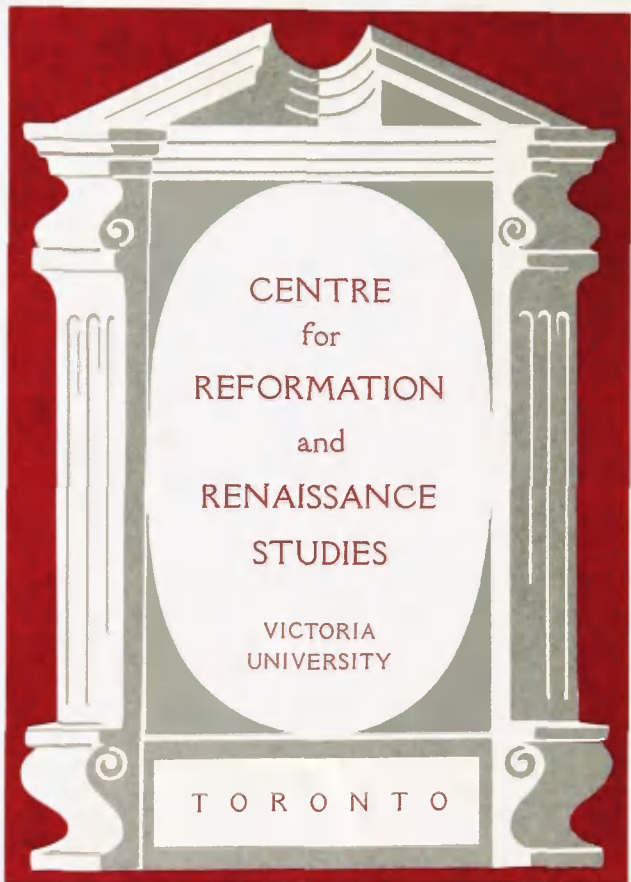

PREFACE.

IN speaking of this, the first portion of the C. Fairfax Murray Library, as a Collection of German Books, it is necessary to point out that the term is used in a wide general sense, so as to include the Presses of Holland, Belgium and Switzerland, all of which produced a style of typography and illustration different from those of the Latin countries. The period included embraces the years 1465 to 1680, the first date being approximately the date of the Block-Books, and the last that of the book containing Rembrandt's etching to Jan Six's Medea. The majority of the books are of the 15th and 16th Centuries, but a few of the 17th were included by Mr. Fairfax Murray on account of their Dürer interest. The whole forms a representative collection of books with woodcuts of remarkable importance and completeness, commencing with the earliest xylographs, i.e. the Apocalypsis, Ars Memorandi, Ars Moriendi, Biblia Pauperum, and Speculum Humanae Salvationis. While few of the books were collected as examples of type-printing only, the famous early German presses at Augsburg, Basle, Cöln, Frankfurt, Lubeck, Mainz, Nürnberg, Strassburg, and Ulm are all well represented, besides those of Antwerp, Gouda, Louvain, Bamberg, Brünn, Leipzig, Rougemont, Schiedam, Speier, Zwolle, etc. The Collection contains many fine and important books from the Ashburnham, Marquis d'Adda, William Morris, Huth, Pembroke, and other recently dispersed Libraries. As, with a few trifling exceptions, all the books are rare, it has not been thought necessary to repeat the usual terms of praise.

The present Catalogue is based on Mr. C. Fairfax Murray's own privately printed Catalogue, 2 volumes, royal 4to, 1913, in which very elaborate and detailed descriptions of the various items will be found.

An index of Presses and Printers will be found at the end of the Catalogue.

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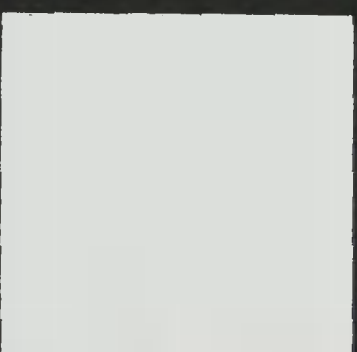
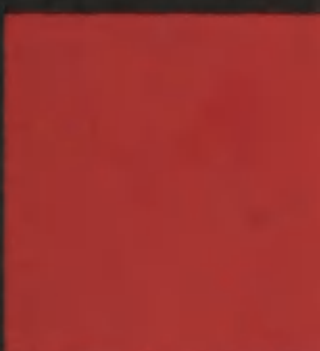
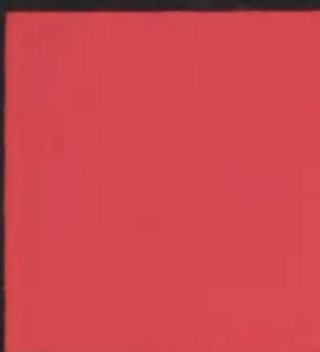
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
