HONORARY DEGREES TO BE CONFERRED

CHANCELLOR TOLLEY NAMED COMMENCEMENT SPEAKER

WILLIAM PEARSON TOLLEY, Chancellor of Syracuse University, will receive the honorary degree, Doctor of Laws, and deliver the Commencement Address, at the 114th Commencement of Lycoming College June 3, 1962. Dr. Tolley became the seventh chancellor and president of Syracuse University in 1942.

Before returning to his alma mater as chancellor, Dr. Tolley had for 11 years headed Allegheny College in Meadville, Pennsylvania.

He was elected president of Allegheny in 1931 at the age of 30—then the youngest man in the nation to head a four-year institution of higher learning. In the brief span of nine years between graduation from Syracuse in 1922 with an A.B. degree and the appointment as a college president, Dr. Tolley accomplished the following:

- Earned four advanced degrees and in 1925 was ordained a minister of The Methodist Church. The degrees were: M.A., Syracuse University, 1924; B.D., Drew Theological Seminary, 1925; M.A., Columbia University 1927; and Ph.D. Columbia University, 1930.
- Assumed additional duties in 1927 as Alumni Secretary of Drew Seminary and Assistant to the President of Drew University.
- Elected the first Dean of Brothers College in 1929. At the same time he completed studies for his Ph.D. degree at Columbia while planning the curriculum and organizing the faculty for Brothers College.

His accomplishments at Syracuse have been no less striking. Dr. Tolley has completed several successful financial campaigns including one for \$15,000,000, increased the physical assets of the University from \$13,000,000 to more than \$65,000,000 and he has increased the endowment more than five-fold from about \$4,000,000 to more than \$20,000,000. Nearly 1,400 faculty members now teach in educational programs that span the state.

Twenty-four colleges and universities have conferred honorary degrees upon Dr. Tolley.

BISHOP CORSON TO DELIVER BACCALAUREATE SERMON

FRED PIERCE CORSON, Resident Bishop of the Philadelphia area of The Methodist Church, will deliver the Baccalaureate Sermon to the Class of 1962 at 10:45 on the morning of June 3, 1962. In the afternoon, at the 114th Commencement of Lycoming College, he will have the honorary degree, Doctor of Humane Letters, conferred upon him. As in recent years, the baccalaureate service will be held in the sanctuary of the Pine Street Methodist Church.

Bishop Corson received his A.B. degree from Dickinson College graduating with Phi Beta Kappa honors. Drew University conferred the B.D. degree upon him where he was the first recipient of the John Heiston Willey Award for pulpit excellence. He joined the New York East Annual Conference of The Methodist Church in 1920 serving as pastor of churches in New York and Connecticut. Later he served as District Superintendent of the Brooklyn South District of that Conference. In 1934 he was elected the 20th President of Dickinson. He continued as President until 1944 when he was elected to the episcopacy of The Methodist Church.

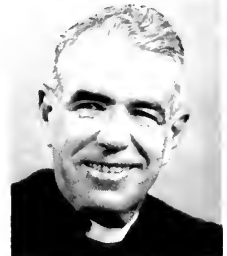
Minister, educator, and administrator, Bishop Corson has had a distinguished career. Last year he was installed as President of the World Methodist Council. His extensive travels abroad have made him an influential figure in international affairs. In 1961 he was a delegate to the World Council of Churches' Assembly in New Delhi, India. He is also the recipient of the St. George's Medal for distinguished service in the World Methodist Church.

A member of a number of academic societies and fraternities, Bishop Corson was awarded the Yorktown Medal of the Society of Cincinnati for distinguished service in the field of Christian citizenship and education. A trustee of seven institutions, Bishop Corson has been a member of the Board of Directors of Lycoming College since 1949.

Twenty-four colleges and universities have conferred honorary degrees upon Bishop Corson.

RECIPIENTS OF HONORARY DEGREES AT SESQUICENTENNIAL COMMENCEMENT

DOCTOR OF LAWS

STAFFORD H. CASSELL '34, Vice-President of American University, will have the honorary degree, Doctor of Laws, conferred upon him at the 114th Commencement of Lycoming College, Sunday, June 3.

Mr. Cassell was graduated from Williamsport Dickinson Seminary and Junior College. He received his A.B. degree from The American University in 1936 and two years later received his M.S. degree from The Pennsylvania State University. He continued his graduate work at the University of Wisconsin and held teaching positions with the rank of full professor at The American University and Morningside College. Prior to his present responsibilities

as Vice-President and Administrative Assistant to the President, he served The American University as Assistant to the Dean, Chairman of the Department of Health and Physical Education, Director of Athletics, and Coach of football, basketball, and baseball. He has also served with the United States representatives to President Eisenhower's Advisory Committee on Physical Fitness for Youth.

In 1960 Mr. Cassell coordinated the Northeastern Jurisdictional Conference held at The American University. In his present capacity he has helped to formulate and interpret for Congressional Committees various legislative issues of interest to the Church and higher education.

DOCTOR OF DIVINITY

JOHN F. STAMM '24, District Superintendent of the Altoona District of the Central Pennsylvania Annual Conference, will have the honorary degree, Doctor of Divinity, conferred upon him at the 114th Commencement of Lycoming College, Sunday, June 3.

Mr. Stamm was graduated from Williamsport Dickinson Seminary, Bloomsburg State College, Susquehanna University, and the Conference Course of Study of the Central Pennsylvania Annual Conference of The Methodist Church. He was a member of the Northeastern Jurisdictional Conference in 1956 and has served the interests of the Church in numerous capacities. He has been chairman of the Conference Board of Missions since 1951. While serving as a member of the Board of Directors of the Conference Home for the Aged, Mr. Stamm was chairman of its development committee. He has also served as chairman of a special study committee to determine the

needs of the aging and to develop a more adequate program to satisfy these needs. As a result of the work of this committee, the Conference plans to build an additional Home for the Aged at Mechanicsburg, Pennsylvania.

Mr. Stamm's pastorates have included Catawissa Circuit (1924-28), White Haven (1929-33), Altoona: Fairview (1934-37), Jersey Shore: First (1938-42), Philipsburg (1943-46), Chambersburg (1946-50), Altoona: Juniata (1951-56), Lewistown: First (1957-60), Superintendent: Altoona District (1961-).

DOCTOR OF DIVINITY

LEON W. BOUTON, District Superintendent of the Wilkes-Barre District of the Wyoming Annual Conference, will have the honorary degree, Doctor of Divinity, conferred upon him at the 114th Commencement of Lycoming College, Sunday, June 3.

Mr. Bouton received his A.B. degree from Syracuse University in 1927. The S.T.B. degree was conferred upon him by the Boston University School of Theology in 1930. The following year he received his A.M. degree from the Boston University Graduate School. Mr. Bouton was a member of the Northeastern Jurisdictional Conference in 1952, 1956, and 1960. He is also one of three clergy members on the Northeastern Jurisdictional Board of Lay Activities. Mr. Bouton is a former Secretary of the Conference and served as the President of the Conference Board of Education for four years. Under his presidency the Conference selected and purchased the Camp Center at Sky Lake, New York, and hired the first full-time Executive Secretary of Christian Education.

Mr. Bouton's pastorates have included Nichols (1931-32), Oxford-Guilford (1933-35), Oxford (1936-37), Binghamton: Fairview (1938-41), Carbondale (1945-46), Endicott: First Church (1947-57), Superintendent: Wilkes-Barre District (1958-).

Mr. Bouton's son, William D., is a member of the graduating class of 1962 at Lycoming College.
