# MINUTES.

# SATUBDAY MORNING, November 6, 1886.

The PEA RIVER BAPTIST ASSOCIATION met in its Tenth Annual Session with the Elba Church, on the 6th, 7th and 8th days of November, 1886, according to previous adjournment.

The Introductory Sermon was preached by Elder John

Bradley, from ixth chapter of Hebrews.

After one hour for refrehsments, the Association was called to order, and the former Moderator being absent, Bro. N. C. Underwood was appointed Moderator pro tem. Prayer by D. C. Allen,

3. Invite ministering brethren to seats.

4. Call for petitions from churches desiring to unite. 5. Appoint committees, to report during the session, viz:

1 To Arrange Preaching.

- 2 On Missions. 3 On Finance.
- 4 On Documents.
- 5 On Nominations.
- 6 On Periodicals.
- 6. Call for correspondence. 7. Return Correspondence.
- 8. Have Rules of Decorum read.
- 9. Call roll and mark absentees.
- 10. Hear reports from committees.
- 11. Hear Treasurer's report.
- 12. Hear miscellaneous resolutions.
- 13. Make arrangements for printing minutes.
- 14. Correct minutes, and adjourn.

# RULES OF DECORUM.

1 The Moderator shall fill the chair and preserve order in the Association, which shall be opened and closed with prayer.

2. The privileges and authority of the Moderator shall be respected by all the members; he shall decide all questions

of order and propriety.

3. The Moderator shall vote in no case, unless there is a tie in the Association, then he shall give the casting vote. He shall have the same privilege of speaking as other members, provided he shall appoint some member to fill the chair.

4. But one member shall speak at a time, who shall rise from his seat and address the Moderator, and keep to the subject; and he shall not speak more than twice on the same subject without leave from the chair.

5. No member shall leave the body while on business, ex-

cept by permission from the Chair.

6. When a question is taken up, after allowing time for deliberation, the Moderator shall take the voice of the body by calling for the yeas and nays.

6. All motions in order must be disposed of by the body,

urless withdrawn by him that made it.

S. A list of names of the delegates shall be called and absentees marked.

9. The Clerk shall enroll the names of the delegates, and keep a regular record of all the business of the Association

10. The minutes of the Association shall be read and cor-

rected before the body rises.

11. This Decorum may be altered or amended by two-thirds of this body.
