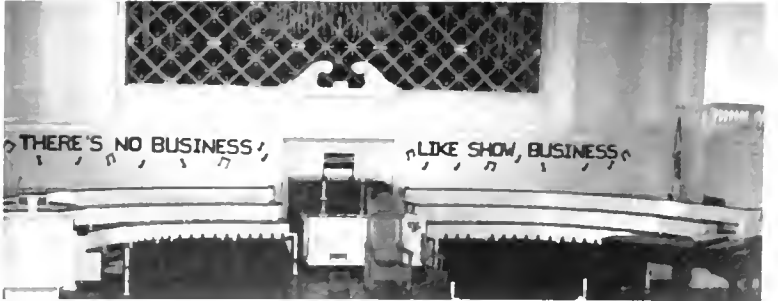
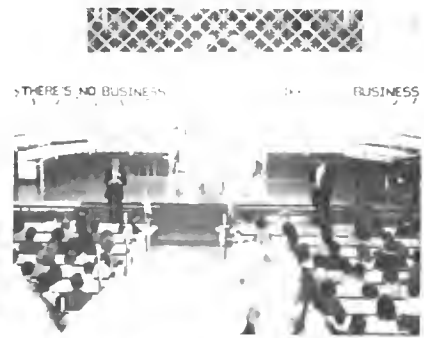

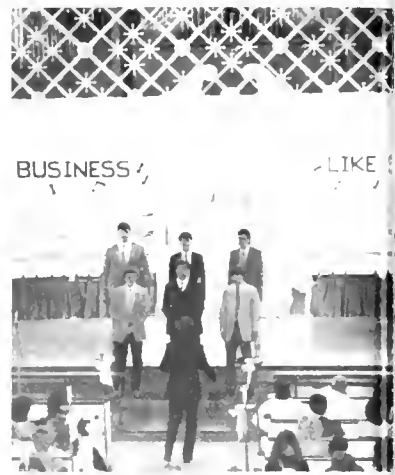

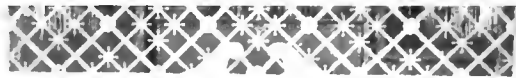

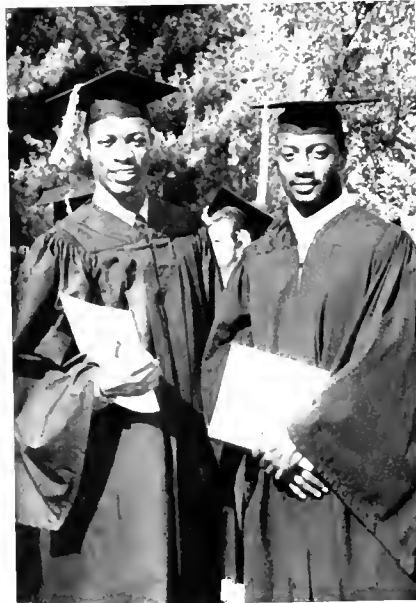

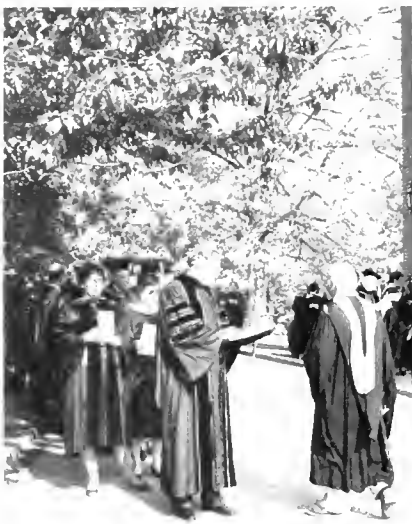

On July 30, the band left Vienna airport and headed for home. After landing, an exhausted band collected their equipment, loaded it on a bus and started on the long drive home.



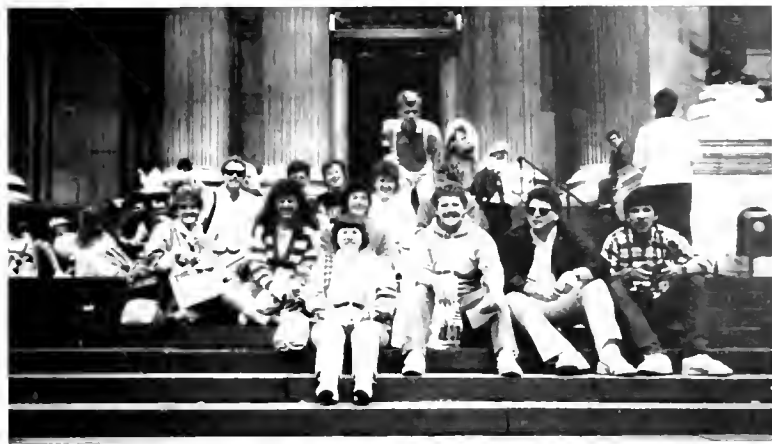

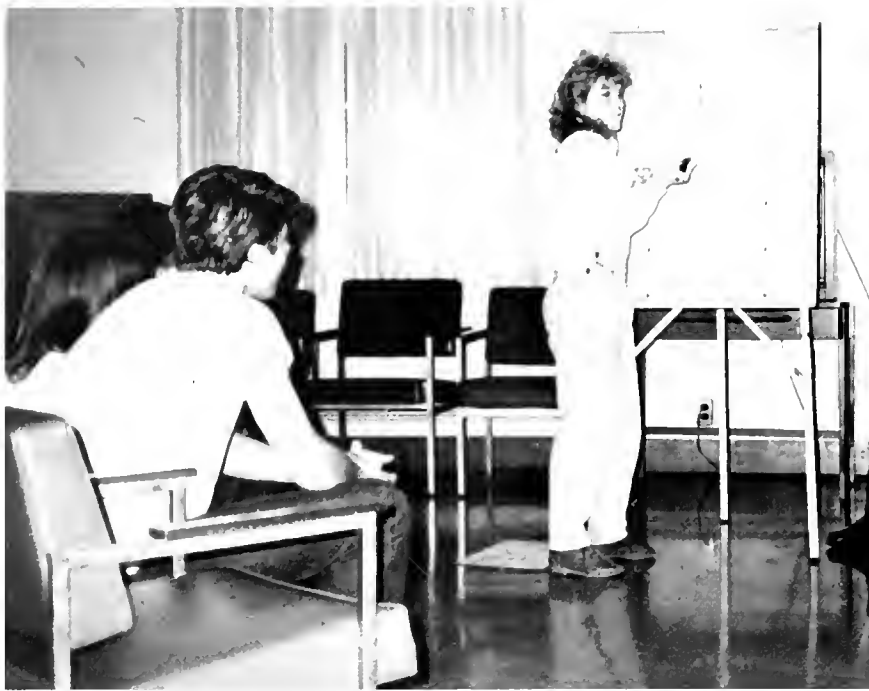

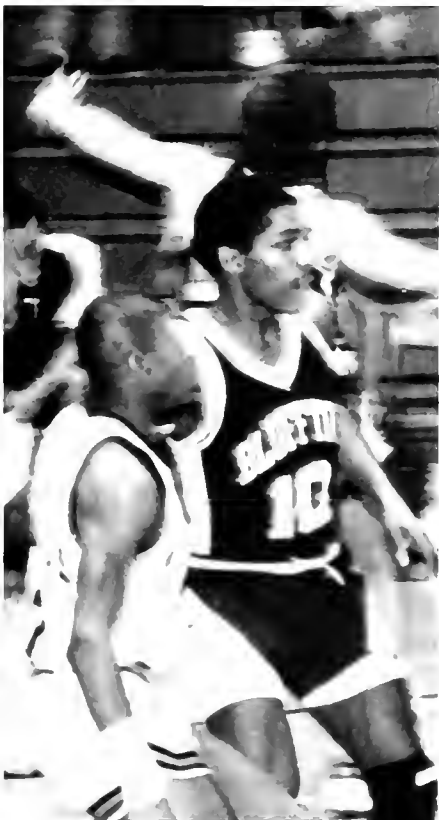
