

NECROLOGY

OF THE

ENGLISH CONGREGATION

OF THE

Order of Saint Benedict,

FROM

1600 to 1883.



HE Death Roll of the English Benedictines will enkindle an honourable family pride in the breasts of the English sons of St. Benedict, and will awaken an interest in

many who are linked by ties of blood, reverence, and gratitude to the members of the Venerable Order. St. Benedict has never deserted England. From the commencement of its history, throughout its national life, during its catholic ages, in the times of persecution, in the revival of its christian life, the majestic figure of the great Patriarch has hovered over the land. To the old Saxon, he was not the apostle only, but the father, the guide, and the friend: not merely the priest and spiritual father, but the ruler of the church, the mentor

of the state, the tiller of the land, the teacher of the children, the mind of the nation, truly a man of light and leading, speaking by the voice of Alcuin and V. Bede, of St. Wilfrid and St. Dunstan, and of all those who made Saxon England the Isle of Saints. When the ruthless Dane ravaged the land he stood before the shrines, and saw the blood of his children stain the sanctuary. In Lanfranc he tempered the stern William, in St. Anselm he curbed the wild will of Rufus, in St. Thomas he stayed the lawless hand of Henry. In Stephen Langton he stood with the barons at Runnymede to wrest from John the liberty of the people, he was foremost in the struggle for the freedom of the serf and the burgher, and when the Red Rose fought with the White he was the mediator, softening the bitterness of strife, soothing the passions of war. Not merely guiding the destinies of the nation, he entered into the social life of the people; his churches arose in the valley and on the hill side, his minsters gathered the people around them, and when in the cathedral cities wondrous temples to the Living God grew out of the soil, he watched his children while they placed stone upon stone, shaped the graceful line, carved the capital and the moulding: when the intellect of the nation was centred in Oxford and Cambridge his spirit and guidance were there: in the city and the village he spoke to the little ones of the burgher and the peasant: he stored up the

wisdom of the fathers and the learning of the ancients within the cloistered walls of the homes of his children: he was the scribe and the printer: in the homestead, in the hamlet, in the rising town he was in the midst of the people, lightening their labours and soothing their sorrows: giving food to the poor, shelter to the wanderer, welcome to the traveller: preaching to the people the Word of God, breaking for them the Bread of Life, conveying to them God's pardon, and solacing them on their deathbed. In life and in death, to the sick and the poor, to the wise and the simple, St. Benedict with his paternal mien was ever near.

When Henry VIII. declared war against the Catholic faith in England, the first foe attacked was St. Benedict: the cells, the priories, and the lesser abbeys, those time-honoured homes of generations of black-robed monks were pillaged and seized, their treasures dispersed, and their heirlooms alienated: then followed the onslaught on the greater abbeys, those grand historic monuments that have indelibly emblazoned the name of St. Benedict on England's story: Glastonbury and Westminster, St. Alban's and St. Edmundsbury, Reading and Evesham, and the great temples and cathedrals through whose groined roofs the Benedictine chaunt had re-echoed for centuries, were stripped of their inmates, and the monks sent forth homeless, and outcasts in their own land. Glastonbury, Colchester, and Reading parted not with

their sons until the blood of their Abbots had been shed on the block. In Elizabeth's long reign of savage and vindictive persecution, the thousands of Benedictine monks scattered over the land died, one by one, in obscurity, poverty and neglect: no tablet or history records their fate, God alone knows and will one day reveal the years of suffering, the privation and hunger, the desolation and the isolation, the contempt and the affronts, that the homeless children of St. Benedict endured, ere they joined the 'corona fratrum' around their great Patriarch in heaven. Then came the revival. From across the seas, as of old, missionaries landed to commence anew in the seventeenth the old work of conversion of the seventh century, and men's thoughts were taken back to the old Benedictine missionaries who came with their silver cross to Thanet, and spread themselves and the faith over the Saxon land. England was the patrimony of St. Benedict: his name was entwined in the life and activity of the people, every town had its memorials, twelve widowed cathedrals silently mourned for his children; every page of history, every record and family pedigree, spoke of St. Benedict, and when English Catholic life revived, it could not but influence English hearts, and lead young men of English birth to seek the old familiar habit in a foreign clime, that, returning as children of St. Benedict, they might reclaim their father's inheritance.

Those who have taken part in this revival are recorded in the following pages, which mark the day when the labours of each one ceased, and he commenced above a life of intercession, watching the results of his own work and the progress of his brethren. Three hundred years have passed and still the revival continues, for God's time has not come for the conversion of the English people: one century of persecution and strife, a second of obscurity, a third of development, and still we wait for the grand harvest of souls. Unlike the Benedictine missionaries of old who came few in number and speedily conquered kingdom after kingdom, the missionaries of the second conversion have made but slow and gradual progress. If the progress has been slow, the difficulties have been greater. The first Benedictine missionaries came to a people simple and rude, if barbarous and semi-civilized: the symmetry of the Christian faith was a contrast to their crude religious belief, the beauty of the Christian worship eclipsed their pagan rites, the lustre of the Christian life of love outshone their savage code of morals: the conquest was comparatively easy, it was over the untutored mind, the unoccupied heart: it was the seed falling on the virgin soil. They offered to the wild Saxon not only faith and grace, but temporal benefits: they taught him the arts of civilized life, they cleared his forests, filled up his marshes, tilled his ground, built his houses, instructed

him in knowledge, trained his children, so that the Benedictine missionary as before observed, was not merely the Apostle of Saxon England, but the father, the guide and the friend. How altered were the prospects of the second conversion! A people who had known the truth, had through interest and self-indulgence cast off the faith: the veil of heresy had blinded their eyes to the light, the rancour of controversy had steeled their hearts against the truth; with one hand on the spoils of the old church, the other was wielding the sword to chase away the rightful owner; the doctrine of the church was rejected, her rites had no charm, her code of morals was too stringent: all the powers of a strong government were arrayed against the church, her temples were seized, her ministers outlawed, her sacrifice proscribed, her sacraments a crime, her children deprived of civil rights: instead of enriching with temporal benefits her missionaries had nothing to offer but civil death, fine, and imprisonment. With the zeal and self-sacrifice of St. Augustine and St. Paulinus, of St. Aidan and St. Birinus, these second Benedictine missionaries came to a changed and blighted land: the former entered into a land promised to their Patriarch, ripe for the harvest, flowing with milk and honey, the latter entered into the same patrimony devastated and desolated by the hand of the spoiler, who strong in his might had placed barrier and fortification against the entry. They came

with a grand tradition, a great name, an illustrious roll of ancestry, and emulating the deeds of their fathers, they faced the tribunal and the dungeon, the fetters and the rack, the halter and the knife of the executioner: in journeys and weariness, in alarms and escapes, in disguise and in hiding places, in hunger and poverty they toiled and struggled to obtain a footing for the faith in the land that their fathers had hallowed. Fifteen won the palm of martyrdom, and the names of Maurus Scot and Alban Roe, of Philip Powel and Ambrose Barlow are as glorious in the heroism of their death as the martyred heroes of the early church. Nine others passed to their crown within the prison walls deprived of the glory of martyrdom, yet suffering more than its pains. Few monks escaped the dungeon or exile in the seventeenth century, and the courage and zeal of these heroic men were tested by their eagerness to return again and again from exile to face toil, prison, and death. Such were the men whose names commence the roll in the following pages: men of indefatigable labour, indomitable energy, invincible courage, and saintly monastic life: of 330 Benedictine priests who died in the seventeenth century, one alone proved unfaithful to his religious vows, and in his old age he repented and returned to obedience. They were alone, separated from their brethren, away from their monasteries, but in their youth they had imbibed

the monastic spirit in the cloister, the three great principles of their founder, obedience, 'conversio morum,' and stability had been engraved in their hearts, and they were prepared, like their missionary brethren in the preceding centuries, to practise these monastic virtues in the sight of the world; in spite of danger and persecution, of trial and allurement, to be faithful in their obedience to rule, to be constant in that 'conversio morum' which they had acquired in the cloister, and to be staunch till death in that stability which is the crown of the Benedictine life.

In explanation of the terms that occur in the Necrology the casual reader will need a brief account of the origin and constitution of the present English Benedictine Congregation. After the dissolution of the monasteries by Henry VIII. in 1536 and 1539 the Benedictines were dispersed over the country. The progress of the Reformation during the reign of Edward VI. stopped the supply of catholic priests and the numbers of the clergy both secular and regular gradually diminished. Mary came to the throne nearly twenty years after the dissolution during that interval there had been no professions and death had considerably thinned the ranks of the Benedictine monks: an effort was made to reconstruct the Benedictine Congregation, and a community was gathered together under Abbot Feckenham within the venerable walls of Westminster Abbey. The reign of Mary was too brief to produce any marked progress, and Elizabeth again dispersed the community at Westminster. During her long sway persecution and banishment were added to the loss of the colleges and monasteries for training priests, and the total extinction of the clergy both secular and regular was imminent. A noble effort to establish seminaries abroad was successful, and young men left their native shore to be trained for the arduous work of missionaries, and on their return to take the place of the old clergy: the Jesuits with their characteristic zeal and sacrifice entered strenuously into the work, and took a large share of the toil and suffering. The glory of the old Benedictine name, and and the intimate connection of the order with England inspired many of the heroic band of volunteers with a desire for the Benedictine habit. This spontaneous desire was the more remarkable as there was no Benedictine centre in England, and their missionary fervour could have been satisfied in the seminaries, or in the Jesuit novitiate: it was a sign that St. Benedict had not deserted his patrimony and had obtained these vocations from God. Their attention was directed to Italy and Spain, and the strength of the feeling may be estimated from the fact that no less than fifty-two applied for the Benedictine habit, in the hope that they might be allowed to return to England to resuscitate the Order,

and recommence the work of St. Augustine and St. The monasteries in Italy in which these young men made their profession were Monte Cassino, St. Justina at Padua, St. George at Venice, La Cava, St. Paul at Rome, and others: in Spain at St. Emilian, St. Benedict at Valladolid, St. Facundus at Sahagun, St. Martin at Compostella, Montserrat, Najar, Onia, Cella Nouva, St. Sinbert, St. Millan, and others. In 1601 application was made to the Holy See to permit the English, who had been professed in the Cassinese Congregation, to return to their country and undertake the missionary labour, and in 1602 Clement VIII, like St. Gregory the Great, sent these monks with his approval and blessing to work for the conversion of England, and soon after a similiar brief was issued to those in the Spanish Congregation. The missioners entered the proscribed land, and were placed under the jurisdiction of two superiors who acted as the Vicars of the Cassinese and Spanish Generals.

In 1603 at Cisson near Wendlam in Norfolk at the house of Mr. Francis Wodehouse there lived F. Sigebert Buckley, a venerable patriarch of upwards of 85 years of age, who had been professed under Abbot Feckenham at Westminster. He was the last of his race, the sole survivor of the old Benedictines, forty-four years of his long life had been spent within prison walls for refusing the oath of Supremacy: his frame was bent, his step

feeble, his eye dimmed, his mind unclouded, and like Simeon of old his days had been prolonged, that he might see the fulfilment of his long hope and prayer for the restoration of the Order in England. In the midst of his solitude and rest, there came to him one day two young and earnest priests, F. Anselm Beech and F. Thomas Preston, who told him that they were Englishmen and Benedictines, and had arrived from Italy with a mission from the Pope to re-establish the Benedictines in England. The meeting was a touching one: on the one hand the speechless delight and gratification of the venerable monk at this answer to his life long prayer, his long deferred hope, his waiting for the dawn of a new day, the opening of a new spring; and on the other the elation and enthusiasm of the young men who at the very threshold of their career, were guided by Providence to the feet of the last survivor of a glorious past. The intercourse was long: the old man's words of welcome and thankfulness mingled with the expressions of attachment and veneration of the young missioners: the records of the past were recalled, the hopes of the future discussed, and they united in the strong determination that, if possible, the old English Congregation and traditions should be perpetuated by the means of the venerable F. Sigebert. The proposal was communicated to the superiors in Italy, and it was arranged that the next postulants should be clothed and professed in England by F. Buckley, that the connection with the old Congregation might be unbroken. Unfortunately at this juncture the fire of bigotry was re-enkindled by the Gunpowder Plot, and one of the victims was F. Sigebert Buckley, who in spite of his great age and infirmity again found himself in the cell of a prison.

The incarceration of the venerable patriarch threatened to overthrow the arrangement, but the importance of the connection and the zeal of the new missioners overcame every obstacle. F. Robert Sadler and F. Edward Maihew, two secular priests who applied to become Benedictines, were clothed with the habit, and passed the year noviceship under the direction of the Italian fathers. On Nov. 21st., 1607, the Feast of the Presentation of Our Lady, they were brought to the Gatehouse prison in London, and conducted to the cell of F. Sigebert Buckley to be professed. It was a strange scene: the dull November light peering through the barred window, shed a dim glimmer on the rough ungarnished walls, the bare table, the rude bench, and the mat that served for the prison bed: the feeble bent figure of the Confessor of the Faith in his 91st. year, with his pale face and glistening eyes that with the excitement had regained their brightness, formed a contrast to the kneeling forms of the two novices in the prime of life with eager faces lit up with religious fervour. He

received their vows, with trembling hands he arranged the habits, he gave them the kiss of peace, and then the sight left his eyes and he became stone blind: the last objects that on earth his eyes looked upon were his newly born children of St. Benedict. Never perhaps in the History of the Church is there recorded an act of similar significance, for by that profession were communicated all the rights and privileges of the old Benedictines in England; they were the accumulated rights of a thousand years from St. Augustine in 596, to himself in 1607: the possessions and rights of the Great Abbeys, of the numerous monasteries, of the twelve Cathedral Priories; all the privileges bestowed by Popes and Bishops, the Indulgences conceded by the Holy See, grants and immunities from King and Baron, all that Benedictines could claim for a thousand years were centred in himself as the sole survivor, and communicated to his disciples in that rough cell in the Gatehouse. This act of F. Buckley was formally confirmed by Paul V. in 1612 by the Brief Cum accepimus. F. Sigebert was shortly after released from prison, F.F. Anselm Beech, and Robert Preston guided the steps of the blind old patriarch to a safe retreat, ministered to him in his declining years with the affection of children, and, when his days were accomplished comforted his deathbed, and watched him pass away to his reward on Feb. 12th, 1610, at the advanced age of 93.

In the meantime the Anglo-Spanish fathers had with equal zeal entered into the missionary work: a number of eager, earnest monks had come from the Abbeys in Spain, and seeing the difficulties and dangers of the life, were anxious to obtain more labourers and to make the work permanent: as the Italians had secured the connection with the past, they directed their attention to perpetuation in the future. They saw the necessity of a centre, a monastery where the monks could be specially trained for the mission, and to which they could send young men to whom God had given a vocation as Benedictine missionaries. F. Augustine Bradshaw was able in 1605 to commence a monastery at Douai under the patronage of St. Gregory, and soon after was instrumental in opening another at Dieulward in Lorraine dedicated to St. Laurence. In 1611 a third was commenced at St. Malo in Brittany, under the special protection of St. Benedict, and in 1615 F. Francis Walgrave founded the monastery of St. Edmund at Paris. Thus in a few years there were four monasteries established to supply the demand for missioners, and there was every prospect of speedy development when difficulties arose from the nature of the threefold jurisdiction. The Italian, the Spanish, and the old English Congregation, each had a superior in England, and it was felt that it would be difficult to direct the labours of the Benedictines with success, unless they

amalgamated into one Congregation. Steps were at once taken to procure a union, but the adjustment of the rights and claims of the three Congregations was a matter of tact and delicacy. The negotiations terminated in the appointment by the Holy See of nine Definitors, three chosen from each Congregation, who met under the presidency of Cardinal Bentivoglio the Legate in France, and drew up the Constitutions that were to form the basis of the New English Congregation, which comprised the missionaries then in England and the monks of the newly erected monasteries. Paul V. who throughout the negotiations had taken a deep interest in the construction of the New Congregation, formally ratified the proceedings, and approved of the Constitution and form of government, by the Brief Ex Incumbenti in 1619, in which, in order to secure the missionary character of the Congregation, he enacted that, besides the ordinary vows, each monk on profession should take an oath to labour on the mission in England when called upon by his superiors. The first General Chapter under the new Constitution was held 1621. The speedy organisation and rapid development of the New Congregation must be regarded as a signal mark of the blessing of Providence on this second Benedictine Mission to England. In the space of twenty years 52 missionary fathers had come from Italy and Spain, the link with the old Congregation had been

secured, four monasteries established, 87 professed in those monasteries and others professed in England, the whole had been welded into one Congregation under one government, and all with the repeated blessing and direct encouragement of the Holy See; and this at a time of persecution and danger, when some were shedding their blood on the scaffold and others were confined in prison, this rapid development of internal organisation will bear comparison with that of the first Benedictine Missionaries. Urban VIII. in 1633 by the Bull Plantata crowned the edifice, confirmed all that had been done by his predecessors, endowed the Congregation with privileges, and enacted that it should be the only Congregation in England, commanding all other Benedictines either to join or to return to their monasteries.

Such is a brief outline of the origin of the Congregation, but the terms employed in the Necrology will scarcely be intelligible to the ordinary reader without a sketch of the form of government. A distinctive feature in the structure of the Congregation was the separation of the missioners, and erecting them into corporate bodies distinct from the monasteries. This was a new departure in Benedictine life, but it was adopted by the Definitors in consequence of the missionary character of the English Congregation, as the most efficient means of carrying out its end. To the monastery was consigned

the task of instilling the principles of monastic life and of educating and training the missioner, and as soon as he was fit for the Apostolic Ministry, he passed to the care of a superior with a special knowledge and experience of missionary labour, who, living in the midst of the missions, could watch over, guide, control, and teach his subjects. This arrangement, specially sanctioned by the Holy See, avoided the difficulty of obtaining a Superior with capacity and ability sufficient to exact monastic observance and discipline in the monastery, and at the same time to exercise supervision over missionary work, and it moreover secured the advantage of a Superior who, besides having the experience, could give his whole time and undivided attention to the requirements of the mission which was the end of the Institute. The Congregation is composed of distinct corporate bodies, consisting of the two Missionary Provinces of Canterbury and York and the several Monasteries: over each of these is a Superior, a Prelate with regular jurisdiction, in the Provinces called Provincial, in the Monasteries, Prior. Over the whole Congregation, as the Superior of the Superiors, is the President General, who is attached to no Monastery or Province, but holds the highest position of honour and jurisdiction: his interest is that of the whole body as distinct from that of Monastery or Province: he has the power of visitation, the control of the Superiors, he alone

can move subjects from monastery to mission, mission to monastery, or from monastery to monastery; his power and jurisdiction are limited only by the Constitutions and Canon Law. In matters of importance he has the assistance of three fathers who are called "Definitors of the Regimen," who are not allowed to hold any office with jurisdiction, in order that their attention may be given to the general interests of the Congregation: they also form a Court of Appeal. Thus the Provinces and Monasteries are presided over by a Superior whose duty it is to attend to the well-being of the separate bodies, while the general interests of the whole are confided to the President General and the Definitors of the Regimen, who are able to adjust any conflict of interest to the advantage of the whole Congregation.

Another distinctive feature adopted by the Definitors was that of temporary superiors instead of superiors for life. All offices, including that of the President General, are held for a term of four years, but at the end of each period of four years the officials are eligible for re-election. A capable superior can thus be continued in office, an unsuccessful one replaced, and moreover greater facility is afforded for employing good administrators in different offices. Every four years the General Chapter assembles and is composed of the Superiors, Definitors, and other officials and dignitaries. It is the supreme legislative authority and ultimate court of appeal:

it controls the elections, examines the accounts of Provinces and Monasteries, receives the report of the visitations, and confirms or rejects the acts of the government during the previous four years.

The Provinces of Canterbury and York each form a corporate body of which the missioners are the community. Each Province has two "Definitors of the Province" to assist and advise the Provincials, a "Procurator" for the transaction of business matters, and holds separate funds and property. The Provincial is a Prelate in the same sense as the Prior in a monastery, and has the same authority and jurisdiction over the missioners as if they were living in the monastery. The Province of York comprises all the missions in the six northern counties together with Derby, Cheshire, Nottingham, Lincoln, and Scotland: the Province of Canterbury includes the rest of England, and Wales.

The Monasteries are distinct from each other, and form separate corporations with superior, council, separate funds and property. Each monk on profession becomes affiliated to the Monastery of profession: when on the mission and removed from the jurisdiction of the Prior, he is not absolutely detached from the Monastery, it is his home to which he returns in infirmity or age, or when not employed on the mission. The principal officials are the Sub-prior, the Novice Master, the Junior Master over the young men after

profession, the Cellerarius for matters of business and temporal affairs. The monasteries that have belonged to the Congregation are:—

1.—St. Gregory the Great, founded in 1605 at Douai, by F. Augustine Bradshaw, through the munificence of Abbot Cavarel. At the French Revolution the community was received by Sir E. Smythe at Acton Burnell, Shropshire, in 1793, where it remained till 1814, when it removed to Downside, near Bath.

2.—St. Laurence, founded in 1608 at Dieulward in Lorraine: at the French Revolution, the Community obtained temporary shelter at Acton Burnell, with that of St. Gregory's, in 1794. In 1795 it removed to Birkenhead, in 1796 to Scoles, near Prescot, in 1797 to Vernon Hall, in 1802 to Parbold, and finally towards the end of 1802 to Ampleforth, near York.

3.—St. Benedict, founded in 1611 at St. Malo in Brittany. It was handed over to the Maurist Congregation in 1669.

4.—St. Edmund the King and Martyr, founded in 1615 in Paris. At the Revolution in 1793 the community was imprisoned in the monastery itself for fourteen months. In 1796 the monastery was restored, and in 1804 the monks were again expelled. In 1823 after an interval of twenty years, the community was re-established in the old buildings of St. Gregory's at Douai.

5.—SS. Adrian and Dionysius: an Abbey at Lambspring in Germany, lent to the English Congregation by the Bursfeld Congregation in 1644. In 1803 it was suppressed by the Prussian government, and the monks were allowed to remain till death on a small pension. It was re-established at Broadway, Worcester, in 1834, but relinquished in 1841.

6.—St. Michael and the Angels, founded at Belmont, Hereford, in 1859. A decree of the Holy See ordered a common novitiate, and that at the end of the year of noviceship, the young monks after their simple profession should remain three years in a house of studies before returning to their monastery for solemn profession. This monastery, attached to the Pro-Cathedral of Newport and Menevia, was erected to carry out the designs of the Holy See. The Diocese has a Benedictine Chapter, some of the Canons are resident in the monastery and others are non-resident: the Prior is hence a "Cathedral Prior."

7.—The Abbey of Our Lady of Consolation, which is the only convent of nuns under the jurisdiction of the President General: other convents of English Benedictine nuns are under the jurisdiction of the Bishop of the Diocese and do not belong to the English Congregation. It was founded at Cambray in 1625. At the French Revolution in 1793, the community was imprisoned, and after its release obtained a temporary

shelter at Woolton in 1795, whence it removed to Salford, near Evesham in 1807, and finally to Stanbrook, near Worcester, in 1838.

The Cathedral Priors.—Before the Reformation the Benedictines formed the Chapter of twelve of the old Cathedrals. They chaunted the Divine Office and conducted the services of the Cathedral: they had all the privileges of a Chapter of the Diocese and elected the Bishop. The Bishop nominally took the place of the Abbot, and the acting superior of the community was called Cathedral Prior. In recognition of these ancient privileges, Pope Urban VIII. in the Bull Plantata in 1633, enacted that these titles should be perpetuated in the new Congregation: the Bull itself nominates the first twelve who were to hold the dignity, and bestows on them the privileges, prerogatives, and immunities of their predecessors before the Reformation. The Bull not only authorizes the Congregation to continue the titles, but commands it never at any time or on any account to abolish or discontinue them, and renders invalid any attempt to do so. The Cathedral Priories perpetuated are those of Canterbury, Winchester, Durham, Ely, Worcester, Norwich, Rochester, Bath, Coventry, Peterboro', Gloucester, and Chester. The offices confer no jurisdiction but are titular merely: they give precedence and a seat in the General Chapter, and are bestowed on those who have been eminent in the Congregation.

The Titular Abbots.—For a similar reason the Holy See has during the present century granted the dignity of Titular Abbot, to perpetuate the great Abbeys that rendered the Benedictine name illustrious before the Reformation. The titles give no jurisdiction, only honour and precedence: at present they are those of Westminster, Glastonbury, St. Albans, St. Edmundsbury, Evesham, and St. Mary's, York.

The Missions have varied in number and character according to times and circumstances. In the days of persecution when liberty and life were at stake, the missionary fathers usually had no settled abode, but passed from place to place to minister to the scattered Catholics, and to elude the attention of spies and informers. With an occasional change of name, as well as concealment of residence, it is difficult to trace the missioner in the seventeenth century: there were no public chapels, mass and other ecclesiastical functions were celebrated in private houses with closed doors and sentinels, means of support for the priest were precarious, he was dependent mostly on the alms of the faithful, and was doubtless often in distress when access to a benefactor was difficult. In every county in England we find records of their labours: London seems to have been the basis of operations, for in the Metropolis there were always Benedictines, and at times regular communities were established at Somerset House and St.

James' Palace under the protection of a Catholic Queen. In the eighteenth century the active persecution diminished, and the Benedictine missions became more fixed: personal liberty was more secure and the missioners could be known and recognized as priests; they were able to erect or hire some room, that bore the name if not the appearance of a Catholic Chapel. The want of funds for support compelled the priests in many cases to remain with a Catholic family of position, and the chapel within, or attached to, the mansion was used by the Catholics of the neighbourhood, Towards the end of the century in the larger towns public chapels were erected usually in retired streets to escape notice. During these two centuries on account of the small number of Catholics, and the meagre means of support, the missions, with the exception of London, were served by one priest only, who lived by himself, receiving regular visits from his superior, and meeting his brethren occasionally at an appointed centre. The Emancipation Act and the immigration from Ireland changed the features of the missionary work. Congregations increased rapidly, funds were more abundant, churches were multiplied, chaplaincies relinquished; in the country the offerings of the people and the endowments of the wealthy, provided both chapel and permanent support; in the towns the labour was too great for one and the means of support sufficient for two or more, so that

in many places the number of priests at one mission was gradually increased, thus securing the society of their own brethren, and greater facility for discipline and observance; the rapid means of communication rendered access between the brethren and the superior easy; at the present time the Provincials are within a few hours journey of any of their subjects. Thus commencing in persecution and without home or support, the Benedictine missions have gradually developed into quasireligious houses with discipline and regular routine.

This preliminary explanation will place the reader in a position to understand the brief references in the Necrology. The names are arranged in three methods, Chronologically, as a Calendar, and Alphabetically. In the Chronological arrangement the names occur as each monk dies, and where the year is uncertain, the name is placed either at the date when he is last known to have been alive, or in the year in which from letters and documents he is supposed to have died. The change from the "Old Style" to the "Gregorian," renders the actual day in some cases uncertain, as it is difficult to ascertain which style the quoted document adopted. The aliases, or names assumed for the purpose of concealment or for other reasons, have been added in order that the individual may be recognized under either name. Besides the mere name and date of death, greater interest has been given by the addition

of other dates: the year and place of birth, the year and monastery of profession, the year of ordination, and the year and place of the different missions at which each was stationed. In many the record is imperfect from causes mentioned above, but when complete, sufficient is given to trace any individual from profession till death. Among the many dates that are inserted there are doubtless inaccuracies, but every care and precaution has been taken to secure correctness. F Allanson's Manuscripts have been freely used, the various necrologies and profession books examined, church registers and memorial tablets referred to, and any source of information consulted that might elucidate a date. The list of the nuns of Our Lady of Consolation has been revised at the Abbey at Stanbrook, and compared with their letters and documents.

The Calendar gives the names in the order of the days of the year. In the necrologies kept in the monasteries, when the actual day of death is unknown, it has been the custom to enter the name on some other day, that of profession, ordination, or birth, in order that the name may not be omitted altogether in the list: and this has given rise to considerable confusion. As all the names are inserted in the chronological arrangement, those with uncertain dates are omitted in the Calendar. Each day in the list records the actual anniversary of the death, and it is hoped that it may

secure a special memento in the Holy Sacrifice for those whose names occur on the day.

The Alphabetical arrangement is given to serve for an Index, and accordingly both year and day are inserted to facilitate reference to the Chronological order, and to the Calendar. The second name or alias is repeated, so that an individual may be referred to under either name.





OF THE

Abbey of Our Lady of Consolation, Cambray.



H

HE same spirit that guided the Benedictine
Missionaries in England, and the success
that attended the rapid development of
the English Congregation, induced many

ladies to whom God had given a vocation for a cloistered life, to desire the restoration of the Benedictine convents that had studded the land before the Reformation. The erection of a Convent in England was impossible, and hence emulating the zeal of the Benedictine monks, they were anxious to establish a community in a foreign clime, so that in more propitious times they might return to their native land, and continue the old Benedictine life. The result was the formation of the Abbey of Cambray,

the origin of which is narrated in Weldon's Chronological Notes recently published. Nine young English ladies were gathered together by the Benedictine fathers to form the nucleus of a community: a great granddaughter of Sir Thomas More with two of her cousins, a daughter of the Vavasours of Hazlewood, of the Morgans of Weston, Warwicks., of the Gascoignes of Barnelow, Yorks., of the Watsons of Parke, Beds., with two to serve as lay sisters, formed the little band. They crossed the sea and took possession of a ruined monastery near the town of Cambray, a desolate place, with four dilapidated walls standing without a roof, and requiring the expenditure of five hundred pounds, a large sum in those days, to render it habitable. It was a dependency of the Abbey of Femy, and was lent to them free of rent, on condition that they were to leave after six months' notice on reimbursement of their expenses over repairs. On Dec. 31st, 1623, the Archbishop of Cambray said the first mass in the new chapel, and assisted by the President General, F. Rudesind Barlow, solemnly clothed the nine postulants with the Benedictine habit. Three English nuns came from the Benedictine Convent at Brussels to superintend the rising community, and on January 1st, 1625, the nine novices made their solemn vows, and this is considered the foundation day of the Abbey of Our Lady of Consolation.

In 1638 they obtained the donation of the building, and the gift was ratified by a special Bull of Urban viii., another signal proof of his fostering care of the English Benedictines. The building was now their own; extensions and improvements were undertaken, gardens and houses were purchased to enlarge the enclosure, and in a short time the establishment was not unworthy of the name of an Abbey. There these English Dames secured the calm and peaceful life of the cloister: they rose at mid-night for the Divine office, and carried out the Holy Rule of St. Benedict as modified by the Constitutions delivered to them by the General Chapter. They were exiles in a foreign land with an exile's hope and longing to return, they watched with eager interest the workings of God's grace in their own country, and by their intercession and good works helped their brothers who were toiling and suffering in their beloved England: many a grace, many a conversion was due to the earnest silent prayers of the nuns before the altar at Cambray. In peace they lived their days and in peace they died, and as each one calmly passed away in her Convent cell she was laid in her more lasting cell within the Abbey walls: and as time rolled on there was a community in the convent and a community in the cemetery. Into their convent home was received a limited number of the daughters of English families for education: it was not a boarding-

school or academy, with its trim line of demarkation where school ends and convent begins, but the girls lived in the enclosure as true "alumnæ," a part of the Benedictine family, growing up in traditions of piety, and combining the training of the heart with the culture of the mind. The staunch old Catholic families of England loved the old Benedictine tradition and the old Benedictine method, for on the roll of the alumna of Cambray occur again and again the names of the Widdringtons, the Plumptons, the Constables, the Stourtons, the Radcliffes, the Middletons, the Howards, the Meynells, the Jenisons, the Gascoignes whose daughters left the Cambray cloister to perpetuate Catholic life in England, to be examples of Catholic principle in the family homestead and in the midst of the Court, to be the mothers of sons and daughters whose fidelity to the old faith and the old piety has kept for us the old religion in the land.

For one hundred and seventy years the peaceful convent life continued in monastic observance, until the upheaving of the French Revolution shook the framework of society. The Republic was established, the war against order, society, and religion had commenced: nobles and ladies, priests and nuns, were hurried indiscriminately to the guillotine: religion was proscribed, the churches closed, the religious garb declared illegal, and to add to the difficulty of the situation the allied

army was approaching Cambray. In anxious terror the sisters knew not what was to come, each day brought its sinister rumours, and each day increased the fervour of their prayers for the safety of their convent home: as a precaution the alumnæ were dismissed to their families. On the evening of Sunday, Oct. 13th, 1793, the twenty nuns who then formed the community, retired at 8.30 for the first sleep before the mid-night office, when a thundering at the enclosure door aroused the whole convent. The Lady Abbess, Mother Lucy Blyde, after a little delay opened the door, and four commissioners of the local authority at Cambray, roughly announced that they had come to take possession of the convent, and to declare them prisoners of the Republic. The trembling nuns assembled before the commissioners, who by the light of a lamp read a long official document, and forthwith went officially through the whole enclosure from room to room to affix their seal on all papers and documents, threatening the direct punishment if the least article of property were concealed. Aroused by the noise and confusion their chaplain, the Venerable F. Augustine Walker, hastened from his little house close by, to render assistance and inspire courage, but his entreaties and expostulations were sternly silenced. A long process was drawn up, to which was added the desire of the sisters to be allowed to remain prisoners in their own convent.

Placing a guard, they left the enclosure at eleven o'clock, and proceeded to the Chaplain's house, where after taking possession, and fixing their seal on all property, they arrested F. Walker and his socius F. James Higginson, and the nuns from their windows saw them at mid-night marched off to prison.

Five fearful days of terror and uncertainty followed, during which the gates were strictly guarded: no intimation of their fate was given, whether death, exile, or imprisonment, and day after day they expected to be summoned to hear their doom. On Friday, Oct. 18th, a troop of Hussars surrounded the Abbey, and a company entered the enclosure, headed by a brutal swaggering official of Cambray. In savage and insulting terms he ordered that all should clear out of the house within a quarter of an hour; he would allow no trunk or box, but each might take what clothes could be carried in a small bundle. He stamped about the room and, brandishing his stick, hurried the weeping and terrified nuns in their preparations for departure, so that some in their grief and stupor could not even gather together a change of clothes. In less than half-an-hour, with oaths and threats, they were hustled down to the entrance ignorant of what was to happen, and when the door was opened they saw a troop of Hussars with naked swords guarding some rude open country carts, into which, without ceremony, they were

hurried. In tears and mute agony they thus were parted from their loved Abbey, their peaceful convent life was roughly crushed, they were torn from their quiet home, their beloved altar, their cells, their treasured garden and enclosure, their departed sisters sleeping tranquilly in the little cemetery, and huddled together in these rude carts they took their last look at their dear Cambray. Surrounded by soldiers, exposed to the gaze of the people, insulted by the jeers of the mob, with little rest and scant food, these ladies whose days had been spent in total seclusion behind the grille, were for five days jolted along the public road for about sixteen miles each day.

The Hussars were not told their destination, but each night received orders for the next day. Friday night was spent in a ruin at Bapaume, Saturday in the citadel at Peronne, Sunday in the prison at Ham, Monday, in an inn at Noyon, and on Tuesday they arrived at Compiègne, the place fixed upon for their incarceration. The building that served for a prison was an old convent of the Order of the Visitation in which the prisoners from Cambray, fifty-two in number, were lodged that night, the old infirmary of the convent being assigned to the twenty-one sisters who formed the community. The number of prisoners increased day by day: some died, some lost their reason, some were led to the guillotine, but the vacancies were

speedily filled by fresh arrivals of prisoners in every rank of life. On November 25th the community had the sad consolation of welcoming the aged F. Augustine Walker, F. James Higginson, and the Hon. Thomas Roper, who had been sent from Cambray to share their lot: their delight was immediately mitigated by a prohibition of all communication, lest they might assist at any religious service.

The horrors of a French prison at the time of the Revolution are well known from published histories and memoirs, and from these we can imagine the trials and hardships that the daughters of St. Benedict endured, during the eighteen months of their imprisonment. Confined in one room with the windows nailed up, with one mattress and one blanket for each, without change of clothes, living on the gaol allowance of one pound of bread a day and a meal at the expense of the prisoners jointly, having their names called over twice each day to prevent escape, the sisters passed eighteen long months without mass, and not daring to say their prayers aloud. Sickness was inevitable: in January, 1794, fever broke out, and one by one the nuns were stretched helpless on their prison bed, and became so weak that the living were scarcely able to assist the dying. On January 13th, the venerable F. Walker at the age of 73 breathed his last after an illness of but 24 hours: on January 14th, died D.

Anselma Ann, aged 79; on the 21st, D. Teresa Walmesley, aged 55; on February 6th, S. Ann Pennington, a lay sister in her 60th year, and on April 3rd, D. Margaret Burgess, aged 72. Thus four of the little band, their lamps prepared, their hearts chastened by suffering, unconscious of the prison bed, calmly went forth to meet the Bridegroom as if from their dear cells at Cambray, and their bodies were laid in a prison grave far away from their sisters in their own little cemetery. Slowly the rest recovered; weak and emaciated they rose from their bed of sickness to meet greater privations and hardships. The rigour of the discipline and the harshness of the gaolers increased: they were subjected to a rigid examination by coarse officials, their persons searched by rude hands, their crosses, reliquaries, even their silver thimbles seized, their scanty pittance of food was reduced, and sometimes limited to coarse brown bread and water. In the middle of June sixteen Carmelite nuns were brought to the prison, and a short time after their arrival they received a letter of encouragement from an emigrant priest, their former confessor: this was a crime unpardonable, they were ordered to Paris, took an affectionate leave of the Cambray nuns by signs and glestures, and were all guillotined at Paris on July 16th, the Feast of Our Lady of Mount Carmel. Shortly after their departure the Mayor insisted on the Cambray nuns putting off the religious

habit which was proscribed by law: they had no other clothes, and the Mayor gave them some old ones left by the Carmelites, precious but ominous relics; one of the sandals is still preserved at Stanbrook.

At the beginning of 1795 the rigour of the prison life relaxed: F. James Higginson and the Hon. Thos. Roper were allowed to go on parole into the town, and they were indefatigable in their efforts to relieve the necessities of the sisters. In April the Mayor advised them to petition for their passports to England, he forwarded the memorial to Paris, and it was granted. As an act of thanksgiving for their deliverance they managed to procure the sacred vessels and vestments, and had the consolation of hearing the first mass and only mass during the eighteen months. By the forethought and generosity of Edward Constable, Esq., of Burton, they were able to draw money from Hamburg to provide for the journey. Two carts were obtained and they left Compiègne on April 24th, 1795, were conveyed to Calais, crossed the sea to Dover, and arrived in London on Monday, May 4th, where they were charitably received in a house prepared for them by the Marchioness of Buckingham, who, although a Protestant, had compassion on these innocent victims of the Revolution. Destitute and penniless they came to London, but found warm and generous friends who were eager to supply their wants: Mr. Coghlan, the 4

the

Catholic bookseller of those days, Edward Esq., of Burton, Francis Sheldon, Esq., of Wycliffe, were the most active in the work of charity. As soon as their arrival was notified, the President General, F. Gregory Cowley, at once made arrangements for their establishment, and Dr. Brewer secured for their lodging and maintenance a ladies' school attached to the mission at Woolton, Lancashire, where they arrived on May 21st, 1795. They resumed conventual life and monastic observance as far as practicable, and remained until the generosity of Francis Berkely, Esq., of Spetchley, offered them rent free his manor of Salford, near Evesham, Worcestershire, and in 1807 they took possession of their new home. Their numbers increased and their fortunes prospered, and before his death they were able to purchase Stanbrook Hall, Worcester, where they removed in 1838. Here they have built a beautiful church, dedicated in 1871, and commenced their new Abbey in 1838, one wing of which is now completed, and thus Providence through suffering and trial has firmly established the daughters of St. Benedict in their native land, and the Abbev of Stanbrook is a fit representative of the convents of the old Benedictine times.

In 1652 the Congregation established another convent in Paris under the title of Our Lady of Good Hope, to which six nuns from Cambray were transferred to

assist at the foundation, but as this convent was under the jurisdiction of the Bishop, it did not form part of the English Congregation: it is now perpetuated at Colwich, Staffordshire.

In the following list D. signifies Dame, S. Sister, M. Mother. The first Christian name is the Baptismal, the second the Religious name, if only one it is the Religious name; where the Religious name is known to be the same as the baptismal it is repeated. The year of profession is in some cases approximate only as the Profession book was not preserved at the Revolution.
