Report on Education—We, your committee on education, submit the following report: We realize that our people need general education. Could our people realize the great importance of a true and sound education, and contribute more liberally to the support of our common schools and denominational institutions of learning, then our noble cause would be lifted to a higher plane of Christian intelligence, and those who are laboring in the cause of education would be encouraged.

Dear brethren, while the interest of education is not what it should be, we are glad to note the fact that a large per cent. of the teachers in our common schools in the bounds of our association are persons of good morals and religions principles. We trust the day is near when all the teachers in our common schools will be sober, Godly and temperate men and women. We call especial attention, and recommend to our people Howard College, Judson Institute, Walnut Grove College and our other denominational institutions. To our pastors and st. lents preparing for the ministry, who cannot avail themselves of the advantages of the above named colleges, we especially recommend the pastors' institute at East Lake, Alabama. the world.

Report on Missions,-Jesus, the Captain of our salvation, gave commandment to this end, that the Gospel should be preached in all the world. Therefore, we believe that it is the duty and privilege of every church and individual to beur some humble part in this great work. "For we are workers together with God," in the redemption of a lost and ruined world, or so many as He shall call from all nations, kindreds and tongues. Eighteen hundred years and more have passed since the command was given and only a small part of this wicked world has been brought under Gospel influence. The rest is in heathen darkness. When we look around us and see that we are blessed with such great privileges, and flooded with the light of the Gospel, we must remember that we are only a small part of this great world; and yet we need more work done in our own God, seeing our indisposition to go to the heathen, has brought them to our doors. Now we must do them good or they will do us harm. For they are here "without God and without hope in the world." We are glad to note the fact that the State Mission Board is doing much in this direction, and while much has been done much more remains to be done. The rapid development of our country demands energy and enthusiasm. The Board has pushed the work forward as last as the means would warrant. This year fifty-one missionaries have been employed in the state, the greater part of whom have labored in North Alabama. Now what the state board is trying to do for Alabama the home board is trying to do for the Southern States, Indian Territory and the Islands of Cuba. Also the Foreign Board is attempting to do the same thing for the outside world where the gospel has 1 of been preached. Report on Temperance.—We, the committee on Temperance, make this report: Seeing the great danger our church members, especially our young members, are exposed to by the use of intoxicants, and seeing that strong drink is yearly increasing the number of criminals, multiplying suicides, and filling drunkard's graves, causing confusion, and destroying the peace of families and churches, increasing the number of widows and orphans, and is a mighty means of the wicked One for destroying the souls of men, we would recommend the adoption of the following resolution by this association: Resolved, that we ask our brethren to abstain from the use of intoxicating drink as a beverage and heed the warning of Habakuk the prophet: "Woe unto him that giveth his neighbor drink, that puttest thy bottle to him and makest him drunken."
