HARVARD COLLEGE

CLASS OF 1871

AMORY, FRANCIS INMAN. No change since last report.

AUSTIN, AMORY. "Since last report I have been living in Newport, R. I., generally letting my house in the summer and going off to fish in the Maine lakes. Have travelled extensively in the last ten years in England, France, Canada, the Bahamas, and the Southern States. Have also passed several winters in Bermuda, and have, as an amateur, photographed that entire colony — twice taking first prize for my pictures at their annual exhibitions. Have read one or two papers before the R. I. Society of Colonial Wars on heraldic and biographical subjects."

*BACKUS, HENRY CLINTON. Backus continued to practise law in New York City up to 1907. In November of that year he had an attack of grip which was followed by heart and kidney troubles and he died on May 3, 1908.

BARNES, ALBERT MALLARD. Is still treasurer and general manager of the Cambridge Gas-Light Company. Is a director in the Harvard Trust Company and a trustee of the Cambridgeport Savings Bank.

BARTLETT, NELSON SLATER. Has retired from active business and is engaged in caring for property as trustee. Is a member of the Union and St. Botolph Clubs of Boston, the University Club of New York, the Essex County Club of Manchester, and the Eastern Yacht Club.

BASS, GEORGE. No reply.

*BASSETT, FRANCIS. Died at London, England, January 2, 1903.

BIGELOW, WILLIAM STURGIS. In 1908 was appointed lecturer at Harvard University on the Buddhist Doctrine and the same year delivered the Ingersoll lecture, taking for his subject "Buddhism and Immortality." This was subsequently published by Houghton, Mifflin Company. Was appointed a member of the United States Assay Commission in 1908 by President Roosevelt and in 1909 was appointed by the Secretary of State a delegate from the United States to the Literary and Artistic Congress at Copenhagen, but owing to illness was unable to attend. In 1909 received from the Emperor of Japan the Order of the Rising Sun, with the rank of Commander, being the highest distinction that Japan can confer upon one not actually in official life.

BONAPARTE, CHARLES JOSEPH. "Have written several magazine articles and for three months of this year contributed signed editorials to a newspaper. Have been more or less (rather more than less) active in Maryland politics. Am a trustee of the Catholic University of America. Was a member Board of Indian Commissioners, 1902-04; special counsel in P. O. frauds, 1903-04; special agent to investigate certain abuses in Indian Service, 1903-04; presidential elector, 1904; Secretary of Navy, July 1, 1905 to Dec. 17, 1906; attorney-general, Dec. 17, 1906 to March 5, 1909."

BOOTH, EDWARD CHAUNCEY. Served as trustee of the Somerville Public Library from 1872 to 1875 and from 1898 to 1910, the last four years as president of the Board. Is a member of the Somerville Harvard Club, the Boston City Club, and the Belmont Spring Country Club. Is civil service examiner for Somerville.

BOWEN, CHARLES STUART. No change from last report.

BOYD, WILLIAM WILLARD. "The last six years have been spent in travel and studies of social and political conditions abroad. Have made a slow, complete circuit of the globe, and visited nearly every country. On the last tour round the world was special correspondent of the *St. Louis Times*."

BRADLEE, DUDLEY HALL. Is agent for Vartray Ginger Ale, Sarsaparilla, and Club soda; Old Diamond Rye, and Glenartney Scotch. "It should interest the boys to know that by using the goods I am representing, they will be able to be on hand for the fiftieth anniversary in splendid condition."

*BROWN, JESSE. Died at Washington, D. C., June 21, 1904, of acute Bright's disease.

BULLOCK, RUFUS AUGUSTUS. No change from last report.

BURNETT, EDWARD. Same as last report. Is making a specialty of farm buildings, stables, and dairies. Was married at Asheville, N. C., on April 25, 1905, to Mrs. Ethel Raymond Burnett (his brother's widow), the daughter of Philip and Mary Raymond Mason. May 6, 1906, Barbara Burnett was born; June 4, 1908, Philip Mason Burnett was born; August 21, 1910, Anne Priscilla Burnett was born.

BUSH, SAMUEL DACRE. Still in the cotton business. Was married February 16, 1905, to Miss Mary Duryee Nichols, of Englewood, N. J.

BYERLY, WILLIAM ELWOOD. No change from last report.

CANAVAN, MICHAEL JOSEPH. Is agent for the sale of various building materials, and has published several articles concerning old New England and particularly Boston.

CHADWICK, FRANCIS BROOKS. No change from last report.

CHAPIN, HERBERT ALLEN. Same as last report.

CHAPIN, HORACE DWIGHT. No change from last report. Is still engaged in the practice of law and resides at Beverly, Mass.

CHASE, HERBERT AUGUSTUS. Is still practising medicine at 950 Massachusetts Avenue, Cambridge. Is a member of the Colonial Club, Cambridge, and its secretary for four years.

He was afflicted with a malignant throat trouble from which he suffered constantly and the end came at Loomis, N. Y., on November 5, 1910. He was highly regarded in Kansas City both as a lawyer and a man, and served as counsel for many of the large corporations of that locality.

DANIELS, FRANCIS BARRETT. Is general solicitor for the Pullman Company, Chicago, Ill.

*DEARBORN, JOSEPH HENRY. Died at Pembroke, N. H., March 24, 1911.

DEMING, HORACE EDWARD. "Am still engaged in the active practice of the law. My energies outside of my profession have been largely devoted to rendering such assistance as I could in various kinds of civic betterment work, such as the improvement of our electoral methods, the establishment and extension of the merit system in the public administrative service, the spread and application of sound principles in the government of cities. Have served as officer and on the working committee of many temporary and permanent movements organized to further these purposes; for example, National Civil Service Reform League, New York Civil Service Reform Association, National Short Ballot Organization, New York Short Ballot Organization, City Club of New York, National Municipal League, etc. In 1909 published (G. P. Putnam's Sons) 'Government of American Cities.' "

†DONALDSON, JOHN JOHNSTON. No reply.

ELA, RICHARD. Still managing the Standard Turning Works, with some law business particularly in probate matters. Is a member of the Colonial Club, Cambridge, University Club, Boston, and the New England Historic Genealogical Society.

ELA, WALTER. No change from last report.

EMERTON, EPHRAIM.

ROME, ITALY, April 1, 1911.

"Dear Barnes — I have answered your questions as well as I can at long distance. I am now taking a semi-

Sabbatical during the second half of the academic year 1910-11. I took a whole year off in 1906-07, of which the important thing was a winter in Egypt, preceded by a second visit to Athens. I hope you will tell the boys that I have tried to do my duty to Harvard, in the thirty-five years I have served her, in such a way that the Class of '71 will not be ashamed of me."

Is a member of the Colonial Society of Massachusetts, the Massachusetts Historical Society, the Cambridge Historical Society, and the Essex Institute of Salem. Is a corresponding member of the Institut Generale and a Fellow of the American Academy of Arts and Sciences. Has published "Calvin and Servetus" (*Harvard Theological Review*, 1909); "The Religious Environment of Early Christianity" (*Harvard Theological Review*, 1910); "Unitarian Thought" (The Macmillan Company, 1911).

ERNST, GEORGE ALEXANDER OTIS. Has been largely interested in municipal reform and in 1907-09 served as a member of the Boston Finance Commission, which investigated the financial condition of that city and drew the reform amendments to the Boston Charter under which the city is now acting.

EUSTIS, WILLIAM ELLERY CHANNING. Engaged in mining and smelting.

FAXON, WALTER. No change to report.

FOX, JABEZ. No change from last report.

†FRENCH, WILLIAM CLIFFORD. No report.

*FULLER, ALFRED NEWELL. Fuller devoted himself to teaching and private tutoring. In December, 1902, he was married to Miss Marie Pothaive of Paris, France, and soon afterwards he found himself out of employment by

reason of the closing of the school where he had been teaching. The last years of his life were a hard struggle, and his health gradually gave way under the strain. He was stricken with paralysis, and after an illness of two weeks he died on March 24, 1909. It is gratifying to note that prompt response by certain members of the Class to the Secretary's appeals for assistance for Fuller served to cheer and comfort him in the last years of his life.

GARLAND, GEORGE MINOT. No change to report.

GERRISH, JOHN BROWN. No change since last report.

GLEASON, THEODORE CLARENCE. In February, 1908, resigned his pastorate at Lonsdale, R. I., and accepted a call to the First Baptist Church at East Greenwich, R. I.

*GODEY, HARRY. Died at Philadelphia on January 30, 1909, of pneumonia.

HAGAR, EUGENE BIGELOW. "As I have no occupation that I pursue for gain, I suppose that I am to be classified with those who have no occupation, though I am the busiest man that I know. Am a member of the Union Club, the University Club, the Bostonian Society, the New England Historic Genealogical Society, all of Boston, and of many other and less important organizations. I am sorry I have not done something to shed lustre on the Class, but it is true, though melancholy to relate, that there are only two facts that distinguish me at the age of sixty from my fellowmen. One is that I know the Westminster Chime, and I cannot find any one else who does, and the other is that I lived over fifty-one years in the same house in Boston."

HILLS, WILLIAM BARKER. Resigned his professorship in the Harvard Medical School September 1, 1904,

to take charge of the chemical laboratory of the New England Mutual Life Insurance Company of Boston, and is still with that company. Holds the appointment of Associate Professor of Chemistry Emeritus at the Harvard Medical School.

HINCKLEY, SAMUEL PARKER. No change from last report.

HODGES, EDWARD FRANCIS.

BERLIN, GERMANY, April 16, 1911.

“My dear Barnes — It is with great regret that I am constrained to announce that my fixed determination to let no other gathering of the class occur without attending it, must yield to circumstances. I shall be in Europe until the fall and cannot join the diminishing remnant of our good class at the festivities which will mark our fortieth anniversary. Just twice as many years have passed since our graduation as I had numbered (and a few months beside) before that event! But my love goes out to all that still gather at the shrine and a wistful regret that I may not be one of them. The previous report is correct but please say ‘was’ instead of ‘is’ for I am become a ‘has been’ and glory in it.”

*HUNKING, CHARLES DUSTIN. Died at Haverhill, Mass., July 23, 1909.

JACKSON, FRANK. Is attending different courses at Harvard College. Is a member of the Tavern Club.

JAMES, HENRY CLAY. No change from last report.

JAY, AUGUSTUS. No reply.

JENKS, CHARLES WILLIAM. “My dear Barnes — I fear I have little of interest for the Class Report. I have lived quietly the last twenty-five years in this little town of

Bedford, Mass., on an ancestral farm interesting myself in a moderate way in agricultural and natural history pursuits. Neither the President nor Governor have needed my assistance except by an occasional vote, but my fellow-townsmen have thought me competent to serve them as trustee of the Public Library, cemetery trustee, tree warden and town moderator. I have been connected with the University Club of Boston, Reform Club, Unitarian Club, Massachusetts Horticultural Society, Boston Society of Natural History, Appalachian Club, New England Botanical Club, American Fern Society, Bunker Hill Monument Association, Concord Antiquarian Club, Rural Club, and the Grange."

JONES, GEORGE IRVING. Publishing law books. Is a member and director in the Harvard Club, Chicago, and a member of the City Club and Edgewater Golf Club.

KIMBALL, CHARLES WARREN. Practising law at Penn Yan, New York. Was married October 31, 1910, to Henrietta Hicks, daughter of Henry and Marietta Hicks.

*KING, JOHN LORD. Died at Syracuse, N. Y., June 18, 1905, of pernicious anæmia.

KING, WILLIAM NEIL. "I belong to the great army of the unemployed, and reside in Columbus, Ohio, the centre of Buckeye statesmanship and office-holding, not to speak of those wanting office. Am a director in the Capitol Trust Company, State Savings Bank and Trust Company, and the Scioto Valley Traction Company, all of Columbus."

KLAPP, WILLIAM HENRY. "My dear Barnes — I am returning to you the class information slip without, how-

ever, answering the questions; and simply for the reason that I have nothing new to report. Since your last report I have not changed my occupation or residence, or married, or done anything distinguished or even notorious. I am deeply interested in my work here, and when you have about three hundred boys to look after, they keep you busy. Between this and the more or less social life and a good deal of reading, with usually two or three months during the summer in Europe, I have not much time to get rusty, but alas! like all of us, only to get old. I wish I could get to the dinner at the last of June, but I shall probably be many a mile away at that time, taking my summer trip. If it should be possible, you may be sure I will be on hand, for it would give me the greatest pleasure to see all you good fellows again, after this long lapse of forty years. I don't believe it has been forty years, anyhow! You have made the count wrong, or something is the matter, for it is a popular saying that appendicitis never attacks any one over forty years of age, and this time two years ago they cut me open in the most approved fashion. So there! What greater proof could you have? Good luck and good health to you."

LAMB, HORATIO APPLETON. Is treasurer of the Simmons Female College and a member of its corporation; president of the Boston Co-operative Building Company; president of the Boston Children's Aid Society; treasurer of the Massachusetts Society of the Cincinnati; trustee of the Suffolk Savings Bank; trustee of the D. L. Dix Fund; park commissioner of Milton; member of the Somerset Club, Tavern Club, St. Botolph Club, Country Club, Milton Club, Hoosic Whisick Club, Rural Club. "Every year I become more interested in farming, especially in cattle breeding, apple and pear orchards, and cultivation of grapes."

* LARNED, WALTER CRANSTON. "I have written many lectures and articles, but have published no book since

my 'Rembrandt, a Romance of Holland.' Among the lectures are 'With the Roman and the Goth from Southern France to Paris' and 'An Interpretation of Leonardo da Vinci.'"

LAWRENCE, JOHN S. Served a term of two years on the Police and Fire Commission of Grand Rapids by appointment and was its president from May, 1906 to May, 1907. Has been an elected member of the Grand Rapids Library Commission since 1907 and for the last two years its president. Published in 1911 a family history, entitled "Descendants of Moses and Sarah Kilham Porter."

LAWRENCE, WILLIAM. "As to occupation and changes in occupation: have been wandering around Massachusetts as Bishop for eighteen years, changing it by going round the other way and occasionally crossing the Atlantic or the Rocky Mountains." Published in 1902 "Life of Roger Wolcott" and in 1903 "Study of Phillips Brooks," besides various pamphlets and addresses. Since last report has received the following degrees: Princeton, LL.D., 1904; Cambridge, England, LL.D., 1908; Durham, England, D.D., 1908; Yale, D.D., 1909; Lawrence University, Wis., LL.D., 1910; Kings, Nova Scotia, D.D., 1910; Columbia, D.D., 1911. Has served as president of the Harvard Alumni Association, chairman of the House of Bishops, and is trustee of the Peabody Educational Fund, Wellesley College, Groton and St. Mark's Schools.

*LINCOLN, FRANCIS NEWHALL. Lincoln remained with the firm of Little, Brown & Co., Boston, until his death, which occurred July 30, 1903, from apoplexy.

LODGE, HENRY CABOT. Was re-elected to the United States Senate in 1905 and 1911. Has published "A Fighting Frigate and other essays," 1902, "A Frontier Town and other essays," 1906; is a member of the Massa-

Was a delegate at large from New York to the Universal Congress of Lawyers and Jurists at St. Louis, in 1904; delegate to the National Conference on Taxation at Columbus, Ohio, in 1907, at Toronto, Canada, in 1908; was one of the delegates invited to deliver an address on Taxation at the State Conference of Tax Officers and others, at Utica, N. Y., on January 12, 1911 and was also a delegate to the arbitration conference at Lake Mohonk. Am and have been, for some years past, president of the German-American Alliance of the State of New York and of the United German Societies of the City of New York."
