ALUMNI FUND TOTALS \$62,403.31 for 1958-59

45% of Alumni Pledge Paid in First Year

The Ahumni Fund of Lycoming College, through the impetus of the Development Campaign, reached the highest level since it was inaugurated. Contributions (not pledges) received in the past year totaled \$62,-403.31 which represented 45% of the \$138,808 pledge by alumni during the Development Campaign last year. The 45% figure is particularly significant when it is recalled that the pledges made last year were for a three-year period.

Birkenstock '16 Fund Chairman

At the special summer meeting of the Executive Board of the Alumni Association Henry Birkenstock was named chairman of the Alumni Fund Committee. In reviewing the results of giving by alumni last year, Birkenstock made the observation that the Century Club had failed to enlist many new members. As a tentative goal, the Alumni Fund Committee hopes to double the membership of the Century Club. As its name indicates, membership is open to anyone who centributes \$100 or more in any one Fund year. Many of those whose names are listed at the right were present on Alumni Day to accept their certificates and formally become members of the Century Club.

A number of classes are without the benefit of a Class Agent. If your class fails to appear in any of the three statistical boxes and you want to do something about it, write to Henry Birkenstock immediately. He may be contacted through the Alumni Office. Some classes have Class Agents who have been inactive lately with the result that those classes are not listed in the statistics. Volunteers who wish to serve as Class Agents are an absolute necessity if the Alumni Fund is to continue to grow.

Perhaps the most disappointing statistic revealed in this analysis of the 1958-59 Alumni Fund is the percentage of participation. Only 7.2% of Lycoming's 4600 alumni were responsible for the \$62,403.31 in this year's fund. This is well below the level of participation of other small, church-related institutions. For the same period Albright College, in Beading, Pennsylvania, increased their level of participation to 33.4%. In 1957, 15% of the Nebraska Wesleyan alumni supported their alma mater. One year later, with the stimulus of a Challenge Club, their percentage rose to a record high of 33%. Lycoming alumni should set a goal of at least 20% participation next year.
