circumstances; one party goes out and another comes in; one policy ends and a new one begins."

At that time the Democratic Party again entered in power; Democratic policy became the controlling policy of our State. The achievements of those years are unmistakably great. To the trust imposed the Democratic Party has been wholly faithful. The administrations of Governor Charles B. Aycock and Governor R. B. Glenn have added prestige to our history and given prosperity to our people. State affairs have been conducted with clean efficiency, and to the people has come peace.

Out of the very shadows of disorder the record begins. There is now no more disorder and no more doubt. The people have come into their own. Responsible government is made sure. Conditions encourage the full and free development of our industries. To the child is given greater and greater opportunity for knowledge, and North Carolina is become a national leader in popular education. A stable government has inspired confidence. Local improvements are pushed with vigor. Good schools and good roads are no longer a dream, but are growing realities. State institutions have been managed with credit and without scandal. The record is unmarred by official misconduct. Appropriations have increased as our needs demand, while taxes are reduced. Even the convict is now made to add his part to the support of our government.

The Confederate soldier has been remembered with gratitude and increased provision made against want in the days of his old age. The needs of the unfortunate are met and the call of the afflicted is answered. To the blind and to the deaf the State now holds open the door of hope. For her unfortunate insane she provides a refuge of comfort. That the Legislature of 1907 could dedicate one-half million dollars for the adequate care of all our unfortunates shows the growth of our ability and the certainty of our care.

And the Democratic Party pledges itself to maintain those policies which make for the development of every section of our State, for the security of our people and for the stability of our institutions.

DEMOCRATIC OFFICIALS ENDORSED.

We endorse the able and progressive administration of Governor R. B. Glenn and the other State officers, and we approve and commend to the people of North Carolina the record of our Senators and Representatives in the Congress of the United States.

GOOD ROADS.

We regard with approval the increased interest in permanent road building, and, recognizing that the advantage in the way of greatly increased land values, of quick and easy transportation over good roads and the consequent saving of war

and tear on stock and vehicles may no longer be doubted, but is an undoubted result, clearly seen in those sections of North Carolina and other States where such roads are in use, and believing that with a constantly improving school system, a system of good roads linking the East with the Piedmont section and the Piedmont with the Mountain section, will be of great good to North Carolina, we recommend this spirit of internal improvement to the people of our State for their investigation, and suggest that the next General Assembly take such action on this matter as may seem best.

EDUCATION.

We believe that education is one of the fundamental needs of all government. We believe that every prospective citizen has the right to receive and it is the duty of the State to furnish adequate preparation for such citizenship. We congratulate the people on the fact that a four-months school in every district is no longer merely a promise, but a realization. We commend the administration of our educational affairs and pledge to the people the continuation of that policy, which has accomplished so great good.

RAILROAD RATES.

The Democratic Party has kept its promise and materially reduced passenger and freight rates in the State. It has given to the people lower rates, and the reports of the railroad companies show that this reduction of rates has been accompanied by increased revenue on that class of business affected by the laws of the State reducing the rates.

ENTERPRISE AND INDUSTRY FOSTERED.

We declare that the best interests of the State demand that all of our people shall unite in earnest endeavors to secure employment at fair wages for all of our fellow citizens who are now idle or who are working on short time, by no fault of theirs, but by reason of the panic caused by Republican policies.

Every enterprise looking to the investment of capital and employment of skilled labor should be fostered and encouraged by the State.

FOREIGN CORPORATIONS.

All foreign corporations doing business in this State should be required to obtain license to do so, and the license of any such corporation should be revoked if watered stock or bonds be issued by it in violation of State statutes or without the approval of properly constituted legal authorities.

Foreign corporations doing business in this State should be required to submit to the jurisdiction of the courts of the State, under penalty of having their license to do business in the State revoked.

All contributions to political parties or for political purposes should be made public at once, and the charter of any domestic corporation doing business in

this State and the license of any foreign corporation should be revoked if any such corporation contributes to any political campaign fund or to any fund for the purpose of aiding in or procuring the nomination of any candidate for public office.

PUBLIC SERVICE CORPORATIONS.

All public service corporations and natural monopolies should be brought under strict control of the United States as to interstate business, and of the State as to intrastate business, but a fair return on a fair valuation of property owned or operated by them should be allowed after paying operating expenses, including just and ample wages to employees.

PRIVATE MONOPOLIES.

Private monopolies should be destroyed. Conspiracies by prospective purchasers to put down or keep down the prices of articles produced by the labor of others should be made criminal, and all persons or corporations entering into such conspiracies should be punished; and we condemn in every form subsidies, gratuities, bonuses, trusts and monopolies, and they should not be tolerated.

DISCRIMINATION AND REBATES.

Congress should so amend the interstate-commerce law as to prevent discrimination and rebates in interstate traffic and provide for the punishment by imprisonment of officers of railroads and other common carriers and public service corporations violating such laws, and particularly to make unlawful such discriminations as are now or may in the future be practiced by railroad companies and other common carriers and public service corporations against all North Carolina points in favor of points out of the State having no greater natural advantages.

The party in power in the nation that has so long failed to correct such inequalities is equally guilty with the public service corporations for the disadvantages under which this State has labored.

FREE PASSES, FRANKS, ETC.

No railroad company, telegraph company, telephone company, express company or other public service corporation should be permitted to issue or grant to any person except officers and employees any free pass, frank or other free service, privilege, benefit or favor, and any person receiving any such free pass, frank or other service, privilege, benefit or favor should be made equally guilty with the corporation issuing or granting the same.

EQUAL JUSTICE TO ALL LEGITIMATE ENTERPRISES.

We pledge, not only to citizens of this State, but to citizens of other States, that all capital invested in legitimate enterprises in North Carolina, whether foreign or domestic, corporate or private, shall have the equal protection of the laws and the equal friendly consideration of those who administer the laws; and we further pledge that all such persons or corporations violating the provisions of the laws shall be made to feel and suffer the full penalties for such violations.

PROFESSIONAL LOBBYING.

We condemn the practice of professional lobbying.

REPUBLICAN POLICIES CONDEMNED.

We denounce the vacillating and do-nothing policy of the last session of the Republican Congress. We declare that most of the legislation enacted by that body is cheap, tawdry, hypocritical makeshift.

THE CURRENCY BILL.

We denounce the Cannon-Vreeland-Aldrich currency bill which was passed by the last session of Congress in the interest and at the dictation of a handful of great banks and speculators who occupy offices on Wall Street. This iniquitous measure, which further centralizes in the hands of a few the issue of American money for the American people, was shamelessly rushed through both houses of Congress in its dying hours, under the

lash of the czar-like methods of the Speaker and through the trickery of the Republican dictator of the Senate. No more shameless spectacle has ever been presented to the American people than the method by which this hybrid and iniquitous measure was railroaded through Congress. This bill turns over the Treasury of the United States to the gamblers of the New York Stock Exchange for a period of six years. It means a gift to the enemies of the Republic of the power to issue or retire one-half billion dollars, exciting speculation or compelling disaster, according to whichever best suits their betting book.

THE REPUBLICAN PANIC OF 1907.

We condemn the Republican Party, whose policies and conduct produced in 1907 the most acute and disastrous panic in the history of the United States. The effect of its policy has precipitated panic, blighted industry and trade with prolonged depression, closed factories, reduced work and wages, halted enterprise and crippled American production. Under this Republican panic suffering has been universal, soup houses have been established and strikes have been of almost daily occurrence. The Republican Party has been in control of the National Government in all of its branches for the past eleven years, and now, in the midst of abundant crops and boundless national resources, it has brought about the most destructive panic in our history. We point to the fact that every panic which has occurred since the formation of the Republican Party was precipitated while that party was in power.

THE BLOODY SHIRT

We condemn the Republican Party for its efforts in the National Congress to revive the bitterness of the Civil War and renew again the bloody-shirt issue by tacking to the campaign publicity bill Crumpacker's Southern representation reduction measure. The passage of this bill through the lower house of Congress was an act of cheap, hypocritical politics, designed to corral the negro vote in the doubtful States for their presidential nominee.

REPUBLICAN FEAR OF CAMPAIGN PUBLICITY.

We denounce the Republican Party for its failure to enact during the last session of Congress a campaign publicity bill; but the people of the country need not expect such a measure to come from a party that thrives on corruption money and which could not carry on a campaign or win a national election without corruption funds from favored interests.

THE TRUST-BREEDING TARIFF.

We denounce the present infamous and trust-breeding tariff imposed upon the people by the Republican Party, and renew our demand for its immediate revision, to the end that all unfair burdens shall be removed, especially those upon the necessities of life and those that enable the trusts to extort from the people unreasonable profits and to sell their products to consumers at home at higher prices

than are charged for the same goods to foreign consumers.

REPUBLICAN EXTRAVAGANCE.

We denounce the Republican Party for its wild extravagance during the last session of Congress. In the last five months the Republican Congress spent \$1,200,000 of the people's money, levying a tax of \$13 per annum on every man, woman and child in the United States, equal to a tax of \$65 per annum on every burdened taxpayer. We do not wonder, therefore, at the present deficit of \$60,000,000 in the Treasury and the expected deficit of \$180,000,000 at the end of the next fiscal year. The Republican billion-dollar Congress of 1890 produced a Democratic victory in 1892; the Republican billion-dollar session of the present Congress means the triumphant election of a Democratic President in the coming election.

We condemn the Republican administration for turning over millions of dollars of the public money to its pet banks in New York City, thereby depleting the public treasury to such an extent that it became necessary for the Republican administration to issue bonds and borrow money to meet the daily obligations of the Federal Government.

STATES' RIGHTS.

We condemn the Republican Party for its failure in the last Congress to enact a law forbidding one inferior judge to suspend the operation of a State law without notice or hearing.

We declare our inflexible opposition to the methods of expanding Federal power at the expense of the just powers of the States, and we especially denounce the bold and revolutionary threat that the omission of the States to pass laws upon subjects within their constitutional powers may be treated as a surrender of these powers into the hands of the Federal Government, which may then lawfully proceed as it such powers were possessed by it under the Constitution.

Though promising reforms demanded by the people, the Republicans, in their National Convention, at the behest of favored interests, voted down every plank looking to reforms and relief of the people or for curbing the power of the trusts. That convention, controlled by Federal officeholders, after nominating for President a life-long officeholder who was never elected by the people to any office, adopted a platform that on every important measure straddles or gives promise to the ear, only to break it to the hope, and completed its work by nominating, to the tune of "Marching Through Georgia," a candidate for Vice-President who has led in throttling every reform measure offered in the last session of Congress, including a bill to meet the pressing need of the preservation of our National resources, opening waterways and preventing the destruction of our forests.

We have faith in the patriotism of our people and in the ultimate development of

the natural resources of the State, and we call upon all North Carolinians to unite in a common effort to restore prosperity, to re-establish confidence, to forget factional differences and to cultivate peace and good will among men.

Republican State Platform---1908.

Adopted at Charlotte, August 29, 1908.

We, Republicans of North Carolina, in convention assembled, commend the wisdom of the National Republican Convention, and congratulate the people of the United States on the nomination of William H. Taft for the Presidency of this great republic; and we endorse the principles and policies of the Republican Party as enunciated in its platform at Chicago June 16, 1908, and as carried out by the administration of Theodore Roosevelt.

We appeal to the people of North Carolina to set the welfare of our State above party and above prejudice; to exercise their freedom to vote according to the dictates of conscience, and to choose those men for public office whom they deem best fitted to serve the public interest. We ask the people to consider whether they will best promote the welfare of the State by committing its affairs to the radical faction now in control of the Democratic Party or by voting for the candidates and policies we offer.

We ask all thoughtful North Carolinians to consider particularly whether the present Democratic Governor and Legislature have dealt wisely or justly with all classes of our citizens in the laws they have recently passed concerning railroads and the violent measures they have taken to give these laws effect. We believe in regulating railroads and other public carriers strictly and carefully and in compelling all corporations to obey the law as faithfully as the humblest private citizen. But we do not believe that Legislatures are competent to fix absolutely the precise rates at which passengers and freight shall be carried. We are sure that the Legislature of this State, which attempted to fix passenger rates absolutely and neglected freight rates—much the more substantial grievance of our people—had neither the special knowledge nor the right for such an undertaking.

They disregarded the Constitution of the United States, and they threw thousands of North Carolinians out of employment.

We denounce in unmeasured terms the unwarranted and uncalled for attack of the Democrats on capital, culminating in the fight on our railroads, involving the State as it did in costly litigation; paralyzed business, drove millions of capital from the State, and sent railroad securities down to less than half their value.

We pledge ourselves, if the people entrust us with power, to set ourselves against two kinds of injustice: The injustice which permits wealthy corporations and individuals to prey upon the poor, and the injustice which sacrifices property and deranges business in order that cheap demagogues may get or keep office.

We favor the policy of the State furnishing, free of charge and under proper regulations, to every child in the public schools all necessary text-books; the further improvement and extension, at whatever cost, of the public school system, embodied in the Constitution of North Carolina by the Republican Party. We favor the education of all our children up to the very limit of our available means.

We favor also a liberal policy with our higher institutions of learning. The South needs highly trained men, and we would have the necessary training provided here so far as we have the means, and put within the reach of our young men of talent and industry, to the end that North Carolinians may guide our people in the development of our resources, in government, in business, in the beautifying of our towns, our cities and our homes, and in the elevation of our daily life.

This is true also of our institutions of charity, particularly the provision made for the blind, the deaf and the insane, for the efficiency with which any community ministers to such unfortunate human beings is a measure of its civilization. It is equally true of our Confederate veterans who have not the means of self-support; the State

loves and honors them, and they must not be permitted to suffer want. We denounce the Democratic Party for not keeping its repeated pledges to provide our Confederate soldiers and their widows with suitable pensions commensurate with their services to the State, and we pledge ourselves to double the pension now given by the State to these classes.

We demand a fair election law which will permit an elector to cast a ballot privately, without interference or dictation.

We favor, as we have ever favored, local self-government; and demand the right to elect by direct vote of the people all members of the county boards of education, county superintendents of public instruction, county commissioners and tax collectors and justices of the peace.

We favor an extension and improvement of the public roads of the State, and believe that the employment of the State's convicts on such work is the best use that can be made of criminals convicted of crimes. We further favor a law prohibiting the use of striped uniforms upon all persons convicted of misdemeanors in the courts of North Carolina.

We favor the establishment of one or more reformatories for the correction of youthful criminals convicted of minor offenses, and we favor a separate reformatory for females convicted of similar offenses.

We pledge ourselves to a liberal appropriation for the care and support of our charitable institutions.

We favor the exemption from taxation of two hundred dollars' worth of personal

property owned by each householder in the State of North Carolina.

We believe in the dignity of labor and the elevation of the wage-earner, and pledge our party to the enactment of such laws as will best promote this end. We believe that labor and capital are co-ordinate branches of our industrial life, each necessary to the other, that neither can prosper without the other, and looking to this end we pledge our party to the enactment of such laws as will, so far as possible, create the kindest feeling between labor and capital, remove all causes for conflict between the two, and promote the upbuilding of both classes.

We favor restricting immigration rigidly, admitting none but the better class to our shores, and protecting American labor against foreign cheap labor.

We believe the South should no longer hold itself politically separate and apart from the rest of the country. We believe the time has come when no interest or principle any longer demands such isolation. We ask the people of North Carolina to give us their suffrages, not merely because the Democratic Party, under its present leadership, both in the State and in the Nation, is unfit for power; not merely because the candidates we here nominate and the policies we recommend are worthy of acceptance, but because every Republican vote cast in the South is a vote for freedom, a vote for the right of our children to enter fully into the life of the great republic which our fathers labored and fought and suffered to establish.

North Carolina Climate.

The climate of North Carolina varies from the mild and equable climate of the seacoast to that of the mountain district where the changes are more pronounced.

On account of the great diversity of the topography the temperature and precipitation data are best exhibited for the different natural divisions of the State; the Eastern Division or the coastal plain, the Central or the Piedmont Plateau, and the Western or the mountain districts.

The following table shows the mean temperatures for the months, seasons, and year, for the different districts and for the State:

The mean temperature for the State during the past thirty-two years varied from 57 degrees in 1872 to 61 degrees in 1890, the warmest year on record. The highest

temperature on record is 107 degrees which occurred at Kitty Hawk, Weldon and Chapel Hill; the lowest was 19 degrees below zero at Highlands.

The precipitation is very evenly distributed, but is somewhat heavier in the Western and Eastern districts than in the Central district. In the Western district there is an area on the south and southeastern slope of the Blue Ridge Mountains where the rainfall averages between 70 and 80 inches a year; and in individual years, the rainfall measured as high as 100 inches.

Snowfall is not very important even in the mountain districts, the average for the State being about 8 inches.

Game Birds.

Under the laws of North Carolina the following only are considered game birds:

Loons, and grebes, swans, geese, brant; river, fish and sea ducks, rails, coots, marsh-hens and gallinules, plovers, shore and surf birds, snipe woodcock, sandpipers, yellow legs, ewhink or tohee and curlews, and the wild turkey, grouse, partridge, pheasant, quail, dove, robbin and meadow lark.

The Governor is authorized to appoint game wardens, upon the recommendation of the Audubon Society of North Carolina, whose duty it shall be to see that the bird and game laws are enforced.

North Carolina Interest Law.

The legal rate of interest is six per cent. It is contrary to law to charge a higher rate.

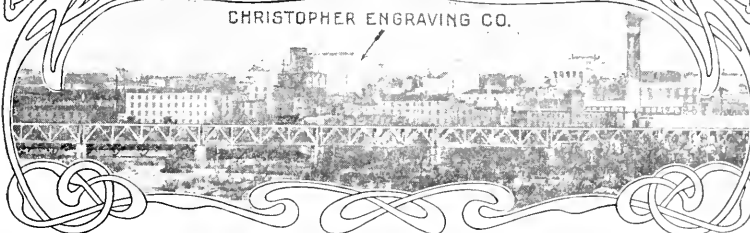

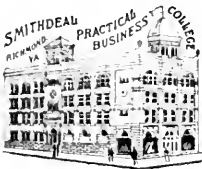

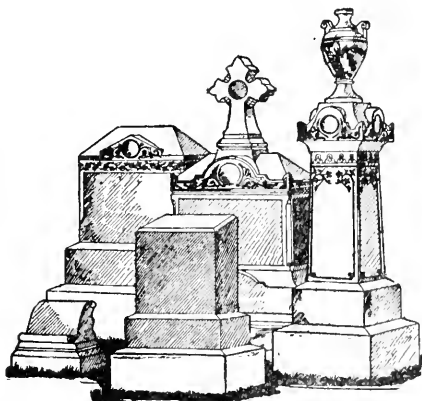
