There are many charocteristics by which a college is judged -the professional preparation and experience of its staff, the coliber of its student body, the facilities which it hos at its commond, and the intellectual climate of the institution. We ore confident that our staff at Indiana is a most competent one ond our odmissions policy guorontees c student body of high grade. While the focilities of the College ore not extensive enough for the size of the student body, those which ore now ovoilable are of good quality.
Mony foctors contribute to the intellectuol climate on a compus. Chief omong these is on academic freedom, unfettered by outside interference, which permits and encourages free inquiry and a discussion of controversial issues. To this is added a concern for and an interest in the cultural life which the College affords. In these respects Indiono prides
itself on the emphasis which it places on the importance of these intellectual standards.

All of these charocteristics go to make up the troditions of any institution of higher learning. The importance which Indiana has attached to these characteristics over o period of more thon 80 years has given it a rich background upon which there is based a sound progrom of teacher education for todoy's world. It has contended that teachers must be first of all educated people with a broad general educotion who utilize in their thinking the scientific method. The modern teochers college no longer bases its program on the techniques ond the methods inherent in a good teoching process. While it is still concerned with these, it is much more concerned with the more fundamental purpose of preparing o really educated person as a teocher.

The main purpose of the Home Economics Deportment is to prepare men and women for the responsibilities and problems of homemaking and family leadership. It also prepares the home economist for professional life. Through the laboratories and other home facilities ot the college, the student of home economics is able to put into practice the principles which are learned in the classroom. One of the interests of the Home Economics Department is the nursery school for children two and three years of age. Juniors in the department hondle the school cafeteria where commuters, Keith pupils, and the faculty eot lunch. There are also two home monogement houses where the students learn all aspects of homemaking including child core.

The music education curriculum is concerned with three major obligations to the college students at Indiana. The department offers o four-yeor program which qualifies the groduating student to teach and supervise public school music. Secondly, it provides four professionalized courses which ore requirements for the elementary division. Finolly, the deportment seryes the whole college through its four chorol ond six instrumental groups.

The governing body of the music education students is the music council. Four elected officers and eight representatives, one of these representotives selected from each of the music classes, moke up this organization. In addition to the regular formol concerts during the year by seven of the student music groups, other services are provided for general college needs: special music for Vespers, educational conferences, College Convocations, Swing Out, music shows for football games ond parades for the community.

There is no specialization in elementary as there is in the ather departments an campus. The teacher must be able to guide the physical, mental, and sacial development of children and furnish them with new learning experiences that are challenging as well as meaningful. Through class observations in their saphamare year, and practice teaching in their juniar and senior years, the future teachers in this field are intraduced to the problems that will face them upan graduation.
