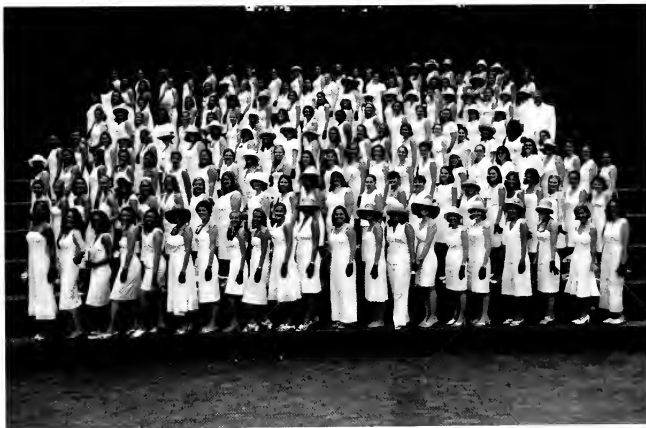

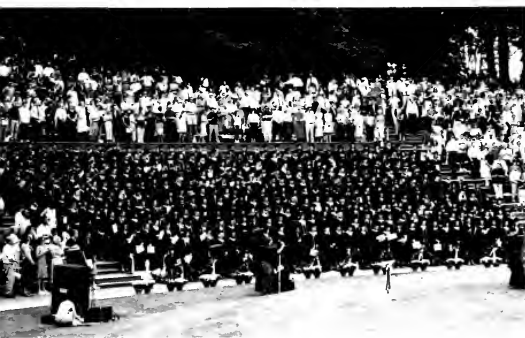


Commencement
