## INTRODUCTION.

THE volume now presented to the public after the lapse of nearly three hundred years appears to have been the genealogical common-place book of Tristram Risdon, the author of the well-known 'Chorographical Description or Survey of the County of Devon.'

Though the compilation of the manuscript must have occupied many years, we are only able to fix the period approximately. On page 180 the death is recorded of Charles Blunt, Earl of Devon, within two years of the time of writing, while on page 279 Sir Popham Southcot is mentioned as having been knighted in 1628. It is clear, therefore, that the book was for the most part written between 1608 and 1628 , and it may be assumed that it was synchronous with the 'Chorographical Description,' which Prince, in his ' Worthies of Devon,' tells us occupied our author from the year 1605 to the year 1630 . It is identified as Risdon's by the fact that on the first page are written, in the same hand as the body of the work, the words ' Liber Tristram Risdon,' and that the list of Sheriffs of Devonshire is, so far as it goes, identical with that printed in the Survey, including the introductory note thereto. There are numerous other points of resemblance which leave no doubt as to the authorship of the manuscript, which may be regarded as a genealogical and heraldic supplement to the Survey.

The volume contains 188 leaves, many of which, including the last, are blank. It is of foolscap size, and somewhat roughly bound in polished vellum. On the back is written the single word ' Risdon,' while on the front cover are the letters $\ddagger \mathfrak{b}$. It is

No. 3531 of the manuscripts in the Exeter Cathedral Library, in which it is preserved, and contains the old Book Plate of that Library-a Bishop enthroned, holding in the dexter hand a representation of the West Front of the Cathedral Church of Exeter, and in the sinister a key, the inscription being 'The Cathedral Library at Exeter, Anno Dom ${ }^{\text {ni }}$ 1749.' Over this plate is written in a hand, probably of the middle of the last century, the words ' Liber Ecclesiæ Cath. Exon.' The first leaf, save for the name of Risdon already referred to, is blank, and the succeeding five pages were ruled and intended for an index to the Brevia Collecta begun on page 37 of the manuscript, which was the original jage 1 of the author, and no doubt the thirty-four preceding pages were all intended to contain the index to this Section. The present pagination was made in red ink by that indefatigable antiquary and accomplished genealogist Mr. Winslow Jones, to whom our thanks are due for some assistance during the progress of our work.*

The General Armory covers from page 8 to page 4I, but pages $37,39,40$, and 4 I are for the most part filled with the ' Brevia' already referred to. The arms are tricked, but unfortunately in some cases, and occasionally in those of special interest, the tinctures are omitted. Nevertheless it contains an enormous mass of useful heraldic information, and the arms of many families are here given which it would be difficult, if not impossible, to find elsewhere. As regards our interpretation of the tricking, we have for the most part followed the latest edition (1894) of Parker's 'Glossary,' but as regards certain charges, we have adopted the practical suggestions of Planché. Notably, we have throughout blazoned all circular figures except bezants as roundels, a course which is justified not alone by the practice of the early heralds, but by the fact that in some instances no tinctures are given, and the use of this term was therefore the only method of securing uniformity. In like manner, instead of speaking of drops of fluid as gouttes de sang, gouttes de poix and so forth, we have invariably blazoned them of their tincture. Again, we have found it a little difficult to discriminate between cinquefoils and roses, as well as to identify some other plant-

[^0]forms, and it has occasionally been impossible to identify the birds and to describe accurately some other charges.*

To the account of the Feudal Baronies of Devonshire more time has been devoted than to any other part of the work, and though Risdon's statements have been found singularly accurate in the main, it has been possible to make a few important corrections and many additions to his text. In particular attention is called to the change in the early part of the Courtenay pedigree brought to light by researches into the records of King John's time, and which corrects all the Courtenay pedigrees to be found in the usual works of reference. It may further be said that no account exists save this, so far as has been ascertained, of the baronies whose history is here traced.

The list of the Sheriffs of Devon corresponds with the printed list in the 'Chorographical Description,' but differs in many important respects from that published in the Thirty-first Annual Report of the Deputy Master of the Rolls (page 278). We have made some corrections from this list, and some from original records, but even now we fear that no strictly accurate list of these officers exists.

The list of Justices Itinerant is very incomplete, but it is useful as far as it goes, and in many cases mentions the Court over which, when in the Capital, each Justice presided.

The list of the Mayors of Exeter varies considerably from the published lists, for which without doubt all later authors are indebted to the labours of John Hooker, alias Vowel. Many of the variations are, however, to be accounted for by the fact that whereas Hooker and his successors give the Christian year in which each Mayor was elected, Risdon adopts the regnal year of each succeeding King, and probably was unacquainted with the actual date of election.

With regard to the lists of Knights and others in the various Western counties, it is unnecessary to say more than that the arms, where given, are tricked, as in the Armory already described; and that, owing to the plan adopted by Risdon, the names of many persons occur under more than one King's reign. It should, perhaps, be mentioned with regard to the

[^1]lists for Wiltshire and Hampshire that in the MS. the county headings are omitted, but there can be no room for error in classifying the Knights enumerated under those counties.

The collection of 'Brevia' contains an enormous mass of most important genealogical matter, taken from original deeds which doubtless at one time or another passed through Risdon's hands. With this part of the work it has been thought best not to do more than make obbvious corrections, but the entries have been so far compared with the Fine Rolls and other Records as to prove conclusively their great accuracy and value.

In conclusion, we have to express our indebtedness to Miss Annie Glanville, of Exeter, for much highly-valued aid in the preparation of the indexes.

Odulphus filius Odogari Comitis Devonie locum hujus Abbathie posuit prope flumenem de Tavy a quo nomenem suum accepit et donavit cum tota terra adjacente, et cum pluribus aliis maneriis et terris ita ut valuacio ejusdem estimabatur ad mille libras annui valoris cum supprimebatur.

[^23]From this list it appears that the Bishop of Exeter held 234 knights' fees, which, though entered under Devon in 'Testa de Nevill,' were probably all situate in the county of Cornwall.

## Baronia Honoris de Totenais.

Magister Camden in libro suo Britannie post Judealem de Totenais* scribit esse Willelmi Briwer baroniam hanc per cujus filiam alteram ad Breosos, et ab illis ibidem ad Georgium de Cantilupo, Dominum Abergavenny, cujus soror Melisenta Eudoni la Zouch elocata suis nupciis ad Barones Zoucheos transtulit hunc honorem.
leigh Tracy, to the Champernownes, Martins and Columbers. It would appear that the latter manor passed from the hands of Columbers about the middle of the fourteenth century, as in 1359 it was granted by King Edward III. to Nigel de Loringe in tail male (Cal. Rot. Pat., 33 Ed. III., pt. 2, memb. 7). At this period Thomas de Keynes was holding the manor of Winkleigh Keynes (Inq. P.M., 35 Ed. III. Pt. I, No. 107).

* Juhell de Totnes appears in Domesday as holding the borough of Totnes (Exon Domesday, fol. 334). He was forfeited by William II, and Totnes was given by Henry I. to Roger de Nonant, sen. (Rot. Hundred, Com. Devon, 3 Edw. I., No. 39, p. 83), by whose descendants it was held unquestioned until the accession of King John, when Henry de Nonant held the honour. In 1200, however, William de Braose, who appears to have been great-grandson of Juhell de Totnes, made claim to the borough (Rot. de Obl. 1 Joh., memb. 9), but subsequently transferred his rights to his third son, Reginald de Braose. ('Testa de Neville,' vol. i., fol. 840, p. 195a.) He prosecuted his claim against Henry de Nonant, and ultimately a partition of the property was made, one moiety remaining with Nonant, and the other being allotted to Braose. (Rot. Litt. Claus., 8 Joh., memb. 2.) In 1206, after the death of Henry de Nonant (whose widow Isabella married, secondly, Robert de Vere, Earl of Oxford-'Testa de Nevill', vol. i., fol. 840 -and, thirdly, . . . de Bolebec-Rot. Origin., 29 Hen. III., Rot. 6) and Roger de Valletort, this moitty passed by grant of the King to Peter de Rupibus, Bishop of Winchester (Rot. Litt. Claus., 8 Joh, memb. 5), who received at the same time the wardship of the heirs of Roger de Valletort ('Testa de Nevill,' vol. i., fol. 840), on whose behalf he undertook to pay the fine agreed upon between Roger de Vallctort and the King, in respect to the Nonant moiety of Totnes; and ten years later, in 1217 , Reginald de Valletort paid a fine of ten marks (Rot. de Fin., 17 Joh., memb. i, in dorso), and in the same year obtained a writ directing the Sheriff of Devon to deliver to him all the fees of Totnes within his jurisdiction. (Rot. Litt. Claus., 1 Hen. III., memb. 18 de rev.) In 1227 he paid 100 l. in settlement of the fine of 600 marks which his father, Roger de Valletort, had fixed with King John for that portion of the lands of Henry de Nonant which by agreement with William de Braos remained to Nonant, and had by him been given to Roger de Valletort and his heirs. (Rot. Fin., II Hen. III., memb. 10.) In 1244 Reginald de Valletort paic a fine of 600 marks on obtaining seisin of the manors of Clifton Clanton and Brixham, which had been the dower of Isabella, the wife of Henry de Nonant (Rot. Origin., 29 Hen. III., Rot. 6). and from the 'Testa de Nevill' (vol. i. fol. 816, p. 108) we find that this Reginald de Valletort, whose wife was Johanna Basset, one of the daughters and heirs of Thomas Basset (Rot. Litt. Claus., 4 Hen. III., memb. i, in dorso), held one moiety of the honour of Totnes. His Inquisition post mortem (Inq. p. in., 30 Hen. III., No. II) shows him to have been dead in 1245, when his next brother, Radulph de Valletort, succeeded to the lands of Brixham, Harberton and others, which he held int capice, Johanna, the widow, having one part of the manor of Brixham in

dower. (Inq. p. m., 30 Hen. III.. No. Io; 27 Edw. I., Nos. 30 and 32.) Radulph married Johanna . . ., and was dead before i269, leaving an only son and heir, Reginald de Valletort, who, though under age, married Hawisia, to whom two parts of the manor of Brixham were given in dower (Ibid.) Reginald died about 1269 , without issue (Inq. $\mu$. m., 54 Hen. III., No. 9), when his moiety of the borough of Totnes passed to his uncle, Roger de Valletort, who did homage for his lands shortly after. (Rot. Fin., 54 Hen. Ill., memb. 13) By him, who became insane, the estates of the family were dissipated, much of his property being given to Richard, Earl of Cornwall. and to Alexander de Okeston, who had married the widow of his brothe $i$ Radulph, and at his death he held only the manor, and with it the Barony of Harberto ?, which escheated to the Crown (Rot. Hundr. Extr., Com. Cornub.. 4 Edw. I., memb. 31, in dorso ; and Rot. Hundr., Com. Devon., 3 Edw. I., No. 20). He died 1275 , and in 1282 his two nearest heirs were Henry de la Pomeray and Peter Corbet, but they did not prosecute the'r claim. Some years later, however, on the death of Edmund, Earl of Cornwall, Peter Corbet and Henry de la Pomeray presented a petition for the recovery of the manor and castle of Trematon, and other lands in Devon and Cornwall which had belonged to Valletort (Abb. Placit., 33 Edw. I., East. Term, Rot. 5). The suit continued until the year 1315, when Corbet and Henry, son of the above de la Pomeray, were nonsuited in their plea for the restitution of the manor and castle of Trematon (Abb. Placit., 9 Edw. I., East. Term, Rot. 123), shortly after which the whole of the honour of Totnes passed into the hands of the Canteloups, probably by purchase.

Reginald de Braose, who, as already explained, obtained one moiety of the Barony of Totnes by agreement with Nonant, was forfeited by King John in 1208, and in the following year the castle and town of Totnes and the manors of Cornworthy and Loddiswell were granted to Henry 'filius Comes,' afterwards Earl of Cornwall (Rot. Litt. Pat., io Joh., memb. I ; and 'Testa de Nevill.' vol. i., fol. 840). In the year 1215 , however, Giles, Bishop of Hereford, elder brother of Reginald de Braose, obtained from King John a grant of all the lands, tenements and castles which had been his father's, but he appears to have died between October $2 I$ and November 18 of that year, without taking posiession of the property (Rot. Litt. Pat., 17 Joh., membs. 13, 14). The King thereupon directed the Earl of Cornwall to deliver the Castle of Totnes to Reginald de Valletort, the writ being dated at Rochester, November 21, 1215 (Rot. Litt. Pat., 17 Joh., memb. 12), but the effect of this grant does not appear. In the year 1217 Reginald de Braose, aleady referred t n, returned to his allegiance, and shortly afterwards had livery of all his father's lands (Rot. Litt. Claus., 1 Hen. III., memb. 15, de revers). In December of the same year he sued Henry, Earl of Cornwall, for Totnes and the honour of Totnes, and November 12, 1218, the King's writ was issued to the Sheriff of Devon, directing him to deliver seisin of those kaights' services of the honour of Totnes which were then in the King's hands (Rot. Litt. Claus., 3 Hen. III., memb. 13). This Reginald de Braose was dead before 1321, leaving by Græcia, his wife, daughter and co-heiress of William de Brewere, a son and

## Baronia de Barnstaple.

Magister Camden in suo Britannie libro memorat Judaelem de Totenais dono accepisse Barnstable jure clientelari a Gulielmo primo rege inde quod Tracii satis longe tempore tenuerunt, post Martini, deinde Ricardo II. regnante ad Johannem Holland Huntingdonie comitem devenisse postea ad Ducem Exonie, et postremo in regium patrimonium. Et quod Maria Regina Manerium hoc Thome Marrow donavit cujus filius divendidit.

Willelmus de Brause tempore regis Henrici II. tenuit de honore de Barnstable feoda 28 militum, quorum Philippus Charteray tenuit de dicto Willelmo 14, Ranulfus de Poher 3, Willelmus filius Johannis tenuit feoda 3 militum, Walterus filius Radulphi 3, Erkenbaldus Flandrensis i feodum.

Willelmus Breos dedit is feoda militum cum Loretta filia sua in maritagium Comiti Lecestrie.

Postea Willelmus Tracy, hunc honorem possidebat, post-

* Oliver de Tracy was in possession of a moiety of the Lordship of Barnstaple in 1164, the other moiety being held by William de Braose, whose title was derived from his descent from Judael de Totnes (Rot. Pip., II Hen. II., Rot. 9, memb. i). His son, Oliver de Tracy, appears to have gained possession of the whole Barony, as in 1194 he was sued by William de Braose for his part of the Honour (Abb. Placit, 6, Ric. I., Devon, Michaelmas Term, Rot. 6), and an agreement was arrived at in 1199 (Ibid., I John, Easter and Trinity term, Rot. 5), which, however, does not appear to have been very strictly observed. Oliver de Tracey married Eva, and was dead in or before 1210 , his son, Henry de Tracy, succeeding him. After the forfeiture of William de Braose, he obtained a grant of Barnstaple and Tavistock, together with the whole honour of Barnstaple in demesne, with all their fees and appurtenances, as they were held by Oliver de Tracy and William de Braose. (Rot. Litt. Claus., 15 John, pt. I, memb. 4.) Two years later, however, in 1215 , he is ordered to deliver the Castle of Barnstaple to Giles de Braose, Bishop of Hereford (Rot. Litt. Pat., 17 John, mernb. 14), and in 1216, being in arms against the King, his lands were granted to William de Briwer, jun. (Rot. Litt. Claus., i 8 John, memb. 4.) In the following year, however, he was Sheriff of Devon, and in 1218 his lands had been restored to him ; but Reginald de Braose made claim to the moiety which had belonged to his father (Rot. Litt. Claus., 2 Hen. III., memb. I4, in dorso), which was resisted on the plea that Tracy held by the King's grant (Rot. Litt. Claus., 2 Hen. III., memb. 14, in dorso). He was probably father of another Henry de Tracy, who was dead before 1273 (Inq. p. m., 2 Edw. I., No. 32). He had 'one daughter, named Eva' (ibid.), who married Guy de Bryane, and died during the lifetime of her father, when her husband seems to have married Sybilla, apparently a daughter of Walter de Sully, by whom he had a son and heir, Guy de Bryane (Inq. p. m., 25 Edw. I., No. 32). By Eva de Tracy he had a daughter, Matilda de Bryane, who in 1272, being then aged thirty-one years, was the wife of Galfrid de Camville, and the 'nearest heir' of Henry de Tracy, her grandfather (Inq. p. m., 2 Edw. I., No. 32). Of her marriage with Lord Martin we have found no mention, though it undoubtedly took place, as William Martin succeeded to the Barony of Barnstaple as heir of Henry de Tracy (Abb. Placit., 7-8 Edw. I., Mich's term, Maj. Kecord, Rot. 7).

* Matilda, the wife of Nicholas Filius Martin, was the daughter and heir of Guy de Bryane by Eva, daughter and heir of Henry de Tracy, Lord of Barnstaple, as has been stated in the notes on the Barony of Barnstaple (ante, p. 63).
$\dagger$ As this account of the marriage of William, Lord Martin, differs from all recognised authorities, it is necessary to state that it is correct in every particular.
$\ddagger$ A contract was entered into in 1296 for the marriage of Edward, eldest son and heir of William, Lord Martin, with Jonetta, eldest daughter of John de Hastings, it being at the same time arranged that William, son and heir of John de Hastings, should marry Edward's eldest sister, Alienora. Edward, however, died before his father, and it would appear that neither of the marriages thus arranged took place (Cal. Rot. Pat., 25 Edw. I., pat. 2, memb. 2). Nor is it probable that William, the eventual heir, was married to Jonetta de Hastings, as his widow, Margaret, was in 1325 the wife of Robert de Wateville; it is, however, possible that this may have been his second wife (Rot. Orig.. 19 Edw. II., Rot. 23).

This William, Lord Martin, was the last male of this branch of the family, and on his death in 1325 his property reverted to his co-heirs. His sister Alienora and her husband, Philip de Columbers, had assigned to them, besides the wardship of James Audley, their nephew, the manors of Combe Martin, Barnstaple, Holdsworthy, and South Molton, together with certain lands in the city of Exeter, and the rents of East and West Anstey. Nicholas de Audley and Johanna, his wife, died before Lord Martin, and their son, James Audley, above mentioned, had assign : d to him the hamlets of Kilmington, North Lew, Takebeare, and Staunton, the manors of Warkleigh, Nymet Tracy, Bovey Tracy, Raddon, Lidford (co. Somerset), Blackdown, the castle and town of Newport, and other property; while to Margaret, his widow, then married to Robert de Wateville was assigned the manor of Dartington, and other estates in Devon and Somerset (Rot. Orig., 19 Ed. II., Rot. 23).
§ John de Torinton had a dispute with the Abbess and Nuns of St. Edward's relative to the advowson of the Church of Torrington in II94 (Plac.

Abbrev., 6 Ric. I., m. 15 days after M'mas, Rot. 8). In the year 1201 he paid 50 marks for license to travel beyond seas, when he held nineteen knights' fees in capite and six knights' fees of the hoour of Gloucester (Rot. de Obl., 3 John, memb. 8). He died in or before 1207 (Rot. Litt. Claus., 9 John, memb. 12), and was succeeded by his son, William de Torinton, who is mentioned in letters respecting scutage in 1214 (Rot. Litt. Claus., 16 John, pt. 2, memb. 24, in dorso). He died in 1224, leaving a widow, Avicia, who had a grant of the manor of Torrington pending the settlement of her dower (Rot. Litt. Claus., 8 Hen. III., pt. i, memb. io), and who subsequently married Nicholas de Boleville, who in 1230 held her dower (Rot. Fin., 15 Hen. III., memb. 7). Leaving no issue, he was succeeded by his uncle, Matthew de Torinton, who in 1224 paid 100l. for the relief of his lands (Rot. Fin., 8 Hen. III., memb. 9), but died without issue in 1226, when the barony was broken up and alienated in such a manner that due service could not be rendered to the King (Rot. Litt. Claus., in Hen. III., memb. 16). It was partitioned amongst the five sisters and co-heirs of Matthew de Torinton, or their surviving heirs. The eldest sister, Emma, married . . . Merton, and was mother of Henry de Merton, who did homage for his part of Torrington in 1227 (Rot. Fin., 12 Hen. III., memb. 9). Another sister, Dionisia, married Henry Fitz William, who did homage for his wife's part of Torrington in 1228 (Rot. Fin., 12 Hen. III., memb. 7) ; but they appear to have died without issue, and two years before her death in 1239 she granted to her nephew, Henry de Merton, her fifth part of the Barony of Torrington (Rot. Fin., 23 Hen. III., memb. 4), after which two-fifths of the barony were held by Henry de Merton, who died in 1246. Another sister of Matthew de Torinton married . . . Tremenet. and was mother of Richard de Tremenet, who did homage for his part of Torrington in 1227 at the same time as his cousin, Henry de Merton, but he subsequently sold his share to Henry de Tracy, from whom it passed to Geoffrey de Camville in right of his wife, Matilda de Bryane, granddaughter of Henry de Tracy (Rot. Hundred., 3 Ed. I., Devon, No. 17). A fourth sister of Matthew de Torinton, named Sibilla, appears to have been the wife of Richard de Umfraville, and mother of Gilbert de Umfraville, who was one of the heirs of Torrington. The fifth daughter appears to have been Mabilia, wife of Walter de Sully. She was mother of Raymund de Sully, who was another of the heirs of Torrington, and in 1232 paid 49l. 9s. 3d. for the issue of his lands (Rot. Pip., 17 Hen. III., Rot. 6). The heirs of the barony were thus Henry de Merton, Raymond de Sully, Gilbert de Umfraville, Richard de Tremenet, and Dionisia de Torinton, wife of Henry FitzWilliam ; but, as has been said, the inheritance of Dionisia passed to Merton and that of Richard de Tremenet was alienated. Some halfcentury later two-fifths of the barony were owned by Thomas de Merton, a ward in the care of John Wiger in 1274, his father, Walter de Merton, son of Henry de Merton, having died in 1272. At the same period, Raymond de Sully, who had died in 1241, was represented by Walter de Sully, his son and heir, who held a fifth part of Torrington, and Gilbert de Umfraville was represented by John de Umfraville, who had succeeded upon the death of his brother Henry in 127I. As has already been stated, the other fifth part had been alienated by Tremenet, and it passed from Tracy to Martin, as explained on p. 63 (Rot. Hundred., 3 Ed. I., Devon, No. 17). As regards the fifth part held by Sully, it was given in free marriage to Sibilla, his daughter, and Guy de Bryane, her husband; from them it went to Guy de Bryane, who was twenty-five years of age in 1306 (Inq. p. in., 35 Edw. I., No. 32), when his parents were both dead.

* Henry de la Pomeray III., who succeeded Henry de la Pomeray II., held lands in Cornwall, Devon, Essex, Hertford, Cambridge, Norfolk, and Suffolk, at his death, in 1207, when the Sheriff; of most of these counties were directed to deliver them into the hands of William de Briwere (Rot. Fin., 9 John, memb. 8).
$\dagger$ Another Henry de la Pomeray IV.must here be inserted in the pedigree. He fines in the sum of 600 marks for his father's lands in Devon and Cornwall in 1208 (Rot. Fin., 9 John, membs. 2 and 8). He and John de Erlegh had custody of the Castle of Exeter and of the County of Devon in 1215-16 (Rot. Litt. Pat., 16 John, pt. i., membs. 2 and 3). He was dead in 122 I. He appears to have married the eventual heiress of Valletort.
$\ddagger$ Henry de la Pomeray V. was in the ward of Ralph de Trubeville in 122 (Rot. Litt. Claus., 6 Hen. III., pt. I, membs. 21, 12). He did homage for his lands in 1232 (Rot. Fin., 16 Hen. III., memb. 3), and was one of the heirs of Roger de Valletort in 1238. He was dead in 1240. His wife's name was Marjery (Rot. Fin., 29 Hen. IlI., memb. 2).
§ Henry de la Pomeray VI. was in the ward of William Caperon in 1240 (Abb. Placit., 25 Hen. Ill., Coram R-ge, Rot. 22, p. IIo). His wife is called Isoldd, or Isota, in inquisitions in 1292 ('Testa de Nevill,' vol. i., fols. 8og-811). She was dead in i3Io (Rot. Orig., 4 Edw. II., Rot. II) when she was a widow. It seems probable that the alleged marriage with Hawisia de Valletort is an error. He died in 1280 (Inq. p. m., り Edw. I., No. 82).
|| Here also another Henry de Pomeray VII. must be inserted in the pedigree. He was born and baptized at Tregony in 1264 (Inq. p. m., I 5 Edw. I., No. 72, prob. at.), was in the ward of Galfrid de Camville in 1281 (Rot. Orig., io Edw. I., Rot. 3, p. 40). He was married, during his father's lifetime (Inq. p. m., 9 Edw. Claus., 1 Hen. III., memb. 15 , de reversis), and a daughter, Gumora, wife successively of Robert de Curcun, Rubert de Gant, and Nicholas de Stuteville, by the second of whom at least she had issue (Abb. Placit., II John, Easter, Rot. 14 ; Rot. de Obl., I John, inemb. 3).

* Fulk Painell is described as the son of Juliana (Abb. Placit., 9 John, Rot. 12, in dorso), and Rob_rt de Bumpton is mentioned as the great-grandfather (avus) of Fulk's son William (Abb. Placit., 15 John, M'mas., Rot. 14, in dorso), thus substantiating the pedigree in the text. In 1164 his father, William Painell had rendered an account to the Treasury of $15 \% .3 \mathrm{~s} .4 \mathrm{~d}$., of which he paid $10 / .3 s .4 \%$., and Fulk Painell was excused the payment of the remaining 5l. (Rot. Pip., I I Hen. II., Rot. 6, memb. 2, vol. viii., p. 50), Fulk had seisin of the honour of Bampton in 1199 (Rot. de Obl., i Juhn, membs. 22 and 21, in dorso), and must have been dead in 1217, when the King directed that his lands in Yorkshire and Leicester should be seised to Hasculf Painell, his brother (Rot. Litt. Claus., i Hen. III., memb. i5, de reversis).
$\dagger$ William Painell is mentioned as the son of Fulk in the dispute between him and the Prior of Bath already referred to (Abb. Placit., 15 John, M'mas., Rot. 14, in dorso). He married Alicia de Mohun (Rot. Fin., 12 Hen. III., memb. 7), sister and one of the heirs of William Briwer, jun., who had as his portion the manor of Axminster (Rot. Fin., 17 Hen. III., memb. 5). She was the widow of Reginald de Mohun, Lord of Dunster. William Painell was dead in 1228, when the custody of his lands and heirs was granted to Herbert Fitz Matthew, reserving the dower of Alicia, his widow, out of the manors of Bampton and Uffculme (Rot. Fin., 3 Hen. III., memb. 13). To this William succeeded another William Painell, who in 1245 was permitted to discharge his father's debt of rool. due to the King by annual payments of 20 marks (Rot. Fin., 29 Hen. III., memb. 1). He married Sybilla (Rot. Fin., 33 Hen. III., memb. 1), but died without issue in 1249, when his sister Auda, wife of John de Balun, became his heir (Inq. p. m., 33 Hen. III., Nos. 23 and 32 ; Rot. Fin., 33 Hen. III., memb. 10), who also died without issue (Inq. p. m., 3 Edw. I., No. 19).
$\dagger$ It appears that the Matilda in the text was not the wife of William Painell, of Bampton, but of a William Painell who, with his wife, Matilda, in 1245, paid half a mark for a precept to the Sheriff of Sussex with reference to their affairs in Essex. These may have been the parents of the three daughters enumerated in the text, but they had no interest in Bampton (Rot. Fin., 29 Hen. III., memb. io).
§ Miles de Cogan had from Henry II. a grant of half the Lordship of Desmond, excepting the city of Cork and some other lands (Rot. Orig., 5 Edw. III., Rot. 22), and was still living in 1226 when the citizens of Limerick paid him $22 l$. for his maintenance, unless indeed, as seems probable from the length of time, two Miles de Cogans existed.

honour of Totnes, to Roger de Valletort. This Roger was descended from Reginald de Valletort, his ancestor (tritarus) [great-great-great-great-grandfather] (Abb. Placit., 3 John, Rot. Cornub., Rot. io, dor so), who, as well as Hugo de Valletort and Godfrey de Valletort, held lands in Devon, Cornwall, and Somerset shortly after the Conquest (Exon Domesday, passim). Reginald was by far the most important person, holding extensive estates under the Earl of Moretain, including thirty-six manors, of which Tremerton, Calstock, and Ludbrook were three. It is probable that Reginald was father of Roger de Valletort, who paid scutage in 1162 (Rot. Pip., 8 Hen. Il., Rot. i, memb. 2), and that he in turn was father of Radulph de Valletort, who made a payment to the Sheriff of Devon in 1164.65 (Rot. Pip., 11 Hen. Il., Rot. 9, memb. 1). The Roger in the text should probably be identified with this Roger of 1162, but we have found no confirmation of the marriage with the daughter of the Earl of Cornwall. In this case, Roger, the father of Reginald de Valletort below, would probably be the grandson of Roger of 1162 and son of Radulph de Valletoit in 1164. It is to be observed that no proof has been fourd of the relatiorship of Reginald (1083), Roger if 160 ), and Radulph (II64), and we have also no proof that Radulph was the father of Roger de Valletort, the great-grandson of Reginald of Domesday, who was living 1201-6. He married Alicia, to whom the manor of Callington was given in marriage by King Juhn (Rot. Litt. Claus., 4 Hen. III., memb. r), and which was afterwards inherited by her son, Reginald de Valletort (ibid, 5 Hen. III., memb. 21). He cied in 1206, when his heirs were in the custody of the Bishop of Winchester, as has been already explained. The further history of the family has been traced undir the honour of Totnes.

Of this connection there was an only daughter, Alda, or Albrida, who would have been heir to her grandfather, de Marke, were the marriage of Galfrid and R sa capable of proof (Inq. p. m., 54 Hen. III., No. 23), and it would seem that a marriage did take place between the two, as on the death of Alda, unmarried, in 1275, her granduncle, Andrew de Merke, was found to be her next heir (Inq. p. m., 4 Edw. I., No. 3). This must have been a second marriage.

* Though othergenealogistsmention but one Oliver de Dinham at this point, it appears to be not improbable that the pedigree in the text is correct, though the Inquisition post mortem of the first Oliver has not been found. He (if he it was) married Mary, the daughter of Hugh Courtenay of Hemington, in Somerset, which lands Mary held as dower in 1279 (Placit. de q. w., 8 Edw . I, com. Somerset, Rot. 62). He was twenty-four years of age at the date of his father's Inquisition post mortem in 1258, and did homage for his lands in Devon in the same year (Rot. Fin., 43 Hen. III., memb. io, alias 2).

$\ddagger$ The wife of Oliver de Dinham was Isabella, daughter of Hugh de Vere, 4 th Earl of Oxford, and widow of John de Courtenay, of Okehampton.
§ Josce de Dinham was found to be twenty-four years and upwards in 1298 (Inq. p. m., 27 Edw. I., No. 42), and did homage for the lands which his father had held in capite in the same year (Rot. Orig., 27 Edw. I., Rot 6). He died in 1300 when at his Inquisition post mortem, dower was assigned to his widow Margaret, and his son was found to be five years of age (Inq. p. m., 29 Edw. I., No. 56).
|| John de Dinham was in the ward of the King for many years, and on attaining his majority he did homage, 18 Oct., 1316, for his father's lands (Parl. Writs., io Edw. II., pt. i., p. 535, No. 1). He died in 1332, leaving a widow, Margaret-not Johanna, as in the text (Inq. p. m., 6 Edw. III., No. 59 and No. 7) who died in 1357 (Inq. p. m., 31 Edw. III., No. 43).

TI Sir Oliver de Dinham had a grant of the privilege of 'Infangnetheof' within his manor of Sampford Peverell in 1336. (Rot. Litt. Pat., io Edw. III., pt. 2, memb. 34, a turgo). He married Johanna, who appears to have been a daughter of Guy de Brian, as in 1368 she granted her lands of Sampford and Aller Peverell to Guy de Brian, probably her brother, for the term of her life (Rot. Orig., 42 Edw. III., Rot. 33). Sir Oliver died in 1342, probably without issue (Inq. p. m., I6 Edw. III., No. 17).

## SHORT BIOGRAPHICAL NOTICES OF

## NOBLES AND KNIGHTS OF DEVON,

DISTINGUISHED FOR MILITARY AND OTHER SERVICE,

FROM THE CONQUEST TO THE
REIGN OF HENRY IV.
(Pages 259-294.)

Men of Renoume in military employmentes, and in Councell within this Countye of Devon sitiens the coming of the Conqueror.

WILLIAM THE CONQUEROR setled in this country to enhabit, and to govern Baldwin le Sap, whom he had made hereditary sherif or vicount.
Judahell surnamed de Totenays of his place of dwelling was also placed in Devonshire, and had his castelles both at Totenays and Barnstable.

Martyn de Turon, a noble warrior, the Conqueror gave the honor of Dertinton unto. This man overran the country called Ceamoys in Wales, and left it unto his posterity. From this man ar discended as heires generals th'erl Bathe and the Lord Awdelegh. The famyly of Martyn at Adelhamston lately resting amongst weomen. Martyn of Seburgh and the Martins of Exceter are also discended from this Martin de Turon.

Raph de la Pomeray did the Conqueror leave to govern this and gave unto him divers landes. He made his castell or dwelling neere Totenays at Berry, where his issue and name contynewed unto Edward VI. tyme; the heire male remayneth unto this tyme in that name, although not in the honor.

Walter de Doway the Conqueror gave Baunton unto with divers other landes, his sonne and grandchild were called de Baunton of theire dwelling. The heire generall of this man is th'erl of Bathe by Pannell, Cogan, and Fitzwarren.

Richard de Granavilla was setled at Bideford, where his issue male contyneweth unto these dayes.

Walter de Clavile receyved a great enheritanc in this country where his issu male contynewed unto Richard II. tyme. The heire generall is Beare of Huntsam. Clavill of Dorcetshire that now is discendeth from this Walter Clavill.

Robert de Albimar in the Conqueror's tyme had a goodly enheritanc in this shire, and had his dwellinges at Midelton and Fluite. Their discended from him divers famylies of great woorth and of that name, videlicet of Midleton Damarell, which ended in Edward I. tyme. Of Northywis, whose heire generall Tremayn of Collacomb is. Of Woodbiry, which ended in the latter part of Edward III. raigne, and the heires general were maried unto Sir William Bonvil, and Sir John Matravers of Melbery. The heire general of Bonvill ys the issue of the lady Katerin Gray, and of Matravers Sir John Strangwais.

Roger de Meolis held Lyw and Wadelescot of Baldwin the sherif of [Devon] in the Conqueror's tyme. This name contynewed in honorable place unto the tyme of King Edward III. Then the heires generals were maried unto the Lord William Botreaux and Sir Thomas Courtenay, whose heires are th'erl of Huntington by Hungerford, and th'erl of Bathe, the Lord Zouch, Arondel of Lanhern and the heire generall of Carew, which is Thomas Southcot of Mounsotery. Theire was also a younger house of Mules which contynewed unto Henry VI. tyme. The heire generall ys Arscott by Batten of Dunsland, and by Gilbard and Norbury, the heires of the Lord Bray.

Robert Bastard was also possessed of divers landes in Devonshire, and his dwelling was at Efford in the Conqueror's tyme. This name contynewed in very good account unto the beginning of Edward III. and theire [were] divers knightes of that famylye. The heires generall by Whitlegh are Sir Barnard Grenvil and Hals of Efford and Kenedon. The name contyneweth in this countrey.

William Poilge, or de Pola, possessed divers landes in the Conqueror's tyme in Devon; his issue contynewed barrons unto King John's tyme. William de Pola or de Stagno went into the Holy Land with King Richard I. and is nombred amongst the barrons.

Tedbald Fitz. Bernard held divers lands in the Conqueror's tyme, he had his dwelling neere Exceter at Holecomb Bernard, soe called from him ; his issue in his name contynewed unto the raigne of King Edward I. The heir generall was maried unto

Kaull, unto whom, by Kingston, Mansell of Somersetshire is heire generall.

Hervey de Hilion had Asseriston and divers other landes in Devonshire, and his dwelling was at Asseriston now called Ashton, fowre miles from Exceter. The heires male contynewed unto the Raigne of King Henry III. The heires generall, by Prous of Asheriston, is George Chidley, by Prous of Wideworthy, is Sir Robert Chichester and Sir Thomas Wise's wief, the daughter and heire of Stowford.

And also by Challons heires generals are Vivian, Courtenay of Lanrak in Cornwall, Fulford, the heire of Larder, the heir of Barnhous, Fortescu of Wimston, Moore of Moorehays.

Their was a younger house of that name, which contynewed unto the raigne of Edward III. and dwelled at Upton Hilion. The heire general of whom is Dowrish of Dowrish.

> Men of nobility, and of Renowme in the tyme of King Henry I.

Richard de Ridver receyved by the gift of King Henry I. the mannor of Tiverton; whom the same king for his good service made Erl of Devon, being the first Erl of this county sithens the Conquest.

Rocelin de Beamont was in high favor with King Henry I. Unto him the king gave Constanc, his base daughter, with the mannor of South Tawton: he had fayre possessions in this county, and his dwelling was at Shirwell. From him arr descended Chichester and Basset, as heires generals.

From a younger famyly dwelling at Ainkesdon, Pomeray of Ainkesdon is descended as heir generall.

And from Beamond of Gidesham which was held illegitimat, and no Beamond, but named John, the sonne of Jone Bodrugan, Muttelbiry of Somersetshire is heire generall.

Asculph de Soleigny, or de Solariis, was in good employment with King Henry I. His dwelling was Umberlegh. The heires general of him by Chambernon, Willington and Beamont, are Chichester and Basset.

Johell de la Pomeray was in King [Henry] the I. tyme, and in good account with the said king. He maried the sister of Jeffrey, Erl of Cornwall, which the sayd king begat on Amasa Corbet, the mother of the sayd Erle, and of Herebert. This man's dwelling was at Berry, which honor his father Raph had receyved from the Conqueror. All the name of Pomeray now remayning in this Shire are discended from this man.

Robert, a Norman born, and Bisshop of Exon lived in the days of King Henry I. He was counselor of estate to the said king, and before unto his brother William Rufus.

William Botereaux, or de Bottereles, lived in very great esteeme with King Henry I. This man's abode was in this schire and in Cornwall; he maried Alis Corbet, the sister of Amasa, mother of Reginald, Erl of Cornwall. The issue male of him contynewed unto Henry VI. tyme and were barrons of great honor and livelihode. The heire generall of him is th'erl of Huntingdon by Hungerford. Sir Walter Hungerford, and Sir Edward Hungerford, late of Wilshire, are discended also from this William Botreaux.

Richard Fitz Baldwin, Lord of Okhamton, hereditary sherif of Devon lived in King Henry I. [tyme]. This man was of the greatest revenew of any man within this County. From his sister Emma are discended heires generals Trelawny, Mohun, Arondell of Talvarn, and Vyvian and Courtney of Lanrak, by the fourth sister of Edward Courtenay, Erl of Devon in Henry VII. tyme, also Sir William Courtnay and the rest of the Courtneys.

Robert Fitz Martyn, Lord of Dertinton in Devon, and of Ceamoys in Wales, lived in Henry I. tyme. From him is descended (as before is sett downe from his father) th'erl of Bathe and Lord Awdeley as heires generals, Martyn of Dorcetshire, from whom are the Martins of Excester.

Roger de Nonant lived in King Henry I. tyme; he enjoyed the moyty of the barony and honor of Totenays; his issue male contynewed unto the beginning of Edward III. The heires generall of him by Bechamp of Kyme and Challons are Vivian and Courtney of Lanrak, by Trethirf and Fulford, Fortescu, Larder's daughter, Moore and Fortescu of Wimston and the heires of Barnhous by Dennys of Combralegh.

William Warlewast, a man of great estimacion with King Henry I. and a principall counselor of Estate unto the sayd King, was advaunced for his good service unto the Bisshoprick of Exon in the [8th year] of his raigne.

King Stephan. Men of Nobility and Woorth that lived in this King's tyme withịn Devon.

Baldwin de Rivers, Erl of Devon, lived in King Stephan's tyme. This man held the cyty of Exceter against the sayd King, and being by the said King expulsed from thence, he fortified the Isle of Weight but the King pursued him, and banished him the land.

Richard, the sherif of Devon lived in King Stephan's tyme, and was Lord of Okhamton.

Robert Fitz Martin, Lord of Dertinton, Joell de la Pomeray, Lord of Byry, Roger Nonant, Lord of the moyty of Totenays,

Robert de Baunton, Lord of Baunton, Rocelin de Bellomonte, Asculph de Solariis and William Botereaux lived also in King Stephan's tyme.

Hugh Peverell of Ermington, the first of the Devonshire Peverelle's, lived in King Stephan's tyme.

Samson Folliot of Warlegh lived in this King's tyme ; his issue male contynewed unto the tyme of Henry III. The heire generall of this man ys Copleston of Warlegh, by Bonvill and Gorges.

Galfrid de Furnell, or Furneaux, lived in King Stephan's tyme.

Mauricius de Pola, Lord of Pole, lived in King Stephan's tyme.

William de Reigny lived in King Stephan's tyme: his heires male contynewed unto Edward I. tyme. The heires generall are Horsy and Code of Gidley, by Prous and Damarell.

William de Buzum, Lord of Churchton and Ithelton, lived in King Stephan's tyme: his heires males contynewed in the right lyne unto Edward III. tyme : the heires generall ar Yard and Ashford by Ferrers, and the heires of the Lord Bray by Chiverston and Halwell. The heire male contynewed in a younger house unto Henry VI. tyme, and the heire generall of that house is Fulford.

Guy de Britvile lived also in King Stephan's tyme : his heire male contynewed unto Edward III. tyme.

## Noble and men of Woorth in King Henry II. his tyme.

Baldwin, Erl of Devon which died in the beginning of the Raign of King Henry II.,* unto whom Richard de Ridvers Erl of Devon his eldest sonne succeeded. And after the death of Richard $\dagger$ Baldwin his eldest sonne succeeded. King Henry II. employed this Baldwyn in his British Warres where [he] behaved himself valiauntly and in recompenc the said king gave unto him the daughter and heir of Raph de Doliz with the honor of Chateau Reaulx; he died without issue.

Raph Avenell, the sonne of Emma by William Avenell, her first husband, after the death of Adeliz, his Aunt, in the beginning of Henry II. did succeed in the barony of Okhamton. This man disdayning the mariage of the daughter of Reginald, Erl of Cornwall, soe farr provoked the said Erl that he raised a tytle against him for the sayd barony of Okhamton, in which he entituled Matild, the daughter of Rubert de Averinches, which was

[^42]sonne unto Emma the mother of Raph or Ranulph Avenell, by a second husband called William de Averinches. It appeareth that Richard, the Lord of Okhamton, in his lief tyme, for the love which he bare unto Robert de Averinches, caused his knightes and freeholders of his honor of Okhamton to attorne unto the said Robert as unto his next heire. By reason whereof an assise being brought by the sayd Matild against Ranulph, the Jury found that Robert de Averinches was seised of the sayd honor by th'attornement, and by meanes of the homages and fealties donne unto him by the knightes and freeholders of the sayd honor. Thus Ranulph lost this honor.

Robert Fitz Roy, in the right of Matild, his wief, became Lord of Okhamton. This Robert was brother unto Reginald Erl of Cornwall and alsoe base sonne to King Henry I. He begat on the sayd lady his wief one daughter called Matild, whom Reginald de Courtenay maried.

The Lord Reginald de Courtenay came into England with Queene Elinor, the wief of King Henry II. The said king gave Matild, the daughter of Robert Fitz Roy, with the barony of Okhamton, unto the said Reginald, and unto William Courtenay* the sonne of Reginald the king [gave] the mannor of Sutton in Oxfordshire. This Williamt by th'advise of his father maried Hawis de Ayncoort the half sister of his father's wief, which the Lord of Ayncort begot on the Lady Matild before she came into England. From this William $\dagger$ and Hawis, after her sister's death $\ddagger$ lady of Okhamton arr issued all the Courtenays. The Lord Reginald had no issue by the Lady Matild, his wief, which died without issue.

Nicolas de Pola, Lord of Pole, in Devonshire lived in the beginning of King Henry II. He had also divers landes in Wilshire. In his deedes he writeth 'omnibus hominibus suis Francis et Anglicis' which was the manner of Barons and great men of that tyme.

Robert, Lord Martin of Dertinton and Ceamoys, the second of the name of Robert, and alsoe Robert the third lived in Henry II. tyme.

Henry de Nonant lived in the 22 of Henry II., and after the death of Roger his father, which died about the tenth of this king, had the moyty of the honor of Totenays.

Asculph de Solariis died Anno domini 1171 in the [18th] yeere of Henry. II., and Gilbert de Solariis which had maried

[^43]with Hawis, sister to Richard Erl of Devon, succeeded him, and his dwelling was also at Umberlegh. This man and his father alsoe did serve Henry II. in his British warres. He left issue Mabil his only daughter and heire, whom Jordan de Chambernon maried, and enjoyed Umberlegh and the rest of the said Gilberte's landes with her.

Reginald, Erl of Cornwall, Lord of the honor of Braneys* in Devonshire died Anno domini 1175; 23 Henry II. Henry his base sonne called 'filius Comitis' held the same honor, but the king resumed it into his owne handes after some short space after the death of Reginald, soe as the said Henry held the same at the kinge's pleasure.

Fulk Pannell, or Paganell, was Lord and Baron of Baunton in this king's raigne; the said Fulk attended the sayd Henry II. in his British warres, and maried Alda, th'eldest sister of Gilbert de Abrinces, and had a great part of his enheritanc after his death, who was drowned Anno Domini i172. This Fulk died Anno domini i182, the 28 of Henry II. and his sonne William succeeded him.

Oliver the sonne of Oliver de Dinan was Vicount of Dynan in Britayne, and Lord of Hertland, and Harpford and divers other landes in Devonshire. This man and also his kinsman Rowland de Dinan were in very great favor with King Henry II. yeat nevertheles they both rebelled against the said King, who destroyed Becherell, the castell of Rolland Dynan and destroyed a great part of Dynan, which belonged unto the sayd Oliver de Dinan. This man was a great souldier, and especially well esteemed by King Henry II. after his submission and reconciliacion.

Warin de Aula held of King Henry II. 9 knights' fees within this shire.

William de Breuse held the moytye of the honor of Barnstable in the tyme of King Henry II. He gave the same unto th'Erl of Lecester, Robert, with Loretta his daughter, who dying without issue gave unto her neixce Matild de Tracy Tawstoke.

Richard de Bellomonte, sonne of Roscelin and Constanc, King Henry I. base daughter, was Vicount of Mayne in Normandy, and Lord of Southtawton in this shire. This man was had in soe great respect with King Henry II. that he bestowed his daughter Ermegardis in mariage on William, King of Scotland and was at the chardge thereof, and honored it with his owne person in the [33rd] yeere of his raigne. Constanc, another daughter of the sayd Richard, was maried unto Roger de Tony of Flamsted. $\dagger$

[^44]Noble men and men of speciall note in military or cyvill governement which lived in King Richard the first his tyme in Devonshire.

William, Lord Brigwer, or Briwer, a man very well learned in the lawes of this land, a judge and counseller of Estate, and much employed by King Richard I. He had lardg possessions in Devonshire by the king's gift, and also by his wief Matild de Vallibus. He left two sonnes both by the name of William; the youngest was a clergyman and Bisshop of Exon. After the death of the Lord William Briwer, his sonne, his large possessions were devided amongst th'issue of his daughters.

William Panell, the sonne of Fulk Pannell, was barron of Baunton in King Richard I. tyme. He left issue William which left 3 daughters, all which died issueles, and his estate came unto Sir John [Cogan], sonne of Cristian sister of William Pannell.*

William de Ridvers, called de Vernon of the place of his birth, the sonne of Baldwin, Erl of Devon, after the death of his brother, and his two nephewes, Baldwin and Richard, came unto th'Erldome of Devonshire in the tyme of Richard I. He had issue Baldwyn, which died two yeeres before him, Jone maried unto the Lord William Briwer, the younger, and Mary, maried unto the Lord Robert de Courtenay, unto whose posterity th'Erldom of Devon afterward came.

Henry de la Pomeray was Lord of Byry in this king's tyme, who enclining in faccion unto John Erl of Moreton and Cornwall, the king's brother, drave out the monkes out of St. Michael's Mount, in Cornwall, and fortified the same against the king. But hearing of the king's redempcion and retorninge homewardes, he died as it was supposed with grief and feare.

William de Tracy had a porcion of the barony of Barnstable in King Richard I. tyme.

Oliver de Tracy held also a porcion thereof in the same king's tyme.

John de Toriton was in King Richard I. tyme Lord and Baron of Toriton; after the death of William, his sonne, this Barony and other his landes were devided amongst five weemen, sisters, $\dagger$ and the heires generall, maried unto Merton, Brian, Martin, Humfravill and Sully.

William, Lord Martin of Dertinton and Ceamoys, lived in Richard I. tyme.

[^45]Henry de Ferrers held the honor of Beere of th'Erl Moreton and Cornwall in this King's tyme, from whome are issued all the families of Ferrers which were in Devon and Cornwall but now extinguished in the heires femalles.

Peter de Burdon lived in the tyme of Richard I. and was Lord of Kingsteignton in this shire : his issue male contynewed unto the tyme of King Henry IV. Henry Clifford esquire, the now Lord of Kingsteignton is heire generall of him by Thorp.

Richard Peverell of Ermington lived in this tyme. The famylyes of Carew ar discended from him, and Thomas Southcot of Mounsotery is the heire generall: from hym alsoe are discended all ye famylyes of Carew.

Galfrid del Estre, or Lestre, Lord of Langford Lestre, lived in the tyme of Richard I. This man's Barony was in Somersetshire.

Odo de Carrio, the sonne of William, the sonne of Girald, the Steward of Pembroke, lived in this king's tyme. King Richard I. gave unto him the mannor of Braunton in Devonshire. He was Lord of Carrew in Pembrokshire from whenc he tooke his name: he was also Lord of Mullefford in Barkshire, and had great posscssions in Ireland. From him all the famylies of Carew ar discended and Thomas Southcot of Mohun's Otery ys the heire generall.

Henry de Tilly lived in this king's tyme and had great landes in Richard I. tyme in this county at Woonford. He fell unto the French King in King John's tyme and left all his landes in England.

Gilbert Villers the Norman held Rew and divers landes in Devonshire, and adhering unto the French from King John left his landes.

William Bacon held Dunsford and divers other landes in this shire; he was also a Norman and forfeyted his landes in King John's tyme.

William de Pola, or de Stagno, held great possessions in this shire : he went into the Holy Land and attended on King Richard I. and is nombred amongst the barrons that attended on the said King. Jone his daughter and heire was maried unto Guy de Bryan.

William Revell lived in King Richard I. tyme in this shire, and held divers landes heere : his sonne Richard de Revell was sherif of Devon in King Richard's tyme, a good part thereof.

William de Montagu, or de Monteacuto, held divers landes in Devon in King Richard I. tyme. His barony was in Somerset. The great family of that name, which were Erles of Salisbury, descended from him, as also did the Montagues of Somersetshire.

Richard Flemyng, or Flandrensis, held Stoke Flemyng, Otery Flemyng, now Otery Mohun, with divers other landes; unto whom succeeded William and William, his sonne and grandchild ; the last gave his landes unto the Lord Reginald de Mohun in the tyme of Henry III.

The Noble and great men of birth, name and reputacion that were of this county and lived in the dayes of King John.
William de Ridvers, Erl of Devon lived and was also Erl of Devon in King John's tyme.

William Pannell, baron of Baunton.
Roger la Zouch unto whom King John gave Blactoriton, being the land of Joell de Mayn, which revolted from King John unto the French King. The King also gave unto him Northmolton and other landes in this shire. Many branches are sprouted out of this dry tree, for soe I take it the name doth signify. The heire male of th'eldest house contynewed unto Edward II. tyme, and after by St. Maur was caried into the Lord Zouch that nowe ys, whoe is heir male as yeat enduring. Bamfild and Stowell are also discended from the sayd Roger by St. Maur, and also Fortescu of Pruteston. From another younger house Mr. Davailes of Merland, by Fitzwarren is discended. And from another younger house Carew and Corbet are discended, by Talbot of Castell Ricard.

Peter Fitz Herbert in King John's tyme held 18 knightes' fees which were parcell of the honor of Barnstable.

Mathew Fitz Herebert, Lord of Stoke in Ham lived in this king's tyme. He was a great soldiour, and was younger sonne unto Herebert Fitz Herebert, whose father was chamblayn unto King Henry I. The issue male of this man contynewed unto Edward's tyme. The honor came unto th'Erl of Huntington, by th'Erl of Salisbury and Monthermer.

William le Brewse, Lord of Totneys, in Devonshire. This man fell soe greatly in displeasure with King John for that he refused to deliver his sonnes for pledges for his loyalty, that he was enforced to flye, but the king's displeasure pursued him into Ireland, where his wief and William his eldest sonne were taken and emprisoned, where they dyed with famyn. But William Brues himself escaped into France, and their dyed.

Oliver Tracy lived in this King's [tyme]: he maried Eva, the daughter of William Bruese, by meanes whereof the whole barony and honor of Barnstaple came unto the Lord Henry Tracy his sonne.

William Lord Briwer lived also in this king's tyme.

John, Baron of Torinton, and William his sonne lived in King John's tyme.

Thomas Basset, a younger sonne of the Lord Thomas Basset, and brother to the Lord Gilbert Basset, lived in King John's tyme ; and had the mannors of Coliton and Whiteford in Devon; he left issue two daughters Jone first wief of Reginald de Valletort, and secondly of William Courtenay, knight, and Alice, first maried to the Lord William Malet, secondly unto Sir Thomas Samford, and thirdly unto the Lord John Biset. She had issue by Samford many children. The heires generall of this Thomas Basset are Grevill, by the Lord Brooke, Cheyney, Stafford, Matravers, and Folliot ; also Strangwais, by Taylbois, Stafford, Matravers, Folliot and Samford.

Eustachius Grenvill was liuetenant of the Towre of London in the 16 yeere of King John: he was discended of Grenvill of Bideford.*

Phillip de Albiniaco, or Dalbeney, had his dwelling in Devonshire 10 of King John. This man was a great soldior, and very faithfull to the sayd king, and never swarved from his service in all his great trowbles. His heire generall is th'Erl of Bathe, whose great-grandmother was the sole sister of Henry Dawbeney, Erl of Bridgwater, and daughter of Giles Lord Dawbeney. Mr. Giles Dawbeney of Wayford in Somersetshire, that now is, descendeth from the brother of the said Gyles, Lord Dawbeney, and is th'only heire male from the sayd Phillip.

John Fortescu was a souldior in armes under this King John, who granted Wimondeston in Devonshire unto him in the io yeere of his raigne. From this man are descended all the severall famylies of that name thorough England. Th'eldest house hath contynewed ever sithens his dwelling at Wymondeston, untill lately the heire of that famyly hath sold this, being the remnant of th'enheritanc of his auncestors, formerly wasted.

William, Lord Martyn of Dertinton and Ceamoys lived in this king's tyme. This man kept himself close in Wales during the sturres betwixt King John and his barrons.

Henry de la Pomeray, lord of Byry, lived in King John's tyme.

Robert de Sachvile served King John, unto whom he gave the land of divers Normans that were departed from his obedienc, as Rew, Cowlegh, Dunsford and other landes, which descended unto his nephew Phillip Causbeof, and soe by Amicia his daughter, wief of Robert Blakford, unto Sir John Blackford their sonne, which lived in the tyme of Edward II.

[^46]Henry, the sonne of Reginald Erl of Cornwall, held the honor of Totenays (which King John had seised into his handes uppon displeasure taken against William Lord Bruis) by the commaundement of the said King, who had also the King's mannor of Carswill and Dupeford, from the said king's gift. He held also the honor of Braneys: he died without issue.

Symon Fitz Rogon had Normancot of King John's gift, which was of the land that the Normans held. His dwelling was at Holcomb Rogus, which bordereth neere Somersetshire. From him are discended Blewet and the heires of Wadham by Chiselden.

Eustachius Courtenay served also under King John, who gave unto him the land of John, the sonne of Lucas, who was Butteler unto King Henry II. This John revolted to the French King and Eustais Courtenay possessed Tingewike* in Devonshire which the sayd John before held.

Galfride de Albemarle was in this king's tyme, and held Woodbery of the king, which King Henry I. gave unto Stephen de Maundevill, his auncetor : the heires generall of this man are the Lord Bonvil's heire, and Grevill and Strangways by Matravers.

Robert de Ropeley held by his wief three fees, parcell of the honor of Lymesey, within this county. This man was a great souldior and of much employment in King John's tyme.

## Men of Nobilyty and Woorth, inhabiting or which [were] of Devonshire in Henry III. tyme.

William de Ridvers, called de Vernon, Erl of Devon: he died the first yeere of this king unto whom succeeded Baldwin de Rivers, his grandchild, by the Lord Baldwin his sonne, which died two yeeres before his father, and left issue by Margaret Fitzgerald, daughter and heire unto the Lord Warren Fitz Gerald : this Baldwin that succeeded his grandfather in th'erldom, he maried Amicia de Clare daughter of the wief of Richard, Erl of Cornwall.

Richard Plantaginet Erl of Cornwall, and after King of Romanes, held in his owne right the honor of Braneys in Devonshire with divers great lardg possessions in this shire, which all came unto the crowne after the death of Edmond his sonne, which died without lawfull issue.

[^47]William, Lord Brywer the younger, lived in the beginning of Henry III. He died without issue, having maried Jone, on of the daughters of William de Vernona, Erl of Devon: his enheritanc was parted amongst his five sisters, Margery, by whom that part was made a porcion annexed unto the honor of Lancaster; Grace, the second sister, left her enheritanc to Cantilupe and Mortimer; Isabell, the third sister, from whom by Wake, and Edmond of Woodstock's daughter, the heires of Holland Erl of Kent are discended. Alis, the fourth sister, from whom by Mohun and Strangeway th'erl of Derby is discended, and the three daughters and heires of Ferdinando, Erle of Derby are likewise discended, and ar the heires generals from the sayd Isabell, and also of the Lords Mohun and Strange; and Jone the fifth sister maried to William Percy, and had issue Jone, Agnes, Alis and Anastacia.

William Brewer, sonne of the Lord William Brewer, th'elder was in great favor with King Henry III., and of his privy counsell. He was promoted unto the bisshoprick of Exon in the Ioth yeere of Henry III. The King putt this man in trust with the conveying of his sister into Germany, to bee maried unto th'Emperor. He died in 29 yeere of King Henry III.

William Ralegh born in Devon. He was a man excellently lerned in the lawes of this Realme, and was first a judge, and after promoted by King Henry III. unto the Bisshoprick of Norwich, but in the 27 of the same king he attayned unto the Bisshoprick of Winchester, without the king's consent, by meanes whereof he fell into displeasure with the said King.

Robert, Lord Courtenay, was Baron of Okhamton in the begining of Henry III. and after the death of the Lady Hawis, his mother, Lady and enheretrix of that honor. This lady was maried unto William* sonne of the Lord Reginald de Courtenay, which had maried Matild the sister of this Lady Hawis, and by her had the sayd barony.

William Pannell, or Paganell, Lord of Baunton, sonne of William, the sonne of Fulk, lived in King Henry III. tyme, and died in the 16 [34] yeere of his raign, leaving issuet Milicent, Alis and Agnes, which all three died without issue, by means whereof Baunton and the rest of th'inheritanc came unto Sir John Cogan as next cosen and heire, being sonne of Sir Williain, sonne of Sir Milo, by Cristian the daughter of Sir Fulk Pannell.

Sir Nicholas de Mules was a man of high reputacion in King Henry III. tyme, and was a counselor of estate. Besides he was a worthy and noble souldier. He was a governor or seneschall of Gascoigne, and in the 28 of King Henry III. he

[^48]fought a Battell with the King of Navarr, and tooke him prisoner in the field. He discended of an auncient linage within this shire, and had in mariage Hawis on of the daughters and heires of the Lord James sonne of William de Newmarch. The King gave unto him his mannor of Kingscarswill in Devon. The heires generall of him are th'erl of Huntington by Botreaux and Hungerford, and the heires of the Lord Dinham by Courtenay.

Sir Stephan de Bauceyne served King Henry III. and was a worthy souldior, and had many victories against the Welch, and was at the length slayne the 4 I of the same King by Rees Vachan.

Henry de Baa lived in the tyme of King Henry III., and was a judge of the King's Bench, and being appealed of falshod by Sir Phillip Darcy he fell soe highly into the king's displeasure, that the king gave liberty unto any man to kill him. But his wief being of kinred of the Bassetes and Samfordes, which were greate men in that tyme, by theire meanes he was reconciled unto the king.

Herebert Fitz Mathew, Lord of Stokenham, sonne of Mathew Fitzherbert, lived in Henry III. tyme; he was a valiant knight, and of great service, and had great knowledge in the warres. He was slayne neere Montgomery in Wales, by the fall of a stone from the topp of a hill.

The Lord Alan Zouch, sonne of Roger, lived in this king's tyme ; he was Lord of Nortlimolton, and had divers other landes in Devonshire. He was lerned in the lawes of this land, and was Justice of Chester. He also receyved great advauncement by Helen, his wief, on of the daughters and heires of Roger Quyncy, Erl of Winchester, and Helen his wief. He was slayne in Westminster Hall.

The Lord Phillip Dawbeney, or Dalbiney, lived in Henry III. tyme, and was of the king's counsell, and employed in great affaires, as namely in practising the revolt of the Normans from the French. This man soe much prevailed in counsell with the king, that by his meanes the jorney, which the bisshops of Winchester and Exceter intended unto the Holy Land was crossed.

Baldwyn de Ridvers, the fifth was Erl of Devonshire after the death of Baldwyn his father, which died 29 of Henry III. This Baldwin had issue John which lived not long, by meanes whereof the name of Ridvers failed, and th'erldom came unto Isabell sister of the last Baldwin, which was maried unto William de Fortibus, Erl of Albemarle. This Lady died without issue. Neere about her death shee sold th'ile of Weight, and her mannor of Christchurch unto King Edward I. for six thowsand mark, payd by the hands of Sir Gilbert de Knovile,

William de Stanes, and Geffrey Hecham, the King's Receivers. After her death th'inheritanc and th'Erldome of Devon came unto the Lord Hugh Courtenay as cosen and next heir.

John, Lord Courtenay, was baron of Okhamton in this king's tyme, after the death of Robert his father.

William de Bruse, the sonne of the Lord Reginald by Grace, on of the sisters and heires of William Lord Brewer, was Lord of Totenais, and was hanged by Leolyn, princ of Wales, for that hee took him in adultery with his wief in the 14 yeere of Henry III.

William, Lord Cantilup, after the death of William, Lord Breuse, had the honor of Totneys ; and left it unto George, his sonne.

Sir Henry de la Pomeray, the father and sonne, were both Lords of Byry in King Henry III. his tyme.

Nicolas, Lord Martyn of Dertinton, and Ceamoys, the father and sonne, were both Lordes of those honors in Henry III. tyme.

Henry, Lord Tracy, sonne of Oliver Tracy, and Eva his wief, was baron of Barnstaple, a man well lerned in the lawes, and a judg in the tyme of Henry III. He left issue Matild, first married unto Nicolas, Lord Martyn, and after to Jeffrey Camvil : he died 2 of Edward I.

Peter Fitz Mathew, Lord of Stokenham, succeeded Herebert, and lived in Henry III. his tyme, and John Fitz Mathew his brother did succeede him, and died about the 54 of Henry III. leaving his sonne Mathew within age, and in the custody of the Lord Nicolas Martin.

Oliver de Dinant was Lord of Herteland in the beginning of King Henry III., whom Galfride de Dynant succeeded, 27 [5] of Henry III. and Oliver the sonne of Galfride the latter end of Henry III. All these three grandfather, father, and sonne were in Henry III. tyme.

Reginald de Valletort was Lord of Tremeton in Cornwall, which he had by Jone, his mother, on of the daughters of Reginald Erl of Cornwall. He was also Lord of Hurberton, in Devon : after the death of Roger, his sonne, th'inheritanc came unto Peter Corbet and Henry de la Pomeray, being cosens and next heires to the said Roger Valletort. Peter Corbet died without issue.

Henry de Bracton lived in this King Henry III. tyme; he was excellently lerned in the lawes, the memory whereof remayneth unto this day by his labors extant; he dwelled in Devon, and lyeth buried in St. Peter's at Exceter.

William Chambernon; baron, the sonne of Jordan Chambernon, was lord of Umberlegh; he died in the beginning of King Henry III., and left a young lady, his daughter and heire
named Jone, which was maried unto Sir Raph de Willinton, and brought unto him divers sonnes. After the death of Sir Raph, which died about the 41 of Henry III., this lady contynewed long tyme a widow, and stileth her self in all her deedes Lady Jone Chambernon. Shee caused also all her sonnes to leave the Willington's armes, and to give the Chambernons.

Sir Raph de Willinton, eldest sonne of Sir Raph and the Lady Jone Chambernon, was a man of warr, in King Henry III. his tyme. He had the keeping of Lundey, and was dischardged thereof in the 48 of Henry III., and the keeping thereof delivered unto Humphrey de Bohun.

Reginald, Lord Mohun of Dunster, was Lord of Otery Mohun and divers other grete possessions in Devon: a great part he gave unto William, his younger sonne, which he begat on Isabell, the widow of the Lord Gilbert Basset, the daughter of William Erl Ferrers by Sibill Marshall: he died the 15 of February, 1257.

Noble men of birth and such principall men of note and employment that were born or had dwellinges in Devonshire in the tyme of Edward I.

Edmond Plantaginet, sonne of Richard, King of Almayn, was Erl of Cornwall, and baron of the honor of Braneys in Edward I. tyme. He died without lawfull issue, and his honors came to the king as his next heire.

Hugh, Lord Courtenay, Baron of Okhamton, lived in King Edward I. tyme. He was sonne unto John Courtenay and died 20 of Edward I., unto whom Hugh Lord Courteney, his sonne, afterward Erl of Devonshire succeeded.

George de Cantilup was Lord of Totenays in Edward I. his tyme: he died without issue, and the honor of Totenays came unto the porcion of his sister Milizent, first wief of Eudo la Zouch, and secondly of Roger de Monthalt. He died I Edward I.

Nicholas Martin, Lord of Ceamoys in Wales, and Dertington in Devon: this man lived in the beginning of Edward I. his raign, and maried Matild, the daughter of Henry Lord Tracy. After the death of this Nicolas, his wief was remarried unto Jeffrey Camvill, which toward the latter end of this king's raigne was called as a baron unto the parliament. This Lady had issue by both her husbandes: by the first William Lord Martyn, and by the second Sir William Camvill, and Matild, wief of Sir Henry de la Pomeray.

William Lord Martyn of Ceamoys, and Dertington lived in the tyme of Edward I. He maried Elinor, the widow of the

Lord John de Mohun the II., the daughter of the Lord Reginald Fitzpeers, by whom he had issue, William, Jone, wief of the Lord Nicolas de Audelegh of Helegh, and Elinor wief of Sir Phillip Columbers, which died without issue.

Henry de la Pomeray, Lord of Byry, died in the 15 of Edward I., after whom Henry de la Pomeray his sonne succeeded, and died in the 33 of King Edward I. unto whom Henry his sonne succeeded, being at the death of his father 14 yeeres old.

John de Mules, sonne of Sir Roger de Mules, sonne of Sir John de Mules, being the sonne of Nicolas, that valiant souldior and grate counseler in Henry III. his tyme, was called as a baron unto the parliament in the 27 of Edward I. He had his dwelling at Kingscarswill in Devonshire; he died the 3 of Edward II.

Oliver de Dinant, or Dinham, sonne of Oliver, was called as a barron unto the parliament 27 of Edward I., in which yeere he also died, and left Jocey, his sonne, to succeede him.

Sir John Cogan, knight, was a man of great honor in Ireland, and a good soulidor. After the death of the daughters* of William Pannel, Lord of Baunton, he came unto the same landes which the said William held in England as cosen and next heire, being sonne of Sir William, the sonne of Sir Miles Cogan by Cristian daughter unto Sir Fulk Pannell of Baunton. This Sir John died 6 of Edward I., and Sir John Cogan, his sonne, succeeded unto him, which died in the 30 of Edward I., and left Thomas his sonne to succeede him, being of th'age of $\operatorname{xxvj}$ yeeres at the death of his father.

Sir Raph de Wilinton, after the death of his mother the Lady Jone Chambernon, was Lord of Umberlegh, unto whom Sir John de Willinton his sonne succeeded in King Edward I. tyme.

Roger, Lord Zouch of Ashby, was after the death of the Lord Zouch, his father, Lord of Northmolton: he maried Ela, on of the daughters and heires of Sir Stephan Longespe, Lord Justice of Ireland, and had issue Alan, the last Zouch of that famyly.

Sir John de Carrio, or Carru, lived in this king's tyme, and had by his wief, Elinor the daughter and heire of William de Mohun, of Otery Mohun, the sonne of the Lord Reginald Monun of Dunster by Isabel his second wief, being on of the heires of th'erl Marshall, great possessions in this shire. He had issue by her Sir Nicolas de Carru, which died without issue, and by his second wief Jone Talbot, he had issue Sir Jolin, unto whom the Mouns' landes were conveyed by fyne.

[^49]This Sir John de Carreu was sonne of Sir Nicolas, which maried Amicia the sister of Sir John Peverell of Erminton, by whom he had Weston Peverell, Mamhed and Galmeton in Devon. The said Sir Nicolas was sonne of Sir Nic las and of Amicia, his wief, by whom he had the barony of Odron in Ireland. Sir Nicolas was sonne of Sir William, baron of Carew in Pembrokshire, and Mulesford in Barkshire, being the sonne of Nicolas, the sonne of William de Carrio, unto whom King John confirmed Mulesford, which King Henry I. gave unto Gerald the sonne of Walter, the grandfather of Otho, father of this William.

From this Gerald, which is sometyme called Gerald de Winsor, and most commonly Steward or governor of Pembroke, are discended the Fitzgeraldes of Kildare, and th'erles of Desmond in Ireland, and all the families of the Carowes in Ireland and England. This Gerald was the sonne of Walter, Constable of the Castell of Windesor, from which Walter, the Lord Winsor that now liveth discendeth.

This Gerald came into Wales with Arnulph Erl of Pembroke, brother of Robert de Belismo, and sonne of Roger de Mountgomery, Erl of Salop, and was his constable, or steward. But after this Arnulph did rebell, and was banisshed by Henry I. The King gave the custody of all his landes unto Gerald, and gave unto him great possessions. This Gerald new builded the castell of Pembrok. He maried Nesta, daughter of Rees ap Theodor, which was a bewtifull lady, and begat on her many children. Wiliam, th'eldest, seated himself at Carru, where he builded his castell; he held also Mullesford by on knight's fee, which his father had of the gift of Henry I. He also held two knightes' fees in Hermitage in Buckinghamshire, by the name of William, the sonne of Gerald of Pembroke. This William had issue Odo. The sayd William and Odo, his sonne, by the name of William the sonne of Gerald, and Odo his sonne, granted Rodberd in Pembrokshire, lying neere Carew castell, by their deede unto the Knightes Templars.

King Richard I. gave unto this Odo the mannor of Braunton in Devon by the name of Odo, the sonne of William, the sonne of Gerald, and it appeareth by a Record in the Towre that Odo de Carrio held Braunton of the King at will, paying xvli yearly, anno primo Regis Johannis.

This Gerald had issue also David, Bisshop of St. Davy, and Maurice Fitz Gerald, from whom are discended the famylies of Kildare and Desmond in Ireland.

The Lord John Willington, sonne of Sir Raph, lived in the tyme of King Edward I. He left issue the Lord John, Sir Reginald and Sir Henry.

The Lord Roger de Valletort was baron of Hurberton in
the tyme of Edward I., and died in the 33 of Edward I. Unto whom Peter Corbet, and Henry de la Pomeray were cozens and next heires.

Roger de Ferrers, Lord of Beere Ferrers, died about the 20 of King Edward I. and Sir Reginald de Ferrers, his brother, succeeded him. This Reginald died in the 33 of Edward I. and William, his sonne, succeeded him.

John Fitz Mathew was Lord of Stokenham in Edward I. tyme whose* enheritanc came unto the Lord Raph Monthermer.

Noble men of birth, and such worthy men as were in Devonshire, or had houses there in the tyme of King Edward II.

Piers de Gaveston King Edward II. made Erle of Cornwall, and Lord of the honor of Braneys, but he lost both lief, erldome and honor in the king's tyme.

Hugh Lord Courtenay, baron of Okhamton.
William Lord Martyn of Ceamoys, Dertington, and after his mother's death Lord of Barnstaple, was in this King Edward II. tyme, and the Lord William, his sonne also, which died the 19 of the same king, and left his enheritanc unto Elinor, his sister, wief of Phillip Columbers, and to James Audeley, sonne of his sister Jone.

Thomas Cogan, the sonne of Sir John Cogan, Lord of Baunton, and died in the [8] yeere of King Edward II., and left Richard, his sonne, to succeed him, and was of full age 14 of this king.

John, Lord Mules, died the 2 of King Edward II., and the Lord Nicolas his sonne succeeded him, which died also the 9 of this king, leaving his brother Roger his heire, who also died without issue, and left his brother John his heire.

Gilbert de Knovill, knight, a man well lerned in the lawes, and as I take it, Chief Barron of th'Exchecquer, died in the 8 of Edward II., and left his sonne, Sir John Knovill his heire, being of th'age of $x l$ yeeres. This John had two daughters his heires, ... , maried unto John Dreu, from whom Mr. John Pawlet is discended as heire, by the mariage of Burton's daughter and heire. The second daughter called Alis maried unto Thomas Ercedecne, from whom by Lascot Arondell of Lanhern is discended as heire generall.

Walter de Stapledon, Bisshop of Exon, was a great counsellor of Estate, and in great favor with King Edward II., by

[^50]whom he was made Lord Threasorer of England, And was sent by the said king into France, to espye the demeasnor of Queene Isabell the king's wief. And being appoynted Custos of London he, togither with his brother Sir Richard Stapledon, a knight of Devonshire, was slayne in a mutynye made by the Londoners.

John Lord Wilinton of Umberlegh lived in the tyme of King Edward II. He was eldest sonne of the Lord de Willinton which died about the beginning of Edward II. This man died Anno domini 1336, about the 9 of Edward III.

Sir Henry de Willinton, youngest sonne of the Lord John, and brother of the Lord de Willinton. This man dwelled at Gidesham in Devonshire. He was a good souldior, and was on amongst the barrons that tooke armes against Edward II., and was slayne about the 17 yeere of the same king: he is named by Holinshed a Baronet.*

Noble men of birth, or of woorth in the commonwelth which had dwellinges in Devon in the tyme of Edward III.

John of Eltam, brother to King Edward III., created Erl of Cornwall in the 2 yeere of his raign.

The Lord Edward princ of Wales made Duke of Cornwall by King Edward III., his father, had the honor of Braneys in Devon, and the cyty of Exceter, and the castel of Exon annexed unto his duchy. His worthy atchiementes are sufficiently sett foorth by many writers, and therefore I shall bestow vayne labor in this place to mencion them.

Hugh, Lord Courtenay, the 2 Baron of Okhamton, after the death of Isabell, countes of Devonshire, entred into all the possessions of the sayd erldome, but assumed not the name and tytle of Erle, by meanes whereof he had was called into question, and theruppon his complaynt unto the king, which bad him take the name of Erle of Devon, and by that name the king directed his lettres and messages unto him. Soe about the 9 yeere of King Edward III. he tooke uppon him the name of Erle of Devon, which contynewed unto him and his posteryty. He died the ninth of January in the 40th [14th] yeere of the same king, after whom Hugh Lord Courtenay the III., his sonne was Erl of Devonshire : he died the 2 of May in the 51 of the same King.

James Lord Audelegh of Helegh and Rougchastell, was also by the right of his mother Jone, sister of William Lord Martyn, baron of Dertington, Ceamoys and Barnstaple. This

[^51]man was excellent in martiall skill, and by his great valew that great field at Poictiers was gotten, where the French king was taken prisoner. This lord gave the first onsett and behaved him self so valiantly that the princ gave unto him five hundred mark of yeerly revenew for that daye's service, which presently the sayd lord Awdelegh gave unto foure of his gentlemen, which served under him and shewed great valew. The princ at first offended that he should soe little esteeme his gift, but depart with it to his servants, was soe well satisfied with his answere, and his gift, that he both confirmed the same, and added other seven hundred markes of Revennew unto the sayd lord. He was knight of th'order of the Garter, and specially employed with others for the government of Devonshire, and the defenc thereof against invasion; he died in the [9] yeere of Richard II., and left the Lord Nicolas to succeede him.

John Montacute, brother unto William, Erl of Salisbury, was Lord and Baron of Stokenham. He maried Margaret, daughter and heire of Thomas Monthermer, Lord of Stokenham. This man was a valiant man and employed in the French warres by King Edward III. He was also appoynted by commission for the defenc of Devonshire with others and in the ... of Edward III. [13 Ric. II.] died and left the Lord John his sonne to succeede him.

Sir Henry de la Pomeray, the father and sonne lived in Edward's tyme, and were Lordes of Byry. Henry the sonne was by commission putt in trust for the defenc of this shire, and died the 48 of Edward III., and Sir John de la Pomeray his sonne, Lord of Byry, succeeded him.

William, Lord Zouch of Haringworth, Lord of the honor of Totenays, died in the 26 yeere of King Edward III., and his grandchild, the Lord William Zouch, sonne of Eudo, the sonne of the first Lord William, succeeded his grandfather.

Richard Cogan, the sonne of Thomas Cogan, was lord of Baunton in the tyme of King Edward III., and died in the 42 of the same king, and Sir William Cogan his sonne succeeded him.

Sir John Carrew of Mouns Otery, baron of Carew and Mulesford, was in the tyme of King Edward III. and served valiantly in his warres in France, and in the 24 of the same King he was appointed and served Lord Deputy in Ireland. This Sir John had a sonne called Sir John, which was slayne in Franc not long before the death of his father, which died in the 36 of King Edward III. leaving his enheritanc unto Leonard, his eldest sonne, then living.

Sir Robert Crues of Crusemorchard was knighted in his service donne in Franc, where he served under the pay of the Lord Walter de Manny.

John Stofford knight lived in King Edward III. his tyme, and was a judge of the King's Coorte of Common Pleas; he left issue a daughter called Jone which was maried unto William Fitzwaryn of Brightley. The heire generall of whom ys Mr. John Giffard of Brightley, by the match with the daughter and heire of Coblegh.

William Fitz Warryn of Brightlegh was well lerned in the lawes of this land, and was a governor in this county in the tyme of Edward III. He was chosen by the sayd county to bee knight of the same, togither with John Dabernon, in the 39 [38] of King Edward III. Mr. Giffard of Brightley is his heire.

John Dabernon, a man wel lerned in the lawes, lived in Edward III. tyme: he was Wardeyn of the Stannery, and of the fees of the Duchy of Cornwall, and in the 39 of Edward III. was chosen on of the knightes for the shire. His heire generall ys Arscot of Dunsland, by Batten.

Sir Henry Percehay of Kytton in Devonshire lived in the tyme of King Edward III. He was very well lerned in the lawes, and employed in the government of this shire; he was chosen on of the knightes of the shire for the parliament holden [25] of Edward III., and after came to be on of the judges of the King's bench, and rode in this Western circuyt in the 47 yeere of Edward III. This man had issue a sonne called William, and his sonne's sonne William, which died without issue, and so his enheritanc came unto the issue of his two sisters, from whom Mr . Warr of Hestercomb and Mr. Fraunceis of Combflory are discended as heires generals.

Richard de Braunscomb lived in this king's [tyme] in Devonshire. He was a very wise man, and employed in the governement, and services of this county; he was foure tymes sherif of this shire, videlicet in the 33, 35, 4I and 49 yeeres of King Edward III. He [No: Adam de Branscombe] was chosen Knight of the shire in the [14] of Edward III. The heir generall of this Richard Branscomb ys Sir Thomas Wise, Sir John Speccot, the heires of Halbene, Kirkham and Chedder.

William Luscot of Luscot, lived in the latter end of Edward III., and bare rule in this shire. He was lerned in the lawes: he left Alice his only daughter, maried unto Sir John Arondell of Lahern, from whom Mr. Arondell that now liveth is descended.

Nicolas Whiting of Wood, neere Columpton, lived in Edward III. tyme, and was lerned in the lawes: his issue male contynewed unto the Raigne of King Henry VII. The last left foure daughters, maried unto Keynes, Fitz James, Walrond and Ashford. The issue of Keynes, Walrond and Ashford contynew : the other died without issue, and gave her porcion of land to her husband.

Sir John Wadham was a judge in Edward III. tyme.
Sir John Cary was a judge in Edward III. tyme.
William Wikes was well learned in the lawes of this Realme, and was Recorder of the cyty of Exon in this king's dayes.

Sir Thomas Mounthermer, Lord of Stokenham, was a man of Armes and served in France under King Edward III. ; and was slayne before Sluys in the fight at sea in the 14 of Edward III. and left Margaret, his only daughter, which was maried unto Sir John Montacute.

John Ferrers, knight, was Lord of Beareferrers in Edward III. tyme, and was a speciall man in the government of this shire ; he died [49] of Edward III., and Martin his sonne, succeeded him as well in his estate, as also in the government of Devon. In the 49 of Edward III. he was putt in speciall trust with others for the defenc of the seacost against the French invasions. He died ... and left issue three daughters unto whom Sir Foulk Grevill, Copleston of Warlegh, Bellew and Dillon are heires generall, that is to say Grevill, by his aunceters, the Lord Brooke and Chambernon, Copleston by his auncesters Bonvill and Poyninges of Basing, and Bellew and Dillon by Flemyng.

Noble men of Birth, or of government, and service IN THE COMMONWELTH WHICH HAD DWELLINGES in Devonshire during the raigne of King Richard II.

The Lord James Audelegh died the 9 of Richard II., and the Lord Nicolas, his sonne, died the 15 of the same king, by meanes whereof the honor of Dertinton fell to the Crowne, and also of Barnstaple, being intailed to the heires males of James, Lord Awdelegh. A great part of th'enheritanc nevertheles came unto the daughter and daughter's children of the Lord James, that is to say unto John Tuchet, the sonne of Jone, his eldest daughter, and Margery, the wief of Roger Hillary, his daughter by his first wief Jone Mortimer, and unto Fulk Fitzwarren, the sonne of Margaret, his youngest daughter, by Isabell Strange, his last wief. John Tuchet had the barony of Audelegh, and Fulk Fitz Waren had Tavistock [Tawstock] by speciall entaile.

Edward Courtenay,* called the blind Erl of Devonshire was in this king's tyme, and left issue by Sir John Dawney's daughter

[^52]and heire, Edward the second Erl of that name, and Sir Hugh from whom the last lyne of the Courteneys Erles of Devon discended ; he died about the 18 of Richard II. and Edward, his eldest sonne, succeeded him.

John Holland, half brother unto King Richard II., was by him made Duke of Exceter, and receyved by his gift the honors of Barnstaple and Dertinton. This duke was made also great Chamberlayn of England by a grant to him and the heires males of his body, and was captayne of Calais; he left issue John Holland, Duke of Exceter, and Edward Holland, Erl of Mortaygn, and Constanc, maried unto Thomas Mowbray, Erl of Notingham, and after to John Lord Gray of Ruthen.

Fulk Lord Fitzwarren of Tauistok, which came by his mother, and he had the honor of the Barony of Baunton by Elizabeth his wief, sister and heire of Sir John Cogan, which died the 7 of this King; he did enjoy Tauistoke a small tyme. The Lord Fulk Fitz Warren, his sonne, succeeded him.

William, Lord Zouch of Haringworth was Lord of Totenays, in this king's tyme.

Richard, Lord St. Maur, was Lord of Northmolton in this king's tyme. His eldest sonne, Richard, died in his lief tyme, leaving on only daughter which was born after his death, from whom the Lord Zouch is discended as heire generall. He gave the mannor of Northmolton unto his younger sonne John, from whom Stowell and Bamfild ar discended as heires generals.

William, Lord Botreaux, was possessed of divers landes within the county of Devon. He died 15 Richard II., and the Lord William, his sonne succeeded him.

John Lord Montagu of Stokenham sonne of John Lord Montagu lived in Richard II. tyme.

Robert Lord Harrington had great possessions by the mariage of on of the daughters of Sir Neale Loring, within this county; he had a Dwelling at Knowston Beapell. He had issue John and William, which did succeed on after the other.

The Lord Guy de Brian had great possessions in Devon. He had three sonnes, Sir Guy, Sir Phillip, and Sir William, which all died before there father: his eldest sonne had issue a daughter named Isabell, from whom th'erl of Northumberland deriveth himself to discend. Stowell of Somersetshire and Bamfild had also a porcion of his landes, as being discended by St. Maur from John Erle and Margeret, his wief, daughter of Sir Guy de Bryan the elder, and cosens of the whole bloode of Amicia Countesse of Wilshire, daughter and heire of Sir Richard Stofford, and of . . . his wief daughter of Robert Lovell, and heire of Elisabeth his wief, daughter of Sir Guy de Brian the younger, which Elizabeth was first maried unto Sir Robert Fitz Payne, from whom th'erl of Northumberland is yssued.

Sir Robert Tresilian, Chief Justice of England in King Richard II., who bicause hee maynteyned the king's prerogative further then the lawes of the land did, he was attainted by Parliament, drawen and hanged at Tyborn. He maried Emma the only sister of William Huish, and his heire, and Emma his daughter, was maried unto John Hawlegh of Dartmouth, unto whom Copleston is heire.

Sir John Cary, knight, in the 39 of Edward III. and 41 of Edward III., together with William Cary, were knightes chosen for this county. He was well lerned in the lawes, and in this king's tyme was on of the judges of the King's Bench.

William Cary, brother of the sayd John Cary, knight, was also lerned in the lawes, and lived both in Edward III. tyme, and in this king's tyme.

Sir John Wadham of Egge, knight, was on of the judges of the Common Pleas in the tyme of Richard II. From him discended Nicolas Wadham, esquire, lately decessed without issue, unto whom Sir John Strangways, Sir John Windham, and the foure daughters of Nicolas Martyn of Adelamston are heires generals.

John Hille of Hillescoorte lived in this king's tyme, he was lerned in the lawes, and was a Justice of the peace in this county.

John [i.e., Thomas] Brantingham, Bisshop of Exon, being of the privy counsell [of] King Richard II., and Lord Threasoror in the 5 yeere of his raign is dischardged of the thresoreship. In the io yere he is appointed on of the peeres for the government of the Realm.

Edmond Stafford, Bishop of Exon, discended of a noble famyly, is made Lord Privy Seale in the 19 of Richard II., and in the 21 is made Lord Chancelor of Englande.

William Courtenay, sonne unto Hugh, Erl of Devon was in this king's tyme Archbisshop of Canterbury, and died in the 21 yeere of Richard II. He was first a Prebendary in Exon from whence he was advaunced to bee Bysshop of Hereford, then after, Bisshop of London, and lastly of Canterbury.

Sir Phillip Courtenay, second sonne unto Hugh Erl of Devon and Margaret Bohun, his wief, was a man very skilfull in armes, and served under King Richard II. He was employed in the 2 yeere of this King's [reign] against the French, and was taken prisoner ; and the greatest number of his company slayne at a fight by sea. They had in their company the most choisest gentlemen of Devonshire and Somerset. In the 9 yeere of the same King he was made Lord Liuetenant for the King in Ireland. He left issue William, Richard, and John, from whom Courtenay of Powderham and Courtenay of Molland are discended.

Sir Peter Courtenay the fifth sonne of Hugh Erl of Devon and brother of Sir Phillip, served in the French warres under the sayd king. He died without issue the I3 of Henry IV. He was likewise taken prisoner with his brother before Sluise by the Spanish fleete and was on of the Knightes of the Garter.

Noble men by birth, and men of woorth in the common welth, that had dwellinges in Devon in the tyme of Henry IV.

Edward Courtenay,* sonne of Edward the blind, was erle of Devonshire in this king's tyme. He had issue by [Eleanor] daughter of [Roger] Mortimer, Erl of March, Hugh which was after his father's death Erl of Devon.

John, Lord Montacute, Lord of Stokenham, was also Erle of Salisbury, and lived in this king's tyme; he had issue Thomas, that valiant Erl of Salisbury.

Robert Lord Harington $\dagger$ the sonne of Robert Lord Harrington lived in the tyme of King Henry IV.

William Lord Zouch of Haringworth was also Lord of Totenais in Devonshire.

Fulk, Lord Fitzwarren of Tauistok, and Lord of Baunton, lived in this King's tyme.

William Hankford was knighted at the coronacion of Henry IV. he was on of the judges of the Common Plees in the same king's tyme, and after, in the tyme of Henry V., he was Chief Justice of England or rather of the King's Bench.

Robert Hull or Hyll of Shilston was a Judge of the Common Plees in King Henry IV. his tyme, from whom is descended Mr. Robert Hill that now is.

John Cokayne was a Judge of the Common Plees in the tyme of King Henry IV.

The overlords of the Honour of Gloucester were the Clares, Earls of Hertford, from whom it passed by inheritance to the Despencers.

    The manor of Winkleigh, however, was granted by William I. to the ancestor of Roger de Keynes, who in 1315-16, at Exeter, claimed to hold it by descent. (Plac. de quo warranto, 9-1o Ed. II., Com. Devon, Rot. 36, p. 167.) But before that date the manor had been divided into two moieties, one held by the family of Keynes, and afterwards known as Winkleigh Keynes, and the other by the Tracies, from whom it passed, as Wink-

[^26]:    heir, William de Braose, who married Eva, sister and co-heir of Walter Marshall, Earl of Pembroke (Inq. p. in., 3 Edw. I., No. 53; Calend. Gen., p. 227), and was dead in or before 14 Hen. 1II., 1229. His widow had the castle and lands of Tonnes in dower, and upon her death they passed to her daughter Eva (Rot. Fin., 35 Hen. III., memb. 19; Abb. Placita, 37 Hen. III., Rot. 12, M'mas Term, p. 132 ; and 38 Hen. III., Rot. 14, Hill. Term, p. 143), who married William de Canteloup, to which family one moiety of the honour of Totnes was thus conveyed. This William was son and heir of William de Canteloup, who died in 1250 (Inq. p. m., I Edw. I., No. 16, Calend. Gen., p. 197), apparently by Milicent, widow of Almaric, Count of Evreux. (Rot. Litt. Claus., I Hen. III., memb. 22.) William de Canteloup the younger died in 1254 (Inq. p. m., 38 Hen. III., No. 46, Calend. Gen., 61), having done homage for his father's lands in 125 I (Rot. Fin., 35 Hen. III., memb. 8). He left a son, George Canteloup, who was born at 'Bergenny' in 1251, and died unmarried in 1272 (Inq. p. m., i Edw. I., No. 16, Calend. Gen., p. 197), seised of the manor and castle of Totnes (Abb. Rot. Origin., I Edw. I., Rot. 25). Of his two sisters, one, Johanna, was the wife of Henry de Hastings, and the mother of John de Hastings, who at the date of his uncle's death was fifteen years of age, and one of the co-heirs. The other sister, Milicent, became the wife of Eudo or Ivo de ła Zouche, and was the other co-heir of George de Canteloup, taking to her husband the honour of Totnes, of which he had seisin on I March, 1273. After her husband's death she married . . . de Monte Alto.

[^28]:    Soc., vol. x., p. 43, No. 26), and was dead in 1158 , when his lands in Somerset were in the hands of the King (Rot. Pip., 5 Hen. Il., Rot. 3, memb. 2, in dorso; Pipe Rull Soc., vol. i., pp. 21, 22), and his lands in Somerset, Wiltshire and Dorset were also described as in the King's hands in the following year (Rot. Pip., 6 Hen. II., Rot. 3, memb. 2 ; Rot. 6, memb. i; and Rot. 7, memb 2, in dorso; Pipe Roll Soc., vol. ii., pp. 19, 41, 58). Fin., 9 John, memb. I3), and was dead in 1209. He had married Avicia, to whom he had assigned the manor of Pulle as dower, and of this she had seisin in 1216, probably on the death of her son (Rot. Litt. Claus., i 7 John, pt. I, memb. 4). The second William held the honour of Cameis, in Wales, and had letters of protection whiie residing in that country in 1210 (Rot. Litt. Pat., 10 John, memb. 1). He was dead in 1216, when the custody of his lands and heirs was granted to Fulke de Breaute (Rot. Litt. Claus., 17 John, pt. I, memb. III., memb. 8). She was dead in 1226 (ibid.), when her dower lands were delivered to Henry de Trubleville as guardian of her son Nicholas, heir to William, his father, as mentioned in the text.
    + Nicholas Filius Martin was father of another Nicholas, who should take the place of the Willelmus dominus Martyn of the text ; he was not, however, Lord Martin. his son being the first of the family to receive a writ of summons to the House of Lords. The second Nicholas died during his father's lifetime, he being succeeded by his grandson Willian, afterwards Lord Martin (Rot. Fin., Io Edward I., membs. 16 and 15 ).

    || Henry de la Pomeray (the second) paid $7 l .12 s .6 \mathrm{~d}$. as his scutage of Wales, and at the same time paid 200 marks for the fine of his lands in Devonshire, leaving 93l. 6s. 8d. due to the Exchequer, and in the following year, 1165, he paid 29l. 6s. 8d. in reduction of this debt (Rot. Pip., in Hen. II., Rot. 9, memb. ı, vol. viii., pp. 80, 8ı ; Ibid., 12 Hen. II., Rot. 7, memb. r, in dorso, vol. ix., p. 94). He confirmed a charter of Gullinus, his grandfather, and Henry, his father, to the Abbot of Valli, of the Church of Stokeleigh, which was claimed as a part of the dower of Rohesia, his mother (Abb. Placit., 15 John, Trinity, Rot. 17, p. 90). This confirmation must have been between in6i and in84, as there is also a confirmation of Bartholomew, Bishop of Exeter, during those years. He appears to have married, secondly, Rohesia, sister of Duin Bardolf, who afterwards became the wife of John Russell (Rot. de Obl., I John, memb. 9). Of this we have no direct evidence, but we find her and her husband disputing with Henry de la Pomeray (the third) wilh respect to the lands of Stokeleigh, Upottery, and Ashcombe, the jury finding, in 1200 , that Henry should hold Stokeleigh, and that John

The second son was probably Josce, who appears to have died without male issue, leaving two daughters, Hawisia, wife of Fulk FitzWarine, and Sibilla, married to - de Blugenay, who petitioned for the lands of Buckland and Corfton in Somerset, and Hartland in Devon, against Oliver de Dinham, in 1204. (Rot. Fin., 6 John, memb. 12). Oliver eventually became the representative of the family, and owned the Manor of Hartland, Buckland, and Corfton ('Testa de Nevill', vol. i, fol. 706, p. 162, fol. 837, p. 194). His eldest son, Galfrid de Dinham, who joined with his father Oliver and his uncle Galfrid in the endowment of Hartland Abbey (Rct. Pat., 5 Edw. IV., pt. 3, memb. 13, viae Oliver's ' Monasticon, Devon,' p. 207) appears to have died without issue in his father's lifetime, the next holder ot Hartland being Oliver de Dinham, as in the text, who was dead in 1220 (Rot.
