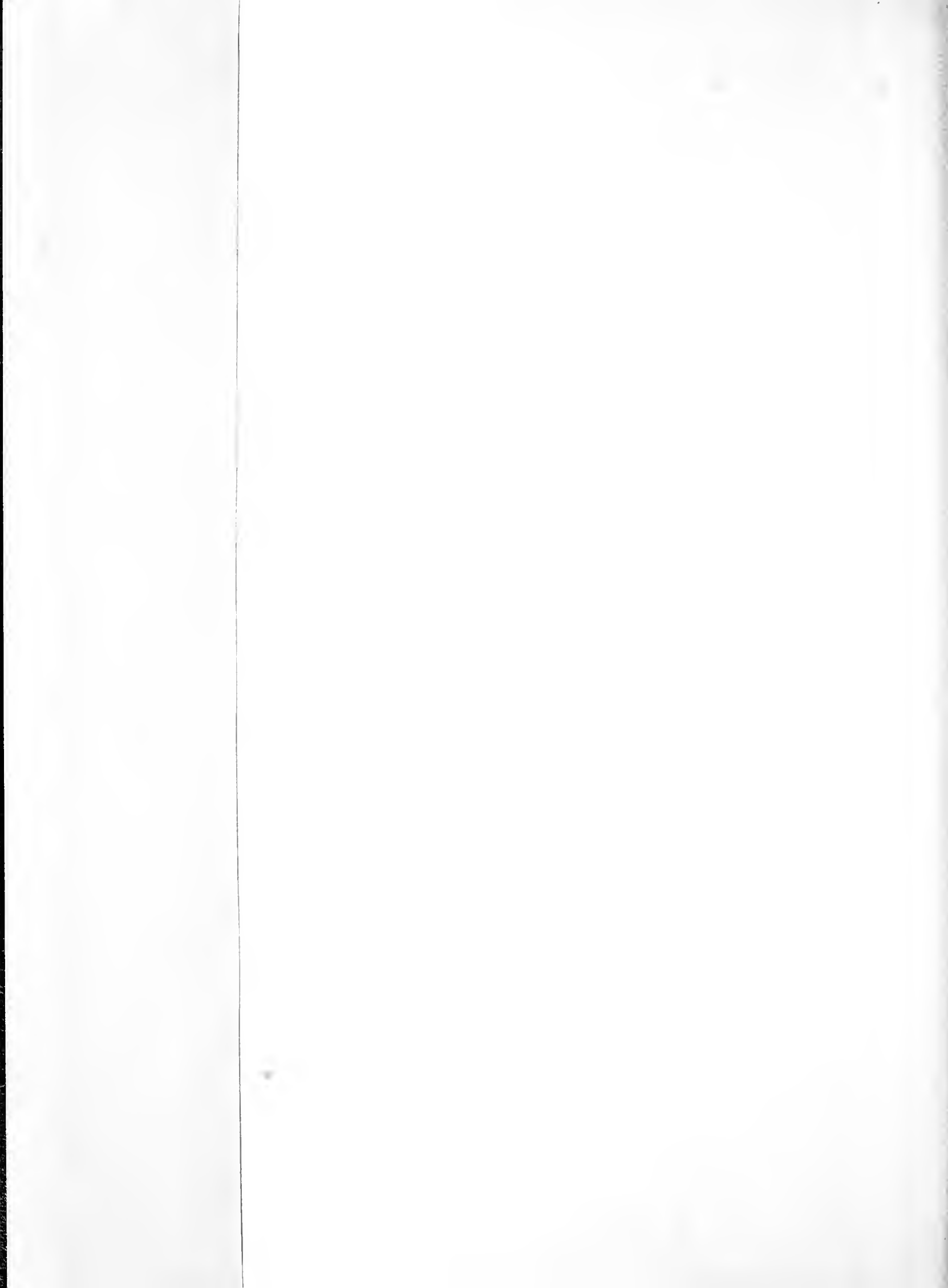

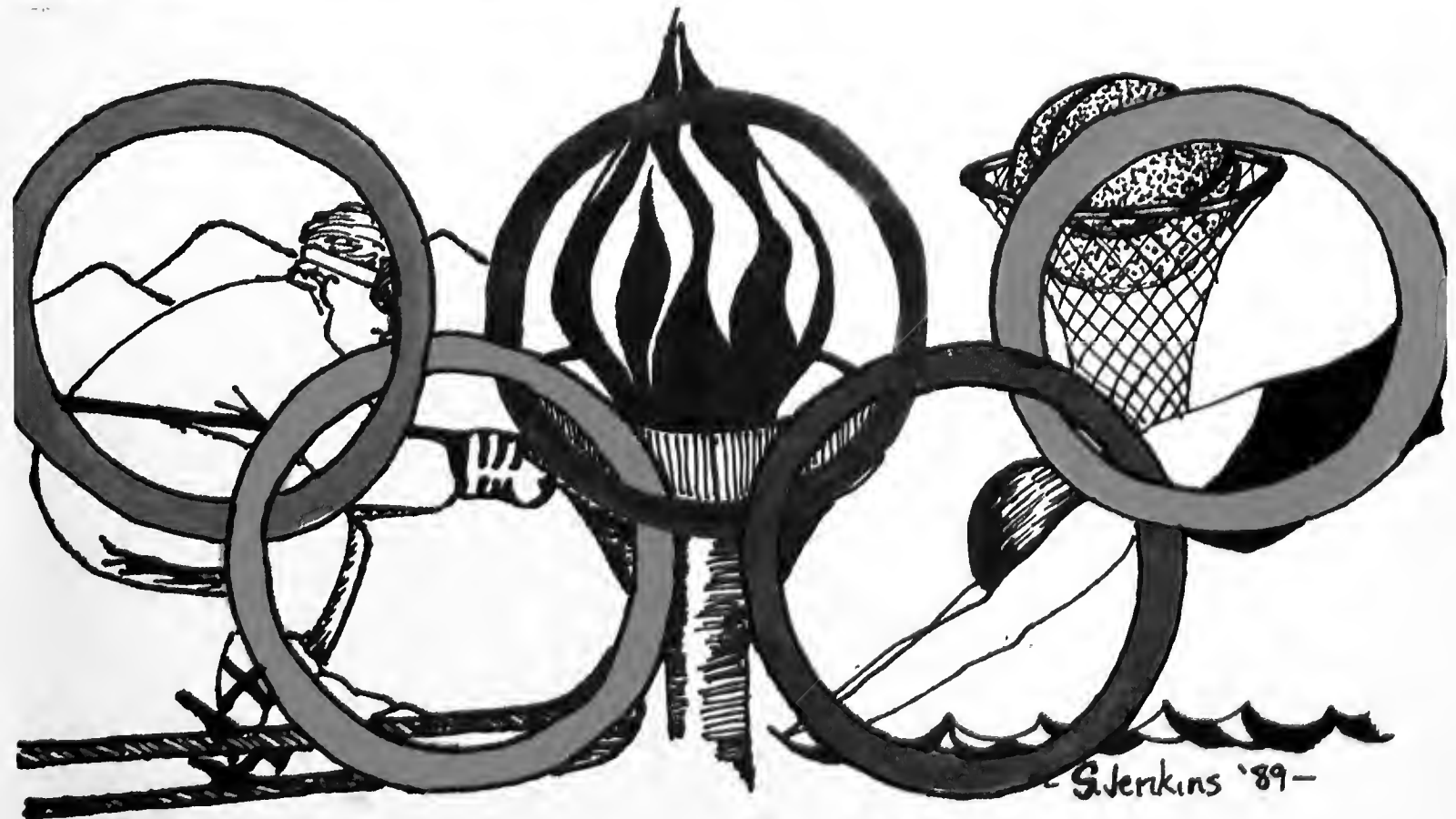
EVENTFUL

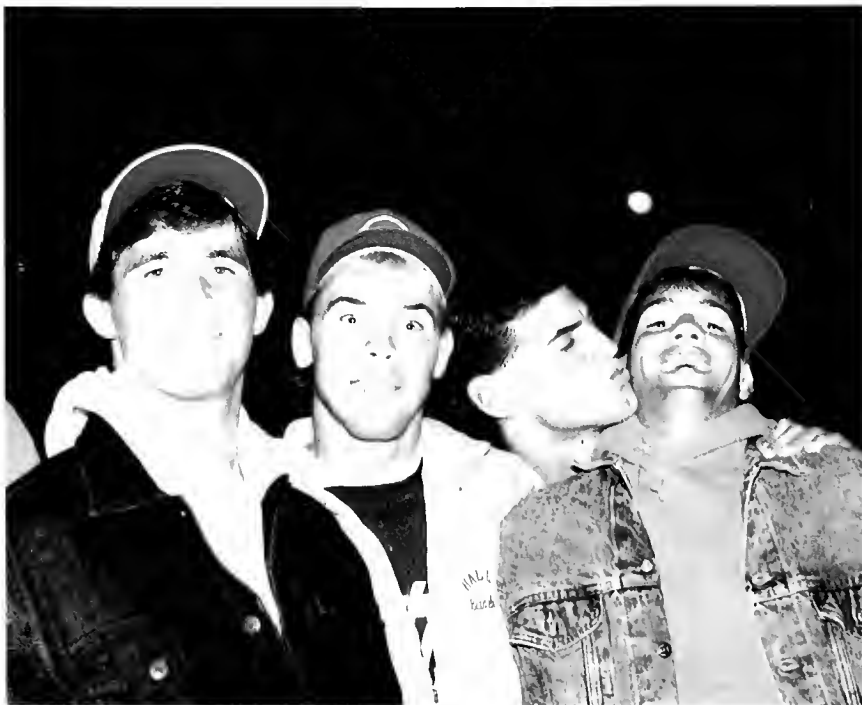




SUPERB

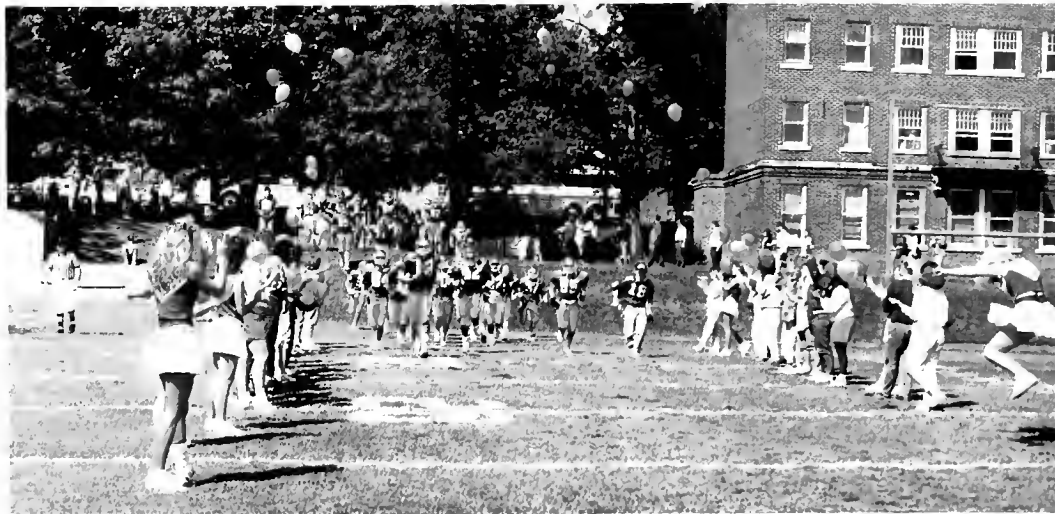

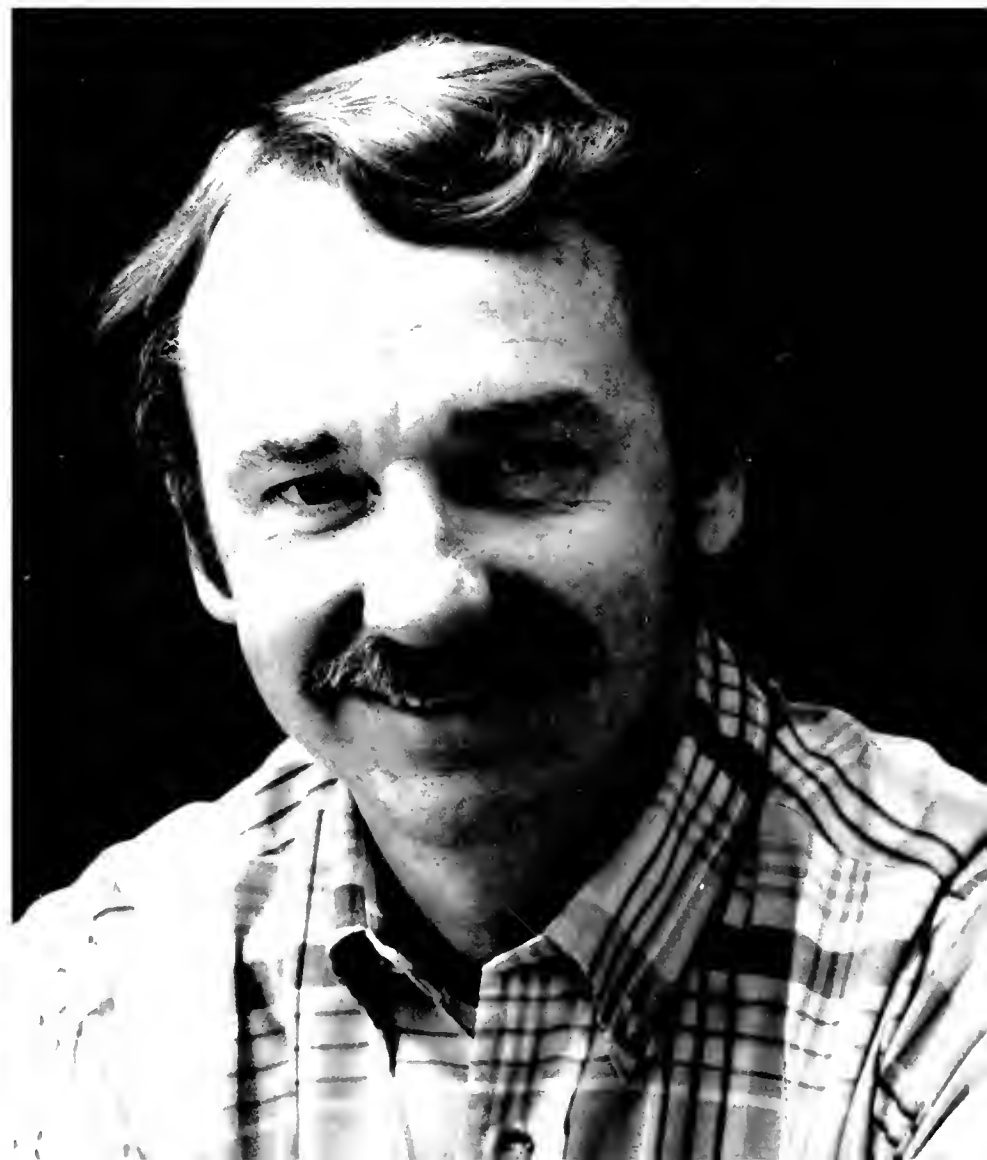


SUPERB

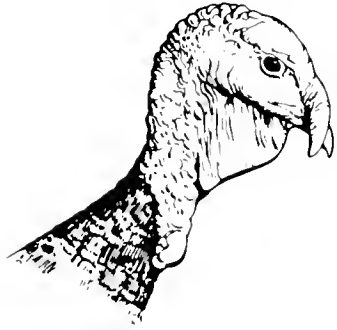


EXCITING

COUNTRY

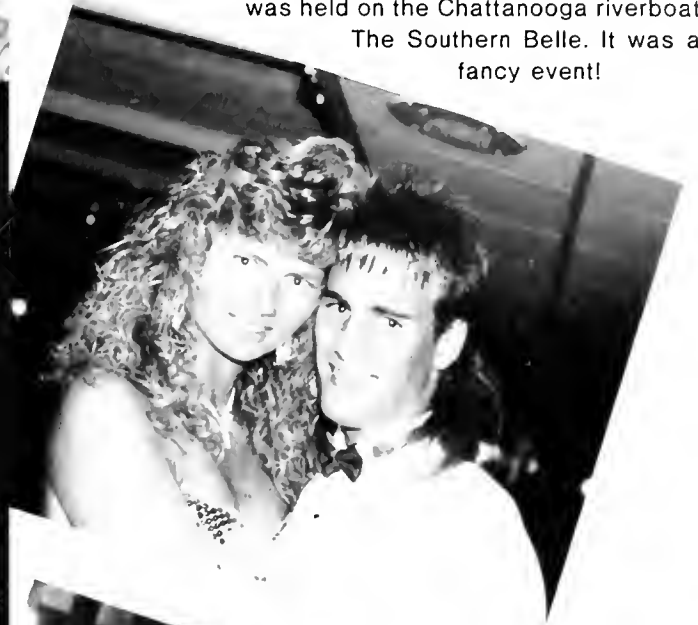

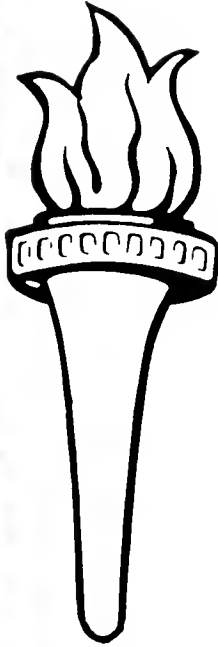
BONDING

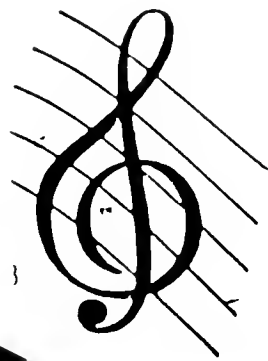

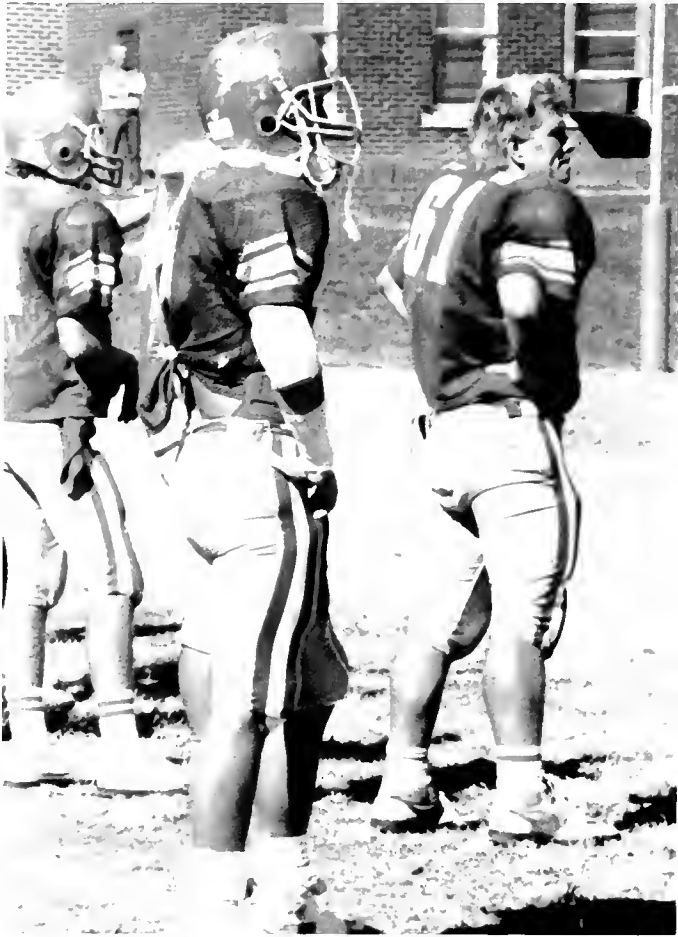

Spirits were high throughout the year, and the team kept their crowds excited with dunks and outstanding plays. Overall, men's basketball was exciting and hot.

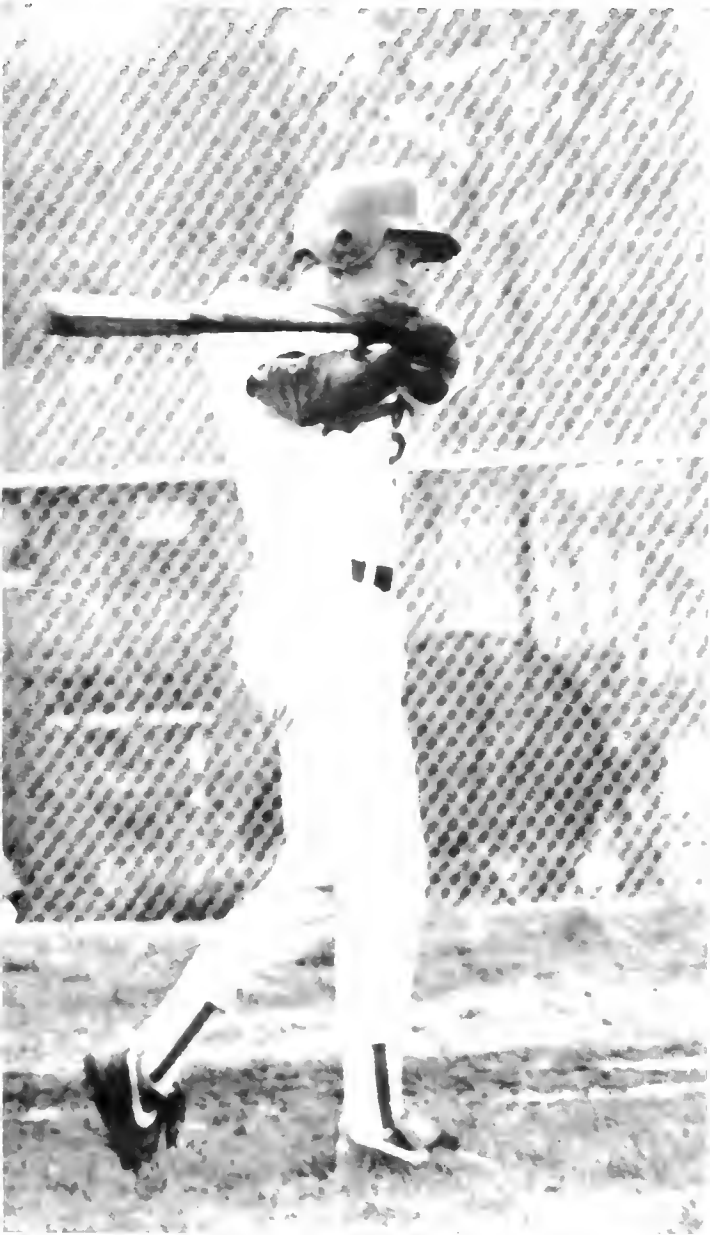
