Bro. M. Bishop, President, in the Chair.

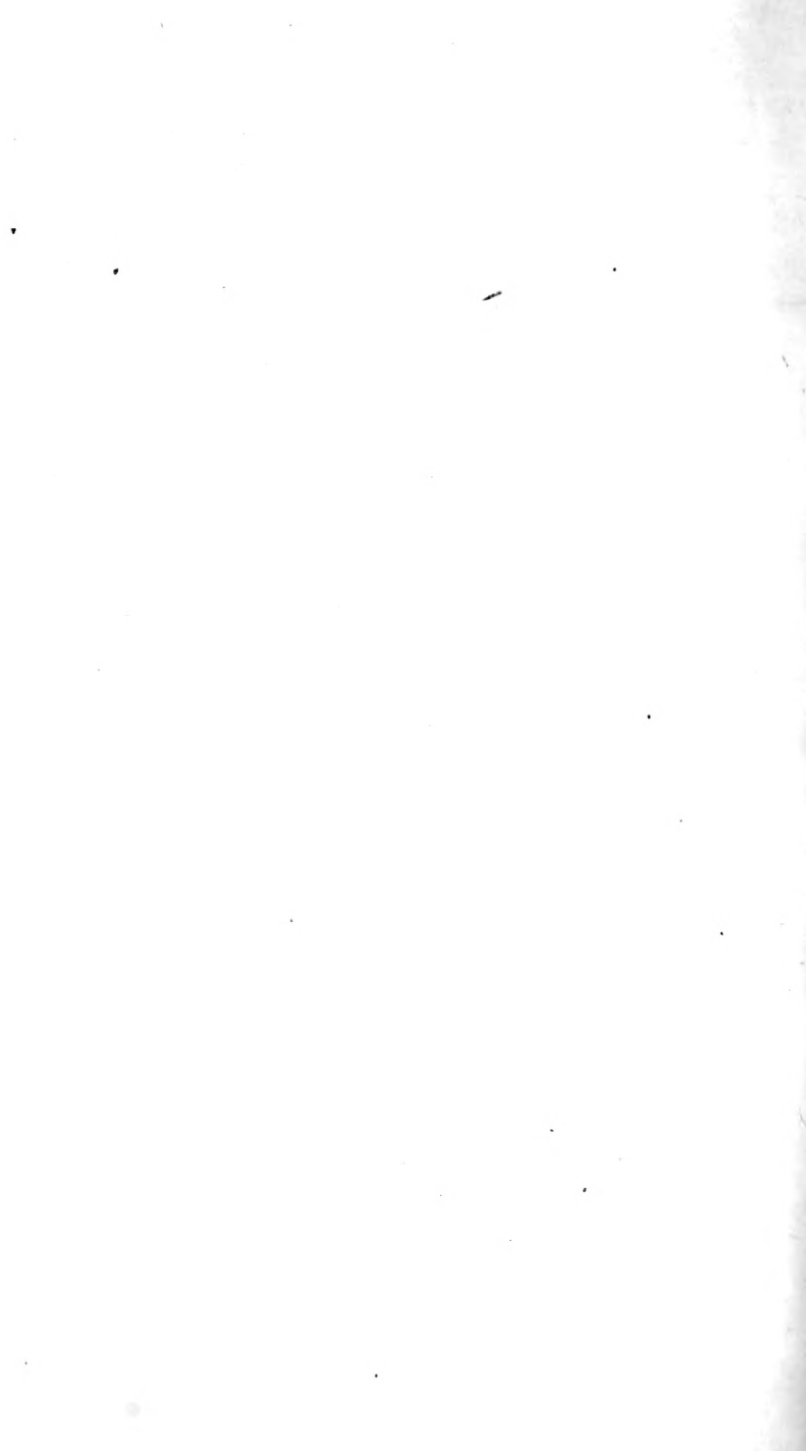

Resolved, 1st—That when this Society adjourns, it will adjourn to meet in the city of Montgomery at the Second Baptist Church, at 8 o'clock, P. M., on Thursday, before the first Sabbath in May, 1867.

Resolved, 2d—That the Secretary be requested to give notice through the *Christian Index* and *South Western Baptist* of the meeting in Montgomery, and that the object of said meeting is to form a Baptist Sunday School State Convention, and invite the Baptists of the State, who advocate Sunday Schools, to meet with us at the time specified.

Resolved, 3d—That we will attend the meeting, and use all of our influence to forward the interest of Sabbath Schools.

Resolved, 4th—That the President of the Sunday School Board, at Greenville, S. C., be invited to attend the meeting.

Appointed Committees in the several districts to look after the interests of Sunday Schools:

First District—Brethren P. H. Lundy, B. H. Crumpton.

Second District—Brethren D. Lee, R. M. Burt.

Third District—Brethren W. W. Waller, T. J. Miles.

**Minutes of the Sabbath School Society of the Alabama
Baptist Association.**

DAMASCUS CHURCH, BUTLER COUNTY, ALA. }
Thursday morning, Oct. 11, 1866, 11 o'clock. }

The Sabbath School Society of the Ala. Baptist Association, met according to adjournment with the Damascus Church, Butler county, Ala. Bro. P. H. Lundy preached an introductory sermon from Col. 3:16—"Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly." Prayer by Bro. A. C. Barron.

The President being absent, the Secretary called the Society to order, and, on motion, Bro. P. H. Lundy was appointed President *pro tem*. Singing, and prayer by Bro. D. Lee.

In the absence of the speakers appointed at the last meeting of the Society, on motion of Bro. D. Lee the Society voted to suspend the regular business and listen to addresses by Brethren J. B. Hawthorne and A. C. Barron. These Brethren came forward and addressed the meeting.

Adjourned to meet at the call of the President.

SATURDAY, P. M., Oct. 13—1 o'clock.

The Society was called to order by the President, *pro tem*. Singing, and prayer by Bro. D. Lee. The Secretary read the proceedings of Thursday. Called for annual

Brethren P. H. Lundy, D. Lee, R. M. Burt and M. Bishop, made verbal reports of Sabbath Schools in their respective districts. Bro. F. Armstrong reported that he had established a Sabbath School of sixteen members. Bro. T. Cook had established a school of fifteen members. Letters were read from the Sunday Schools of the First and Second Baptist Churches, Montgomery; Damascus Church, Hopewell Church, Bethel Church, Unity Church, and Mt. Lebanon Church, Dallas County. Bro. J. B. Hawthorne gave a verbal report of the school at Greenville, and Bro. T. J. Scott of the colored school, Montgomery.

This Committee, through Bro. F. Armstrong, reported the accounts of the Treasurer and Finance Committee correct.

The Association voted to meet with the Centre Ridge Church, at Carlowville, next year.

The Clerk reported that a balance of \$50 of the last year's Minute fund was still on hand. Voted to pay \$30 of this balance to Bro. J. B. Taylor, for the same amount paid by him in publishing Bro. I. T. Tichenor's speech before the Association at its last annual session, and the remaining \$20 to the Domestic Board at Marion.

Bro. J. B. Hawthorne moved the following resolution, which was adopted :

Resolved, That this Association recommend to all the Baptists within its bounds the "Christian Index and South Western Baptist", as a religious journal, eminently worthy of a place in all our families.

Bro. W. B. Hurlson moved that all charges of this Association against Mrs. Lyon, widow of the late Dr. Lyon, former Clerk of this body, be and are hereby cancelled. Adopted.

Bro. J. B. Hawthorne moved that the Clerk receive \$10 for his services, and the balance of the Minute fund be used in printing and distributing the Minutes. Adopted.

A vote of thanks to the brethren of the Damascus Church for their kindness and hospitality to the members of this Association, was unanimously passed.

cease of our beloved brother, Thomas Barlow, a deacon of the church, and for many years a member of this body; and we feel that we have sustained a great loss in his death. In the letter of Antioch Church, Butler county, is recorded the death of Bro. J. T. Jones, also a deacon of his church. He was taken from us in the prime of life, and in the midst of his usefulness. In the removal of Brethren Barlow and Jones, we realize that we have sustained a great loss, and that God has thus afflicted this people. But while we grieve for ourselves, we feel that our loss has been their gain, and it becomes us to bow in meekness and submission under the mighty hand of God, who does not willingly afflict or grieve the children of men. These good men still live, in their example of usefulness and devotion to the cause of our dear Redeemer, who has taken them to himself. We beg leave to offer to their bereaved families the assurance of our heartfelt sympathy. In two or more letters, the churches have requested our advice as to the manner in which they should deal with their colored members. On this subject, in the general aspects of it, we would refer the churches to the minutes of our last annual session, and to the address of the Rev. L. T. Tichenor, D. D., of Montgomery. We are persuaded that all is there said, which can be judiciously recommended to the churches, in the present condition of our country. In reference to those members who are absent, and who cannot be accounted for, we would advise the churches, to deal with them precisely as they would with white members, after making due allowance for the ignorance of our poor colored brethren, who are being ruined by the pretended philanthropy of northern fanaticism. It would, perhaps, in any event be well to keep a distinct record of the absent members, in order that they may be dealt with as God in His Providence may indicate. The action of our churches must be modified by the peculiar circumstances by which they are surrounded. The Steep Creek Church requests you to hold your next annual session with them. The church is not in that division of the Association to which, by usage, the next meeting belongs. It is, however, for the Association, to determine the point at which it will hold its next annual meeting.

Resolved, That when a church shall be satisfied that a colored man in their midst is worthy and ought to be authorized to preach, that they try to make an arrangement to place him in the care of some white minister who can instruct him in the doctrines and ordinances of the church, and when he has made sufficient proficiency, and shows his adaptation to the work, he may be ordained.

The Association met.

Bro. P. H. Lundy, from Committee on Missions, presented the following report, which was adopted :

The Committee on Missions would make the following report :

The Missionary work, through our several Boards, has been blessed of God, and through the instrumentality of the Missionary many have been led to the Cross, and are now heirs of eternal life: henceforth the work should be continued and prosecuted, even with more energy than formerly. The Board of Foreign Missions of the Southern Baptist Convention, located in Richmond, Virginia, were compelled to contract a debt during the late war, of about eight thousand dollars, to sustain our Missionaries in foreign lands. The great wonder is, not that so large a debt was made, but that those faithful men were kept in the field on so small an amount. This debt must be liquidated. The credit of the Board must be sustained. Every Baptist in the Southern States ought to feel obligated to aid in its payment. In our present impoverished condition, we must supply the larger amounts formerly contributed, by increasing the number of contributors.

The Domestic Mission Board located at Marion, Ala., always prompt, active and efficient, have in the field at present eighty Missionaries, and yet is this number too small for the great work to be accomplished. Our obligations to God, our obligations to our fellow-men, our love for the blessed Jesus, call upon us to aid to the extent of our ability this Board, in sending faithful ministers to preach Christ crucified to thousands of all ages in our Southern States, who are perishing for the want of the Bread of Life. Missionary work is much needed in the bounds of the Alabama Association, and we pray that the good work commenced to-day, may continue, and that such aid may be given as will bring, ere long, all our people within the influence of the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

for the support of missions in the Association, and other funds designated for missionary purposes, be sent to the Domestic Board at Marion, with a request that such a missionary be appointed, to labor the coming year in this Association, as the Domestic Board of the Association may nominate, and that in case the Associational Board do not appoint a Missionary, the Board at Marion may appoint one. Adopted.

A committee, consisting of Brethren P. H. Lundy, J. B. Hawthorne and P. H. Drake, was appointed to nominate a new Board of Missions in the Association.

The committee nominated the former members of the Board, brethren D. Lee, D. Gordon, W. B. Haralson, J. H. Robertson, and H. W. Caffey, in place of Bro. T. Barlow, deceased. They were unanimously elected by the Association.

Bro. J. B. Hawthorne moved that the Committee on Religious Exercises nominate preachers for the Introductory and Missionary Sermons for the next meeting of the Association. Adopted.

Bro. J. E. Bell, from the Committee on the State of Religion in the Churches, made the following report, which, after discussion, was adopted:

The committee to whom was referred the subject of the State of Religion in the Churches, report that most of the letters sent up by the churches bear the tidings of God's gracious dealings with them.

During the past associational year, 457 have put on Christ by baptism and united with their respective churches.

Such news as this is indeed cheering to our hearts, in times of darkness and gloom like those through which we have just passed,—we say have passed, for we trust and believe that the day of Zion's prosperity is dawning. To us there seem to be many potent providences, pointing to the time when the "kingdoms of this world shall become the kingdoms of our Lord and His Christ," and plainly indicate that that happy period is not far distant.

But while we unite with the saints in most of our churches, in rejoicing over the prosperity of our Zion in their midst, we have also to unite with some churches of our union, in deploring a state of coldness and inactivity, and we do not think that we have done our whole duty, while there is a single cold or destitute church in our bounds.

Then, in order more effectually to promote a spirit of devoted piety, growth in grace and a knowledge of the truth as it is in Jesus, we recommend the following course :

1st. That the ministering brethren of the Association be, and are hereby requested, as soon as practicable, to arrange among themselves, and "go two and two" to such cold and destitute churches as they may be able to visit, and labor with them.

2d. We earnestly recommend that a weekly prayer meeting be organized and kept up in every church in our bounds. If the church houses are too remote, meet at each other's houses, and pray for the Lord's reviving grace.

3d. That a ministers' meeting be appointed to meet at Bethel church on Saturday before the fifth Sabbath in March next, to take into consideration the best means of expending ministerial labor in destitute churches.

Hawthorne to preach the Missionary Sermon at the next meeting of the Association.

Bro. H. Talbird, from the Committee on Documents, made the following report, which was adopted :

Your Committee on Documents beg leave to report :

In the letter of the Second Church of Montgomery, mention is made of the death of our venerable brother, Rev. Robert Carson, in the eighty-ninth year of his age.

Thus he died full of years and full of honors. His name is now enrolled in that great cloud of witnesses by which we are surrounded. He rests from his labors and his works do follow him. We are profoundly grateful to our blessed Saviour that for a time He gave him to the churches, and we rejoice to believe that his redeemed spirit is now expanding in the realms of life and light. While we offer to his bereaved family and friends the assurance of our sympathy, we also congratulate them in the fact, that their earthly sire is now crowned a king and priest unto God.

And being governed by a standing order of your body, viz: *not to involve the Association in debt*, we have made no appointment. The labors of efficient Missionaries are greatly needed at this time to save several churches of your body from dissolution, and to preach the gospel to the destitute in your bounds.

As impoverished as our country is, if all *would give according as God has prospered them*, the money would soon be forthcoming; and the poor would have the gospel preached to them. Your Board are of the opinion that the "Card System", revived, would do much to replenish your exhausted Treasury. But for the next associational year, something should be done quickly.

It is with sorrow of heart that we have to report to you the death of our highly esteemed co-laborer, Bro. Thomas Barlow. As a member of the Board, Bro. Barlow was wise in counsel, and diligent in business.

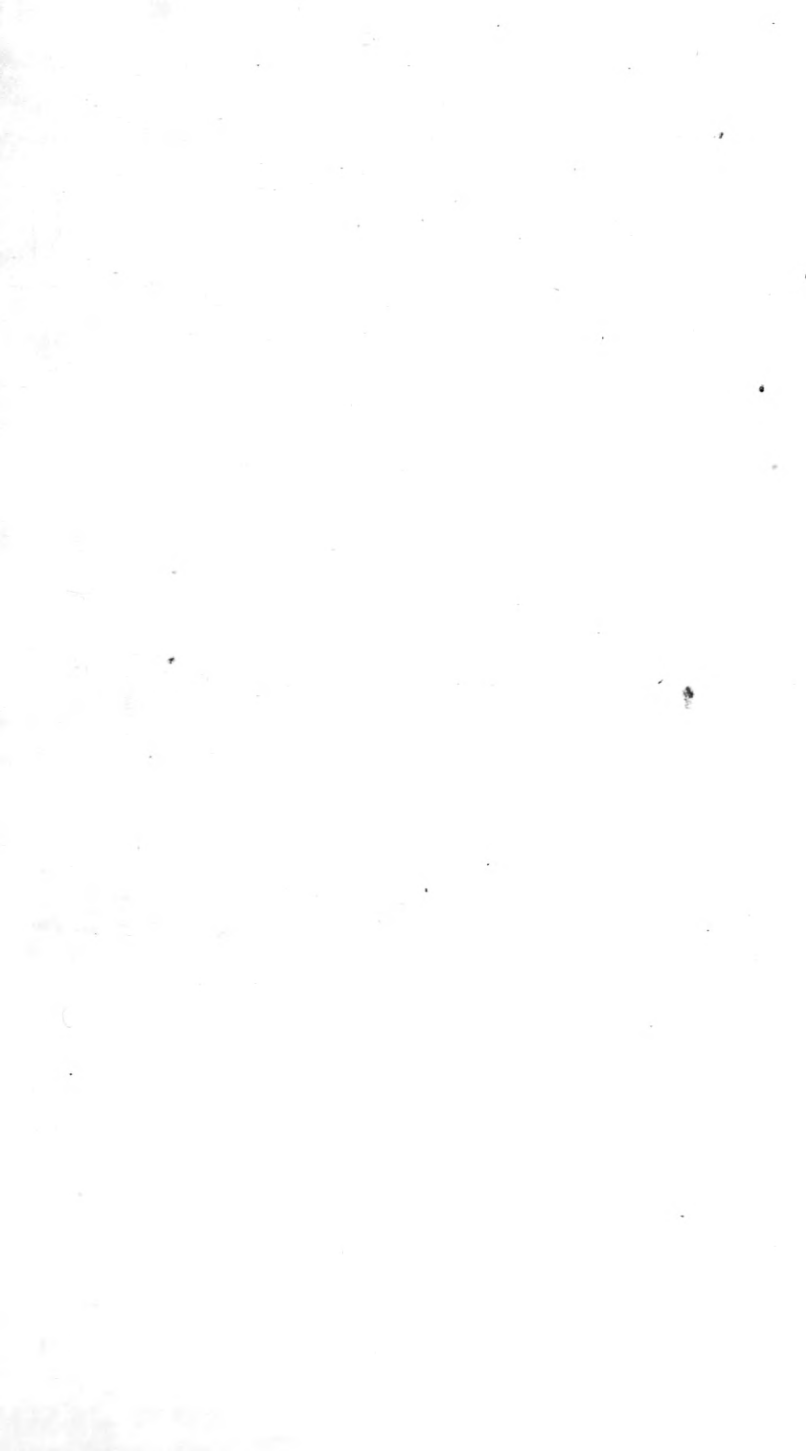
