




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
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OV SIMPLIFIED SPELING.



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DUU YUR BEST.

OUR membership haz nou reecht neerli fifteen hundred—a result which iz veri gratifiing. We hav maid a good start. Much remainz tu be dun.

We aut tu hav fiev thouzand memberz bi the end ov the yeer. We can atain that number if yu wil help.

Hav yu dun sumthing tu help the cauz ov rashonal speling ?

Yu beleev in it yurself—hou meni hav yu wun oever ? Yu wish our muuvment sucses ; ar yu meerli wishing, not duing ?

We miet hav cloes on fiev thouzand memberz in a munth if everi member obtaind tuu nyu wunz. That shood not be dificult. It iz eezi tu convins intelijent men and wimen. Moest peopl hav never seeriusli thaut about the cwestion. It iz yur dyuti tu tauc tu them about the advaantijez ov a rashonal speling.

Thai wil urj the yuzhyual objecshonz. We noe them aul. Riet tu the Secretari (44 Great Russell Street, London, W.C.) and he wil suplie yu with literatyur. We hav aanserz tu aul the comon objecshonz, in printed form—boeth in the oeld and in the simplified speling.

If in yur atacs on indiferens and prejoodis yu fiend weec points in yur armor, strengthen them. Lurn sumthing about the histori ov the convenshonal speling—yur oponents ar ignorant ov it, or els thai wood not opoez.

Lurn sumthing about the soundz ov the muther tung. Studi yur oen speech and that ov uther edyucaited peopl. Pai atenshon tu loecal dialects. In fiev yeerz' tiem the teecher ov English hu noeza no fonetics wil be a cyurius servieval ; in fifteen yeerz' tiem no chield wil leev scuul without having lurnt tu yuz standerd speech.

Consider the spelng ov THE PIONEER ; duz it in surtin deetailz difer from yur oen speech ? Let us heer about it; but aulwaiz distingwisch whot yu (and uther edyucaited peopl liec yu) reali sai, and whot yu thinc wun aut tu sai. Be cairful tu estimait whether yu ar alouing the convenshonal spelng tu inflooens yur iedeaz about the spoeцен langwij. Duu yu pronouns the *d* in "handkerchief," the *t* in "castle, often, glisten," the *p* in "cupboard, raspberry, empty," and hou duu yu pronouns the *s* in "gooseberry, houses, news, newspaper"? Thair ar hundredz ov cwestionz liec theez yu mai aasc yurself, and wil be the beter for aascng.

Duu not rest content with reeding our spelng : riet it. Yu wil fiend it ful ov interest az an ecsersiez. Let yur pyupilz reed it and riet it ; thai wil lurn much that iz valyuabl.

Yuz it in yur prievait corespondens, and never miend if at furst yu maic slips. Enithing iz beter than the prezent spelng. Rijid yuniformiti iz ov secondari importans. If yu doen't liec "aanser," spel it "anser." The esenshal thing iz that yu shood shoe az meni peopl az possibl that yu, an edyucaited man or wooman, hav caast doun the iedol, that for yu the oeld spelng haz no glamor, that yu denie its fansid claimz tu respect.

Join activli in the campain. Let yur wochwurd be : Cleer speech and cleen spelng ! We hav maid a good start, and if we aul duu our best we shal suun render our langwij byutiful and urn the gratityud ov countles jeneraishonz.

SIMPLIFIED SPELING IN AMERICA.

THE Simplified Speling Bord ov America haz just isyud its "Forth List ov Simplified Spelingz." From the copi we hav reseevd we taic the brefe histori ov preevius lists. The furst (the famus Thre Hundred Wurdz) woz publisht in 1906. It woz a selecshon ov simpler formz aulredi in good yus, with the authoriti ov the thre prinsipal American dicshonariz behiend them. The Second List (Janyuari 28, 1908) containd a number ov spelngz that miet be cauld "inovaishonz." But the formz wer strictli in accord with egzisting ruulz and analogiz ov English spelng, and wer for the moest part restoraishonz ov simplificaishonz formerli in hie literari yus.

The wied acseptans ov the Thre Hundred Wurdz and ov the Second List maid it dezierabl tu publish a mor ecstensiv list, in-

cluunding claasez ov wurdz in which regyulaishon woz much demaanded and cood not be defurd. The Thurd List caim intu being, thairfor, on Janyuari 25, 1909. The thre lists wer poot together in wun Alfabetic List and publisht March 6, 1909.

Bi the Forth List sum strieing chainjez ar maid—"draught, laugh, laughter," ets., becum "draft, laf, lafter," ets.; the inishal g in wurdz ov the "gnat" claas iz dropt—but, for the moest part, az the proëm ov the Ecsecyutiv Comiti sez, thai ar chainjez that moest pursonz hav recogniezd az at leest theoreticali dezierabl.

An apeel iz maid tu consider raather the simplisiti, economi, regyulariti, and reezon which ar behiend the chainjez, than tu be ofended bi the od apeerans. "In publishing this Forth List, the Simplified Speling Bord and its Adviezori Counsil, and the meni thouzand profesorz, teecherz, syuperintendents, clurjimen, lauyerz, fizishanz, and uther suporterz for huum thai speec, declar thair dezier tu bring about an impruuvmment in English speling, in this wai, in theez wurdz, heer and nou. Meni ov theez inflooenshal pursonz wil be yuzing theez nyu spelingz the rest ov thair lievz."

In the List the simplificaishonz aulredi adopted bi our Sosieti ar indicaited bi the leterz "S.S.S." We regret we hav not spais tu set forth mor than a fyu spesimen wurdz from the List, but we sinseerli congratulyulait our American frendz on this ecselent step forwerd.

In wurdz ov the "barrack" tiep whair -ck iz pronounst *c*, aafter an unstrest vouel, the *k* iz tu be dropt, foloing the fashon ov our forbairz, hu roet "almanac," ets. *H* iz tu be dropt from *ch* wurdz—e.g. "cord" for "chord," and so on. "Blew," and similar wurdz, becumz "blu"; az for the inflecshonz: (1) -ewed becumz -ued; (2) -ews becumz -ues—"brues," ets. *E* iz dropt from wurdz which contain -ey unstrest, and pronounst liec short fienal -y—e.g. "jurny" for "journey." Wurdz ov tu *l*'z aafter a short strest vouel—"bell, doll," ets.—nou luuz an *l*. It iz ecsplained that wurdz ov this claas wer wuns *normali* speld with singl -*l*. But becauz ov the grait freecwensi ov *ll* in French and in Latin, it woz aulwaiz freecwent in English, and it fiinali prevaild oever the normal English speling -*l*. The sufics -ous iz redyust tu -us; -ow pronounst liec *o*, long (*o*) or short (*o*), tu -o—e.g. "blow" tu "blo," "billow" tu "billo," ets. The sufics -some, when pronounst liec -sum, iz so riten; the silent *h* in "rhetoric" and uther wurdz iz dropt; the *w* iz decapitaited from "wrap" and cindred wurdz; but theez ar oenli a fyu ov the tipical chainjez in a moest important and sujetiv list which bringz intu cloeser agreement the tuu sosietiz which the Atlantic diviedz.

SIMPLIFIED SPELING IN THE CLAASROOM.

[Mr. Percy W. Long, ov Harvard Yunivursiti, Secretari ov the American Dialect Sosieti, haz ciendli sent us this articl, which we hav transcribd intu S.S., acording tu our yuzhyual practis, and at his recwest.]

WUN feetyur ov the publicaishonz ov the Simplified Speling Sosieti which haz freecwentli pruuvd interesting tu me az an American iz its testimoni tu surtin diferensez between its speech and that which I am acustomd tu heer in the north-eestern Yunitied Staits. Thus, tu cwoet from the oepening lienz ov *The Star*: "It woz on the furst dai ov the nyu yeer that the anounsmant woz maid, aulmoest simultainiusli from thre obzurvatoriz . . ." Normali, I thinc, a Bostonian wood sai "wuz, uv, nuu, siemultainiusli, three, and frum." We mor freecwentli yuz ~~streſt~~ "tuu" (whair THE PIONEER yuzez unstrest "tu") befor the infinitiv. We sai "sugjest," not "suject"; "pasing," not "paasing"; "anser," not "aanser" (if I mai ignor "scuulmarmz"); and aulwaiz "esthetic, esthetisizm" raather than "eesthetic, eesthetisizm."

[It mai be wel tu point out parentheticali that "wuz, uv, frum"—in which *u* reprezentz the voecal murmer—is our pronunsiaishon tuu, in unstrest silablz. In the cais ov wurdz which hav strong az wel az weec formz, it iz our practis tu spel them yuniformli according tu the soundz ov the strong formz. Bi "thre" we meen "three"; it iz meerli a shortening for economi, az in "be, we, me." "Pasing" and "anser" ar comon in sum parts ov England, az our corespondents freecwentli remiend us; but in cairful public speicing it iz not hurd, tho sum prodyus a sound haafwai between *a* and *aa*, which sum teecherz ov elocuyushon recomend.]

This list iz pyurli cazyual, and I ofer it but az an indicaishon ov the wai in which Simplified Speling maics for a basis ov considering the standerdiezaishon ov speech. I thinc it miet profitabli be yuzd for this purpos in the claasruum, and regard such yus ov it az an entering wej which miet efectivli and without reproech be emploid bi memberz ov the Sosieti. Surtinli no simpler alfabet oferz for elementari wurc in fonetics.

Thus it shood pruuv interesting and instructiv tu a claas engaijd eeiven insidentalni in studiing the histori ov the English langwij tu reed a breef seerieez ov pasijez in Simplified Speling, choezen from such authorz az Chaucer, Shakespeare, Pope, and Wordsworth—and perhaps aulso from Malory, Bacon, Swift, and Thackeray—so

riten az tu reprezent the historical pronunsiaishonz. Fyu teecherz nou cair tu indicait this important faiz ov the development ov langwij further than tu stait the fact mor or les cazyuali: such a pamphlet wood render the ecsersiez not oenli mor presies and mor yunivursali aplicabl, it wood plaisir the facts clearerli and permanentli befor the styudent.

Ov much wieder aplicaishon iz the posibl yus ov Simplified Speling az an aid in teaching the standerdiezaishon ov speech. Aafter the aij ov claasroom instrucshon orali wurd bi wurd az the styudent chaanseztu mispronouns, corecshonz occur les and les freecwentli; and the erorz ariezing from inflooensiz outsied the claasroom recwier sum efectiv chec. The lists ov wurdz deziend heer for this purpos—hou flat and teedius thai ar! But miet not pasijez ov instructiv reeding selected or compoed so az tu incluud theez veri wurdz at wuns instruct and insidental corect seeriusli folti pronunsiaishon? The ie iz inevitabli arrested bi the speling which duz not accord with the sound.

In America, at leest, I thinc thair wood be a further interest in pamphlets dezienedli ilustraiting differensez in English az it iz nou specen in England, America, South Africa, India, and Australia; and I am incliend tu thinc that ilustraishonz ov prominent dialects wood pruuve an acceptabl adishon. Cwestionz consurning pronunsiaishon yuzhyuali evoec interest in our claasez. Our styudents ceenli relish evidens ov provinshalizm in thair clasmatis. And the yus ov such a pamphlet iz defensibl az a disiplin in the apreesiaishon ov literatur, preparing the styudent tu recogniez in authorz thair corect or folti portraial ov speech characteristics.

From the point ov vyu ov speling reform I can see from such yusez a distinct advaantij in the braicing doun ov much opozishon which ariezez soelli from ignorans ov the advaantijez ov fonetic speling and from prejoodis against the looc ov a thing becauz it iz unfamiliar. Thair miet reezonabli be opozishon tu eni yus ov such tecsts dyuring the peeriod in which the chield iz being taut our dicshonari spelingz. But this peeriod mai be regarded az for practical purposez paast when the styudent haz reechecht hiz teenz. No dout meni teecherz wil heer suspect a woolf in sheep's cloething. But utherz, it mai be hoept, tho thai wood shrinc from adopting Simplified Speling for ordinari yus, wil consent thus tu familiarizez themselvz and thair claasez with the sistem. It iz but the yus ov rashonaliezd speling which we yunivursali maic when we consult the indicaishonz ov pronunsiaishon in our dicshonariz.

LOECOMOESHON : FURTHER PARALELZ.

LAAT munth we gav a striecing pictyur ov the oposizhon leveld against the introducshon ov gas lieting. The foloing further paralelz ar interesting—and amyuzing. Tiem haz a wai ov meeting out a Nemesis ov laafer tu theoz hu biendli opoezd reform. Thair iz a stori ov a Somerset farmer hu wood hav nuthing tu duu with the electric liet—becauz "the Lord gaiv darcnes, and it woz temting providens tu maic it les"! In meni miendz the oeld iedea prevailz that the current spelng iz eecwali heven-sent, and tu seec tu reform it iz tu wajj wor with the godz.

In his *Lief of George Stephenson* Dr. Smiles sez: "Pamflets wer riten and nyuspaiperz wer hierz tu reviel the railwai. It woz declarid that its formaishon wood prevent couz graizing and henz laiing. The poizond air from the loecomoetivz wood cil burdz az thai fluu oever them, and render the prezervaishon ov fezants and foseez no longer possibl. Housholderz ajoining the projected lien wer toeld that thair houzez wood be burnt up bi the fier throen from the enjin chinmiz, whiel the air around wood be poluuted bi cloudz ov smoec. Thair wood no longer be eni yus for horsez, and, if railwaiz ecstended, the speeshiz wood becum ecstingwisht and oets and hai unsailabl comoditiz. Traveling bi roed wood be ruind. Boilerz wood burst and bloe pasenjerz tu atomz. But thair woz aulwaiz this consolaishon tu wiend up with—that the wait ov the loecomoetiv wood compleetli prevent its muoving, and the railwaiz, if maid, cood never be wurct bi steem pouer!"

Eeven William Brougham, hu woz counsel for the promoeterz, bluntli toeld George Stephenson, at wun ov the preliminari consultaishonz, that if he boested so much about the speed ov his enjin befor the Comiti, he wood "inevitabli dam the hoel thing, and be himself regarded az a mainiac fit for Bedlam."

Laast sumer the sentenari ov Bell, inventor ov steemships, woz selebraited on the Clyde. The "Glasgow Herald" publisht an oeld leter, riten bi a clurjiman about 1820, from which we ecstract the foloing: "In a vilij ajaisent tu that siti, the smoec ov huuz abominaishonz goëth up tu Heven az a thic cloud, and ov huuz wicednes yourself woz witnes in our daiz at the Colej thair—in Helensburgh, tu wit—thair dwelt a man ov scil in the art ov Enjineer. He being puft up with pried ov his abilitiz thairin did laitli Conseev a Ship tu goe upon the wauterz, not bi dint ov the Cleen Windz ov the Air az ordaind bi God, but bi meenz ov fier which isyud from the bouelz thairov. In this Devies the Man did sail upon the wauterz ov the River Clyde in Pried and hienes ov Hart, tu the grait scandal ov pius miendz, but aulso tu the Hyuj Gratificaishon ov the Man and theoz hu wer with him. But, not content tu ceep his Unluci Deviese in the seen ov thair Consephon, this Man must needz sail or propel his Creetyur eeven unto Grinan itself, neer tu which plaisir yur Survant laiborz in the Gospel boeth in the Gaelic and English. And so tu Fort-William, with much efyzuhon ov stincing vaipor and grait hurt tu the liec-miended ov this Congregaishon and ov the Christian Conshens ov the Peopl ov Argyll, the Isles, and eeven Inverness."

Theez transcripts tel thair oen tail.

THE BORD OV EDYUCAISHON AND SPELING.

PERMISHON tu yuz fonetic tecsts in teeching reeding tu Standardz I in priemari scuulz woz given bi the Bord ov Edyucaishon in 1893. The individyuual egzaminaishon bi H.M. Inspectorz ov children atending theez scuulz haz nou seest, and with it the spesific purpos for which permishon tu yuz fonetic tecsts woz given. The Bord no longer prescrieb eni yuniform curicyulum; the responsibiliiti rests priemarili with the Loecal Edyucaishon Authoritiz. We hav the hiest authoriti for staiting that shood eni Loecal Edyucaishon Authoriti wish tu introdyus eni reformz in spelng intu the curicyulum ov its scuulz, the propoezal wood hav the Bord'z cairful consideraishon. On the ground ov impruuving pronunsiaishon in the scuulz, if for nuthing els, a Loecal Authoriti miet wel begin an ecsperiment with our sceem.

PRONUNSIAISHON PROBLEMZ.

UR AND ER.

IN our laast number (pajj 41) we gaiv a number ov wurdz in which the oeld spelng haz *er*, *err*, *erre*, *ear*, *ir*, *irre*, *or*, *ur*, *urre*, for aul ov which we riet *ur* in S.S.

Mr. J. Blaikie sendz us the foloing leter:—

"I wish tu riet tu protest in the strongest possibl termz agenst the spelng *ur* whair the sound iz *er* accoding tu the yusajj ov edyucaited peopl in everi part ov the British relm and dependensiz except a part ov London and the South ov England. It seemz tu me tu spel 'refer' *r-e-f-u-r* iz tu encuraij a sluvlenli mistaik in pronunsiaishon. If the *fur* on mi coetsleevz iz fraid, I send it tu be *refurd*. I sertainli prefer tu spel : 'refer aver, er, gerdl, herd, deter, fern, cernel, lern, disern, stern, yern, erth, berth, derth, gerth, merth, hers, dispers, ters, vers, berch, perch, serch, erl, erli, gerl, perl' ('purl' iz cwiet another thing); and it seemz tu me that the graitest possibl hindrans tu the spelng reform cumz from the atemt tu impoez suthern mispronunsiaishonz on the inhabitants ov Scotland, Ireland, and the North ov England, hu hav retaind the corect pronunsiaishon."

Nou let us turn tu the historianz ov the langwij, and see hou thai record the facts.

Sweet, in his *New English Grammar*, Part I, § 868, sez: "In Second Modern English (*i.e.*, seventeenth sentyuri) *er*, *ir*, *ur* caim tu be leveld under (*ər*) or (*ər*), az in 'her, bird, fur, turn.' Laiter (*ər*) paast intu (*əə*)"—*i.e.*, long (*ə*), which we riet *ur* in S.S.

Skeat, in his *Principles of English Etymology*, Second Series, § 59 (4), sez: "The tril [*r*] iz comonli lost when *r* iz foloed bi a consonant or nou endz a wurd. In such a cais the regyular development iz intu the obscyur sound (*əə*), az in 'herd, bird, surd.'

Jespersen, in his *Modern English Grammar*, deelz in deetaiil with the prezent coalesens ov *ir* in "birth" ("myrtle"), ov *ur* in "cur" ("word, journey"), and ov *er* in "herd" ("heard, earl"). The first tuu becam iedentical from about 1600, but wer for sum tiem cept apart from the thurd, tho the soundz

tended tordz confyuzhon at an urli dait. Shakespeare riemz "first—accurst, stir—incur," whiel *er* and *ur* duu not az a ruul riem tugether. From Gabrielson, *Rime as a Criterion of the Pronunciation of Spenser, Pope, Byron, and Swinburne*, we lurn that Pope riemz "birth—earth, first—worst, learn—turn, earth—worth"; Byron: "bird—heard, girl—earl, third—absurd, erred—absurd, early—surly, earn—burn, verse—curse, earth—worth, girl—pearl—curl, mirth—earth—worth; Swinburne: "girl—pearl—curl, first—wurst, term—worm, fern—burn, verge—surge."

We turn tu wures which reprezent speech not yuzhyuali deaignated az standerd English. Lloyd, in his *Northern English*, yuzes the saim sien tu indicait the italisiezd part ov "earth, mercy, concern, converse, refer, first, thirst, word, worship, church, nurture."

A referens tu Wright's *English Dialect Grammar* shoez that meni pronun-siaishon ov the soundz in cwestion ar tu be found. Thus the *ear* ov "earth" iz pronounst in sum forti waiz in the British Ielz; but this incluudz "unedu-cated" speech.

Grant, in his reesentli publishit *Pronunciation of English in Scotland*, sez that moest Scottish speecerz stil yuz the mid-front lacs vowel (similar tu *a* in "Mary") befor *r* or *r* + consonant, as in "confer, fern"; uthertz yuz a vowel intermeediat between that and (ə).

Tu the abuv evidens mai be aded the practis ov our actorz and ov public speecerz jenerali, hu (we beleev) rairli giv tu such wurdz az "fern, refer" the pronunsiaishon prefurd (or prefaird) bi Mr. Blaikie, and descriebd bi him az aulmoest yunivursal (or yunivairsal) among edyucaited speecerz in the British relm. We ar incliend tu beleev that, in point ov fact, a veri smaul mienoriti yuz this pronunsiaishon; and we hav hund a number ov speecerz oriijinali hailing from Scotland hu hav given it up. Az for the "dependensiz," it iz nyu tu us that the Scottish pronunsiaishon iz jeneral thair.

UNSTREST SILABLZ.

Mr. Lewis Thompson riets:

"It iz beter tu be reproecht az pedantic, or arcaic, or eeven afected, than tu be sluvenli in speech. Aimen tu Mr. S. O'Dwyer [laast number, paiz 35, footnoet]—mor pouer tu his elboe; his naim sujest the Emerald Iel: we noe that good English iz spoecen thair—a 'halfpenny' iz cauld a 'half-penny,' not a 'haipni,' az it iz on this sied ov St. George'z Chanel . . . If yu and I wer tu meet, yu wood probabli fiend that I miesel sai 'langwij' or 'langwei.' Doubles I fiend the saim dificulti that puur Mr. Bridges did [laast number, paiz 36] in living up tu mi iidealz. But duu not let uz wontonli destroi iidealz. Let us recogniez that the wurd reali iz 'languäge.'"

Iz thair no goelden meen? Must we be iether pedantic or sluvenli? And whot iz the good ov an iideal if we ar content tu preech and refrain from practising? Laastli: iz it reali "languäge"?

It yust tu be, in Midl English, "langage" with the second silabl pronounst az in French. The *u* crept in becauz it occurz in Latin *lingua*: aafter a tiem, it caim tu be pronounst. It woz az much a pedantri az the *b* in "debt" or the *c* in "perfect." Everibodi nou pronounsez the *u*. The form without *u* is recorded az servieving so lait az 1701.

But what about the -age?

The authorz ov the *Concise Oxford Dictionary* (aulso authorz ov *The King's English*) sai: "The pleantz fieshon that 'cottage' iz pronounst 'kötäj,' tho stil prevalent in dicshonariz, haz perhaps never deseevd eniwun"; and thai descrieb it az a rezult ov the undyu inflooenz ov speling.

"Language," liec "image" and "carriage," wuns had the acsent on the second silabl. When it woz shifted tu the furst, the vowel ov the second silabl woz redyust. This iz entierli in acordans with the normal development ov English; similarli "bataile" haz becum "batl," and "vicaire" "vicar." Whether enibodi in the paast ever pronounst "langwaj" iz doubtful; but if we asym this form and adopt it, thair iz just az much reezon for returning tu "batail."

Az suun az the speling iz divisorst from the spoecen langwij it tendz tu afect the later advursli. It shood record soundz, not creatit them or chainj them. A fonetic speling haz a conservativ tendensi; a speling liec ourz fasilitaits chainj. "Langwij" or "langwej" iz az satisfactori a development az "batl"; edyucaited speecerz redyus the vowel ov the second silabl, and it seemz tu us no gain whot-ever tu the langwij tu introdyus a form that never woz, simpli becauz in our reched spelng "age," which wuns spelt *aaj*, nou aulso spelz *aij*, in streest silablz.

If a considerabl number ov edyucaited speecerz hav adopted "langwaj" in thair oen speech, it wil be a diferent mater: at prezent eeven Mr. Bridges and Mr. Thompson ar content (and wiezli) with the pronunsiaishon comon amung edyucaited speecerz, which can on that account not be cauld sluvenli.

"E.L.P." riets:

"Anent THE PIONEER'z referens tu the 'Times' yus ov 'tire' for 'tyre,' hav yu noetist 'jewelry' in its columz, az in thoez ov the 'Nineteenth Century,' 'Daily News,' and uther peeriodicalz; aulso 'quartet,' 'quintet,' ets., tu march with 'duet'; and 'stanch' for 'staunch'—but whi not aulso 'lanch,' a spelng yuzd bi Walter Scott, mor fonetic and neerer the French *lancer*?"

"'Program' and 'jail' ar nou in jeneral yus, and 'tho' iz comon in corespondens. Haz eni English jurnal the curij tu reviev the Oeld English 'plow,' emploid everiwhair in America? Tu syuperseed an oeld and fonetic spelng bi wun clumzier and unfonetic, huuz oenli sancshon iz tu recaul a long ecstinct guteral sound, seemz an unacountabl pees ov foli."

We print this leter under "Pronunsiaishon Problemz" becauz it raizez the cwestion ov the *-aun-* wurdz. "E.L.P." prounseuz "launch" and "staunch" with the saim vowel az "aunt." The jeneral tendensi amung edyucaited speecerz apeez tu be tu giv aul theez wurdz (ecsept "aunt") the sound ov *au*, not ov *aa*. Our reederz mai be interested in deturmining thair oen pronunsiaishon ov "daunt, gaunt, gauntlet, haunch, haunt, jaundice, jaunt, laundry, paunch."

"THE pronunsiaishon ov 'centenary' shood be deturmind bi the analoji ov English wurdz ov a similaar formaishon. Thair iz no ruul ov mor jeneral aplicaision than that wurdz ov for silablz ending in *-ary*, *-ory*, thro the ascent bac tu the furst silabl, az in 'nécessairy, tributary,' ets. The ruul duz not hoeld in caisez liec 'infirmary, satisfactory,' ets., whair the stres must nesesarili lie on the ruut silabl. I hav hurd ov a wel-noen public man [Lord Rosebery] speeing ov 'senteenari,' but I thinc veri fyu pursonz pronouns it in this wai. The custom seemz tu be iether 'céntenary' or 'centenary.' It wil, no dout, gradyuiali taic its plais with aul uthier wurdz ending in *-ary*, ov which we hav about 300, and neerli 200 ending in *-ory*."—SUR ISAAC PITMAN.

"Yesterdai Mr. Brodrick cauld on me. Amung uthier thingz pertaining tu S.S. we discust the spelng ov 'figer' az comentedit on on the furst pajj ov the March PIONEER. Boeth he and I agree that the spelng shood be 'figer,' and not 'figyur.' In this district wun never heerz eni pronunsiaishon uthier than 'figer.'"—W. J. SHIELD, our Loecal Corespondent for Liverpool.

We duu not beleev thair iz eni district in Grait Britain whair peopl pronouns "figyur." The *Concise Oxford Dictionary* givz "figer" az the oenli pronunsiaishon. In the south ov the Yunited Staits thair iz stil tu be found the palataliezd *c* and *g* in such wurdz az "cyard, gyied" ["guide"], but it iz diing out. "Figyer" iz aulso sed bi sum Americanz. The wurd so pronounst by individual English peopl iz probabli a servieval ov meni comon palataliezaishonz ov *c* and *g*, suported perhaps bi the atemt tu speec according tu the spelng *-ure*. This tendensi tu palataliez *c* and *g* befor frunt vowelz manifests itself in the seventeenth sentyuri, iz freecwentli menshond bi gramairianz in the aiteenth, and disapeerz in the nienteenth. Hill, in his *Lecture on the Articulations of Speech* (1821), stil givz *cy* (*ky*), *gy* az the pronunsiaishon ov the inishal ov "gap, card, guard, kept, care, gain, gay, get." In the *Comic English Grammar* ov 1840 it iz staited that "theatrical dandiz caul sky 'ske-eye.'" In "girl" this palataliezd *g* persisted a long tiem.

NOETS AND NYUZ.

The membership ov the Sosieti nou numberz 1490.

M R. E. PRENTISS BAILEY, an American nyuspaiper editor huuz deth woz reesentli reported, woz repyuted tu spair no painz in licing "cub reporterz" intu shaip. In the cais ov wun nyu member ov hiz staaf he sielentli revieez hiz spelng until at laast a bach ov "copi" sent in containd an eror tuu outraijus tu be paast oever without coment. "O," sed the editor, turning reproechfuli tu the lad, "hou duu yu spel 'income'?" "Whi, hou hav I got it, Mr. Bailey?" "Heer it iz—i-n-c-u-m." "O, I forgot the *b*, didn't I?"

WUN ov the fienest speechez maid in suport ov spelng reform cain at the cloez ov a lectyur on the subject befor the Stretford teeacherz. A yung maaster sed wun ov hiz scolarz had dun a briliant "compozishon" that dai. Ten yeerz agoe it wood hav been flung intu the w.p.b., becauz ov spelng mistaics. That iz, corect spelng woz prefurd tu good thincing and cleer ecspression! "Wun reezon, I beleev, whi our children ar sumtiemz so absolutli wooden iz the styupidnes ov the spelng thai ar taut. Thai must not thinc for themselvz, or thai goe astrai." Theez wurdz cum direct from the claas-room.

AT a meeting in Chesterfield a hed maaster confess that the oenli fair wai tu marc "compozishon" woz tu be bliend tu spelngz. "Let the chield get up and reed out whot it haz riten. Then yu can form just juiment." In uther wurdz, it iz the sens that materz, az Mr. Yellowplush yust tu sai.

"YUR admirabl sceem, **which iz shuur tu cum.**" This significant fragment iz taicen from a leter riten bi a wel noen publisher. He haz taicen a speshal interest in the teeching ov spelng in public elementari scuulz, and that iz hiz vurdict. The convicshon that reform iz bound tu cum beginz tu setl deep upon the public miend.

WE hav reseevd from Nova Scotia a copi ov the Fienal Report ov the Comiti tu the Provinshal Edyucaishon Asoesiaishon. Surtin simplified formz ar yuzd thruout: "prolog, catalog," etc.; "hight, favor"; "purpos, traveler"; and utherz. **It iz maid part ov a teech'erz dyuti tu ecsplain tu claasez hou a simpl rashonal spelng wood promoet edyucaishon.** This iz an advaanst step, but a wiez wun. It seemz tu us much beter franchi tu tel the chield that the spelng which authoriti compelz it tu yuz haz no uther mandait, and that he mai taic hiz part in aifter lief in creatiting a nyu and enlietend authoriti. That iz mor edyucaishonal than a dril in the darc.

RIETING from the uther sied ov the Atlantic, a frend ov rashonal spelng sez: "It amaizez the American and Canadian reformer tu see the number ov pres noetisez yur ecstreem S.S. reseevez. In Canada we hav thre ov the veri best nyuspaiperz—'Toronto Globe,' 'Montreal Witness,' 'Toronto World'—and sum menor jurnalz, suporting the muuvment bi wurdz ov encurijment, but veri fyu admit eni simplificaishonz, eeven ov the mield sort propoezd bi the S.S. Bord. In the Yunitied Staits the nyuspaiper pres iz iether indiferent or antagonistic, but intu a fyu ov the best peeriodicalz a fyu simplificaishonz ar creeping—noetabli. ov lait, intu the "Independent," ov New York. In the Midl West the Yunivursitiz ar lending a raather frendli eer. Laitli, the Yunivursiti ov Illinois (sum fiev thouzand stuydents) and the Millihen Yunivursiti hav desieder tu yuz aulmoest aul ov the furst list ov 300 simplificaishonz." This iz a grait step forwerd. The pres wil foloe in the waic ov the Yunivursitz.

FROM the "Church Abroad" for March we taic this fragment: "Wuns a Japanese gurl sed tu me, 'Thair ar tuu thingz in the wurld that I hait: thai ar

snaics and English spelng ; but **English spelng iz wurs than snaics.**" And again : " The egzaminaishon that aul Japanese children ar moest afraid ov iz the English langwij egzaminaishon." The snaics ov spelng ar thair.

" ENGLISH iz nou spoecen bi about 125,000,000 peopl. A sentyuri agoe it woz spoecen bi 20,000,000 peopl oenli. Dyuring that peeriod no uther leeding European langwij haz maid the slietest advaans." Graanted a revizhon ov spelng, wood not the progres ov our tung be swifter stil ? In the wurdz ov James Howell : " He duth hiz naitiv tung a good ofis hu fiendz a wai tu spred her abraud and maic her beter nooen tu the wurld."

" ACCOMADATION FOR CYCLISTS." The noets cuverd a waul neer the vilij scuul. Complaint woz maid bi the domini, and the painter tried again. He gaiv a dubl *m* tu " accommodation "—Robert Louis Stevenson woz never shuur whether wun or tuu—but left the *a*, and this vaast pees ov mis-speling stil peeps in at the scuul windoe.

THE prinsipal meetingz in coneckshon with the Pitman Sentenari wil be held in London in the thurd weec ov Mai. Sur-Albert K. Rollit wil prezied at the meeting ov the Cripplegate Instityut. On Saterdai, Mai 24, a speshal aul-dai escruschon tu Bath haz been arainjd. Vizitorz wil be conducted tu plaisez ov interest in Sur Isaac's siti. Mr. E. A. Cope, the Sentenari Secretari, Selsdon Road, South Croydon, Surrey, wil giv further informaishon tu eni reeder ov THE PIONEER.

WE hav reseevd a copi ov the " Kurzschriftliche Mitteilungen," publisht in Hamburg. It containz a pleezing referens tu our eforts tu bring about a reform ov the " deplorabl spelng ov English."

MASHEENERI mai bring tu paas whot the slugish miend delaiz. Mr. John B. Flowers, a yung electrical engineer ov Brooklyn, haz maid an atemt tu prodyus a vois-operated tieprieter, and haz cum neer tu sucses. If the masheen ever gets intu the marcket it wil duu much tordz the cauz ov simplified spelng. The man hu iz acustomd tu seing hiz leterz and uther rietingz tiept fonetical wood suun lurn the advaantijez ov this form ov spelng. Good luc tu Mr. Flowers ! The aim ov siëns iz tu eliminait waist. Whi can not we begin bi stoping the leecij ov lief dyu tu the convensional spelng ? That demaandz no masheen saiv public opinion.

THE siëntific vista iz interesting. Another inventor iz at wure upon a method ov recording fonetic soundz upon strips ov paiper, on a ciend ov " pianola " prinsipl. Theez strips ov paiper wil be fed intu an automatic tieprieter, and the wure wil be dun. The inventor asurts that in twenti yeerz' tiem rieting as noen tudai wil be a rariti. A nyu spelng wil hav groen from the ruinz ov the oeld.

WE ar glad tu poot an act ov curtesi on record. The Scholastic Trading Company, Bristol, haz veri ciendli agreed tu incluud spelng reform literatury in parsels which ar being sent out tu scuulz in Cornwall. Iz this an urnest ov the dai when the hoel parsel wil be in that spelng—and scuul " reederz " be richer in content thairbi ?

THE " Yorkshire Post " reesentli printed a copi ov a liesens for egzemshon from Lenten flesh faasting graanted tu the Lord " Mayor " ov York in 1608. We giv a spesimen ov the cwaint spelng :

" I . . . so farre as in me lyeth by these psents doe license the Honorable Christopher Consett, lorde maior of the Citie of Yorke my pishioner considering and well knowing the imbicilite, weakenesse and unhealthfulness of the said Honorable the Lord Maior being very sickly and weake by reason of his dyvers and often infirmitities, for the bettr recovery of his health to eat fleshe during this season and tyme of Lent,

yf his said sicknesse shall so long endure, otherwyse onely during the space of eight dayes next aftr the date hereof." "Sovran" iz spelt "soveraigne" and "sovereigne," and "Christopher" iz also riten "Christofer."

"THE groeth ov whot iz ecelent iz sloe"—but our list ov memberz iz faast giving the nai tu this truuth. Suuner than we dreem we mai reech a strength ov 50,000. Mai we ad a wurd ov jentl remiender tu thoez memberz huuz subscrisphonz wer dyu at the begining ov the yeer, but hu forgot tu maic a noet in thair diariz tu that efect? Literatyr for distribyushon mai be had in eni cwontiti from the Secretari. We wont tu plaat a seed ov liet in everi garden.

THE tuu events ov the munth hav been Mr. E. B. Osborn'z articl in the **Morning Post** (March 7), foloed bi corespondens prominentli plaist ; and Mis Burstall'z "Mesij" on Speling Reform in the "Woman Teacher's World" (March 19). Mr. E. B. Osborn sucseeded Andrew Lang on the staaf ov the "Morning Post." Hiz causerie woz delietfuli sympathetic and catholic in spirit. It iz hoept tu secyur permision tu isyu it in pamphlet form. "Enuf haz been sed," Mr. Osborn sumz up, "tu shoe that the speling reformerz hav a *prima facie* cais tu taic intu cort, and I for wun hoep thai wil get the Roial Comishon ov incwieri which thai dezier." As tu **Mis Burstall'z** "Mesij" tu teecherz, it iz wun ov the moest convinsing staitments that haz been riten ov pursonal faith in rashonal speling, and everi member ov the Sosieti shood reed it. The Secretari wil be glad tu send a copi on reseet ov poestij (½d.). We wish we had spais tu cwoet the hoel articl—an inspiraishon—and not meerli the concluding wurdz :

We English, hie and loe, jentl and simpl, hav shaimfuli misyuzd our muther tung. We speec it wurs than our naiborz duu thairz ; just az our speling iz mor irashonal than that ov eni uther wruld langwij. The tuu erorz goe together : reforming wun, we shal avoid the uther. We shal teech our boiz and gurlz whot the soundz ov English reali ar ; thair delicasii, valyu, and fors. Thus wil our children lurn, thru reformd speling, hou thai shood plai upon that noeblest ov instrooments—the hyuman vois —thru the riet yus ov that misterius gift ov langwij which iz the pecyuliar atribute ov hyumaniti.

PRES CUTINGZ CLASIFIED.
