Question 3 was called, viz.: "Who are discontinued?" Answer: None.

Question 17 was called, viz.: "Who are supernumerary?"

F. A. Bishop, from the Committee on Conference Relations, submitted a report recommending that R. W. Townsend, M. H. Tuttle, W. F. Jones and J. O. Guthrie be granted a supernumerary relation, which was adopted; and that E. Pope be not granted the supernumerary relation, and on motion of E. A. Yates, the name of E. Pope was re-referred to the Committee on Conference Relations for further consideration.

At 1:10 o'clock p. m. the Conference adjourned, with the benediction by Bishop Wilson.

FOURTH DAY.

SATURDAY, December 2, 1905.

The Conference opened at 9:30 o'elock a. m., Bishop Wilson in the chair.

The opening religious services were conducted by Rev. R. A. Willis.

The Journal of yesterday's session was read and approved. Question 17 was called, viz.: "Who are supernumerary?" F. A. Bishop, from the Committee on Conference Relations, submitted a report recommending that E. Pope and W. H. Townsend be granted a supernumerary relation.

On motion of F. A. Bishop, the order of the Conference which referred the name of W. F. Jones to the Committee on on Conference Relations for a supernumerary relation, was reconsidered, and the name of W. F. Jones was referred to that committee for a superannuated relation.

On motion of E. H. Davis, the name of W. H. Townsend was referred to the Committee on Conference Relations for a supernumerary relation.

On motion of J. D. Bundy, the name of T. P. Bonner was referred to the Committee on Conference Relations for a superannuated relation.

Question 2 was called, viz.: "Who remain on trial?"

James Edward Saunders having passed the examination of character, and having been approved by the Examining Committee, was continued on trial, and advanced to the class of the second year.

W. B. Cooper submitted and read the report of the Sunday School Board, which was adopted. (Document No. 4 of Appendix.) Question 6 was called, viz.: "Who are received by transfer from other conferences?"

The Bishop announced that E. S. Hursey, elder, from the Montana Conference; J. J. Renn, elder, from the Western North Carolina Conference, Preston L. Kirton, elder, from the South Carolina Conference, had been transferred to this Conference.

Question 4 was called, viz.: "Who are admitted into full connection ?"

Robert Eugene Hunt, Charles Martin Lance, Samuel Freeman Nicks, John W. Hoyle, William Richard Royall, Valerius Addison Royall, Duncan Ajah Futrell, Louis Edward Sawyer, Charles Alexander Jones, who had passed the examination of character and having been approved by the Examining Committee, were examined by Bishop Wilson in open Conference and admitted into full connection.

On motion of J. T. Gibbs, Bishop Wilson was requested to draw his draft on the Treasurer, W. H. Moore, of the Board of Trustees of the Conference for \$250.90, in favor of the Joint Board of Finance.

Bishop Wilson called up the question of the election of delegates to the General Conference, and announced that the Conference was entitled to four clerical and four lay delegates.

R. H. Willis and M. T. Plyler were appointed tellers for the clerical vote; and J. H. Bridgers and W. K. Jacobson, for the vote of the laymen.

On motion of W. L. Cuninggim, it was ordered that when the ballots were cast that the tellers, with a secretary of the Conference, retire and count the vote and bring the result to the Conference. The first ballot was taken, and the tellers and secretaries retired to count the vote.

Question 45 was called, viz.: "Where shall the next session of the Conference be held?"

T. A. Green presented an invitation from Centenary Church, New Bern, for the Conference to hold its next session with that church. W. S. Rone presented an invitation from the Methodist Episcopal Church, South, in Rocky Mount, for the Conference to hold its next session with that church.

Rocky Mount was selected as the seat of the next session of the Conference.

The first ballot of the lay members of the Conference was announced, as follows: 24 votes were cast; 13 votes are necessary to an election. J. G. Brown, T. J. Jarvis and H. A. Page having received 19 votes each and J. F. Bruton 18 votes, were declared elected lay delegates to the General Conference.

Question 18 was called, viz.: "Who are superannuated?"

F. A. Bishop, from the Committee on Conference Relations, submitted and read a report recommending that M. C. Thomas, W. S. Davis, T. J. Gattis, J. E. Bristowe, J. E. Thompson, T. P. Bonner, W. F. Jones, be granted a superannuated relation, which was adopted.

The second ballot of the lay members of the Conference was announced, as follows: 19 votes cast; 10 votes are necessary to an election, and W. B. Cooper having received 16 votes and J. H. Bridgers 13 votes, were declared elected alternate lay delegates to the General Conference.

J. N. Cole, for the Board of Trustees of the Conference, presented the following resolution, which was unanimously adopted:

Our Conference has received notice of the bequest by the late Washington Duke of the sum of five thousand dollars to the Superannuate Fund of the North Carolina Conference. We desire to express our profound gratitude to our God for His gift of Washington Duke to our church and to the cause of Christ in the earth, and for the deep affection for our church that He put into the great heart of His servant. We request that the executors of his estate will pay this bequest to the Rev. W. H. Moore, Treasurer of the Board of Trustees of this Conference. We request the Secretary of this Conference to forward to the family of our departed and ascended brother a copy of this paper.

J. T. GIBBS, President, J. N. COLE, Secretary, Board of Trustees. Y. E. Wright submitted and read the report of the Committee of the Bible Cause, which, after discussion, was adopted. (Document No. 5 of Appendix.)

J. H. M. Giles submitted and read the report of the Committee on Temperance, which was adopted. (Document No. 6 of Appendix.)

A. J. Parker submitted and read Report No. 2 of the Committee on Books and Periodicals, which was adopted. (Document No. 7 of Appendix.)

J. C. Humble submitted and read the report of the Committee on District Conference Records, which was adopted, (Document No. 8 of Appendix.)

On motion of F. A. Bishop, it was ordered that when the Conference adjourns at the close of this session, it do so to meet to-morrow afternoon at 3:30 o'clock for the Memorial Services.

The first ballot of the clerical members of the Conference was announced, as follows: 143 votes were cast; 72 votes are necessary to an election; J. C. Kilgo having received 118 votes, and T. N. Ivey 91 votes, were declared elected clerical delegates to the General Conference.

L. S. Massey submitted and read the report of the Board of Education.

On motion of R. F. Bumpas, it was ordered that the time of this session of the Conference be extended for the consideration of this report.

On motion of F. A. Bishop, it was ordered that the Board of Trustees of Trinity College be requested in their annual meeting in June, 1906, to formulate a full statement of the plan for nominating and electing trustees by the alumni association and refer the same to the North Carolina and Western North Carolina Conferences as to the legality and right of such authority vested in a body having no ownership of the property.

The second ballot of the clerical members was announced, as follows: 141 votes were cast; 71 votes are necessary to

an election; J. D. Pegram having received 71 votes was declared elected a clerical delegate to the General Conference.

The report of the Board of Education was adopted. (Document No. 9 of Appendix.)

At 1:55 the Conference adjourned, with the benediction by Rev. J. C. Kilgo, D. D.

Bishop Wilson announced that at the close of the evening services of yesterday in this church he ordained James Marvin Culbreth, Eugene Malcolm Snipes, William Palmer Constable, William Towe, and Norman Clyde Yearby to the office of Elder.

Question 15 was called, viz.: "What local preachers are ordained Elders?"

Bishop Wilson announced that at the close of the evening services of yesterday in this church he ordained Joseph Valentine Williams and James Fenton Hallford to the office of Elder.

On motion of E. H. Davis, the name of F. E. Dixon was referred to Committee on Conference Relations for a supernumerary relation.

On motion of G. F. Smith, the name of G. D. Langston was referred to the Committee on Conference Relations for a superannuated relation.

The third ballot for clerical delegates to the General Conference was taken.

On motion of F. A. Bishop, it was ordered that after the fourth clerical delegate is elected the two clerical members of the Conference receiving the next highest vote be declared elected alternate clerical delegates to the General Conference.

APPENDIX.

[Document No. 1.]

MEMOIR OF REV. JAMES C. CRISP.

Rev. James Collins Crisp was born amid the great mountains of our Western North Carolina, in the vicinity of Blowing Rock, Caldwell County, on July 11, 1829, and died in peace with God, and triumph of faith, ----- day of February, 1905. His early life was not spent in the lap of luxury, but from the beginning did earnest battle with untoward circumstances, wresting victory after victory, appropriating mental and moral material gained therefrom to the upbuilding of a character that stood well against the storms incident to life in this world. He builded on Christ, Zion's foundation stone, tried, precious and sure. His mind, strong, active and eager in the pursuit of knowledge, found training in the common schools of the country and at Findlay High School, Lenoir, N. C. Many of the earlier years of his life were spent in teaching, having served in this capacity high schools in Western North Carolina and in Spartanburg District, S.C. He was licensed to preach at third Quarterly Conference of Lenoir Circuit (which was then a part of the South Carolina Corference), Sept. 5, 1863, and was admitted on trial into the South Carolina Conference at its session in Newberry, S. C., December, 1864. Ordained elder by Bishop Kavanaugh at Cheraw, S. C., Dec. 19, 1869, and served various charges in that Conference until December, 1874, at which time he was transferred to the North Carolina Conference, since which he has faithfully served as an itinerant preacher wherever sent, whether amid mountain fastnesses or along our Atlantic shores. On account of throat trouble he took supernumerary relation in 1888, and while sustaining this relation was principal of a successful high school in Pender County. Again he took active work, and served faithfully, bringing forth fruit even down to old age, until December, 1900, at which time he took a superannuated relation, remaining therein until his death.

In 1856, married Jane Caroline, daughter of John Hayes, of Caldwell County, who died in Dare County, April 9, 1902. As a result of this marriage there were five children, two of whom survive—B. G. Crisp, of Manteo, and Mrs. S. M. Carter, of Pender County. In 1903 married Mrs. Rachel Garrett, of Charlotte, N. C., who survives.

With but little notice of life's last hour he came down into the valley of the shadow of death, seeing in the twilight of this life's little day the inspiring dawn of an eternal one. He was ready, having received the justifying and regenerating Spirit of adoption whereby he knew that he had passed from death unto life. His labors have ended, and not a few, saved through his instrumentality, will ascribe eternal praises to our God.

"And I heard a voice from heaven saying unto me, Write, Blessed are the dead which die in the Lord from henceforth; yea, saith the Spirit, that they may rest from their labors, and their works do follow them." (Rev. xv. 13.)

MEMOIR OF REV. GEORGE ALBERT OGLESBY,

The life of Rev. George Albert Oglesby came to a tragic end on the 24th day of January, 1905. On this day he went from his home, near Mt. Gilead, in Montgomery County, to Troy, and as the train was slowly approaching the station at the latter place, in some unaccountable way, the passenger car, with one or two others, left the track and rolled down an embankment. There were many passengers on board, and among them Brother Ogles-At first it was not thought that any one of them was dangerby. ously hurt, though Brother Oglesby was found to be suffering more than others. He was carried to the hotel, and at 1 o'clock, two hours after the accident, the physicians attending him, judged that he was internally injured, and fatally so, and told him he had only a short while to live. Thus, in full possession of his mental faculties, he was unexpectedly brought face to face with death. This was enough to startle an irresolute or unprepared man. But he had lived a noble, true life; he had devoted his strength to his Master's cause; he knew in whom he trusted; his hope reached within the vale, and his faith failed not. He assured those about him of his readiness to try the issues of death. calmly gave directions as to his family and business affairs, and at 3 o'clock passed away. Brother Oglesby's last sermon, which was preached to one of the churches he served, was from the text: "Be ye also ready, for in such an hour as ye think not, the Son of Man cometh." How soon he was to exemplify the blessedness of such readiness! The funeral services were held in Central church, Concord, and his body was laid to rest in his family lot in the cemetery at that place. Rev. John N. Cole, Rev. John H. Hall, Rev. W. R. Royall and this writer conducted the services.

Brother Oglesby came of sturdy, strong stock. His parents were Thomas M. and Eva Reeves Oglesby. He was born in Alleghany County, N. C., of which his mother was a native, December 23, 1853, but his father, who was from Virginia, soon returned to Grayson County, of that State, and it was here that the subject of this sketch grew to manhood. He had the blessing of country bringing up. His eyes gazed daily upon the rugged mountains about his home, and their ruggedness and strength seemed to enter into the very fibre of his being. The passing years never erased these scenes from his memory or stole away his love for the hills. His early religious training he received from his mother, who was a woman of deep piety. His father he had the joy of baptizing and receiving into the church, late Brother Oglesby himself was converted and joined in his life. the church in his sixteenth year. The testimony of those who knew is that he was from the beginning a youth of great character, and of fervor in the church's work. What school training he received was at Old Town, Va., which was near his home. When a young man, he taught for a while before he began to preach.

In the autumn of 1877, he joined the Holston Conference at Cleveland, Tenn., and for five years he labored in the hard mountain fields of that Conference. In 1881, he married Miss Ada

Laws, whose home and kindred were within the bounds of the North Carolina Conference, and in 1882 this Conference, in session in Raleigh, received him as a transfer from the Holston. His appointments after joining our Conference were as follows: 1883-84, Salisbury Circuit; 1885, 1886, 1887, Mt. Pleasant Circuit; 1888, Haw River Circuit; 1889, 1890, 1891, Presiding Elder, Washington District; 1892, 1893, 1894, Presiding Elder, Wilson District; 1895, Presiding Elder, Washington District; 1896, Conference Missionary Secretary; 1897, 1898, 1899, Main Street, Durham; 1902, 1903, 1904, 1905, Aberdeen Circuit.

Two years, 1900 and 1901, he was superannuated.

At the time of his death and for several years preceding, Bro. Oglesby was a trustee of Trinity College. Having himself been denied the opportunities of college training seemed only to intensify his appreciation of higher education, and to render him the more anxious to make it available for all deserving young men. He gave to our college the best thought of his brain and constant love of his heart.

From this record it will be seen that Brother Oclesby gave just twenty-five years to the active itinerant ministry, and that his labors extended from the very crest of the Appalachian range to our furthest eastern shore. Everywhere he was abundant in labors, and everywhere his labors were blessed with large fruitfulness. He was always edifying and strong as a preacher, and often he was anointed with the Spirit of great power. He had a clear, incisive mind, and an original and piquant style that he brought from the mountains. He grappled truth strongly and was quick to detect a fallacy, and when detected, his blows fell upon it with tremendous power. Denied college training, he constantly improved himself by careful reading of the best books. He studied men and things as well as books, and upon almost everything that came within the range of his thought, he had well-defined views. This made him always interesting in conversation. He was wise in the councils of the church, and of decision and energy in action.

But while nature did much for him, and he made faithful use of her gifts, in the work of the church, he realized that the Lord was the source of spiritual power. He approached the throne as a child. Often in secret he poured out his soul to God, and his words of prayer in the public congregation often bore more apathetic spirits with him as suppliants into the very presence of the throne of grace.

This strong nature was much chastened by affliction. At times he suffered much physically, more than any but his more intimate friends knew. He knew the loneliness and weariness of the ineffective preacher's lot. In the earlier years of his ministry he lost the wife of his youth. His second marriage was to Miss Julia Montgomery. Two children were born of either union. His youngest born died while the father was away from home on the Washington District. He reached home in time for the burial, but knew not of the sorrow awaiting him till he was at his gate.

In Brother Oglesby's death the militant church lost a valiant soldier whose sword was ever ready for the conflict, and the North Carolina Conference one of its wisest, strongest, best men. "Be ye also ready." R. B. JOHN.

Dr. Atkins in his report to your body says, "Many of our Sunday Schools have attained to the dignity and efficiency of real schools in which the youth of the church are being religiously educated and thus prepared for great and effective careers."

We believe this applies to a large number of schools in our Conference. We are going forward in numbers also, though not so fast as we would like. We urge each pastor to organize and push both the cradle roll and home department.

With the exception of about forty pastors, children's day has been observed, as required by our church law, and much good accomplished, we believe, towards saving the children, as well as giving your board nearly one thousand dollars, with which to prosecute the work, the coming year. We are grateful and earnestly beg of the forty brethren to come with us next May, and all observe the day, and push the important work as one man.

Our second annual year book will be sent out at the earliest possible moment, giving full information.

Dr. H. M. Hamill and a strong faculty held a very successful training school at Wrightsville Beach, near Wilmington, June 15th to 21st. Much good was accomplished, and at the unanimous request of the school, it will be held this year at the same time and place.

The railroads have agreed to give half rates, hotels \$1.50 per day, boarding houses \$1.00 per day. We beg you come and bring all your superintendents, officers, and teachers.

Further information will be cheerfully given by our chairman or secretary.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON TEMPERANCE.

We rejoice to note the increasing interest and activity in every part of our Conference in the matter of temperance. The time of indifference seems to have passed and our people are realizing as never before the malignity and cruelty of the whiskey traffic- hence they are now speaking and acting in such way as to make this power of darkness tremble. Throughout the bounds of this Conference and throughout the State has the former insolence of this enemy of righteousness changed its tone, but his forces, while in retreat, are also with vigilance arranging a defensive warfare. The Christian people of the State have spoken to our law-makers, and they have heard their voice-the "Watts law" and the "Ward law" are the legislative reply. They have not the sweep that the temperance people desired, but they bear to us a demonstration of the awakening of the public conscience, marking the highest reach that has ever before been attained in the law-making body of the "Old North State," and is the promise of better things yet to follow in answer to the prayers of God's people. The battle is not yet over, nor the victory won, and will not be so long as there is one distillery, dram-shop, dispensary, or other places where liquor, as a beverage, may be obtained. We are ever to keep this condition before our people as our goal. Anything less may under local conditions be considered wise, as a lesser evil, but in fact it is always delusive, and can only result in evil. We must ever keep in mind that even dispensary whiskey will blight and damn as surely as that sold in an open saloon. We wish to express our appreciation of the good work done by the Women's Christian Temperance Union and the Anti-Saloon League. The latter organization especially deserves the loyal support of all temperance people for the forward movement it has inaugurated, and the aggressive warfare it has maintained.

We would call upon all of our people to carry out the teaching of the church: "Let all of our preachers and members abstain from the manufacture or sale of intoxicating liquors to be used as a beverage, from signing petitions for such sale, from becoming bondsmen for any person as a condition for obtaining a license and from renting property to be used for such sale. If any member should violate any of the provisions of this section he shall be guilty of immorality."

We recommend that the Conference request the Bishop to appoint T. N. Ivey as editor of the *Raleigh Christian Advocate*.

THE REPORT OF THE BOARD OF EDUCATION.

The General Board of Education at its last annual session adopted a statement in answer to the question: "What is Christian Education?" From this statement we take the following extract: "Christian education looks to the study of those subjects which not only inform and discipline the intellect, but much more. It has regard to the motives which determine largely the extent of the education of the mind and the use made of all its powers. Its aim is complete education, the freedom that comes by the truth. . . . Christian education must therefore be honest, accurate, thorough, complete, because conscientious, sympathetic, reverent, and religious. It must accept a divine revelation, man's guide alike to faith and practice, and seek, honestly and reverently, its interpretation. Its claim is not that it does better work in the several departments, but completer work. It does not attempt education in a receiver devoid of God and revealed truth, leaving the mind and heart in doubt whether God has ever spoken, but it seeks to inform and discipline the mind as capable of receiving a revelation which a loving and intelligent Father has provided for his children, and to ply the will with those lofty motives which can alone stir the human heart to its depths." In the light of such a statement, and with such a view of the lofty purpose which incites and controls the educational work of the church, no Christian can dispute the superior quality of such education.

THE GENERAL BOARD OF EDUCATION.

From the report of the General Board we are pleased to note the marked progress of the educational work of our church. In every line there has been a large increase over the preceding year. It reveals the fact that in the institutions of our church there is being trained an army of youth numbering 29.078—an increase over last year of 939. Among these there are 276 looking to the ministry—an increase of 97 over last year. Such results demonstrate the efficiency of our General Board in classifying and building up this important department of the church's work. We wish to commend the wisdom of its methods and pledge our co-operation in its work.

VANDERBILT UNIVERSITY.

The recent loss which this institution suffered by fire has brought it more prominently before the church. Much that was lost cannot be replaced, but she goes heroically forward upon her noble mission. Two new buildings are already being erected to take the place of the one destroyed by fire, while others are planned for the near future. The enrolment this year is the largest in the history of the institution. It is the one university of our church, and should have the undivided patronage of our people.

We wish to call special attention to the Correspondence School in connection with the Biblical Department of this institution. We rejoice in the phenomenal success that is attending its efforts, and in the large and increasing number of our young preachers who are taking advantage of the opportunities which it offers. It is seeking

t

to be still further helpful by the establishment of a circulating library for ministers, so that at a nominal cost to themselves they can have access to the freshest and strongest books in their line that are being published. We commend it to the favorable consideration of our preachers and people, and trust that they will co-operate with the Director, Rev. J. L. Cuninggim, in the establishment of this work.

Your Board has also considered the projected plan for an annual course of lectures to be delivered during the sessions of our annual Conferences. The Board recommends that this Conference co-operate with him in this work in so far as the means at our disposal will allow.

TRINITY COLLEGE.

This is the one institution of learning of college grade which the Methodist Church, South, owns in North Carolina. We are proud of her heroic history, and of her present attainments. In buildings, in equipments, and in the men of scholarly attainments and Christian character who compose her faculty, she stands in the very forefront of all Southern colleges. We can to-day fearlessly challenge comparison, and it invites the patronage of the church upon the ground of its merit. It aspires to contribute to the solution of all the problems of our Southern life, and will always hold a leading place in the intellectual progress of the South. Since its opening in September there have been matriculated in the college department 283, and 168 in the Park School, making a total of 451 students-a large increase over last year. The gifts to the college during the year have amounted to something more than forty thousand dollars. In response to a proposition from the trustees of Trinity College to this Conference, your Board recommends the following:

That we appropriate out of the educational assessment upon this Conference \$1,750 to the current expenses of Trinity College upon condition that said college give free tuition to any worthy young man or woman within the bounds of our Conference who may need and apply for such assistance, provided they come suitably recommended.

Your Board recommends that the Conference confirm the following nominations for trustees of Trinity College: Mr. V. Ballard, Col. J. F. Bruton, Mr. J. A. Long and Col. G. W. Flowers.

SECONDARY CHURCH SCHOOLS.

Greensboro Female College.—This institution has been recently making history that will not soon be forgotten. Having passed through tremendous struggles with debt and with flames, she is emerging into a new and a larger life. The enrolment for the present scholastic year is now 163, and the President assures us that it would have been larger, if there had been room to accommodate them. The hearts of the Methodist people of North Carolina are

turning to this institution as they never have in the past. In the midst of her struggles have been born deeper friendships, and a brighter day is dawning for her future. This institution is now the property of Methodism in North Carolina, and for her daughters she is doing a grand and noble work. Her benign Christianizing influences are already felt in many homes of our beloved State, and to-day she turns her face hopefully toward the future. The process of building has gone forward. The remaining dormitory and recitation rooms have been completed, thus adding 17 new and comfortable rooms at a cost of about \$2,000, besides completing the chapel and bath-rooms at a cost of about \$3,000. About ten thousand dollars in new subscriptions have been secured, and the circular front of the building is now in course of erection. The property is now valued at \$161,372.77. The indebtedness of the institution is about \$28,000. This is offset by about \$17,000 in subscriptions, leaving about \$11,000 indebtedness unprovided for. This is a very gratifying financial exhibit when the circumstances are considered.

Your Board recommend that the Conference confirm the following nominations for trustees of Greensboro Female College: E. A. Poe, C. H. Ireland, J. A. Odell, J. A. Young, each for a term of eight years, expiring Dec. 31, 1913.

Your Board requests that the Conference recommend that the Board of Trustees of Greensboro Female College grant the petition of Miss Bessie Brown concerning the sale of certain property in Elizabeth City, the proceeds to be applied to the payment of mortgage on said property.

TRINITY PARK SCHOOL.

This is a high-grade preparatory school located upon the campus of Trinity College. Because of its location, it has many of the advantages that the college itself furnishes. Because of its equipment, and well-furnished faculty, and its strict correlation with Trinity College, our Methodist boys can go to no better place for their preparatory training. The growth of this school made necessary the erection of a new dormitory, which has been done during the year at a cost of \$25,000. The enrollment to date this scholastic year is 168.

SECONDARY AFFILIATED SCHOOLS.

Littleton Female College.—The report of the President shows a matriculation of 231 pupils since the last session of the Conference. More than 200 of these are boarding pupils. The Faculty is composed of 23 officers and teachers. The school is well equipped, and the enterprising President is constantly adding new improvements. We rejoice in its prosperity, and commend it to the patronage of our people.

Louisburg Female College.—This well-known institution has had another year of prosperity. There have been matriculated 177, and the boarding department is full. The faculty is composed of scholarly, conscientious, painstaking, Christian teachers. They endeavor to develop the best type of womanhood in the character of their pupils, and the institution deserves the popularity that it enjoys.

The Scarritt Bible and Training School .- We fear that this institution is not as well known to our people as it deserves to be. It is a unique institution in our Methodism. Its purpose is to train young ladies who desire to become missionaries, Sunday school teachers, nurses, or who desire to become well furnished Christian workers. We heartily commend it to the patronage of our people.

Your Board recommends that the Conference ask the Bishop to make the following appointments:

Rev. J. C. Kilgo, D. D., President of Trinity College.

Rev. E. A. Yates, D. D., Lecturer in Trinity College.

Rev. J. M. Rhodes, President of Littleton Female College.

Rev. J. L. Cuninggim, Director of Correspondence School, Vanderbilt University.

Rev. G. R. Rood, student in Vanderbilt University.

Rev. J. C. Kilgo, D. D., Conference Secretary of Education.

Rev. C. R. Taylor, Principal of Wanchese High School.

Rev. J. M. Culbreth, student in Vanderbilt University.

Your Board recommends the following assessments:

For Greensboro Female College, \$2,000; for Education, \$5,000, \$1,750 of which has hereinbefore been directed, and we recommend that the remainder thereof be turned over to the Board of Trustees of Trinity College for the purpose of creating a sinking fund to meet the \$40,000 bonded indebtedness of that institution, which bonds are now nearing maturity; for the General Board of Education, \$602; for Paine Institute and Lane College, \$602.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON SABBATH OBSERVANCE.

Your Committee on Sabbath Observance submit the following report:

The proper observance of the Christian Sabbath is of perpetual and paramount importance to the church and state.

The Sabbath day is not a human invention, but a gift from God. It is not simply an expediency, but an absolute necessity, the life and power of the church as well as the permanency of the nation being interwoven with its observance.

To the busy toiler the Sabbath is a respite, and stands for his emancipation from that servitude to labor which would otherwise rob him of the time necessary for the improvement of his mind and the cultivation of his heart. The redemption of the world from the thraldom of sin is in an important degree bound up in the divine idea of a holy Sabbath.

To destroy the civil Sabbath would be to enslave the laborer: to destroy the Christian Sabbath would be to reduce the opportunities of the church to propagate the cross and make proselytes of men. Whatever, therefore, threatens the Sabbath day, civil or religious, is an unmitigated evil which cannot be sanctioned nor tolerated by the church. It is the bounden duty of all Christian people to defend the Sabbath, and to studiously avoid any perversion and all appearances of such a perversion.

To the holy ministry, especially, must we look for a persistent and heroic defense of this day. More than all others, our preachers are its custodians by virtue of divine authority, and are, therefore, doubly responsible to God for any abuse of the Sabbath. The situation, which just at this time is critical, is largely in the hands of the ministry. By a proper, determined and resolute stand our preachers may create and mould a public sentiment, just as has been done for temperance, which will hold in abeyance the many aggressions of the world which seem so threatening. We must be courageous and wise, and warn our people against all desceration; and labor for the maintenance of a public and religious conscience upon the matter.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON THE ORPHANAGE.

Your Committee on the Orphanage beg leave to report that the institution has enjoyed remarkable progress during the year and is rapidly gaining a deeper hold in the affections of our people. We confidently believe that the seventy-one children now in the Orphanage are receiving faithful and efficient care and training. Their improvement in every department is very gratifying to superintendent and teachers, and it is believed they will show a worthy appreciation of the interest shown in them by the church. With the incomplete facilities we now have we feel that the best possible work is being done for the development of the industrial life of the children. Excepting some farm and garden work, nothing of this kind has been undertaken. More land is needed. Shops and tools should be provided, that all may have ample employment. These things are to be held in view and made an object of our endeavor. An equipment for laundry work is needed for the girls.

The main building is practically complete, save heating-plant, lights and water. These, as a safeguard against destruction by fire, are an absolute necessity.

We recommend the continuance of the committee, namely: Rev. J. W. Jenkins, Dr. T. N. Ivey, Rev. J. N. Cole, J. G. Brown and R. T. Gray, who were elected one year ago to act as a commission with a like committee from the Western North Carolina Conference, looking to the united support and management of the Orphanage.

We also recommend the re-election of the following Trustees, viz: W. B. Boyd, L. B. Bynum, J. S. Wynn, J. W. Jenkins, B. B. Adams, Jos. G. Brown, John N. Cole, and the election of the following new Trustees, viz: Q. K. Nimmocks, Fayetteville; E. J. Parish, Durham; C. W. Munger, New Bern.

The assessment plan, adopted by this Conference one year ago, has worked with great satisfaction and success, resulting in the collection of \$11,246.54.

We recommend that an assessment be made for the incoming year of an amount equal to ten per cent of the amount paid on pastor's salary for year 1905; and that the same be apportioned to the several charges by the District Stewards: *Provided*, That where any Sunday School or individual shall support an orphan or make a private contribution it shall not be considered a part of the regular assessment.

We request that the Bishop reappoint Rev. J. W. Jenkins Superintendent of the Orphanage for the ensuing year, he having been elected by the Trustees to this office.

The unconditional bequest of \$3,000 by the late Washington Duke to the Orphanage is acknowledged with profound gratitude and is accepted as a token of his abiding love for the institution.

[Document No. 16.] REPORT OF THE BOARD OF MISSIONS.

The Board of Missions of the North Carolina Annual Conference would make their annual report as follows:

The communication from the missionary secretaries referred by you to our Board is full of encouragement. From it we learn that during the past year our church has made marked progress in its missionary operations. There has been considerable increase in membership in the foreign field, and at home we have made the greatest financial advance in our history. "Best of all is the deep work of grace which has been going on in several of our missions."

We rejoice to note the success with which we have met in our missionary efforts within the bounds of our own Conference, and the evidence of increased liberality on the part of our people. The reports from our brethren serving domestic mission charges indicate faithful service on their part, and the blessing of God has evidently rested upon their labors. A larger number of conversions on these charges are reported, if we mistake not, than for many years past. On these charges, we are glad to note, the salaries of the pastors are being gradually increased, and we have reason to believe that within the next few years a number of these will become selfsustaining. The Board of Missions stands ready to co-operate in every way possible with the Presiding Elders and domestic missionaries in developing the church at these weak points.

During the past year, in co-operation with the General Board of Missions, we have sought to disseminate missionary intelligence and to awaken a keener missionary conscience on the part of our people. Through the liberality of a few laymen, and by the help of collections taken in a few cases, we have been enabled to place as a gift in the hands of all our preachers that most excellent book, written by John R. Mott, "The Pastor and Modern Missions." We have also made use of our church paper in keeping this great work before the people.

The South Atlantic Missionary Conference held in Asheville last May, was attended by a large delegation from the North Carolina Conference, and we trust that the effect of that great meeting will be felt in our Conference for years to come.

For several years past we have made a steady advance in our contributions for missions. One year ago we found that we came within \$900 of paying the assessment for Foreign and Domestic Missions in full. We expressed the hope then that we would be able this year to report these claims paid in full, and we made appropriations for this year with that in view. Notwithstanding an advance of \$1.400 this year in the assessment for Foreign Missions, we have not been disappointed, and the North Carolina Conference, for the first time in its history, has paid, and overpaid, its assessment for Foreign and Domestic Missions. The amount raised last year was \$24,631.73; this year, \$27,366.73, an increase of \$2,735.00. Six of the nine districts in the Conference have this year paid their assessment in full. and two of the remaining three have made considerable advance over last year. We hope to be able to report next year, not only that the Conference has paid its assessment in full, but also that every district in the Conference has paid in full.

We acknowledge with profound gratitude the receipt of \$5,000 left to this Board by the late Washington Duke for Domestic Missions. For the present this money will be invested, and the income therefrom will be used to supplement our annual collections for Domestic Missions. We trust that in coming years the cause of Christ in the North Carolina Conference may be greatly promoted by the gift of this noble Christian man, who during his life-time took such great interest in, and gave so largely to, the various enterprises of the church.

The Missionary Training School, the first session of which was held in Nashville, Tenn., last winter is worthy of the patronage and support of the entire church. The first session was a most successful one. Eight young men from the North Carolina Conference were in attendance for four weeks, and all express themselves as having derived great benefit therefrom. The Board has not seen its way clear to appropriate any money for scholarships this year, but it is to be hoped that individuals and churches will make it possible for many of our preachers, and other Christian workers, to spend a few weeks in attendance upon this school.

Attention has already been called through the press to the publication of a series of twelve booklets, containing the principal address delivered at the Missionary Training School last year. We would urge every preacher to secure for himself these booklets, and to devise some way by which they may be circulated amongst his people. We would emphasize, also, the importance of putting *Go Forward* in all our homes, and the distribution of missionary leaflets in all our congregations.

The Board requests the Bishop to appoint R. H. Willis Missionary Secretary.

In 1800 North Carolina territory in the Holston Conference and in the Virginia Conference. except that beyond the Chowan River, was transferred to the North Carolina Conference, and the Conference was divided into the North Carolina and Western North Carolina Conferences. In 1894 the remaining North Carolina territory in the Virginia Conference was transferred to the North Carolina Conference. So now the two Conferences embrace the whole of North Carolina.
