




# Around The World In A Week-end, Theme Chosen for Homecoming








Carol Dimling from Reistertown. Md., became the 1968 May Queen at the annual May Week-end festivities in Wesley Chapel.





A Steak Dinner was held in the Buckhannon Fire Hall to raise funds for Alpha Delta Pi's philanthropic project.








220-relay demands full steam ahead
