The Twenty-seventh Annual Session of the Judson Association convened with the Shorterville Church, October 5th, 1871, at 11 o'clock A. M.

3. Called for the report on Sabbath Schools, and pending its adoption, Brother J. T. Davis spoke of the happy results of Sabbath Schools, and urged the brethren to be more active in keeping up schools in our churches.

Brother A. L. Martin was of the opinion that churches do not feel or understand their obligations to this subject. "Every church is a Sabbath School. With the Bible and song books every church is prepared to carry on a school." His church was keeping up such a school, and with Brother Green as teacher of the Bible class, they were doing much good.

The report was adopted as follows.

REPORT ON SABBATH SCHOOLS.

Your Committee beg leave to report that the letters show that a few of the churches of this Association have flourishing Sabbath-schools. It is, however, lamentably true, that too little interest is manifested in training up our children in the nurture and admonition of the Lord, and teaching them the great moral truths of God's Law.

PLACE OF MEETING NEXT YEAR.

6. On motion, resolved to meet with *Pleasant Plains Church*, 7 miles west of Columbia, on Friday before the first Sabbath in October, 1878.

7. Brother John T. Davis read the following:

REPORT OF EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE.

Your Committee beg to report that, acting under authority from the Association, given them at its last annual session, they employed Brother Malone to supply the White Oak Mission, and agreed to pay him thirty-five dollars for said labor. They employed Brother Bruner to supply the Gordon Mission, and agreed to pay him sixty-five dollars for said labor. Brother Malone reports that he has preached regularly once a month within his mission work. He has baptized two, and feels that good has been accomplished. Brother Bruner reports that he has labored faithfully in discharging the duties which were imposed upon him by the Committee. His report shows 17 baptized, and 358 miles traveled. Brother Bruner feels that the cause of Christ is being strengthened in said mission field. We recommend the above named brethren be paid the amounts named for their services. We further recommend that the above missions be continued and recognized as fields of destitution, and supplies be provided for them. We further recommend that the mission in the lower part of the county be changed from the Gordon Mission to the Bluff Springs Mission.

The report was received, and a motion to pay brethren Malone and Bruner for their mission labor was concurred in.

A motion to discontinue the mission in our lower bounds was adopted.

On motion, the White Oak Mission was continued.

The report as amended was then adopted.

A motion to suspend business to hear Brother Martin's sermon was carried.

Adjourned to meet at 2 o'clock. Benediction by the Moderator.

The motion, as amended, was adopted.

Adjourned to Sabbath morning at 9 o'clock. Prayer by Brother E. M. Knowles.

L. R. Sims in the chair. Prayer by Brother J. C. Wells.

Brother John T. Davis moved that thirty dollars be appropriated for publishing the Minutes.

Adopted.

Brother Knowles moved that the mission work be turned over to the Executive Committee. Carried.

Brother Armstrong moved that the Colportage be continued another year. Motion concurred in.

There being no other business, it was moved that we repair to the stand and take the parting hand at the close of the 11 o'clock sermon.

ELEVEN O'CLOCK.

Brother W. N. Chaudoin preached the Missionary Sermon upon Isa. lxvi. 13 :

"As one whom his mother comforteth, so will I comfort you."

The sermon was doctrinal, practical, animating, and comforting. It cannot be lost. The Baptists who were there, *if Christians*, will love missions more, will do more for missions, will want to make *personal sacrifice*, and thus have fellowship with a suffering Savior.

At the close of the sermon a collection was taken up amounting to \$40.30.

A hymn was sung and the parting hand taken, while many feel that we shall not all meet again in another such Association. Prayer by Brother Chaudoin.
