MINUTES.

MORNING SESSION.

The Mud Creek Baptist Association convened with the Freewill Missionary Baptist Church, two miles southwest of Quinton, on the Kansas City, Memphis & Birmingham Railroad, October 17, 1891, at 11 o'clock, A. M.

The introductory sermon was preached by Elder A. White, from St. Mark, chapter V and 19th verse, which reads thus: "Go home to thy friends and tell them how great things the Lord hath done for thee."

Prayer by Brother B. M. Waldrop.

The Association then adjourned to meet again at 1:30 o'clock, P. M.

AFTERNOON SESSION.

The Association reassembled in the house at 1:30 o'clock, P. M. Services were opened by singing a hymn in the Psalmody, No. 982, after which prayer was offered by Brother W. H. Peterson.

The Moderator called for the letters of representation from the various churches and appointed Brother B. M. Waldrop, of the Birmingham Association, and Brother J. R. Reeves a committee to read the letters handed in. The Clerk enrolled the names of delegates.

The Moderator appointed Brothers B. M. Waldrop and J. K. P. Laird to take the votes of the several churches for Moderator and Clerk. As the Moderator called out the names of the churches the delegates came forward and voted for these officers, which resulted in the choice of Elder A. White, Moderator, and Brother A. J. Sumners, Clerk.

The Moderator called for newly constituted churches and received none. He then called for correspondence and received Elder B. M. Waldrop, of the Birmingham Association.

The Moderator called for Returning Correspondence. None.

On motion, this body agreed that when any of its members are present with other Associations in session, that they may be recognized as messengers from this Association.

The Moderator called for the reading of the Constitution, Rule of Decorum and Abstract of Principles. Read by Brother J. R. Reeves.

On motion, it was decided to have singing Sunday morning at 9 o'clock.

Adjourned until Monday morning.

SUNDAY MORNING.

At 9 o'clock, A. M., singing began.

The Elder appointed to preach the missionary sermon being absent,

Elder S. B. Stiff was appointed instead, with Brother T. B. Vandiver to follow.

At 11 o'clock singing began, which was followed with preaching by Elder Stiff. The hymn, No. 475 in Psalmody. Text, St. Mark, Chapter V and Verse 19, which reads: "Go home to thy friends and tell them what great things the Lord hath done for thee, and had compassion on thee." After prayer, "Nothing But the Blood of Jesus" was sung. An interesting sermon was then preached. Prayer by Elder Vandiver.

EVENING SERVICE.

At 2 o'clock, p. m., the class of singers reassembled and enjoyed a very animated lesson. At 3 o'clock Rev. S. B. Stiff gave a pointed and interesting lecture on Sabbath Schools. Dismissed until morning.

MONDAY MORNING.

Singing began at 10 o'clock. The Moderator read a lesson from Matthew, Chapter V and the first sixteen verses. Hymn, No. 574 in Psalmody was sung. Prayer by Brother A. J. Summers.

The Moderator then called the Association to order and asked for the reports of the various Committees.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON DOCUMENTS.

We, your Committee on Documents, beg leave to report as follows: We have examined the letters from the various Churches and find a request from Blue Creek and Friendship Churches, letters of dismission from our body, and also a request from Pilgram's Mission Church to publish Wm. H. Moeyer in our next minutes for profanity, drunkenness and dancing. He has been excluded for the same, but holds a license to preach and a letter of dismission. All of which we recommend.

We, your Committee on Nominations, report as follows: That we find a request from Mud Creek Church asking that the next session of this body be held there, and this we recommend. Mud Creek Church is five miles Northwest of Adger. We recommend that Elder J. N. McFalls preach the introductory sermon, Elder J. A. Markham, alternate; Elder G. H. Bean to preach the missionary sermon, Elder T. P. Vandivere, alternate. The Association to convene Friday before the third Sabbath in October, 1892.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON SUNDAY SCHOOLS.

We, your Committee on Sunday Schools, submit the following: By investigation we find only three of our Churches engaged in this important work. Feeling as we do, the great need of the word of God being taught our children, who we know are the hope of our country, and seeing the danger of their being led astray by the sin and devices that surround them, and feeling the need of our going to work in earnest in this great work, we ask this body to appoint five brethren, whose duty it shall be to organize Sunday Schools in the Churches of this Association. We also recommend that the several Churches report in their letters to the next session of this body the number of scholars engaged in their schools, and that the same be spread on the next minutes of this Association. Resolved, To meet with Mud Creek Church, five miles northwest of Adger commencing Friday before the third Sunday in October, 1892. Prayer by the Moderator, a hymn was sung and each gave to the others the parting hand.
