## Biology



If you are interested in cells, leaves, plants, and animals, then the Biology Department has the major for you. At Meredith a student is encouraged to explore many areas of the biological sciences including anatomy, zoology, genetics, and microbiology. A degree in biology can lead to such exciting careers as medicine, medical technology, teaching, dentistry, and research.


Business/Economics
