for the year 1859

Morristown, New Jersey October 18, 1859
The Synod of New Jersey met according to adjournment in the First Presbyterian Church and was opened with a Sermon from Matthew 9:35 by the Rev. James T. English, the Moderator.

After public worship the Synod was constituted by prayer.





Synod then had a recess until 7:15 p.m.

At the close of the recess the Synod met when the Annual Sermon on Foreign Missions was preached by the Rev. M. J. Hickok from Luke 24:46-47. Mr. Lourie made an address, etc.

Committee of Bills and overtures (file). Meet 8:30 tomorrow morning and afterwards, etc., their own adjournment.

Resolution about Choctaws. Unanamous.

Rev. B. J. Lowe, Synod of Ohio, Rev. H. F. Hickok, Albany, Rev. H. I. Coe, Illinois, Rev. C. F. Massy, Missionary from Southern India, and Rev. McElivy, Particular Synod of Reformed Dutch Church of New York.

Resolved, that if the way be opened for the reception of the Choctaw Mission by our Board of Foreign Missions, that this Synod pledge themselves as far as in them lies, that it shall not be wanting in me as to sustain it.

Synod then adjourned to meet tomorrow morning at 9 o'clock. Concluded with prayer.

Burlington unanamously chosen next place of meeting.

The Moderator of this Synod the Rev. John Chester and the Rev. Dr. Van Rensselaer were appointed a committee to make arrangements for the religious exercises of the Synod.

Mr. Chandler, that it in their opinion would be better not to appear as a religious body before the Legislation and motion was made to discharge the committee. Pending the discussion on this subject the order of the day was taken up- when the Nev. H. I. Coe, Church Extension Committee addressed the Synod. Dr. Van Mensselaer, Corresponding Secretary Board of Education. Dr. Happensett, Corresponding Secretary Board of Domestic Missions. Rev. George Shelden in behalf of the American Bible Society.

Thos. H. Morris, Elder from Woodbridge of Presbytery of Elizabethtown and A. B. Karner, Elder from Hightstown of Presbytery of New Branswick appeared in Synod.

Committee appointed to examine the Minutes of the General Assembly reported calling the attention to the Minutes on pages 524 and 532 and 4- as follows - and it was adopted (file).

Committee on Bills and overtures made No. 1 inadequate support of the Ministry, No. 2 Reconstruction of the Presbyteries of this Synod, No. 3 Disabled Ministers.

Synod then proceeded on motion made, to a consideration of overture No. 2 and after a lengthened discussion the overture was laid on the table.

Overtures No. 1 and 3 were by order of the bynod placed upon the docket.

Synod then had a recess until 7:15 o'clock.

At the close of the recess the Synod met and attended on the Exercises of the Synodical Frayer Meeting agreeably to the report of the committee.

Woodbury of Presbytery of West Jersey appeared in Cynod. Rev. Mr. Yeomans, Rev. John "all and Rev. Mr. Hornblower appeared, etc.

Rev. David Wilson of the Irish Delegation was introduced to the Synod and invited to sit as a corresponding member.

Books approved, Raritan, Burlington, Passaic, Susquehanna, West Jersey, New Brunswick, Luzerne, and Newton.

Ordered that the Statistical Report be forwarded to the Stated Clerk of the General Assembly.

Synod then adjourned to meet tomorrow morning at 9 c clock. Concluded with prayer.

## Thursday Morning 9 o'clock

Symod met pursuant to adjournment and was opened with prayer.

Committee on leave of absence reported (on file).

Rev. Dr. Macle n made an interesting statement in regard to the present condition of the College of New Jersey (see page 135). Also respecting Theological Seminary, Rev. Tr. Wilson offered a resolution respecting a division of the Presbytery of New Brunswick (see file).



Amendment of Dr. Maclean - Strike out 1 and 2 Cra, and adding, and such other churches contiguous to them as may be willing to be connected with them - which was carried - and the resolution for the erection of a new Presbytery was passed. Resolution offered by Dr. Van Rensselaer to detach Lr. Stewart and the Church of Camden from the Presbytery of West Jersey and a tach them to the Presbytery of Burlington, Carried.

Rev. David yons, Synod of Albany, Rev. E. D. G. Prime, D. D. Synod of New York being present were invited to sit as corresponding members.

The committee appointed about the Marriage law made report. Accepted. Committee continued and instructed and requested to obtain a supplement to the law in accordance with the provision contained in the report. Accepted.

Committee on leave of absence reported (file).

Synod had a recess until 2:30.

At the close of the recess Synod met and proceeded to business.

Dr. Studdiford's resolution- which after discussion was postponed until the next meeting of Synod.

Committee appointed to examine the records of the Presbytery of Elizabethtown reported and the book was approved with the exception of the action of the Presbytery recorded on page 294 with respect to which the Synod express no opinion.

Overture No. 1 was taken up and adopted - Stated Clerk to send copy to each Presbytery and publish in Fresbyterian.

Resolution respecting Presbytery of Monmouth.

Vote of thanks - citizens and Rail Roads.

Janitor's bill paid \$5.00 and a bill of Stationery \$1.00.

Adjourned to meet, etc. in Burlington on the 3rd Tuesday of October 1860 at 3 p.m.

Concluded with prayer, singing and Benediction.

No. 1 The following paper was efferred for the consideration of the Synod, and they unanimously adopted.

Tery Interesting addresses having been made by the Cecretaries and agents of the Board of Foreign Missions-Domestic Missions-Education-the Committee of Church Extension, and the Church Bible Society,

Resolved. That these several Boards and Societies be renewedly recommended to the increased liberality of the churches under the care of this Synod.

Resolved. That this Synod commend to the attention of the members of the churches under our care, the Presbyterian Wistorical Almanac, published by Fr. Wilson of Philadelphia, illustrating, as it does the annual operations of the whole Presbyterian family.

No. 2 The committee of Bills and Overtures reported Overture No. 1 from the Presbytery of Lizabethtown on the inadequate support of the ministry—The committee recommend the adoption of the following resolution, viz: Resolved. That in view of the inadequate support of many of the ministers within our bounds, this Synod enjoin it upon the Presbyteries to take order directing their sessions to enquire whether the ministers of their churches receive a sufficient temporal maintainence, and to report to this Synod at its next stated meeting what they have done, together with the result of their enquiries.

Overture No. 2 being an overture on the matter of the reconstruction of the Presbyteries of this Synod.

The committee recommend the adoption of the following paper, viz: Whereas under the present arrangement of our Presbyteries, many churches, whose local interests are the same are separated and many which have no common Presbyterial interests are thrown into the same body; and whereas several of our Presbyteries are too large and others too

small for efficient action therefore, Resolved. That a committee consisting of one minister and one ruling alder from each Presbytery be appointed to consider the subject of a reconstruction of our Presbyteries, and if such reconstruction appear feasible, to report a plan for the same at this meeting of the Synod.

Overture No. 3 being an everture in regard to the fund for diabled ministers, and the widows and orphans of deceased ministers. On this subject, the committee recommend the adoption of the following resolution.

Resolved. That it be recommended to the ressions of the churches under the care of this Tynod, to bring before their congregations, the matter of disable ministers and the needy widows and orphens of deceased ministers, and to take up a collection for this object on some Sabbath previous to the 1st of January, 1860, and transmit the same to the office of the Treasurer of the General Assembly in the city of Thiladelphia.

No. 3 A paper was presented to the Symod by the Rev. Tr. Wilson in which a proposition was made for a division of the Presbytery of Lev Brunswick and after considerable discussion It was.

Resolved. That a new Presbytery, to be known as the Presbytery of Monauth, be and the same is hereby eracted, and that the following ministers compose said Presbytery: Tev. Charles F. Worrel, Rev. Messrs. John M. Rogers, Phaddeus Wilson, Charles Webster, Frank Chandler, Donald McLaten, John L. Kehoo, Daniel J. "ahler, William ". "ells, with the following churches, Millstone, "iddletown, Point, Shrewsbury, Willage Church Breehold, Tennent church, Manalapan, Red Bank, Jamesburgh,

Tom's River, Cedar Creek, Manchester, Squan Village, and such other churches contiguous to them as may be willing to be connected with them—that said Presbytery hold its first meeting at the Tennent church on Wednesday the 11th day of January, 1860, at 11 o'clock A. ".—to be epened with a sermon by the Rev. Charles F. Worrel, (or in his absence, by the oldest minister present) who shall preside until a Moderator be chosen.

The Rev. Dr. Van Rensselar offered the following resolution, which after some discussion was adopted,

Resolved. That the church of familier, and the Rev. Daniel Stewart P. D. be and hereby are detached from the Presbytery of West Jersey, and connected with the Presbytery of Bulington, and that the territory of the Presbyter, of Burlington be extended so as to include the city of Camden and the township of Rewton, Union, Centre and Delaware.

# PRESBYTERIAL STANISTICAL TEPONTS

1. The Presbytery of Elizabethtown, report to the Symod of New Jersey that they consist of 24 "inisters, and have under their care 16 Churches, 1 Licentiate, and 4 Candidates.

The Presbytery further report that on the 21st of December 1858, they received the Rev. V. LeRoy Lockwood from the Presbytery of Ottowa and on the same day installed him pastor of the 2nd Church of Rahway -- that on the same day they received Mr. James R. Campbell under their care as a candidate for the gospel ministry, and ordered that the name of the Nev. John Wirz be erased from the roll of the Presbytery -- and that the name of the German Church of Elizabeth be dropped from the list of Churches -- that on the 17th of April, they received the Rev. George M. L. Blauvelt from the Presbyterian and Conpregational District Convention of Milwaukee, and dismissed Mr. Samuel McIlhenny a licentiate under their care to put himself under the care of the Presbytery of West Jersey-that on the same day, they received under their care, Ar. James Gibson, a candidate for the ministry from the Presbytery of Belfast, Ireland -- and licensed Mr. James Gibson and Mr. Morris C. Sutphin to preach the gospel -- that on the 1st of May, they dismissed Fr. Gibson to out himself under the care of the Presbytery of Belfast, Ireland -- that on the 27th of September, they dismissed the Rev. George S. Nott to connect himself with the Presbytery of Newton. and on the 1st of October dismissed the Rev. George M. L. Blauvelt to join the Presbytery of Pascaic.

The Presbytery further report that all the churches under their care have taken collections for the various objects recommended by the General Assembly, except that the churches of Pluckamin, Perth Amboy, "lizabeth Fort, Plainfield, and 2d Rahway have omitted the Board of Publication and the fund for disabled Ministers.

2. The Presbytery of Passaic, report to the Symod of New Jersey, that they consist of 19 "inisters, and have under their care 14 Churches, 3 Licentiates, and 3 Candidates.

The Presbytery further report that on the 20th of April, 1859, the pastoral relation between the Rev. Charles D. Rosenthal and the German Church of Paterson was dissolved -that on the same day, Fr. Rosenthal was dismissed to join the Presbytery of Luzerne -- that on the same day the Tev. Josiah Markle was dismissed to Join the classis of Kingston, of the Reformed Dutch Church -- that on the same day "r. Francis W. Butler was licensed to greachthe gospel -- that on the 51st of May Mr. Edward ". Weiss a licentiate was received under their care from the classis of Bergan and that on the same day he was ordained to the work of the gospel ministry, and installed him pastor of the German Church of Paterson--that on the 5th of eptember, 'r. J. Harvey Clark a licentiate was dismissed to place himself under the care of the Presbytery of Iowa -- that on the 4th of October. the Rev. George M. L. Blauvelt was received from the Presbytery of Elizabethtown -- and that on the 5th of the same month, Mr. John L. Beekman was taken under the care of the Presbytery as a candidate for the ministry.

- 3. The Presbytery of New Brunswick, report to the Synod of New Jersey, that they consist of 53 Ministers, and have under their care 32 Churches, & Licentiates, and 19 Candidates.

The Presbytery further report that on the 19th of October, 1858, they revoked the licenses of Fr. John T. Baldissare, to preach the gospel—that on the 20th of the same month, they dismissed Mr. David Cole, a licentiate to put himself under the care of the classis of New Brunswick of the Reformed Dutch Church—that on the 4th of Movember they ordained Mr. William W. Wells, a licentiate under their care to the work



of the gospel ministry, and installed him pastor of the Church of Jamesburg, -- and on the same day dismissed the Rev. Joseph W. Carrol to join the Presbytery of Charleston. S. C .-- and that on the same day they dissolved the pastoral relation between the Rev. Henry R. Avery and the Squan Village Church-that on the 6th of Movember, they organized a Church in the city of Grenton, to be known as the 4th Presbyterian Church in that city, and on the same day received the Lev. Edward D. Yeomans from the Presbytery of Northumberland -- that on the 16th of December, they dismissed Mr. Nathaniel McConaughy, a licentiate under their care to put himself under the care of the Presbytery of "est Jersey-that on the 1st of February 1859, they allowed the Rev. William A. Dod to withdraw from the ministry of the Presbyterian Church and on the same day dissolved the pastoral relation between him and the 2d Church of Princeton -that on the same day they received the Nev. Menry B. Chapin from the Presbytery of Steubenville, and the Rev. George M. Burroughs from the Presbytery of Biltimore -- that on the same day, they received under their care as candidates for the ministry Wessrs. Stirling Galt. Samuel B. 'ilson and L. B. Taggart -- that on the 8th of February they installed the Rev. Henry B. Chapin pastor of the 3d Church of Frenton -that on the 24th of February I'r. James II. Larrimore a candidate was dismissed to out himself under the care of the Presbytery of Albany -- that on the 25th of the same month. they installed the Rov. Edw rd D. Yeomana pastor of the 4th church in the city of Trenton--that on the 3d of Farch 1859, the venerable James Carnochen D. D. L. L. D. departed this life - That on the same day, they received Fr. Alfred Yeomans under their care as a candidate for the ministry and licensed Mesers. J. Addison Wenry, Robert C. Feegles. and Robert H. Hassau to preach the gospel--that on the 5th of August they dismissed I'r. John Darrock a licentiate to put himself under the care of the Presbytery of Luzerne--

Isaac M. Patt rson to put himself under the care of the
Presbytery of Baltimore—that on the 4th of October, they

Tyeritt. a licentiate from the Presbytery of Massau--that on the 20th of April, they received under their care Ir. Mathanicl McConsurhy a licentiate from the Presbytery of New Brunswick and I'r. Bamuel A. McThinney a licentiate from the Presbytery of Flizabethtown -- that on the 4th of May they received the Rev.
