The Mayor Aldermen and Commonality of the City of New York have been served with A Copy of the above Mentioned Petition Pursuant to the Order of Your Excellency in Council for which favour we desire leave to tender your Excellency the most Humble thanks of this City and Corporation

As we are Very unwilling to trespass on that time which Your Excellency Employs so much to the General good we hope we Shall be the more Excuseable if we Answer to or Observe upon no more of that Petition than what is Contain'd in those parts of it which the Petitioners Acknowledge to have been the Chief Motives to the presenting of it, which Motives we Apprehend to be the fears they Express Concerning the south East Bastion of his Majesties Fort being rendred Useless; the loss of the Prospect they Enjoy by the Vacancy in the Petition mention'd, and their Interest (as they Term it) in that Ground where the Old Market House Once Stood and that Space where the Old Dock is filled up.

We desire leave May it please Your Excellency to Assure you that when we proposd to Lease these Lots we did not forsee that any Buildings which might hereafter be Erected thereon would have Obstructed the Guns or weakened that Bastion, which Ranges over [62] those Lotts because Buildings upon Leases are seldom of such or Costly Structure but that they may be Soon removed upon any great Emergency, and the Builders upon these Lotts would, we believe have Consider'd from their Situation that their Sheds or Warehouses together with the Houses of some of the Petitioners (which are design'd for Generations yet to Come) must in Case of Nessessity or whenever the Publick good requir'd be laid in Rubbish in Order to Clear the Royal Fort of all Obstructions; but we Neither Repine at the Advantage the Petitioners Enjoy nor desire any for our selves but what Your Excellency Shall declare fit for us to ask.






