




## MAIN STREET PROJECT






I will respect at all times the dignity and religious beliefs of the patients under my care, holding in confidence all personal information entrusted to me, and refraining from any action which might endanger life or health.

I will do my utmost to honor the international code of nursing ethics and to uphold the integrity of the professional nurse.































Other events offered include racquetball(singles and doubles) and one on one basketball.












