V. STANDING RULES OF CONFERENCE

1. When any member of the Conference intends to object to the passage of the character of any member, he shall hand the name of such member to the President, who shall pass the name by and direct the case to be investigated.

2. When any one of our members is called from earth, it shall be the duty of the nearest pastor or District Superintendent of the district to notify all the preachers in the district of such death, and of the time set for the funeral service.

3. At each session of Conference a publisher shall be elected to publish the minutes of the next session who shall be authorized to make arrangements and enter into a contract for the publication in advance of the session.

4. The District Superintendent of the district, and the preacher in charge of the station where the Conference is to be held, together with the presidents of the several Conference societies, are instructed to arrange the program of religious exercises, and if practicable, secure their publication in the Western Christian Advocate.

5. The Board of Stewards shall consist of six members of the Conference, each of whom shall serve three years, two being elected at each session of the Conference. The Conference may, at its discretion, add two laymen, to be elected annually. The Board shall organize each year by electing a president, secretary and treasurer, whose names shall be published in the Conference minutes.

6. When the names of candidates for admission on trial or for orders, are called, they shall, if present, be called forward and introduced to the Conference.

7. All candidates for recognition of orders shall, unless excused by vote of the Conference, be examined in the same manner as candidates for ordination, and the Committee on Conference Relation shall inquire into the character and fitness for the traveling connection of each candidate for admission on trial, for admission into full connection, or for readmission into the Conference, and all persons desiring a change of relation or any special appointment.

8. There shall be a meeting of the Statistical Secretaries with the Conference Treasurer at eight o'clock on Saturday morning, for the purpose of comparing the money reported in the statistical tables.

9. When a member of the Annual Conference dies, the Conference shall appropriate one hundred dollars to provide a monument for him. The Conference to elect annually a custodian of Monument Fund, who shall apportion the amount necessary to this fund to the several charges on the basis of the amount paid by the charge for pastoral support the previous year. The pastor to report this under the head of other collections. The publisher of the minutes shall reserve a column in the statistical tables for this report.

10. No person in the second year's course of study shall be placed on the Statistician or Treasurer's force.

11. The Stewards are authorized to take annually from the pro rata due the claimants from the Book Concern, a sum according to their discretion, not to exceed ten per cent of their indebtedness to the Book Concern, until it shall be paid in full.

12. All reports of committees and resolutions shall be handed to the Secretary in duplicate.

13. No person shall have his orders recognized who comes from a church that requires a lower standard of literary qualification than the Methodist Episcopal Church, without passing an examination with us.

14. To admit on trial any candidate who is over thirty-five years of age, it shall require a two-thirds vote of all members present and voting, provided the two-thirds equal a majority of all members of the Conference.

15. All charges entertaining the Annual Conference shall provide lodging and breakfast only, leaving the attendants to provide for the mid-day and evening meals. Provided, this does not apply to superannuated members, their wives, the widows of deceased ministers, deaconesses and guests officially invited, who shall have full entertainment. The Committee on Entertainment shall see that sufficient and wholesome meals shall be provided at reasonable rates.

16. All members of the Conference under appointment as Conference Evangelists shall, on the call of their names for passage of character, report their work for the past year, stating number and place of revival meetings held, number professed conversions and accessions to membership of the church.

17. The reports of the pastors shall be filed not later than Thursday morning of conference week, and if such reports are not in, the report of the previous year will be used instead and the names of delinquents published in the minutes.

18. On the first day of the Conference, at the hour following the Communion Service, a memorial shall be held for the ministers and ministers' wives who have died during the year. The Bishop shall appoint someone to deliver the address, and also an alternate.

19. The Secretary of this Conference and the publisher of minutes shall edit the minutes each year before printing same. The printed minutes of the Conference shall be the official journal of the Conference. The publishers of the minutes shall send one copy of each year's minutes by mail free to each retired minister of the Conference and to each widow of deceased ministers of the Conference.

20. Each pastor shall collect or pay a minute fund equal to one-third of one per cent of his cash salary, and shall be entitled to one copy of the minutes for each one hundred dollars of cash salary. The District Superintendents shall receive nine copies each and pay three dollars for the same.

21. Every Effective member of the Conference shall contribute to the support of our Summer School an amount equal to one-third of one per cent of his cash salary.

22. It shall require two-thirds of those present and voting to change or suspend any of these rules, except rule fourteen, which has its own provision.

The Southern Illinois Annual Conference of the Methodist Episcopal Church convened at the First Methodist Episcopal Church in Carbondale, Illinois, for its seventy-third annual session at 9:00 a. m. Bishop Frederick D. Leete presiding.

Bar.—The entire auditorium with the exception of the last three rows of pews under the gallery was made the Bar of the Conference.

Program.—On motion of W. P. MacVey the printed program was adopted as the Official Program of the Conference, and the hour of 8:45 a. m. was fixed for opening the sessions and 12:15 p. m. for adjournment.

Report.—The following section of the report of the Book Committee was read by the Bishop and ordered by the conference incorporated in the minutes.

The Methodist Book Concern endeavors to maintain Christian standards in all its business and industrial relationships. Good will and cooperation are the keynotes of its policy. Group Insurance and retiring allowances are features of its economic system. Wages, hours and working conditions are so adjusted as to promote human values. Our products are sold at a lower price than similar publications of the same quality by other publishers. Its business is conducted with economy and care, and due to the diligence of our publishing forces the sales of The Methodist Book Concern for 1923 total \$5,394,668.43, an increase of \$359,412.42 over the year before. The net produce for 1923 is \$537,708.92, an increase over 1922 of \$89,728.07. The distribution to the Annual Conferences for the retired preachers is also increased by fifty thousand dollars, the amount this year being \$350,000, next to the largest sum ever distributed in a single year to the men who have given their lives for the Church, and who have built up this potent Christian agency to serve the varied parts of the Church and to spread Christian literature over the land.

SECOND DAY

Thursday, September 25, 1924

The Conference convened at 8:45 a. m. The devotions were conducted by Conference Evangelist Leroy Mitchell. At the request of Bishop Leete, sentence prayers were offered by members of the conference, concluding with the Lord's Prayer.

That the Southern Illinois Conference of the Methodist Episcopal Church approve of the plan of Group Life Insurance, \$1,000 for each effective member who gives full time to his pastorate: That the Treasurer of the Board of Trustees be authorized to collect the necessary premiums from those desiring the insurance and to remit the same to the Insurance Company. In case a sufficient number does not join to make the insurance effective any premiums collected and not paid to the Insurance Company are to be returned to those remitting.

COMMISSION

1. The Commission on Unifying the Philanthropies of this Conference recommends first, the organization of a Board of Hospitals and Homes as provided for in the General Conference Legislation. This Board shall have general supervision of the several institutions, viz: The Methodist Orphanage, The Old Folks Home and Holden Hospital. It shall have particular charge of all promotion efforts and shall itself carry the budget for such promotion.

2. The fact that the new Holden Hospital Building cannot be opened until equipment shall have been provided, leads us to recommend that the Conference authorize and direct the Board of Trustees of the Conference to borrow such a sum as will complete an equipment fund of \$15,000 not later than March 1, 1925.

3. To unify the interests of the Womans Home Missionary Society and of the Conference in Holden Hospital, this commission recommends that a Board of twenty-seven members be created which shall hold the property of the Hospital in trust for the Woman's Home Missionary Society and for the Southern Illinois Conference, giving joint ownership of the Hospital. The Womans Home Missionary Society shall elect thirteen members of this Board; provided also that the members of that Society who are now on the Board of Holden Hospital shall act in the new board until their successors are duly elected. The Southern Illinois Conference shall elect thirteen members of the Board and the Board of Trustees of the Southern Illinois Conference shall elect one member from among their own number.

4. The Board of Hospitals and Homes is authorized to promote the development of the Old Folks Home, with reference to location, planning and erecting of the new building for the home. We recommend the continuation of Brother J. B. Stout as representative of the Home.

5. We ask for the appointment of C. C. Hall as Executive Secretary of the Board of Hospital and Homes and Superintendent of The Methodist Orphanage.

McKENDREE COLLEGE

McKendree College opened her ninety-seventh year with the largest college freshman class in her history. The equipment is being constantly supplemented to meet the demands of the institution, and of the standardizing agencies. Notable improvements have been made in several departments. A four thousand dollar pipe organ is being installed this conference week. Dr. Hype's gift through his will has made possible extensive enlargements and improvements to the athletic field. The department of Religious Education is of increasing value. The administration is giving most careful supervision of the moral and spiritual life of the students. The faculty is giving sacrificial services. Dr. Harmon is pouring his life into the effort to lift McKendree to a commanding place in education and christian influence. The loyal co-operation of pastors and laymen have made these successes possible.

Economy and increased income from tuition has decreased the deficit very materially. The Sustentation Fund this year amounts to \$4,000. Income must exceed expense if the Endowment is to be largely increased in the near future. The college will now receive one dollar and one half from the Rockefeller Board for every three and one half added to the Endowment from other sources until one hundred and fifty thousand are contributed from this Board, which will add five hundred thousand dollars to the productive endowment.

To meet deficit and as the people's part in the current expenses of the school, and to make increasing endowment possible: Be it

Resolved, that we commend the splendid work of the Wesley Foundation of the Normal University of Southern Illinois under the leadership of Dr. W. P. MacVey; and of the Wesley Foundation of the University of Illinois.

We approve the asking of the Wesley Foundation of the Normal University for an appropriation from the Rockefeller General Education Board for the support of the work.

THE WESLEY FOUNDATION AT THE UNIVERSITY OF ILLINOIS

The Wesley Foundation at the University of Illinois is the Methodist Church at work among the students at our state university. The work is no longer an experiment.

Last year 8,928 students, not counting Summer Session or Chicago Departments, were enrolled in the departments of the University of Urbana-Champaign. Of this number, 2,448 were Methodists, or more than a fourth.

One thousand, three hundred and sixty students were last year enrolled as members of Trinity Church, the Church of the Foundation. We must have a new Trinity Church as soon as possible. We are actually losing scores of students who would come, had we the facilities for them.

The problem of support is a very serious one, growing out of the amazingly rapid growth of our work. If the opportunities in this wonderfully strategic field continue to be met, there must be increasing numbers of friends who will contribute regularly to the work of the Wesley Foundation at the University of Illinois.

COMMITTEE ON LIFE INSURANCE

Your Committee decided upon the plan of \$1,000 for each effective member of the Conference on the group plan. This provides that an official of the Conference makes the contract for all and pays the premium for all, that each member has an individual policy providing for \$1,000 in full force immediately in case of death and for the payment of the same to the insured in case he were totally and permanently disabled before the age of 60. As there is no examination, the condition is made that 90 per cent of the class selected be insured.

There are 167 effectives in the Conference. Ninety per cent would be 152. Data on 135 has been secured which lacks 17 of that number. Your Committee considered limiting the class to those effectives who were working full time in the Pastorate. There are about 160 of these, 90 per cent being 144. We lack 9 of that number.

Several of those who gave the data may not take the insurance when the plan is ready to put in operation, and some have already indicated that attitude. Therefore it is evident that the plan of financing the group of insurance by an official of the Conference collecting the amount due from each member is not practical, as 90 per cent will not continue persistently.

The only way your Committee see that this may be effective is by Conference action and not individual action. The average premium figured on 122 persons was about \$17.00. This on 167 effectives totals \$2,839.00. This would be reduced by dividends in future years, but increases by the age of those retiring would probably offset that. The total claim for the support of Pastors including rent was \$280,291. One per cent of this would amount to \$2,802.00, approximately the amount of premium.

Your Committee therefore believes that the plan of group insurance can only be made effective by a levy of some such amount, in addition to present levies.

If this plan is not adopted, then your Committee will try to interview or correspond with the few unseen.

If data on over 90 per cent is secured then you will be advised by letter to remit the premium of approximately \$17.00 to the treasurer of the Board of Trustees or some part of it not less than \$2.00, the balance to be paid by deposits as you wish. When the Treasurer has had the remittances from 90 per cent the first installment of the total premium of about \$2,800 will be remitted to the Prudential Insurance Company and the insurance will be in force. If the first remittance is not secured from 90 per cent, the group insurance cannot go in effect and the remittances will be returned to those so remitting.

Notes

1. The standing of a student in any subject shall be determined as follows: The examination papers and the written work furnished by the student shall each be graded on a scale of 100 per cent. The final grade to be found by striking an average between these two grades.

2. To assist the student in systematizing his study the Board of Examiners recommend the following scheme of work:

The first subjects in each year to be studied during the months of October and November; the second subjects during the months of December and January; the third during the months of February and March; the fourth, or remaining, during the months of April and May. Let the written work in each subject be prepared and sent to the

proper examiner at the close of each study period. Let the books for collateral reading and study be taken up during the months of June to September.

3. There shall be two examinations each year; one at the close of the Institute at Lebanon in June, which will cover the entire Course of Study for the year, and the other on Tuesday before Wednesday on which the Annual Conference meets.

4. If the applicant shall be absent at the time appointed for examination it shall be optional with the Examiner and Chairman whether he be given an examination that year.

5. There will be no giving or receiving information during the examination.

6. Sermons shall be sent to the Examiner by the first of August.

XII MEMOIRS

REV. WILLIAM CRITCHLOW MACURDY.

William Critchlow Macurdy was born January 16, 1859, in Butler, Penn. During his young manhood he attended Union College in Ohio, and later received his degree from Upper Iowa University. He was married October 20, 1866, to Miss Mary Kerch, who with four children survive him. One son died when he was four years old, and Vincent Macurdy lost his life during the World War. The children surviving are: Mrs. W. G. Lewis of Lincoln, Nebr.; Herold of Great Bend, Kans.; Warren and Lloyd Barker are at home and present at their father's death. Dr. Macurdy also had three sisters and one brother surviving him. The sisters are: Mrs. Clare Hesselgesser of Cotesfield, Nebr.; Mrs. Olive Morgart of McKeesport, Penn.; and Mrs. Gertie Westhay of Almeria, Nebr. The brother, John Macurdy, lives in Butler, Penn.

Dr. Macurdy belonged to the following organizations: the Masonic, the Odd Fellows, the Modern Woodmen and the Southern Illinois Conference of the Methodist Episcopal Church in which church he was a minister from the time he united with the Conference in Iowa until his death.

During his ministerial life he served a number of leading charges, among them Davenport, Iowa; Anaconda, Montana, and in Kansas he was the pastor at Coffeyville, Parsons and Emporia from where he was transferred to Carthage, Mo. Several years on the Farmington District of the St. Louis Conference and he was made president of Carlton College and later the educational secretary of the Conference in charge of Carlton and Marionville colleges. Dr. Macurdy closed his effective Conference relation at Flora, Ill., in the Southern Illinois Conference. Since then he and his family have lived in Emporia. He has never lost his interest in the church, but has preached whenever his health has permitted and been regular in his attendance at the services of the church. He always had a kind word for his pastor and helped him in every way possible.

Funeral services were held in the First Methodist church, Emporia, Kans. Rev. C. L. Hovgard, pastor of the church, assisted by Rev. Eugene Kramer, pastor of the Grace Methodist church, and Rev. H. G. Biddlecum, pastor of the Friends church, conducted the services. Interment was in Maplewood cemetery.

Minerva Elzira Flint nee Minerva Elzira Robertson, daughter of Thomas and Elizabeth Robertson, was born near Sarcoxie, Jasper County, Mo., Jan. 9th, 1849; departed this life in the Methodist Hospital Madison, Wis., Feb. 17th, 1924, aged 75 years, one month and eight days.

Her father was a native of Kentucky and her mother of St. Clair County, Ill.

When the deceased was sixteen months old her father started with a company of friends to cross the plains to the gold fields of California, but never arrived at his destination, having taken sick

on the way and died and was buried on the plains at the side of the trail.

At the age of four her mother migrated to Illinois, believing a free state was a better place and presented more favorable condition for employment to aid her in the rearing of her child than did slave territory.

On Dec. 18th, 1854, Mrs. Robertson, the mother of Mrs. Flint, was married to Haynes T. Woods of St. Clair County. In this county she lived with her mother and her step-father, attended the common school till she was able to teach school. For seven years she alternated with attending school, teaching and other duties. In January, 1871, she entered McKendree College attending two terms. Then taught school again. In September, 1874, she attended college for two more terms.

She was converted and joined the Methodist Episcopal church in her eighteenth year at Freeburg, Ill., under the ministry of Rev. T. J. Davis.

On Sept. 6th, 1875, occurred the happy event of her marriage to John Wesley Flint of Lebanon, Ill. Mr. Flint was admitted, one week later, to the Southern Illinois Conference.

Thus she entered with her husband into the Methodist itineracy and together they served fifteen charged. In the fall of 1920, with her husband, entered the retired relation after forty-five years of effective service. On retirement they located at Madison, Wis., where she lived till the end came.

Mrs. Flint was blessed with unusual good health, which was faithfully devoted to the interests of humanity, she being especially interested in the poor, unfortunate and aged.

She contributed her full share to the success that attended the ministry of her husband. During his 12 years as presiding elder, the care and the culture of the family rested mainly on her.

A full measure of her devotion was given to both the local church and Conference interests. She served for many years as a teacher in the Sunday-school, also as president of both Lebanon and Mt. Vernon Districts and corresponding secretary of the Vandalia District for the Woman's Foreign Missionary Society and was also a faithful and interested worker in the Woman's Home Missionary Society. Her last illness was of short duration and the end came suddenly. A great mother heart has ceased to beat. A gentle voice has become still. A genial, kindly countenance has vanished.

On her going she leaves a broken hearted husband, Dr. J. W. Flint, three daughters, Mrs. Mary Fletcher Morgan, wife of Prof. E. L. Morgan of the State University of Missouri, **Annie E. Flint** of Madison, Wis., Mrs. Alice Flint Blied of Madison, Wis. A son, Gilbert Roy Flint, who served in the World War, spending 16 of the 21

months in France, now residing in Fairfield, Ill., eleven grandchildren and a host of friends to mourn her demise.

“Servant of God, well done,
Thy glorious warfare’s past,
The battle’s fought, the race is won,
And thou art crowned at last.”

The funeral services were held in Lebanon, Ill., Feb. 21st, in charge of Dr. James G. Tucker, superintendent of the Olney District, with a number of the Southern Illinois Conference members assisting. Interment was in the College cemetery at Lebanon.

Anna Bell, daughter of James and Lucinda Dagley, was born at New Haven, Illinois, May 19, 1854.

She was married to Albert Goldburgh, December 12, 1877. To them were born four children, one son and three daughters. Mr. Goldburgh died in 1890.

September 22, 1898, Mrs. Goldburgh was married to Rev. W. T. Morris of the Southern Illinois Conference. This union was a very happy one. Faithfully, with her husband, she bore the toils and shared the joys of an itinerant preacher. Together they served Fairfield one year, Metropolis six years, Cairo three years, Salem two years, Du Quoin three years, District Superintendent of Lebanon District two years, Carbondale District five years, Carmi two years and seven months, and Jerseyville one year, at which place her earthly career was suddenly closed April 11, 1924. As she sat at the table with her husband the summons came and she was not found among men, for God had taken her. In all ways she was a diligent and efficient helper. She was a constant inspiration to the church wherever they served, especially to the ladies. She lived life’s measure full and has gone to rest.

Funeral services were held at Fairfield, Illinois, April 13, 1924, conducted by the Pastor, assisted by Dr. J. G. Tucker and other members of the conference.
