Naturalis Historia (Latin for "Natural History") is an encyclopedia published circa AD 77-79 by Pliny the Elder. It is one of the largest single works to have survived from the Roman empire and purports to cover the entire field of ancient knowledge. The first volume includes the first five books. Bk. 1: Dedication; Bk. 2: the world and the elements; Bks. 3-5: countries, nations, seas, towns, havens, mountains, rivers, distances, and peoples who now exist or formerly existed.
