



INTRODUCTORY.

THE edition of the New Bedford Directory now completed, is the sixth that has been published since the commencement of the work, and the first since the City organization.

It were in vain to hope, amidst the unceasing changes of so large a portion of our community, that perfect accuracy could be obtained at any time, but when to these are added the removals and changes caused by one of the most remarkable emigrations upon record, the Directory becomes necessarily, yet more imperfect.

The information collected in the first instance by personal inquiry at every house in the City, was collated with all the lists and other means of information known to the compilers. It was then tested by inquiry at every store and place of business in the City, and submitted to the examination of as many of the citizens as practicable.

In presenting it to the public, the compilers would embrace the opportunity to return their sincere thanks to those who, during its progress, have so kindly aided their inquiries, and encouraged their efforts.

The Statistical Information with reference to the Whaling business usually published in this Directory, being a transcript of the tables published in the Whalemen's Shipping List, by Henry Lindsey, Esq., and consequently accessible to all in the pages of that Journal, has been omitted in this edition.

The information with reference to the Societies and Incorporated Institutions, was obtained from their respective officers.

The directory of the Streets, has been corrected from the official record.

The Advertising Directory is collected from good substantial money-paying advertisers, and to it the attention of the public is respectfully invited.

NEW BEDFORD.

THE Indian name of New Bedford was Acchusnutt, or Acushnet. It was incorporated as a town in 1787, previous to which it formed a part of the town of Dartmouth, but at what time and by whom the first settlement was commenced does not distinctly appear. It is supposed, however, that the Friends or Quakers, were the first white inhabitants. The first settled Minister appears to have been Samuel Hunt, who died about the year 1735; it is supposed he was ordained here [Acushnet Village] about the year 1700.

The villages of New Bedford and Fairhaven, were both settled about the year 1764. The first house in New Bedford village was built by John Louden, of Pembroke. The land upon which the city now stands, was owned by a Joseph Russell, which name (Russell) being the family name of the Duke of Bedford, Joseph Rotch, one of the principal purchasers and settlers, declared that the place where they built, should go by the name of Bedford, to which the word New was afterwards prefixed.

During the Revolutionary War, New Bedford was a place of resort for American Privateers. In order to destroy them, 4000 British troops, under Gen. Gray, landed upon Clark's Point, and marching to the town burnt houses, wharves, shipping and merchandize to the amount of \$323,266.—[Barber's Historical Collections, Massachusetts, pp. 126, 127.

New Bedford received a City Charter, March 18, 1847, and at the ensuing election Abraham H. Howland was elected Mayor, to which office he has been re-chosen at each subsequent election.

The population of New Bedford in 1790, was 700, in 1820 it was 3,947, in 1830 it was 7,592, in 1840 it was 12,585, and in 1847 it was 16,031.

SUPREME JUDICIAL COURT.

The Supreme Court has exclusive cognizance of all capital crimes, and exclusive chancery jurisdiction so far as chancery powers are given by statute; and concurrent original jurisdiction of all civil cases when the amount in dispute exceeds \$600, in Suffolk, and \$300 in the other Counties.

Law terms are held at Plymouth and Taunton, alternately on the 4th Tuesday next after the 4th Tuesday in September, for the Counties of Bristol, Plymouth, Barnstable and Dukes.

Nisi Prius terms for Bristol County are held at Taunton on the 7th Tuesday next after the 1st Tuesday in March, and at New Bedford on the 2d Tuesday in November.

COURT OF COMMON PLEAS.

The Court of Common Pleas is held for the trial of civil cases above \$20, and, except in Suffolk County, has criminal jurisdiction in all cases not capital.

It is held for Bristol County, at Taunton on the 2d Mondays of March and September, and at New Bedford on the 2d Mondays of June and December.

NEW BEDFORD RURAL CEMETERY.

This Cemetery is on the west side of Dartmouth street, and is about one mile in a south westerly direction from the City Hall. It was incorporated April 12, 1837, but is now owned by the city.

OAK GROVE CEMETERY.

This Cemetery, covering eight acres of ground, is situated on the north side of Smith street, and is about one mile north west from the City Hall. A part of the cemetery is laid out in lots, the exclusive occupancy of which may be obtained from the city authorities, and the remainder is devoted to indiscriminate burial.

Schools and School Teachers.

PUBLIC SCHOOLS.

The Public Schools in New Bedford, exclusive of the adult schools, are twenty-eight in number, and are divided into five classes, viz:

- I. The High School in which are taught all over twelve years of age who are found qualified to pursue the studies taught therein, in accordance with the laws of the Commonwealth.
- II. Grammar Schools in which are taught those between the ages of ten and twenty one.
- III. INTERMEDIAL SCHOOLS, in which are taught children between the ages of seven and ten.
- IV. PRIMARY SCHOOLS, in which are taught children between the ages of four and seven.
- V. Schools in remote parts of the city, partaking to some extent of the character of all these classes.

These are in constant operation throughout the year, excepting one or two weeks vacation at the end of each term. In the 2d class the boys and girls are taught in separate schools, but in each of the others they attend the same schools.

The number of teachers now in the employment of the city is fifty-eight. Of these seven are males, and fifty-one are females. The number of children between the ages of four and sixteen in May, 1848, was three thousand seven hundred and fifty-five; between the ages of five and fifteen in May, 1849, was three thousand and three.

It is furnished with good apparatus, and sufficient means of illustration in the branches of Natural Philosophy, Astronomy, Geography, &c. It has also a library of 2000 volumes, and a fund of about \$12,000.

The Streets of New Bedford, with a very few exceptions, are laid out North and South, East and West, intersecting each other at right angles, or nearly so. Those running North and South are numbered commencing at Union Street and increasing each way, with the even numbers on the East and the odd numbers on the west side. Those running East and West, are numbered, commencing at the river and increasing Westerly, with the even numbers on the South, and the odd numbers on the North side. Any departure from this rule will be noted in the following list.

The letters enclosed by brackets, which follow the name of any street, signify the general bearing of such street from the City Hall: Thus, School street, [S.] is South from the City Hall.

Acushnet, a village at the head of the Acushnet River, about three and a half miles, in a northerly direction from the City Hall—the westerly part being in New Bedford, and the easterly part in Fairhaven.

Acushnet Avenue, [N.] from the Rail Road crossing at B. Rodman's farm, North to Acushnet Village.

Acushnet Heights, an elevated portion of land extending northerly from Willis street, on each side of County street, commanding a fine and extensive view of the harbor, Buzzard's Bay, Fairhaven village, and the opposite shores of the Acushnet River.

Allen's Mill Road, [N. W.] leading from Perry's Corner to "Allen's Mills." in Dartmouth.

Allen street, [S. W.] from County street West, and nearly in line with Wing and Howland streets. Numbers commence at County

Anthony street, [S. W.] Second street west of County, extending south from Grove to Bedford streets, and passing on the east of Jos. S. Tillinghast's residence.

Arnold street, [S. W.] from County west, between School and Wal-

nut streets. Numbers commence at County

Ash street, [N. W.] from Kempton to Smith, being the Sixth street west of County. It is but partially open.

Ashland street, [N. W.] from Robeson, North to Linden street.

Bedford street, [S.] from Third street west across County street to the Mill Pond. Numbers commence at Third.

Belville. a small collection of houses on the Acushnet river, about

one mile South of Acushnet village.

Belville Road, [N.] leading from McPherson's wharf at Belville, to the stone bridge at Acushnet village.

Bethel Court, [E.] opens on the north side of Union street on a line with First street.

Bonney street, [S. W.] extends from Allen to Washington street, and next east of Orchard street.

Bush street, [S.] from Davenport's wharf west to County street.

Campbell street, [N.] from Ray west to State street.
Cannon street. [S. E.] from South Water west to Third street, nearly in a line with Russell street.

Cannonville, the neighborhood in the vicinity of the Meeting House standing at the junction of the "Noel Taber" road with the "Smith's Mills " road.

Cedar street. [N. W.] fifth street west of County and extends from Morgan street north to Smith street—open from Kempton to Smith. Centre street, [E.] from North Water east to Central Wharf.

Chancery street, [N. W.] from Kempton street north. This street

is the Seventh west of County.

Charles street, [N.] from Purchase street west, and in line with High street. The numbers on this street are in continuation of the numbers on High street.

Cheapside, [E.] from Union to William street, in range with Fifth, and nearly in line with Pleasant street.

Cherry street, [S. W.] from Sixth street west to County, and nearly

in line with Coffin street-open from Seventh to County. Chesnut street, [N. W.] second street west of County, and extends

from Kempton to Smith street—partially open.

Coffin street, [S. E.] from Eddy's Wharf west to South Second

street, and nearly in line with Cherry street.

Commercial street, [S. E.] from Commercial Wharf westerly to South

Cottage street, [S. W.] third street west of County, and will ultimately extend from Union street southerly to Allen or Dartmouth street. It is now open from Hawthorn to Bedford street.

County street, [W.] extends from "Clark's Cove" northerly across Union street, over Acushnet Heights to Linden street, and is the longest street in the city. The numbers commencing at the south end,

increase throughout its whole length to the North.

Clark's Point, a point of land extending in a southerly direction from the city, having the Acushnet River on the east and Clark's Cove on the west side.

Cove street, [S.] from the southerly extremity of County street in the vicinity of Clark's Cove easterly. The numbers commence at County street and increase easterly.

Crape street, [S. W.] from Grinnell street south.

Cross street, [S. E.] from Pine street south to the Friends Burying Ground.

Cypress street, [N. W.] third street west of County and extends from

Kempton to Smith street—partially open. Dartmouth street, [S. W.] from Allen street south westerly past the Rural Cemetery. Numbers commence at Allen street.

Eighth street, [N.] from Spring north to Elm street.

Elm street, [N.] from North Water west across County street.

Fair street, [S. W.] from Dartmouth street easterly.

Fifth street, [S.] from Union street south. First street, [S. E.] from Union street south.

Fish Island, a small Island situated a short distance east of the foot

of Middle street with which it communicates by the Bridge.

Forest street, [S. W.] next south of Allen street, extending west from County street. The numbers are calculated to commence at Third street, with which it will hereafter most probably communicate. Foster street, [N.] from Middle street north to Maxfield street.

Numbers commence at Middle street.

Fourth street, [S.] from Union street south—now open from Union street nearly to Wing street.

Franklin street, [N.] third street north of Willis and extends from Purchase st. west to County st. Numbers commence at Purchase st. Grape street, [S. W.] This street extends westerly from Oak street, and is situated a little north of the Rural Cemetery.

Griffinstreet, [S. E.] from Third st. east to the Friends Burying Ground.
Grinnell street, [S.] from the river west, across County.
Grove street, [S. W.] between Bedford and Hawthorn, extending from Orchard street westerly.

Hamilton street, [E.] from North Water street east to Rotch's wharf.

on the south side of the Merchants Bank. Harrison street, [S. W.] next west of Dartmouth street and extends

from Hickory street southerly to Oak street.

Haskins' Corner, the corner formed by the intersection of the north end of the Noel Taber road with the North Road; and about one mile north of Cannonville.

Hawthern street, [S. W.] from County street west, opening opposite

104 County. Numbers commence at County.

Hickory street, [S. W.] from Dartmouth street west, and nearly in

line with Fair street.

High street, [N. E.] from Purchase street east to North Second, in line of Charles street, and thence east to North Water street, nearly in said line. Numbers commence at North Water street.

Highland street, [N. W.] from Mount Pleasant street near "Loo

Choo," to the North Road, running west of the Wind Mill.

Hill street, [N.] from Kempton to Hillman street. Numbers are calculated to commence somewhere south of Middle street, whenever the street shall be extended in that direction.

Hillman street, [N.] from Samuel Rodman's Wharf west across

County street.

Howland street, [S. E.] from Third street east across South Water street, and nearly in line with Wing street. Numbers commence at Third street and increase easterly.

Linden street, [N.] from Purchase street westerly, past the Hill School House and across Mount Pleasant street. Numbers are calcula-

ted to commence somewhere to the east of Purchase street.

Kempton street, [N.] from North Second street west across County street, running into the "Smith's Mills Road." From Purchase street east it is but partially open.

Leonard street, [S. E.] from South Water east to Rotch's South

Wharf, and nearly in line with Bedford street.

Market street, [S.] from Cheapside west to North Sixth street, on the south side of Market Square. Numbers commence at Cheapside.

New County Road, the road built by Jonathan Tobey, extending from Acushnet Village northerly along the Fairhaven line to the town

Noel Taber Road, the Road running northerly from the Smith's Mills Road at the Cannonville Meeting House, to the North Road at Haskins' Corner.

North street, [N.] from the river west across County street-open

from the river to County street.

Philip's Road, a road in the extreme north-westerly part of the city, running in a north-westerly direction from the New County road. It takes its name from King Philip.

Pine street, [S. E.] from South Water street east to the river.

Pleasant street, [N.] from Kempton street north crossing Willis

street, &c. The numbers are calculated to commence somewhere south of Kempton street.

Pope's Island. This island is situated near the centre of the Acush-

net river, and is crossed by the Bridge.

Pope street, [N.] second street north of Willis, extending from Purchase, west to County street.

Prospect street, [S. E.] from South street northerly. This is the second street east of South Water street.

Purchase street, [N. E.] from Union street north to the Rail Road crossing.

Ray street, [N. E.] from Kempton street north. The numbers are calculated to commence at some place south of Kempton street.

Robeson street, [N. W.] from County street at Robeson's Corner west to Ashland street.

Rodman street, [E.] from North Water street east to Rotch's Wharf. Rodman's Court, between North Second and Purchase streets-opens opposite No. 122 Union street.

Rose Alley, [E.] from North Water east to Orange street.

Smith street, [N. W.] from County street west to the Oak Grove Cemetery. The numbers are calculated to commence at a point east of County street, to which it is presumed the street will by and by extend.

Smith street Court, [N. W.] opening from Smith street to the north between numbers 63 and 65.

Smith's Mills Road, the road leading from Kempton street to the village of "Smith's Mills," in Dartmouth.

South street, [S.] from the river west to County street.

South Orange street, [S. E.] from Union street south to Commercial wharf-and again from the easterly range of Howland street south to South street. Numbers commence at Union street.

South Second street, [S. E.] from Union street south to the Common Burying Ground—and again from Howland street south.

South Sixth street, [S.] from Union street south to County street. South Water street, [S. E.] from Union street south, leading to " Clark's Point.

Spring street, [S.] from South Second west to County street. Numbers commence at South Second street.

Spruce street, [N. W.] fourth street west of County, and extends from Kempton to Smith street. Numbers commence at Kempton street. This street is but partially open.

State street, [N.] from Maxfield street north. The numbers are cal-

culated to commence somewhere south of Kempton street.

Sullivan street, [N. W.] A Court opening from Middle street nearly

opposite No. 228.

Summer street, [N. W.] first street west of County, extending north from Elm street, and passing on the east side of the High School The numbers are calculated to commence at Union street.

Sycamore street, [N. W.] first street south of Smith street, and extends from the east side of State street westerly. It is now partially open from Walden to Cedar, and again a short distance on the east side of State street The numbers increase west from the east side of State street.

Tarkiln Hill, the highest elevation of land in New Bedford, situated

from half to one mile west of Acushnet Village.

Tarkiln Hill Road—road leading from Acushnet over Tarkiln Hill to Perry's Corner.

Third steet, [S. E.] from Union street south.

Thomas street, [N. W.] from Hillman street north. The numbers are calculated to commence somewhere south of Hillman street.

Union street, [S.] from the river west across County street.
Walden street, [N. W.] from Hillman street north. The numbers are calculated to commence some distance south of Hillman street.

Wall street, [N. E.] first street north of Pearl, extending from the

river to Rav street.

Walnut street, [S.] from Walnut street wharf west to County.

Washington street, [S. W.] from Fourth street west. The numbers are calculated to commence at Third street, with which Washington street may hereafter communicate.

William street, [N.] from North Water street west to County street,

passing on the north side of the Custom House and City Hall.

Willis street, [N.] from Ray street west to County, on the south side of J. A. Parker's residence.

Wing street, [S.] from Third street west to County-and nearly in line with Howland street at the east, and Allen street at the west.
