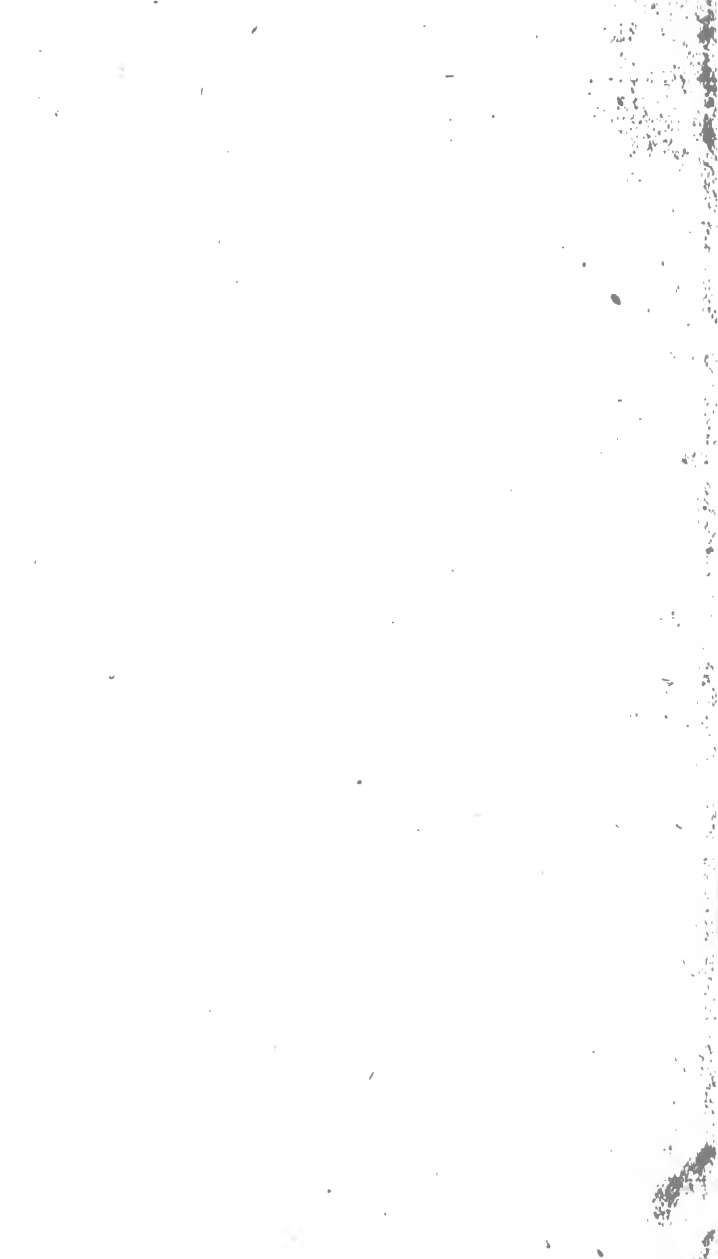

MINUTES

The Pea River Baptist Association, met according to a previous adjournment, with Woodland Grove Church, Coffee County, Alabama, on November 4th 1882. The Introductory Sermon was preached by Elder J. W. Bullard. After one hour and a half for refreshments, the body was called to order by the former moderator, Elder M. Brooks, and prayer by Elder Wm. Pritchett.

By request the letters from the several churches were read by brothers D. C. Allen and W. M. Cooper, and delegates names enrolled as follows:

Woodland Grove—J. M. Rowe, C. R. Talbot and W. M. Cooper.

New Providence—W. J. Spurlin, J. A. Moore and P. T. Wise.

Bethlehem—(Dale)—Jasper Ellis, J. M. Bullard and J. W. Bullard.

Bethlehem—(Coffee)—A. J. Brooks, D. W. Jernigan and J. J. Bradley.

New Ebenezer—William Taylor, N. B. Fleming and J. A. Taylor.

Shiloh—M. Brooks, J. W. Brooks and A. J. Wise, Jr.

Then proceeded to an election of officers, when Jesse M. Rowe was elected Moderator and A. J. Wise, Jr., was re-elected Clerk, and C. R. Talbot, Treasurer.

Invited visiting ministers and brethren to seats in the body, when Elder W. C. T. Mosely responded from the Alabama Association, and Wm. Pritchett from the Centennial Association and Rev. M. M. Wamboldt and brother J. D. Parkman from Salem Association.

Then called for petitionary letters, when letters from Mount Lebanon Church were presented by her delegates, J. F. Wise, J. A. McGee and Amos Thames.

From White Water Church, by her delegates, D. J. Williams, George Calhoun and Henry Morris.

The letters with their respective delegates were re-

ceived and the right hand of fellowship was extended by the Moderator in behalf of the Association.

Called for correspondence, when Elder D. C. Allen and E. M. Brooks responded from Salem Association, and E. Edwards and W. W. Fleming from Newton Association. Then suspended business for one hour for brother M. M. Wamboldt to preach. After which returned correspondence.

MONDAY MORNING, 9 O'CLOCK, A. M., Nov. 6, 1882.

The Association met according to adjournment. Singing, and prayer by Elder D. C. Allen.

Called roll and marked absentees.

Renewed the call for correspondence. Also renewed the call for petitionary letters.

Called for report of committees, when that of the committee on missions was read and adopted. See appendix A.

Report on periodicals read and adopted. See appendix B.

On motion, business was suspended fifteen minutes for the purpose of raising funds to support a missionary, a portion of the ensuing year, when

When a balance of \$11 was found to be in the hands of the former treasurer A. Windham, and a committee consisting of J. W. Brooks, W. M. Cooper and J. W. Bullard was appointed to collect the amount and turn it over to the present treasurer.

Report of treasurer read and approved. See appendix G.

MISCELLANEOUS BUSINESS.

It was resolved hereafter to meet on Thursday before the first Sabbath in November.

Resolved, That we are due the members of Woodland Grove Church, together with the kind citizens of the surrounding vicinity, our thanks, which are hereby tendered them for their kindness extended us, during our very pleasant stay among them.

Resolved, That it be left discretionary with the clerk where the minutes should be printed, and that he be instructed to draw on the treasurer for the money to print minutes with, and likewise his salary. Minutes read adopted.

On motion, the Association adjourned to meet with New Providence Church, one mile east of Elba, on Thursday before the first Sabbath in November 1883.
