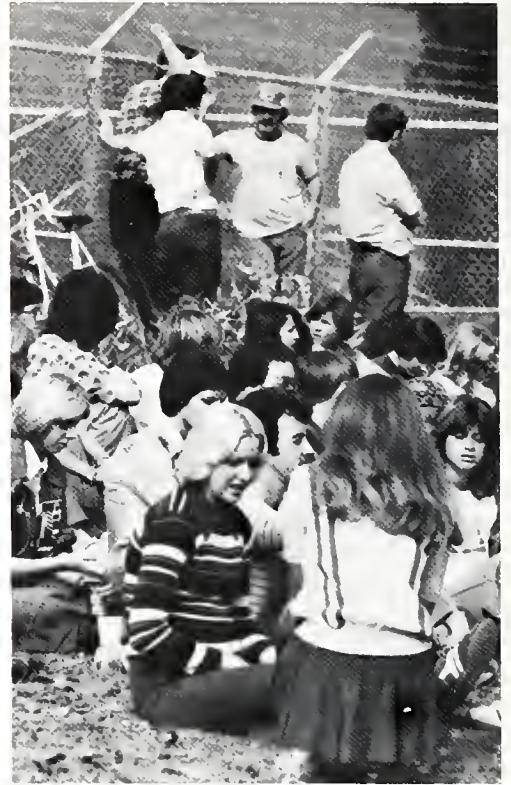

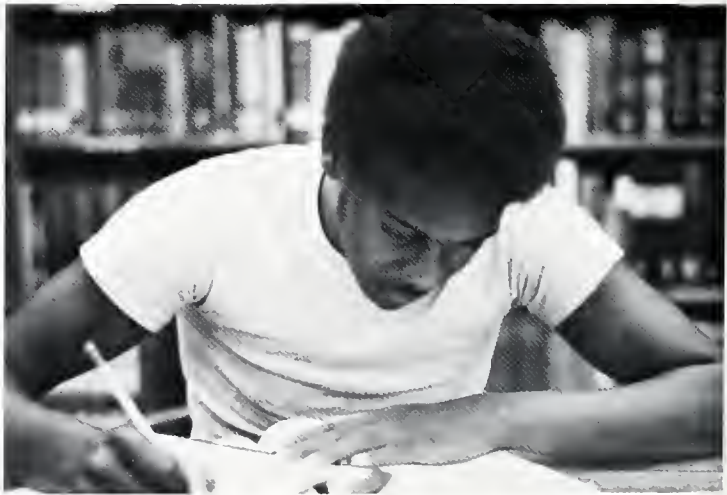

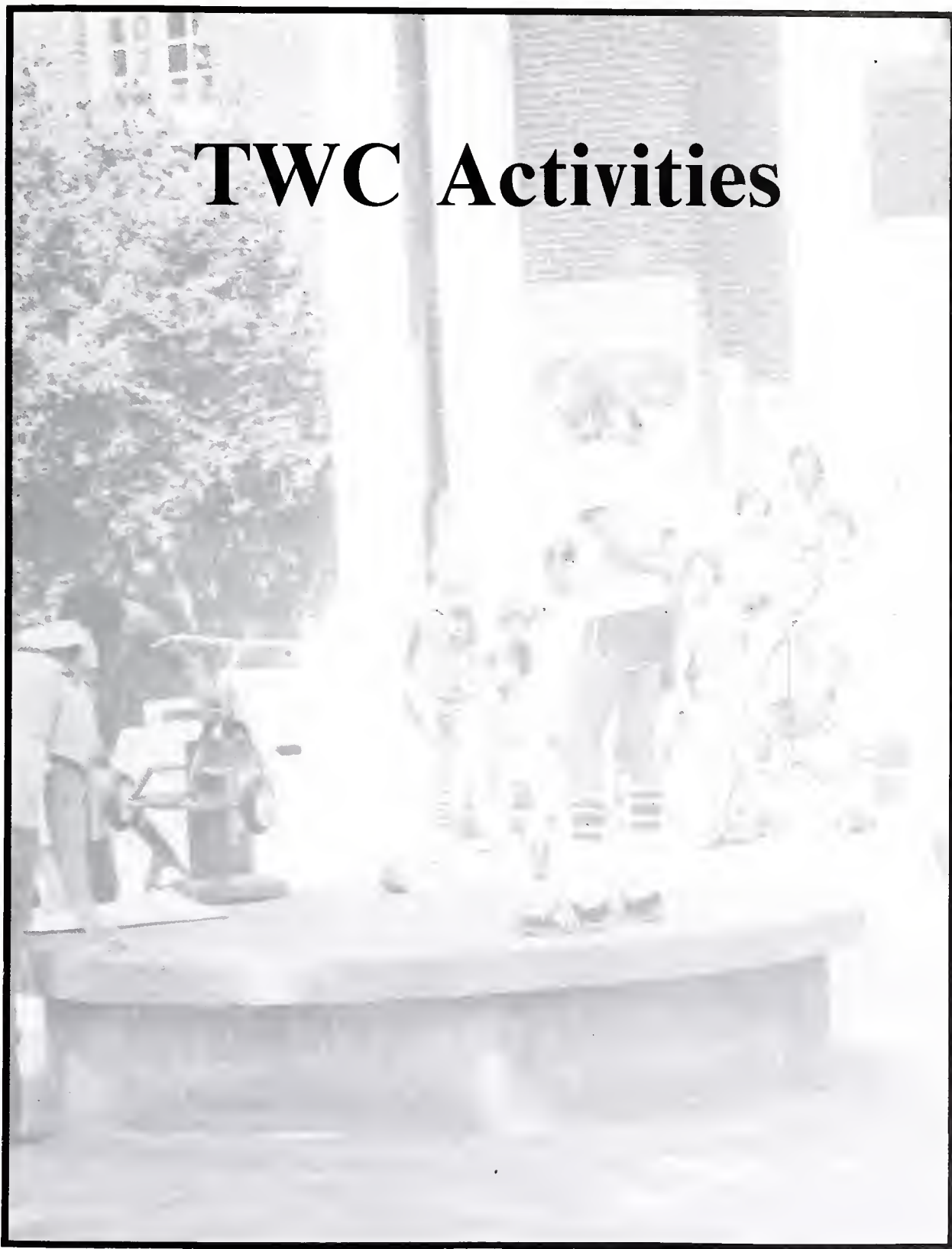

A favorite of the 1977 Carnival goers was the dunking booth sponsored by the TWC baseball team. It seemed everyone wanted to get in the act.



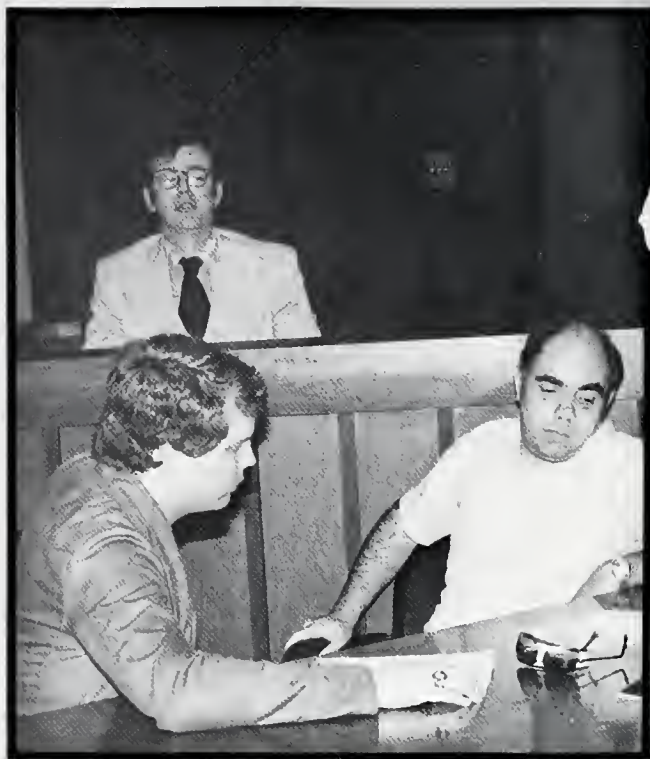

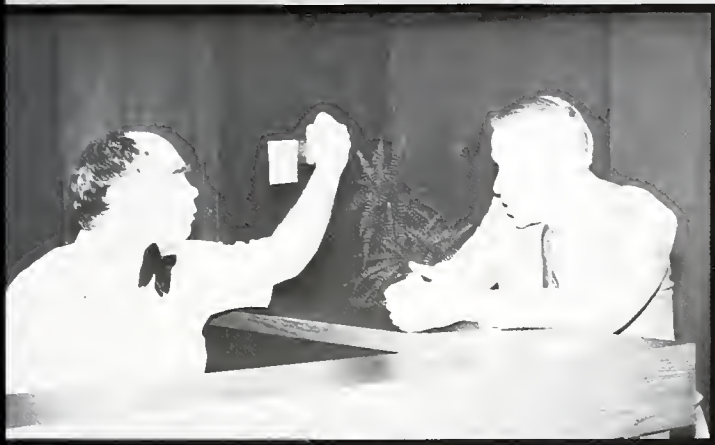

The M.C. (Tip) Smith Award was presented by Dr. Jack Bowling to David Ellis. David was also named captain of the 1978-79 basketball team.

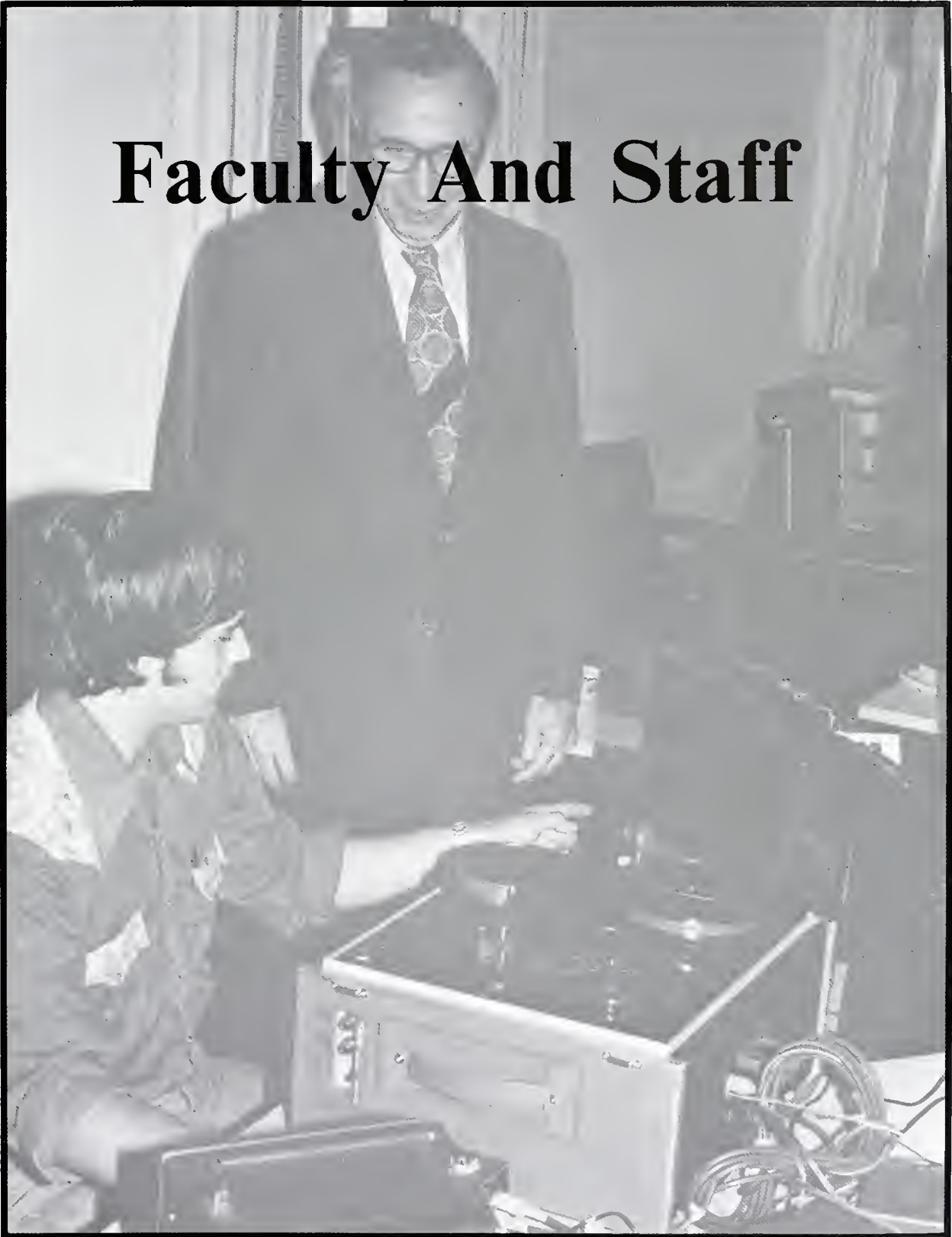
