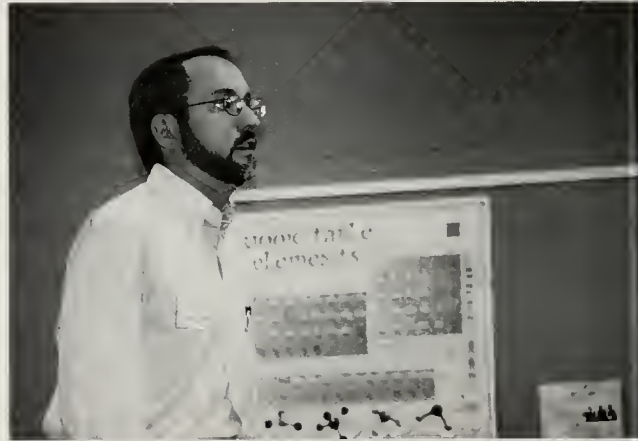

In the Fall

Fall at Wesleyan combines the beginning of a new academic year with traditional campus events. August brought 1,580 students to Wesleyan's doors. College leaders praised the 80% retention rate of last year's freshman class and the increasing presence of PROMISE Scholarship recipients on campus. Theatrical and musical performances included "The Laramie Project" and Cole Porter's "Anything Goes". Three Bobcat teams achieved conference championships--women's cross country and soccer teams and football. Historically, Wesleyan football made its mark with the first undefeated conference record since 1935. Homecoming 2003 brought current and past students together to celebrate our community in the hills. Royalty, football victory, class reunions, and parties marked this well anticipated fall tradition. 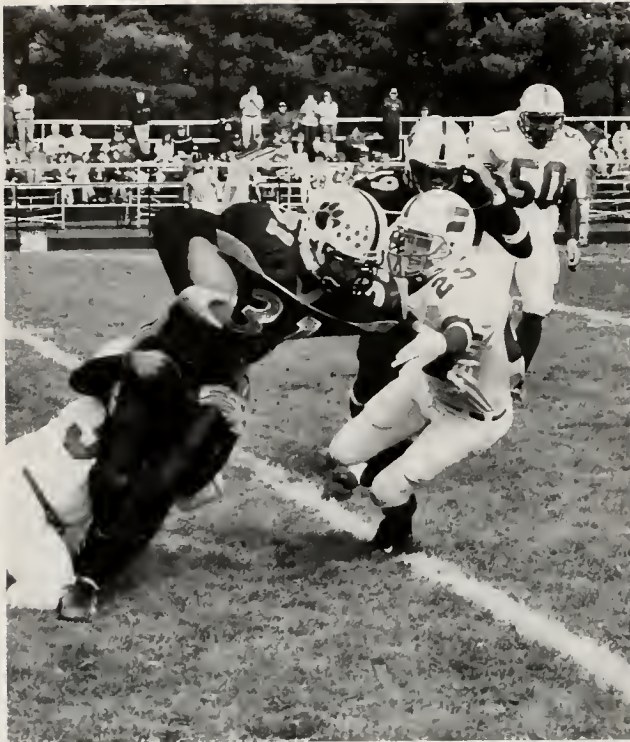

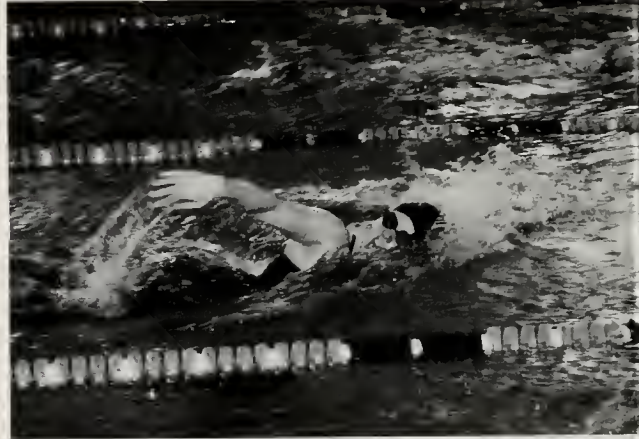
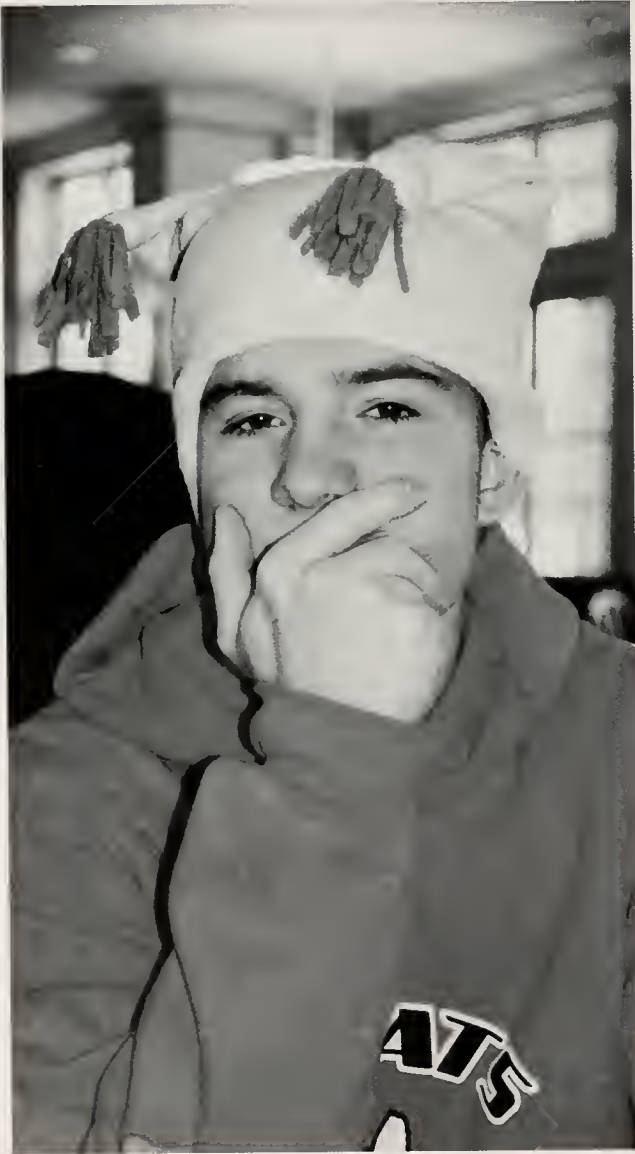




Homecoming

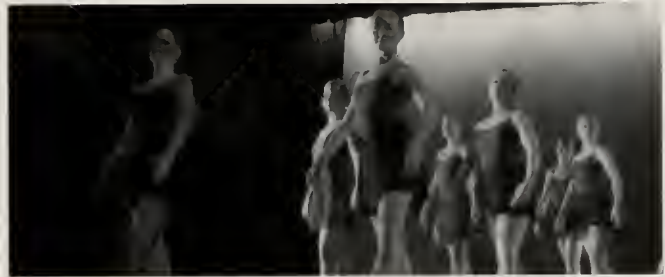


Theatre

Each time I go home it is easy to notice how much I have changed since coming to West Virginia Wesleyan only four years ago. I will head out to the bar, or back to an old friend's house to hang out and talk about old times, but my mind keeps bringing me back to people and events that have happened right here in good old Sunny Buck. Conversations dry up, we each part ways, and I get the distinct feeling that those friends whom I had in high school and the different cliques that I palled around with are not as special or important as I once thought. I realize I don't really care what they think of me anymore and I keep thinking about what is going to happen when I head back to Buckhannon a little early, telling my parents that I have so much left to do before classes start up Monday. Debates were no longer a time where I dreaded coming in with all my information printed off and highlighted, counter arguments scribbled in the margins. Now a quick glance at the info and we are off to class with a scrap piece of paper and a pen ready to shoot from the hip and defend our side of the argument with ease. My years at Wesleyan have been a whole lot of fun, quite a bit of work, and the friendships that I have built here will last a lifetime. As I look onward to grad school, I know that I have been prepared as well as I can for all the entrance exams and classes that await me. I am excited for the challenges that are in front of me, but no matter what I will never forget my experiences over the last four years that have changed me from the timid and inexperienced boy who came here, to the well-rounded man who will be leaving.

The women's soccer team of West Virginia Wesleyan College had an outstanding performance in 2003 and finished the season with its second WVIAC crown in three years and an overall record of 16-3-2. The team ran through the conference with a 7-0-1 mark scoring 41 goals and only allowing three. No team scored against the 'Cats in the postseason as they won three straight home games and won back the WVIAC title with a 1-0 victory to Davis & Elkins. 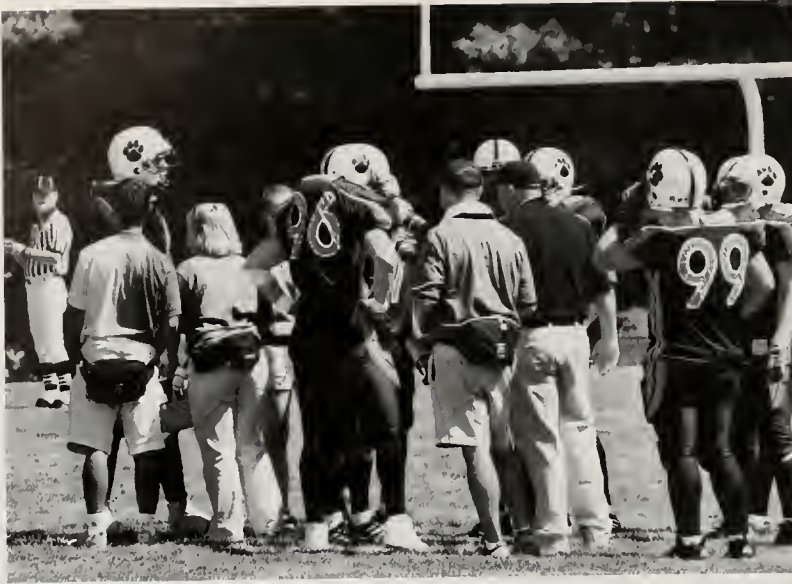

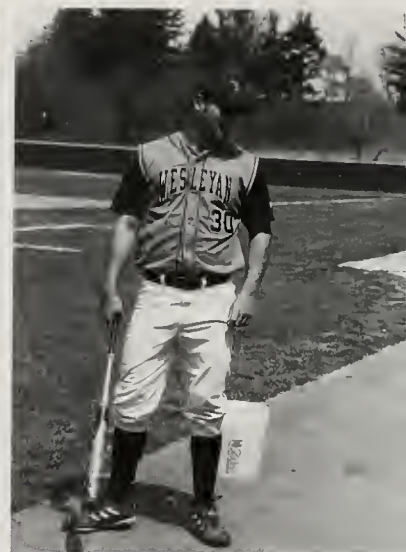
ATHLETIC TRAINERS

The athletic training major provided students with theoretical knowledge and understanding of the profession of athletic training. The major blended classroom instruction and structured clinical experiences through a process that resulted in students' gaining eligibility to sit for the National Athletic Trainers' Association Board of Certification (NATABOC) examination upon graduation from Wesleyan. Students who graduate from the program and subsequently pass the national certification exam will be qualified to be employed as athletic trainers in secondary schools, in colleges and universities, for professional athletic teams, in sports medicine clinics, or in industrial preventive medicine clinics. In addition, students will be well prepared to pursue graduate level studies in athletic training and, upon completion of specified prerequisite coursework, advanced degrees in movement science, exercise physiology, physical therapy, medicine (including physician's assistant programs), health, and physical education. The major is accredited by the Commission on Accreditation of Allied Health Education Programs (CAAHEP).

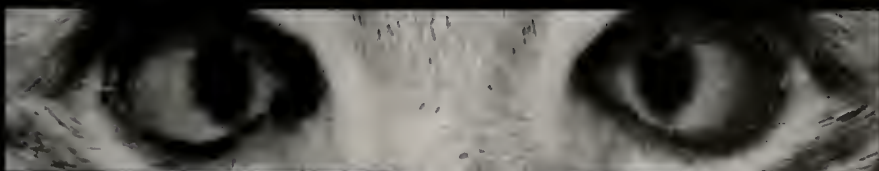

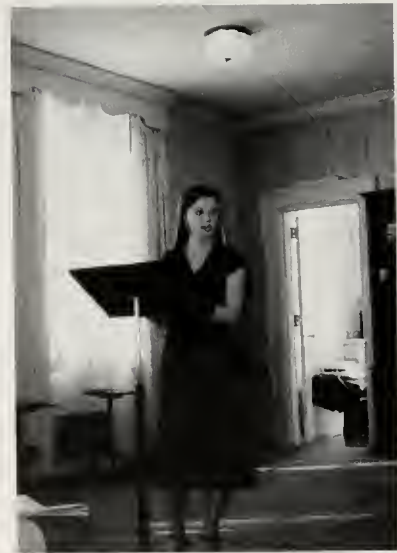

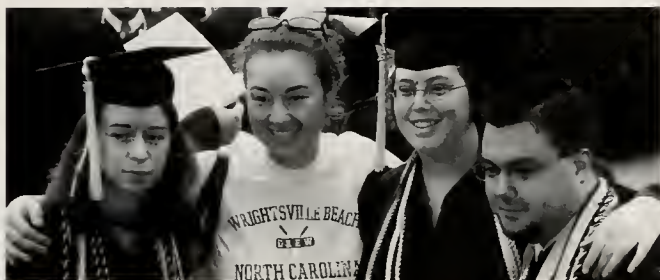
