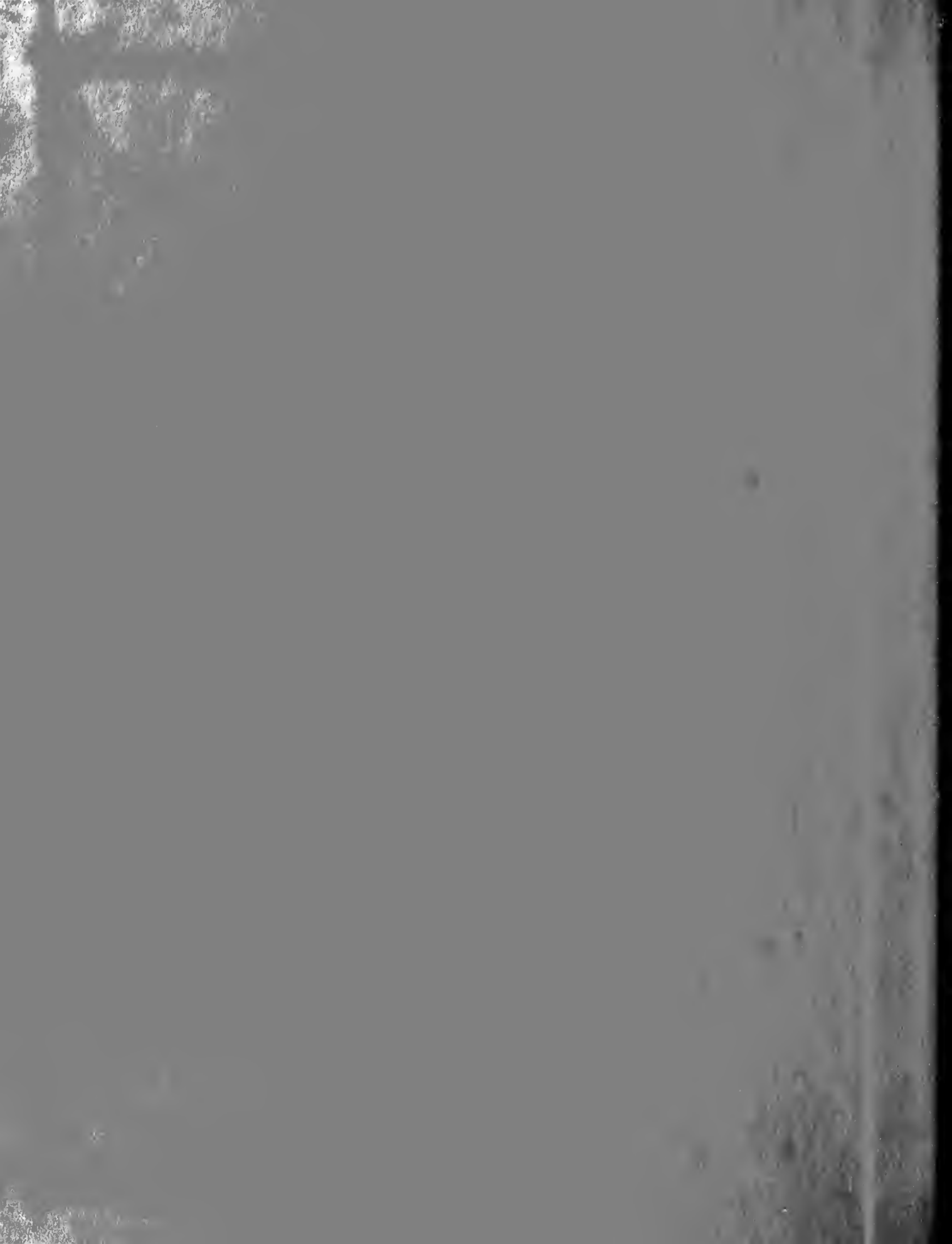

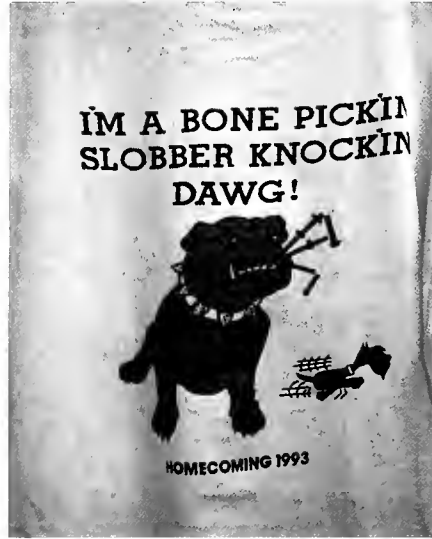
Homecoming Day: Stepping out with Style

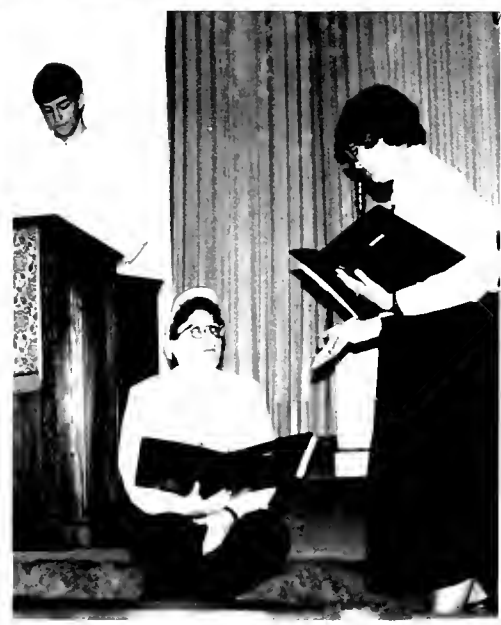

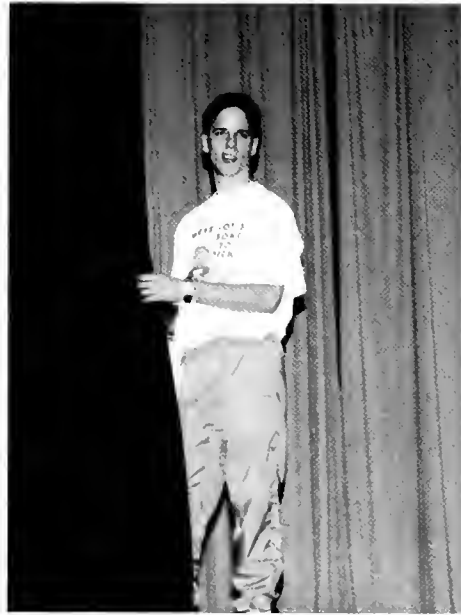
Seniors are the most dedicated students, they have survived all the hardships of school. They realize that they are on the last stretch before they graduate.

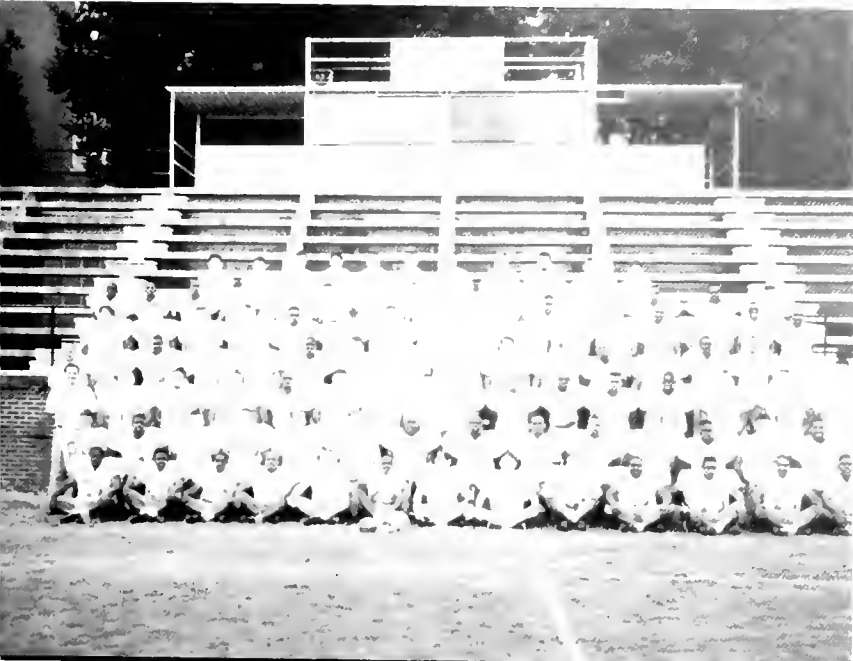
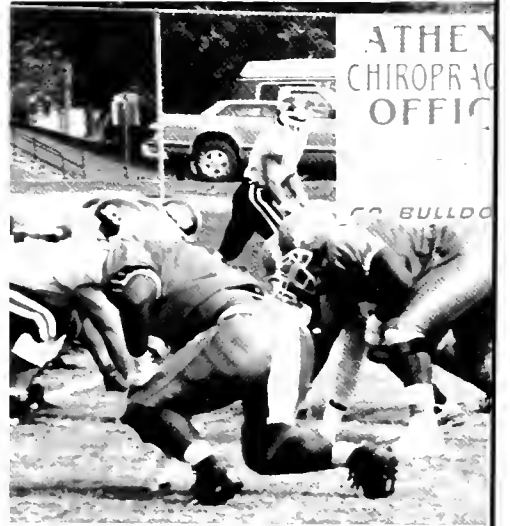
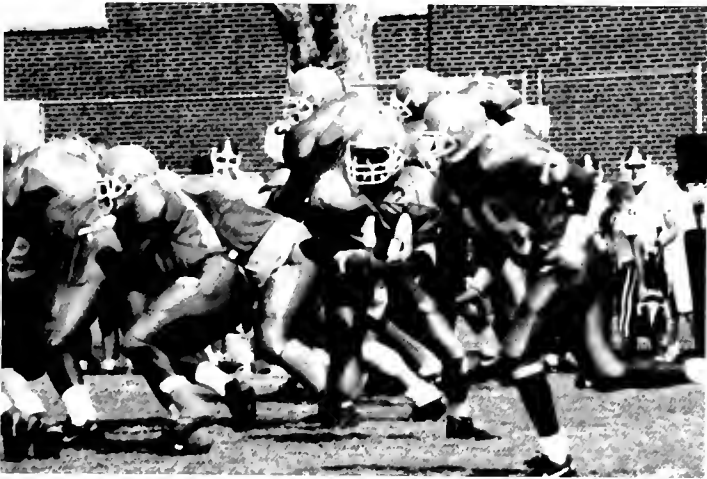
Football Squad

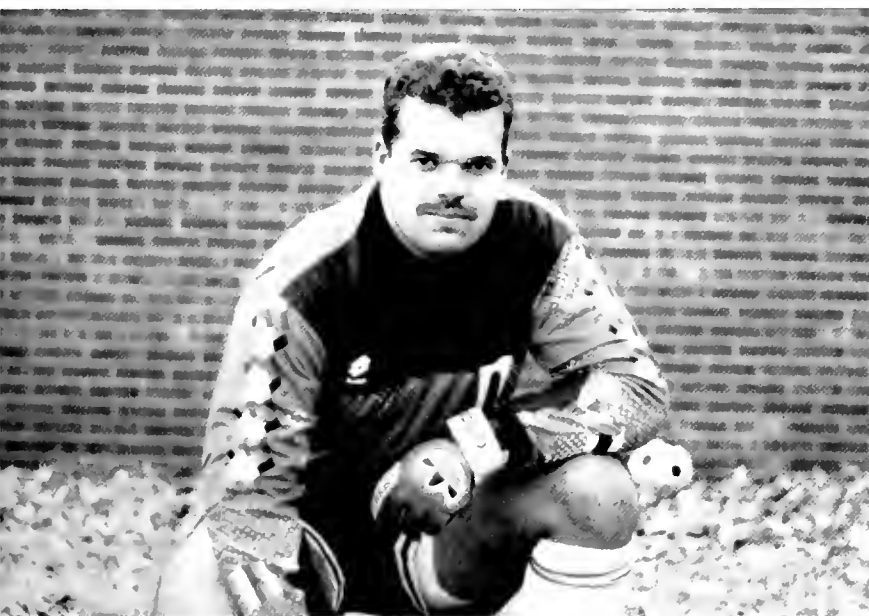

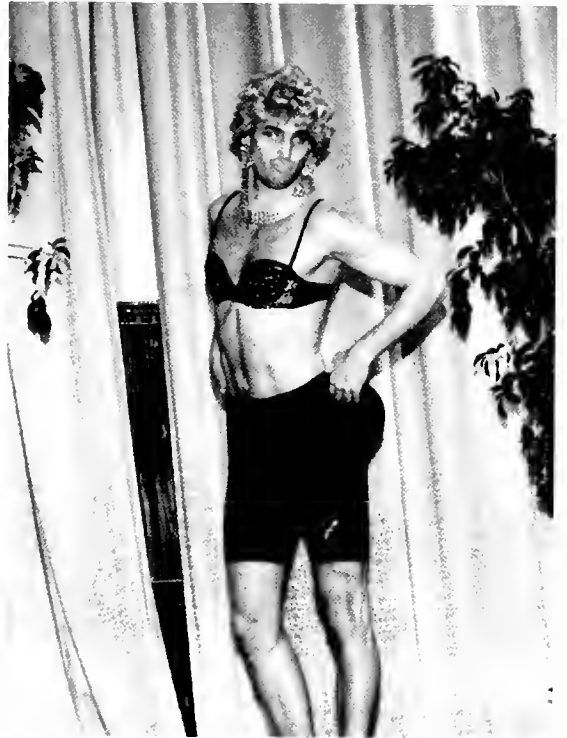

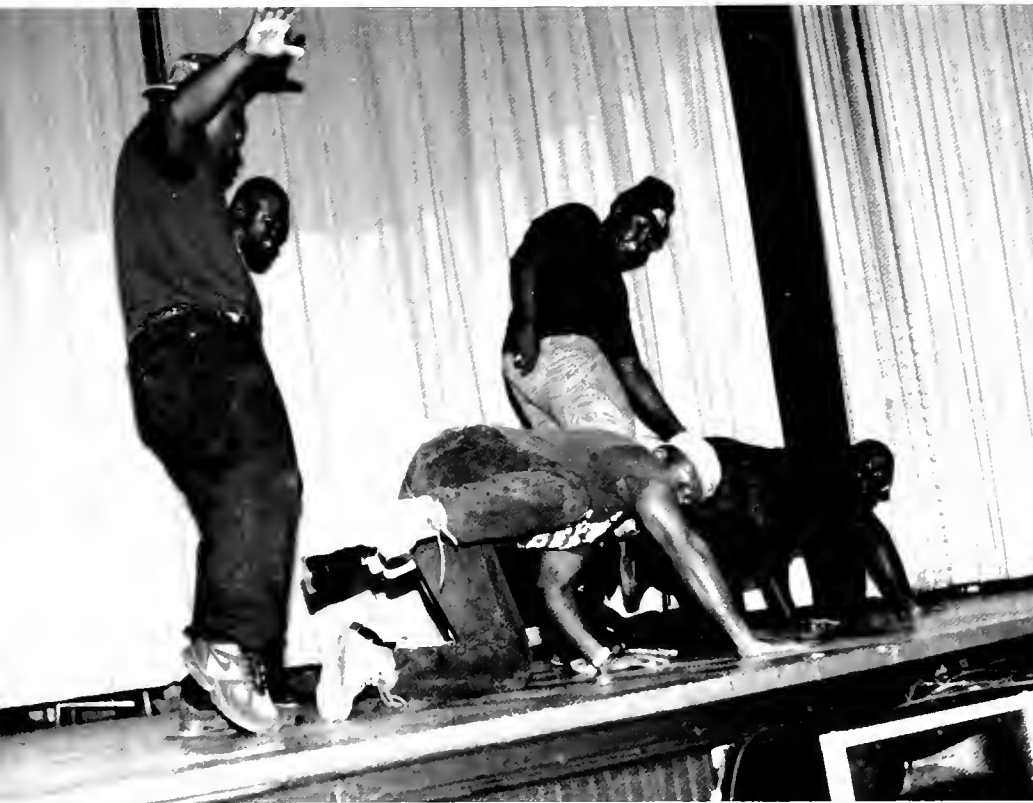

Honor's Day

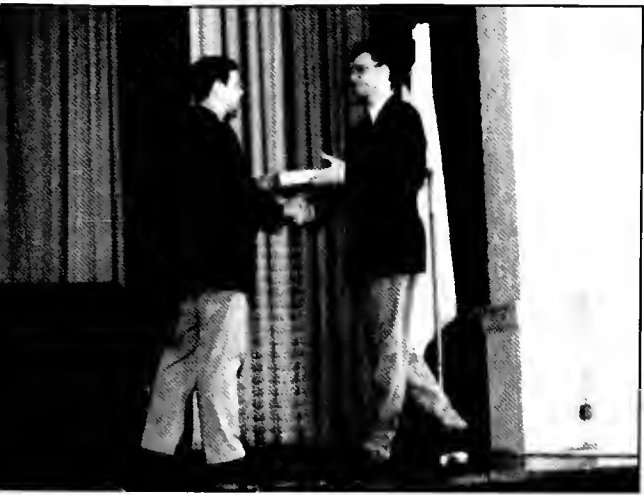

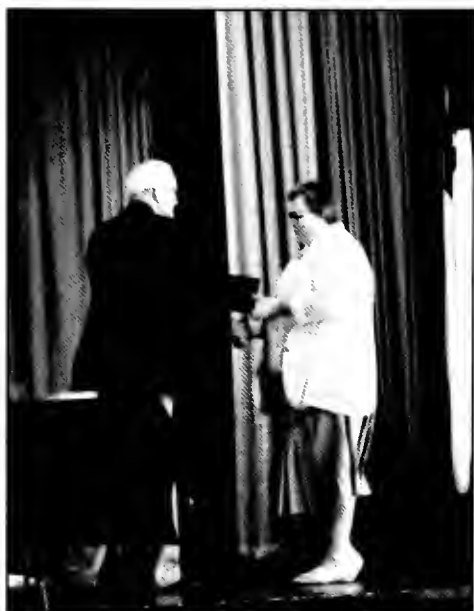
