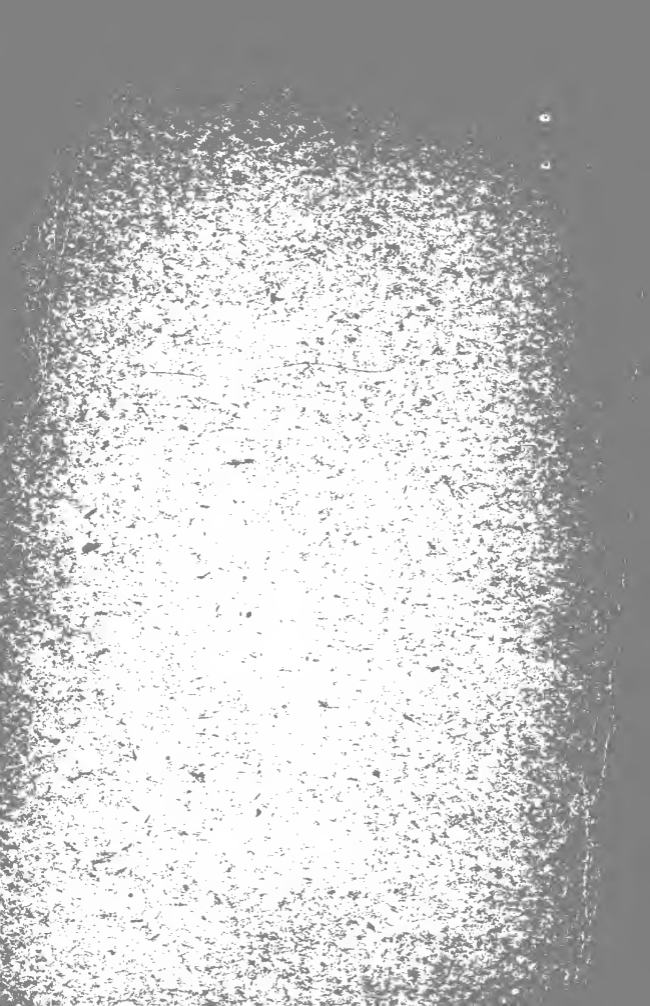

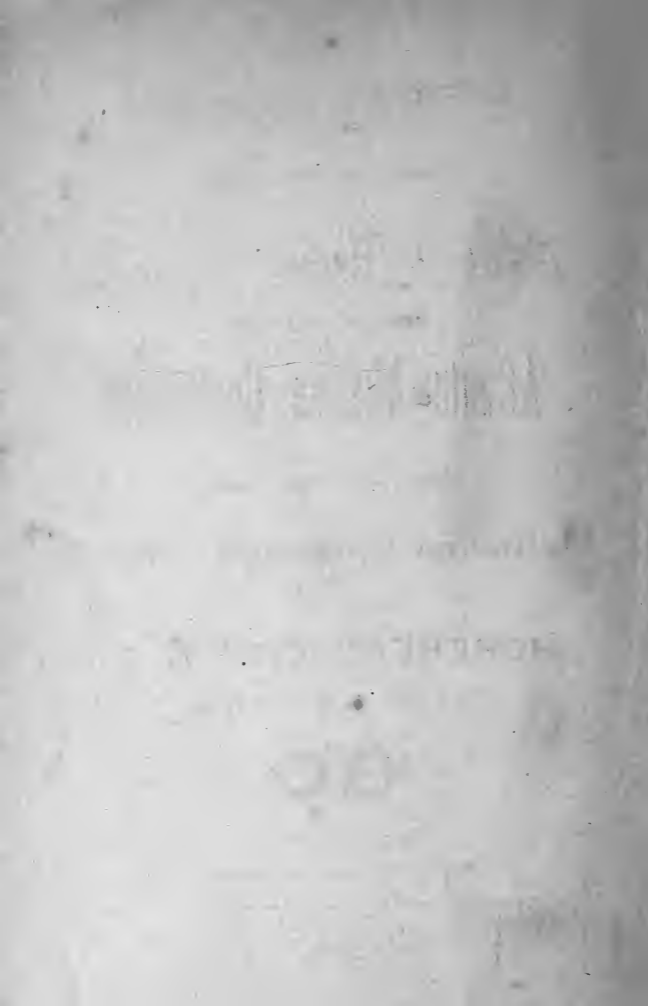

DAILY PROCEEDINGS.

FIRST DAY.

Thursday Morning, October 18, 1906.

The Tenth Annual Session of the Atlantic Mission Conference of the Methodist Episcopal Church, convened in Franklin Memorial Church, Morehead City, N. C., Thursday morning, October 18, 1906., Bishop William Burt, D. D., Presiding.

The Bishop announced hymn, number 338, after the singing of which, M. L. Chappell led in prayer. The Bishop then read St. Luke, 24th Chapter, beginning with the 13th verse. He then addressed the Conference in a very interesting manner. Dr. Graham led in prayer; hymn No 183 was sung and the Sacrament of the Lords Supper was administered.

The Secretary of the last session being absent, T. S. Davis called the roll and the following named responded: M. L. Chappell, T. S. Davis, W. Q. A. Graham, J. A. Hudson, J. J. Lewis, W. H. Luther, U. S. White. — Probationers: D. D. Baily, W. C. Baines, W. R. Woodle, A. B. FitzGerald.

On motion of W. H. Luther, T. S. Davis was elected Secretary and U. S. White, Assistant.

On motion of M. L. Chappell, J. A. Hudson was elected Statistical Secretary and D. D. Baily Assistant.

On motion of Dr. Graham. W. H. Luther was elected Conference Treasurer.

Rev R. H. Willis, Pastor of the M. E. Church, South, Morehead City, N. C., was introduced to the Confer-

On motion of Dr. Graham the time for meeting was fixed; tomorrow at 2.30 P. M. and on Saturday at 9.30 A. M.

Bishop Burt called the attention of the Conference to the "World Wide Prayer League" and appointed T. S. Davis to secure the literature and distribute it among the various pastors, and to encourage co-operation.

On motion, G. W. Stancill was appointed to solicit subscriptions to the Methodist Review.

Bishop Burt spoke of Bishop Bashford, explaining why he could not attend our session.

Question 13 was asked. W. Q. A. Graham was called. His character passed and he reported the work in the Conference as being in a prosperous condition.

The effective Elders were called. W. H. Luther, J. J. Lewis, M. L. Chappell, and T. S. Davis made report of their work.

On motion of Dr. Graham the Conference adjourned. The Bishop pronounced the Benediction.

SECOND DAY.

Friday, October 19, 1906.

Conference met at 2,30 P. M. and after devotional services led by W. H. Luther, was called to order by Bishop Burt.

The Journal of yesterday morning was read and approved.

The draft on the Book Concern for \$85., our share of the dividends, was on motion. ordered drawn, and placed in the hands of the Conference Treasurer.

On motion of Dr. Graham, D. D. Baily was elected to fill the vacancy in the Trustees of the Conference Relief Fund caused by the absence of C. M. Levister.

On motion of J. J. Lewis, G. W. Stancill was appointed to collect for the Book Concern.

Question 5, "Who are continued on Trial?" was called. A. B. FitzGerald reported his work; the Examiners made report as to his studies in the first, second and third year, and on motion he was continued on Trial in the Studies of the Fourth Year.

W. C. Baines was called. His character passed and he reported his work. On motion of W. Q. A. Graham he was continued in the studies of the first year.

W. R. Woodle was called, his character passed, he reported his work, and on motion of the Superintendent he was continued in Studies of the First Year.

J. H. Garris was called. The Superintendent represented him, he being absent on account of sickness, On motion he was continued in the Studies of the Third Year.

Question 7, "Who have been Admitted into Full Membership" was called. The Examiners reported in the case of D. D. Baily, the Superintendent made proper representation and the Secretary reported the filing of the required answers to the questions concerning debt and tobacco. The Bishop addressed him concerning the office and work of the ministry, setting forth the importance of entire consecration, and asked the Disciplinary questions, to which satisfactory replies were given. On motion he was admitted into full membership, he having been previously ordained Deacon. He was promoted to studies of the fourth year.

Question 8, "What Members are in Studies of the Third Year?" was taken up. J. A. Hudson reported his work at Parmele, his Character passed, the Examiners reported, and he was advanced to the Studies of the Fourth year.

U. S. White's Character passed, he made his report and was continued in the studies of the Fourth year.

Question 12 was called, "Who have been Elected and Ordained Elders?" (a) As Local Deacons.

On motion of W. H. Luther, W. J. Plint was elected to Local Elders Orders.

Question 4 was called, "Who have been Received on Trial?" (a) In Studies of The First Year.

The Examiners reported favorably concerning W. J. Plint and he was admitted on trial.

Question 22, "Who are the Supernumerary Preachers?" was asked, and J. B. Bridgers was continued in the Supernumerary relation.

On motion of T. S. Davis the Conference requested

that C. M. Leviser be appointed Assistant Editor of the Baltimore Methodist.

Question 30, "Where shall the next Conference be held?" was called and invitations from Harkers Island, Marshallberg, Pinners, Va. and Pates were presented. Harkers Island and Marshallberg were subsequently withdrawn in favor of Pates and on the vote between Pinners and Pates, Pinners was selected.

On motion the Conference tendered a vote of thanks to Pates for their invitation.

Bishop Burt led the Conference in prayer, after which the Doxology was sung, and the Benediction pronounced.

THIRD DAY.

Saturday, October 20, 1906.

Conference met at 9.30 A. M. After devotional exercises, conducted by D. D. Baily, Bishop Burt called the Conference to order.

The Journal of yesterday was read and approved.

The Standing Committees submitted reports and, on motion in each case, they were adopted. See Reports.

On motion of M. L. Chappell the President of Graham Collegiate Institute was authorized to assess the various charges for the support of that Institution.

On motion of J. J. Lewis the Trustees of the Conference Relief Fund were instructed to investigate the securities held by the Trustees and to call in all outstanding loans as soon as it can be done.

Bishop Burt addressed the Conference on "The kind of Preachers the Church needs" He urged

the importance of living holy lives and devoting all of the time to the work of the ministry,

On motion of Dr. Graham a resolution appreciative of the presence and sympathy of Bishop Burt was adopted by a rising vote.

On motion a vote of thanks tendered Dr. Graham, who has offered his resignation as Superintendent, for his wise counsel, loving influence, and life example, while Superintendent of this Conference.

On motion of Dr. Graham a vote of thanks to the good people of Morehead City for their splendid entertainment of the Conference was adopted.

On motion Conference took a recess until 5 o'clock P. M.

At 5, P. M. Conference was opened by singing hymn No. 1. J. J. Lewis led in prayer. The Statistical Secretary read his report, which was adopted.

The Treasurers report was also adopted.

On motion of Dr. Graham the usual plan for printing the minutes was adopted.

On motion of J. J. Lewis, Dr. Graham and the Secretary of the Conference were authorized to have the minutes printed.

The following members of the Board of Trustees of The Graham Collegiate Institute were elected to fill vacancies. Term to expire in 1909, W. Q. A. Graham, W. H. Luther, Stephen M. Davis.

John A. Hudson and W. J. Plint were elected in the places of A. B. FitzGerald and Dr. D. S. George resigned.

On motion of J. A. Hudson the pastor at Pinders was authorized to travel beyond the bounds of the

Conference to solicit aid for the church at that point.

On motion of W. H. Luther the Conference adjourned sine die. Doxology was sung, and the benediction was pronounced by the Bishop.

SUNDAY SCHOOL UNION AND TRACT SOCIETY.

We are deeply impressed with the importance and magnitude of the work of this Society.

Its report shows it to be a home and foreign missionary society giving aid to our missionaries in all foreign lands and assisting in the development of our church in new communities in the South and West. It is the forerunner of the Church Extension Society. Sowing the seed and forming the first nucleus of organization, it creates a demand for church building.

We would urge, in the strongest terms, that the literature published by our Book Concern be used in all our Sunday Schools. We regard it little less than church disloyalty to permit our Sunday School supplies to be displaced by those of another publisher. There are no publications better than ours and no first class literature cheaper. We therefore urge our pastors to see that our schools are supplied with our literature and request Presiding Elders to call special attention to the question in our discipline to be asked at the Quarterly Conference.

We are convinced also that the Tract may be made a great agency of usefulness in connection with all our churches. Pastors could use them with great effectiveness in their pastoral work. The proper use of

wisely selected Tracts would accomplish great and they could be used with advantage in the instruction of our youth.

Pastors by giving the matter proper consideration, might open the door of usefulness to many, in the tactful use of Tract literature, who would otherwise render little christian service.

We therefore recommend —

1st. That every pastor send for a copy of the report of the Society, also for a catalogue of its publications, and inform himself regarding the great work being done and thus be able to explain it fully to the people.

2nd. That the collection for the Tract Society be taken in all our churches and an earnest effort be made to greatly increase these collections.

3rd. That pastors consider the various uses of the Tract in their pastoral work and obtain a carefully chosen selection of Tracts to the value of one-half the Annual Collection and purchase more as they are able to make helpful use of them.

BOARD OF EDUCATION.

The expanding work of the Board of Education is cause for gratitude. We note with pleasure the report of the past year. Nearly two thousand students have been assisted to attend the institutions of the Church, more than \$108,000 being distributed among our institutions for the purpose of aiding worthy young men and women.

All our pastors should see that the program prepared by the Board of Education be used on Children's Day.

We cordially commend the work of the Board in the emphasis which it places constantly upon high christian ideals of education.
