# MINUTES.

4th. Appointed Elder Wim. Brown to preach at the Stand at 3 o'clock p. m., followed by Elder Samuel Gibbs. Preaching at night by Elder R. C. A. Ashcraft; conclusion by Elder H. R. Moore.

5th. Appointed Eider H. R. Moore to preach next introductory sermon.

6th. Appointed Bro. G. F. Weaver to preach the missionary sermon.

8th. Appointed Elder M. S. Stevens to lecture on Sabbath Schools.

9th. Appointed places for general meetings. First District, to meet with the church at Fellowship, Friday before the first Sabbath in August next.

Second District to meet with the church at Big Springs, Friday be fore the fourth Sabbath in Aug. next.

6th. The next session of this Body will be held with the church at High Shoals, beginning Wednesday before the first Sabbath in October 1889.

Adjourned to 8 o'clock Monday morning.

Sabbath morning at 10 o'clock interesting lecturers were made by Elders G. E. Brewer and Wm. McCarter on Sabbath schools. At 11 o'clock a missionary sermon was preached by Elder G. E. Brewer at the Honse, text, Mathew 6:10: "Thy Kingdom Come." At the Stand by Elder R. C. A. Ashcraft, text not located; after which collections were taken to the amount of \$12.70. Preaching at the Honse at 3 p. m. by T. G Layton; conclusion by Elder H. R Moore. Preaching at night by Elder Wm. Brown; conclusion by Elder H. R. Moore.

## MONDAY'S SESSION.

After prayer by Elder II. R. Moore, the Body proceeds to business. 10th. The query sent up by Rocky Branch last year and tableed, was taken up viz: "Can we be consistent, and receive members by letter from any other denomination?" The Body answered no.

The call for correspondents was renewed, and received from the East Liberty, Elder C. J. Burden and Bro. F. M. Handley; From the Cary Elder Wm. Brown. Appointed on Finance, Brethren G. A. Gross and J. B. Adams.

11th. Called for reports of Standing Committees. The report on Deceased Ministers was adopted, after which the Body joined with Bro. Brewer in thanks to God for the preservation of the lives of all the ministers in this Association for the period of another year. The reports on Missions, Publications, Sabbath Schools Finance and Temperance were read and adopted. After these reports were made, the floor was occupied and the attention of the Body was arrested by strong and convincing speeches made in the interest of the same by Elders Win, Brown, T. G. Layton, Win, McCarter. C. J. Burden and G. E. Brewer.

12th. Appointed Correspondents to Sister Associations: To East Liberty, Brethren F. M. Spears, G. F. Weaver, E. D. Andrews and Elder Wm. McCarter; To the Central Western, Elder H. R. Moore; To the Arbacoocnee, Brethren F. M. Spears, F. Weaver and Elder H. R. Moore.

13th. Called for Miscellaneous business. A motion was carried to send ten dollars to foreign missions and the rest to home missions, and the undirected money to foreign missions. Elder H. R. Moore was elected to attend the convention at Memphis. A motion was carried for the Executive Committee to confer with Bro. Crumpton, to let any of the pastors of the Rock Mills Association whom they may recommend, have literature. The time for this Body to convene was changed to Wednesday before the 1st Sabbath in October. Brethren C. Andrews and M. F. Ussery were continued as Executive Committee of this Body.

14th. A motion was carried to furnish the Clerk seventeen dollars to pay for printing the minutes and to remunerate him for his services.

15th. Called the roll and marked absentees. Those who were absent at roll call will be designated by an X.

16th. Read and adopted Minutes.

17th. Took the parting hand and adjourned to time and place.
