OBITUARIES OF SECULAR PRIESTS, 1722-1783, &c.

CONTRIBUTED BY THE REV. RAYMUND STANFIELD.

The obituary here printed belongs to the Old Brotherhood, formerly the Old Chapter of England. It seems to have been originally commenced as a private obituary, kept by a priest, recording the deaths of his Brethren and noting with one cross, that he had said the usual mass for the repose of his soul. The writer seems to have been a chapter man or capitular as he marks three crosses after the name of a member of the Chapter, which signifies that he had said three Masses for him: a custom which still survives in the Old Brotherhood, the heir of the Old English Chapter.

There is quite enough internal evidence, with one explanation, to shew who was the writer during the first 39 years. In 1727, five years after the commencement, he records the death of his *cousin Christopher Tootel*; in 1733 of his *cousin Ed. Melling*; in 1745 of his *cousin John Melling*. Mr. Gillow supplies (*Cath. Rec. Soc.* vi., 112 *note*) the required explanation that the Rev. *John Sheperd* was related to the Tootels and Mellings. The handwriting, allowing for circumstances of writing, and especially for the hand of a man ageing from 44 to 83, is sufficiently similar. When this handwriting ceases in 1761 the first death is that of *Mr. Jn. Sheperd*, the Dean of the Chapter.

The Rev. William Walton, at the time Secretary of the Chapter, and later on Vic: Ap: of the Northern District, carries on the obituary from October 27th, 1761 until December 26th, 1779, and the next but one of the entries, after he ceased to write, records his own death, February 26th, 1780.

The upper part of the early pages of the MS. is burnt away, and this is the cause of some few deficiencies. There are some slight corrections and emendations in Mr. Walton's handwriting in the earlier portion, and the MS. has also been in the hands of Dr. Kirk. Mr. Walton has written on the second page—"This catalogue is but very imperfect, W. Walton."

The MS. consists of 48 pages without numbers, which are here supplied in square brackets, the fragments pasted on page [1] being cuttings from an old paper cover. The size is $6\frac{1}{2}$ by $4\frac{1}{4}$ inches. It is newly bound up in half morocco with a number of other MSS. entitled "Obituary of Priests, Twyford School Rules, and others."

“LAITY'S DIRECTORY” OBITUARIES, 1773-1839.

CONTRIBUTED BY JOSEPH S. HANSOM.

When James Peter Coghlan started his *Laity's Directory* in 1773, the name of only one secular priest, James Watson, appears as having died during the preceding year, the numbers increasing annually. Down to and including 1781 the obituaries are in Latin at the end of the Calendar, seemingly to remind secular priests when to remember their deceased brethren. In 1782 they appear in English as a special feature in the books, and some during the preceding year, the numbers increasing annually. In 1782 some regulars are added, a separating line alone distinguishing between the two classes, indicating that the lists had been supplied by different authorities. In the following year nuns and lay brothers are added. In 1787 three “Students in Philosophy” and a special notice of one layman, “Mr. John Francis Wade,” appear, the list concluding with the names of nine important members of the laity under the heading of “Nobility.”

In 1789 Coghlan inserted a notice, reproduced in these pages, undertaking to insert the names of the laity whose mortuary cards or “Bills” had been printed and delivered by him to the few Catholic chapels then existing about London. At a later period, as the chapels increased in number, he made a small increase in his charge. There was no charge made to religious at any time. The offer met with varying results, in the few following years; but the system was maintained, meeting with ultimate success. So it became a means of notifying to friends the deaths of Catholics and securing remembrances in prayer, not only amongst London people, but throughout the three Kingdoms, and even with foreigners in a few cases, where they had had associations with this country.

A notable feature in 1794, repeated later, is a list of exiled French clergy, said to be only part of 150 who had succumbed within little over a year after their sufferings and privations in French prisons. The hospitality accorded to these confessors of the Faith by England is for Englishmen cause for pride, tempered by gratitude for the foundation of many missions. Their edifying lives and apostolic labours in our country had immediate and enduring results.

Like most annuals of the sort, having served their purpose for the year, these Directories, commencing with a few pages $6\frac{1}{2} \times 3\frac{3}{4}$ inches in paper covers, would be treated as waste, and destroyed or neglected. In consequence, it has been no easy task to collect this nearly complete list. There is probably no complete set in existence, the best collections being deficient of several numbers. Living in the parish of the London Oratory I availed myself of that access kindly granted by the Fathers to transcribe the forty-three lists in their fine library, and was able to supplement these by ten more from those at the British Museum. I have to thank the Right Rev. Mgr. Ward for transcribing eleven more from the Old Hall collection; the Rev. Edwin Bonney one from Ushaw College Library; and the Rev. Joseph L. Whitfield one from Oscott College Library. The result is I am able to provide the whole series from 1773 to 1839, with the exception of that for 1774, under which date an explanation is given.

I am also indebted to the RR. Henry Norbert Birt, O.S.B. ; Fr. Thaddeus, O.F.M. ; Bede Jarrett, O.P. ; and the Superiors of several houses of religious women, for looking over the lists, and correcting defects and deficiencies ; and to the Rev. J. H. Pollen, S.J., for the loan of a list of ex-Jesuits, who were secularized during the early years covered by the lists. In very few cases are any alterations made. They are dealt with as far as possible in brackets, which are not much used in the original, except in the cases of priests’ seminaries. Anything like systematic correction of the names of the laity must have been futile.

It was suggested that the obituaries of priests might be extended by the list in the *Catholic General Directory* for 1850 ; but having made a transcript of them, and finding several mistakes, including one remarkable Benedictine accommodated with three deaths, it seemed prudent to omit all that list, using only a few additional notes from it in brackets. As the entries, if meagre in the *Laity’s Directories*, and subject at times to mistakes, were both for religious and laity, supplied near to the time of printing from authentic sources, it seemed inadvisable to mix with them doubtful obituaries.

Owing to occasional entries being inserted some years after deaths some confusion may seem to exist ; but as the Catholic Record Society has always made a point of giving full indexes, this confusion will be found to be more occult than real.

A LIST OF DEATHS which occurred during the confinement of the English in France, in which they experienced many severities, scanty allowances—deprived of communicating by letters with their friends, or receiving any assistance from them—their property confiscated for ever; and threatened with death, for no other cause than being born subjects of England.

It will be a satisfaction to hear that the Benedictin Dames of Paris, Pontoise, Dunkirk and Cambray, the Poor Clares of Graveline, Dunkirk and Rouen have been permitted to return to their native country, and have got establishments, except the latter.

The houses remaining in France, of women, are at Paris, the Austin Dames, Conceptionists, and the Irish Benedictin Dames of Ypres—Poor Clares of Aire—and some few clergy and religious men.

This Lady may be justly characterized as the model of Christian matrons. Bereft of her husband almost in the prime of her youth, she devoted a long widowhood to piety and beneficence. In her life she constantly "adorned the doctrine" which she professed: zealous and constant in all the practices of our holy religion, equally unostentatious and exemplary in her piety, faithful in the discharge of every social duty, mild and gentle in her temper, conciliating towards those of another communion.

Indeed it has often occurred to the writer of these lines, that the life of this virtuous Lady would afford any candid enemy of our religion, one of the best practical refutations of his prejudices, and a testimony of that faith which it was the desire of her heart to exemplify in act.

The charities of Lady Stanley were very ample, but ordinarily secret. She was a benefactress, who may be described in the Apostle's words "as unknown, yet known" (2 Cor. 6);—unknown to the widow whom she solaced, and the orphan to whom she was a parent, but known to HIM before whom alms hidden in the bosom of the poor ascend as a sweet memorial. Let us hope that Providence will raise up others to relieve the wants and distresses of those who have long prayed in behalf of "an unknown benefactor," but whose name they are likely now to discover to their sorrow, whilst we entertain the well grounded assurance, that their deceased friend has entered into the joy of her Lord.

CATHOLIC MEMORIAL INSCRIPTIONS.

CONTRIBUTED BY JOHN HOBSON MATTHEWS.

In view of the necessity for rescuing, before it is too late, the rapidly perishing memorials of the dead which can still be deciphered in churches, churchyards and cemeteries, there is perhaps no call for an apology on behalf of these notes of Catholic tombstone inscriptions. Societies have been formed for the preservation of all records of this nature, in England and Ireland, and the importance and urgency of such work is recognised on all hands. Time and weather, and the hands of that still more destructive agency, the ignorant Vandal, are causing the steady disappearance of old sepulchral memorials, especially those exposed to the open air. It must not be said that Catholics are backward in placing the graven records of their co-religionists in the security of print, and a first instalment of such Catholic inscriptions is here presented to the public. It is hoped to add further examples from time to time.

It is necessary to preface this first contribution with a few remarks on the whole subject, and as to the methods which have been followed in publishing these epitaphs. In the first place I must explain how the sepulchral monuments of Catholics are identified, how they are distinguished from those of their Protestant brethren who lie around them.

On mediæval tombs there is often no inscription; or when there is one, it consists of little more than the name of the deceased, the date of his death, and a brief prayer for the repose of his soul. The tomb was almost always marked by a long cross, its arms terminating in ornamental forms which varied according to the period. After the Reformation, the cross was ousted in favour of fat cherubs, arabesques, urns, inverted torches, and other Pagan emblems; the prayer for the dead was discontinued, and the epitaph expanded into an enumeration of the virtues of the deceased—until at length, at the beginning of the 19th century, it had grown into a prosy, ridiculous and irreverent panegyric, or a morbid, moralizing and often doggerel rhyme. The instinct of the Faith preserved Catholic tombs from these repellent absurdities; but the dominant Protestantism forbade the inscription of the ancient prayer for the departed, and even the cross, on sepulchral monuments. The irrepressible desire of the Catholic mind to distinguish, among the memorials of the dead, the resting-places of those "who have gone before us with the sign of the Faith and sleep in the slumber of peace" * soon led our persecuted forefathers to substitute a symbol which served their purpose. This was the sacred monogram IHS, the middle letter being surmounted by a cross indeed, but one of such insignificant dimensions as to escape the censure of the Puritan. This is in some cases accompanied by the three nails and surrounded by rays (as in the badge of the Society of Jesus); sometimes it is engraven within the outline of a heart—in allusion to the Sacred Heart of Our Lord. When the times improved, the monogram was incised in bolder letters, and the cross became larger; until at length, soon after Catholic Emancipation, the cross alone (usually in relief) began to figure on our gravestones. Recently, the introduction of certain Catholic practices within the Established Church has brought both the cross and the monogram into use on Protestant tombs; and so would render it im-

possible to distinguish the graves of Catholics, had the latter not reverted to the custom of inscribing a prayer for the soul of the deceased, or the equivalent initials R.I.P. Now that some Anglicans have taken to imitate us in this particular also, I know not to what device we must in future resort in order to mark out the graves of our dead from those of persons who die outside the visible fold of the Catholic Church.

As a matter of archaeological fact, it may be taken as a safe rule, that tombstones of a date prior to 1830, marked with the cross or sacred monogram, are those of "Roman" Catholics.

It should be noted, however, that not every old Catholic grave is so marked. There were times when, and places where, public bigotry was so strong as to prevent the smallest indication of Popery in church or churchyard. Much depended on the personal proclivities of the incumbent, on the numbers and influence of Catholics in the parish, or on the political circumstances of the time. There can be no doubt that this collection leaves unnoticed a large number of the memorials of our Catholic brethren, for lack of some distinguishing sign of the Faith in which they died.

In addition to the considerations stated above, the present contributor has used the special knowledge which (particularly in the case of South Wales and the Marches) he possessed of the local Catholics and their family history.

In some instances a stone commemorates both Catholic and Protestant members of a family; and in such a case all the names are here given, for the sake of the genealogical information involved.

A reference to earlier volumes of these Transactions will show the large Catholic population which yet existed in the Monnow Valley, and throughout North-east Monmouthshire and South-west Herefordshire, down to the beginning of the 19th century. Evans and Britton ("Description of the County of Monmouth," London, 1809) remark upon "the prevalency of Romish doctrines still manifested in Monmouthshire, and the comparatively large proportion of Roman Catholics among the inhabitants."

The collection of these inscriptions by the present contributor began in 1893, with those of the district in and around the town of Monmouth. As the particulars were not at first gathered with a view to their publication, he was in many cases content with recording the year of death—neglecting the month and day. Where it has not since been possible to supply the missing details, the inscription is here noted in the imperfect form, it being thought better to preserve it with its deficiency than not at all.

It has not been thought advisable to exclude a few Monmouthshire epitaphs which were supplied by me to Mr. J. A. Bradney's "History of Monmouthshire" (London; Mitchell Hughes and Clarke, 1904—1911). My reason is that the work referred to is a large and costly book, accessible only to the few, and also that the Catholic inscriptions are not there noted particularly as such, and are lost among those of non-Catholics.

As it was not practicable to reproduce in type the sacred monogram surmounted with the small cross over the middle letter, nor the large Latin cross of later times, the IHS is printed without its cross, and the large cross is merely referred to when it occurs. The Greek cross, which is sometimes met with, is duly represented.

This churchyard was long the chief burial-place for the Catholics of the northern part of Monmouth town.

Around the platform of the ancient churchyard cross is a group of Catholic tombstones, the most noteworthy being that of the Ven. John Kemble, priest, executed at Hereford for the Faith. His memorial is an oblong slab of the local red sandstone, very slightly raised above the ground, against the west side of the platform above-mentioned, with the head to the east. The slab has bevelled edges. Two incised lines extend for a short distance inwards from the top corners, and terminate in an outward spiral curve. Between the two is the inscription ; below which the space

is occupied by a "cross of Calvary," or long cross with three gradients, carved in outline. The slab is cracked across the middle, and was mended long ago with two iron clamps. To this grave pilgrimages have yearly been made since the martyr's death. On every such occasion it is decked with flowers. The inscription (badly re-cut a few years ago), is as follows:—

I K | Dyed the 22th | of August | Anno Do: 1679.

The second grave north of the above is a stone slab lying flat. The inscription is extremely faint. I deciphered it 22 August 1903. The words of the prayer are very roughly cut, apparently not by a mason. The family is Scudamore of Treworgan.

It commences with the initials TG, or TC, followed by three short lines of a mixed script, and concluding with what looks like the Arabic numerals 1714—which would be about the date of the monument. The whole is certainly the grave of a Catholic.

in 1720 found that this chapel was the ancestral burial-place of the Catholic
family of Croft, whose house was close by. It was also deposed that William

Prichard of Plas Ifor, gent., and the children of Robert Andrews of Skenfrith, gent., were lately buried there. Robert Needham* of Hilston, gent., stated that he (being 70 years of age) lived at the grange house called Llanfair Cilgoed † for 10 years prior to 1683. Llanfair was an ancient free chapel, and formerly belonged to Turberville Morgan, esq., grandfather of the defendant Mary Croft, widow. The said chapel, Mr. Needham further deposed, is halfway between the top of the mountain called Severney, and Trerhiw Cross. (Suit concerning the tithes of the chapelry of Llanfair in the parish of Llantilio Croseny. Excheq. Dep. 6 Geo. I., Mich. No. 9.)

No tombstones were found in the chapel when I visited it in 1903, but I picked up two fragments of stone with a letter on each, of the 17th and 18th centuries.

A modern Protestant chapel of ease was built, in 1843, a little distance away from the old one. In its cemetery is a headstone with the following inscription:—

In Memory of William, fourth son of Anne ‡ and Turbyville Williams, of this parish; who died 10 February 1886, aged 93 years.

Close to the north-west angle of the west porch is a plain and massive slab of grey stone. No inscription is now visible, and the stone is fractured across the middle. It bears faint traces of ornamental carving, and of the shaft of a long cross.

This is traditionally regarded by the local Catholics as the grave of the Ven. David Lewis, S.J., *alias* Charles Baker, who was executed at Usk in 1679 for alleged complicity in the bogus " Popish plot."

In 1889 I was told that this grave was still cleaned and decorated every year, by an aged Catholic Irishwoman of Usk, on the 27th of August—the anniversary of the martyrdom.

In the year 1904 the tradition had grown faint, and I took steps to renew it before it should expire. The following are portions of letters written by the Rev. Isidore Heneka, priest in charge of the mission of Usk, and the late Rev. Thomas Burgess Abbot, for over 50 years rector of the Monmouth mission :—

In a letter dated 24 Aug. 1901, to the late Mrs. Elizabeth Mary Theresa Stuart (*née* Addis), of Monmouth, the Rev. Mr. Abbot wrote as follows:—

Father Baker (or Lewis), S.J., martyred at Usk in August 1679 and buried in the church yard, where the present gravel walk passes from the street to the church door, and about 10 paces from the door of the church—as old Mr. McDonnell of Usk pointed out to me where, as a boy, he had seen the “square stone” marking the grave of the Popish Recusant. He told us also that he was pointed out the part of the “island” on the other side of the Usk, as the place of his martyrdom.

Usk, 18 Feb. 1904.

Dear Mr. Matthews,

* * * *

I am afraid that we shall never be at a certainty as to Ven. Father Lewis' grave. I have searched the whole churchyard to find a stone with an inscription, without result.

We can only go by tradition. The old people of Usk, Catholic and Protestant alike, point out the grave at the left corner next the porch. The stone is broken, but without any sign of inscription, right or left.

Dear Mr. Matthews,—Today I had removed the broken gravestone of the supposed grave of the Ven. David Lewis, S.J., near the west porch of Usk parish church. I found under it some broken pieces of a gravestone with the inscription “. April 18 aged 62” ; and a full-sized stone halfway under the priest's, with the words “Mary Low * of this town 1721. IHS.” I also found in the same spot a small bone which evidently got there when they made some alterations in the church and reburied remains taken from there. Strange that local tradition has not kept up the grave !

Closely contiguous with the martyr's supposed gravestone, on the north, is a similar recumbent slab having at the top a coat-of-arms in low relief, with esquire's helm, crest and mantlings, thus:—

Arms : A cross between four fleur-de-lis (Richmond of cos. Bucks. and Wilts.) *Crest* : A broken tilting-spear, the two pieces erect and slanting, respectively, both encircled by a ducal coronet.

“Here lyeth the body of William Richmond of Lanbadock, Gent., who Deceased 1728.”

The inscription is all but obliterated, and was deciphered with great difficulty.

It would appear from the evidence of Father Heneka's letter of 1905, that the stone traditionally regarded as that of the Ven. David Lewis was removed to its present site some years later than 1721.

J. H. Clark, “Reminiscences of Monmouthshire” (Usk, 1908), says : “Until 1830 the stone over the grave bore the words ‘Popish Recusant.’ They have now become effaced.” It is highly improbable that the martyr's epitaph contained such a description of him ; nor does it appear which stone Mr. Clark is referring to. Brother Foley's “Records of the English Province S.J.,” Vol. v., p. 929, says the holy priest's body was “interred in the porch” of the church. This is the statement made by most writers as to Father

David Lewis' resting-place. Mr. Robert Rickards, however, in his monograph on the "Church and Priory of Saint Mary, Usk" (London, 1904), says: "His remains were buried close to the west porch of the church, the stone over his grave, with the words 'Popish Recusant,' being visible until the year 1830."

After studying the question carefully for years, my own belief is that the martyr lies buried in the west porch, and that his gravestone was ousted from its original site sometime early in the 19th century when the pavement of the porch was repaired.

Probably this is the grave of a priest.

East of the chancel, close against the south corner, is a recumbent oblong stone. It has an incised border and a band of two incised lines across the middle. In the upper compartment is the sacred monogram with a rather large cross, and within the band are the initials and the date—but the latter is effaced. I discovered this stone 11 Oct. 1897, by removing the thick growth of grass and moss which covered it.

At foot of the south-west buttress of the tower is the ornamentally carved upper portion of a tombstone, of hard, blue slate. It was evidently used to mark the resting-place of an Irish Catholic, but none of the inscription appears. The design shows a classic building in three compartments. In the centre is a figure vested in mitre and chasuble, roughly sculptured in low relief—evidently Saint Patrick. On the dexter side is a figure with a curiously shaped head-dress, and over it, on a scroll, the legend "St. Cullum." On the sinister side is a female figure in nun-like garb, and the legend "St. Bridget." All three effigies are very rudely designed, and each has a large cross on the breast. The date of the work would be circa 1825.

These tombs are composed of a hard, white stone which gathers no moss but roughens, in about a century, in such a manner as to obliterate the inscriptions. The crosses on the stones are, curiously, all crutched crosses carved in relief within an oval. Most of them are easily visible from the street.

I am informed by that diligent antiquary, the Rev. Raymund Stanfield, of the Convent of the Good Shepherd, Hammersmith, that when, some years ago, at the rebuilding of the parish church, the bodies of Bishops Talbot, Douglas and Giffard were removed from their common vault for transference to Old Hall, Ware, only the remains of the first-named were precisely identified, they being encased in a leaden coffin. The other two prelates having been buried in wooden coffins which had fallen to pieces, their bones were mingled in the vault. The bones of a fourth person were found among them—a circumstance which puzzled the authorities. All these were buried in one vault at Old Hall, as four bishops; but Father Stanfield afterwards learned from some old document, that the unknown remains were those of Miss Ann Giffard, who, under the terms of her will, was buried with her illustrious uncle, Bishop Giffard. The ecclesiastical authorities have suffered the lady's body to rest with those of the three bishops at Old Hall.

Constitutions

1. *Name.* The name of the Society is "THE CATHOLIC RECORD SOCIETY."

2. *Objects.* The objects are the transcribing, printing, indexing and distributing to its members the Catholic Registers of Baptisms, Marriages, and Deaths, and other old Records of the Faith, chiefly personal and genealogical, since the Reformation in England and Wales.

3. *Management.* The affairs of the Society are managed by a Council consisting of twelve members and four honorary officers, viz., The Recorder, Bursar, Legal Adviser and Secretary—four forming a quorum. It has power to appoint a President and Vice-Presidents, its Chairman and Officers, and to fill vacancies on its own body, and has power to refuse or take away membership. One-third of the twelve members and all the honorary officers retire each year, but are eligible for re-election. Nominations of New Members of the Council must be sent to the Secretary fourteen days before the Annual Meeting. The representation and management are reserved to Catholic Members.

4. *Subscription.* The subscription is one guinea per annum, which entitles members to the publications for the year, but the names of any members whose subscription shall be two years in arrears will thereupon be removed from the Society, and not be readmitted until all arrears are paid.

Subscriptions are due on June 1 in each year, and no work is issued to any member whose subscription is unpaid. A member wishing to retire from the Society must intimate his intention to the Bursar or Secretary before the 1st day of June, or be held liable for his subscription for the ensuing year.

5. *Privileges.* The members are entitled to the Volume or Volumes printed for the year of subscription, no Volume being issued to any member whose subscription is unpaid. They may also, on prepayment, obtain back numbers (if in stock) on such terms as the Council may direct.

6. *Meetings.* An Annual Meeting is held in the month of June or July, of which at least seven days' notice is sent to all the members. At this meeting a report of the work of the Society, with a statement of the income and expenditure, is presented. This is issued together with the list of members and the Constitutions of the Society.

7. *Audit.* The Bursar's accounts are audited by a member of the Society appointed by the Council, at the close of the financial year, which expires on May 31.

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EIGHTH ANNUAL REPORT

IN common with all Catholics and many others, we have rejoiced in the promotion of our Patron, the Archbishop of Westminster, to the Sacred College. The Holy Father, in His solicitude for the Church in England, having divided the province into three, by the creation of metropolitan sees at Birmingham and Liverpool, the Council respectfully requested the Archbishops of the two new provinces, in which our work continues, to accept the position of Patrons. Both graciously acceded to this request, with expressions of approval of the Society's work and good wishes for its progress.

Volume IX was issued to members just before the annual meeting last year, and the important *Douay Diaries*, in two volumes, were issued later. Owing to continued difficulties in arranging the terms of agreements with printers, it was only in December that Volumes XII and XIII were placed out. The second has been proceeding more satisfactorily than the first. We have to ask the indulgence of members for delay with these two volumes, which are intended to be issued for the past year. Volume XIV for the current year is already in the press. Proofs are already coming in, and it is intended to start Volume XV in the autumn.

The demands on our space called for by special subjects, as *The Blue Nuns of Paris* and the *Douay Diaries*, cannot be matter of regret; but they have stood in the way of Registers, for which there have been appeals from many quarters. With two volumes of *Miscellanea*, we shall be able to deal with these again, and hope to satisfy genealogists, who are such an important source of strength to the Society.

Thanks are due to many helpers, as Mrs Seymour Spencer, who had nearly concluded the index of the *Douay Diaries*, when she felt compelled to give it up; and to Miss Stearn, who kindly undertook its completion. The Rev. Thomas Williams assisted Dr Burton with the *Douay Diaries*. The Rev. Raymund Stanfield has contributed papers to Volume XII; the Rev. Edward R. James, Mr R. Trappes-Lomax, and Mr J. B. Wainwright to Volume XIII. Mr Hunnybun is editing the papers of the English Poor Clares at Gravelines in Volume XIV. The assistance thus cordially rendered is of material value. Mr Andrew has for the eighth year audited the Bursar's accounts. Most important is Miss Calthrop's contribution of an old Recusant Roll, which she is now preparing for the press.

The output of work has necessarily lowered the financial balance, which is still responsible for the cost of two volumes for the past year. But, when these liabilities are met, there is every prospect of an adequate balance, whilst the anticipated revenue for the ninth year ought to cover its own expenditure, including two volumes as contemplated. The number of avail-

able complete sets of the volumes in stock is now reduced to fourteen; which, when exhausted, will leave only small numbers of any single volume. These will be required to make up incomplete sets and for special requirements. The initial policy of printing only what would be required, and so making the books valuable, as well as useful, has been fully justified.

The losses by deaths during the year have been seven. The Right Rev. William Gordon, D.D., second Bishop of Leeds, was followed, at a brief interval, by his brother, the Very Rev. William Watson Gordon, a Canon of that diocese. John Orlebar Payne, M.A., a diligent and careful antiquary and genealogist, and author of several reliable works, including *The English Catholic Non-Jurors of 1715*, was for some time a member of our Council. The Very Rev. John Norris, D.D., was the second Superior of the Birmingham Oratory in succession to the illustrious Cardinal Newman. We have also to regret the loss of Edward Maurice Greenway; Robert Beale Washbourne, founder of the firm of Catholic publishers; and the Very Rev. Daniel Iles, L.D., Canon of Clifton diocese.

We regret the resignations of five members; and, still more, the necessity of having to remove one name under Constitution 4.

The new adherents to our work number fifteen, including the Right Rev. Dr Cowgill, Bishop of Leeds, who continues the membership of his predecessor. The nett result is a gain of two members, making the names on the Roll three hundred and ninety. An increase like last year's would have carried us past four hundred; and we rely on the co-operation of members and well-wishers to attain such a desirable result for the ninth year.

Mr Burke, Norroy King of Arms, has been a member of the Council from the beginning, and has often given assistance that could not otherwise have been obtained; but it was not convenient to him to attend Council meetings. He has resigned his seat in consequence, and has been elected a Vice-President of the Society, thus we can still count on his valuable assistance. The vacancy on the Council has been filled by Alderman Smith, of Barrow-in-Furness, a Founder, who has always taken warm interest in our work, and has been organising a system for obtaining the Catholic Registers of Lancashire for our pages. This is likely to keep us well in touch with Lancashire, its men, and matters.

The Council has accepted, with regret and a cordial expression of thanks for all his work, Major Skeet's resignation of the office of Hon. Secretary, which he has held for two years and a half, and which was rendered none the easier by the fact that he was living at a considerable distance from London. The vacancy has been filled by the election of Mr G. F. Engelbach, a Founder, who was Hon. Bursar of the Society during the year of its foundation.

The members of Council retiring by rotation are the Rev. Bede Jarrett, O.P.; the Marquis of Ruvigny; the Very Rev. Canon Sutcliffe; and Dr Williamson. They are eligible for re-election.

TRANSACTIONS OF THE EIGHTH ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

The Eighth Annual General Meeting was held at Archbishop's House, Westminster, by permission of his Eminence the Cardinal-Archbishop, on Tuesday, 2nd July, 1912, at 5-30 p.m. His Grace the Duke of Norfolk, the President, took the chair.

There were also present the Very Rev. Prior Higgins, C.R.S.; the Very Rev. Canon Wyndham, O.S.C.; the Rev. Bede Jarrett, O.P.; the Rev. J. H. Pollen, S.J.; Miss M. M. C. Calthrop; the Marquis of Ruvigny; the Hon. Alexander Wilmot; Mr R. Trappes-Lomax; Mr F. A. R. Langton; Mr J. S. Hansom; Mr L. C. Lindsay (Hon. Bursar); and Mr George F. Engelbach (Hon. Secretary).

The press was represented by the *Tablet*, *Catholic Herald*, *Catholic Times*, and *Universe*.

Messages of regret were received from His Eminence the Cardinal-Archbishop, the Right Rev. Monsignor Ward, and the Rev. Dr Burton (all three engaged for the speech day at Old Hall College); the Very Rev. Canon Sutcliffe, the Rev. J. Gilbert Dolan, O.S.B., Mrs John Humble, Mr Brierley (Hon. Secretary of the Lancashire Parish Register Society), Mr Gillow (Hon. Recorder), Mr Glencross, Mr Hunnybun, Mr C. Munich, K.S.G., Mr R. D. Radcliffe, Major Skeet, Alderman Smith, the Mayor of Barrow, Mr Spedding, Major Charles Vaughan, and Dr Williamson.

The President referred briefly to the different paragraphs of the report, and said that the value of the work done witnessed to the determined efforts of the Society, despite the difficulties besetting its task. Disclaiming to speak as an expert himself, his Grace said the general opinion was that the work was most creditable and desirable. The progress in the membership was not large, due to some extent to an increase of deaths over last year, when it was much below the average. He hoped the Society would long continue its useful work, and proposed the adoption of the report and balance-sheet, which showed a sound financial position.

The Hon. Alexander Wilmot, in seconding, said we were trying to find out the truth from the mass of misstatements that had been made. The results of researches made were most interesting to Catholics, and he instanced that even Dr Challoner in some few cases was not quite accurate. The more such records were printed the more sound ground was there for sifting the truth from the chaff, and so founding true history. Eleven volumes had already seen the light, whilst four more were in progress or in contemplation. This, coupled with the official statement of so few volumes remaining on hand, testified to an increasing demand. He had been profoundly touched by the many evidences produced of the sufferings of confessors of the Faith.

At the desire of the President, Mr Hansom explained that from the beginning of the Society, eight years back, the Council started with the deliberate intention of making the works valuable, giving members the utmost value possible for their subscriptions. The numbers of volumes was therefore limited. Now the report shows that only

fourteen complete sets remain. These must soon be exhausted ; and when volumes begin to be marked off as "out of print," their value will be enhanced.

His Grace remarked that was matter for congratulation to the Society, and to the owners of the books. He put the resolution, which was carried.

Mr R. Trappes-Lomax proposed the re-election to the Council of the Rev. Bede Jarrett, O.P., the Marquis of Ruvigny, the Very Rev. Canon Sutcliffe, and Dr Williamson for the next three years. He described the absence of the representatives of many ancient Catholic families from membership of the Society as conspicuous and deplorable. Many were descendants of those who had helped largely in the formation of Catholic England, and their names appeared constantly in the records printed by the Society. Yet they were absent from the roll ! He supposed it must be left to their own consciences. An examination of the roll showed, after the elimination of libraries, communities, clergy of all grades, converts, and some well-wishers amongst Protestants, a poor representation of little more than two hundred laymen from England and Wales !

The Very Rev. Canon Wyndham, in seconding the re-elections, expressed his great pleasure with the steady production of the useful, interesting, and ornamental books supplied to the members. Such work called for renewed confidence in the Council by the re-election of the retiring members.

The Duke of Norfolk put the motion, and it was resolved accordingly.

The Very Rev. Prior Higgins said it was his pleasing duty to propose a vote of thanks to the Council and officers. They had only to look at the report to realise the zeal and discretion exercised. He hoped the words of Mr Trappes-Lomax might have the effect of waking up "the sleeping partners," as he might call them. A hint to our own people was not sown on the barren rock. Deploring all this, he rejoiced in the generosity of converts. The Catholic Record Society was doing a much-needed work in unearthing and presenting the facts regarding the history of the penal times.

Mr Trappes-Lomax seconded, and, on its being carried, Mr. Lindsay, Hon. Bursar, returned thanks. He would like to see a further increase in the public libraries, and was glad to announce that the Public Library of New South Wales had just joined. The Rev. J. H. Pollen said that, as a second member of the Council, he would like to return his thanks, and to thank those outside the Council who had helped with volumes and papers,* especially the contributor of the old Recusant Roll. He was glad to see that Ireland had followed suit in the work of the Catholic Record Society by founding a similar Society. He deprecated the criticism of Dr Challoner's accuracy.

The Meeting concluded with expressions of thanks to the Duke of Norfolk for presiding, and to the Cardinal-Archbishop for granting the use of the room.

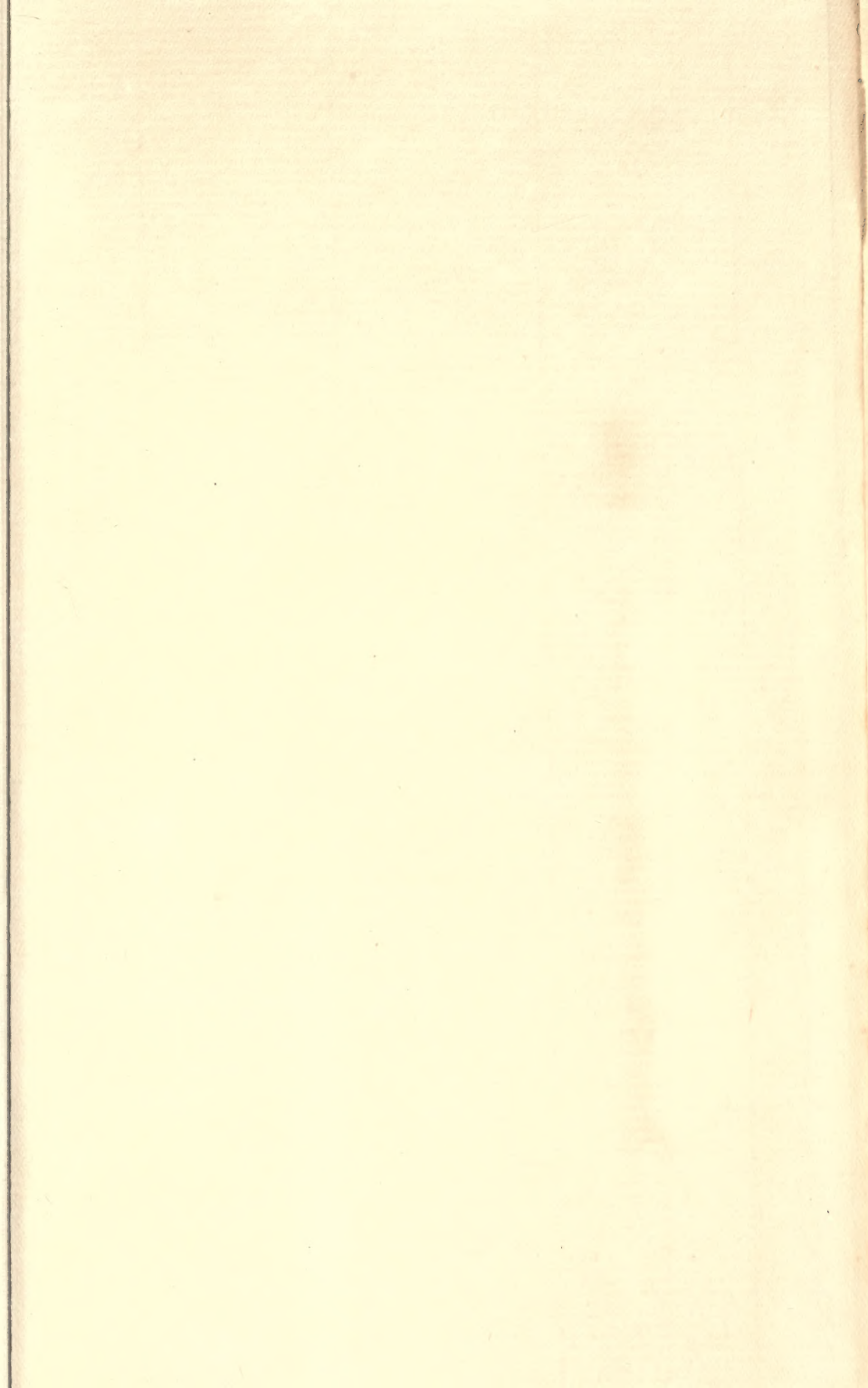
VOLUMES were posted to those entitled to them—IX on 4th July, 1911, and X with XI on 29th Dec., 1911.
