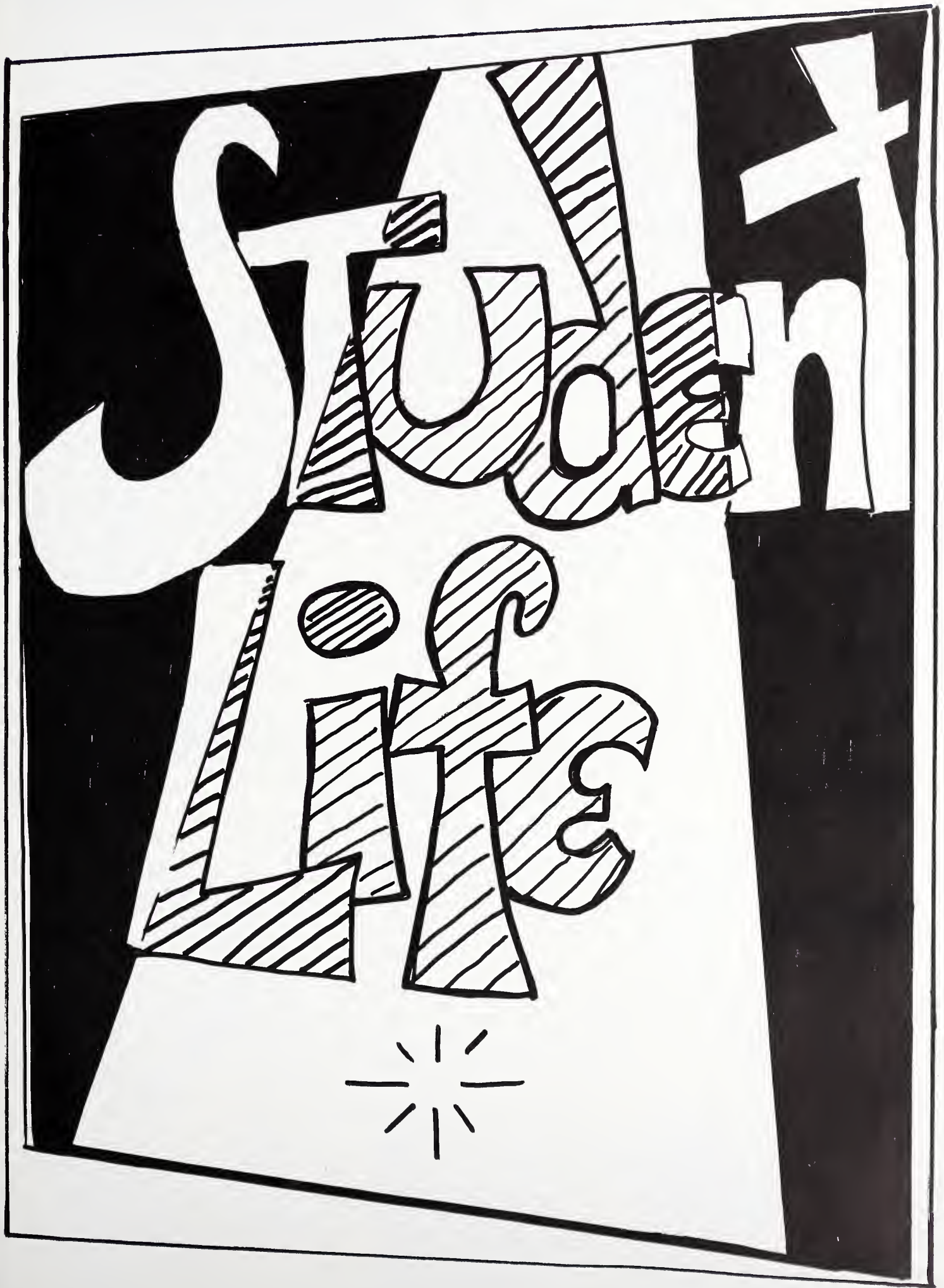
With this in mind, Morris College is on move to adapt to the changes and meet the challenges that technology is constantly presenting to society.
