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THE MODERATOR'S MESSAGE

Congregationalism as a form for religious worship dates from the earliest New Testament churches. While the form fell into disuse during the time a single structured church dominated Christendom, it was again applied among certain English groups almost 400 years ago. The National Association of Congregational Christian Churches continues the historic tradition of the automony of the local church and the priesthood of all believers. Each Congregationalist is expected to search the Scriptures and to put Christ's precepts and example to work in every facet of his life. A fellowship of likeminded Christians gives us comfort and strengthens us to do God's will.

In the year 1970 we need to take a look at history and also to appraise the present which is a prelude of things to come. Let us then examine the past, present, and future:

Congregationalism Past

Congregationalism was founded in America 350 years ago by that intrepid band of 102 Saints and Strangers who landed at Plymouth. They were tested physically, mentally, and spiritually. Plymouth Colony was never a success in today's business sense but the ideas implanted there became the cornerstone of our great country.

Congregationalism Present:

In a day when organic union seems to be again in the ascendency, we need to stand fast in our convictions. The National Association is a vehicle of fellowship which can be of service to any Church which cherishes its freedom from heirarchical control.

The people themselves, as a fellowship of believers, are making Congregationalism what it is today and what it will become tomorrow. Let it be stressed that each contribution, activity, value and concern must be individual, and based upon spirit rather than form.

This year the 16th Annual Meeting of the National Association of Congregational Christian churches will be held within the boundaries of the original Plymouth colony. A highlight of the anniversary year will be a three-weeks trip to Europe, which will include retracing the Pilgrims' steps in England and Holland.

Congregationalism Future

Let us, then, look forward with optimism and hope. Let us pray for opportunities to serve and the wisdom to do that which we should do. All

human institutions are the bulwarks of our civilization and culture, but they must gradually change in custom and method. Change for its own sake is shallow. Change for the better should always be welcome, since change is inevitable. Youth participation implies change, which we welcome.

We know that church membership and attendence are at a low ebb in most denominations. If we are to grow, we must set an example for our youth and for the strangers in our midst.

Congregationalism indeed has a proud past. A bright future awaits us if we only have the courage and the will to work as did our forebears.

FROM THE EXECUTIVE SECRETARY

The pages of the 1970 Handbook introduce the National Association in its fifteenth year of service to Christ and the Gospel as the agency of the Congregational Christian Churches of the United States. It is a year in which we will look back to the heritage that is ours as we observe the 350th Anniversary of the arrival of the Pilgrim Fathers in New England; and the 150th Anniversary of the first Congregational missionaries to the Hawaiian Islands. Appropriate commissions will be planning an emphasis on these anniversaries, and our Annual Meeting is to be in Massachusetts with the Pilgrim memorial in mind.

On the other hand, 1970 must be a year in which we take giant steps toward bringing Congregationalism to full fruition as a fellowship through which the Gospel of Jesus Christ can creatively touch the lives of men and society in the '70s. The challenge to our fellowship and our Churches was issued in the Moderators' Call of 1969, and is underscored by the affairs of the world and the problems confronting the Churches. Through its Boards and Commissions, and by the service of its Executive Staff, the National Association seeks to support the effort of the Churches that comprise its membership, and to do as a fellowship thoses things that an individual Church cannot accomplish by or for itself.

The personnel currently charged with responsibilities within the National Association is listed in this Handbook. Please contact them with your suggestions—and with any requests for assistance.

A member Church can be of particular assistance to the National Association in several ways:

- 1. By being represented by a delegate at the Annual Meeting.
- 2. By giving thoughtful consideration to what its financial support for the National Association and its Divisions should be to reflect the Church's responsible participation in our fellowship life.
- By nominating one or more of its members to serve on N.A. Commissions and Committees.

A word of emphasis on the third point. The National Association has been blessed by the competence and devotion of those who have served it through the years, but there must be a continuous flow of fine people. We are a fellowship that does not want to establish a heirarchy or a coterie of those who might be considered "professional" leaders or conference-goers. BUT, the only alternative to this is for our Churches to be sure that some of their effective laymen and laywomen give time to the National Association and that their ministers count participation as an essential part of their ministry. Please be sure to respond when the annual request for nominees comes to your Church.

We all stand ready to be of assistance in any way we can to witness for the Congregational Way. Call upon us.

A statement of purpose for the Missionary Society, a division of the Corporation for the National Association, appears in the By-laws of the Corporation as follows:

To serve as the missionary agent of the churches of the National Association, and of such churches as desire its service; to receive, manage, and distribute such funds and properties as may be entrusted to it according to the expressed wishes of the donors, or in the absence of such designation, by the vote of the division; to counsel with such Churches as call upon it in the area of their missionary concern; and generally to stimulate the spreading of the Gospel of Jesus Christ by such means as are in keeping with the basic principles of the Congregational Christian Churches as stated in the Articles of Association and By-Laws of the National Association of Congregational Christian Churches of the United States.

The activities of the Missionary Scoeity are managed by a board of twelve members. The Board of Directors of the Corporation (Executive Committee of the National Association) appoints four members each year, for three year terms, to the board. An Associate Executive Secretary of the National Association serves as its administrative officer. Actions of the Society are regularly reviewed by the Corporation Board. All funds received are disbursed through the Treasurer of the National Association.

One hundred percent of the funds received for missionary work from the churches, their organizations, and individuals, is used for missionary work because of the wise provision that funds necessary for administration and promotion are provided by the budget of the National Association. The Society hopes that support for the N.A. budget will be sufficient so that this excellent policy may be continued. Designation of gifts for specific missionary projects is faithfully complied with in the disbursement of funds.

In 1970 the Missionary Society is supporting church extension in many communities across our country, including churches in Alaska and Hawaii, together with mission work in nine countries overseas. A gradual increase in all major areas of interest and concern is to be expected. In 1968 the Society received and allocated \$332,814.18 in designated and undesignated funds.

COMMISSIONS OF THE NATIONAL ASSOCIATION

The Functions of the Commissions

The Commissions of the National Association actually are extended sub-committees of the Executive Committee, charged with responsibilities in specific areas of concern such as Christian Education, Fellowship, the Ministry, Publications, World Christian Relations, Spiritual Resources, Women's Work, and Youth.

The Executive Committee sends a liaison representative to each Commission and the number of other persons both laymen and clergymen compose the membership which varies in number. Commission members are appointed by the Executive Committee for three-year terms so that one-third of the membership changes each year. The Executive Committee also approves the chairman of each Commission for a one-year term, after consultation with each Commission.

In practice, the Commissions are granted considerable autonomy in carrying out their responsibilities. They report all actions promptly to the Executive Committee, including recommendations for actions by the Executive Committee. Some of these recommendations require further action by the National Association at its annual meeting; in that case, they are reviewed by the Executive Committee, and its recommendations in turn are submitted at the annual meeting.

In the case of some of the older Commissions, records have not become available on the enabling resolutions which originally brought them into existence. It has therefore been necessary to draft a current statement of their activities based on actual practice, as a matter of information to the membership of the National Association.

The Commissions meet twice a year; during the winter months and immediately before the Annual Meeting of the National Association. Seminars are planned by many of the Commissions in conjunction with the Annual Meeting of the National Association.

The basic responsibility of this Commission is the nurture of the Christian ministry in the churches of the National Association.

Working closely with our National Association's Associate Executive Secretary for the Ministry, the Commission concerns itself with policy aspects of securing ministers and all problems arising within the purview of his office. The Commission also assumes the responsibility of overseeing the endorsement of our ministers as chaplains in Federal government positions.

The Commission concerns itself with supervising financial assistance to our ministers facing emergency financial crises. The monies for this type of assistance come through special contributions to The Christmas Fund for Ministerial Assistance.

Because of the shortage of fully ordained ministers to serve many of our

small low-budget churches, the Commission on the Ministry has established a training program for preparing laymen to serve these churches in limited areas. A manual and other materials are available for a course in lay preaching from the Milwaukee office. The Commission is no less concerned with encouraging young men and women in entering full time Christian service, and therefore, retains a liaison relationship with the Foundation for Theological Studies.

Always concerned with safeguarding traditional Congregationalism, the Commission on the Ministry recommends, whenever requested, material in the area of faith and order in Congregationalism.

Underlying every responsibility assumed by the Commission on the Ministry is the determination to maintain with our churches and ministers a and advisory relationship rather than to make "official" helpful pronouncements.

The World Christian Relations Committee was brought into being at the Minneapolis meeting in 1962, and at Wichita in 1964 was given full Commission status.

In creating the Commission, the National Association charged it as follows:

It shall be the agency of the National Association of Congregational Christian Churches in initiating, implementing, sustaining, and improving relations with all other established religious bodies

in a spirit of fellowship."

The Commission, in company with other interested persons, chiefly from the Council of Community Churches and the Disciples, met in Chicago in May 1966, to hold the first seminar on the Nature and Future of the Free Church. This was a rewarding meeting, at which Free Churches began to find each other. Other sessions were held in succeeding years and are planned for future years as a Conference on the Free Church.

The World Christian Relations Commission has the vitally imperative obligation of making the Congregational voice heard in an ecclesiastical milieu where the presbyterial, espicopal, and papal claims are clear and insistent. The cause of Congregationalism will not be served by timid isolation. We will bate no jot of our message of freedom and fellowship as we make our needed witness in and to the ecumenical movement, and we will be heard. With wisdom, persistence, and imagination we will cause our Congregational Way to be seen among men.

COMMISSION ON YOUTH (Continued)

It is the purpose of the Youth Commission to offer local churches youth program resources and support so that the churches can provide opportunities for growth in the understanding of Christian life principles, for the development of a sense of responsible freedom, and for serving the cause of Christ through fellowship and service. The Youth Commission does not seek to provide a total program for the local church youth, rather, it seeks to support these groups and extend specific help when it is requested. In accord with this aim, the Commission engages in the continuing development of resource material for use by the churches.

Further, the Youth Commission seeks to provide opportunities for inter-group fellowship among young people through the National Association Pilgrim Fellowship and the Heritage of Pilgrim Endeavor (see below). An Annual Assembly for NAPF and HOPE is held each summer in conjunction with the Annual Meeting of the National Association. The Assembly is an opportunity for sharing, growing, and learning for the youth of our churches.

Opportunities for service, which might otherwise be unavailable, are afforded through the Work Camps and Pilgrimages sponsored by the Youth Commission. These special programs are available to the High School and College young people of all National Association churches. Other projects, in this country and overseas, are sponsored as needs and opportunities arise.

ARTICLES OF ASSOCIATION

of the

National Association of Congregational Christian Churches of the United States

Preamble

WHEREAS Churches of the congregational order have historically held to certain truths, chief among which are the freedom of the Christian man maintained at all costs and all hazards; the right of the local Church to self-government in all matters temporal and spiritual, because of Christ's word that where two or three are gathered together in His name He is in their midst; the fellowship of the Churches in the spirit of love, without compulsion or restraint and free from the bondage of creed or ecclesiastical control, and,

WHEREAS the congregational way is one of the great outer and corporate expressions of the inner and individual life, and,

WHEREAS the needs of our time demand that these timeless principles be revived and given national, as well as local, expression, and,

WHEREAS the advance in transportation and communication is such that Churches a continent apart are now as near together as the contiguous Churches of yesterday, and,

WHEREAS it is desirable that Congregational Christian Churches have an organization embracing the entire nation, of which the members shall be Churches, and through which they may take counsel and may realize their common purposes, and advance God's Kingdom;

WHEREAS Churches by delegates assembled in Detroit, Michigan, on November 9 and 10, 1955, first organized and elected temporary officers of the National Association

of Congregational Christian Churches;

THEREFORE WE, the Churches by our delegates here assembled in Wauwatosa, Wisconsin this 25th day of October, 1956, do covenant in this National Association of Congregational Christian Churches to walk together in the ways which God anciently revealed to our fathers, and in such further ways as He may yet reveal to us, the present form and purposes being hereinafter stated. Amen.

ARTICLE I. NAME

The name of this Association shall be the National Association of Congregational Christian Churches of the United States, hereinafter called the Association.

ARTICLE IL PURPOSE

The purposes of the Association shall be:

To provide a means by which Congregational Christian Churches of this nation may, without in any wise disturbing or altering their present associations and affiliations, consult and advise together as Churches upon matters of common concern to them, both temporal and spiritual;

To provide this closer fellowship and unity in all spiritual matters among

Congregational Christian Churches;

To aid, in such ways as may from time to time be appropriate and proper, the continuance and growth of those Christian purposes and practices which have been the historic and accepted characteristics of Congregational Christian Churches.

In case of necessity to do and perform any and all functions ordinarily and

customarily performed by Congregational Christian associations.

To promote, carry on and supervise such co-operative activities among member Churches as to them from time to time may seem wise and expedient.

Upon application therefor by member Churches, to provide for them such assistance, whether financial or through advice and consultation or otherwise, as may be proper and expedient.

ARTICLE III. MEMBERSHIP 1. MEMBER CHURCHES

Membership in the Association shall be by Churches, which membership shall not be considered inconsistent with membership in any other Congregational Christian Association or conference. In all matters submitted to the Association for consideration. each member Church shall have one vote.

For the purpose of this Article a Congregational Christian Church shall be defined as a body of Christians complete under God in spiritual authority and ecclesiastical power, regularly meeting and worshipping in one place, united by a mutually owned covenant and recognized by the laws of the place of location as a duly constituted Church.

Any Congregational Christian Church may become a member of the Association by congregational action taken at any duly called and held meeting of such Church, which congregational action shall then be certified to the Secretary of the Association by the Church clerk, at which time such Church shall become a member.

Membership may be withdrawn by any member Church at any time by like action and certification, without impairment of any of its temporal or spiritual rights as a Congregational Christian Church.

2. ASSOCIATE MEMBER CHURCHES

Any Christian Church, in sympathy with the purposes and goals of this Association, and in accordance with the procedure of ARTICLE III, Section 1, above, may request an associate membership in the Association, without vote, but with representation on the floor at meetings.

3. AFFILIATED FELLOWSHIP

Fellowships of Churches in sympathy with the purposes and goals of this Association may request a mutually agreeable affiliation, without vote, but with voice, whether or not any or all of their individual member Churches are members of this Association. Such affiliation shall be in the spirit of fellowship and shall never be the basis for the exercise of ecclesiastical control by this Association or by the affiliate.

ARTICLE IV. OFFICERS AND COMMITTEES

1. Officers. The elected officers of the Association shall be as follows: Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Secretary, Treasurer, and Historian, and such other officers as may be named in the Bylaws.

The Moderator shall be elected for a term of one year and shall preside at all meetings of the Association. Men or women, either clergy or lay, shall be

eligible for election.

(b) The Assistant Moderator shall be elected for a term of one year and shall fill the office in the absence of the Moderator, or at his request. In case of a vacancy in the office of Moderator, the Assistant Moderator shall fulfill the duties during the unexpired term.

The Secretary shall be elected for a term of one year and shall keep a full and accurate record of the proceedings of the Association and of the Executive Committee. He shall keep a record of the membership and attendance and receive official communications, send notices and correspondence as directed

by the Association or the Executive Committee.

The Treasurer shall be elected for a term of one year and shall be the custodian of the funds of this Association. He shall receive all contributions and disburse funds under the direction of the Executive Committee to whom he shall report upon request, and to the Association to which he shall report at its Annual Meeting. The Executive Committee shall require a sufficient bond to be posted by the Treasurer, and shall require that his books be annually audited.

- (e) The *Historian* shall keep a written chronology of important historical events and accomplishments of the National Association which are pertinent to the development and promotion of Congregationalism.
- (f) The officers shall be elected at each Annual Meeting.
- 2. The Executive Committee.
- (a) There shall be an Executive Committee consisting of twelve members who shall be elected for a term of four years. Their terms of office shall be staggered from the time of the adoption of these Articles so that finally three shall be elected annually.
 - (1) The Executive Committee shall be elected from the membership of member Churches of the Association. It shall elect its own chairman.
 - (2) No person may ordinarily serve a total of more than eight years on the Executive Committee and no person can be elected to succeed himself on the Executive Committee after completion of a full four-year term without having been off the Executive Committee for at least one year.
- (b) The Executive Committee shall meet on call of its chairman, or the secretary of the Association.
- (c) The Executive Committee shall act for the Association between its meetings, but the Committee's action shall be subject to ratification and review by the Association. Minutes of the action of the Committee shall be kept and presented to the Association for ratification and review at the next regular meeting.
- (d) The Executive Committee may appoint an Executive Secretary for the Association, whose term of office, remuneration, and duties shall be as agreed upon at the time of appointment; such appointment and agreements shall be subject to relevant provisions of the Bylaws and subject to the approval of the next regular meeting of the Association. No Executive Secretary shall serve more than six years or shall thereafter be eligible for reappointment.
- 3. Committees and Commissions.
- (a) There shall be such commissions created by the National Association as are necessary for carrying out the purposes and activities of the National Association as stated in Article II.
- (b) Members of other committees and commissions, and other officers shall be chosen either by the Association or by the Executive Committee acting ad interim.
- 4. No officer or appointee of the Association shall, by virtue of such office, have any ecclesiastical authority or standing.

ARTICLE V. MEETINGS

Regular meetings of this Association shall be held annually, the exact time and place to be fixed by the Executive Committee unless otherwise ordered by the Association. Announcement of such meetings shall be made at least three months in advance.

Special meetings may be convened upon the call of the Executive Committee or when twenty or more member Churches have so requested; such meetings shall consider only that business stated in the call for the meeting, which call shall be made not less than thirty days prior to such meeting.

A quorum shall consist of the delegates present representing 20 per cent of the Churches holding membership in the Association, except as provided in ARTICLE IX hereafter.

ARTICLE VI. CORPORATION

There shall be a corporation for this Association, the purpose of which shall be to provide ways and means for the continuation, fostering, and advancement of the historic and accepted practices of Congregational Christian Churches, as these practices are stated and defined in the Articles of Association and Bylaws of this Association.

ARTICLE VII. BYLAWS

The Association may from time to time make, alter, amend or repeal Bylaws, consistent with, and to carry out but not augment, the purposes and functions set forth herein.

Bylaws may be adopted, altered, amended or repealed upon a two-thirds vote of the members present and voting, but no Bylaw may be altered, amended, or repealed on the same day the change is first proposed.

ARTICLE VIII. REFERENDUM COUNCIL

Since ecclesiastical power under God rests solely with the local Churches, the member Churches of this Association have, and shall retain among their other rights and powers, the right and power to review and modify any proposal or action by any agency or creature of the member Churches of the National Association when such proposal or action is deemed by the Churches to be in violation of the principles set forth in these Articles. The Churches also have, and shall retain among their other rights and powers, the right and power to initiate action which they deem wise and proper.

Such right and power to review, modify, or initiate may be exercised by means of a Referendum Council, which may be called by not less than ten percent of the member

Churches,

The manner of calling and constituting a Referendum Council, the functioning of such a Referendum Council, and the method of voting on a question referred to the Churches by a Referendum Council, shall be governed by the relevant provisions of the Bylaws of this Association.

ARTICLE IX. AMENDMENT

At any duly called and held meeting of the Association, a quorum being present, these Articles of Association may be amended by a two-thirds vote of the member Churches represented at such meeting through their delegates, (1) notice of such proposed amendment or amendments having been given at a previous meeting, or (2) the proposed amendment or amendments having been requested by twenty or more member Churches. In either case, the full text of the proposed amendment or amendments shall be printed and distributed with the call to the meeting at which they are to be considered.

I. MEETINGS BYLAWS OF THE ASSOCIATION

1. Regular meetings shall be held annually at times and places fixed by the Executive Committee, which shall issue a call of the meeting signed by its Chairman, as provided by the Articles of Association.

2. Special meetings shall be called and held as proposed in Article V of the Articles

of Association.

II. MEMBERSHIP AND VOTING

1. Each Church which is a member of the Association as provided in the Articles of Association, may be represented at meetings of the Association by a delegate chosen in such manner as each Church may for itself determine. Such delegate shall, nevertheless, be certified to the meeting by the proper officer of the Church which he represents. A person may represent more than one Church but not more than a total of ten Churches as an official delegate.

2. Any member Church may designate one or more alternate delegates, in addition to the Official Delegate, such shall be certified in the same manner as the official delegate. Alternate Delegates may attend all meetings and take part in any business, but shall not be permitted to vote, except that one delegate may vote for the Church in the

absence of the official delegate.

3. Any person who signifies his interest in and sympathy with the purposes of this Association may attend any meeting on his own initiative, or by designation of his Church, as an Observer, without vote, to whom the Moderator may grant the privilege of the floor.

4. In all matters which come before the Association or a meeting thereof for action, each Church shall be entitled to one vote. All Official Delegates shall have equal privileges in debate and in making motions or otherwise bringing matters before a meeting.

III. OFFICERS

1. Moderator. The Moderator and Assistant Moderator shall be elected at the Annual Meeting of the Association by the members of the Association. The Moderator, and Assistant Moderator, shall take office upon adjournment of the meeting at which they are elected, and shall hold office for one year or until their successors are elected.

The Moderator, or in his absence, or at his request, the Assistant Moderator, shall preside at the meetings of the Association. The Moderator may deliver an address upon a subject of his own selection at the opening of the meetings of the Association over which he presides. It is understood that his acts and utterances have no authority from or upon the Association, except as he may be specifically authorized by the Association or Executive Committee.

2. Secretary. The Secretary shall be elected by the members of the Association. He shall be the custodian of the archives and records of the Association. He shall keep full and accurate records of the proceedings of the Association and of its Executive Committee. He shall keep the membership roll of the Association and it shall be his duty to see that due notice of meetings of the Association and of the Executive Committee are given and that due notice is given of the action taken by these bodies whenever such notice is necessary or appropriate or is directed to be given.

The Association or the Executive Committee may appoint one or more Assistant Secretaries to assist the Secretary in the performance of his duties, and the Secretary may, with the consent of the Executive Committee, delegate to the Executive Secretary,

if there be one, the performance of such of his functions as he may desire.

3. Executive Secretary. The Executive Secretary, if and when one shall be appointed, shall perform such duties and functions as may be included in the terms of his appointment or as may from time to time be requested of him by the Association or the Executive Committee.

4. Treasurer. There shall be a Treasurer elected annually, whose duties shall be

as provided in Article IV of the Articles of Association.

- 5. Historian. The Historian shall be elected for a period of one year by the Association at its Annual Meeting. The duties shall be as described in Article IV of the Articles of Association.
- 6. The terms of office for the Secretary, Treasurer, and any other officers not otherwise provided for, shall begin January 1, following the meeting at which they are elected and shall continue for one year and/or until their successors take office.

IV. COMMITTEES AND COMMISSIONS

1. The Executive Committee. The Executive Committee shall be composed of the twelve members as provided in Article IV of the Articles of Association, who shall be the only voting members, and in addition, ex officio without vote, the Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Immediate Past Moderator, and the Secretary of the Association. The Executive Committee may make rules for its own guidance not inconsistent with the Articles of Association and these Bylaws. Due notice having been given to all members, seven shall constitute a quorum.

The Executive Committee shall be the Association ad interim and shall transact such business as the Association shall from time to time direct. It shall not contravene or exceed the authorizations, implied, inferred or explicit, in the acts and votes of the Association itself. In the intervals between meetings of the Association it shall represent that body in all matters not otherwise provided for but shall in no case exceed the

prerogative of the Association itself.

(a) The Executive Committee shall have authority to contract for all necessary expenditures for carrying out policies authorized under the Articles of

Association or authorized by the Association, and to approve claims therefor; shall consult the interest of the Association and act for it in intervals between meetings in all matters of business and finance, subject to the direction of the Association; and shall make a full report of all its doings, the consideration of which shall be part of the order of business at the next regular meeting. It shall provide a suitable form of voucher for expenditures of the Association and shall secure a proper auditing of its accounts.

(b) The Executive Committee may submit to the Association for consideration any recommendations that it may deem useful for the development of the life

and work of the Churches.

(c) It may fill any vacancy occurring in its own number or in any committee or office in the intervals between meetings of the Association, the person so appointed to serve until the next regular meeting of the Association.

d) It shall appoint any committee or commission ordered by the Association, but

not otherwise appointed.

- (e) It shall suggest to meetings of the Association proposed and appropriate agenda and make preliminary provision for carrying the same into effect; but any such agenda may be modified and amended by the meeting and the discussions and actions of the meeting shall not in any manner be limited by such suggested agenda, nor by the Executive Committee whether acting as a business committee or otherwise.
- (f) The Executive Committee shall serve as the business committee for the meetings of the Association. It may appoint other special committees to deal with phases of work not covered by other agencies as the need arises,

(g) The Executive Committee shall determine when a necessity exists as

contemplated by Article II of the Articles of Association.

(h) The Executive Committee may take official action on any subject matter within its area of concern by mail ballot and the motion or resolution so stated shall be submitted by mail ballot to all members of the Executive Committee. The Secretary of the Association shall mail out to each member of the Executive Committee a ballot stating the proposition or propositions as proposed, and each member of the Executive Committee shall promptly return his or her ballot with each proposition marked "Yes" or "No", dated and signed. An affirmative vote shall consist of a two-thirds majority vote "Yes" by the members of the full Executive Committee, and a vote shall not be counted until all ballots have been returned.

This procedure shall not be used in lieu of meetings, but may be used between

meetings.

(i) The Executive Committee may establish an Interim Committee of five members which shall include the Chairman of the Executive Committee, as chairman, the chairman of the finance committee, and two other members of the Executive Committee and the Moderator ex officio.

(1) The Interim Committee shall meet upon call of its chairman or upon direction of the Executive Committee.

- (2) The Interim Committee may initiate business and recommend action to and by the Executive Committee, but no action shall be considered as effective until approved by the full Executive Committee either by mail ballot or at a regularly called and held meeting of the Executive Committee.
- 2. Committee on Credentials. A committee on credentials composed of five persons shall be elected at each regular meeting to serve at the next regular meeting and at any intervening special meeting. The committee shall prepare and report as early as practicable a roll of members of the Association represented at the meeting with the names of their representatives determined by the presentation of credentials from the electing Churches. This roll shall be made available to all delegates by posting or duplicating or both.

3. Nominating Committee.

(a) A Nominating Committee will consist of six members, three of whom shall be elected at each regular meeting after nominations from the floor, to serve from the adjournment of the meeting at which they are elected until the adjournment of the second annual meeting following the meeting at which they are elected, to present a complete slate of officers to be voted upon at each Annual Meeting during which they shall serve.

The Committee's nominations shall be transmitted to the Association Secretary who shall transmit such list of nominees to all member Churches at least thirty days prior to such regular meeting. In addition to any nominations so made, in every case nominations for any elective office may be made from the floor of the meeting. The Moderator shall in every instance call for such

nominations from the floor.

Nominations for members of the Nominating Committee shall be complete on the day preceding the vote upon their election which shall be by written ballot.

4. Committee on Resolutions. At each Annual Meeting, a Resolutions Committee consisting of seven persons shall be elected from the floor to serve from the close of that Annual Meeting until the close of the next succeeding Annual Meeting.

A. Resolutions Procedure.

The Resolutions Committee may initiate and propose resolutions only in reference to expressions of appreciation for hospitality and for appreciation of service to the National Association.

All other resolutions, except those matters which are properly considered as 2. proposals for action made by the duly constituted boards, commissions, and committees of the National Association, shall be proposed as follows:

Only a member church can offer a resolution, and must certify by the Clerk or Secretary of the Church that such resolution was duly approved by congregational action of said Church.

Such proposed resolution must be germane to the purposes of the National Association as expressed in Article II, Purposes, of the Articles of Association of this Association.

A copy of such proposed resolution must have been sent to the office of the (c) Executive Secretary at least sixty days prior to the convening date of the

Annual Meeting.

- (d) No less than forty-five days prior to the convening date of the Annual Meeting, the Executive Secretary shall mail to each member Church a copy of all resolutions, showing the name of proponent member, in order that each member Church will have the opportunity to take congregational action on such proposed resolutions so that its delegate may be informed as to what position the member church wants to take on the same. Copies shall also be mailed to the Resolutions Committee.
- All resolutions so proposed shall be considered by the Resolutions Committee, and the Resolutions Committee shall report to the Annual Meeting its recommendations, favorable or unfavorable, on each proposed resolution. In the event that the Resolutions Committee reports unfavorably as to any proposed resolution, such resolution can then be brought before the Annual Meeting for action only by the delegate, or his official alternate, of the

member Church proposing such resolution.

Any resolution that is adopted shall in no sense bind the member churches.

5. A Commission. A commission shall consist of a body of persons charged with the responsibility of carrying out one or more purposes and/or activities of this Association.

A Commission shall be charged by the Annual Meeting creating it with a (a) statement of its purposes, powers, and duties, and such statement can be from time to time changed by the action of an Annual Meeting. All existing commissions shall continue to operate under their present charges or rules.

- (b) A Commission shall have authority to conduct its own business within its charge from the Annual Meeting, or its existing rules, provided its actions are germane to the purposes of this Association as stated in Article II of the Articles of Association, and subject to Article IV, 2 (c) of the Articles of Association.
- (c) A Commission must work within the framework of the budget approved by the Annual Meeting, or as subsequently revised by the Executive Committee.
- (d) A Commission shall consist of not less than five nor more than nine members, the number to be subject to determination by the Annual Meeting creating the Commission, or by any subsequent Annual Meeting. Not more than two members of a Commission may be members of nonmember Churches.

(e) The Commission members shall be appointed by the Executive Committee.

(f) The Commission members shall have three-year terms, and terms shall be staggered so that approximately one-third of the terms expire each year. All terms shall begin at the close of the Annual Meeting.

(g) Any Commission can be abolished by a majority vote of an Annual Meeting.

V. STATISTICS

A list of member Churches in this Association shall be prepared annually by the Secretary and sent to the member Churches. This list shall, so far as possible, give correct addresses of the pastors and clerks of the Churches so listed, together with such other information as shall be deemed wise in the judgment of the Executive Committee.

VI. FINANCE

1. Finance Committee. The Executive Committee shall appoint, from its own membership, a Finance Committee of not less than three persons, whose duties shall be to prepare for the next year a budget of salaries of paid officers or employees of the Association and of anticipated expenses of the officers and its committees and other expenses. The Finance Committee shall present the budget to the Executive Committee who shall present the proposed Association budget to the next regular meeting for adoption and approval.

2. The expenses of the Association shall be met from voluntary contributions solicited from the Congregational Christian Churches in response to recommendations from the Executive Committee, and also from such receipts as may come to the

Association in its meetings or through special gifts and legacies.

3. The fiscal year shall be the calendar year.

VII. STANDING RULES

Standing rules for the Association may be adopted from time to time by a two-thirds vote of the members present and voting at any meeting of the Association. Unless otherwise provided, meetings shall be conducted in accordance with Robert's Rules of Order.

VIII. REFERENDUM COUNCIL

1. In the event that not less than ten percent of the member Churches of the National Association contend that any agency or creature of the Churches of the National Association is violating the principles set forth in the Articles of Association, or is taking action contrary to the will and interest of the Churches, or is formally contemplating such violation or action, the contending churches shall have the right and power to call a Referendum Council.

An agency or creature of the National Association is any Committee, Commission, Board, Corporation, or legal or ecclesiastical entity of any kind, brought into existence by the member Churches of the National Association and ratified by the Annual Meeting or a special meeting of the National Association, or by common acceptance and usage. Any subsidiary agency or creature subsequently brought into being by an agency or creature of the National Association shall be deemed an agency or creature of the Churches of the National Association for this purpose.

2. A Referendum Council is an adaptation of the Congregational custom of a vicinage council. It is composed of nine persons, three to be chosen by the Churches that call the council, three by the party whose action or proposal is in question; these six to choose the other three. Each of the nine persons must be a member in good standing of a local Congregational Church in fellowship with the National Association. Not less than five members of a Referendum Council shall and must be laymen. If the party whose action or proposal is in question shall fail or refuse to choose three persons within thirty days after receiving written notice to do so from any Church which participates in the call, the Churches taking part in the call shall have the right to choose the number of persons who otherwise would have been chosen by such party.

3. A Referendum Council meets at such times and places as are determined by the last three persons chosen and considers the controversy, hearing the pleadings of both parties, All records of the National Association and its agencies and creatures shall be available, without the necessity of legal recourse, to either or both parties. The Referendum Council shall endeavor to settle the controversy. If unable to do so, it makes it findings, which may include a minority report, formulates the question at issue, and sends the question directly to the Churches, together with a notification of the

deadline for voting set by the Referendum Council.

legal powers, and is subject to legal action by the Churches.

4. The local Churches vote on the question in their own localities. Only a duly convened meeting of a local Church shall be competent to act upon a question submitted by a Referendum Council. A copy of the vote of the local Church, certified by its proper official, shall be forwarded to the Secretary of the National Association. The secretary shall tabulate the votes, and not later than sixty days after the close of voting, notify all member Churches of the results of the balloting. A two-thirds majority vote shall be necessary for decision. No subsequent action on the part of the Annual Meeting of the National Association or a special meeting of the National Association, or on the part of any of the agencies and creatures of the Churches, can overrule or supersede the decision of the Churches on a question referred to the Churches by a Referendum Council.

5. A vote on a question referred to the Churches by a Referendum Council has for the Churches as much force as force of wisdom in it lies; it is not a legal determination. No local Church can be legally bound by anything but its own actions or the laws of the state. But any agency or creature of the Churches of the National Association which ignores, contravenes, or alters the will of the Churches as that will is expressed in a vote of the Churches on a question referred by a Referendum Council, is acting beyond its

IX. STANDING AND ORDINATION

1. In accordance with the historic and accepted practice of congregational bodies exterior to the local Church of making lists of the names of those who have ministerial standing in our Churches as ordained pastors and teachers and other ministers, the National Association shall prepare, maintain, and publish such a list. The presence or absence of the name of a pastor or minister on this list shall not be construed as either conferring or denying ministerial standing. The act of recordation shall be a mere acknowledgment of the fact that he is the pastor or minister of a member Church of the National Association. This list is compiled for the convenience of those concerned and as a source of information to the Churches, and it shall be published by the proper agency of the National Association as this is determined by the Executive Committee.

2. There shall also be published a supplemental list containing the names of ordained Congregational ministers who are retired, or no longer engaged in full-time

Christian service, missionaries, college and seminary professors, and licentiates.

3. In no case shall any person have the right to vote in a National Association meeting merely by virtue of the inclusion of his name in these lists. In every case a listed person shall be a member of a member Church of the National Association.

4. The National Association has no power to ordain, censure, or depose a minister,

or to sit as a council of reference in such cases.

- 5. Ordination is the right and business of the local Church, but the following statement of things commonly held among us is germane to the purposes of the National Association as stated in Article II of the Articles of Association:
 - (a) The local Church being complete under the Headship of Christ in all spiritual and ecclesiastical power has, and shall retain, the inalienable right to ordain its own minister. The local Church may call an ecclesiastical council as an expression of the fellowship of the Churches, but it shall be remembered that ordination is by the local Church.
 - (b) Ordination by the local Church is valid and sufficient, but it is conducive to orderliness and continuity of record that the fact of a minister's ordination be listed with a larger body or bodies. This may include a local association of Congregational Churches and the National Association. In the case of the National Association, such listing shall be done under the pertinent provisions of this Bylaw.



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
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
