## Presentation

Out of the past have evolved all traditions and institutions. The old has always been the foundation upon which the new was built. During the years, Indiana has passed through various stages of evolution until now it is no longer a normal school based upon a two-year course, but a professional school of college rank offering a degree in education. This is Indiana's first year as a teachers college, and a new trend of development has begun. One of the most marked features has been the change in the yearbook. Due to this transitional period the name of the annual was changed from "The Instano", a grouping of the first few letters of each of the words "Indiana State Normal", to "The Oak". ## The Indiana Penn

In 102?. When the Indiana Penn first made its appearance, it was composed of one sheet that was typed when enough material from the composition classes was ohtained to make up the paper.

From 1023 (w1025. Mr. De Witt Ray, of the Indiana Evening Gazette, published the paper, and receised his remuncration from the proceeds of the sale of single copies.

This gear for the first time, the Penn has been published weekly. For the first time, aho, the subscription has been meluded in the registration fee. and each student now receives a copy of the paper.

In addition to campus. department, and organization news the Penn has such special columns as "What Others tre Doing." "Interviewing Reporter," "Pen Prick," "Peramals," As The larth Revolves," and "As The World Progreses," the last two of which interpret work esents from the point of view of geographs and history:

During the present vear. under the leadership of our president, Gertrude Lindquist, the constitution has been revised and modified to fit our present needs as the Deparment of Commerce of the Indiana State Teachers College.

Heetings are hed once a month and important business matters as well as current topics of the business world are dincussed. Toadd spice to these meetings, it is the custom to furnish a program for the entertamment of the members at the condusion of the meeting. During the early fall and spring. outings are held, and during the winter months certain daten are set aside for social gatherings.

## Pennsylvania State Commercial Contest

The Inter-County Commercial Contents are held in May. The state is divided into two sections. and a final content is hed in the Eant, and a linal contest in the II est.

Each county has a local orgamization of commercial teachers, the president of this organization acting as the director for the unit in contest matters. This commercial-teacher organization hodd regular meetings throughout the school year All maters are worked through this body and the state director.

Emphasis is placed upon the county as an honor unit. When the final honors are tabulated in May, a list of the counties is published, showing the county in the state that eamed the greatest number of homor points, the one that came second, etc. This has a tendency to bring the schools within the county closer together and deselop a professional pride and spirit. Individual winners are also anmounced and awarded medals. Pirst place in each event is awarded a gold medal; second place is awarded a siker medal; third place is awarded a bronse medal. Winners are chosen on a state-wide basis.

It is the duty of the director in each county to get the commercial teachers in the public schools acquainted with the contest movement and arrange for holding an inter-school elimination contest at some comsenient place some time in Aprit. At the time of this elimination contest, winners are chosen 10 represent the county in the final contest.

Fach county is allowed two entrants in the final contest for each esent. No one may enter the final contest except those who are certified by the directors as winners in the elimination contests. The plan is th give an opportunity to as many students as persible to participate. Participation should be the result of consistent daily excellency on the part of the students in the dases. This emphasizes the training of the many, rather than of the fews.

The Junior Chamber of Commerce of the State Teachers College sponsors the contest mosement and furmishes the awards for the final contest held in May. The Deparment of Commere furnishes suitable test materiah, for the elimination contests hedd in dpril.

The following event, were hed this year: First Year Shorthand, Second Year Sherthand, special shorthand. Typewriting, First and Second Year, and Speciat Bookkeeping, First and second bear, and Special Rapid Calculations, Drithmetic, and Busines Writing.
