




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

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OV SIMPLIFIED SPELING.



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NASHONAL AND INTERNASHONAL SPELING.

THAIR iz sum confyuzhon az tu the naityur ov a reformd speling ov English which we must trie tu dispel az we enter upon the second yeer ov our campain.

We need tu ciendz ov speling—a nashonal and an internashonal. The later iz recwierz for siëntific purposez and for the teeching ov forin langwijez. It shood be ov such a ciend that it can reprezent everi variëti ov speech soundz.

Such an alfabet nesesarili recwierz a larj number ov sienz, and eeiven then it iz not aultugether satisfactori. We reali need complecs simbolz, such az Prof. Jespersen haz so injeniusli deviez in his analafabetic sistem, which indicaits the acshon or pozishon ov eech organ ov speech consurnd in the producshon ov a sound. Houever, for scuul purposez, his sistem iz obviusli tu elaborit.

In teeching forin langwijez it iz important that we shood hav a set ov simbolz with recogniezd valyuz, and heer again it iz important that the saim simbolz shood surv for aul the langwijez taut. Thoez hu hav foloed reesent developments in the teeching ov modern langwijez noe that a grait advaans haz been maid in the w提醒 ov imparting the forin pronunsiaishon. The alfabet emploid aulmoest ecscluusivli iz that ov the Internashonal Fonetic Asoesiaishon, which iz far mor wiedli yuzd thruout the wurld than eni uther. Long ecspeeriens shoez it tu be wel adapted for practical scuul w提醒.

It seemz a grait piti that moest ov thoez hu deviez nyu sceemz ov speling, with nyu leterz, pai so litl atenshon tu this alfabet and indeed tu the resurchez ov fonetishanz jenerali. A reform ov the

speling must be in the direcshon ov bringing the riten langwij mor intu harmoni with the spoecen ; and wun hu discusez speling reform shood furst ecwip himself with sum nolej ov the soundz ov our speech. It iz not az tho taucing a langwij and heering it, houever long, sufiest tu convai this nolej ; in a properli spelt langwij it miet duu so, but in ourz the speling constantli misleedz. Peepl thinc thai uter soundz becauz thai spel them ; thinc thai pronouns wurdz differentli becauz thai ar spelt differentli, and *vice versa*. Thus, we hav hurd it sed that "made" iz not pronounst in the saim wai az "maid," and thair ar meni hu hav not realiezd that thair ar tu ciendz ov *th*.

Let us taic az an egzaampl ov the sceemz which incluud nyu leterz that propoezd bi Dr. A. W. Thomson. He sujestst the yus ov whot iz jenerali regarded az the length marc for the vowelz in "faather" (*ā*), "fain" (*ē*), "fateeg" (*ī*), "oeld" (*ō*), and "poot" (*ū*), and of *ñ* for the laast sound ov "ring."

Nou, in the furst plais, the length marc iz trublsmo tu riet ; liec everi diacritic, it interfeerz with the floe ov the pen. (It iz a piti we duu not return tu the undoted *i* and adopt an uncrost form ov the *t*, such az iz yuzd in German.) It iz aulso a seerius adishon tu the printer'z stoc ov tieps ; the cwotaishonz about "nyu leterz" in the laast number ov THE PIONEER shoe that clearerli.

Secondli, it iz tu much liec the recogniezd fonetic sien for naizal vowelz (*ā*, *ē*, ets.) ; and a long naizal vowel wood recwier boeth sienz abuv it.

Thurdli, it tendz tu efais the distincshon between taul and short leterz, which iz ov veri grait importans for the recognishon ov wurdz, az haz been abundantli pruuvd bi reesent resursh.

Forthli, it iz not consistentli yuzd : in "pūt" and in "riñ" the marc duz not indicait length at aul ; and in the uther caisez the pairz ar not simpli longz and shorts. The vowel ov "fat," if length-end, iz much cloeser tu that ov "fair" than tu that ov "faather," that ov "dot" cloeser tu *au* (az in "faul") than tu *oe* (az in "oeld"). The soundz in "fair" and "faul" duu not apeer in the sceem at aul ; but in the spesimenz we noetis "brod" (= "braud"), "ol" (= "aul"). The fact that in "fait, doet" the difthongal pronunsia-shon iz the moest comon iz aulso obscyurd. Tu sai that "the vowel soundz propoezd for *ā*, *ē*, *ī*, *ō*, *ū* ar the long Italian soundz" iz just a litl funi ; reed "The Sām ov Laif" with long Italian vowelz and yu wil get—enithing but standerd English.

The yus ov *y* az a vowel (az in "very") serpriezez in a sceem which strievz tu be fonetic ; the distincshon in "boy, boiz" aulso

haz no fonetic justificaishon, and if fienal *i* and *oi* ar tu be riten *y* and *oy*, whi not "tay, taiz" (for "tie, tiez")?

Compair with this sceem ov vouel reprezentaishon that ov the Internashonal Fonetic Asoesiaishon and yu wil not hezitait for a moement which tu prefur.

Az for the consonants, thair iz litl tu noet in Dr. Thomson'z sceem. If a nyu sien iz tu be adopted, the wel noen *n* (*i.e.*, *n* with the tail ov a *g*) iz far beter than *ñ*. Dr. Thomson'z preferens ov *k* oever *c* iz shaird bi meni; it iz a cwestion we shal shortli submit tu the consideraishon ov our memberz. With regard tu *qu* and *x*, Dr. Thomson wood retain them; thair seemz litl gain in the former cais, unles *q* (without the adishon ov *u*) be yuzd for *cw*. "*X* shood be retaind with its prezent valyu ov *ks*"; so we ar tu riet "ne^k, nex, stik, stix," but "eg, egz, egzamin."

Dr. Thomson'z sceem, eccept for its obviusli Scotch flaivor, iz tipical ov meni sceemz submited tu us; it faulz short ov the Internashonal alfabet tu which we hav refurd. It wil be wel for aul hu consider the cwestion ov nyu leterz tu studi that alfabet cairfuli befor launching a sceem ov thair oen.

We sed abuv that we aulso recwier a nashonal alfabet; and it iz this that we ar prinsipali consurnd with. Whot duu we cheefli need? A notaishon such that a chield taut tu pronouns properli can reprezent the soundz without hezitaishon, bi meenz ov leterz or gruups ov leterz consistentli yuzd, and so selected that he wil be aibl tu reed boocs in the bad oeld spelng without dificulti. It must maic yus ov the leterz nou in yus—az the ecspeeriens ov Pitman and Ellis haz shoen. Posibli, in cors ov tiem, a fyu nyu leterz mai be introdyust; but thair ar grait dificultiz in the wai ov this.

We duu not denie that sum dai thair mai be an internashonal alfabet, yuzd for aul langwijez thruout the wurld; we shal gladli duu whot we can tu further it. But the moest ardent optimist wil not maic boeld tu maintain that this grait object wil be atained suun. It iz a cwestion ov sentyuriz.

Meenwhiel, ar we tu goe on waisting our children'z tiem? Ar we tu let them sufer, and wurc oenli for distant jeneraishonz tu cum? Can we afford tu wait?

Ov this we mai be cwiet shuer: tu acheev sucses we must prezent a yunited frunt; and whatever sceem iz adopted iz bound tu be a compromiez. Let us, then, begin the Nyu Yeer with a braiv spirit and redi tu sacrifices, if need be, our oen predilecshonz for the saic ov the grait cauz that we hav at hart. Then we shal win, and suun.

WHI ISAAC PITMAN FAILD.

Beleeving, then, az we duu, that spelng bi sound iz the oenli truu moed ov spelng, we feel at pees in the ashuerans that tiem wil bring tu it the saim sucses and ecstension which it haz braut tu truuth in uther formz and uther siënsz. Thus thincing, we can wel aford tu be caam under whotever opozishon we mai encounter, noing that so far az our sceemz ar setld in truuth, we hav but tu bied our tiem, and we shal see them reseevd with aclamaishon.—ISAAC PITMAN, 1852.

THAIR ar sed tu be sum maasterful memberz ov the hyuman famili huum no dainjerz afriet and no laiborz tier, and the fraiz slietli auiterd mai be aplied tu Isaac Pitman, in the sens that no dificulti or opozishon ever afrieted him or cauzd him a moement's hezitaishon when he had convinst himself ov the wizdom ov the cors he had desieder on, whiel no amount ov literari toil ever seemd tu weeri him. Not meerli in hiz long and vigorous manhood, but eeven in thoez daiz ov decliening strength when moest men ar content tu rest from the laiborz ov a lieftiem, he stil egzibited the saim dezier for wurc. Hiz step woz az elastic, hiz hand az stedi, and hiz hed az cleer at aiti az it woz twenti yeerz urlier in hiz career.

Born intu an eera ov reform, he advocated reform in everi direcshon, but gradyuali the reform ov English spelng oevershadoed aul els, and for wel oever fifti yeerz he consentraited hiz energiz on this point.

Wun hundred yeerz hav elapst sins hiz burth, seventi sins he started hiz cruusaid—and whot duu we fiend? Nuthing cood hav been a graiter sucses than hiz shorthand! Nuthing cood hav been a graiter failyur than hiz spelng!

A sentenari iz yuzhuali an ocaizhon for glosing oever aul short-cumingz, but Isaac Pitman woz caast in a sturner moeld than moest men, and woz ever redi tu sacrifices himself for hiz object. If hiz sucsesorズ ar enaibld tu advaans wun singl step bi studiing the cauez ov hiz failyur, thai mai feel confident that thai ar acting egzactli az he wood hav dezierd.

The failyur ov the muuvment woz dyu larjli, if not mainli, tu the fact that Isaac Pitman pozest in a marct degree the defects ov hiz cwlitz. Tho he wurct hard for oever haaf a sentyuri, it iz doutful if he ever advocated presiesli the saim reform for fiev consecyutiv yeerz. Nuthing woz aloud tu stand in the wai ov Truuth, but unfortyunitli hiz Truuth woz continyuali taicing up a fresh pozishon. Not content with reform, he woz everlaastingli

reforming reform, so that he never had a staibl platform from which tu preech.

In 1844 the "Fonotipic Jurnal" began tu yuz the nyu forti-leter alfabet. A. J. Ellis had joind forsez with Pitman, and asyumd soel charj ov the "Jurnal" at the end ov 1847. If oenli he had been content tu goe sloe, the entier histori ov speling reform in England miet hav worn a veri diferent aspect. But he woz a yung man in a huri, and within aiteen munths a compleet nervus braicdoun, indyust bi oeverwurc, compeld him tu retier.

With no wun left tu moderait hiz zeel, Pitman rezyumd charj and set tu wurc in urnest. Meni ov the leterz wer chainjd in shaip, thair number woz redyust from forti tu thurti-tu, then increest tu thurti-for, then tu thurti-seven; the funcshonz ov sum leterz wer interchainjd, thai wer increest tu thurti-nien, thai wer redyust tu thurti-ait, and fienali, in 1879, tu thurti-sics. Then it woz discuverd that twenti-thre wer enuf; but wun or tu wer ocaizhonali aded tu this toetal, oenli tu be remuuvd again laiter.

In vain did Ellis and utherz beg him tu pauz and giv the reform tiem tu consolidait. He woz inegzorabl. Truuht, az he sau it at the moement, must be persyud at aul cost; hiz panting disieplz wer hoepleslis outdistanst and never nyu which wai thair leeder wood hed necst. Scuulmaasterz, hu with the graitest eez and sucses had taut the yung tu reed from hiz boocs, found, when fresh wunz wer needed, that the nyu cood not be yuzd with the oeld. Just as the aij ov a roc can be dedyust from the fosilz found thairin, so can eni pasij in ful fonotipi be daited from inturnal evidens oenli.

Hiz jeneral atiyud tordz fonografi woz much the saim, and the ocaizhonal gaps that mai be noetist between the reereformz ov speling jenerali coïnsied with a nyu edishon ov the shorthand. But fonografi woz a plaant ov sturdi groeth, aibl tu stand a good deel ov pruuning and loping. Moroever, the propagaishon ov fonografi cood be carid on at a profit, that ov fonotipi oenli at a los; so thair wer suun meni teecherz ov the former, but fyv indeed ov the later.

The caliedoscopic beecon continyud tu burn bretli at Bath, but at length its worder gruu oeld and hiz asistants becaim tierd ov footing the bil. Fonetic speling woz gradyuiali ousted from aul saiv the tielt ov the "Jurnal," and with hiz deth eeven that lapst.

Nuthing besied remainz. Round the decai
Ov that colosal rec, boundles and bair,
The loen and level sandz strech far awai.

THE PRINTER AND SIMPLIFIED SPELING.

THE up-tu-dait printer haz, ov cors, obzurvd the imens proegres reesentli maid bi the S.S.S., and a fyu hints from wun ov hiz oen craafit mai thairfor not be aultugether unacseptabl. Theez wil taic the form ov noets, az PIONEER spais iz valyuabl.

Glaansing thru the paiez ov this magazeen, the *Printer* wil see that he must order a fyu ecstra "sorts." Thair iz a graiter "run," for instans, on aul the vowelz; but the freecwent recurens ov *z* wil espeshali cach hiz ie—he wil need, let us sai, sics or seven tiemz the ordinari cwontiti ov theez. The *x*, being recwierd oenli for proper naimz, mai be relegaited tu the "uper cais," alongsied the *k*. Then the partishon mai be remuuvd that nou separaits the *x* and *z*, thus maicing the *z* bocs dubl the yuzhual siez. This wil fasilitait compozishon, az the compozitor wil nou priti ofen fiend hiz hand in this bocs. A mor cairful analisis wil doutles reveel the need ov uther sliet reajustments, but theez the intelijent printer wil cwicli discuver for himself.

The *Tiepist* wil duu wel tu practis the rashonal spelng in vyu ov the cuming chainj, for it iz confidentli ecspected that authorz wil veri suun insist that thair "copi" shal reech the printer in that form.

The Lienotiep Operaitor and Compozitor.—The copi being tiepriten, its dificultiz wil not be grait; and, born along bi the fors ov comon-sens spelng and eggilaraited bi the prospect ov revizhualiezing thair muther tung, the operaitor and "comp." wil setl doun tu thair taasc with serpriezing alacriti and ceen deliet.

The *Printerz' Reeder* wil nou discuver that for him the senter ov graviti in the printing wurld haz shifted from the ie tu the eer—that iz tu sai, he wil not hensforth aasc, "Hou duz it looc?" but hiz incwieri wil be, "Hou duz it sound?" In uther wurdz, *Pronunsiaishon* wil be the pivot around which—morning, nuun, and niet—hiz mentaliti wil revolv. Let us hoep that the hithertu somnolent British Academi wil shortli setl dispyuted points for him. Shood he meet with pecyularitiz ov pronunsiaishon in hiz copi, he wil be cairful tu foloe theez, at the saim tiem saifgarding himself bi meecli sujesting (on the marjin ov the pruuf) whot the abuv-menshond august bodi shal hav desieder.

The subsecwent ruuteen proesesez, with aul ov which printerz ar thuroeli familiar, duu not caul for particyular coment.

Sum Caxtonian reederz ov THE PIONEER mai consider the forgoing a tu roezi vyu ov the mater, and mai object that wun haz

omited tu taic fair noet ov the adishonal ecpens. It iz redili conseeded that compozishon wil for a tiem be mor costli; but, with the rapidli increesing fasiliti ov operaitorz, compozitorz, and reederz (men ordinariili swift tu adapt themselvz tu nyu condishonz), the cost ov this ietem must tend tu decrees in the liec proporshon.

Az tu the man in the street, groïng familiariti with the apeerans ov English in its rashonal dres wil cauz him tu forget that he wuns laaft at it. So riets from ecspeeriens an urstwhiel

STAMPLIFTER.

SPELING PROBLEMZ.

WE print sum further opinionz on the vecst cwestion ov the reprezentaishon ov the *oo*, *uu*, *yu* soundz.

So long az we alou *th* tu stand for tu soundz, whi duu we trubl ourselvz with an unfamiliar sien *uu*? I sujest that we yuz *oo* in boeth "good" and "food," espeshali az it iz doutful if the distincshon wil prevail, "room" being aulredi in a transizhonal staij.—H. O. COLEMAN, London.

In mi opinion *eu* iz preferabl tu *yu*. I thinc so partli becauz it loocs beter and partli becauz it is a diphong ov the soundz *ē* and *ū* (in "trūth").—A. GREGORY, Viscount, Sask., Canada.

I liec niether *oo* nor *uu*. Ov the tu I prefur *oo* for the long sound, *u* for the short sound (tu aplie tu "book" and "but"). The eus ov *oo* iz not veri acceptabl in sum wurdz, and *uu* iz veri unfamiliar and wil tend tu tu meni split leterz in MS.—"buum" ("boom"). Az the short *oo* iz not found in meni wurdz, tu reprezent it and short *u* bi *u* wood not creat much ambigeuiti, and iz a reducshon ov a leter in the diegraf.—H. DRUMMOND, Hetton-le-Hole.

I thinc that Mr. Moore'z propoezal tu revurs the S.S. seem ov *uu* and *oo* wuud be an improovment. I liec the *oo* for the long sound, and wurdz liec "moon, boon, baloon, maroon, saloon" luuc neet and plezant. Besiedz, thai ar aulredi familiar tu the man in the street. The long vowelz ar the aristocrats ov the spelng wurd and ar veri conspicuous [*sic*], whiel the short vowelz ar ecstreemli modest. If, thairfor, the aucwerd-luucing *uu* iz alocaited tu the short vowel it wil not be noetisabll.

The *yue* and *yu* seem tu be veri unsatisfactori. Mr. Moore'z propoezal (*yu* and *yoo*) iz veri consistent; but whot a shoc the *yoo* givz. If it iz desieder tu giv up the atemt tu reprezent the long and short soundz ov *yu*, then I am inclid tu faivor Mr. Sykes'z *iu* for *yu*. I liec "niu, fiu, diu" beter than "nyu, fyu, dyu." However, I thinc the form *yu* wuud hav tu be retaind inishali: "Yu, yuth, yus" luuc beter than "iu, iuth, ius." — JOSEPH HOGARTH, Johannesburg, South Africa.

I cwiet agree that *yu* iz corect foneticali, but it iz a form not found (ecxcept in "Yule") in our langwij, and thairfor givz riez tu a good deel ov argyument. Ov cors, I hav red the vairius articlz on this point in THE PIONEER; but sumhou I aulwaiz seem tu cum bac tu the noeshon that *eu* wood be beter. It wood leev a good meni ov our wurdz unchainjd, and, aultho it iz not *cwiet* fonetic, I doen't thinc it wood or cood be misunderstood.—F. M. SEXTON, Kingston-on-Thames.

We hav reseevd a number ov leterz about unstrest vowelz, reprezentng grait divursiti ov vyuz; theez wil apeer in an urli number.

ESAI COMPETISHON.

THE jujez (Mis M. S. Walker, Mr. D. Jones, and Mr. W. Rippmann) report az foloez :

The rezults ov this competitishon hav pruuvd hieli satisfactori, and it haz been no eezi taasc tu aword the priezez. Forti-for esaiz on the edyucaishonal advaantijez ov simplified spelng wer submitied.

In Claas I (Teecherz in Scuulz—Men) thair wer nienteen competitorz. The priez ov fifteen giniz iz aworded tu *Mr. L. Leadley*, 21 Feversham Crescent, York; and a priez ov fiev giniz tu *Mr. F. A. Cavenagh*, King Edward VII School, Lytham. The esaiz ov Mr. E. A. Bagnall, 75 Cromford Road, Wandsworth, S.W.; Mr. R. Cairns, Elgin Academy; Mr. C. G. L. du Cann, 21 Henshall Street, Chester; Mr. C. H. Hardingham, St. George's School, Harpenden; Mr. J. H. Jagger, Royal High School, Edinburgh; Mr. J. Michell, Higher Elementary School, Devonport; Mr. Ezra Sykes, 51 Headingley Avenue, Leeds; and Mr. A. R. Williams, 155 Lansdowne Road, Worcester, ar wurthi ov speshal comendashon.

In Claas II (Teecherz in Scuulz—Wimen) thair wer oenli fiev competitorz. The priez ov fifteen giniz iz aworded tu *Mis Susan Fillips*, 139 Box, Metuchen, New Jersey, U.S.A.

In Claas III (Non-Teecherz) thair wer twenti competitorz. The priez ov fifteen giniz iz aworded tu *Mis Hilda Wilson*, 318 28th Street West, Saskatoon, Sask.; and a priez ov fiev giniz tu *Mr. F. L. Sargent*, 27 Everett Street, Cambridge, Mass. The esaiz bi Mr. A. Brodrick, 77 Mount Road, Higher Tranmere, Birkenhead; Dr. Crichton, Castleton, Ontario; Rev. H. Hodder, Wesley Villa, Pontefract; and Mr. F. M. Sexton, Warwick Lodge, Hampton Wick, ar wurthi ov speshal comendaishon.

NOETS AND NYUZ.

MESSRS. SELFRIDGE hav aulmoest lifted advertiezing intu the relm ov literaturyur. Everi eveneing the London paiperz contain a sparcling colum "reflecting the polisiz, prinsiplz, and opinionz ov this Hous ov Biznes upon vairius points ov public interest." An apeel for the "scraping" ov iedeaz az wel az masheeneri caut the ie the uther niet. "Let Comers hav a yunivursal scraping campain. . . . Haz enibodi ever met a reali nyu iidea and not considerd it 'imposibl' and 'mad' at furst? Yet the amount ov madnes that haz becum sanit i zciet remarcabl. . . . Real progres in the wurd hav aulwaiz been preseeded bi grait atension tu the art ov scraping." This iz wizdom wel esprest. We turn tu an oeld lumbering loecomotiv with a feeling ov piti for our paishent forfaatherz. When wuns the current spelng iz "script" the wurd wil wunder houever we got along with it.

THE jeenial "S. L. H." ("Sub Rosa"), speeing on "The English Character" the uther dai, twited his cuntrimen with dismissing everi nyu staitment az "a lie" and laibeling pioneerz az "crancs" and "fadists." "Nevertheles. 'crancs' and 'fadists' hav dun mor in the histori ov the wrold than aul the clever feloez poot together." An interesting studi it iz tu traiz the pedigreez ov the reformz that hav cum tu adorn our public lief. At the begining yu fiend—a pilori.

"I DEZIER tu becum an anyual member ov yur ecselent Sosieti, with the objects ov which I hartili sympathiez. Shood yur sceem (or wun similar) ultimil be adopted bi our wrold-wied Empier, it wil not oenli tend tu maic much eezier the acwizishon ov the langwij bi forinerz, but it wil also (nesesarili and obviusli) be a grait buun tu the vaast armi ov authorz, editorz, compozitorz, and printerz' reederz. Indeed, the ocyupaishon ov the laast-naimd foec (ov huum yur prezent corespondent iz wun) wil be seeriusli thretend, inazmuchi az thair nou indispensabl nolej ov 'speling' wil no longer be recwierd." This iz a mesij direct from the printing hous, and, tu cwoet from a traid jurnal, the printer iz the real autocrat ov speling.

THE abuv leter iz printed egzactli az reseevd, speling and aul. The polisi ov THE PIONEER in regard tu cwoataishonz iz tu poot them everi wun intu rashedal speling. The habit ov scolarz iz tu reprodyus the speling ov the authorz thai cwoet. It iz a habit that is duing much tu shaic the sanctiti in which prezenter dai orthografi iz sed tu be enshriend. Whi duu we in theez paiez taic a diferten cors? Becauz wun main mishon ov THE PIONEER iz tu ween the public ie from oeld tu nyu formz ov speling. That cood not be so wel efected if we did not sai, az in Famili Coech, "Aul chainj!" Aafter aul, we ar not duing enithing mor than woz dun tu Shakespeare when his spelingz wer transliteraited intu Dr. Johnson'z.

"TIM," incwierd Mr. Riley, glaansing up oever the dor ov the poest-ofis, "whot iz the meening ov thoez leterz MDCCXCVIII?" "Thai meen aiteen hundred and nienti-ait." "Tim, duzn't it striec yu that thai ar cariing this speling reform entierli tu far?" We giv the stori from the "Fourth Estate," a New York paiper.

"NEEREST staishon: Maze Hill, S.E.C.R." "A mieti maiz and cwiet without a plan," cwoets Mr. Archer ov the curent speling.

"THAT a boi can goe thru a big public scuul and paas an eggaminaishon in mathematics, French, histori, and the liec, and yet not noe hou tu spel his oen langwij or riet properli shoez that sumthing iz amis." Thai ar the wurdz ov an Armie coech. The "sumthing amis" we ar trieng tu get rietet. In the speling iz the fault, not in boi or scuul.

"MOEST cyurius ov aul iz the fait ov the wurd 'fault.' In O.F. and M.E. it iz aulwaiz *faute*; but the sicsteenth sentyuri turnd it intu F. *faulte*, E. 'fault' bi the insurshon ov *l*. For aul that, the *l* ofen remaind myut, so that eeiven az lait az the tiem ov Pope it woz stil myut for him, az iz shoen bi his rieming it with 'ought,' with 'thought,' and with 'taught.' But the persistent prezenter shon ov the leter *l* tu the ie haz prevaild at laast, and we nou invairiabli sound it in English, whielst in French it haz becum *faute* wuns mor. The object, no dout, woz tu inform us that the F. *faute* iz ultimil deriev'd from Latin *fallere*; but this duz not seem so far beyond the scoop ov hyuman intelijens that so much painz need hav been taicen tu record the discuveri." (The lait Prof. Skeat.)

THE South Indian Braanch continyuz tu maic ecselent proegres. On the 18th ov laast munth Mr. Daniel Jones, M.A., a member ov Comiti, gav a lectyur on

speling reform in the Senit Hous ov the Madras Yunivursiti. The lectyur woz graitli apreeshiaited and wil hav an inflooen far beyond the imeediit audiens. "Several nyu memberz hav joind," riets Prof. Mark Hunter, "includiing Sur V. C. Desika Charry, Kt., a leeding member ov the Indian comyuniti. . . . A good number ov edyucaishonal peopl from different parts ov the Prezidensi wer in Madras for the purpos ov atending Mr. Jones'z lectyurz on fonetics, and theez mai be ecpected tu help the cauz when thai return tu thair several staishonz." So the torchez ar handed on tu burn til daibraic.

IN distant parts ov the Empier the vois ov the reformer iz hurd. Mis A. Woodhouse gaiv a paiper on the subject ov nyu speling at a meeting ov the Otago Instityut, New Zealand, in "the faul" ov laast yeer. "New Zealand," sez Mr. Coupland Harding, ov Wellington, "haz led the wurld in mor than wun reform. Whi not in reformd speling?" A leter from the Director ov Edyucaishon in Melbourne faulz in for aproeprit menshon heer. Mr. Tate riets: "It iz veri gratifiing tu me that the smaul modicum ov reform maid heer meets with yur aproprial. Az yu mai be awair, the simplificaishonz adopted heer cauzd much loecal discusshon and sum advers critisizm. But the Department haz no intenshon ov retraising its steps. . . . Sum atemts hav been maid heer tu form a loecal braanch ov yur Sosieti. I hoep that we shal suun sucseed in this." Mr. Tate iz wun ov the braiest aposlz ov the nyu order.

AT the Children'z Welfair Egzbibishon at Olympia our staul ov literatury attracted much noetis. "Simplified Speling: the Children'z Magna Charta"; "Simplified Speling iz Speling without Teerz;" theez wer tu placardz that maid vizitorz pauz. We must never rest until that Magna Charta iz siend by Hiz Majesti'z oen hand.

"WHOT haz struc me moest in lurning Dutch iz the simplisiti ov its speling. I meen the reformd speling which is nou being yuzd bi moest ov the scuulz in South Africa. . . . My muther tung, bi the wai, iz not English, but Gaelic, and I hav not forgoten the tiem and trubl it haz taicen me tu lurn English orthodocs speling." The rieter livz in Johannesburg. If Britain cood be transported tu South Africa for a yeer tu see the rais between Simplified Dutch and Complicated English, everi man wood return hoem a convinst reformer.

"IN laast munth's PIONEER," riets Mr. Shield, ov Liverpool, "iz a sujestion from Mr. Horsfall that the Sosieti shood preapir and sel tu the memberz india-ruber stamps . . . and that the Sosieti shood get promisez from its memberz tu riet at leest wun leter a weec in the nyu speling. . . . Az suun az I joind the Sosieti, in 1908, I had such a stamp maid for me and I yuzd it. Sins the Sosieti haz isyud the card shoing the S.S. in bref and the S.S. laibel I hav seest yuzing the stamp, az I aulwaiz attach tu mi leterz iether the card or the laibel or boeth. I am fuli in acord with the second part ov Mr. Horsfall'z sujestion, and wood goe farther and sujest that the memberz shood aul be aasct tu yuz the nyu speling in aul thair prieveit leterz. If everi member nyu that hiz 1,000 feloe-memberz wer yuzing the nyu stiel, he wood feel much encurijd in hiz yus ov it. Dyuring laast yeer I obtaind sics or seven nyu memberz, and I hoep tu obtain az meni—and mor—this yeer. If eech ov our 1,000-memberz obtaind seven nyu memberz this yeer, we shhood be 8,000 strong. I thinc it miet be maid a subject ov interest tu the memberz if thai vied with wun another in this wai." This leter iz its oen apeel.

WE welcum the "Simplified Spelling Bulletin," the organ ov The Simplified Speling Bord ov America, for Desember. Heer iz a stori cwoeted from a nyuz-paiper: "Joel Chandler Harris, the author ov 'Uncle Remus,' woz at hiz desc wun niet when an oeld-tiem reporter looc't oever and sed: 'Joe, hou duu yu spel "graphic"? With wun f or tu?' 'Wel,' sed the ciendli Uncle Remus, hu woz

tu jentl tu hurt eeven a comon ajective, 'if yu ar going tu yuz eni, Bill, I ges yu miet az wel goe the limit.'

MR. MAURICE SEXTON, ov Kingston-on-Thames, roet in "Esperanto" an articl on consistent spelng ov English. Translaishonz apeerd in the German paiperz. Mor liet, mor liet iz whot we wont. Whairever Mr. Sexton can liet a candl he duz it. It iz the oenli wai tu dispel the darcnes that prevailz in regard tu spelng and its sanctitiz.

"FROM the remarcs ov meni, thai wood seem tu thinc that rieting caim furst (in the giez ov English spelng, perhaps !) and langwij aafterwerdz."

IT woz a speshal plezher tu see on the Nyu Yeer'z Onorz List the naim ov Sur J. K. Caird, Bart., wun ov Dundee'z moest prominent sitizenz, and we ad sinseer congratulyaishonz. Sur J. K. Caird haz taicen an interest in spelng reform ever sins the daiz ov Sur Isaac Pitman. We welcum intu membership this munth Mr. Alfred and Mr. Ernest Pitman, the sunz ov that grait man huuz sentenari iz selebraited this yeer. A Manchester paiper wuns sed ov his sistern ov shorthand that it woz uterli impracticabl ! Faather Tiem must hoeld his siedz with laafter !
