





Coach Hank Ellis and his Bobcat basketball team had a rough time getting started, losing the first five contests. After this start, they spent all season trying to even up the record, but ended up with an 8-18 record. The record doesn't tell the complete story though, because nine of the losses were suffered by seven or fewer points. Two of the biggest games of the season were the 84-81 victory over VMI and the 102-91 victory over Morris Harvey on their home court. Ed Hood, Harp O'Toole, and Tommy Rutherford led the Bobcats in scoring. Hood broke all of the single season scoring records by tallying 574 points. O'Toole had 392 and Rutherford garnered 375.
