The threefold purpose of Delta Kappa is stated as: "First, to recognize men who have attained a high standard of efficiency in collegiate activities and to inspire others to strive for conspicuous attainments along similar lines; second, to bring together the most representative men in all phases of collegiate life and thus to create an organization which will help to mould the sentiment of the institution on questions of local and intercollegiate interest; and third, to bring together members of the faculty and student body of the institution on a basis of mutual interest and understanding.

Delta Kappa recognizes and encourages achievement in five major phases of campus life -scholarship; athletics; student government, social and religious affairs; publications; and speech, music, drama, and the other arts. Student membership is limited to three per cent of the male enrollment of the junior and senior classes.
