LYCOMING BEGINS ACADEMIC CENTER

On July 15 Lycoming College broke ground for the new four and a half million dollar academic center. Williamsport Mayor Raymond M. Knaur, former Congressman Robert F. Rich, honorary chairman of the board of directors, and other dignitaries participated. Dr. D. Frederick Wertz, president, presided. The ceremony, held on the corner of Ross Street and College Place, across from Rich Hall, lasted one-half hour and drew faculty, situal ents, and townspeople to watch.

Mayor Knaur, representing the city of Williamsport, spoke briefly and turned a shovel full of earth. Congressman Rich and Fred A. Pennington, president of the board of directors, represented the board in the groundbreaking. Dr. Philip R. Marshall, dean of the college, Harold W. Hayden, college librarian, and several students, turned shovels of earth in the name of the student body. Nathan W. Stuart '36 represented the alumni association. Joseph J. Bendel, director of the Williamsport Urban Redevelopment Authority was present and Horace O. Hallman, administrative assistant to Congressman Herman T. Schneebeli, represented the Congressman.

Representatives of the various contractors and the architectural firm of Wagner, Hartman and Associates also attended. Those represented were the Stan Sciple Company of Simbury, general contractors; the J. L. Turner Company of Wilkes-Barre, plumbing contractors; the George F. DeLallo Company of Hazleton, heating, ventilating, and air conditioning contractors and the McDermott Brothers of Williamsport, electrical contractors.

College Receives \$400,000

Lycoming has received a grant of \$400,000 through the Appalachian Regional Development Program which will be applied toward the construction of the academic center. Dr. Wertz was notified by Senators Hugh Scott and Joseph S. Clark that the college's application for the grant had been approved.

Lycoming qualified for the grant under Section 214 of the Appalachian Regional Development Act which pertains to supplementary grants to federal grants-in-aid. In June of 1965 the college received a federal grant of \$894,988 to be applied toward the construction of the new center. Thus, it was eligible for consideration of the Appalachian grant as a supplement to the original one.

In April Lycoming received a loan of one and one-half million dollars under Title III of the Higher Education Act of 1963. In addition, the Central Pennsylvama Conference of The Methodist Church has contributed \$524,000 and the Wilhamsport Foundation has granted \$250,000 toward the funding of the new center.

The new academic center will consist of four units joined together to create a functional complex for teaching and learning. The three-story structure will provide 200,000 square feet of usable space, almost doubling present academic facilities. Construction has begun on the center and plans call for its completion by January 1, 1968.

Lycoming Uses TV in Biology Lab

The biology department at Lycoming College is using a new teaching aid in the laboratory which accelerates some of the instruction by as much as twelve times. It is a closed circuit television camera with three monitors which makes it possible to illustrate and explain experiments, dissections, etc., to an entire class at once. Wenrich H. Green, biology instructor, has been able to explain things to his current summer school classes which in prior sessions required a three-hour lab period. He can place materials directly before the camera or shoot through a mieroscope in order to study slide mountings. The class simultaneously sees a bright, accurate example while he discusses the work. Formerly he had to go through the normal time-consuming steps of asking the students to study text-book diagrams of what they should see in their individual microscopes, giving them time to adjust their scopes, then visiting each student to make sure he was viewing the specimen on his slide clearly and accurately.

The students like their lab television. Their response to watching the screen as Mr. Green demonstrates dissections of such things as worms, starfish and other biological subjects has been to improve noticeably in their own dissection assignments which follow.

Homecoming Grows

In response to numerous requests Homecoming activities this year for alumni will begin Friday, October 7. Homecoming day is October 8. Class agents will be invited to the campus for dinner Friday evening. At 8:30 p. m. a two-hour show for all alumni and students will be presented at the Elks' Auditorium by one of the country's top performing groups, The Highwaymen. Following the show there will be an alumni coffee hour on campus. Information about tickets and accommodations for the week end will be announced in September to all alumni.

Saturday morning class agents will meet for a refresher session on the college annual giving program. Their program will conclude with a luncheon.

Alumni Giving Reaches \$50,000

When the books of the Alumni Fund closed on June 30, there were a number of new records. Total alumni giving for the first time exceeded \$50,000 reaching a grand total of \$50,506.53. This included gifts for the Alumni Lecture Hall, Development Fund, other designated gifts from alumni as well as an annuity gift.

New High for Century Club

The Alumni Office would like to see more days like Thursday, June 30. On that day alone three \$100 checks were received, boosting Century Club membership to 64. The previous high was 57 last year. Of course we would like to see this record of 64 broken during the coming year.°

While not as dramatic, gifts also increased for the Alumni Lecture Hall. Alumni who made pledges to the Development Fund will not find their gifts reflected in the Lecture Hall totals although they are included in the overall totals for the year. The \$13,067.93 designated for the Lecture Hall this year when added to last year's \$12,224.43 brings the Alumni Lecture Hall total for the two years to \$25,292.36.

The following table summarizes the alumni giving for the last four years and reflects the records set last year in each area. May issue of the Newsletter carried a two-page picture story of the phonathons which began in Williamsport and continued in New York City and Philadelphia. These three phonathons resulted in gifts and pledges amounting to \$5,200 most of which was received prior to the end of the fiscal year. Phonathons in these three eities and other cities are being planned for the current year. Anyone interested in joining a phonathon should make his wishes known to Andrew R. Lady.

Class of '64

There were a total of 794 contributors to the Alumni Fund. While not a record it marked an increase of more than 100 over last year. Participation by Seminary and Junior College alumni remained about the same; College alumni accounted for virtually the entire increase going from 321 two vears ago to 448 last year. We cite for outstanding participation the record number of 41 contributors from the Class of 1964. A close second was the Class of 1957 with 38 contributors. The Class of '49 regained the percentage of participation title with 19.4%. Again the Class of '57 was a close second at 19.0%. No College class has broken the 20% barrier since 1962 when the Class of '49 set the current rec-
