregations report to your Board of Missions the amount of money they raise each year for missions and church erection in their bounds. The amount thus raised added to the sum raised by the Board would cause many of our people to take courage and work individually for missions, and at the same time let the world know we are doing things. If this was done, many of the congregations referred to above, submitting no offerings, would be credited with liberal offerings; and the waste places would soon become places of life and energy, and thousands who are now without the gospel would have it. Many of the members who have not heard for years a sermon by one of our ministers would find themselves surrounded by a band of Cumberland Presbyterians who would be going out into the byways and bringing the people into the gospel feast. In the territory occupied by our Church there are multiplied thousands who can be brought to Christ through the influence of the Church, and for which the Lord will hold us responsible. Have we, as a Church, enough of the Spirit of Christ to thrust in the sickle and reap the harvest that is ripe and ripening? The harvest is so large and the grain so precious we could use a thousand more ministers than we now have.

We need more and better church buildings. We do not mean that they be unnecessarily expensive, but respectable, comfortably seated and lighted. Our people are willing to worship in plain churches until they are able to build better ones. We are not asking money to build fine houses of worship. The places where such churches could be built and ought to be built are numerous. We need a church in San Francisco, another in Oakland, one in Kansas City, Mo., another in Springfield, Mo., another in Louisville, Ky., and one in Tampa, Fla.; but when we begin to enumerate the places they rise up before us so rapidly that we have to shut our eyes and close our ears to the not only silent call of these places, but to the appeals from these places. It makes us sick at heart to see the many open doors to us and then think of the lack of interest our Church shows in missions.

What the Board Is Doing.**INDIANOLA SYNOD.**

Cherokee Presbytery.—Rev. D. F. Blasingame is the missionary for this Presbytery. According to his last report he was doing a good work. This is a needy field and should be looked after.

TEXAS SYNOD.

Quannah, Tex.—This Church has paid off the debt and is no longer being helped by the Board.

ARKANSAS SYNOD.

De Queen, Ark.—The Board is supplementing the salary of the pastor of this church—Rev. George E. Greer, ten dollars a month. There have been some deaths and removals, which for a time depressed the faithful, but of late the prospects have been brightening, and the members are encouraged.

PACIFIC SYNOD.

Your Board has been assisting three places in this Synod. As the years pass the importance of this Synod to our Church increases. There is no more inviting field to our Church than Pacific Synod. All the nations of the earth are represented in California. These people come to us with their heathen ideas and begin at once to teach and practice them. We must Christianize these people or they will heathenize us. They are not beyond the reach of the gospel, but yield to it when they see its reality and its beauty. If the foreigners in Pacific Synod were brought to a saving knowledge of Jesus Christ, they will in time return home and preach the gospel to their people. A converted Chinaman in his native land has more influence over his country men than a half dozen foreigners have; therefore it is important that we not only keep up our work there, but increase the number of missionaries.

Fresno.—We have been supplementing the salary of the pastor of this church—Rev. W. M. Freeze, twenty-five dollars a month, until the first of February, 1918, when we concluded it was not wise to continue the help.

Merced.—The former pastor of this church concluded to resign and go to school to fit himself for greater usefulness in the ministry. The congregation was supplied for a while with whoever they could get until Rev. J. D. Lewis could come to them. He is now their pastor and has been for the last five months or more. The work is growing under Brother Lewis's care. Merced is an important place to us. We are supplementing the pastor's salary, twenty-five dollars a month.

Los Angeles.—Our church in this great city is growing slowly and steadily. Rev. C. H. Walton is the pastor, and from the reports which come to us he is doing a good work. There does not seem to be any limit to the growth of the city, which makes it all the more important that we continue to assist the church until it is self-sustaining. We are supplementing the salary of the pastor—fifteen dollars a month.

Rev. B. H. Baker is the missionary for California Presbytery, who is now a member of that Presbytery. He is to begin work in March, but just where is not settled at the time of writing this report.

We are supplementing the salary of two ministers in this Synod, who are giving their time to the places most needy. These men are D. W. Cheek and W. A. Hester. We pay each of them ten dollars a month. The Synod of Mississippi is very weak and must be assisted.

Our Foreign Work

CHINA.

This is one of the most important fields in the world. The Woman's Board is supporting Brother Gam Sing Quah, who is doing a wonderful work there. As soon as this war is over there ought to be at least two men, if not three men, ready to sail for China. These men are needed there for the purpose of organizing the Presbytery of China, or whatever name they may select. These men are needed there to see that the work is started right and kept that way.

There are several young men there preparing for the ministry in our Church, who, when qualified for ordination, will have to come to this country to be ordained, unless we have a Presbytery there. And there are other needy foreign fields that are ripe unto the harvest and should be entered by our people at the earliest date possible. The people of the far-east will be ready at the close of the war for the gospel as they never have been. The great work the Young Men's Christian Association and the Red Cross are now doing will have so opened the way for the missionary that the people will be ready for the missionary when the Y. M. C. A. and the Red Cross are withdrawn. Fortunate will be the Church which will be ready.

TERMS OF OFFICE WHICH EXPIRE AT THIS MEETING.

The time for which Rev. J. E. Cortner and Elder O. G. Dameron were elected expires at this meeting. We recommend that Rev. Fred C. Hughes of Lexington Presbytery and Elder Robert C. Ewell of New Lebanon Presbytery be elected to fill the vacancies.

BEQUESTS TO THE BOARD.

"It is appointed unto man once to die, but after that the judgment." Before death comes men should have their business arranged so that what they have will be disposed of as they wish; therefore we recommend that those who are able to do so make the Cumberland Presbyterian Board of Missions and Church Erection one of their heirs.

ANNUAL REPORT OF THE BOARD OF PUBLICATION, SUNDAY SCHOOL AND YOUNG PEOPLE'S WORK.

To the General Assembly in session at Dallas, Tex., May 16-26, 1918:

Dear Fathers and Brethren: We herewith submit the report of the Board of Publication, Sunday School and Young People's Work April 1, 1917, to April 1, 1918.

The Board held seven meetings during the year; the first one May 29, 1917, shortly after the meeting of the General Assembly. Henry J. Graf was elected President; Frank Slemons, Vice President; Rev. T. Ashburn, Secretary and Treasurer. Rev. J. L. Hudgins was appointed Editor of the Cumberland Presbyterian and Manager of the Publishing House. Rev. T. Ashburn was appointed Sunday School Field Worker and Editor of the Sunday school literature. He was also required to give some time to the affairs at the plant and was for that purpose made assistant to the Manager. The term of office for all appointees of the Board was fixed to close June 30 in order to allow time enough for new Board members or new appointees to become familiar with affairs before changes take effect.

Additional writers for the Sunday school literature departments were secured during the year. The organization of editorial and mechanical force has been strengthened and improved.

The manager has persistently and consistently endeavored to place the business on a better financial footing and has in a large measure succeeded. Reports follow from him and also from the Sunday school field man.

REPORT OF TRUSTEE OF PUBLISHING HOUSE FUND.

Brethren: I submit the following as my report for the year ending March 31, 1918. Since the list of subscriptions to the Publishing House Fund was, by you, placed in my hands on August 14, 1917, I have collected and paid on the machinery notes executed by the Rev. A. N. Eshman to the companies from whom the machinery was bought, originally, the sum of \$713.63.

Owing to the fact that many subscribers seem to understand that they were to have five years in which to pay their subscriptions made in 1914, rather than in five annual payments which would have covered a period of but four years, collections have been disappointingly slow. Being your Business Manager, as well as Trustee, I have passed all the money collected, through your books, and have made all payments in your checks. I have paid on the machinery \$1,153.49, or \$439.76 more than I collected from subscribers. This leaves the Publishing House Fund indebted to your Board to the amount of \$439.76.

As near as I can determine there is about \$1,200 yet to be paid on the machinery notes, and there is enough due from subscribers to the fund to pay this and reimburse the Board for the money paid on machinery, over and above the amount collected, but it will take probably almost a year to finish up the collections.

I have every assurance from the Rev. A. N. Eshman that he will, by May 1, 1918, turn over to me as Trustee, all the notes executed by the Board to him when the Board purchased the machinery of him, fully received, and since you, through me as Trustee, hold the list of subscribers to the Publishing House Fund, I feel that you are entirely safe in the whole matter. This trusteeship has been a matter of much responsibility and has necessitated much hard work upon my part. But, because of my interest in the success of the work of your Board, I have tried to be faithful to the trust and have paid all postage, etc., out of my own private funds as

my contribution to the cause. From first to last the splendid machinery now owned by the Cumberland Presbyterian Church has never cost the Church, as such, one five cents; but the subscribers to the fund have paid it in, and I have, in as cheerful way as I knew, done the work of gathering it in. Assuring you of an abiding interest in all that pertains to your Board and its interests, I beg to subscribe myself,

REPORT OF THE FIELD SECRETARY.

In the early part of the year I gave all my time to field work with very satisfactory results. The latter part of the year was given largely to visiting Presbyterial and Synodic meetings and to editing the Sunday school literature. In those departments I have sought to be faithful to the trust committed to me. The embarrassing thing has been the magnitude of the work to be done by one man. There is enough work for half a dozen. The congregations are receptive. I have found the people responsive and ready to co-operate. The Church should not diminish its efforts, but should take steps to increase the number of workers. We cannot afford in any way to neglect this department of our work. The Church which fosters its Sunday school and young people's interests is the Church of the future.

The field work will pay its own way if properly planned and directed. Many congregations were visited in the interests of this department, and they are getting a new vision of the field and opportunities before them. Many are improving their methods and plans and are doing much more efficient work. A number of Sunday schools and Young People's Societies were organized, and there are many encouraging things in this field.

I have given much time and thought to editing our Sunday school literature. There are many capable writers in the Cumberland Presbyterian Church who make acceptable contributors. The denomination is fortunate that so many are interested in this line of work and are willing to give so freely of their talent. We have sought to improve all our Sunday school and young people's literature; and, judging from the complimentary expressions of the people, it is in a very satisfactory manner meeting the demands of the Church. Our people are more and more using the Sunday school papers and quarterlies and patronizing our Publishing House.

Plans for further improvements are maturing, although we now have literature and equipment that ranks with the best to supply all demands.

While traveling a large part of the time, yet the Secretary has found time to reply to one hundred and ninety-six inquires on topics concerning Sunday School and Young People's Work and written four hundred and seventy-five letters directly to Sunday schools and societies, and six hundred and fifty-five letters to promote the field work, literature, and Church work at large.

We received contributions for this work from one hundred and sixty-one congregations and eleven individuals, and Children's Day offerings from one hundred and nineteen schools. In addition, contribution were also received for the Board of Publication. Following is the list of contributors through this department:

THIRTY-SEVENTH ANNUAL REPORT OF THE BOARD OF MINISTERIAL RELIEF OF THE CUMBERLAND PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH.

To the Eighty-Eighth General Assembly of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church in session at Dallas, Tex., May 16-22, 1918:

Dear Fathers and Brethren: Your Board of Ministerial Relief herewith submits its thirty-seventh annual report to your reverend body:

Another year has come and gone into the past with all its success or failure. Your Board comes to you again with an humble heart, implicit faith in Him who is the giver of every good and perfect gift and a supreme love for the Cumberland Presbyterian Church, to report to you that success is still subscribed upon our banner.

It is indeed a great pleasure to report that while we as a nation have been and are at the present time passing through the greatest crisis in American history, when the demands have been greater than ever before upon our people in order to defend the principles that we love, yet the Cumberland Presbyterian Church has not forgotten those who have laid their lives upon the altar of our Church and have handed down to the goodly heritage we enjoy to-day.

The past winter has been very severe and long in its continuance on them. Yet you have made it possible for your Board to answer every call and demand that has come to them.

ON OUR ROLLS.

There have been thirty-one beneficiaries on our roll during the year, which it has been a great pleasure to your Board to gladden and comfort during the long severe winter through the funds which you have entrusted to us for that purpose.

There have been nine in the home at Bowling Green, Ky.—viz: five children and three ministers and the wife of one of these who have had and are having every comfort that can be given them

At the present time we have twenty-seven beneficiaries and seven in the home, making a total of thirty-four on our roll of beneficiaries. There are now a number of applications for beneficiaries, which will increase the number for the May payment of the new year.

ENTERED INTO REST.

During the year one minister and one widow have passed into their eternal home:

Mrs. Eva Taylor, of McMinnville Presbytery, Tennessee Synod, died January 4, 1918.

Rev. N. F. Gill, of Los Angeles Presbytery, Pacific Synod, died March 19, 1918.

"Blessed are the dead which die in the Lord from henceforth. Yea, saith the Spirit, that they may rest from their labors; for their works follow them.

DISTRESS CALLS.

During the year we have answered twenty-one distress calls, aggregating \$326.75.

OFFERINGS FOR THE YEAR.

Notwithstanding the great demands that have been made upon the people, we are glad to report that there has been quite an increase in the amount of the offering for this year, as the statistical report will show.

At the beginning of the year an increase of more than twenty-five per cent was given our beneficiaries by your Board. During the year the expense of the Home has doubled that of preceding years, caused by the great advance in the cost of food, clothing, fuel, etc. But we have been able to meet all demands that have been made upon us.

AUDIT.

The books and accounts of the Corresponding Secretary and Treasurer were audited by the Board at its February meeting and were found to be in excellent condition and well kept.

ENDOWMENT FUND.

One of the aims of your Board for this year was to start an Endowment Fund for the Board of Ministerial Relief.

Realizing that there are many individuals who would be glad to give of their means to be used as a permanent fund, the interest of which is to be used to support and carry on the work of caring for our old and wornout ministers, their widows, and the orphan children of the Church, your Board has decided to raise such a fund, that the work of those who contribute may continue after they have gone to their reward.

Your Board will be glad to receive for this purpose money, liberty bonds, or bequests payable at the death of the donor, the interest only to be used on all such gifts.

We are glad to report that this fund has been started in the amount of three hundred dollars, donated by the Holtslaw Sisters of Salem, Ill., and the same has been invested in liberty bonds, which arrangements were made by them. We trust that others will follow their example, that they may be contributors long after they have gone to their eternal home.

VACANCIES BY EXPIRATION OF TERM OF OFFICE.

The term of membership of Rev. C. A. Galloway, of Bowling Green, Ky., Rev. J. A. Hill, of Jonesboro, Ill., and Elder R. M. Lisman, of Dixon, Ky., expires with the meeting of this General Assembly.

The Board at its February meeting recommended to your reverend body that the above-named brethren be elected to succeed themselves.

RULES.

The General Assembly has set apart the months of December and January as special periods for offerings to be made by churches, Sunday schools, Young People's Societies, and individuals for the support of our aged and infirm ministers, ministers' widows, and the orphan children of the Church.

The Presbytery has the sole power of making a minister, minister's widow, or orphan children beneficiaries of the Board.

The application must be filled out and signed by the Moderator and Stated Clerk of the Presbytery and forwarded to the Corresponding Secretary and Treasurer of the Board.

Simply reporting names of persons in need is not making them beneficiaries of the Board. They must be made beneficiaries in the regular order to receive help from the Board.

Presbyteries which have beneficiaries of the Board who have become able to resume active work, thus providing for themselves, should notify the Corresponding Secretary and Treasurer to drop their names from the roll of beneficiaries.

The Home will not receive any person who has any form of contagious disease or who is insane.

A widow, should she marry, ceases to be a beneficiary of the Board.

The Corresponding Secretary and Treasurer shall make a full report of all finances handled during the year and submit his books, vouchers, and papers for the inspection and audit of the Board at its February meeting.

THE HOME.

REPORT OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE CUMBERLAND PRESBYTERIAN THEOLOGICAL SEMINARY TO THE EIGHTY-EIGHTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE CUMBERLAND PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH.

Fathers and Brethren: We submit for your consideration this report of the year's work. We beg that you shall give same your careful consideration. What we have done has been done prayerfully and with an earnest desire that the interests of the Church might be maintained. We, in common with all other citizens of our great country, have had to deal with problems brought about because of the world war that has raged so fiercely; and we are confident, but for the conditions under which we have had to labor, we could have accomplished a much greater work for the Master in the work of the Board.

At the first meeting of the Board after the close of the 1917 General Assembly the Board organized by electing Rev. T. C. Newman, Marion, Ky., President, and Ruling Elder D. M. McAnulty, Bolivar, Tenn., Secretary and Treasurer. The Treasurer was instructed to make bond in the sum of ten thousand dollars in some good bonding company. This was done, and the bond is now in the custody of the President of the Board. The Loan Committee was re-elected—namely, Rev. J. L. Hudgins, W. T. Marshall, and D. M. McAnulty, Secretary and Treasurer. Rev. W. A. Boone was elected to teach in the Theological Department of the school at Leonard, Tex., the General Assembly having instructed the Board to continue the work in that school.

The second meeting of the Board was held in Memphis, Tenn., on February 20, 21, 1918. This was a called meeting and was for the purpose of transacting any and all business that might come before the Board, but was for the specific purpose of considering some of the grave problems that confronted the Board and which are herein submitted to you.

It developed that the school at Leonard, Tex., was closed by the order of the Synod at the close of the first half of the term, which meant that the work of the Theological Seminary ceased to exist at that place. Your Board paid the salary of Rev. W. A. Boone for the one-half year's work at the rate agreed upon—namely, six hundred dollars per year (eight months' work in the school).

The report of Rev. P. F. Johnson, Dean of the Theological Seminary, made before the Board in session, showed that something radical must be done to maintain this work during the war period, and with his approval the following resolution was passed by the Board and the recommendation made to the General Assembly:

Whereas, we as a denomination, in common with all other American citizens, are suffering from the great war situation, and

Whereas it seems impossible for our Seminary to have an adequate body of students until the close of this great war situation, we as a Board recommend:

1. That at the close of the present scholastic year the Theological Seminary be closed until such time as conditions will justify the re-opening of the same.

2. That in case this recommendation is adopted by the General Assembly, then in that event, the election of a faculty by this Board shall be null and void.

FACULTY.

In the event that the General Assembly, in its wisdom, does not believe it best to close the Seminary for the present, the names of Rev. P. F. Johnson, Dean, and Rev. S. H. Braly are nominated for re-election to the position they now hold in the Seminary.

RECOMMENDATION.

In the event that the General Assembly does see proper to close the work of the Seminary temporarily, we then recommend that such part of the income from the Endowment Fund as may be necessary be used to increase the Endowment Fund, under the direction of the Board.

DEGREE TO BE CONFERRED.

Upon the recommendation of the faculty it was ordered that the degree of Bachelor of Theology be conferred upon Rev. E. Rueb at the close of the present scholastic year, he having qualified under the requirements of the General Assembly.

It was ordered that Miss Kitty Wood be given a certificate setting forth the fact that she had completed a three-years' classical course in the Seminary.

FORECLOSURE OF MORTGAGE.

During the year it became necessary that your Board foreclose a mortgage held to secure a loan of \$6,000 made to S. H. Borum of Nashville, Tenn. Because of some technicality, we were taxed with the cost of the suit in the Chancery Court, which amounted to \$224.07. The agent of the Board in this matter, Rev. J. L. Hudgins, had an agreement in which he understood that this cost was to be paid by the purchaser of the property, but up to this time he has been unable to collect same.

PURCHASE OF REAL ESTATE.

In the adjustment of a loan made to Rev. A. N. Eshman, the Loan Committee conceived the idea of purchasing of Rev. A. N. Eshman certain properties and made him an offer of \$5,000 for eight lots of his Radnor property, and upon which stands the building known as the Publishing House and a six- or seven-room bungalow, to be paid by the cancellation of his note for like amount. We believed that it was for the interest of both Brother Eshman and the Board that we made this offer, and after due consideration the offer was accepted and the transfer made. We are of the opinion that in normal times this property will sell for a profit over the price paid, and it is now bringing in a rental of \$37.50 per month for the two buildings. This transaction has been duly approved by the Board.

RECOMMENDATION.

It will be noted that the time of Rev. T. C. Newman, Marion, Ky., Rev. Hugh S. McCord, Marshall, Mo., and Rev. F. A. Grundy, Central City, Ky., expires with this sitting of the General Assembly. We recommend that they be elected to succeed themselves.

TREASURER'S REPORT.

D. M. McAnulty, Treasurer, submits his report, which is as follows: After the election of D. M. McAnulty as Secretary and Treasurer, it was suggested that the actual transfer be not made until certain litigation which was in progress in the Chancery Court and had to do with the collection of a note of \$6,000 and interest, same having been instituted by the former Secretary and Treasurer. Rev. J. L. Hudgins as Trustee was finally disposed of. This matter was reported closed, and on August 13, 1917, the books, notes, and papers of the Board were received by and receipted for, by the present Secretary and Treasurer. Brother McCord gave up one of the best pastorates in our Church to become Tithing Evangelist for our Board. He began his work the first of November, 1917. In these six months he has demonstrated beyond the question of a doubt his peculiar fitness for this important work.

We call your attention to the fact that this is a new field of work to which we have called Brother McCord. No other denomination, so far as we know, has a Board of Tithing; and no other denomination has a man in the field devoting his time and energy to this extremely important subject. Scores of our people have decided to adopt the Bible plan of tithing under Brother McCord's preaching.

We are happy over the fact that we were able to secure the consecrated services of Mrs. Vint N. Bray to help us in carrying on this great educational campaign for the Bible plan of financing God's kingdom on earth. Mrs. Bray will perform the duties pertaining to the office of corresponding secretary and treasurer. We call your special attention to her accurate and well presented report as treasurer of our Board.

We recommend:

1. That all our ministers be requested to preach on "Tithing" at least once a year to each of their congregations.

2. That each pastor be urged to write to The Layman Company, 143 Wabash Avenue, Chicago, Ill., for free tithing literature sufficient to supply all their members.

3. That the following brethren be elected to succeed themselves on the Board of Tithing: R. B. Shaver, Greenville, Ky.; Rev. M. L. Clemens, Greenville, Tenn.; Lieutenant H. M. Baber, Greenville, S. C.

4. That the month of July, instead of April, be named as a month in which our people shall be invited to make contributions to the support of the work of this Board.

5. That each congregation in our Church be urged to make an offering to the Board of Tithing in the month of March or July.

COMMITTEE ON REVIVAL WORK.

To the General Assembly of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church: The chairman of your committee submits the following report:

In view of the fact that the last Assembly virtually decided that this work should and does pertain to the duties of the Presbyteries rather than to the Assembly, and that the Committee on Revival Work was continued only because of the book that the committee was requested to prepare not being yet finished; therefore the chairman of the committee reports on that feature of the work.

The manuscript has been prepared by the chairman and has been examined and endorsed by each member of the committee, excepting Rev. I. K. Floyd, who is chaplain in the army and was not reached. Three of the eight members made some corrections and suggestions, which were appreciated and followed as far as possible.

The manuscript was gone from the hands of the chairman about six months on account of the mails and one or two of the members having changed their address. The manuscript was then placed in the hands of your committee, whose duty it is to examine all manuscripts of books published in the Church, as to soundness of doctrine. Each of the three endorsed it as sound Cumberland Presbyterian doctrine throughout. One of them made some suggestions that was of assistance in preparing for the press, which also was gratefully received. The Rev. W. T. Dale, D.D., is managing the publication, who, together with Mrs. Dale, will read the proof. We are glad to report that if there is no unforeseen hinderance, the book will be printed by our own Publishing House and ready for circulation before the date of this year meeting. The title of the book is: "Salvation, How Obtained and How Lived."

There never has been a time in the history of our Church when a wider field white unto the harvest was more inviting than at the present. When God first called us into existence, we were sorely needed to counteract cold formalism by preaching the truth as the Master preached it to the ruler by night. "Ye must be born again." There is a dark, dark night spreading itself over even the Churches of our land, and the same great Teacher is saying to many of them while the spiritual darkness is appalling: "Art thou a church and knowest not these things?" Art thou the angel or pastor of this church and knowest not that not one of your hearers can enter heaven without being born of the Spirit? Our Saviour taught nothing more positively; and still to an alarming extent there is a sad departure from the gospel teaching; and churches are being made larger, almost everywhere, with members who have not truly repented of their sins and have not surrendered their lives to Christ in a clinging, cleaving faith; therefore they are perfectly ignorant of Holy Ghost religion. The methods used in the midst of the prevailing darkness make the impression that becoming a Church member is about like joining a club or secret order, sign a card and go along with the tide, from a social or business standpoint. Is not the Cumberland Presbyterian Church in danger of a sad departure from the purpose for which it was born? Some of us believe deep down in our souls that the most important thing was us to do in this our reconstructing period is to throw ourselves out in the Master's name to let other Churches and the world know that we are a peculiar people in that peculiar way that God wants us to be peculiar—that is, in publishing far and near through our preachers and their reconstructed preaching, through our papers and their reconstructed matter in their columns, filling them with so much gospel, new birth power—we mean with so much expository teaching on being born again—that many thousands of people would eagerly read them, who care nothing for the heated discussions and seemingly unkind thrusts that they often contain. We preachers, we elders, everybody know that we are constituting a God-called Church, to actually be a power in God's hands in presenting the plan of salvation as no other Church can do, according to their doctrinal declarations.

The Cumberland Presbyterian Church is beyond all question standing very near, to say the least, enchanted ground, where we are getting some of the poisonous winds. Are we not feeling some of the world's chilliness in our souls? Are we not in danger of being like the Church in Laodicea, neither cold nor hot? You remember that God was ready to spew that same luke-warm Church out of his mouth. Our mission is wonderfully great. Will we fill it? We cannot be a revival Church without being revived. We cannot be revived without repentance, reformation, and faith in Christ. A revival is needed in the homes, so that the children may have the privilege of being taught the Word of God, and also have the privilege of being in family prayer. If all our families constituted consecrated, religious homes, father and mother having been born again, and they teach the soul-saving doctrine to their children, would that not be a wonderful, far-reaching revival? To make the work general and powerfully effective we preachers need to tarry before God until we are as the prophet, having the heavenly fire shut up in our bones so that we must carry the message of salvation to those who know nothing of the necessity of being born again in order to shun hell and reach heaven.

God wants to use the Cumberland Presbyterian Church to prove to the world that signing cards or hand raising or going with the tide into some Church does not save. Christ said: "That which is born of the flesh is flesh, and that which is born of the Spirit is spirit."

We feel confident that a wiser thing could not be done than to establish a rule to devote at each General Assembly one whole day, including even the evening hour, for prayer to God for revival power and for addresses and sermons on the importance

of a deeper spirituality and the great necessity of the entire Church filling its mission as a soul-saving brotherhood. There is not a member of the Assembly possessing heart-felt religion but would admit that God would approve of this being done and that it would result in rich blessings to the Assembly and to the entire Church, and still the decision would be: "We haven't time to do such a thing as that." If it is the thing to do, and we are bleeding at a thousand pours for want of a deeper spirituality, why not leave off quite a lot of useless discussions on minor questions and give the time to the most important subject that confronts us to-day. The very life and future usefulness of the Church is depending not on the question of schools and higher education, not on the question of publication, and other questions of importance (and they are important), but the most important of all is to first give time to the consideration of getting under Holy Ghost power as a Church and how to counteract the sweeping tide of formalism and the unbelief everywhere in heart-felt religion, or regeneration by the power of the Holy Spirit, before a soul is fit for the Church, and especially fitted for the home of the blood washed. These truths no doubt will be passed on lightly, consigned to the records, and that be the last of them; but we would plead with you to well consider the thing that is paramount, or rather should be, to every other great question that will come before your body.

We now remind you of something that we all know, and know we know. If we as a Church fill our mission in soul-saving, making it the greatest of all works, the Holy Spirit filling and leading, our Boards will run smoothly without friction and bickerings, our finances would improve an hundred fold, loving confidence in each other would be again established, and showers of precious blessings would come from heaven upon us. If we go on as we now are going, not reaching out after more of God's offered power and usefulness, knowing our Master's will and doing it not, we shall be beaten with many stripes.

Buchanan, the above report was prepared, and the Stated Clerk desiring a copy at once, there was no time to submit the same to the other members of the committee, whose minds we feel that we know so well on this work that we had no hesitancy in thus making the report.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON PROHIBITION FOR 1917, 1918.

To the General Assembly of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church in session at Dallas, Tex., May, 1918:

Fathers and Brethren of the Cumberland Presbyterian General Assembly: For ten years your committee has been making reports on the temperance and prohibition condition of our beloved country and ever urging the Church to be firm in its stand on this vital issue and to be true to the great trust committed to us by our Father in heaven for the upbuilding of our nation and the salvation of immortal souls.

This year we come to you with a stronger and more urgent appeal than ever before and ask that you give this great question of prohibition due consideration and give plenty of time for discussion of the same on the floors of the General Assembly. Too often this report has been considered as a non-essential and has been passed with just the vote, which, I think, in all cases has been a majority; but not enough of time has been given it to impress the members of the General Assembly and the audience present that we really are strongly in favor of real prohibition.

The issue is now squarely before our people, and we must not lose sight of the fact that we should use all our powers now and in the future to help crush and bury king alcohol once and for all time to come. Our United States Congress has submitted to our States a proposed amendment to the United States Constitution, forever prohibiting the manufacture and sale of all intoxicating liquors. Eleven States have up to this time voted in favor of that amendment. Never shall we relax our efforts until we get the required number of States voting in favor of this amendment to secure its adoption and thereby take the Federal government out of the death-dealing business.

It's going to be a hard fight in some of the States to carry the vote even by a small majority. The liquor men have an abundance of money and will hire some of the shrewdest men to speak in favor of their business and to work their usual devilish

plans to hold the State in favor of the whiskey business. They are at work now, planning and executing their plans, putting in their money to defeat the issue in States where they believe there is some hope of holding the State in favor of the business. So should we be using every opportunity to safeguard our interests of home and country.

Preach it from the pulpit, from the platform, from the place of business, and on the public highway. Put all the power into your State possible and carry the vote by the biggest majority you possibly can. While we have a chance let us down this hell-traffic once and for all time to come. Stir your people everywhere you go.

The liquor business is the devil's business from start to finish. It has brought starvation and death to its untold thousands of pitiful and helpless women and children and filled thousands of drunkards' graves. It's the lowest down, meanest, most dishonest, most contemptible and merciless business on the face of the earth; and why shall we endure it any longer? It curses the home and blights the life of every individual it comes in contact with. Why shall our Federal government and our States be a party to it any longer? Rise up, ye men, and put it out and wash your hands of it forever and ever.

Our government receives about three hundred and twenty-five millions of dollars out of this revenue every year, but every dollar of that and more too is turned back to take care of the hell-distilling broth; and when the liquor men say the government must have the revenue or go bankrupt, he knows it's not the truth.

If liquor is good in time of peace, why is it so bad in time of war? Then look at the nations in the world's war to-day, and from the time they moberlized their armies they prohibited the use of intoxicating liquors being served to their men. A thousand times more should we prohibit the deadly stuff from being dealt out to our sons and daughters at any time.

National prohibition is the only remedy for this deadly curse on the human race. It will stop the making, and that will stop the drinking. There will be no more shipping across State lines or into any dry territory. No more bootlegging. No more blind tigers. We will have removed one curse off of our fair land when we so amend the United States Constitution that it cannot be made in the United States.

God speed the time when this curse shall be removed forever off of the face of the earth.

Dear Brethren of the Assembly, we beg you to give due consideration to this report and also to the report of the local committee in this General Assembly.

We don't think it would be wise at this time to allow the interest that is even now held in the writing of said history to wane by dispensing with this Society, but keep up the Society, and when the time should arrive they can then secure some one to write from the data held by them.

REPORT OF THE COMPILER OF ASSEMBLY'S NEW CUMBERLAND PRESBYTERIAN DIGEST.

Moderator and Brethren: The Assembly in 1916, at Birmingham, Ala., adopted the following resolution: "Whereas, the need of an up-to-date Digest of General Assembly deliverances on various phases of Church laws and government is great, and such a Digest is essential to a proper understanding and efficient administration of our Church government; therefore be it

Resolved, That this General Assembly appoint a commission of three whose duty it shall be to arrange for the compilation and publication of such a Digest, and that the deliverances of the General Assembly as contained in Stephens' Digest shall be revised and included in the New Digest, unless precluded by copyright."

The Assembly of 1917, at Lincoln, Ill., sanctioned this former action, taking a further step toward securing this much-needed revision of our Digest by adopting the following resolution:

"We recommend that Rev. A. C. Biddle, of Clarksville, Tenn., be appointed to prepare the Digest, in accordance with the printed report of the committee." Adopted 1917, p. 133.

A casual examination of the old Digest will show that a great deal of the matter found there has either become obsolete or non-applicable to our Church since the attempted union; and so I have carefully gone over every line of it and conscientiously deleted every reference and movement which can never be of further benefit to the Cumberland Presbyterian Church. And so it comes about, brethren, that, while I have added all the pertinent deliverances of the twenty Assemblies since 1898 and have introduced the full text of all our charters and the personnel of all our present activities, yet the new book will be only half so large as the old one. The printer estimates that the present volume will not exceed 250 to 300 pages. In the manner of treating the matters to be found in the Digest, I have adopted the plan and general order of the old book, both because of its logical simplicity and admirable arrangement, but more especially because the workers in all our Church courts have for years been acquainted with that arrangement. Therefore, all deliverances, opinions, or mandates of the Assembly shall be found under one or another of the following general divisions:

- I.—The Historical Statement.
- II.—The Church.
- III.—The Church Officers.
- IV.—The Church Courts.
- V.—The Judiciary.
- VI.—The Agencies of the Assembly.

Then, too, complete indexes are so arranged that easy reference may be had in a moment to any deliverance that has been made upon the question. I am also working up a "Brief on Points of Order" and "Rules for the Government of Church Courts," which I am reasonably sure will add very much to the forum value of the New Cumberland Presbyterian Digest.

Anxious to serve you in any way that seems best, I await your further orders concerning the printing and publishing the new Digest.

REPORT AND OVERTURES OF THE EDUCATIONAL CONVENTION HELD IN MEMPHIS, TENN., FEBRUARY 20, 1918, AND ADDRESSED TO THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE CUMBERLAND PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH.

To the General Assembly of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church, in session at Dallas, Tex., May 16-21, 1918:

Dear Brethren: A Cumberland Presbyterian conference was held in the city of Memphis, Tenn., on February 20, 1918, for the purpose of considering the educational needs of our denomination. The following report of the Committee on Resolutions was adopted:

Your Committee on Resolutions would submit the following for your prayerful consideration:

Whereas, the educational needs of our denomination are only provided for in part by the present educational policy of our Church and believing that the time has fully come when some definite plan for concerted action should be adopted; therefore be it

Resolved, That this Conference submit to the General Assembly, which convenes at Dallas, Tex., in May, 1918, the following as a policy and program for the Cumberland Presbyterian Church:

1. That the General Assembly establish and maintain one educational institution, which shall include both a literary and a theological department.
2. That this institution shall be under the supervision of a Board of Trustees elected by the General Assembly.
3. That the General Assembly, at its meeting in May, 1918, provide for the raising of one-half million dollars as an endowment for the literary department.
4. That the endowment of the two departments be kept separate and distinct.
5. That the following plan be adopted for the raising of the literary endowment:
 - (a) That the Assembly appoint an Endowment Committee.
 - (b) That no subscription be binding until at least a quarter of a million dollars be subscribed.
 - (c) That when a quarter of a million dollars has been subscribed all subscriptions become binding and are due and shall be paid in cash or by bankable notes bearing interest at the rate of six per cent per annum.
 - (d) That the provisions for the raising of the literary endowment shall not interfere with the present plan of raising the theological endowment.

We, therefore, now as the Board of Trustees submit to you for your prayerful consideration this tender with all it may mean and pray that you will give same proper thought and that the General Assembly will decide this question in a way that will prove to be for the benefit of the whole Church.

REPORT OF MUSIC EDITOR.

To the General Assembly of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church, to meet in Dallas, Tex., May 16-22, 1918:

Moderator, Fathers, and Brethren: Since my appointment as your Music Editor by the Assembly in 1910, at Dickson, Tenn., beginning with that year, I have published a revised and enlarged edition of "Cumberland Hymns," known as "Centenary Edition," which is now being published and for sale by the New Cumberland Press. This book contains some fine songs commemorative of the organization of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church, February 4, 1810. Then it abounds with the "Whosoever-Will" type of songs that distinguishes it as a Cumberland Presbyterian songbook. Besides these it abounds with an array of fine gospel songs for revivals, prayer meetings, Sabbath schools, a fine selection of old standard hymns and tunes for church services, and a choice selection of "Songs of Our Fathers," which revive precious memories of by-gone years.

In 1911 I brought out "The Harp of Glory," which was endorsed by the General Assembly at Evansville, Ind. This has proved to be one of the most popular songbooks we have ever published. Pastors and evangelists who have used it in their work have given it unstinted praise.

In 1912 we issued a "Supplement to the Harp of Glory," a book of ninety-six pages, which, when added to the original book, makes a book of 320 pages. The "Supplement" can be had bound with "The Harp of Glory," or separately.

As Music Editor the General Assembly at Warrenburg, Mo., in 1912, appointed us Chairman of a Committee to prepare a New Church Hymnal, and this committee was able to report to the Assembly which met at Bowling Green, Ky., in 1913, that this task, though a laborious one, had been performed. Our report was received and adopted by that Assembly.

The next step was to have the new hymnal published, for without it being published it could be of no possible benefit to the Church. So on July 10, following the Assembly, we laid the matter before the Board of Publication at a regular meeting in the Publishing House and asked the Board as to the feasibility of its undertaking the publication of the book. After carefully considering the matter, it was decided that the Board was not in a financial condition to undertake the work; but the Board pledged itself to co-operate with any other publishers who might be willing to publish the book. After long and tedious correspondence with other publishers, we were finally able to arrange with the A. S. Barnes Company, of New York, to take the book and publish it on their own account, but not until they had been assured that it had been adopted by the General Assembly and endorsed by the Board

of Publication. Thus it will be seen that this was not a private venture by the publishers as a money-making scheme.

Perhaps I should not conceal the fact longer that during our correspondence with the publishers they wished the Board to share the financial outlay with them by advancing about \$1,500 toward the expense of making the plates, the same to be taken up in books when ready to deviler.

Knowing well the serious financial embarrassment under which the Board was laboring at the time, I did not present this matter to the Board, but wrote the publishers that I would advance \$500 myself to be taken up in books when ready. This proposition was accepted by them, and the work begun. This will account for my handling the books myself. It was that I might "get my money back" which I had invested in the publication of the book.

I desire to acknowledge, with deep appreciation, the valuable aid which the Cumberland Presbyterian Banner and the Cumberland Presbyterian have rendered in the way of free advertisement of the book, without which I would have been wholly unable to have succeeded in getting the book before the Church. Brother Havron has been very generous with his space, knowing of our outlays in getting the book out and wishing us to succeed. In my last report I mentioned the fact that the Board had ordered a certain amount of space to be given to the advertising of the book in the Cumberland Presbyterian.

Sometime ago, at my suggestion, the publishers made a proposition to our Board of Publication, Sunday School and Young People's Work with reference to handling the hymnal, offering fine inducements, which was accepted by the Board; and so now the New Hymnal can be had by ordering it from the New Cumberland Press.

I will still continue to fill orders for this book out of the stock which I still have on hand and may order from time to time. I have it in board binding, also in full cloth with and without the "Bible Readings for the Responsive Service." I will be glad to furnish sample pages giving prices of the various styles of binding and a description of the book, together with a large number of testimonials from ministers, musicians, and the press, recommending the book in the highest terms of commendation. It has been endorsed by every Assembly since it was first adopted in 1913 and recommended to the churches.

I trust that our churches will roll up large orders for the book and send to the New Cumberland Press or to myself and thus help to redeem our obligations to the publishers for their large investment in the book on our Church's account. Surely the Church cannot be less than reimburse the publishers in this matter; and if this were done, I, for one, would feel very much relieved.

I thought when I made my last report to the Assembly that I would have another songbook ready for the Sabbath school, revivals, and prayer meetings by this time, but the uncertainty of the times brought about by the world war has caused me to postpone the matter for another year in the hope that times will be more propitious then. Meanwhile, I will thank friends to send me selections of such songs as they may deem suitable for a gospel songbook, either of their own composition or selection from others, that have been tried and found serviceable.

It is my purpos to form a strong company of our own people, to be known as "The Cumberland Music Company," with headquarters in Nashville and for this purpose invite any of our brethren who feel disposed to enter into such an arrangement for the development of the musical talent of our Church, to write me at once, that we may lay our plans. I am already in correspondence with some of our brethren on the matter. We do not want to waste our energies and resources by publishing books separately, but we want to combine together in producing the very best to be had.

I appeal to our people to encourage home production by patronizing the songbooks that bear the imprint of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church, and thus prove their loyalty as Cumberland Presbyterians. Our songbooks are the equals of the very best published in the land and should receive the patronage of our people before all others. Other denominations have their own songbooks and use them in preference to all others; and it is our privilege to do likewise, and we should be loyal enough to do it.

And because of the great calamity which befell our beloved Church in Dallas (where you are now assembled) fourteen years ago, which disrupted our once happy, united, and prosperous Church, we who have remained loyal to the principles of our fathers should feel ourselves bound by the common ties of brotherhood to stand by each other in the matters that pertain to the welfare of the Church.

Praying God's richest blessings on you in all your deliberations and trusting that our work as your Music Editor may have been such as to merit a continuation of your sanction and approval, I am yours for the best service I am capable of rendering to the Lord and our beloved Church.

REPORT OF CONDITION OF DALLAS CHURCH.

General Assembly Board of Missions, in session at Dallas, Tex., May 16-22, 1918:
Brethren:

We, the Church Session of First Cumberland Presbyterian Church of Dallas, Tex., herewith submit to you a report of condition of our Church and a proposition for handling the Church in the future.

Our local active membership is forty-seven, of which number only five are grown men. There are twelve members who earn or have incomes, and there is not a wealthy member in the Church.

The indebtedness is as follows:

The note at the First State Bank carries a lien on the Church property and is due the 28th of this month. This was extended six months ago on payment of interest only, in hope of being able to dispose of it in some way during the General Assembly. We are unable to meet the note or to make a payment on it, and as the property is worth \$2,500 on very lowest reasonable appraisal, we appeal to you to

save it, and the proposition which we wish to submit is as follows: That you take the above indebtedness off our shoulders and handle the Church here as a mission, Trustees of Dallas Church to deed the property here into such trusteeship as may be indicated by you, and Dallas congregation to exert its best efforts to maintain and build up the organization.

EXPLANATION.

The note to Mrs. Eversole, a local member, is not to be paid at any stated time, her agreement being that she will carry the note, on payment of interest, indefinitely, the loan being subject to call only on condition that she finds it necessary to call it. We do not know what arrangement can be made for carrying this note should our within proposal be accepted by you, nor can we say just what can be done in the matter of the Woman's Board note, which is due July 26, next, with option of renewal for one year. The piano in question was never really purchased by the Church, arrangements being made by individuals with the understanding that the Church was not to be held responsible in any way for its purchase. This debt can be disposed of by returning the instrument, and such settlement is entirely satisfactory with us, as individual members.

In case these three items can be disposed of for the present the net indebtedness remains as follows:

REPORT OF WAR-WORK COMMITTEE.

To the Eighty-Eighth General Assembly of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church: Brethren: Your Committee on War Work, after duly considering the matter referred to them, would recommend:

1. That your body create a special War-Work Commission composed of five members.
2. That this Commission is created with special reference to the religious activities and gospel ministrations in connection with the great war now pending on the European soil, and which Commission shall continue until the close of the war.
3. That it shall be the special duty of this Commission to consider and recommend to the War Department all applications for ministers of our Church for service as chaplains in the regular army and navy; also to assist any one of our Church who may desire to enter the army Y. M. C. A. service.
4. That the Commission will co-operate with the various ministers of our Church, who are serving as chaplains in the army and navy, with the view of giving any additional aid that may be needed, supplying them with necessary equipments in their work, and for the purchasing of religious tracts and literature that may be needful and helpful in the service.
5. That the Church at large be called upon to contribute the necessary funds for the prosecution of the work of the Commission.

REPORT NO. 2 OF COMMITTEE ON MISSIONS AND CHURCH ERECTION.

Your Committee on Missions and Church Erection would make report No. 2 as follows:

We have had the report of the Board of Missions and Church Erection before us and have carefully considered it from every standpoint possible for us to do.

We cheerfully commend the Board for the untiring efforts it has made during the past year. It brings to us the best report for the past ten years, but at the same time it is far too small to meet the demands made upon it for its work. This is no fault of the Board, and we must face the fact that our churches and pastors have been unmindful of the cause of missions—did not answer the call made upon them by your reverend body.

We note that seven Presbyteries did not respond to any appeal made to them by the officials of the Board. And your committee is at a loss to make any excuse for them. But we do commend San Francisco congregation, California Presbytery, Shinar, in Iowa Presbytery, Mt. Zion, Lexington Presbytery, Mt. Tabor, Madison Presbytery, Holden, Lexington Presbytery, Selma, Tulare Presbytery, for sending more than one dollar per member. If all the churches would have done the same, the Board could have done a work that this Assembly would have been proud to put its approval upon.

The Board requests that you demand of your ministers and churches to keep their vows, which were solemnly made to the Lord, and your committee recommends the following for your adoption:

1. That you require all Presbyterial Missionary Committees to report all work done and funds collected to the Synodical Boards, and all Synodical Boards to report all work done and funds collected, including the work of the Presbyterial Boards, to the Assembly's Board of Missions and Church Erection.

2. That you require and demand that each church and minister take the usual collections called for by this Assembly and forward same to the Assembly's Board.

3. That you instruct your Board not to spend any of the funds belonging to the Board upon any man or church without the lawful approval of the Presbytery in whose bounds the work is to be done; and in the event that any Presbytery should approve any man or church, that the Board of Missions should later find unworthy, that the Board be instructed to cease paying anything more to said person or church.

4. That you instruct the Board of Missions to favorably consider the case of the Mississippi Synod, and if at all possible to aid the New Hope and Yazoo Presbyteries with a donation of \$120 each; also aid the Los Angeles Church in the sum of \$125 next year.

The time for which Rev. J. E. Cortner and Elder O. G. Dameron were elected expires at this meeting, and we recommend that Rev. Fred C. Hughes, of Lexington Presbytery, and Elder Robert C. Ewell, of New Lebanon Presbytery, be elected to fill the vacancies.

REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON MINISTERIAL RELIEF.

Dear Brethren: We, your Committee on Ministerial Relief, respectfully report:

As never before, we think, the American Church is beginning to show to the world that it has a heart. Hitherto it has held up to the world a beautiful and logical Christianity; now it is lifting a great beacon of light in a darkened world as it asserts itself in the setting forth before the world a more Christ-likeness. The great and cruel war is bringing to the Church many a wider vision. The appeals for charity and mercy are aiding the Church to really find out that it has a Christ-like heart. We heartily commend all relief work everywhere; yet every Christian of today just as truly believes that that charity which spectacularly poses as patriotic, subscribing to the relief of the soldier on the battlefields of Europe, and yet allows his own father or mother or child to suffer in the trenches of a spiritual service, is either ill-advised or hypocritical. "These ought ye to have done and not to have left the other undone." The same gospel which calls for increased offerings to relieve the distressed in Belgium calls just as pleadingly for increased offerings for the old soldiers of the cross, dying behind their guns in the fields here at home. Beloved,

your Board is placed in much the same attitude, with regard to the suffering at home, as the Red Cross Society to the suffering "over there." The stricken, wounded, dying soldier cannot be reached but by the Red Cross agencies; neither can the distressed of the old preacher and the helpless orphan at home be elevated except through larger offerings to your Board.

We have carefully examined the splendid report of your Board and make this annual exhibit a part of our report. We ask you to call attention of the Presbyteries to the better work done by the Board and to the increase in their offerings. We note that your Board has had for the past year thirty-one beneficiaries on its roll and wish heartily to commend the tender reference it makes to the passing of three of these to their final reward:

Mrs. Eva Taylor, McMinnville Presbytery; Rev. N. F. Gill, Los Angeles Presbytery; Rev. E. M. Johnson, Ewing-McLin Presbytery.

We call attention to what the Board has named the "Endowment Fund." It proposes to take gifts, bequests, wills, in liberty bonds or any other monies, the interest alone to be used. By this means a donor can continue to "feed the hungry and clothe the naked" after he himself has gone to his reward.

We also note that the term of service of three members of the Board expires at this meeting of the Assembly—namely: Rev. C. A. Galloway, Rev. J. A. Hill, and Ruling Elder R. M. Lisman; and at the request of the Board we recommend that Rev. C. A. Galloway and Elder R. M. Lisman be elected to succeed themselves and that Elder Harry Copper, of New Holland, Ill., be elected to succeed Rev. J. A. Hill.

We further recommend that you urge upon your Board the necessity of getting its work before the churches through the press of the Church and the mails, and that as the set time for offerings to this enterprise approaches, the months of December and January, that the Board make special appeals to congregations, societies, and Sunday schools for "Christmas gifts."

We further recommend that while it is inherent with a new-born heart to want to give, it is the duty of the pastor to give an opportunity to his people to give.

We also finally recommend that you direct that this report be read at the first meeting of each Presbytery and that action thereon be reached in Presbyterian minutes.

We have examined the books and accounts of Rev. J. W. Duvall, Treasurer of the Board of Missions and Church Erection, and find same correct.

We find the accounts of Rev. John A. McLain, Treasurer of the Board of Ministerial Relief, to be correct and in good form.

We have examined the books of Mrs. Vint N. Bray, Secretary and Treasurer of the Board of Tithing, which we find to be in order and well kept. This being a new department of work, presents for the first time its books for examination.

We find the books and accounts of the Board of Publication, Sunday School and Young People's Work to have been examined by an accredited accountant of Nashville, Tenn., who reports the books to be correct and well kept.

We therefore recommend the congratulation of the General Assembly and the Church at large for the efficiency of the various secretaries and treasurers of the several Boards.

REPORT OF THE JUDICIARY COMMITTEE.

To the General Assembly of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church, in session at Dallas, Tex., May 16-22, 1918:

Moderator and Brethren: The Judiciary Committee has had only four matters referred to us for consideration.

1. A communication from the clerk of the session at Humboldt, Tenn., asking the General Assembly to give the application of the recent decision of the United States Supreme Court rendered in the Missouri Valley College case, giving said college to the U. S. A's. Whether or not it effects all Cumberlands Presbyterian Churches?

Your committee would respectfully state that the said court in the Missouri Valley College case has not been published. Or if it has been published, it is not in the hands of your committee; but from excerpts or extracts as published in the paper proposing to give the same, we believe that we might rightly infer that the decision effects only the churches and other property that are at this time in litigation, but that where no litigation exists, that said opinion, legalizing the merger in

1906 does not apply and the said opinion will have no tendency to provoke such a thing.

2. A communication from Amarillo Presbytery has been referred to us, in which the Presbytery asks for the General Assembly to define who are resident and who are non-resident members. It is the opinion of this committee that this question is raised with a purpose of protecting Church sessions from paying Presbyterial dues for members from whom they have received no collection. We therefore beg to answer that all members who keep in correspondence or touch with the congregation or any who live near enough to attend services of the congregation should be regarded as resident members. And no session is, in our opinion, justifiable in reporting a member as a non-resident member on account of the non-payment of dues.

3. A communication from Pacific Synod addressed to this body has been referred to us, in which the following questions have been asked:

1. In case a Presbytery is unable through a lack of a quorum to hold either its regular session or the called meeting, provided for in paragraph 34 of the Constitution (when there are brethren holding letters from other Presbyteries waiting admission to the Presbytery), what steps shall then be taken to organize the Presbytery?

2. Can this action be taken as soon as it becomes evident that there will probably never be a quorum of the Presbytery; and if not, how long a time must elapse before the Presbytery can be re-organized or a new one formed?

3. Is the Presbytery organized or re-organized in this manner a new Presbytery, or a re-organized one?

4. What action, if any, should be taken by the Synod in regard to this new or re-organized Presbytery?

Answer to question No. 1. The Church law requires one session, either a regular or called meeting of the Presbytery to be held once each year. (See Confession of Faith under Constitution articles 30 to 34 inclusive.)

Answer to question No. 2. A new Presbytery may be organized where the legal requirements exist.

Answer to question No. 3. A Presbytery so organized would be a re-organized Presbytery subject to the approval of the Synod in the boundaries of which the said Presbytery is located.

Answer to question No. 4. Follow the law. (See articles 35 to 39 inclusive under Constitution.)

Referring to question No. 1 your committee^s is of the opinion that when the difficulty cannot be met by the appointment of a commission by the Synod under section 37 of the Constitution that the names of the regular ordained ministers who are present with letters in due form from other Presbyteries within the bounds of the Synod in which said condition exists should be received.

On page 83 of the Preliminary Minutes of the General Assembly we find what is termed a resolution and overture from Roswell Presbytery, introduced by Rev. E. D. Dysart, asking this body to release the Presbytery of taxes and debt which they had contracted because of their un-organized conditions.

We, your committee, would report that the above paper is not signed by the Moderator or Stated Clerk. Hence it is not properly before the General Assembly.

REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON EDUCATION.

To the Eighty-Eighth General Assembly of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church, in session at Dallas, Tex., May 16-22, 1918:

Dear Fathers and Brethren: Your Committee on Education make and submit the following report:

1. We have had before us for consideration the following:
 - (a) The annual report of the Board of Education.
 - (b) An overture from Madison Presbytery.

(c) A report and overtures of the Educational Convention held in Memphis, Tenn., February 20, 1918, and addressed to this General Assembly.

(d) A communication from Hopewell Presbytery.

Concerning the overture from Madison Presbytery and the report and overtures of the Educational Convention, we submit same in their full text.

Concerning the report of the Board of Education, we note that thirty-eight beneficiaries have been assisted during the year and that an appeal is made to the Church for liberal supports of the cause of education, that every financial barrier that exists between our boys and girls and efficiency (so far as education is concerned) may be swept away.

Realizing the absolute necessity of education for our boys and girls who are to be our religious leaders of to-morrow, we recommend:

1. That our people be given an opportunity to contribute of their means to the support of whatever institution, or institutions of learning we now or in the future may have.

We note further in this report that the term of office of C. A. Davis, A. J. Harpole, and M. M. Russell expires with this meeting of the Assembly and that it is the duty of this Assembly to elect their successors. Therefore we recommend:

1. That C. A. Davis be elected to succeed himself.

2. That Rev. A. C. Biddle be elected to succeed Rev. A. J. Harpole.

3. That J. W. Burney be elected to succeed M. M. Russell.

We note also in this report the financial exhibit which is not within our province to consider, except as it may be of interest to us in endeavoring to create a deeper interest in the cause. To this end we call your attention to the facts that less than five cents per member was paid to this important work during the year. This is sufficient to attract our attention to what should be done.

In regard to the report and overtures of the Educational Convention held in Memphis, Tenn., February 20, 1918, we submit as a part of our report.

"To the General Assembly of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church, in session at Dallas, Tex., May 16-22, 1918:

Dear Brethren: A Cumberland Presbyterian conference was held in the city of Memphis, Tenn., on February 20, 1918, for the purpose of considering the educational needs of our denomination. The following brethren were present at this conference and participated in its proceedings: D. M. McNulty, A. D. Rudolph, Hugh S. McCord, G. W. Burroughs, W. E. Dunaway, N. J. Finney, W. H. Butler, R. A. McCullough, J. L. Hudgins, Ira Foust, J. M. Bryant, J. A. Whitner, T. C. Newman, A. L. Thomas, W. B. Cunningham, G. B. Holladay, J. L. Cunningham, J. W. Stiles, B. W. Covington, W. B. Morgan, M. G. Brockwell, J. S. Hall, A. D. Salisbury, Burt Brown, Mrs. Ola Gragg, Mrs. Joanna Alexander, W. H. McLeskey, J. M. McLeskey, C. A. Davis, P. F. Johnson, J. M. Everett, T. F. Martin, E. M. Miller, and Dr. Horn.

The following report of the Committee on Resolutions was adopted:

Your Committee on Resolutions would submit the following for your prayerful consideration:

Whereas, the education needs of our denomination are only provided for in part by the present educational policy of our Church and believing that the time has fully come when some definite plan for concerted action should be adopted; therefore be it

Resolved, That this Conference submit to the General Assembly, which convenes at Dallas, Tex., in May, 1918, the following as a policy and program for the Cumberland Presbyterian Church:

1. That the General Assembly establish and maintain one educational institution, which shall include both a literary and a theological department.

2. That this institution shall be under the supervision of a Board of Trustees elected by the General Assembly.

3. That the General Assembly, at its meeting in May, 1918, provide for the raising of one-half million dollars as an endowment for the literary department.

4. That endowment of the two departments be kept separate and distinct.

5. That the following plan be adopted for the raising of the literary endowment:

(a) That the Assembly appoint an Endowment Committee.

(b) That no subscription be binding until at least a quarter of a million dollars be subscribed.

(c) That when a quarter of a million dollars has been subscribed all subscrip-

tions become binding and are due and shall be paid in cash or by bankable notes bearing interest at the rate of six per cent per annum.

(d) That the provisions for the raising of the literary department shall not interfere with the present plan of raising the theological endowment.

We will say that it is the opinion of your committee that there never was a time in the history of our Church when the demand for education was more imperative than it is now, and we heartily endorse any movement that tends toward bringing about conditions that will guarantee to our denomination a sufficient institution or institutions to care for our needs along these lines. Therefore we recommended that the first sections of said report be adopted verbatim, and that the fifth section be adopted as it reads except section (b) which shall read as follows: That no subscription be binding until at least \$200,000 be subscribed; and section (c) which shall be adopted as it reads except, where any person cares to include Liberty Loan Bonds or War Savings Stamps may do without making up the difference in the rate of interest.

We have taken due notice of the overture from Madison Presbytery and note that its memorial and recommendations are thoroughly covered by sections one and two by the Memphis Educational report above referred to.

We further note the communication from Hopewell Presbytery. We approve and recommend the adoption of this communication as a part of our report down to the clause on page 2, demurring from the proposition of merging the Theological department with the Literary department. We feel that the one great need and demand of our Church to-day is to provide for one school with both Literary and Theological departments under the supervision of one Board of Trustees, and that this school should as soon as it becomes possible give free tuition to every person who enters it. We believe further that this plan does not interfere with the policy adopted at the General Assembly at Wagner, Okla., 1914, to which reference is made in this communication, which plan as we understand it was: that a Theological Seminary be established and that an additional Endowment Fund of \$100,000 be raised.

A provision is made in the plan we are recommending that this Endowment be kept separate and distinct from the Literary Endowment proposed.

We note that all the provisions of this communication are covered in previous recommendations in this report.

REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON PUBLICATION.

To the Eighty-Eighth General Assembly of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church:

Dear Fathers and Brethren: Your Committee on Publication begs leave to submit the following report:

We rejoice to bring you the glad tidings of the dawn of a new day. With the machinery of our publishing plant entirely free from debt, a Church paper that is second to none, and the finest Sunday school literature ever published by our Board, we should get a broader vision of the stupendous worth of our Board and printing plant in the future growth and progress of our Church, that will send us back to our respective Synods and Presbyteries determined to give the Board the loyal and hearty support that it so justly deserves. We would commend the Board and the Editor of the Cumberland Presbyterian for their faithful work in furthering our publishing interest. Therefore, we would recommend:

That Rev. J. L. Hudgins be retained as Editor of the Cumberland Presbyterian and Trustee of the Publishing House Funds.

We also recommend the Cumberland Presbyterian and our Sunday school literature to all our congregations and urge that every minister and Church session see that their respective congregations use their own literature and that the Cumberland Presbyterian is placed in every home in our Church.

We further recommend, that the Synods and Presbyteries of our Church patronize

their Board of Publication when having their minutes printed, and that Stated Clerks of our Synods and Presbyteries send the announcements of their meetings to the Cumberland Presbyterian for publication, and that each church furnish the Cumberland Presbyterian with a news item at least once a quarter.

We note with great pleasure the good work done by our Field Secretary, Rev. T. Ashburn. The training of our young people is paramount to everything. The future of the Church depends upon this. Well organized Sunday school and Young People's Societies are the best institutions of the Church for producing strong men and women for God. This work should be continued if possible, and we believe it can and will be continued. We would recommend that the Board secure a suitable man to take the place of Brother Ashburn as Field Secretary and continue this important work if possible.

We have had a lengthy communication before us from Dr. W. T. Dale in regard to his various publications in music. As the General Assembly endorsed his work in 1910, we see no need of endorsing his works at each Assembly, but would urge our people to give him as liberal patronage as possible.

We have had before us a communication from M. L. Smith, of Nashville, Tenn., an expert accountant in which he informs us that the books are accurately kept and free from errors. He recommends that you install a more modern, simple, and business-like system of bookkeeping. We would recommend that the Board of Publication use its own discretion in this matter.

We have had before us a communication from our very dear Brother Henry J. Graf, asking that on account of his health he be not re-appointed on this Board. But after the urgent request of the other members of the Board and their assurance that they will relieve him of as much work on the Board as possible, we would recommend that all three members of the Board whose term expires at this time—namely: Henry J. Graf, Evansville, Ind.; Rev. J. H. Zwingle, Rock Island, Tenn.; and Rev. W. B. Duck, Greenville, Tenn.—be elected to succeed themselves.

We have had before us a communication from Judge F. H. Prendergast, of Marshall congregation, with charges and complaint against Rev. J. L. Hudgins, Editor of the Cumberland Presbyterian. After a careful review of all papers placed in our hands, and also having had these brethren before us in person, it is the unanimous decision of your committee that there is not sufficient evidence to warrant the charges in his complaint. Your committee would urge that your reverend body place your disapproval upon brethren bringing petty offences into our Church courts. All of this we cheerfully submit. Signed by the committee.

REPORT OF THE TITHING COMMITTEE.

Your Committee on Tithing would respectfully make the following report:

God had reserved a part of all that he hath made unto himself. When he placed Adam and Eve in the Garden of Eden he gave them right to all that was therein except the tree of knowledge; hence, reserving a part. And throughout the Bible we find that a part of all belongs to him. We see from the Bible that all who obey this law are blessed. We are glad to note the fact that this great movement possesses the elements of progress and success along Scriptural lines. The outlook is becoming brighter every day, and scores of people are being converted to the Bible plan of tithing under the preaching and teaching of our valuable Tithing Evangelist, Rev. Hugh S. McCord.

We have had before us the Memorial from Cumberland Presbytery, Synod of Kentucky, which is as follows:

"To the General Assembly of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church, in session at Dallas, Tex., May 16-22, 1918:

Whereas, there is some difference of opinion in our Church touching the doctrine of tithing, and inasmuch as conflicting teaching in regard to this subject is being disseminated, even by our own preachers to the confusion of the mind of our people, therefore, for common good of God's work in our own midst and for the enlightenment of the world at large, Cumberland Presbytery memorializes your reverend body to define the doctrine of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church on tithing.

The foregoing was adopted by Cumberland Presbytery in regular session April 6, 1918."

And after duly considering the above memorial we ask that you hereby declare that it is the sense of this General Assembly:

1. That God's plan of financing his Church, as is set forth in the Holy Scriptures, is tithing. "The tithe is the Lord's." (Lev. 27:30.)

2. That all should pay a tithe of their net income, or one-tenth, to the support of the Lord's cause.

We therefore recommend:

1. That all of our ministers be requested to preach on "Tithing" at least once each year to their congregations.

2. That each pastor be urged to write to the Layman Company, 143 Wabash Avenue, Chicago, Ill., for free tithing literature, sufficient to supply all their members.

3. That the following brethren be elected to succeed themselves on the Board of Tithing: Rev. W. Y. Durrett, S. M. Gough, and that Rev. Charles R. Matlock succeed Rev. J. J. Cobb.

4. That the month of July, instead of April, be named as a month in which our people shall be invited to make contributions to the support of the work of this Board.

5. That each congregation in our Church be urged to make an offering to the Board of Tithing in the month of March or July.

2. That each sentence should contain all the words necessary to clearly convey the true meaning of said sentence.

We further recommend that wherever practical a Synod should have its minutes printed and submit same to the General Assembly in printed form, as well as to distribute same among the churches of the several Presbyteries within said Synod.

REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON THEOLOGICAL SEMINARY.

To the Eighty-Eighth General Assembly of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church: Brethren: Your Committee on Theological Seminary reports as follows:

Your committee had referred to it the report of the Board of Trustees of the Theological Seminary and a memorial from Cumberland Presbytery, Synod of Kentucky.

Looking to what we believe to be the best for the Church, we bring you the following recommendations:

1. That the Loan Committee—namely: Rev. J. L. Hudgins, with Elders W. T. Marshall and D. M. McAnulty—be continued on the Board of Trustees of the Theological Seminary.

2. That the matter of continuing the work of the Theological School be left to the discretion of the Board of Trustees, and that you confirm the election of Rev. P. F. Johnson and Rev. S. H. Braly as teachers in the Seminary.

3. That the time for which Revs. T. C. Newman, H. S. McCord, and F. A. Grundy having expired, you re-elect Revs. T. C. Newman and H. S. McCord to succeed themselves and Rev. J. H. Thomas be elected to succeed Rev. F. A. Grundy.

4. That the Board of Trustees of the Theological Seminary make such satisfactory arrangements regarding the J. L. Goodnight library as they may be able to do.

5. That you endorse the memorial from Cumberland Presbytery asking that the Assembly take no steps at this meeting looking toward a permanent location for the Theological School.

6. That the committee for the selection of a place for the location of the Theological School be discontinued and that the Board of Trustees of the Theological Seminary take this matter under their advisement and report their findings at the next sitting of the Assembly, or as soon thereafter as they may think best.

7. That the charter of the Theological School be amended so as to include high school and college work.

8. That the endowment work be pushed to the limit, and every opportunity be used to raise a productive endowment of \$500,000.

REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON RESOLUTIONS.

With three additions, we recommend the adoption of the following resolution which was referred to us:

Be it resolved by the Eighty-Eighth General Assembly of the Cumberland Pres-

byterian Church, in session at Dallas, Tex., May 16-22, 1918, That we heartily endorse the action of President Woodrow Wilson in the stand he has taken in our nation's relations to this world war. That we pledge to him our support in his efforts to raise and equip a great army and an efficient navy. That we endorse and encourage the buying of Liberty Bonds, Thrift Stamps, and War Savings Stamps, and that we heartily endorse the conservation of food and clothing as recommended by our national leaders. That we pledge our support to the American Red Cross Society, the Y. M. C. A., and the Y. W. C. A. in their war activities. That we will do all we can to help our government win this war for a world peace. That we will pray that out of it all may come those things that glorify God and uplift the human race.

We recommend that the Stated Clerk be instructed to send a copy of the foregoing resolution to the President of the United States.

With one addition, we recommend the adoption of the following which was referred to us:

Resolved, that this General Assembly require all Stated Clerks of Presbyteries, Synods, and session clerks to faithfully perform all duties entrusted to them. All such clerks who will not discharge their respective duties shall be ordered to resign by the court having jurisdiction over them.

We recommend the adoption of the following resolution in place of the one which was referred to us:

Resolved, that the General Assembly direct each Presbytery to submit its approval or disapproval to the next General Assembly concerning the building of a permanent Assembly meeting place which shall be centrally located.

We recommend that our Church papers give this resolution wide publicity.

We recommend the adoption of the following resolution:

Whereas, it has been the practice of the Commissioners to the General Assembly to return home in some instances three or four days before its close; therefore, be it

Resolved: That the General Assembly recommend to the Presbyteries that they make an order to the effect that the expenses of their Commissioners to the General Assembly be not paid in the event they leave the Assembly before its close, unless their leaving is for reasons acceptable to their Presbyteries. That the stated clerks of all Presbyteries are hereby directed to call this order to the attention of their Commissioners at the time of their election.

Whereas, the following have contributed toward making our stay in the beautiful city of Dallas so pleasant and profitable; therefore be it resolved: That we extend to these our heart-felt thanks:

1. To the pastor and members of the congregation of the First Presbyterian Church, U. S., in whose beautiful building we have held our sessions.

2. To the Rev. H. R. Allen, the pastor-host of the Assembly, and the members of the congregation of the First Cumberland Presbyterian Church in Dallas, who have been untiring in their efforts to make our stay pleasant and profitable.

3. To J. Newell Johnston and Z. E. Black, reporters of the Dallas Morning News; J. R. Hayes, reporter of the Times-Herald; and H. H. McGill and Phil E. McCleary, reporters of the Evening Journal, who have been so careful to correctly report the Assembly news, and to their respective papers that have given space to such news.

4. To the Hilderbrand-Burnett quartette that has given such beautiful music for the Assembly.

5. To the Moderator, Stated Clerk, Engrossing Clerk, and stenographer, each of whom have been so patient in serving the members of the Assembly.

6. To the railroads that have given reduced rates on account of the Assembly.

7. To all others who in any way have contributed to our comfort and pleasure. May peace, prosperity, and happiness be the lot of all named herein!

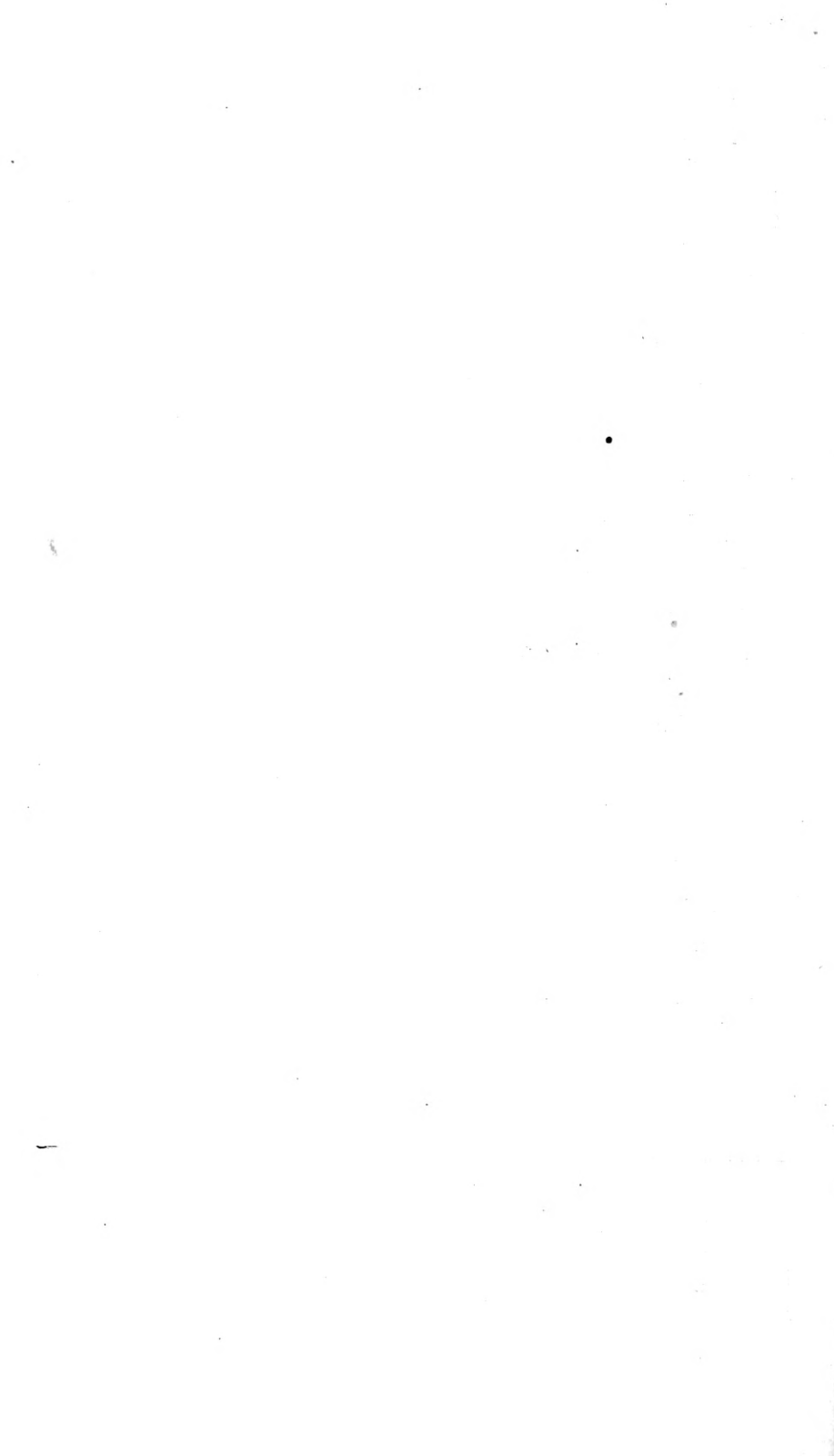
