MINUTES.

SATURDAY, OCT., 22, 1892.

The Geneva Baptist Association met this day at New Hope Baptist church, Holmes county, Florida, at 11 a. m. After singing some songs of praises the introductory sermon was preached by Rev. A. B. Riddle. Text, 1 Cor. 4:20, "For the Kingdom of God is not in words, but in power." The delegates were requested to meet in the house at 2 p. m., for business. Resolved, 2. That this Association will not hereafter receive churches into this union which hold members received on anti-missionary baptism.

REPORT ON BIBLE DISTRIBUTION.

Your committee on Bible Distribution, after a careful consideration of the subject and in view of its importance, think that the report of committee made at the last session can not be improved any other way except such improvements as may from time to time be suggested by experience. Imperfection is hard to discover in any place until it has been tried. Then your committee would urge the Association to act upon the plan already adopted for the Distribution of the Bible.

REPORT ON MISSIONS.

Your committee on Missions have had the subject under consideration, and ask to submit the following:

We all agree that the Missionary work is the outgrowth of the church or is perhaps more properly stated, an important and highly important part of church work. While this is an acknowledged fact, it is attended with more serious difficulties than perhaps any other branch of church work. In consideration of the subject, questions quite difficult of solution present themselves to the mind of your committee, we are far short of the progress that we ought to be making. We believe, however, that the unusual political excitement has had great tendency to retard Missionary operations. The first thing to be done is to adopt a plan, and your committee is of the opinion that the plan adopted at your last session is a good one, if put in operation and pursued. No doubt experience would suggest improvement, as all other plans when first adopted are more or less crude, and we believe that until tried and proven to be insufficient the plan adopted at the last session should remain as the plan of our Missionary and colporteur work of this Association. The question of funds to successfully put the plan in operation is the one most difficult of solution. No plan is worth anything unless we are active in co-operating upon it; now we are confronted with the question, "How are we to raise funds to put the plan in action? for nothing has been done in this direction, and certainly nothing can be done until means are provided. Ten dollars and a half is reported by the church letters, we are thankful for this, but it would not more than buy Bibles and Testaments for the colporteur work. We feel at a loss to suggest a plan for this indispensable work of raising money.

Your committee recommend that all 5th Sabbaths in the ensuing associational year be devoted to Missionary meetings, to be held under the direction of our Missionary Board, whose duty it shall be to arrange program etc., giving prominence to Missionary work and Sabbath-schools. We further recommend that funds raised for Missionary purposes be paid to the secretary of the Missionary Board, subject to the order of the said Board.
