I will leave on Monday, 5th inst., and persons desiring to join, who do not have an opportunity before that time, can report to my Company at Camp Mangum, near Raleigh. All have had ample time to study the Conscript Law, and must know that all between 18 and 35 years of age will have no opportunity to volunteer after the 17th inst. Come in and save the bounty, as no bounty will be paid after the 17th. Those having unsettled business will be allowed time to wind up.

Capt. Gregory, an able officer, is now in this County legally authorized to raise an Artillery Company, and those preferring this beautiful arm of the service, will never have a better opportu

nity.

The following order from Gov. Clark is published for your instruction:

All those not in by that time will be subject to the War Department under that law, and had better remain at home till ordered by that Department."
