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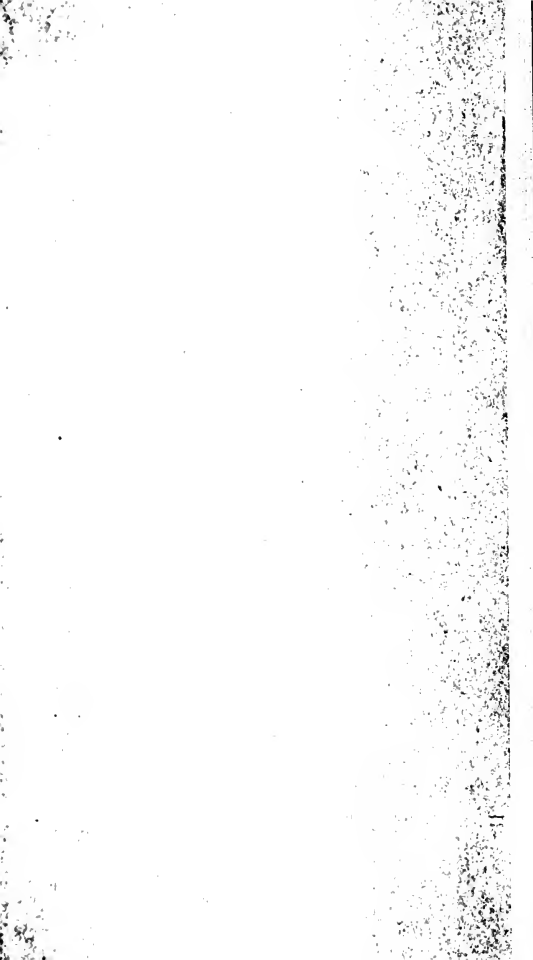


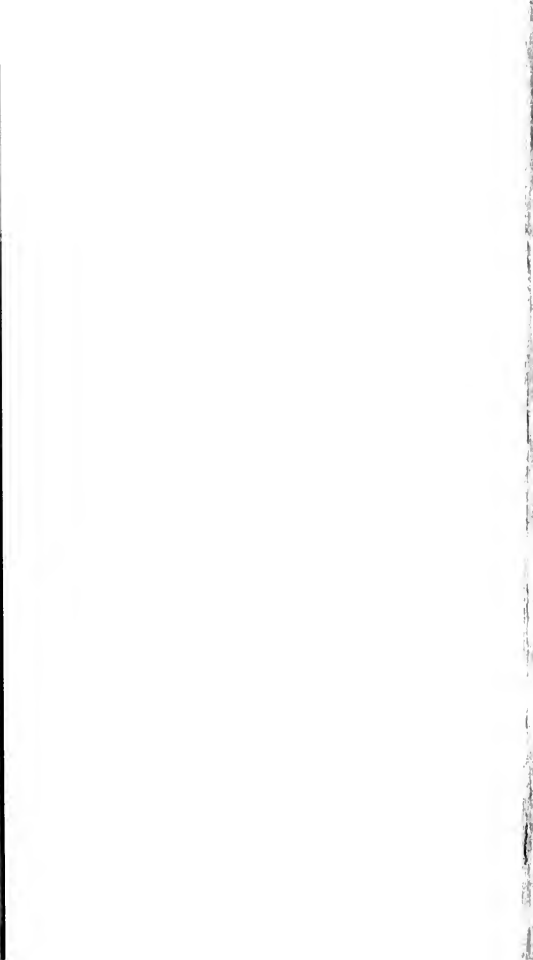

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PREFACE.

THE utility of books of this description in a Christian country, can be questioned by none. There is not a Christian Father of a Family, who is not ready to acknowledge his obligations to the author, by whom he is furnished with the means of guiding the devotions of his household, and of teaching those, whose spiritual as well as temporal interests, are committed to his care, how, suitably, to address themselves to the Father of their spirits, the Preserver of their lives, the Bestower of their blessings, and the Redeemer of their souls. There is scarcely an individual in any condition of human life, who may not be indebted to the pious labors of compilers of works like this, for a proper channel, through which to convey the fervors of gratitude to the Divine Author of every good and perfect gift; the cries of penitence for pardon to the Father of Mercies; or the supplications of suffering and necessity, to him, to whom in the time of need "all flesh should come."—Among the most sincerely religious, there are numbers who know not of themselves, how to address their petitions or their thanksgivings to God. To such, a book like this can need no recommendation. Among the most thoughtless, and the most inattentive, habitually, to the ways and will of heaven, there are none who may not sometimes have the disposition to pray awak-

ened in them, by such dispensations of Providence, as prove the utter insufficiency of the world or man, for the support or consolation of their spirits. "*But how can they, unless some man should guide them?*" Ignorant in what manner to present themselves before their Maker, and discouraged through the fear of uttering that which is unworthy of his majesty, they often, it is to be apprehended, suffer the devout emotion which had been excited to subside, and pass away from their bosoms, which might have ascended an acceptable incense to his throne. To the intent, then, that all those circumstances which are suited to direct the thoughts to God, may be improved to the effectual establishment of the hearts of men in those habits of devotion which are the soul and strength of practical holiness and virtue, how desirable is it, that forms of prayer, suited to them, should be furnished to all, at once as an encouragement, and an help and guide to religious duty!

FAMILY PRAYERS.

Morning Prayer for the Lord's Day.

O LORD, the great Almighty God, thou art the giver of life and strength, and of all grace and goodness; without whom we can do nothing; and through whose gracious assistance it is, that we are enabled to do all things belonging to thy service and our duty: We humbly pray, that thou wilt be graciously present with us, and powerfully assist us this day, to direct and quicken us in all the ways and duties of thy holy service. O forgive our iniquities, that separate between thee and our souls; and remember not the sins against us, which may justly provoke thee to hide thy face from us. But according to thy mercy, remember thou us, O Lord, and accept us, and our imperfect services, at the hands, and for the sake of Jesus Christ.

O leave us not to the dulness and hardness, the vanity and deceitfulness of our own depraved hearts: but shew the power of thy heavenly grace, in working mightily upon these hearts of ours: to bring and keep them in such a holy frame, that we may be fitter to attend upon thee, and perform more faithful and acceptable ser-

vice to thee, and enjoy more of that heavenly communion with thee, which thou hast made us capable of; and which our souls will be forever restless without. O let us not serve thee in formality and hypocrisy, making any duties of course the cover of a vain licentious life: But let our hearts and souls, and all that is within us, be taken up in a reverend, faithful and affectionate attendance upon thee. Nor let us serve thee of constraint, only because we must; but with all readiness and gladness, and love and delight to be so engaged: Making thy pleasure to be ours, and the Sabbath and service of our Lord, the joy and solace of our souls. O help us so to sanctify thy day, that thy day may be a means to promote the sanctification of our souls. Let us bestow ourselves in exercises benefitting the holy season; and not profane it to any vain and vicious purposes. But on the Lord's day may we abound in the work of the Lord: and not do our own works, nor find our own pleasure, nor speak our own words, in the day which thou hast hallowed for thyself: But rest from all our sinful ways, as well as from our common labors; and so delight ourselves in the Lord, that thou mayest give us the desires of our hearts.

And bless to us thy word, O gracious Father, and all the means of grace, which through thy favor we do enjoy, that we may not use the same in vain, not to our hurt: but for the informing of our minds, the reforming of our lives, and the saving of our souls; still growing in grace, and in the knowledge of our Lord and Saviour Jesus

Christ; till we attain to be such as thy holy word requires, in all-holy conversation and godliness.

Great peace have they that love thy law, and nothing shall offend them. O Lord, increase our love to thy word, which the angels desire to look into; and make our souls pliable and submissive, to be turned and ruled by it, till we become in all things agreeable to it.

Bless us, our father, and command a blessing upon all our pious designs and performances this day: and bless thy servants whom thou hast appointed to break the bread of life to our souls, that they may speak thy word as they ought to speak: and give to every one their portion in due season. And that thy word, which they deliver, may be to our conviction, edification and comfort, and the savor of life to our souls. O thou that hast the key of David, and openest and no man shuttest, thou that speakest to the heart, and givest the increase, open our understandings to receive thy truth, both in the light, and in the love of it. And set it home so powerfully upon our hearts, and root it so deep in our souls, that the fruits may be seen in our lives: We being not forgetful hearers but faithful doers of thy word.

And grant, O God, that our services this day may be such, as may tend to our advantage and rejoicing, in the great day of thy appearing and glory: That we may so hallow these Sabbaths here upon earth, that hereafter we may be admitted to the joyful celebration of the eternal Sabbatism in thy kingdom of heaven: there,

with all the church triumphant, to magnify thy glorious name, and to enjoy thy love, and sing thy praise for ever. And for the addition of this Sabbath to all the rest, for the benefit of thy word, and the ordinances of thy worship, and all the means of grace, and hopes of thy eternal glory, to thee, the God of all grace, be the praise, and honor, and glory rendered by us, and by all thine, from this time forth, and for ever. AMEN.

Another Morning Prayer for the Lord's Day.

WE praise and worship thee, O Lord, the Creator of heaven and earth ; for thou speakest the word, and all things were made ; thou commandedst, and they were created !

We admire and adore thy infinite wisdom and power in the things thou hast made, and we acknowledge our absolute dependence upon thee, and thy great goodness and bounty to us and all the world.

Blessed be thou, who didst so love the world, that thou gavest thine only begotten Son to redeem it, who was delivered for our offences, and raised again (as on this day) to justify and save all such as fear and obey thee.

We give thanks to thee, O Lord, for all thy mercies to our souls and bodies, for appointing one day in seven for thy more peculiar worship and service. All possible praise and thanks be given to God, who created us ; to Jesus Christ,

who redeemed us, and to the Holy Ghost, who sanctifieth us.

Grant, O Lord, that by a wise and religious use of the means of grace, we may grow up to a state of holiness and righteousness, and that our souls may be prepared for those glorious and delightful praises, which will be part of the happiness and employment of thy saints to all eternity in heaven.

O Lord, we confess that we have offended thee by the negligent performance of our holy duties, by our abuse of thy grace, and mispending this thy holy day, and by many sins committed in the course of our lives. But let not this provoke thee to withdraw the assistance of thy Holy Spirit from us, and to leave us to the vanity and folly of our own minds. We humbly beseech thee, O most merciful Father, to forgive us all our past offences. Do thou mercifully hear our prayers, and let our cry come unto thee.

Let our whole behavior on this day be such that there may be nothing thought, said, or done by us, but what may best serve to promote the end for which thou hast instituted it; and, O God, make every one of us diligent, not only to save our own souls, but, as much as in us lies, the souls of others too.

Bless thy universal church: Be thou graciously present in all Christian assemblies throughout the world, and hear the prayers they shall this day put up, and make thy word effectual to the pulling down the Kingdom of Satan, and to the edifying of the Church of Christ in sound faith and true godliness. May thy word come with

power into every conscience, and have a due and saving effect upon the minds of all that hear it.

Bestow a plentiful portion of thy good Spirit upon all that by sickness, imprisonment, or any other lawful impediment, are kept from partaking of the means of grace that we enjoy; and be pleased mercifully to relieve and succor them in all their straits and difficulties. Those that are troubled in mind, do thou direct to proper means to obtain comfort and satisfaction. Give all that have no sense of thy Majesty, and live as it were without God in the world, awakening convictions of the dangers they are in, and the miseries they are exposed to, that they may escape them.

Pardon our sins and imperfections, and relieve all our wants, for the sake of Jesus Christ; for whom we thank thee; to whom, with thee and the blessed Spirit, be ascribed all honor, glory, power, thanksgiving and praise, for ever and ever. AMEN.



Another Morning Prayer for the Lord's Day.

ALL praise be given unto thee, O God, our heavenly Father, for this holy day, in which we imitate the company in heaven, whilst we assemble in thy courts on earth.

Instead of rejecting us for our pride, and wilful ignorance, and forgetfulness of thee, thou hast set apart thy day to teach us the knowledge of thy name, and of our own condition. Thou

hast commanded us to make public confession of our sins, and thy perfect hatred of them ; of our manifold disobedience, and thy forbearance ; of our depravity and perpetual need of thy grace. Thou hast commanded us thus to abase ourselves before thee, lest a proud, self-sufficient spirit should destroy us. Thou hast commanded us to make intercession for all men, that our hearts may be enlarged in love towards them, and our hands ready to minister to their necessities. Thou hast sent thy word unto us for reproof, correction, and instruction in righteousness, to make us wise unto salvation, through faith which is in Christ Jesus. And thou hast required us to give thee thanks in the great congregation, in order that our hearts may be filled with gratitude to thee for all thy benefits. O how amiable on these accounts, Lord God of hosts, are thy houses in our land ! We especially adore thy goodness, in passing over the provocations and insults we have so often repeated, by rushing into thy house, in pride, hypocrisy, and contempt of thy salvation. Instead of cutting us off in this most dreadful state, thou hast been pleased to lay it all open to our view. Therefore we now, on our knees, implore of thee every disposition of heart which can make us acceptable worshippers. O our God, send forth light and truth, forcibly to impress us with the great importance of the work we have to do. Shield us from all distractions. Whilst we confess our sins, fill us with deep self-abasement and godly sorrow. Give us to ask in full assurance of receiving the things we need, pardon,

righteousness, and strength, from thy love in Jesus Christ. Accompany thy oracles, and the preaching of thy servants with the power of the Holy Ghost, that we may be more wise, and more diligent to follow the examples set before us : that thy judgments and threatenings against transgressors may deter us from walking after the flesh, and the fashion of this world. O that, by hearing thy gospel, we may clearly perceive, and gladly embrace the great salvation it proclaims, and be careful to observe and do whatsoever our Lord commands. And when we offer up our prayers for all estates and conditions of men, give us to feel bowels of mercies, and to beg for their support, deliverance, and salvation, as for our own.

Thou knowest, Lord, our sad condition ; that when we would do good, as thy holy law requires, evil is present with us. We would wait upon thee without a wandering thought ; but our weakness and depravity, alas ! are manifest, after all our endeavors to be wholly taken up in thy service. Arise, O God, and save us from those idle thoughts, which else will hinder our prayers ; and though we can have nothing to rejoice in what we do, may we rejoice in thy goodness and tender mercies, in the redemption of our souls by the blood of Jesus, and in thy exceeding great and precious promises.

Thou, Lord, hast appointed pastors and teachers, whose lips should retain knowledge, and the people are to be instructed in thy law from their mouths. We pray thee to give unto them all the spirit of wisdom and revelation in the

knowledge of Christ, that they may be taught how to lay, like able builders, the true foundation; and, by their preaching, may knowledge be increased, and sinners turned from their evil ways. By their preaching, may thy children be comforted and established, the beauty of holiness and the sinfulness of sin be effectually set forth; that after due improvement of thy day, house, and word, we may for ever rejoice in the rest which remaineth for all the people of God, through Jesus Christ our Lord and Savior.

Evening Prayer for the Lord's Day.

ETERNALLY blessed, and infinitely glorious Lord God, who keepest mercy for thousands, and forgivest the iniquities of all truly penitent and returning sinners; we present ourselves this evening before thee, acknowledging our manifold sins, whereby we have exposed ourselves to thy just displeasure.

We have been unmindful both of our duty and interest; have broken thy holy law, dishonored thy holy religion, and miserably neglected the great salvation thy blessed Son purchased and procured for mankind.

We have come without due preparation to thy solemn worship; and been heedless and inattentive in hearing thy word. O how cold have we been in thy praises; how earthly, dull, and distracted, in our prayers!

How seldom have we been seriously exercis-

ed in holy meditation ! How seldom have we recollected thy multiplied mercies to us, so as to become sensible of the many obligations we are under to thee for them ; or so thought on our ways, as to turn our feet to thy testimonies !

But, O Lord, we humbly pray thee, for Jesus Christ's sake, to forgive us all our past offences. Direct and guide us in the ways of truth and holiness : And that we may always fear thee our God, help us to set thee always before us ; and so to observe and consider thy all-seeing eye, that we may dread to offend thee.

Reform whatever thou seest amiss in the temper and disposition of our minds ; and be thou graciously pleased to conduct us safe through all the temptations and troubles of this world. To this end, enable us strictly to follow the example of Jesus Christ, and manfully to fight under his banner, against the world, the flesh, and the devil ; vigorously opposing, and valiantly conquering all the enemies of our souls. Help us, in conformity to his death, to die daily unto sin, and in conformity to his resurrection, to rise to a life of holiness and obedience, that so we may receive the prize of a glorious and incorruptible inheritance.

O Lord, we render unto thee our most humble and thankful acknowledgments, for thy many and undeserved mercies. It was thy hand that formed us. It was thou that gavest us life, and breath, and being. Our food and raiment, our health and strength, our ease and liberty, the use of our limbs, and the exercise of our reason and understanding, are all derived from

thee. We therefore render unto thee, O thou Bountiful Giver of all good, our praises and thanksgiving, for thy temporal mercies to us, of which we are utterly unworthy.

But, above all, O Lord, we praise thee for thy spiritual mercies; for blessing us in heavenly things in Christ Jesus, which tend to the renewing us after thy likeness in this life, and to the sanctifying and preparing us for that which is to come.

For ever blessed be thy name, that our compassionate Redeemer took upon him our human flesh. We praise thee for his holy doctrine and exemplary life; that he gave himself to death, to purchase our redemption; that he completed that great work by his glorious resurrection. We bless thee that he hath begotten us again to the lively hope of an inheritance incorruptible and undefiled, that fadeth not away, which is reserved in heaven for all who, by patient continuance in well-doing, seek for glory, and honor, and immortality. We praise thee for his glorious ascension into heaven, there to intercede in thy presence for us; for sending the Holy Ghost to comfort and assist us; for appointing a succession of men to preach and propagate the knowledge and practice of his heavenly doctrine, and to administer the holy sacrament, the seal of thy covenant.

We thank thee, O heavenly Father, for all the precious promises in the gospel of thy Son, and that thou hast made our duty so necessary to our happiness. O! that we may all so effectually apply our minds to the consideration of

thy manifold mercies, that they may work in our souls all those divine virtues, dispositions, and affections, which they are designed by thee to produce in us.

Extend thy mercy, O God, to the whole world, that thy name may be great among the Gentiles, from the rising of the sun, unto the going down of the same.

Bless thy universal church. Put an end to all division, strife, and contention; purify and cleanse it from profaneness and ungodliness, from superstition and false doctrine; and make it the joy of the whole earth.

Be gracious to this sinful nation to which we belong; forgive our many and great sins; and particularly, we pray thee, pardon our abuse of time set apart for thy more immediate worship; our unthankfulness for the light of thy gospel, and walking contrary to its precepts. Wash us thoroughly from our iniquities, and cleanse us from our sins; and grant that by unity, and charity, and holiness of life, we may glorify thy great name, and adorn the doctrine of God our Saviour in all things.

Continue the light of thy gospel among us: Defeat and overthrow the designs of evil men, that would pervert the truth of it.

Be thou pleased to further with thy blessing, all those good designs that are for the advancement of true religion and virtue. Let no artifices of the devil, or wicked men, render them ineffectual.

Let all magistrates, and other inferior officers, maintain and defend true religion, encouraging

virtue and goodness, and punishing and suppressing all wickedness and vice ; and let all men follow after peace and holiness, without which no man shall see thee.

O thou that art the Father of Mercies, relieve all that are in affliction, of any kind whatsoever ; and grant that all may have cause to say, It is good for them that they have been in trouble.

Be gracious and favorable to us that are here before thee ; forgive us all our sins, and remember not the iniquities of our holy things. Defend and protect us this night from all those dangers and mischiefs that may justly overtake us ; refresh our frail bodies with quiet and moderate rest, and help us, in the renewed strength thereof, vigorously to serve thee in the faithful discharge of the duties of the following day. And in that and all other days, enable us to live to thy honor and glory ; that in the end of them we may live with thee, through our Lord Jesus Christ ; in whose prevailing name and words we sum up all our wants,—

Another Evening Prayer for the Lord's Day.

THOU, O Lord our God, art great, wonderful, and holy. Thou art exalted far above all blessings and praise which men or angels can offer ; yet thou hast taught us, that whoever offereth thee thanks, he honoreth thee. Much cause

have we now to praise thy name for thine ordinances, which we have this day observed. Pardon the iniquity of our holy things, and cleanse us from the defilement cleaving to our best services. Accept our prayers and praises, for the sake and through the intercession of our great and merciful High-Priest. For his sake, O heavenly Father, fulfil all the requests we have made this day before thee, that the benefit we gain in calling upon thy name together may be manifest in our deportment, and felt in our hearts. Thus may we love and serve thee, waiting in joyful hope for that hour when we shall see thee face to face, and know even as we are known.

To thy mercy we recommend all our relations, and all our friends. Enlighten their minds, that they may not profane thy holy day; give them grace to worship thee in spirit and in truth, with the great congregation; to spend their time with joy in retirement, and secret prayer, and meditation upon the multitude of mercies they have received from thy hand.

Visit, O Lord, the nations yet sitting in darkness and the shadow of death. May the day spring from on high shine upon them, to guide their feet into the way of peace. O that the fulness of the Gentiles may come into Christ, and all Israel be saved! O that the mountain of the Lord's house may be established upon the top of the mountains, and exalted above the hills, and the earth be filled with the glory of the Lord!

We beseech thee, O Lord, to put an end to all

idolatry and superstition in the nations called after thy name. Cause the power of godliness to flourish in all thy churches. Utterly destroy formality and hypocrisy amongst the professors of thy holy faith, that there be no offence given to scoffers, or that they should have any cause to say, what advantage does the gospel of Christ impart.

Take us this night, O our God, under the shadow of thy wing. When we awake, may we think of thee : and if our life is spared to the return of day, may we walk in the light of thy countenance, and in all thy commandments blameless. And when our departure is at hand, may we enjoy a sweet foretaste of heavenly bliss, and know, that when we are removed from waiting upon thee in the courts of thy house below, we shall, with angels and archangels, and all the company of heaven, for ever laud and magnify thy name, O Father, Son, and Holy Ghost, to whom be ascribed, as is most due, glory and dominion for ever and ever. Another Evening Prayer for the Lord's Day.

MOST holy and glorious God ; who is like unto Thee ? Thou art clothed with honor and majesty, and coverest thyself with light as with a garment. Thou only hast immortality, and dwellest in light that no man can approach unto. Yet thou art a God that hearest prayer, and art ready to forgive, yea plenteous in mercy unto all that call upon thee. Lord, quicken us,

this evening of thy day, that we may call upon thy name, and graciously attend unto the voice of our supplications.

We acknowledge that we have forfeited thy favour, and deserved thy wrath. We have followed the vain imaginations of our carnal minds and rejected thy holy laws. We have left those things undone which we ought to have done, and we have done those things which we ought not to have done.

We have sinned presumptuously, against the clearest light, and the strongest love. Thou hast graciously allowed us time to work out our salvation, but alas! we have lavished much of it away in pleasure and vanity. Thou hast given us thine holy sabbaths, and permitted us to attend the ordinances of thine house: But too much of our sacred time has been mispent. We have profaned thy day; we have been backward to the duties of thy worship, and have been very dead and formal in our solemn performances. Instead of worshipping thee in spirit and in truth, O how often have we dealt hypocritically with God, and taken thy name in vain!

Our own consciences witness against us, and out of our own mouths thou mightest justly condemn us. But there is forgiveness with thee that thou mayest be feared. Blessed be thy name that thou hast provided a way for our pardon and reconciliation in Jesus Christ. For his sake we pray that thou wouldst forgive all our past sins, and our manifold shortcomings; particularly those we have been guilty of this day. Lord wash away our sins in the blood

of Christ. We fly to his cross as our security, and to his wounds as our refuge ; renouncing all confidence in any thing besides him, who is the Lord our righteousness.

And Lord engage us not only to accept of him as our high-priest, to atone for us, but also as our king to reign in and rule over us, all the days of our lives. Lord possess the throne of our hearts by thy Spirit ; subdue all our lusts, that they may rule over us no more, and make us willingly submit to thy golden sceptre. Do thou so incline our wills, and animate our souls, that we may never count thy commandments grievous, but may esteem it our highest pleasure and dignity, as well as our greatest duty, to serve and obey thee. Convince us of the evil and filthiness of sin, that we may loathe and shun it as deadly poison. Cherish and preserve any convictions of this sort which thou hast this day wrought in us by thy word. Suffer us not, like the man that beholdeth his natural face in a glass, to go away and forget what manner of persons we saw ourselves to be ; but help us so to think of what we saw amiss in ourselves, that we may be humbled for it, and be made restless till we apply to the fountain of Christ's blood for washing away its guilt. And, Lord, we pray also that thou wouldst make us doers of thy word and not hearers only, deceiving our own souls. Let thy word be a light to our feet, and a lamp to our path, that our conversation may be as becometh the gospel, and our light may so shine before men, that others seeing our good works may glorify thee our heavenly Father.

Lord save us from resting in a good name ; for what will it profit us if we have a name to live but are really dead ? Save us from trusting to an outward form ; for what will it avail us to have a form of godliness while we deny the power thereof ? Lord renew us in the spirit of our minds. May we be thy workmanship, created anew in Christ Jesus unto good works. Produce and cherish in us a true faith, a fervent love, and a lively hope. And O grant that the love of Christ may be so shed abroad in our hearts as to burn up the love of sin and of the world, and constrain us to live not unto ourselves, but unto him who died for us and rose again.

Cause the saving knowledge of Christ to cover the earth, and let his name be great from the rising of the sun to the going down thereof. Convince the Jews that Sbiloh is come, and that Jesus whom they crucified is the true Messiah. Lord appear on the behalf of thy oppressed churches. Never let the gates of hell prevail against thy Zion. Let the time to favor her come. Peace be within her walls, and prosperity within her palaces, and let them prosper that love her. Lord bless these united lands. Make our rulers public blessings, both in our civil and sacred concerns. Frustrate the designs of those who are enemies to the protestant religion. Countenance the ministers of thy word, and water the seed they sow with the dews of heaven, that they may bring a large harvest to Christ. Let not the word spoken this day be like good seed devoured by the fowls of the air, or rotting beneath the clods, but cause it to spring up and yield great increase.

Be pleased, O Lord, graciously to visit those who by sickness are deprived of public ordinances. Sanctify their afflictions and make up their loss, prepare us for sickness and trouble, and give us cause to say that it is in faithfulness that we are at any time afflicted.

Bless all the members of this family. Let this be one of the tabernacles of the righteous, in which the voice of rejoicing and salvation is heard. Enable us all faithfully to discharge the duties of our several stations ; make us blessings to each other, and to all around us.* Accept our daily sacrifices of prayer and praise, and let us all at last be admitted to celebrate an eternal sabbath with thee above ; for the sake and merit of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, who with thee and the Holy Spirit is over all, God blessed for evermore. OUR Father, who art seated on a throne of glory in the highest heaven : while we bow down before thine awful presence with the humblest reverence, we would nevertheless approach thee with a filial confidence, as our bountiful and compassionate Parent ; uniting our supplications to thee, with hearts full of brotherly love, and asking for each other the blessings we seek for ourselves.

Where thy glorious perfections check and forbid our approaches, thy gracious attributes invite and encourage our supplications unto thee, and embolden us to look upon thee, as our most kind and merciful Father in Jesus Christ. And though we have great and many sins to confess, yet will we confess them, in hopes of thy pardon of them, and of power on high, to enable us against them.

Thou didst create us, O Lord, after thy own blessed image, in an holy and happy estate : but we have made ourselves vile and miserable, quite unlike the thing which at first we came out of thy hands : averse to good, prone to evil, and so very full of provocation, that it is thy wonderful patience with us, and loving kindness

to us, that thou hast not, long before this time, cut us off in our sins, and shut us up under final despair of thy mercy. But thou hast so far declared thy willingness to be reconciled even to thy enemies, that thou hast sent thy only Son into the world, upon the great errand of our salvation: that whosoever believe in him, should not perish in their sins, but have everlasting life, for his sake. O Lord, we believe, help our unbelief: and give us the true repentance towards God, and the right faith in our Lord Jesus Christ; that we may be the number of those who do indeed repent and believe, to the saving of the soul.

And save us, O Lord, from our sinful selves, and from the love and course of this present evil world, and from every self-destroying way which we are tempted to follow. Make us a way to escape out of all the snares of temptation, wherewith we have been entangled and held, and hindered in running the race set before us. And make thy ways plain before us, and so full of invitations to us, that we may be thoroughly convinced of their goodness and excellence, and resolvedly give up ourselves to follow them: that our own experience in the way of goodness may be more to keep and engage us to it, than all allurements and discouragements in the world to put us beside it. Establish, O Lord, and strengthen and settle us; that going forth in thy strength, we may do thy will to all well-pleasing; and continue in thy fear and love to our lives' end.

Which things we beg not for ourselves alone,

but also in behalf of all whom we ought to intreat thy mercy for in our prayers. O bring nigh unto thee all those that are yet afar off: and make manifest the savor of thy knowledge in every place: that such as yet sit in darkness and the shadow of death, may come to see the light of thy truth, and the joy of thy salvation. O that every one who names the name of Christ may depart from iniquity, and so live up to their high and holy profession, that they may give no just occasion to the enemies of the Lord to blaspheme; but adorn the doctrine of God our Savior in all things and to put to silence the ignorance of foolish men by well doing.

Be gracious and favorable, O Lord, in an especial manner to thy church. Arise, O God, and plead thy own cause, and maintain thy true and holy religion, which thou hast so long and so wonderfully owned and asserted. O let not the enemies of thy church ever have cause to say, that they have prevailed against thy people; but let all that do espouse thy cause, and stand up for the honor and defence of thy truth, be still prevalent and prosperous in all their pious designs; and still have cause to say, the Lord be magnified, who has pleasure in the prosperity of his servants.

Bless, with the choicest of thy blessings, the President of these United States. O Lord, protect his person, direct his counsels, make his administration easy and happy, both to himself and us; and prosper all his undertakings and endeavors for the public safety, peace, and welfare of these states. Give all magistrates wis-

dom and courage to defend the truth and to do right to all. Make ministers an example to the flock, in all sobriety, righteousness and holiness of living; and establish us all an holy people to thyself; granting us one heart, and one way, that we may all agree in the same faith, and adorn it with a suitable life.

Comfort all that want the comforts which we enjoy; and apply thyself in a way of agreeable mercy, to the several necessities and calamities of all thy afflicted ones, wheresoever or howsoever they are tried. Remember, with the favor which thou bearest to thy people, all our friends and benefactors, our kindred after the flesh, and whosoever are dear to us on any other account. Make them, O Lord, such as thou wouldst have them, and such as, in Christ Jesus, thou wilt mercifully accept of them, here to thy gracious favor, and hereafter to thy glorious kingdom. Forgive our enemies, and turn their hearts; and turn ours to forgive them. And direct all our ways to please thee, that thou mayest make even our enemies to be at peace with us.

Hear us, O God of the spirits of all flesh! hear us for ourselves and others; others for themselves and us: and hear the Son of thy love, the lover of our souls, for us, and all the members of thy church militant here on earth, whereof Christ Jesus in heaven is the glorious head. For him, and to him with thine eternal Self, most holy Father, and the blessed Spirit of grace, our guide and comforter, be all thanks, and praise, and honor, and glory, humbly and heartily rendered and ascribed of us, and all thy people, now and for evermore. AMEN.

Another Morning Prayer for a Family.

O MOST holy, most merciful, and most gracious Lord God, thou art the inexhaustible fountain of all good, the source and spring of all our comforts here, and the sure and certain foundation of all our hopes hereafter; look down from heaven, the habitation of thy holiness, upon us, who humbly beg leave to renew our praises to thy Divine Majesty, in whom we live, and move, and have our being.

O Lord, we acknowledge, that under thy protection we have slept this night secure, and by thy infinite goodness it is, that we are now in health and safety; praised therefore be thy name, O Lord; O let all that is within us praise thy holy name; as long as we live we will magnify thee, O God, for thou art our creator, our preserver, and our constant benefactor.

To this end, O gracious Lord, make us truly sensible of the vanity of this world; that we may not be carried away with the force and power of sensible objects, nor brought under the dominion of those lusts which war against the soul. Give us grace so to use the world, as not to

abuse it; and grant that neither the cares of this life, nor the deceitfulness of riches, may ever make us neglect the great work thou hast given us to do. Root out of our hearts all covetous affections and desires, and let it be our great care and concern to provide for eternity, and to lay up a treasure in heaven, which faileth not.

Conduct us by thy good Spirit through the affairs and business of this life, that we may at last arrive at that place of everlasting rest and peace, which thou hast prepared for those who truly and sincerely love and fear thee, through the merits and intercession of thy beloved Son Jesus Christ our Lord ; in whose most comprehensive words we sum up our own, and the wants of all mankind, saying,—

Another Evening Prayer for a Family.

We pray thee, in a more especial manner to be gracious to all our friends and relations, and more particularly to O Lord, thou art thoroughly acquainted with all our wants ; O vouchsafe to give us what thou seest best and most fit both for our souls and bodies.

Accept, O merciful Father, of our unfeigned praises for all thy blessings, spiritual and temporal.

Our health and safety, and all the comforts of our lives, proceed from thy bounty and goodness ; to thee, therefore, we ascribe all possible praise and thanksgiving, humbly beseeching thee to grant us the continuance of thy mercy and goodness.

Gracious God, we humbly beseech thee to take away the guilt of our sins, through the atonement of thy Son; justify our persons through his righteousness, and subdue the power of our iniquities by thy Spirit. Deliver us from the natural darkness of our minds, from the corruption of our hearts, and the perverse tendency of our appetites and passions. May thy Spirit discover to us the evil and danger of sin, enlighten

our minds in the knowledge of God in Jesus Christ, and sanctify all the powers of our nature. Form our hearts according to thy will, and after the image of thy Son. Be thou our light and our strength, and quicken us in the paths of holy obedience. Fortify us against the temptations, and free us from the snares which daily attend us. While we are in this life we are in continual danger; let the watchful eye of our God be upon us for our defence. Save us from the power of our enemies in this world, and from the punishment due to our sins in the world to come.

Preserve the gospel among us, and let all the means of grace be continued to us, and be made serviceable for the great ends of their appointment. Let all thy providences be sanctified to us. May the same good providence defend us thro' the hours of this day, and may thy grace assist us in all the duties of it. Hear and answer us, pardon, accept, and bless us, for thy mercy's

sake in Jesus Christ, through whom, by one Spirit, be ascribed to the only living and true God, everlasting praises. AMEN.

Prepare all of us, we beseech thee, for the solemnities of thine house on the ensuing day, and render thine ordinances pleasant and profitable to us, and to our fellow-worshippers. Assist all thy ministers in leading the worship of thy sanc-

tuary, and in delivering the truths of the everlasting gospel; and do thou command the blessing out of Zion, even life for evermore. And O grant that the glad tidings of the gospel which we hear may be proclaimed through the whole earth, that all flesh may know the salvation of the Lord. We beseech thee to accept these our prayers, praises, and solemn vows, through the worthy name of thy dear Son, to whom, as the Lamb that was slain, to redeem us unto God by his blood, be glory and dominion for ever. Another Morning Prayer for a Family.

go on conquering and to conquer all the enemies of our souls, and all the hinderances of our salvation, till satan be bruised under our feet.

O thou God of all grace ! bring such thoughts to our minds, and lay such considerations home powerfully upon our hearts, as thou knowest most effectual to prevail with us, to work in us thy will, and to keep us from our iniquity, within the bounds of our duty, till thou receive us into the blessed kingdom of thy glory. And being justified by faith, grant us peace with God, through our Lord Jesus Christ.

And we pray that thou wilt be to us a Father of mercies, and a God of consolation ; so that thou wilt make us followers of God, as dear children ; ever jealous over our hearts, and watchful over our ways ; continually fearing to offend, and endeavoring to please thee ! and keeping our hearts with all diligence, that they may not be hardened through the deceitfulness

Though my sight is dim to the world, let my eyes be ever towards the Lord, and open to see the things of my peace ; though my ears are dull of hearing, let my heart be attentive to thy calls,

And because I am old in sins, as well as in years; pulled down with iniquity, as well as with age; and the number of my transgressions exceeds not only my years and days, but even the hours of my life, and the hairs of my head; O my gracious Lord, give me true repentance! and that godly sorrow for my sins, which may

prevent my going down in a worse sorrow to my grave. Thou hast saved many old sinners; O God, be merciful to me a sinner. Put all my sins upon the account of thy dear Son; and wash me thoroughly from them, in the fountain of his precious blood. Especially, O merciful Lord, acquit and discharge me from the sins that lie heaviest upon me; and that make the thought of death and judgment most frightful to me. O give me, Lord, some tokens for good, that I shall find such mercy at thy hands, that I may depart in peace, and finish my course with joy, and in the end of my life, be numbered among the redeemed, blessed of the Lord, through the tender mercies of my God, and the all-sufficient merits of my only Savior Jesus Christ. AMEN.



A Prayer for a Young Person.

WHITHER, O Lord, shall a young man go, or how shall he be able to escape all the snares which beset him, and all the corruptions within his own heart ever ready to betray him? Where, but to thy throne of grace, O God of all power? Here, therefore, do I present my supplication, humbly beseeching thee to give unto me that faith in thy word, which shall make me receive all thy promises with delight and comfort, and stand in awe of doing any thing to incur thy threatenings. Establish in me the fear of thy eternal majesty, and a steadfast purpose of

We desire at this season to remember all the past mercies with which thou hast been pleased to bless us and our household. God forbid that our present grief should make us unmindful of the constant benefits we have enjoyed. How long has each of our family lain down and risen up, gone out and come in, in

fore God the oblation of a broken and contrite heart; and may it be our concern, not to appear unto men to fast, but to him who seeth in secret.

Without any merit or worthiness of our own, we offer these our requests, through the mediation of our exalted High Priest, to whom, with the Father, and Holy Spirit, be equal honors, and everlasting praises. AMEN.

O GOD, the Creator and Preserver of mankind, who hast instituted the holy state of matrimony as the only way to continue the world, and for the comfort of man's life, under the various evils, cares, and labors of it, by the mutual society and help that married persons ought to have one for the other, both in prosperity and adversity, and for the good of human society, by preventing many confusions, and promoting concord therein: grant that now I have thoughts of entering into this state, I may so seriously consider the chief end of its institution, as not to enter into the same unadvisedly, lightly, or wantonly to satisfy my carnal lust or appetites; but reverently, discreetly, advisedly, soberly, and in the fear of God.

Let me seriously weigh and consider beforehand, the solemn vow and promise I shall then make, so as never to entertain any thoughts of it, without a sincere purpose of heart, and a firm resolution of mind to perform the same.

Let me consider, that if I marry, my future happiness or misery of life will very much depend on the choice I make; that with whomsoever I marry, I venture the being happy or unhappy all my days; and that I shall be obliged by thy holy laws, to love my partner, and no other till death.

Let not a wild and sensual, a heedless and inordinate spirit, rule me in this momentous change of life.

This is to be used by a person under the care of parents or guardians.

[And since I am young and under the care and direction of others, as I expect thy blessing, let me listen to their advice and better judgment in this matter.]

Let reason and religion, prudence and consideration, and, above all, thy good providence, direct my choice, and let my chief ends be those for which matrimony was ordained.

Let me chiefly aim at religion and virtue, wisdom and discretion, and such other good qualities and dispositions in a partner, as are most likely to last and continue, and not such only as please for a time, and will bear little satisfactory reflection afterwards.

O Lord, the Sovereign and wise Disposer of all things! grant I may duly consider that a man's heart deviseth a way, and proposeth a design to make his life easy and happy: Yet thou, O Lord, directest his steps, and determinest the event, and givest such issues as it pleaseth thee, and when thou seest fit, many times quite contrary to what he intended or persuaded himself of; I know the way of man is not in himself; it is not in man that walketh, to direct his own steps.

Let me, therefore, in all my ways, acknowledge thee, that thou mayest vouchsafe to direct my paths: let me not trust to my own prudence, care, skill, or any human aid: but let me seek to engage thy good providence on my behalf, and only regard to do my own duty; because the events are thine, and thou canst turn the

fairest prospects of happiness to my punishment and misery : and far be it from me, O God, to endeavor to rescue them out of thy hand, by fraud or falsehood, or by using any dishonest or unworthy means to bring this or any other purpose about ; always remembering, that *he that walketh uprightly, walketh surely*. And let me wait thy time, and think that always best ; for thou only knowest what things are joined to, and are the consequences of other, and what is fittest for me, and for my greatest happiness ; and hast promised that all things shall work together for good to those that love thee : in confidence hereof, let me rest satisfied with that state and condition (whatever it be) that thou in thy wisdom and goodness shalt order me. A Prayer for a Person under Affliction.

O MOST gracious God, who dost not afflict willingly, nor grieve the children of men ; I flee unto thee for comfort and support under the troubles thou hast laid upon me : I know assuredly, that this is thy hand, and that thou, Lord, hast done it. I acknowledge thy judgments are right, that thou of very faithfulness hast caused me to be troubled, and that my sins have deserved more grievous punishments than I now suffer. I am fully convinced, that the events of this life are not left to chance or uncertainty,

but are all under the steady and wise disposal of thy good providence.

To thee, therefore, O my God, do I direct my supplications : beseeching thee, O gracious God, who hast a tender love for all thy creatures, and more especially for thy faithful servants who repose all their hope and confidence in thy mercy, to have pity upon me, and to deal with me not according to my sins, but after thine own great mercy. Support and comfort me under all my troubles ; direct and counsel me in all difficulties ; carry me through all trials and temptations ; and, in thy good time,

take thy afflicting hand from me ; and grant that these light afflictions, which (in comparison) are but for a moment, may work for me an exceeding and eternal weight of glory. Hear me, O Lord, for thy mercy's sake, and for the sake of thy Son Jesus, our only Mediator and Advocate. AMEN.

O BLESSED Lord God, thou most compassionate lover of souls, look with thy tenderest pity upon me, a weak and frail creature, who am encompassed about with many and great infirmities ; my nature is corrupt, my passions are strong and violent, and so prone am I to peevishness and anger, that almost every slight provocation disorders my mind, and makes me forward and impatient, and many times (alas ! with sorrow I confess it) I have been hurried away into foolish and unreasonable passions.

GOD be merciful to me a sinner: a sinner beyond expression! How shall I lift up mine eyes towards thee, O thou most holy, or take thy name within my polluted lips! O Lord, thou needest not my confession to inform thee, for thine eye hath been ever upon my path: and of the things

that have come into my mind, thou hast known every one of them. The vanity of my childhood, the folly of my youth, the obstinacy and rebellion of my riper years, are all written in thy book. Alas! thou knowest I was conceived in sin, and have lived in sin ever since I was born. All thy commandments have I broken, all thy mercies have I abused, trifled with thy patience, resisted thy Spirit, and rejected thy gospel, times without number.

So foolish and ignorant, so stupid and hardened, and unthankful have I been; a transgressor from the womb: such has been my life. What then must my heart be, the foundation from whence all these streams of bitterness have flowed? O Lord, thou hast said it, and I cannot deny it, my heart is deceitful above all things, and desperately wicked. I am wholly defiled. There is no sound part in me. I am full of pride and ignorance, unbelief and self-will: my boasted strength is weakness, and my best righteousness as an unclean thing before thee. A Prayer for the Increase of Faith in Christ.

A Prayer for a Prisoner for Debt.

ALMIGHTY God, just and holy in all the dispensations of thy providence to the children of men: the difficulties and sorrows I labor under in this close confinement, are perfectly known to thee, who dost succor the miserable, and help the friendless. O Lord, I most sorrowfully confess, that I have deserved to suffer much greater punishments, and to feel the severities of thy wrath and displeasure, for I have abused my liberty, and neglected my duty. I have gone contrary to thy holy will, and refused to obey thy wise and righteous laws. I do therefore most humbly desire to submit to thy all-wise disposal, and patiently to wait for that time which thou shalt think best for my enlargement. O LORD God, thou art light, and in thee is no darkness at all; thou art the instructor of the ignorant, the light of those that are in darkness and error, and the fountain of all wisdom, and knowledge, and truth; I desire above all things to please thee, and to do thy will: and it is a trouble and grief to me to consider, that I have so often acted contrary to it; O that I may never do so again, that I may never more turn aside to the dark paths of sin and folly! O give me a wise and understanding spirit, that I may know my duty, and a heart fully bent and determined to practise it.

More particularly, O Lord, I address myself to thee at this time, to enlighten my understanding, and inform my unsettled judgment, how to determine safely in the matter which at present I know not how to act in. Show thou me the way that I should walk in, and leave me not to the weakness of my own reasoning, which, without thy enlightening grace, will lead me into the ways of error and confusion.

Give me, O Lord, I beseech thee, such an honest and upright heart, that nothing in the world may be ever able to seduce me from my integrity. Let not the example of a multitude persuade me to do evil, nor the most powerful allurements of riches, honor, or any other worldly advantage, turn me aside from thy commandments; but convince me more and more, how little it will profit me to gain the whole world,

and lose my own soul ; that being possessed with an awful fear of thy displeasure, I may never dare to do any thing but what thou approvest, and of which I may be able to give a comfortable account at the great day of the Lord Jesus.

Direct me, O my God, to those means which will inform my understanding, and satisfy my doubts ; that if it should be my misfortune, after all my inquiries, to fall into any unwilling error and mistake, O Lord, lay it not to my charge, nor let it ever provoke thy anger against me.

But, O Lord, if it is thy good pleasure that I should still remain under doubts, give me grace, I beseech thee, to submit to thy will, and to wait with patience, till thou seest fit to instruct me better ; and whatever advantages, as to this world, I may lose by it, yet let me still retain my innocence, and have the comfort and support of a good conscience. Suffer me not to be so regardless of my eternal interest, as for the sake of any temporal advantage to forfeit thy favor, which is better than all the enjoyments of this world.

O Lord, I leave myself in thy hands ; and I most humbly beseech thee to carry me through this and all other difficulties, and bring me to that blessed place of rest and peace, where I shall be out of all temptation and danger of offending thee, and where I shall love and praise thee throughout all ages.

Grant this, O merciful Father, for the sake, and through the merits of my dear Redeemer Jesus Christ. AMEN.

*A Prayer for the Enlargement and Prosperity
of the Church.*

O GOD of all grace, who hast called out of this present evil world a chosen generation, to know thy will, to seek thy face, to follow thy ways, and to inherit thy glory; bless all thy people every where, and cause thy face to shine upon them; and so add to their number, that all the ends of the earth may remember themselves, and turn to the Lord, and see the salvation of our God. Call home to thee again thy once only people the Jews; and take the veil off their hearts, that they may see and own their Messias; and let that blood of Christ, which they imprecated upon their heads, to their confusion, light on their hearts, to their conversion. Bring in the fulness of the Gentiles; and give thy Son the heathen for his inheritance and the uttermost parts of the earth for his possession. O give thy gospel a free and effectual passage throughout the world, that it may be further propagated where it has not yet reached, and the joyful sound may be heard, even where Christ is not yet named; and give such good success to it, where it shines already, that all who have received it, may sincerely obey it; and every one who name the name of Christ, may depart from iniquity; and let their light shine before men, to the glory of our heavenly Father, and to the adorning of thy doctrine and advancing the religion of God our Savior.

Convince and convert both the professed enemies of Christ, and also the enemies of his own

house. Beat down all antichristian powers, both in the false church, where christianity is so foully corrupted; and also beyond the borders of Christendom, where it is openly opposed. O shew unto them all the light of thy truth; that they may know it, as it is in Jesus, and expel their prejudices, together with their darkness; and so bring them to receive thy truth in the love of it, that they may be saved. O that the true religion of our Lord Jesus may prevail powerfully, and gain more proselytes daily throughout the world; that Jerusalem may be the joy and praise of the whole earth; and that we may see the good of it all the days of our life! and O that all errors, both in judgment and practice, the heresies of doctrine, and the ungodliness of life, may be more and more exposed and confounded, and suppressed, till they be utterly abolished! that the wickedness of the wicked (being under rebuke and disgrace) may come to an end; and that truth and peace, and holiness, may get still more credit and authority; and reign and flourish to the ends of the earth; thro' the abundant grace of our Lord Jesus Christ.

A devout Prayer that may be used at any Time.

O MY God, infinite in goodness and boundless in mercy to all who love and obey thee, grant me grace, I beseech thee, to love thee with all my heart, with all my soul, and with all my

strength, and for thy sake to love all men as myself; give me a charitable opinion of them all, whether friends or enemies; suffer me not rashly to judge or contemn any person, of what state or condition soever; and if it be my own lot to be despised and rejected by others, teach me with patience to submit.

Grant that I may never study to please men in any thing, whereby I may be in danger of displeasing thee; and that it may always be my chief and only desire, to promote thy honor, and to fulfil in all things thy most holy will.

Give me grace, O heavenly Father, to be entirely submissive and contented under all the afflictions, disappointments, and sufferings which it is thy pleasure I should endure, and which thy wisdom shall judge proper and useful to advance me towards thee. And grant that by every tribulation and adversity which may befall me, whether directly from thy hand, or from men, as thy instruments, I may be weaned from the world, and more closely united to thee.

O heavenly Father, I beseech thee, by the merits and death of thy Son, to give me grace to have thee always before my eyes; and with a holy fear seriously to consider the hour of my death, which is so uncertain; the shortness of my life, of which, alas! I have so unprofitably, for trifles, already lost so great a part; the day of judgment, which is so awful to the good, and terrible to the wicked; and upon the infinite and eternal punishments which shall then be inflicted upon impenitent sinners.

And, finally, grant, O infinite Bounty! that I

may never seek or find peace or pleasure in any thing without thyself; and that thy will may be the rule of my conduct, and of all my actions in this world, and thou thyself my eternal bliss and happiness in that which is to come.

II. O most gracious Savior, keep me from presuming on my own sufficiency; from relying on my own actions, and on my own conduct. Grant that I may not trust in any thing, but in thee alone, and in thy all-sufficient merits; that all my hope, and all my confidence may be in them; yet so as never to make me neglect any opportunity of performing that which thy grace hath enabled me to do.

Fill my heart, O blessed Jesus, with a lively sense of thy divine love; and deliver me from all the inclinations of impure and deceitful self-love. Raise my desires, enlighten mine eyes, and touch my soul, in order to give me the true knowledge and sense of thy love, of thy mercies, of thy wisdom, and of thy power: as also of my own nothingness; of my darkness and unfaithfulness; of my folly and wickedness; of my misery, and of my weakness.

O dearest Redeemer, grant I may never lose the memory of thy passion and death, but may have always recourse to thy merits and sufferings, as to an assured refuge, and as a blessed means of reconciliation to my offended God; and that I may look on thy wounds as an effectual remedy to cure all the defilements and corruptions of my sinful nature.

O Prince of Love! fill me so with thy divine love, that for the sake thereof, all toil and tra-

vail, all dangers and difficulties, may be sweet and easy to me; and that in comparison of thy sacred love, I may look upon all thy creatures, all their comforts, all their joys, and all their recreations, as mean and contemptible; that if at any time thy infinite wisdom shall think fit to withdraw them from me, I may feel as great cheerfulness in submitting to the want of them, as I have sometimes found reluctantly to be deprived of them. 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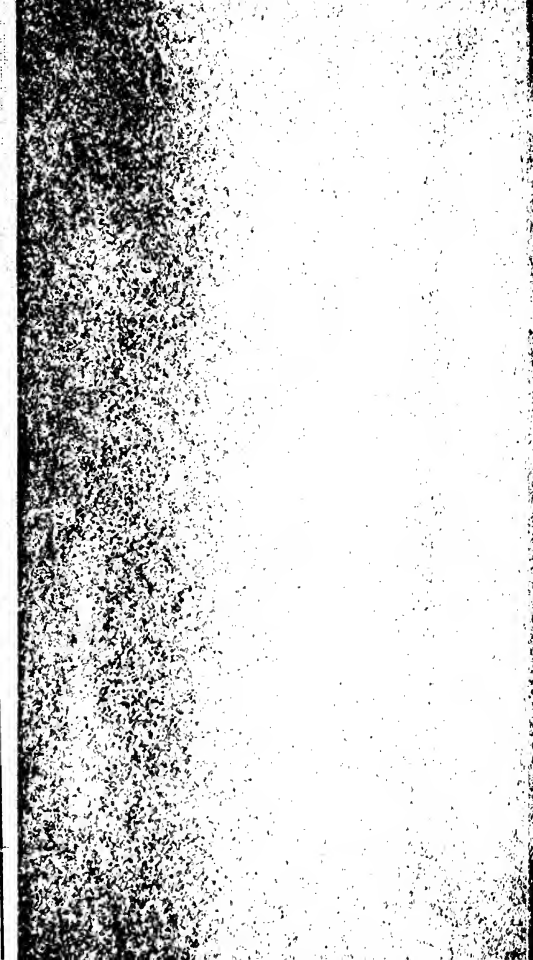
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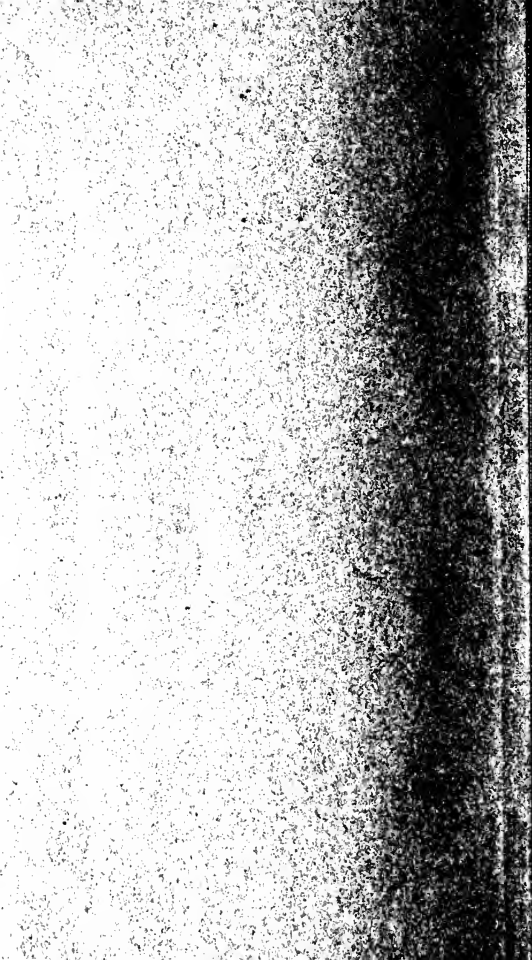












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
