FORMATION.

VETERANS' RIGHTS UNION.

"The object of this Union is, under the auspices of the G. A. R., to secure to those who served under the Government of the United States during the late war, the rights and privileges guaranteed to them by Sections 1754 and 1755 of the Revised Statutes of the United States," as also § 3, Chapter 287, Laws of 1876.

"SEC. 1754.—Persons honorably discharged from the Military or Naval Service by reason of disability resulting from wounds or sickness incurred in the line of duty, SHALL be preferred for appointments to civil offices, provided they are found to possess the business capacity necessary for the proper discharge of the duties of such offices."

SEC. 3, Chapter 287, Laws of 1876, is in part, as follows: "Provided, that in making any reduction of force in any of the Executive Departments, the head of such Department SHALL retain those persons who may be equally qualified who have been honorably discharged from the Military or Naval Service of the United States, and the widows and orphans of deceased Soldiers and Sailors."

PLAN OF ORGANIZATION.

Each Post in a county or city to elect one member of an Executive Committee¹ which Committee, when elected, are to constitute the Executive Committee of the Veterans' Rights Union of said county or city with full power.

No member of the Executive Committee shall hold or, under any circumstances accept, during the term for which they are elected, any position of profit or trust under the National Government.

COMRADE :

How expressive the word, to ears attentive. How important in results it made the key note of our efforts, each for the other, united as in the years gone by in comradeship, for principle and the Veterans' rights.

The discrimination in appointments to and removals from office and employment under the Government as against the Veteran, has become notorious. "Political necessity" has been assigned as the cause for removals, and "Political service" has been made the criterion by which men were judged in their applications for employment. The "Empty Sleeve," the sacrifice of limb and health in the army, the ability to successfully perform the duties of the position for which they were applicants, were not considered; an honorable discharge from the Military or Naval Service by reason of disability resulting from wounds or sickness incurred in the line of duty was powerless to save when removal threatened, and of no avail when "necessity, which knows no law," made such men applicants for place in the service of the Government, excepting only when they were of some consequence as political factors; who could believe when they were closed, that the Veterans would be neglected or forgotten; and told within twenty years, that the "Soldier business was played out." This was not the fault of the people, who have ever held these men in grateful remembrance because of the benefits they enjoy as a result of the sacrifice made by the Veteran, but it was the result of forgetting that "Eternal Vigilance is the price of liberty," through which, those who controlled in political life, assumed to own and dispense as their personal property and perquisites public office and employment, that which the law intended and declared should go to those who, in the dark days of the war, stood between the Country and her dishonor.

Everywhere throughout the Union, the Statute (SEC. 1754) was entirely ignored, or through non-enforcement became virtually a dead letter.

It was under these conditions and the necessity which existed that something should be done, that the Veterans' Rights Union was called into existence, through a Convention of Delegates from the Posts of the Grand Army in this State, and that to-day it is thoroughly organized in Pennsylvania and New York.

Our object is plainly stated and our declaration of principles are :

FIRST. " We ask a fair construction, consideration and enforcement of section 1754, Revised Statutes of the United States ; and Sec. 3, chapter 287, laws of 1876 (in so far as it applies,) by all who have the power of appointment or removal under the Government, from the Executive of the Nation down to the lowest subordinate in authority ; whenever and wherever an applicant, employe or appointed officer comes within the provisions of either of these laws.

SECOND. An amendment of the Statute Law, so that the preference therein contained shall extend to, and cover, all those who were honorably discharged from the Military or Naval Service of the United States during the late war.

THIRD. The establishment of Labor Bureaus in all the large Cities of the land, to the end that we can ask, at the hands of the people for the old soldier, such employment so they may have to give and he be fitted for, thereby carrying out the recommendatory character of Sec. 1755."

We will not dilate on the work which has been done, nor mention those who have labored in this worthy cause. Its results speak louder than words, in the respect that is now paid to this class of claimants, which was not the case between the years 1865 and 1882.

But the work is not complete : To you, Comrades, belongs a rightful share in impressing upon our membership a spirit of true Fraternity, which inculcates Charity, and then the recompense of our Loyalty will come. To help the worthy, needy, and destitute wards of our Grand Army, is a sacred duty ; " to stand by our Comrade " he being right, " though the whole world assail him " is one of the tenets of our faith. Let us demonstrate by our work that we are worthy the name of Comrade.

While we hold in sacred remembrance the memory of those who gave their lives on the altar of our Country and discharge our full duty by those who survive them, let us push forward solidly and unitedly, the electric touch of the elbow still felt, to protect and defend, against all who oppose, the rights and privileges which the law and a grateful people intended should be given to those who defended the Flag.

While we have not, from the beginning, been bound by State lines but have determined that we can say with Hamlet " I'll fight them on this theme, until my eyelids can no longer wag," even if we fight alone until we gain the victory, yet we realize that in Union only there is Strength, and while so much can be accomplished by the few, what must result when an advance is made along the whole line, and together ?

Who among us, having worn the Union blue, and being bound by " ties that were welded in the fire of battle," will hesitate in rendering assistance in protecting the rights of a Comrade ?

We therefore earnestly urge upon all Department Officers, delegates to the National Encampment, Post Commanders, and the Comrades of our Order everywhere, to extend our lines so that New York and Pennsylvania, with a membership of 75,000, will not stand alone in fighting this battle, when we can muster over 300,000 men in defense of the principles for which we contend.

VETERANS' RIGHTS UNION IN CLEVELAND.

In December 1885, through the action of all the G. A. R. Posts in Cuyahoga county, an organization of Veterans' Rights Union was perfected for Cuyahoga county. It consists of an Executive Committee, consisting of one member elected on each Post in the county,

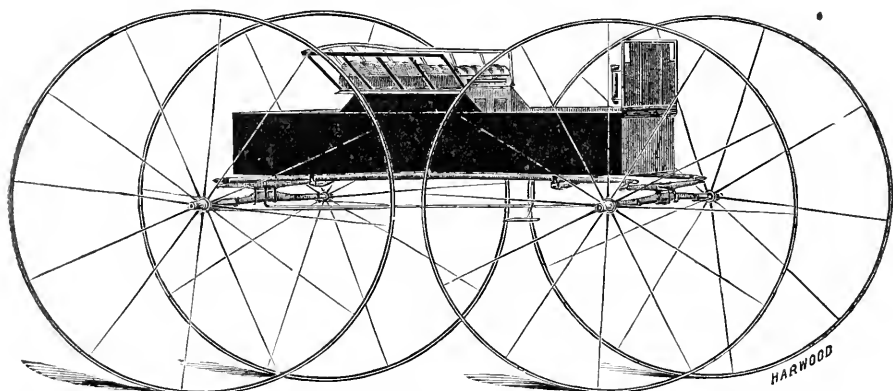

ORIGIN OF THE G. A. R.

INTERESTING ACCOUNT OF THE GROWTH OF THE GREAT ORGANIZATION.

At the close of the war in 1865, when the soldiers had returned to their homes, the question of the organization of some Order that would keep up that fraternal feeling that existed between all soldiers, officers and privates alike, during the war, was discussed at Springfield, Illinois.

Maj. B. F. Stevenson, formerly Surgeon of the 4th Ill., was the most active and enthusiastic advocate of the scheme. He is entitled, I think, to all the credit as the originator of the Grand Army of the Republic.

The ritual and the secret work of the Order was planned and written by him, with the aid and assistance of Capt. Robert M. Woods, now of Joliet, Ill., Comrade Phelps, now of Chicago, and Col. John M. Snyder of Copperas Creek, Illinois.

The first Post was organized at Springfield, Ill., and then the Order extended to Bloomington, Chicago, Decatur, Peoria, Canton, and other cities in the State.

The originators never intended that the Order should be exclusive, but that it should embrace every soldier who had served in the army of the Rebellion, and had an honorable discharge; and this is to-day the only soldier organization that admits the rank and file alike—the corps organizations being made up entirely of officers.

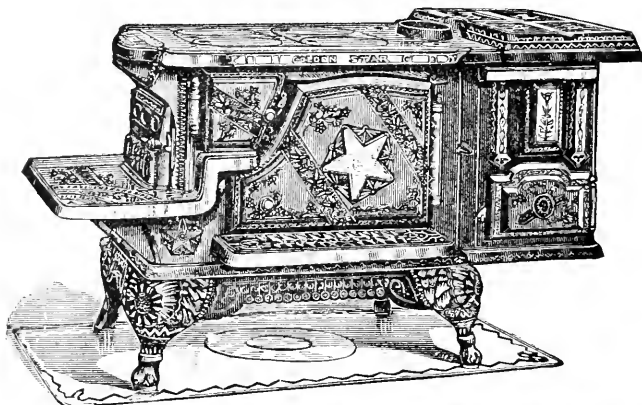
Maj. Stephenson was chosen the first Commander, and the work of organizing Posts in the State of Illinois progressed rapidly and soon spread to other States—Indiana, Ohio and Pennsylvania—and the first National Encampment of the Order was held in 1867, at Indianapolis, Ind., when Gen. John A. Logan of Illinois, was chosen Commander-in-Chief.

The object of the first organization was misconstrued in the West—it having been charged that it was simply a political organization—and many old soldiers withdrew from its ranks for that reason, and the Order progressed much more rapidly in the East than in the West.

At a National Encampment held in Philadelphia, the secret work was revised and divested of any and all objectionable features that existed from the first organization, and since that time the Order has progressed, until to-day you can find in almost every village and hamlet a Post of the Grand Army of the Republic.

The organization cannot last always, but in the last few years the Order has authorized the organization of the Woman's Relief Corps and the Sons of Veterans, and if these organizations are fostered, encouraged and cared for, they will still live to perpetuate the memory of the boys who took part in the preservation of the Union.—*John M. Snyder in the National Tribune.*

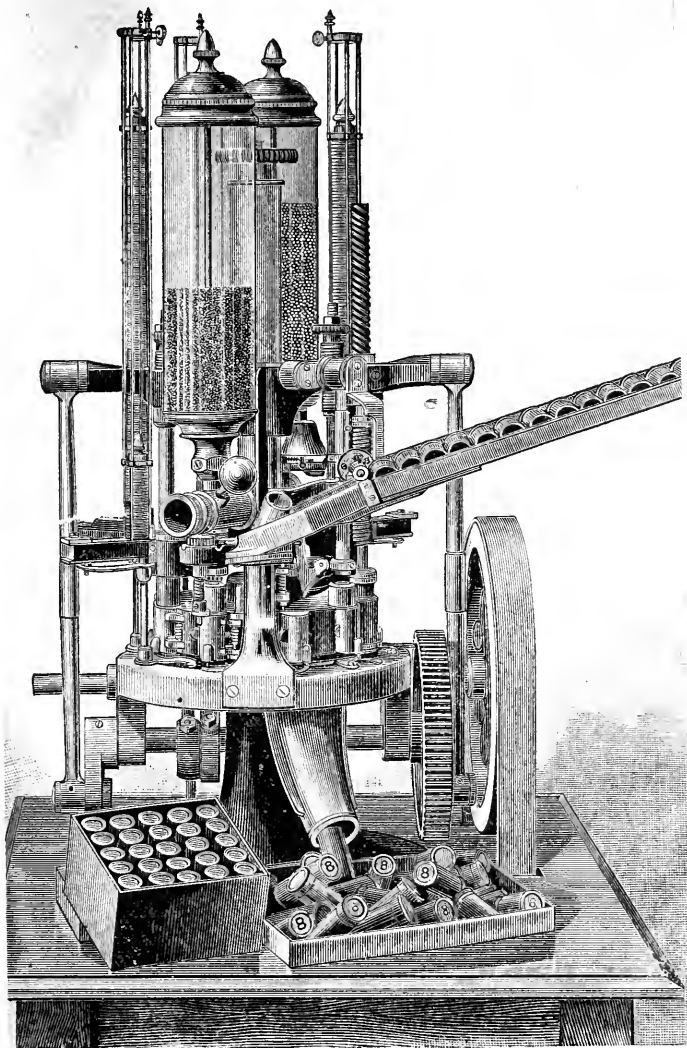

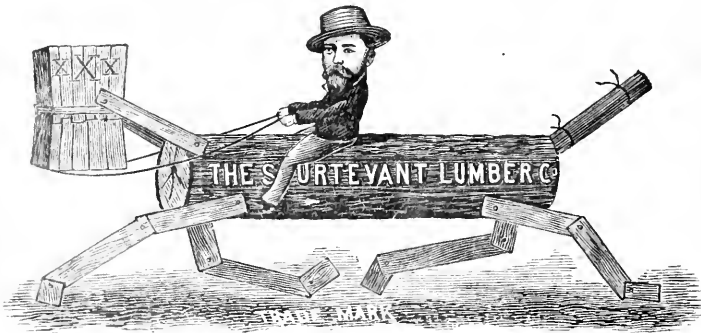

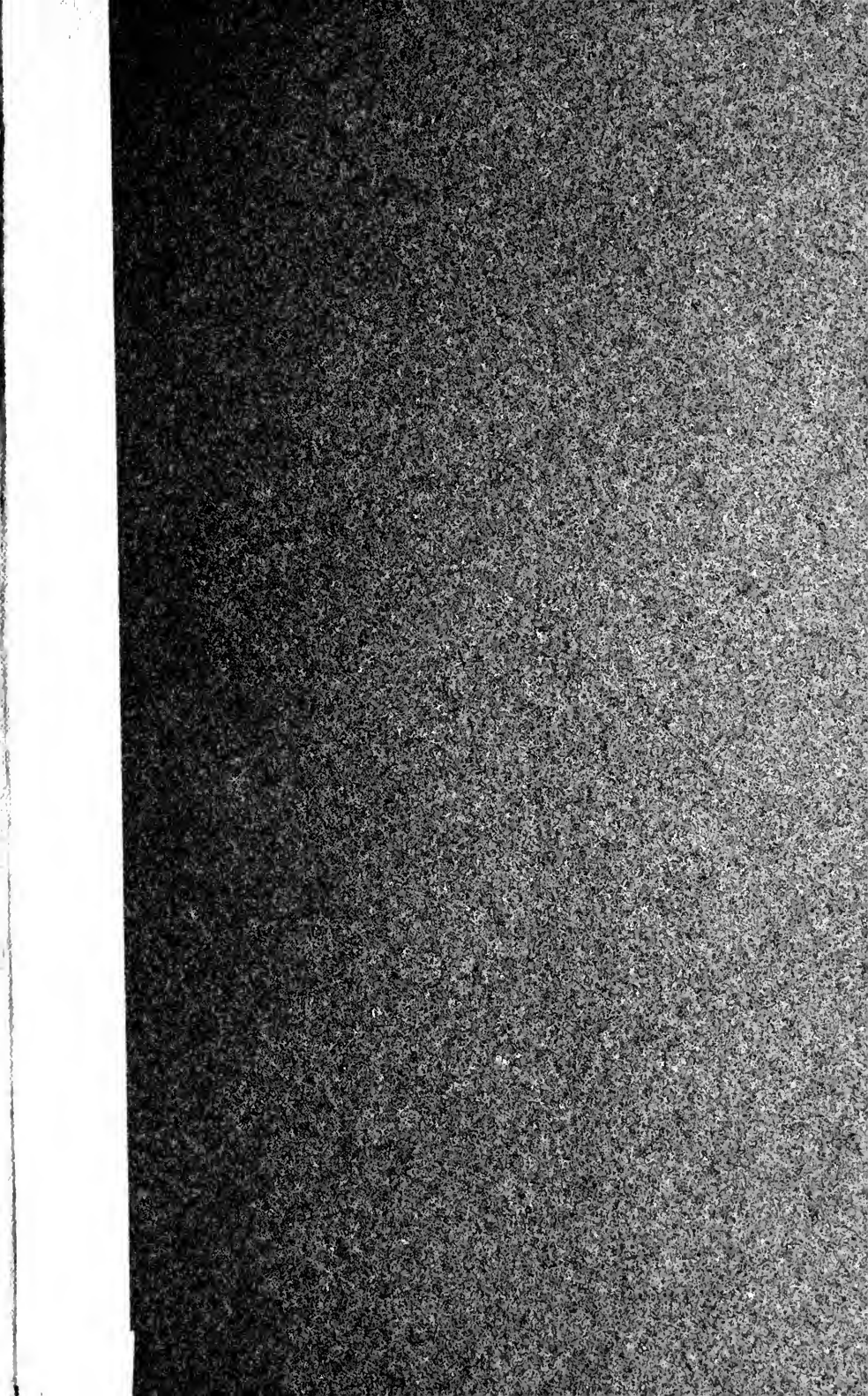
