#### EDWARDSVILLE, ALA., OCTOBER 1ST, 1897.

The HARMONY BAPTIST ASSOCIATION met this day in its Thirty-Third Session, in the meeting-house of the Edwardsville Baptist church, at 11 o'clock a. m.

The introductory sermon was preached by Rev. A. Willingham. Text: Revelation xxii, 9-"Worship God."

The Association re-assembled at 1.30 p. m., and was called to order by J. C. Jackson, the Moderator. Prayer by F. Lindsey.

The Association convened at 9 a.m. The Moderator read the 133d Psalm. Engaged in singing and prayer, led by J. C. Garner.

Letters from Pleasant Hill and Providence churches read and delegates, names enrolled.

Renewed call for Correspondents and Visiting Brethren. None.

On motion, heard from Bro. Walker on the dissolution of Mt. Olive church.

On motion made 9 o'clock a.m. tomorrow, hour to hear report on Sabbath schools, and discussion of same.

On motion report on Temperance made special order for 2 p. m.

Report on Indigent Ministers read, and after being discussed by the brethren, adopted (See Reports of Committees.)

The Committee appointed to nominate an Executive Committee nominated T. J. Burton, V. M. Thackerson, A. M. Turner, D. E. Head, G. W. Roberts. Adopted.

Report on Nominations read and adopted.

Report on Home, State and Foreign Missions read. Pending discussion of reports on Missions, took recess for preaching.

Preaching at 11 o'clock a. m. by Rev. J. A. Glenn.

#### AFTERNOON SESSION.

1:30 p. m. Met according to adjournment.

Report on Temperance taken up and read and after being discussed by Brethren Edwards, Glenn, Higdon and others, adopted.

Report on Finance adopted.

Resumed discussion of reports on Missions. Discussed by Brethren Glen, James and others. Adopted.

Reports on Destitution and Deceased Ministers and Deacons adopted. Adjourned.

The Association convened at 6:30 p. m.

Reports of Executive Committee and Treasurer adopted.

APPOINTED GENERAL MEETINGS:—Second District, at Pleasant Hill Church, on Friday before the fifth Sunday in October, 1897; First and Third Districts, none appointed.

APPOINTED DELEGATES: To the Alabama State Baptist Convention—T. A. Higdon, A. A. Hurst; to the Georgia State Baptist Convention—J. S. Edwards, T. W. Griffith, J. C. Jackson; to the Southern Baptist Convention—T. W. Griffith, delegate, and J. S. Edwards, alternate.

Appointed next session of this Association to be held at Hopewell Church, Cleburne county, Ala., 15 miles south of Tallapoosa, Ga., and 13 miles southeast of Edwardsville, Ala., commencing on Friday before the first Sunday in October, 1898, at 11 o'clock a. m.

Heard and adopted resolutions. (See Resolutions.)

On motion, directed the Clerk to have 800 copies of Minutes of this session printed and distributed among the churches pro rata, as per minute fund, and retain balance for his services.

Directed all the missionary funds sent up by the churches, and all that may be received during this session, to be equally divided between the State Mission Boards of Georgia and Alabama.

Directed Treasurer to pay to T. J. Garner \$2, sent up by Mt. Olive church.

On motion, granted the delegates from Shiloh and Pine Bower churches leave of absence, and W. J. Fincher and T. J. Loveless.

Adjourned to 9 o'clock a. m. Sunday.

#### SUNDAY'S SESSION.

Met according to adjournment. Prayer led by J. D. Walker. Report on Sabbath Schools read, and after being discussed by Brethren Hardin, Dunklee, Adair, E. A. Burton, Glenn and others, was adopted.

Adjourned to 1.30 p. m.

#### SABBATH EXERCISES.

At 11 a. m., Rev. J. A. Glenn preached the annual Missionary Sermon from 2d Corinthians, 12th chapter, and a part of the 10th verse: "For Christ sake." During the service unmistakable evidence of the spirit and power of God were manifested in our midst. Yea, in some of our hearts God by His divine spirit dwelleth.

Took up a collection for Missions, amounting to \$10.09.

The Association re-assembled at 1.30 p. m. Engaged in singing and prayer, led by J. W. Walker.


On motion, took up a collection for Bro. J. A. Glenn, amounting to \$5.25.

#### REPORTS OF COMMITTEES.

HOME MISSIONS.

We your committee on Home Missions beg leave to submit the following report: We regret to note the painful indifference of our churches on the subject of Missions, and especially Home Missions. We heartly believe that it is the duty of every Baptist to support the Home Mission cause, and we regret to hear the oft-repeated and still false reason that "I am not able to give anything to Missions '

We believe, however, that the main fault is in the Pastors, and we earnestly recommend that the Pastors inform themselves and

educate the people on this the work of the churches.

We further desire to endorse the work of the Home Mission Board, and especially the work of Dr. Diaz in Cuba, under the Home Mission Board, and we recommend that the churches cooperate with the Home Mission Board, and contribute liberally to its support. Respectfully submitted.

#### STATE MISSIONS.

We your committe offer the following report: We find that the cause of Christ has been greatly advanced through the Mission work within the state. We have increased the contributions, and greatly increased the number of contributors.

We are proud of the work done by the brethren through the board, and are impressed that there is still a greater work before

us, if the churches will do their duty in support of the boards.

The work of the board is to collect the money for Home and Foreign Boards, and to do all of the Mission work possible. therefore recommend that our churches take steps to comply with the demands made on us by our respective state boards.

#### FOREIGN MISSIONS.

We refer to the report of the Finance Committee for what has

been done for this cause by us during the last year.

We think we all, individuals and churches, should have a system for aiding in this work, and we recommend that the system reported by this body at its last session be given a trial, and we refer to that report and ask that the churches and individual members adopt it and practice it during the next year. #### DESTITUTION.

Report that most of our churches have preaching once a month. But the preachers generally work during the week and do not have time to do but very little pastoral work. We believe that this Association ought to have a Missionary in the bounds of the Association, to visit the churches and assist the Pastors in reviving the Missionary cause in our bounds.

We recommend that the Executive Committee look after the Mission work in the Association, and that each church help to support a Missionary, and that he report to the committee quarterly.

#### TEMPERANCE.

We your committee report: We find on investigation that the temperance cause in some parts of our Association is improving, but in other parts it is languishing. We believe that the habitual drinking of ardent spirits is a menace to our growth as a denomination and is a reproach on the cause of Christ.

We therefore urge our brethren to refrain from the use of whiskey, wine or other intoxicants as a beverage, and obey the Holy

injunction "to be temperate in all things."

#### ARTICLES OF FAITH.

I. We believe in one only True and Living God, the Father, Word and Holy Ghost, and these three are one. Deut, vi, 4; 1st John v. 7; 2nd Cor. xiii; 14 Matt. xxiii, 19.

II. We believe that the Scriptures of the Old and New Testament are the word of God given to us by inspiration of sod (2d Tim. iii, 16,) and the New Testament is the only book of discipline to govern the Church of God; and that Jesus Christ is the head and only lawgiver. Heb. ix. 14-17; Eph. i, 22; Matt. xvii, 5.

III. We believe in the doctrine of election, according to the

fore knowledge of God the Father through sanctification of the Spirit and belief of the truth. 1st Peter i, 2-5; 2d Thess. ii, 13.

IV. We believe that all men are sinners by nature, children of wrath, even dead in tresspasses and sin (Eph. ii, 13: Rom. v, 12), and unable to recover themselves from the tallen state they are in by their own ability. Rom. v, 6; John vi, 44; Phil. ii. 13.

V. We believe that sinners are justified in the sight of God only by God's grace, through faith in the Lord Jesus Christ. Eph.

only by God's grace, through faith in the Hold Jesus Christ.

ii, 8; 1st John i, 5; Rev. i, 5; Rom. v, 1.

VI. We believe in the preservation and final salvation of all God's children. 1st Peter i, 5; John vi, 38, 40, and x, 28, 29; 1st John iii, 2; Col. iii, 3, 4.

VII. We believe that Baptism is an ordinance from God, enjoined upon true believers in Jesus Christ only, commanded by Christ to be kept by His Church; and that immersion only is Script and Labarian Lebus is 6.22. Matt. vvviii 10: 1st Cor. xi. 2; Rom. tural Baptism. John i, 6, 33; Matt. xxviii, 19; 1st Cor. xi, 2; Rom.

vi, 4, 5; Col. ii, 12. VIII. We believe that the Lord's Supper was instituted by Christ as an ordinance to be observed by His Church till He comes, and that no person has a right to participate in this ordinance only those who have been Scripturally Baptized, and sustained an accredited membership in the church. Matt. xxvi, 26, 27, et seq.;

Mark xvi, 22 et seq.; Acts. ii, 42; 1st Cor. v, 11 et seq.

IX. We believe that the visible Church of God is composed of Baptized believers covenanted together and to keep the Commandments and ordinances of the Lord as He delivered them to us, acknowledging no head nor law-giver but Christ. Acts ii, 41, 42 and 47, and v, 14, and xviii, 8; 2d Cor. viii, 5; Eph. i, 22, 23; Col. i, 18.

X. We believe in the resurrection of the dead and a general judgment, and that the righteous will enter into eternal life and

the wicked will enter into everlasting punishment. Matt, xxv, 46;
Acts xxiy, 15, and xvii, 31; Rev. xx, 12 et seq.; 1st Cor. xv, 21 et seq.
XI. We believe that no person has a right to administer the ordinances of the Church, only those who are chosen by the Church and Scripturally set apart to that office. Acts vi, 5; xiii, 2, 3.

We believe that all infants that die as such are saved through the atoning merits of Christ, without any works that man can perform. 2d Sam. xii, 23; Matt. xix, 13, 14; Rom. v, 14.
