P R E F A C E.

THE ancient, nervous and expressive Caledonian language, commonly called the Scots Gailic, once the Language of the British isles, *and possibly* of the greatest part of Europe, has, for ages past, been gradually on the decline. The cause or causes which have operated this effect have not escaped notice ; it is therefore needless to detail them ; but they still exist, and, if not obviated or suspended, must, in the order of events, ultimately effect its total extirpation. To the Antiquarian and the Clastic Highlander, this consideration has proved a cause of serious mortification and regret, and hence they have called aloud for means to prevent an effect so dishonourable to their country.

To the several laudable motives of promoting Piety and Religious Light, which suggested the Translation of the Scriptures into the Gailic, we may add a Patriotic wish for the preservation of the Language ; though, when that measure was adopted, this effect might not have been in view, nor have engaged attention, yet it has resulted from it. That work was apportioned to Clergymen in the Highland districts, whose Knowledge of the Language, added to their taste for polite Literature, best qualified them for the undertaking ; and it has been executed in a manner that does honour to their Taste and Judgment. To this we may add a metrical Translation of the Psalms, with other Religious Tracts, Ancient Songs, Poems and Proverbs, which have been collected and published for the same purpose.

How far these well intended labours may contribute to the revival, or preservation of this Venerable Language, time only can determine.

One thing is certain, and a point of no small importance, that the Orthography has been much improved, if not completely fixed.

Over and above what has been done by such able hands, this Vocabulary may also have its use; it is a mite cast into the common stock, and with the same honest patriotic view: Care has been taken to avoid in it such terms and idioms as are either obsolete or not generally understood, or have not found their way to the prefs in other works.

The author does not indeed pretend, that it contains every vocable in use, or that it is a perfect work; nor will a Candid Public expect a perfect work from a private individual: The Orthography, he flatters himself, will give general satisfaction; and if it be found useful, as far as it goes, he hopes to meet the approbation of every admirer of the Language.

To the Antiquarian he thinks it will afford amusement. He is not without hopes, that young men designed for the service of the Church, whose attention to Classical pursuits may have prevented a Critical study of this Language, (though their mother tongue,) and who may be stationed in the Highland districts, will derive some assistance from it. And there is likewise a probability, that in the Highland Schools, it may accelerate the acquirement of the English Language, which is so eagerly pursued, and which seems exclusively the only object of attention and pursuit.

Considering, however, how lightly the Gaelic Language is esteemed by those who have no other; how little it is affected by the half taught English Scholar; how much Highlanders in general have lost all relish for their native Language, the Author thought he saw little encouragement for this work. But the Highland Society of Scotland, whose Patriotism extends to every thing connected with the honour as well as the improvement of their Country, with a Liberality that be-speaks their Zeal, have enabled him to bring it forward; and if any advantage results from it, to that respectable body it must be ascribed, whose patronage he will be as ambitious to merit, as anxious to preserve.

Some individuals of the Society, for whom the Author entertains a high and just regard, expressed a wish that a Counter part, or English and Gailic Vocabulary might be added, deeming it necessary to complete the work. This was not his original design; thinking it, however, his duty to comply with their desire he, already has commenced the selection and arrangement; and if this performance meets with encouragement, the second part will in due time come forward. In the mean while, he embraces this occasion of expressing his warm and grateful acknowledgements to that Society for the honour they have done him, the favours they have conferred upon him; and if this performance meets their approbation, he will consider the trouble of compiling it fully and abundantly rewarded.

NEW VOCABULARY:

GAILIC AND ENGLISH,

RULES for Reading the Gailic Language.

I. OF THE LETTERS.

THE Alphabet of the ancient Caledonian language consists of seventeen letters; *a, b, c, d, e, f, g, i, l, m, n, o, p, r, s, t, u*; which are divided into vowels and consonants. The aspirate *b*, is now reckoned by some a letter, (though it begins no word in this language, except some interjections, as Ho! Ha! &c.) The general use of it shall be noticed afterwards.

II. OF THE VOWELS IN GENERAL.

A Vowel is a letter that makes a compleat sound of itself, without the aid of any other: They are five in number, *a, e, i, o, u*, which are divided into broad and small vowels; *a, o, u*, are broad, and *e, i*, small.

In words of more than one syllable, if the foregoing end with a broad vowel, the next must begin with a broad likewise; but if with a small, then the next must begin with the same; accordingly it would be im-

proper

proper to write *carid*, a friend, and not *caraid*; *leisachadb*, to mend, and not *leasichadb*, agreeable to the well known adage.

Leathan re Leathan,
Agus Coal re Caol,
Leughar is Sgriobhar,
Gach focal fan Tsaoghal.

No vowel is silent at the end of words.

The same vowel is never doubled in any word.

All the vowels are sounded, sometimes long, at other times short: To prevent mistakes, the long ought to be marked thus; *àitbne*, (long.) a command, *aitbne*, (short.) to know, *àite*, l. a place, *ait*, s. glad, *gàradb*, l. a garden, *garadb*, s. a cave or den, *àud*, l. jealous, or zeal, *eire*, s. a burthen, *àigbeach*, l. to cry, *eagal*, s. fear, *mile*, l. a mile, a thousand, *mil*, s. honey, *mìr*, l. a piece, *mire*, s. mirth, *òglach*, l. a servant, *eganach*, s. a youth, *dòcas*, l. hope, *doeann*, s. hurt, *ùir*, l. dust, *uigse*, s. water, *ùil*, l. the eye, *suilbhcir*, s. pleasant.

All the vowels, in words of more than one syllable, are sounded short, except in the first, as *a* in the English word woman; *e* as in women; *i* as *ee* in feed; *o* as in forgotten; *u* as *oo* in foot; but shorter and more obscure.

III. OF THE VOWELS SEPARATELY.

1. *A* generally sounds long, like *au* in English; as *àdbmbor*, fortunate, *àr*, slaughter, *gàbbadb*, danger; sometimes short, like *a* in the English words what, that; as *abar*, a mire, *abair*, say thou, &c.

2. *A* before *dh*, or *gh*, sounds like the diphthong *ao*, in the following words; as *adblac*, to bury, *adbarc*, a horn, *adbart*, a bolster, *agbaidh*, the face, *magb*, a field; but like *ao* long in *àdbbar*, a cause, *àlbradb*, warship, and some others.

E

E sounds like *ai* in praise, in *é*, or *é*, he, *re*, during the time of, &c.

2. *E* likewise sounds long in the following and some others; *cè* the earth, *tè*, a woman, and *dè* yesterday, *èigin*, a strait, *èacail*, a disease; the difference here is one of many cases to be learned only by the ear when spoken gracefully.

I

1. I sounds long, like *ee* in English, in *mìn*, soft, *sìtb*, peace, *tìr*, a country, *nìos* up, &c. or short, *min*, meal, *smig*, the chin, *sì*, there, *nithe*, things, &c.

2. I sounds obscure and short in *is*, and, *is*, am, &c.

O

1. O sounds like *o* English ; in oak, ear, in *ðg*, young, *ðr*, gold, *lòn*, provision, *fòs*, also, *dòcbas*, hope, *mòr*, great, *bò*, a cow, *tròcair*, mercy, &c. ; short in *lòt*, to wound, *gort*, famine, *còpan*, a cup, *mhàidh*, praise, *moigail*, awake, &c.

2. O frequently sounds somewhat long like *o* English, in bone, horn ; as *lòm*, bare, *tòll*, a hole, *tobar*, a well, *cògnamb*, help, &c.

3. O, before gh, sounds often like *ao*, or *i* short ; as *logba*, forgiveness, *rogbuinn*, choice, *bogba*, a bow, &c.

U

U, when accented, sounds always like *oo* in English ; as *ðr*, fresh, *brùite*, bruised, *dlùtb*, near, *gnùis*, face ; or short, as *ubb*, an egg, *urras*, a surety, *uile*, all, *uinnecg*, a window.

IV. OF THE DIPHTHONGS IN GENERAL.

A Diphthong is the union of two vowels in the same syllable : They are thirteen in number, viz. *æe*, *ai*, *ao*, *ea*, *ci*, *eo*, *eu*, *iw*, *iu*, *ci*, *ua*, *ui* ; *ao*, and *eu*, are improper diphthongs, having only one simple sound, all the rest are proper diphthongs, having a mixt sound of both the vowels of which they are composed ; some more, others less, which is easily learned by the ear, when read or pronounced by a good speaker ; *eu*, *ia*, and *ua*, are always sounded long ; *ao*, *eo*, and *iu*, are long at the end of monosyllables, and for the most part in words of more than one syllable ; the rest are sometimes long, sometimes short.

All vowels and diphthongs, and monosyllables, when immediately followed by two consonants, are long.

In all words of more than one syllable, the diphthongs are always short and obscure, except in the first.

Note. The meeting of two vowels in Gailic, form always a diphthong, and are never parted, as, *cre-ate*, *du-el*, *fu-el*, *fru-it-ion*, *tut-ion*, &c. in English.

V. OF THE DIPHTHONGS SEPARATELY.

AE

This diphthong is seldom used in Gailic; its sound is compounded of that of a broad *a*, and an obscure *e*; as *laetbe*, days.

AI

1. The sound of *ai* is made up of a broad *a*, and an obscure *i*; it is long in *àitbe*, a command; *àite*, a place, *àill*, will: or short, as *aig*, at, or with; *ait*, glad; *tair*, soft, &c.

2. *Ai* sounds almost like *ay*, in the English words, hay, bay, &c. as in *saibbir*, rich, *daibbir*, poor, *saigbde*, arrows, *airm*, arms, *gairm*, a call, *sailm*, psalms, &c.

AO

1. *Ao*, in some words, has a peculiar sound, learned only by the ear, but generally long, as *cabl*, small, *maòl*, bald, *maòr*, an officer, *maòrach*, shell-fish, *gaòl*, love; or short, as in *gaòr*, entrails, *gaoraid*, short.

2. *Ao* has likewise a soft nasal sound, attainable only by the ear, in *aon*, one, *caomb*, kind, *maoth*, tender, *naothadb*, ninth, *naomb*, holy, *naembacbd*, holiness.

EA

Ea has often the sound of a broad *a*, softened by *e*, long, as *seàlg*, hunting, *speàlg*, a splinter, *dearg*, red, *searga*, withered, *gearr*, short, *gearradb*, a cut; or short, *caladb*, a swan, *carrach*, spring, *geal*, white, &c.

Note, *ea* has never the foregoing sound, but when followed by *l*, *m*, *r*, or *mb*, *ng*, after it.

EA

2. *Ea* sounds like *ea* English, as beat, heart, dearth, when immediately followed by *b*, *d*, *g*, *s*, single : as *eabar*, mire, *leabadb*, a bed, *leabb-*
ar, a book, *feadan*, a pipe, *sgcadacb*, clothing, *seadb*, yea, *beag*, little,
leaghadb, melting, *teas*, heat, &c.

Note, *ea* is often used indifferently for *eu*, and sounds long ; as *ead-*
acb, cloths, *eacail*, a disease.

3. *Ea* sounds long in some words, like *ai* in the English word praise ;
as *fea*, six, *fearbb*, bitter, *breagba*, pretty, *geadb*, a goose ; short in
breac, speckled, *beacb*, a bee, *lear*, the sea, *leatbar*, leather, *eatorra*,
between them.

EI

1. *Ei*, like *e* long and *i* short, in *ccin*, far, *ceir*, wax, *eigin*,
necessity, *geill*, subjection ; or short, as *eili*, a hind, *gcilt*, dread, *eire*,
a burden.

2. *Ei* sounds sometimes like *ai* in raise ; *meise*, a plate, *neimbe*,
heavenly.

EO

1: *Eo* sounds the *e* short, and the *o* long in *bed*, living, *deònacb*,
willing, *deòfacb*, fond, *deò*, breath ; and short, as *beothail*, lively, *deoch*,
a drink, &c.

2. *Eo* has the *e* short and the *o* long, like more and sore, English ; as,
leòmban, a lion, *ted-cbridbeach*, affectionate.

EU

1. *Eu* sounds long in *feur*, grass, *eudacb*, cloths, *seusig*, the beard,
rcult, a star, *leud*, breadth, *leugbadb*, reading, &c.

2. *Eu* sounds long, as *fèuch*, behold, *èud*, zeal or jealousy.

IA

Ia sounds long in *dian*, rash, *dias*, an ear of corn, *iafg*, fish, &c.

IO

Io has the *i* long and the *o* obscure, in *diol*, pay, *fior*, true, *nios*, up,
fios, down ; and short, in *fios*, the side, *iolach*, a loud cry, *icnad*, a
place.

O sounds sometimes like *ee* English, as *tobairt*, a sacrifice, *isbradh*, sacrificing, *disbradh*, forsaking, &c.

IU

Iu sounds long in *fiugbanta*, worthiness, *stiùradh*, steering.

OI

Oi has the *o* long, and *i* short, in *bìgh*, a virgin, *tòir*, pursuit, *tòir-eachd*, to pursue, *bòid*, a vow, *feid*, a turf, *bìge*, youth : or short, as *tòic*, wealth, *tòit*, vapour, *feis*, rest, *loisgeadh*, burning.

UA

Ua sounds long in *cluas*, the ear, *buar*, kine, *fuar*, cold.

UI

Ui sounds the *u* long and the *i* short, in *ùir*, earth, *suift*, a flail ; short in *fuil*, blood, *muir*, the sea.

VI. OF THE TRIPHTHONGS.

A Triphthong is the union of three vowels in the same syllable.

They are five in number; viz. *aoi*, *eoi*, *iai*, *iui*, *uai*; they are all sounded long, and seldom occur but in words of one syllable ; sometimes they occur in the first syllable of polysyllables.

AOI

1. Has a sound like the diphthong *ao*, and an obscure *i*, as *aoibhneas*, joy, *casin*, mild, *laigb*, calves.

2. It has a nasal sound, with the *i* somewhat longer in *nasimb*, saints, *masin*, substance, *naoidbean*, an infant, *mnaci*, to a woman, *masidbeamh*, upbraiding.

3. It sounds like *ui*, in *caoidb*, wailing, *clacidbeamh*, overwhelming, *daci*, wicked, *lacidb*, an hymn, *faoi*, good.

EOI

Eoi sounds like *eo*, and a short *i*, as *becir*, beer, *sesid*, brave men, *treoir*, strength, vigour.

IAI

Iai sounds like *ia*, and an obscure *i* ; as *an diaigb*, afterwards.

IUI

IUI

Iui sounds nearly as *ii* diphthong, in *ciiin*, quiet, *stuir*, the helm.

UAI

Uai sounds like the diphthong *ua*, and an obscure *i*; as *cruaidb*, hard, *stuaim*, modesty, *gluais*, move, *duaife* reward.

Note, *chuaidb* sent, *nusidbeachd*, news, are pronounced, as if written *chaidh*, *noidheachd*.

VII. OF THE CONSONANTS IN GENERAL.

A Consonant can never make a perfect sound of itself, without the aid of a vowel.

The consonants used in this language, are *b, c, d, f, g, l, m, n, p, r, s, t*, with the aspirate *b*, and are divided into *mutable* and *immutable* consonants.

The *mutables*, by having an *b* subjoined to them, either alter or lose their pronunciation: these are *b, c, d, f, g, m, p, s, t*.

The *immutable* consonants, viz. *l, n, r*, never change or lose their natural sound, neither is an *b* subjoined to them, and no other letter is ever doubled in the Gailic language.

All the *mutable* consonants take *b* after them.

None of the *mutables* take another *mutable* after it, except *s*, which has nearly the sound of a semi-vowel, and admits any other of the *mutables*, (*f* only excepted) to be subjoined to it.

The *immutables*, *l, n, r*, never admit of another consonant immediately after them. *L* and *r* may follow any of the *mutables* but *m*; the consonants *e, g, s*, admit of *n* after them: as *cnaimb*, a bone, *gnuis*, the face, *sneachda*, snow, &c. also *m* and *t* admits of *n* in a few words, as *mnasibin*, women, *tnu*, envy.

The *mutable* consonants in the end of words of one syllable, or in the first or second syllable of pollysyllables, after a vowel or diphthong not accented, are pronounced as if doubled; this is frequently to be observed, likewise, respecting the *immutables*, when single, or

not

not followed by another consonant; as *obair*, work, *garadh*, a den, *cfrag*, a blast, *codal*, sleep, *tamall*, a while, *tlus*, compassion, *las*, kindle; to be pronounced, *obbair*, *garradh*, *offag*, *coddal*, *tammall*, &c.

A consonant standing alone, is pronounced as if it were the first letter of the following word, if it begins with a vowel; as *an t ord*, the hammer; but, if it begins with a consonant, and if the foregoing word ends with a vowel, it must be joined to the preceding word; as *nz shealladb*, in his sight, to be pronounced, *na healladh*.

VIII. OF THE CONSONANTS SEPARATELY.

1. Of the Mutable Consonants.

B

B is pronounced as in English, *bratbair*, a brother; *bb* has the sound of *v* in English; *a bbratbair*, his brother.

C sounds always hard like *k* English, whatever vowel or consonant comes after it; *call*, *losf*, *cia*, who, are pronounced kall, kia.

Cb, at the end of a word or syllable, sounds as in the word *loch*; as *dòchas*, hope, *laoch*, a hero.

Cb, at the beginning, has a certain modulation of the voice to be acquired only by the ear.

Note, *'cld* is usually pronounced as *chg*; so *bochdain*; poverty, *toch-dadb*, swelling, are sounded as if written, *bochgain*, *tochgadh*.

D

D has a soft pleasant sound, and requires a tolerable command of the voice, and a good ear, to distinguish it from the soft sound of *t*.

Db, at the beginning of words, sounds like *y* consonant, and at the end of words or syllables, nearly like *y* vowel; as *dbuinne*, to us, as if written *yuinne*; *dbuit*, to the, as if, *yuit*, *i:nnfsuidb* to him, *biadb*, meat, as if written, *ionnsuiy*, *biay*.

D

D_b, before any word beginning with a vowel, is sounded as if immediately joined with the following word ; as *db'eirigb*, arose, *db'orduigb*, ordained.

F

F sounds as in English : *fearg*, wrath, *fogladhb*, opening.

Fb is always silent ; as *fbeara*, O men, *gun f'bios*, not knowing, to be pronounced 'eara, 'ios.

Fb sounds in some words as *b* alone ; as in *fhuair*, he found, pronounced huair.

G

G sounds as in English ; *gb* sounds nearly like *db*, or *y*, both at the beginning and end of words, but pronounced rather harsher and more through the throat.

M

M keeps its own natural sound, *matbair*, mother.

Mb, like *bb*, sounds like *v*, but softer ; *mo mbatbair*, my mother ; when the personal pronoun *mo*, my, goes before words beginning with a vowel, the first vowel is suppressed by an apostrophe ; thus *m' atbair*, my father, *m' eagal*, my fear ; the idiom of the language requires the suppressing of the vowel that ends a word with an apostrophe, when the next word begins with a vowel ; in many words, *mb* is often quiescent in the middle and end of polysyllables.

P

P is always pronounced as in English : *pb* sounds like *f*, as it does also in English ; as *pbill me*, I turned, *mo phiutbar*, my sister ; to be pronounced, fill, suithar.

S

1. *S* before or after a broad vowel in the same syllable, sounds as in the English ; *sal*, filth, *sias*, comely.

Note, that *sin*, there, *so*, this, *sud*, that, are pronounced, shin, sho, shud.

G

2. S when immediately before, or after a small vowel, sounds as *sh*, English ; *siss*, down, *gnuis*, the face, pronounced shios, gnush.

3. S sounds as in English, in *is*, am, *is*, and ; likewise in the inseparable particles *se* and *sin* ; *aigise*, with him, *agaibhse*, with you, *tbrigibhse*, come ye, *dhuibhse*, to you, *dbcibhsin*, to them ; but *easan*, he, *ise*, she, *mise*, me, are pronounced, eashan, ishe, mishe.

Note, that *s* at the beginning of a word, after an euphonie *t*, is silent ; as *an t flegbe*, the way, *an t sacgbail*, the world, pronounced *an t lighs*, *an t oaghail*.

4. *Sb*, before vowels, sounds as *b* alone, and the *s* is silent ; *sbcid e*, he blew, *sbeas e*, he stood, pronounced, heid e, heas e.

S is silent before the consonants, *l* or *n* ; as *sbliug e*, he swallowed, *sbniomb i*, she spun, to be pronounced, luige e, niomh i.

N. B. That *s* is the only mutable consonant that takes another mutable after it. It may be further noticed, that *sh*, *sp*, *sd*, *st*, *sc*, and *sg*, are sometimes written the one for the other, or used indifferently ; but, as *b*, *d*, and *g*, when joined to an *s*, have a softer sound than the other, care should be taken, when to use the one and when the other.

T

T, like *D*, has a soft and pleasant sound, to be learned only by the ear ; as *tagradb*, to plead, *tabhair*, give thou, *tblacbd*, delight.

2. *Tb*, in the beginning of a word, before a vowel, or *l*, *n*, *r*, only intervening, sounds as *b*, alone ; as *tbiormaich e*, he dried, *mo tblackd*, my delight, *tlnu'*, envy ; pronounced, hiormaich, blachd, hnu'.

Tb, in the middle or end of words, is generally quiescent.

Of the Immutable Consonants, L, N, R.

1. *L*, *N*, *R*, when they begin a word ; or when joined to another consonant, have generally a soft liquid sound, to be perfectly attained only by the ear ; as *las*, kindle thou, *glan*, clean, *neart*, strength, *snasimhor*, elegant, *reult*, a star, *srjan*, a bridle ; to be pronounced, llas, gllan, nneart, snnasimhor, rreult, srjian.

2. *L, N, R*, when initials, found frequently with an aspiration, or nearly as in English; as *reubuinn*, robbery, *nocbd*, naked, *loisg*, burn; to be pronounced, *rheubuinn*, *nhochd*, *lhoisg*; they have frequently this sound in the end or middle of words, though not joined with another consonant.

3. When *L, N, R*, retain their soft liquid sound in the middle or end of words, they are generally doubled; as *tùill*, holes, *fànn*, feeble, *fèarr*, better; to distinguish them from *tuil*, a flood, *fan*, stay thou, *fear*, a man.

Note. It is observable, that when substantives and adjectives are together, contrary to the English, the substantive generally takes the lead; *duine maith*, a good man, *bean gblie*, a wise woman, *eacb luath*, a swift horse, *fecil àr*, fresh beef, &c.

In sentences that have a verb and pronoun, the verb is pronounced before the pronoun, *sgriobb e*, he wrote, *labhair i*, she spoke. In sentences purely narrative, or argumentative, the verb generally begins the sentence, or is placed near the beginning. Interrogatories are exceptions to this rule, though the answer, if in the affirmative, begins with the verb.

In words of two or three syllables, (and there are not many words of more than three syllables in this language, compounds excepted) the first syllable is generally sounded long, and the rest short.

Such as would speak elegantly and with propriety, have adopted this rule, that when a word ends with *r*, and the next word, (if in the same sentence) begins with *db*, the *db* is to be pronounced like *r*, *da uair dbeug*, twelve hours; to be pronounced, *da uair reug*: *thoir dbomb*, give me; to be pronounced, *thoir romh*, &c.

The genders of nouns may be distinguished thus: All words beginning with any of the mutable consonants except *f*, takes the aspirate *b* after that mutable for the masculine, but not for the feminine.

When such substantive begins with *f*, *fan* or *fin* should be annexed to the masculine, but omitted for the feminine.

When any of the immutable consonants begins a word, the possessive pronoun has a full and distinct sound for the masculine; but for the feminine, it is sounded as if the immutable were doubled like the Welsh.

But when a noun begins with a vowel, the possessive is omitted before the masculine, and *fan* or *fin* annexed to the word; but for the feminine, the possessive remains, and the aspirate *b* is prefixed.
