DAILY PROCEEDINGS,

FIRST DAY.

Tuesday Morning, October 22, 1907.

The Eleventh Annual Session of the Atlantic Mission Conference convened in Pinners Point Methodist Episcopal Church, Pinners, Va., at 10 A. M. October 22, 1907, Bishop L. B. Wilson in the chair. After singing 'Pass Me Not, Oh Gentle Saviour!' and prayer by the Bishop, the Sacrament of Our Lord's Supper was administered, Dr. J. H. Howard, W. H. Luther and T. S. Davis assisting.

T. S. Davis, the Secretary of the last session, called the roll to which the following responded; T. S. Davis, D. D. Baily, W. Q. A. Graham, J. A. Hudson, W. H. Luther.— Probationers; W. C. Paines, A. B. FitzGerald, W. J. Plint.

On motion, W. J. Plint was elected Secretary and appointed D. D. Baily as his Assistant.

On motion, J. A. Hudson was elected Statistical Secretary and appointed Dr. Graham as his Assistant.

On motion, A. B. FitzGerald was elected Conference Treasurer and appointed W. H. Luther as his Assistant.

On motion, the Rules of Order governing our General Conference were adopted for use during this Session.

The 13th Question was called and the following examined:

T. S. Davis, Presiding Elder, his character passed, his report read and filed. (See Reports.)

W. Q. A. Graham, his character passed, his Educational Report was reserved.

M. L. Chappell, his character passed, his report reserved account of absence.

J. J. Lewis, his character passed, the Presiding Elder made report of his work.

W. H. Luther, his character passed, verbal report of work rendered.

The 5th Question was called and the following examined:

W. J. Plint, his character passed, report read, the Examining Committee made report and on motion he was continued on Trial and advanced to the Studies of the Second Year.

W. C. Baines, his character passed, report made and on motion he was continued on Trial in Studies of the First Year.

W. R. Woodell, his character passed, the Presiding Elder represented his work and on motion he was continued on Trial in the Studies of the First Year.

J. H. Garris, his character passed and the Presiding Elder represented his work.

A. B. FitzGerald, his character passed, report made and on motion he was continued in the Studies of the Fourth Year with credit of examination.

The 9th Question was called and the following examined:

D. D. Baily, his character passed, he made report and on motion he was continued in the Studies of the Fourth Year with credit of examination.

The 10th Question was called and the following examined:

J. A. Hudson, his character passed, he made his report, the Examining Committee reported and on motion he was elected to Elder's Orders.

Question 14 was called and U. S. White was reported as Transferred to the Central Tennessee Conference.

On motion we adjourned to meet at 2 P. M. Benediction by the Bishop.

FIRST DAY. (Afternoon Session.)

Conference called to order by Bishop Wilson, singing of 'Blessed Assurance, Jesus is Mine' and prayer by D. D. Baily.

The Minutes of the Morning Session were read, corrected and approved.

On motion A. B. FitzGerald was received into full

connection upon the satisfactory answers to the usual questions.

On motion our draft on the Methodist Book Concern was ordered paid to the Treasurer of the Conference Relief Fund.

Question 22 was taken up and J. B. Bridgers was called, his character passed and he was continued in the Supernumerary Relation. On motion he was requested to Locate at the next Session of the Conference.

Question 30 was called. On motion Elizabeth City, N. C. was selected as the place for holding our next Conference. On motion a vote of thanks was tendered Parmele, Pinners and Ocracoke for their kind invitations.

Question 4 was called and after the report of the Examining Committee, on motion A. Burgess, L. N. Booth, W. F. Graham and E. Johnson were received on Trial in the Studies of the First Year.

The 12th Question was called and on motion G. F. Sever was elected to Local Elder's Orders.

The 21st Question was called and on motion the Elders orders of Alonzo Quick, coming from the Methodist Protestant Church were recognized.

Question 11 was called and on motion A. Burgess, L. N. Booth, W. F. Graham and E. Johnson, having answered the questions relative to debt and tobacco to the satisfaction of the Conference, were elected to Deacon's Orders under Missionary Rule.

The 5th Question was called and on motion J. H. Garris was continued on Trial in the Studies of the Third Year.

Questions 15—16—17—18—19—20. None.

M. L. Chappell, J. H. Garris and G. F. Sever made pastoral report.

On motion, the Bishop was requested to appoint C. M. Levister to the Editorial Staff of the Baltimore Methodist.

Dr. Graham read his report as President of The Graham Collegiate Institute.

On motion the following resolution was adopted:

Resolved; That we require all future examinations in this Conference to be in writing.

On motion we adjourned to meet at 9.30 A. M. Wednesday the 23rd.

SECOND DAY.

Wednesday Morning, October. 23, 1907.

Conference met at 9.45, A. M. Devotional services were conducted by A. B. FitzGerald, after which the order of business was resumed. The Journal of the session yesterday afternoon was read, corrected and approved.

The Assistant Secretary read a communication regarding the Episcopal Fund asking that we raise \$39. as our apportionment. A Memorial was also read from the New York Conference relative to an elective

Presiding Eldership. On motion we concur with the Memorial. The following reports were read, and on motion in each case, were adopted. Board of Education, F. A. & S. E. Society, Temperance, Home Missions and Church Extension, Foreign Missions, State of the Church, and the apportionment of money to the various charges.

After most appropriate remarks by the Bishop on the needful threefold character of the pastor of today, viz; to be at his best always, in body, mind and spirit, and further remarks upon the doctrines of the Church A. B. FitzGerald was received into full membership.

The reports of the Statistical Secretary, and Treasurer were read. The Treasurer of the Conference Relief Fund reported \$170.00 remaining in the Treasury. On motion the usual method providing for the publication of the minutes, viz; \$2.00 from each member, probationer, and supply, was adopted.

On motion it was ordered that the printed minutes be our official journal.

On motion we adjourned to meet at 1.30 P. M. The Benediction was pronounced.

SECOND DAY. (Afternoon Session)

Conference was called to order by Bishop Wilson. After singing 'Jesus lover of my Soul' and prayer by the Bishop, the minutes of the morning session was read, corrected and approved.

The Chairman of the Conference Relief Fund made remarks upon the condition of this fund, and several members made application for payment of deficits in their salaries, but on motion, the claims were not al-

lowed. On motion the amount held by the Trustees is to be placed in the bank. J. A. Hudson was elected as a member of this Board.

T. S. Davis, C. M. Levister, L. W. Nelson were elected Trustees of The Graham Collegiate Institute. Term to expire in 1910.

On motion, the endorsement of the Conference was given to Dr. Graham who wishes to travel beyond the bounds of this Conference in the interest of our Conference School at Marshallberg.

On motion, also, endorsed the appeal of the pastor Pinner's Charge in behalf of the payment of the debt upon this church.

On motion the Conference endorsed the application of the Marshallberg Charge for a donation of \$1000.00 from the Board of Church Extension.

On motion W. Q. A. Graham, A. B. FitzGerald, D. D. Baily, Everett H. Davis, Benjamin T. Willis, Thos. R. Nelson, were appointed as the Conference Board of Church Extension.

On a motion of Dr. Graham, a vote of thanks was offered. Bishop Wilson by a rising vote

A vote of thanks was also tendered the citizens of Pinner's for courtesies to the Conference.

Bishop Wilson introduced Dr. McLane, representative of the Foreign Missionary Society, who spoke briefly on the subject of Foreign Missions.

The Presiding Elder read the Missionary appropriations for next year.

The minutes were read and adopted. The Bishop read the appointments, and, on motion, the Conference adjourned "sine die."

REPORTS.

STATE OF THE CHURCH.

WHEREAS: Your Committee, having carefully considered the work of this Conference; the geographical position of its charges; the financial strength and probable growth of the churches. the meager support of the pastors and the increased cost of living: And Whereas, we have much unoccupied territory, and many open doors awaiting our entrance; RESOLVED, That we recomend such revision of the existing pastoral charges os willlessen the number by the absorption of two or more of the existing number, thus giving more financial strength to the remainder.

RESOLVED, furthur, that, in the judgment of your committee we should develop a policy of expansion. If we have any work to do in this field, it is both right and needful that we enter territory hitherto unoccupied by ourselves. Never in the history of this country has so much advance been made along material lines. Immense corporations have projected schemes for developments that will revolutionize every bhase of the domestic life of this region.

Your committee, in looking out upon this expanding, restless, rushing tide of progress now spreading over this southland desire to see a Methodist Episcopal Church planted in close touch with every whirling mill, and a spire of our own pointing heavenward alongside of every belching smoke stack within our borders.
